

SHOOTING SPONSORSHIP

The current situation for most clay target shooters is that they pay personally for all the costs associated with clay target shooting. Sponsorship as we have traditionally known it, has been allocated to major competition or to a very limited number of top class shooters.

The potential for clay target shooting to elevate its profile and sports value is limited by the financial position of the majority of shooters. Therefore, if clay target shooting is to achieve an improved status we need to attract additional financial support – the obvious area is the corporate or business sector.

There would be a number of ways that this sponsorship could be achieved, bearing in mind we should not limit ourselves to the traditional shooting industry suppliers. For example in the USA the NSSA (Skeet Shooters) attract sponsorship from Buick Motors to the tune of 4 cars per year.

The following proposal is an example of what could be done:

- 1. Conduct at every Nationals a 3 person team event.
- 2. Corporate sponsorship entry cost \$100-\$250 per team.
- 3. Team members ammunition to be supplied free (i.e. included in team entry costs).
- Ammunition manufacturers be requested to tender as suppliers.
- Proceeds from the competition be donated to a major charity, such as <u>Variety Club</u>.
- Sponsorship would then attract tax concessions because of the donation to charity.
- Utilise the relationship with the Variety Club to attract media coverage.
- We would be seen as doing the right thing.
- Publicise the fact that clay shooters are supporting a <u>children's charity</u>.

1993 NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Conditions of Entry

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISU Skeet.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same way as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Lationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 Targets.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated as scorer/referee or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the services of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role SHALL INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.
- Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 12. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 14. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 15. High gun awards are determined for each section irrespective of the nomination paid. To be eligible for high gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective high gun.
- 16. Shooters who are eligible for a reduced nomination and elect to pay the full open nomination shall be eligible for recognition in the open section only. One nomination only

- may be paid. Shooters who are eligible for and elect to pay a reduced nomination, (60% of the open nomination) for their respective division, ladies and juniors shall, having so declared their section of competition only be eligible for recognition in the section nominated (U.I.T. Rules).
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
- Nominations will close at a time determined by the Tournament Director.
- Practice of card playing at the Nationals Championships is probibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas, or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- The Olympic finals system will be used to determine the overall placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.
- 21. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
- 22. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 23. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- I am in compliance with State licencing laws in my State of residence and in the State where this competition is being conducted.

As is normal practice in the year following the Olympic Games, the International Shooting Union Rules relating to all disciplines have been addressed and numerous changes made effective from 1st January, 1993.

In regard to the shotgun events, changes made include limiting shot load in all events, target distances in Olympic Trap and Ball Trap, shooting procedures in Skeet and format changes in Double Trap.

General

Effective immediately, shot load allowable for all U.I.T. shotgun events is restricted to a maximum of 24gr (loading tolerance + 0.5gr) of shot size no larger than 2.5mm (+ 0.1mm tolerance). In the old terms, this is the equivalent of a maximum of $\frac{7}{8}$ oz of shot size no bigger than No. 7.

All U.I.T. Championships in Olympic Trap, Automatic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet will be of 125 targets to be shot in five (5) rounds of 25 targets each.

Double Trap will be 75 pairs (150 targets) for men and 60 pairs (120 targets) for women and juniors.

The practice of Test Firing' (clearing of barrels) is permitted in all U.I.T. shotgun events, however shooters may only test fire prior to the commencement of their first round each day, not before each round.

I.S.U. Skeet

has been increased to a maximum of 2.5mm (+0.1 mm tolerance). Each round of Skeet must be completed with cartridges of one type only, those being the ones with which the round was started. (Cartridges of different size shot, e.g. No. 9 in the first barrel and No. 7 in second barrel are not permitted. Cartridges of one brand only must be used during each round.)

Skeet Time Limit – A shooter must stand on the station, position himself, load his gun and call for his target within 10 seconds after the shooter preceding him has left the station or after the

referee has given the signal to start firing. (The time limit has been reduced from 15 secs).

Shoot-offs – (After the completion of the 'final round' for the top six shooters). If two or more shooters have equal scores for the first three (3) places in the event, they will all shoot on the same stations and targets specified for that station. The shooter who hits the least number of targets on the respective station is the loser.

Olympic Trap

Changes have been made to the Olympic Trap tables. Major variations relate to distances. The new tables relating to Olympic Trap are shown below.

Cartridgec/Firearms - As with all I.S.U. shotgun events shot load is limited to a maximum of 24gr of shot size no larger than 2.5mm. Compensators or other devices which serve like purposes (e.g. barrel porting) are prohibited on all guns used in Olympic Trap shooting.

Time limit – A shooter must position himself, load his gun and call for his target within 10 seconds after the shooter on his left has fired at a regular target. The shooter must not leave his station before the shooter at his right side has fired at a regular target and a result is declared.

Shoot-offs (After the completion of the 'final round' for the top six shooters). If two or more shooters have equal scores for the first three places in an event, they will all shoot ONE SHOT station after station in sequence until a 'LOST' target is recorded. Each shooter shall load his shotgun with only ONE (1) CARTRIDGE on each station. If two shots are fired a 'LOST' target will automatically be recorded. Each shooter must shoot at the same number of stations and targets. The shooter who records the first 'LOST' target is the loser.




Target Distances and Elevations. With a throwing elevation of 2 metres at 10 metres forward of the pit, a properly released target will carry a minimum of 70 metres and a maximum of 75 metres when measured over level ground.

The height of the target's path above the level of the trap house roof and 10 metres forward of the trap shall be at least 1 metre and shall not exceed 4 metres.

The targets shall be thrown within an area bounded by angles not less than 30 degrees nor more than 45 degrees right and left of the imaginary centreline drawn through the centre of the trap house and station 3. The horizontal angles will be measured from the front of the traphouse.

At the commencement of each days competition, a target must be released from each squad to view, prior to the start of their first round of competition.





Double Trap

The recently introduced Olympic Discipline shotgun event, Double Trap, has now been refined and new rules and settings established

As with all U.I.T. shotgun events, shot load for Double Trap is restricted to a maximum of 24gr of shot size no larger than 2.5mm. Compensators or other devices which serve like purposes (e.g. barrel porting) are prohibited on all guns used in Double Trap shooting.

Double Trap events are normally conducted on a standard Olympic Trap range using the centre group of traps (Nos. 7, 8 & 9 traps), however, a separate Double Trap pit may be constructed capable of housing three (3) traps spaced between 1 metre and 1.1 metres apart.

At the commencement of each day's competition, a pair of targets must be released for each squad to view, prior to the start of their first round of competition.

Trap settings. Double Trap settings must be made according to the trap setting tables below.


Target Distance –50m. Elevation 3.0m to 3.5m. Maximum Angle 5 degrees left or right.



With supper over it was back out into the wet night to contest the 50T Double Barrel. Greg Matthews took out A grade with a well shot 50/50 and Bill Koitka claimed B grade on 47/50. However the biggest smile of the night belonged to Cloncurry junior Chris Keyes. His 50/50 made sure the C grade trophy was his, and Tanya Maxwell won D grade with 36/50.

MIROKU 1



With radical ballistic changes and the shooters awareness that recoil reduction will enhance scores, the demand for more than the traditional firearm is being sought. It is only in the last couple of years since some of our gunsmiths have ventured overseas to learn of the new innovative methods that will improve patterns and striking power, thus allowing Australian shooters to be able to keep up with the rest of the world by having their guns improved.

It is also worthy of note that up until the early 80s there was no real significant change to barrel performance since choking came into being about a hundred years ago.

Even now most of the European and English gun manufacturers are still building their guns with short cones, however, the top manufacturers are moving the in right direction by at least starting to lengthen their forcing cones.

So up until now, if one wanted to

have all the innovative, recoil reducing, pattern enhancing, hard hitting shot, built into the one gun, the shooters had to have their guns made to suit as there was no 'off the rack' firearm available, not until the new range of MIROKU MODEL 10s have come onto our market that is.

adiustable trigger.

MIROKU FIREARMS have been in our country since 1966 and are distributed by the FULLER FIREARMS GROUP in Sydney and have been since MIROKU was introduced. MIROKU FIREARMS have always had good firearms at affordable prices and there is not too many of us that have not owned a MIROKU at one time or another. MIROKU first started business in 1893 manufacturing

SAMURAI swords, blades and armour and then ventured into firearms in the 60s. BROWNING has had a big influence at MIROKU and the company manufactures some BROWNINGS under licence.

Always on the lookout for good SKEET guns I could not wait to be able to test the new MIROKU MODEL 10, the gun I had been given to test was the GRADE 5 SPORTER version. This gun is an excellent skeet and sporting gun.

Barrels

These are the chopper lump type made from one piece of

forged steel, the length in the test gun measured out at 28", however, they are available in 30" and 32". The rib is a raised light weight, channelled rib and is tapered from 13mm at the rear to 11mm at the front. Anti-glare serration extends all the way up the rib and it is fitted with a white front and midsight bead. The side ribs are ventilated for extra cooling and weight drop. The blueing is of a high standard and when cleaned, gives a deep black and high lustre appearance. The front of the barrels are swaged to accept the Invector Plus chokes, this is not noticeable when shooting. Now, the inside of the barrels is where the big changes are. The forcing cones start at 3" and

taper for 1/4" to a bore diameter of .741" and run with this measurement to the lead in for the choke which measures .754". This allows a smooth entry into the choke with out hangups. The SKEET measured out at .740, big diameter one might say but good choking is directly relevant to

with 28g and 24g shot loads. The other chokes measured out at $1/4\ldots736$ ", $1/2\ldots728$ ", $3/4\ldots$. 720" and the full choke at .708. They all tapered down from the choke lead in over 21/4", the patterns on these chokes proved excellent, however, one would be advised to pattern test with different cartridges and chokes to obtain the best performance. The barrels on the test gun were PORTED and I did notice less muzzle


the bore diameter. What this means to the shooter is less distorted pellets that create 'flyers' and better patterns especially

flip on the ported gun as compared to one that wasn't. What was noticeable was that cartridges with slow burning powder or

progressive burning powder created a lot of unwanted residue escaping from the ports, mainly from 34g and 36g cartridges. Don't forget that if you want to shoot OLYMPIC TRAP (TRENCH), barrel porting is illegal.

To obtain the best results with over bored barrels like these, one must clean the barrels regularly, especially the ported version as plastic build up was quite evident.

The ejectors are of the floating type and are actuated by ejector kickers in the forend. They are strong and extracted steel headed cartridges without a problem.



The heavy duty, receiver featuring anti double discharge hammers, heavy duty hammer guide rod springs ensure guick lock times.

Action

The action is constructed of good quality steel with strong side walls, cut away about half an inch in front of the breech face to accept the barrel lock situated on the top barrel adding support to the breech face. A hinge pin goes right through the front of the action and is made of hardened steel. The barrels are finally locked up with a self tightening tapered under lock which fits into a heavy locking lug on the bottom barrel, this all ensures a very tight lock up.

The action was nicely engraved with game scenes on both sides and underneath the action, the top lever is also engraved, all quite tasteful and pleasing to the eye.

The internal mechanism incorporates an inertia system (the selection of the second firing is actuated by the recoil of the first firing). Which barrel fires first is determined and incorporated with the safety catch to the left for the bottom barrel to the right for the top barrel.

The hammers are set off by overhead sears lifted upwards by the inertia block when the trigger is depressed. Cut into the hammers is an anti-double discharge lug. The hammer guide rod springs are strong and ensure a good fast hammer fall. The firing pins are strong and well made and have rebound springs to return them from the breech face. The trigger is a curved OLYMPIC type, checkered so you can feel it. The trigger can be adjusted with three settings. This adjusts the length of pull and can be adjusted by removing an ellen screw on the under side of the trigger and sliding the trigger forward or backwards to suit your finger position. Make sure you lock up the screw tightly as it may come loose and cause problems.

Trigger pulls were quite good but they could be improved with a little honing.

Stock and Forend

The woodwork on the Grade 5 tested was magnificent, beautifully figured walnut with hand cut checkering and teardrops. The oil finish is not bad, but the wood was very porous. With a little work with fine sandpaper, boiled linseed oil mixed with a touch of french polish, this wood would come up really well. The forend on the test gun was a schnarbled or tulip type. I found it a bit uncomfortable to handle as I couldn't wrap my hand around the wood comfortably. In the Trap and Skeet versions a semi beavertail is standard, and I feel this would be better, however, each to his own. The forend was well made, plenty of wood and good hand cut checkering. The forend is attached to the barrels and action by a very solid forend iron fixed by two strong screws, screwing right through into the forend catch frame. The bottom of the forend iron is located into the bottom of the receiver by a spring retracting clip thus giving the forend more stability.

Stock Measurements

The stock measurements are the same for Skeet and Sporting LENGTH 362mm (14^{3} 6"), TRAP 365mm (14^{1} 2"). Drop at COMB SKEET/SPORTING 36mm (1^{3} 8"), TRAP MONTE CARLO 38mm (1^{1} 2"), straight 35mm (1^{1} 4"). Drop at heel SKEET TRAP 50mm (2"), MONTE CARLO 63.5mm (2^{1} 2"), straight 44.5mm (1^{7} 8"), PITCH SKEET and SPORTING 2^{1} 2" TRAP 2".

Summary

Shooting the MIROKU MODEL 10 was very pleasing as a SKEET GUN, the overall weight of 3.4kg let the gun travel smoothly and from the gun down position was easy to mount without any noticeable 'barrel bobble'. From the gun up positions it swung smoothly, target sighting was easy because of the higher stock and when the trigger was pressed I noticed very little muzzle flip. Follow through was easy as the gun stayed on line.

I liked the angle on the top of the recoil pad cut away. It made catching the shooting garment nearly impossible. As stated before, I felt a little uncomfortable with the forend, but I am sure the beavertail forend would be fine. This gun would be very competitive as a Skeet gun. All in all this was a very well made gun, it shot well and was pleasing to the eye. Price wise the MIROKU MODEL 10 is also very competitive. The gun comes in three models, GRADE 1, GRADE 5 and PRESENTATION. The gun is available in SKEET, SPORTING, TRAP (monte carlo stock or straight stock) all with INVECTOR PLUS CHOKES.

1993 OCEANIA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Auckland, New Zealand

On Thursday 28th January, members of the 1993 Oceania ISU Teams assembled at both Sydney and Melbourne Airports for a flight with United Airlines to Auckland, New Zealand.

All, that is except for Michael Diamond, who, because of car failure, missed the flight. After seat allocations and the usual last minute Firearm Restricted Goods Permits, the respective flights got underway. While in the air, we were informed of Michael's plight and that he would be on another flight several hours later.

On arrival at Auckland Airport, we found and joined a long line of other Australian shooters waiting for the Police to log in and clear the weapons. Following this delay and Customs cleared, the two groups joined up where it was discovered the vehicles hired for the Team would not be available until the following morning. Ian Hale volunteered (will we ever learn) and negotiated the services of mini buses and in a short space in time, we were transported to O'Rorke Hall –our accommodation for the Championships.

Later that evening Michael arrived and on catching sight of him, we knew that there was still a problem as his normally smiling face had that "Why me?' look across it. The problem turned out to be the misplacement of his new ASE90, but with assurances from Air New Zealand that it would be found, we headed for Auckland and bed.

Next morning the Teams vehicles were picked up and with a smiling Michael (his gun had been located sunning itself in Fiji), headed for the Walternata Gun Club. After attending the Technical meeting with David Menck and Jim Kelly, a quick trip was made to the Airport to retrieve a suntanned and healthy looking ASE90, before I headed off to Walternata.

Waitemata Gun Club facilities were first rate, having been the venue for the 1990 Commonwealth Games. The grounds are set on the top of the hills overlooking a picturesque valley, some 30kms from Auckland.

Ammunition that Scorpio and Winchester had allocated for their respective shooters had been located and was being put to good use, as each of the Team members adjusted to the conditions and background. In case of the ISU Trap, it definitely was the lack of background. A word of appreciation to Scorpio and Winchester for their support of the Individual Team members.

A summary of each day follows:

Day 1

75 TARGETS TEAMS MATCH.

Competition started at 9am in overcast conditions with an approximate 20 knot south-westerly wind blowing. Each team member showed their talent in what was considered difficult conditions. Overall Team scores were not high, but achieved good placings.

Using program 6 in ISU Trap, the placings were: 1st - Australia 'A' 207/225, 2nd - New Zealand 'B' 186/225 on count back to 3rd - Australia 'B' 186/225.

ISU SKEET.

1st - Australia 'A' 199/225, 2nd - New Zealand 'B' 192/225. That evening at O'Rorke Hall, an official Opening Ceremony took place prior to medal presentation to ours and other shooting disciplines.

Day 2

1st day of 125 TARGETS INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION.

Conditions had deteriorated further with heavy overcast skies and a south-westerly wind gusting to 45 knots. The Skeet competitors found these conditions difficult while the Trap competitors using Program 5, did not have it any easier.

Day 3

Final Day of 125 TARGETS INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION.

Conditions had eased slightly with the wind gusting to 20 knots, but with intermittent rain squalls.

At the end of the 125 targets, the shooters from Australia to go forward into the finals were:

TRAP - M. Diamond 116/125, R. Mark 115/125, J. Maxwell 115/125 (also MQS's) and G. Hayden 112/125.

SKEET - I. Hale 107/125 (no MQS's).

OVERALL RESULTS:

TRAP – 1st R. Mark 140/150, 2nd M. Diamond 138/150, 3rd G. Hayden 138/150.

SKEET - 1st D. Coe (NZ) 136/150, 2nd T. Dodds (NZ) 132/150, 3rd G. Jukes (NZ) 129/150.

Day 4

150 TARGETS DOUBLE TRAP.

Conditions remained the same as Day 3 which made the slower targets duck and dive. At the end of the 150 targets, the shooters from Australia in the finals were: J. Maxwell 123/150 and MQS, R. Mark 118/150, M. Diamond 115/150 and J. Ellis 111/150.

OVERALL RESULTS:

1st R. Mark 159/200, 2nd J. Maxwell 157/200, 3rd G. Ede (NZ) 153/200.

TEAM RESULTS:

1st Australia 'A' 356/450, 2nd Australia 'B' 328/450, 3rd New Zealand 'A'.

In conclusion, it should be stated that the conditions were some of the most difficult that I have seen or experienced and that on occasion the targets were unhitable, with only luck adding to the score. Overall the results and placings achieved, showed the high standard that our Oceania Teams are known for.

The organising that goes into any Team leaving Australia is always a large administrative and logistical nightmare and I am sure that I speak for the 1993 Oceania Team when I record a vote of sincere appreciation for a top job done by Gina of our National Office.

Finally a question unanswered from the Oceanias' "How many ISU shooters fit into a Falcon station wagon?" and "Were the trap and skeet disciplines equally represented?"

New Rules

I have received correspondence from one of the NSW State Rules Supervisors, Mr Bob Blake, concerning the apparent misunderstanding of some of the new rules in some areas of NSW.

It is unfortunate that there were several misprints in the printing of the new rules in the February CTSN, however, these are being addressed as quickly and accurately as possible.

Bob would like to clarify the following points.

- The new rules state that Handicap events CAN be shot with
- Double Barrel and Pointscore events shot from 15 METRES ONLY are to be recorded on Handicap events in the DB column, as stipulated in the printing of the new rules.

ONLY 15 METRE EVENTS ARE RECORDED.

- As rule 3.15(d) does not specifically say that the targets in Champion of Champions events are to be shot in any particularly order, we hope commonsense will be used, and the event shot as it should be. This item is already listed for correction when the rules are re-printed.
- DOWNGRADING from any one grade to another is NOT allowed this year. Whatever grade you were in on February 1, when the new rules commenced, is the grade you must remain in until the end of the year. Then, providing you have shot 2 consecutive lots of 200 at a lower grade, you will be downgraded appropriately for the commencement of the next year. Then, likewise, you will remain in that grade for all of next year.

The only exception to this rule, is referred to in rule 2.7(a). Please refer to rule book. This rule has not been altered except for 14 days notice instead of the previous 7 days.

As with any new system when introduced, teething troubles are always encountered.

Bob has suggested that we give the new rules 12 months trial period to see if they will work for the improvement of clay target shooting. Then, if it is not an improvement, we can really get our act together and do something constructive and not destructive to improve shooting.

We realise that some shooters are not happy with the new rules, but likewise, many were not happy with the old rules. Obviously, finding a set of rules to please everyone would not be possible.

So let's give Bob's suggestion a try and trial the new rules and evaluate the results.

His efforts over the past year have been recognised by the Leader Newspaper Group, where Vince won the junior section of the Annual Sports Stars Awards.


Vincent also finished 1991 as Australia's highest ranked U18 Down the Line shooter, after leading Victoria to the national title.

PROFILE ON RUSSELL MARK

Interviewed by Alan Maher

(Continued from February issue).

Alan: How do other shooters react when they see you shooting, as some of them say, as a professional shooter, when you are shooting long breaks over two days, you're holding up their shooting – how does all that come into it?

Russell: Well, I have certainly heard a bit of criticism, which is a bit unfounded really. People think I am a professional shooter, which is not the case. I am employed by Winchester as a consultant for their company. I earn my living from being a land valuer not a shooter. You cop a lot of criticism, but there were some people in Tamworth who were very grateful to shoot the biggest scores in their life because they were caught up in a long shoot-off. I think there is some jealousy out there in the shooting world, but I have never found it with many of the top line competitors, the people that I really consider to be great shooters. I think those people understand. It's the people that really want it but just can't quite get there who are the one's who have been the most vocal, but mind you, it has always been behind my back. I have never had anyone actually say it up front to me.

Alan: Would it be fair to say that a lot of the people who might criticise you and others, may have greater ability than they show, but they haven't or aren't prepared to put in the same effort that yourself and others have, and therefore their criticism just boils down to plain jealousy as you have suggested?

Russell: Sure, that's a fair comment. I am pretty lucky to have the type of relationship with Michael Diamond, where I can sit down with him and talk about these things because Michael is certainly in the same situation. I remember one day speaking to Michael about how people say he has a lot of natural ability. He sort of laughed and said "if people only knew how hard I try." That is the same for me. It's not a matter of just natural ability, it's a matter of putting in a lot of effort.

Alan: With all the shooting you do, have you ever gone through a long slump and if you have, how do you or how would you overcome it?

Russell: I have certainly gone through bad times. I think it's more burn out, it's not so much a slump. After I have shot a lot of DTL it can get very boring, and if I have shot DTL for 3 or 4 months without a break, then I find that I will start shooting badly, simply because you can't mentally put the effort in. The best way to get out of a slump is either you stop shooting that discipline or have a rest altogether, but I tend to get out of it by going to shoot Olympic Trap again for a while or vice versa.

Alan: So you're looking for a change from the everyday one target after another.?

Russell: Yes, that's right. I think the saying a change is as good as a holiday is very true in this case.

Alan: Talking about holidays, all the travel that you do overseas, do you look upon that as a holiday or what do you get out of that? Do you confine your trips away to shooting or do you try to do a little bit of sight seeing at the same time?

Russell: I think anyone who says that to make the Australian team is great because you can have a holiday just doesn't understand. You are putting in so much mental effort all the time, you have got to try and do the right things when you are away so you will hit your peak form. Generally, as soon as the competition is over I try and catch the first plane back home.

Alan: Have you seen people who have treated it as a holiday?

Russell: I have certainly come across that in the past. Generally, you will find that those people don't make the team too often and if they do, they learn very quickly that that is not the attitude to have.

Alan: What about Team Managers? What role do they play in teams? If, as you say, some people have not approached their competition internationally as seriously as they should, should the Managers be playing a greater part in that, or do they just like to keep the team a happy close knit group and just hope for the best? Russell: No, I think a Manager's role is to keep the team together. I would think if a Manager got too hard on the team members that it wouldn't be good, but sometimes that has to be the case. I have been licky enough in my trips away to have two very good Team Managers in Peter Quire and Robbie Smith. Robbie in particular I have found has done an excellent job. I think Robbie's knowledge now in ISU shooting will be sadly missed in the sport and it's very disappointing to see him now cut his involvement on the Executive, although I certainly understand the reason for his decision, but I think it is a position that is going to be very hard to fill. I have found Robbie's expertise with handling people to be probably the most important part of his role as a Team Manager. It's certainly not as a coach position, it's a managerial role.

Good communication and personal skills, that's what a good Team Manager needs. He doesn't have to be the greatest shooter but he has to be able to realise when the tension is getting there and what to say to a person. I found Robbie to have that ability and I found Peter in a different way to have that same ability, and of course that is something which comes with experience.

Alan: What about yourself Russell, would you like to take a team away as a Team Manager?

Russell: At this stage, it's a long way from my mind. It's something that I have never thought of. Certainly I think that the people who have been involved with ISU shooting for quite some time really owe it to the sport to put something back into it and maybe down the track the day will come when I would like to do that. At this stage it's a long way away, but I would like to put something back into shooting.

Alan: Just a couple of closing questions in relation to the technical side of things, how important is a proper gun fit?

Russell: It's essential really. That is the first thing you must do, you must have a gun that fits reasonably close and then develop your style from there. It's very hard to develop a style around a poor fitting gun because you develop very bad habits, and you can be sure that when the pressure is really on, those bad habits will come to the top.

Alan: For a newcomer to the sport, where does a person go to get a gun and how does he know that his gun is going to be fitted for him?

Russell: It is a criticism I hear widely about the lack of actual club coaching that goes on in the sport and it's certainly a criticism I also have that there is very little hands on coaching taking place.

Around Victoria you rarely ever see it. I guess if the system worked more efficiently you could go to your club or zone coach, or even maybe your state coach, but at the moment I don't see that happening in too many clubs and certainly there are some places crying out for it. That should be the direction to take, but at the moment you are really relying on a new shooter having enough courage to come up to an experienced shooter and ask him, and often the experienced shooter may not know. This is a problem the sport definitely must overcome to keep new shooters involved.

Alan: Are shooters generally willing to impart their knowledge freely to a new shooter or do they see him as a bit of a nuisance?

Russell: No, I think a genuine person asking advice would be given it. I have had a couple of incidences in the past where I've been reluctant to give advice to a shooter because there have been so many other people giving them advice also and it's very hard for someone to listen to three or four different people at once. But certainly if any person came up and asked me what I believed to be the case, then I would tell them.

Alan: Just finalising on the gun, what about your stock? Do you use a high or a flat stock?

Russell: For DTL I have always tended to use a fairly high stock because I don't try to move the barrels very fast, I just swing up, meet the bird and pull the trigger. For Olympic Trap I have had a turn-around in the last twelve months. I've had my gun adjusted quite considerably by Beretta from what I was used to using, and it's now a flatter stock, but I get away from that by swinging the barrels a lot faster and swinging through the targets a lot more now, so I've had a reversal – a higher stock for DTL and a little bit flatter stock for Olympic Trap.

Deepest sympathy to their sons and daughter.


