NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S NOTES



Winchester Sponsorship

The A.C.T.A. has received a letter from Winchester's Marketing Manager, Mr Bruce BURNS requesting that shooters be advised of the extent of the proposal put forward by them.

In brief, the proposal was for a two (2) year period covering the National Trap, Skeet and Olympic Discipline Championships. The sponsorship would have been in two (2) divisions – (i) Sponsored Award for persons winning **not** using Winchester products and (ii) Loyalty Award for persons winning using Winchester products. The sponsored award amounted to \$44,500 (retail value) and the loyalty award \$54,400 (retail value).

If the A.C.T.A. was to accept this proposal, conditions applying to it were, as stated in last months column. Winchester ammunition to be sold and distributed exclusively on the grounds for all Nationals and Pre-Nationals. The use of Winchester targets at the events for the two (2) year period. There were other conditions requested by Winchester in the proposal regarding advertising on the ground and in the C.T.S.N.

I must apologise to Winchester if they believe that my comments in last months magazine indicated an unbalanced understanding of their proposal, it was certainly not intended.

The A.C.T.A. must have sponsorship to continue to provide shooters with a high standard of competition and awards and the decision taken by the National Executive was not taken lightly.

Office Manager

Mr Ian HILL has been appointed as temporary Office Manager until such time as a review is completed for the position of Executive Director.

Many shooters will be delighted with this appointment. Ian was previously in the Executive Director's position and hopes to renew old friendships, as well as helping to keep the wheels of our organisation turning.

Rules

A full list of rules introduced on the 10th February, 1993 appeared in the February edition of the C.T.S.N.

Within this printing were a number of spelling and grammatical errors, as well as some changes that were overlooked.

The Victorian Clay Target Association is at present compiling a full re-write. This re-write will eventually be grammatically correct, as well as having the same wording in any Rule that is relevant both to Trap and to Skeet. As can be appreciated, this is quite a job.

Conditions of Competition - Entry

Entry into the 1993 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1993 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors **must** produce their 1992 and 1993 registration cards, before nominating, to the 1993 Nationals Office Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1992 he/she must produce his 1993 registration card.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions. Exceptions to this rule are events where there are separate Championship titles for Ladies and Juniors, these events being the: National Double Barrel Championship, National Single Barrel Championship and the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship.

Shooters may nominate in any one section of an event - Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran.

Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section, shall only be eligible for the section entered, as well as all High Gun awards.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the Open team irrespective of the section nominated for. In addition to Open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior or Veteran.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on March 27, 1993.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on March 27, 1993 will be under the age of 18 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination, shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28g struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

Targets and Traps

Targets through the program are to be black and will be supplied by Winchester Australia. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classifications

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, **Open, Ladies, Juniors** and **Veterans** divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Womens, Juniors and Veterans who have elected to enter the Open section, will be indicated on the High Gun Scoreboard as: OL, OJ, OV.

Major Sponsors

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the designated area.

Cash Prizes

Cash prizes will be awarded in all events with the exception of the Grand Australian Handicap and the Deauville Doubles, to the Overall winner and the winner of each Grade.

The cash prize for the Overall winner shall be calculated on 50c per nomination, the Grade winner shall also be calculated on 50c per nomination in the particular grade.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time, if considered necessary.

In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
 - NOTE: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same way as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination, shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet, he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed, then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with, or attempting to interfere with, the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- $11. \ All \ disputes must be in writing, together with a $20 deposit,$ which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area. which shall be at a different location to the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the day following each event, with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the Open team as well as Section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 16. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun awards, Section(s) and Overall. Competitors

- must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.
- 17. The Overall winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall winner in any event, shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination).

ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID - OPEN OR SECTION.

- 18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- Nominations will close daily at 11.00am.
- 20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- 21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 22. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 23. All competitors must comply with firearms licencing laws in their state of residence and in the state of South Australia.

FIREARMS LICENSING 1993 TRAP NATIONALS

A reciprocal arrangement exists between South Australia and other states for the carriage and use of firearms in South Australia.

All shooters attending the Trap Nationals are reminded that your licence must be carried at all times when transporting or using your firearm. If your licence is not carried at all times, your firearm may be confiscated.

Tasmanian shooters attending the Nationals who having made application for licences but still await receipt of them, should contact the authority responsible explaining the need to have the licence before travelling to Adelaide.

RULES

Trap and Skeet shooting rules are still undergoing correction and amendment and will be printed, hopefully, in the April issue of the C.T.S.N.

Below are amendments to I.S.U. Rules as printed in the February C.T.S.N.

3.20 ISU POSTAL TEAMS MATCH

- (a) Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet The qualifying event shall be conducted over 50 targets. Teams are to consist of 6 shooters with the top 4 scores to count the course of the team's event is to be 50 targets. ISU Ladies and Junior teams to consist of 4 members with the 3 best scores to count 25 targets per team member.
- (b) Double Trap The qualifying event shall be conducted over 25 pairs (50 targets) for the men's team and 20 pairs (40 targets) for the ladies and junior teams. Teams are to consist of 6 shooters, with top 4 scores to count for men, and 4 shooters in both the ladies and juniors teams with the top 3 scores to count.

The course of the event shall be 25 pairs for men and 20 pairs for ladies and juniors.

3.22 ISU CHAMPIONSHIPS - Olympic (ISU) Trap & Skeet

(a) Commonwealth, State, Zone and District Championships must be conducted using International Shooting Union Rules. Cartridge specifications for all ISU events restrict shot load to a maximum of 24 grams of shot size no larger than 2.5mm. Compensators or similar devices (e.g. barrel porting) are prohibited on all guns used in UIT Trap and Double Trap events.

ACTA grading system shall be in addition to ISU Shooting Rules. The Conditions of Entry for State Championships shall be the same conditions as apply for National Championships.

- (i) District ISU Championships to be of 50 targets or 125 targets.
- (ii) Zone ISU Championships to be of 50 targets or 125 targets.
- (iii) State ISU Championships to be of 125 targets.
- (iv) Commonwealth & National ISU Championships to be of 125 targets.
- (v) State or Commonwealth Universal Trench (5 trap) to be of 50 targets (minimum), or 125 targets.
- (vi) All 125 target ISU Trap and Skeet Championships should include a further 'final round' of 25 targets for the top 6 competitors to determine the first 3 placings.
- b) (i) All ISU events shall be run as graded events, and equal trophics shall be provided for each grade. Section and grade ties after 125 targets in Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet Championships should be broken by a shoot-off comprising of a full round of 25 targets, followed by a single barrel miss-and-out shoot-off if scores are still tied after one full round.
 - (ii) Shooters shall be graded into four classes by their percentage performance at all targets fired upon in competition, and shoot-offs from 15 metres at either ISU Trench or UIT Trap.
 - (iii) The grades shall be: AA 95% and over; A 85% and under 95%;
 B 75% and under 85%; C under 75%.
 - (iv) It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to progressively mark the shooter's card and after each 250 targets, regrade the shooter if necessary.
 - Note: If the 250 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, regrading will not take place until the completion of that event. All targets to the end of that event and shoot-off targets are to be used in calculation of percentage. When he re-registers, the shooter shall be placed in the allowable grading indicated by his percentage at the conclusion of his last 250 targets. If he has not shot at 250 targets during the year he shall be graded on the percentage of the targets shot at up to the time of re-registration.
 - (v) A shooter may have his grade increased after shooting 250 targets but must shoot three consecutive groups of 125 targets at a lower grade percentage to be down-graded. All scores after the last grading must be carried forward onto the new handicap card.
 - (vi) Until such time as a shooter records his initial 125 ISU or UIT targets he shall be placed in the same class as his grading under ACTA rules.

3.23 ISU DOUBLE TRAP

- (a) All Double Trap events must be conducted under ISU Rules.
 - (i) District and Zone Championships to be of 50 pairs (100 targets).
 - (ii) State and National Championships to be of 75 pairs (150 targets).
 - (iii) Ladies and Junior Championships to be of 40 pairs (District and Zone), 60 pairs (State and National)
- (b) All Double Trap events must be run as graded events and equal trophics shall be provided for each grade.
 - The grades shall be AA Grade 80% and over; A Grade 70% and under 80%, B Grade 60% and under 70%; C Grade under 60%.

3.24 BALL TRAP

- (a) Commonwealth, State, Zone and District Titles must be conducted under ISU rules.
- (b) Gradings shall be as ISU trench, AA 95% and over, A 85% and under 95%, B 75% and under 85%, C under 75%.

- (c) State and Commonwealth Ball Trap Titles to be of 50 targets (minimum), 100 or 125 targets.
 - Zone and District Titles to be of 50 targets (minimum) or 125 targets.

3.25 ISU TEAMS MATCHES - Olympic Discipline National Championships

- (a) Interstate Shoulder to Shoulder teams matches will be conducted at National OD Carnivals for Open, Ladies and Junior teams in Olympic Trap, ISU Skeet and Double Trap.
- (b) Team Events will be as follows:
 - (i) Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet over 125 targets shot in conjunction with the National Championship. Open teams 3 members, Ladies and Juniors 2 members per team.
 - (ii) Double Trap teams match shot in conjunction with the National Championship, of 75 pairs (150 targets) for Men and 60 pairs (120 targets) for Ladies and Juniors. Men's team 3 members, Ladies and Juniors teams 2 members.

3.26 SASHES Change of rule No. only

4.12 CARTRIDGES

(b) For handicap events, load is restricted to <u>32 grams</u> struck measure or equivalent, shot size not larger than No. 6.

6 ISU CHAMPIONSHIPS

- (a) Commonwealth, State, Zone and District Championships may be conducted under international Shooting Union Rules using standard targets only.
- (b) Trophies for ISU Championships should be limited to sashes, badges and similar. Clubs may provide additional trophies at their own discretion.
- (c) Number of targets shall be: Commonwealth - 125 targets; State - 125 targets; District - 50 or 125 targets; Zone - 50 or 125 targets.



SKEET NEWS

What a month has passed for skeet shooting, with successful shoots in Griffith and Wagga. The A.S.S.A. shoot in Wagga was a resounding success, with all reports of a happy, well run shoot. I feel next year's event will be even better, attendance-wise.

The New Zealand contingent shot well and the presence of the Kiwi's was well appreciated, as always. On my recent visit to New Zealand, the folks over there are looking forward to the Aussie's coming over to their skeet shoots, so, all who are going over will have a great time.

Our I.S.U. trip to the Oceania was a mixed bag. On the first day of practice our team shot brilliantly. The next day the Waitemata wind got up and we struggled to win the gold team medal. With Craig Meuleman shooting really well, the erratic targets were proving a real problem.

In the individual match, the wind and rain on the first day was proving difficult, with only one shooter really taming the birds – Des Coe from New Zealand. Des shot really well, with Geoff Dukes from New Zealand close on his heels. The next day was a bit kinder weather-wise, but Des kept his head to take the honours.

The final was tight, with those behind Des – Geoff Dukes 108; myself 107; Tim Dodds 107; Malcolm Duff 107; John Farrell 107. Tim Dodds shot the only 25/25 for the whole tournament, to finish second.

The results were New Zealand 1st, 2nd and 3rd, with Geoff Dukes taking out the bronze. So we got a fair hiding and the Kiwi's loved it. Something interesting came out of the match, however, in I.S.U. Skeet, the competitor can now use No. 7 to No. 9 shot size, so it is worthwhile to pattern your gun in these sizes, as windy conditions will have a marked effect on patterns, with light shot, especially on the shot string.

Shooters using 20g 28g 410g may also like to pattern test to heavier shot, so that they may be more competitive in windy conditions.

Quite often I am asked about skeet guns by people who are wanting to purchase a new gun, so in the next few months I hope to road test a few of the firearms available. The first will be Miroku's new model – 10, especially the grade 5. I am very impressed with this gun. In the sporting version, it comes with chokes, porting, backboring, adjustable trigger, tapered rib and an excellent weight and stock height. The price ticket is reasonable, so I am looking forward to giving it a run. World Cup winner and Olympian, John Summers, is just about to get a ASE 90 skeet gun, so it will be good to see what Beretta comes up with in this high quality piece.

With regards to my comments on League Shooting in the last column, I have had quite a lot of feedback (all positive), of which I thank you, so I will draw up a proposal and let it go through the right channels and see what eventuates.

In closing this month, I would like to congratulate Reg Clarke on his High Gun win at Wagga. A really top result especially in the Doubles, where Reg and Dave Cunningham both shot a 99/100, with the old boy pipping Dave at Station 2 in the shoot-off. Well done Reg. Enjoy your shooting and bring a friend.

1993 A.S.S.A. SKEET OPEN

Shooters from all over Australia and some from New Zealand turned out on Saturday morning to stake their claim for some of the prizes. The notable prize was a Miroku model 10 skeet gun sponsored by FULLER FIREARMS as a door prize for all competitors who entered all four days of the Tournament.

Jenny Burt had the office up and running early (before most of us were out of bed in fact). As always Jenny and her helpers took nominations and had squads ready to start at 9 o'clock. Tournament Director, Tony Long, and Shoot Marshall, Col Burt, got the first squads started with the help of volunteer referees and scorers. 
The idea of 5 person teams made up by a shooter from each grade and either a lady, junior or veteran was very popular. This ensured that everyone on the ground was involved in team shooting.





YANKS GRAB **GIPPSLANDER**

A Gippslander has been appointed America's national skeet coach. The 47 year old former Bairnsdale accountant won the overall aggregate at the world skeet championships in America. last year. Adrian Cousens had won everything possible in Australia, so set out to conquer the home of skeet.

Bairnsdale is also home to Gippsland's current best shot, Lynne Curtis. (That feminine version of masuline Lin got him into scraps at school.)

The 43-year-old used car salesman is the current Australian points champion. He has also won the Australian handicap and the New Zealand double barrel title.

He is partly sponsored by Sydney cartridge manufacturer, Scorpio.

Bairnsdale timber man, Stan Collins, and electrician, Bruce Hall, have also performed well at state and national level. Stan has run-up in the Australian double barrel, been second in an Australian handicap and has achieved a rare 50/50 off 25 metres.

Morwell rigger and crane driver, Bernie Stokes, was 37 six years ago at Echuca when he was the only one of 613 competitors to shoot a 50/50 and win the Australian handicap off 17 metres.

Twenty one years ago at Griffith, Bena dairy farmer, John Green, not only won the handicap, but the champion of champions, ran-up in the double rise and won the aggregate over the program, in the days when skeet was included in the aggregate. He had previously run-up twice in the aggregate. John, 60, is the best known of 'The Shootin' Greens,' a South Gippsland family who rarely fail to handle a gun or rifle each week.

John's eldest son, Philip, 33, a forestry officer near Penola, has made the South Australian team several times. Philip and his Bena dairy farmer cousin, Malcolm Green, 36, have attained the rear mark of 24 metres. The Green's also shoot quail, duck snipe, when there was a season, and foxes with Jack Russell terriers. More than once duck shooters have cradled their guns and applauded as John has brought down five birds with five shots with his 'jack-hammer.'

I remember him for a 50 metre half-choke shot at a snipe that zigged left between two trees, then zagged right from behind the further tree. "Gotcha!" declared Greenie, as the wader from Japan found its evasive action had been futile.

Gippsland also has the current Victorian schoolboy/girl champion in Mitchell Foon, 16, of Lance Creek near Wonthaggi. Retired Drouin garage proprietor, Allan (Tup) Pedersen, 84, is Gippsland's oldest competitor. He started 44 years ago when starlings, sparrows and pigeons were targets. He was Australian Clay Target Association president from '75 through '78.







NEW ZEALAND CUSTOMS EXPERIENCE

It has taken me almost 12 months to finally write to the A.C.T.A. to advise of my experience on arriving in Auckland, New Zealand, on route to the famous Waitemata Gun Club skeet carnival.

First of all, my very patient girlfriend, Anne, and I, were ushered aside into the customs check-through point after declaring two shotguns. What was the big delay and all the discussions between the customs officer in a private office out of sight and earshot? You guessed it? I had brought along one Winchester U/O for trap and one of the famous Remington 1100 semi-autos for skeet. Sorry sir! The law does not permit semi-autos into this country (passed only weeks before).

More discussions – finally, I handed the 1100 over to the police officer on airport duty and left with a receipt and advised that I may collect it on my departure from New Zealand, which was to be Christchurch after the Belfast Gun Club nationals.

Before I left, while adding the New Zealand weapon licence to the collection – one Queesland weapon licence. Australian customs permit to export and A.C.T.A. handicap card (proof that I was a clay target shooter) and copies of the shooting programs in New Zealand, I was told of one chance to collect the 1100 and that was to obtain a permit signed by the commissioner of police. Hell! Sounds impossible.

Finally departed from the Auckland International Airport after receiving the keys for the hire car from an irate young lady (held up - running late for a dinner I suspect).

My first time in New Zealand, standing in the car park with a very patient Anne, trying to check the road map in the semi-dark around 1.00am – just wanting to get to the motel on the other side of the city on route to Waitemata.

Next morning, 8.00am, back on the motorway to Auckland police station (only two days to get the gun back). Well, not quite right to the police station. The first part in heavy traffic – the final short distance in a taxi (Maori driver). Queenslanders are you? Broncos? Yes, good players ah! Yes, but where did the coach come from? Yeah, right. OK, fair enough.

Met the inspector in charge of weapons etc. What was going on? Kept explaining and producing the receipt for the 1100. Are you sure, sir, that the police took possession of the 1100? Oh no! They've lost it, stolen or something.

Finally, it was explained to me that the customs had the authority to take possession of the gun on import laws, not the police. Several hours later a permit was received, signed by the assistant commissioner of police, to release the gun, but first a permit to pick the gun up from the airport then back to the police station for the final inspection – serial no. again etc. and final permit to take the 1100 away with me.

Actually the police were great (and customs) couldn't have been more friendly and helpful.

The trip you ask -we had a great time. Recommend it strongly. Waitemata and the Belfast Gun Club, excellent. Won a few bottles of Grouse whiskey.

The moral of all this? None! Just don't take your semi-auto to New Zealand. Looking forward to another trip to New Zealand.

Other shooters to receive a bonus case of ammunition in January for breaks of over 300 were George Sckaf from Queensland at the Sunshine Coast Clay Target Club for his break of 422 and Steve Guest from N.S.W. for his break of 406 at the Canberra International Clay Target Club.


Geoff Faulkes won the Overall High Gun award at the Albany Club's 2 Day Carnival in W.A. and receives 500 shotshells for his fine effort.

WONTHAGGI'S FIRST PRESIDENT

The first President of Wonthaggi's gun club has died.

He was Royce Johnson, 75, of Inverloch. He was president in 1955 and 1956 when the club operated on second president Bill Mile's farm behind Pommy Town.

Royce, the late 'Mo' Cargill and other enthusiasts built the trap house and laid the shooting lanes. Royce preferred field shooting and used to say: "You can't eat those clay pigeons."

We shot ducks at Barham, quail at Outtrim and snipe at The Five Mile. At Barham a local woodcutter took us into a forest, and the 11 local and visiting shooters had exactly 220 birds when the locals called a 10.30 halt because they had a cricket final to contest.

The Five Mile snipe trip is memorable because we followed a lone snipe for 200 yards out of ploughing to long grass around a water filled depression. There 15 birds were flushed and a place that frequently yielded snipe was discovered.

I am indebted to Royce for guidance in bird dog training. And so are other Wonthaggi-ites. He got me, in exchange for a good home, a German shorthair that was not the top class retrieving trials dog that its Mt Evelyn owner wanted. Royce owned two outstanding labradors which achieved Australian champion status in water retrieving trials. He competed (and later judged) in three States and the ACT.

Since Lake Eucembene became a mecca for trout fishermen, Royce and wife Thelma fished there every year. They also gave East Gippsland rivers a hiding.

In the 45 years he lived at Inverloch, Royce played and (like his brother Ron) acted as a local footy trainer.

He was a diesel mechanic in the RAN during WW2 and afterwards was a mechanic or service manager at garages at Morwell, Geelong and Wonthaggi. He also managed Page's farm machinery factory at Wonthaggi.

Royce was a TIP pensioner. In retirement he got a lot of pleasure from artistic painting.

He is survived by his wife, a daughter at Kerang and Lang Lang, a son at Emerald and Inverloch and five grandchildren.

In the 50s the developing northern part of Inverlock was light heartedly referred to as Johnsonville because of the influence of Royce's father Stan, then an Inverloch estate agent.

Pud Hasson

The day after Royce died, John (Pud) Hasson, retired motor mechanic, of Drysdale Street, Wonthaggi, also died in the same Wonthaggi and District hospital. Pud 64 was another keen shooter whose happiest days were spent after quail over his little English pointer, Dan.

Pud had been in ill health for several years, and in the good quail season of 1991 was not well enough to even sit on the back of a station wagon and walk a short distance over uneven ground to my dog on point. He settled for eating the birds . . . and, in exchange, gave me frozen whiting fillets. He told good yarns about local duck, deer and snipe shoots, and had been a keen salt water angler and bowls player.

He is survived by his wife Ketha, daughter Maxine Cummings and son Garry, all of Wonthaggi.


