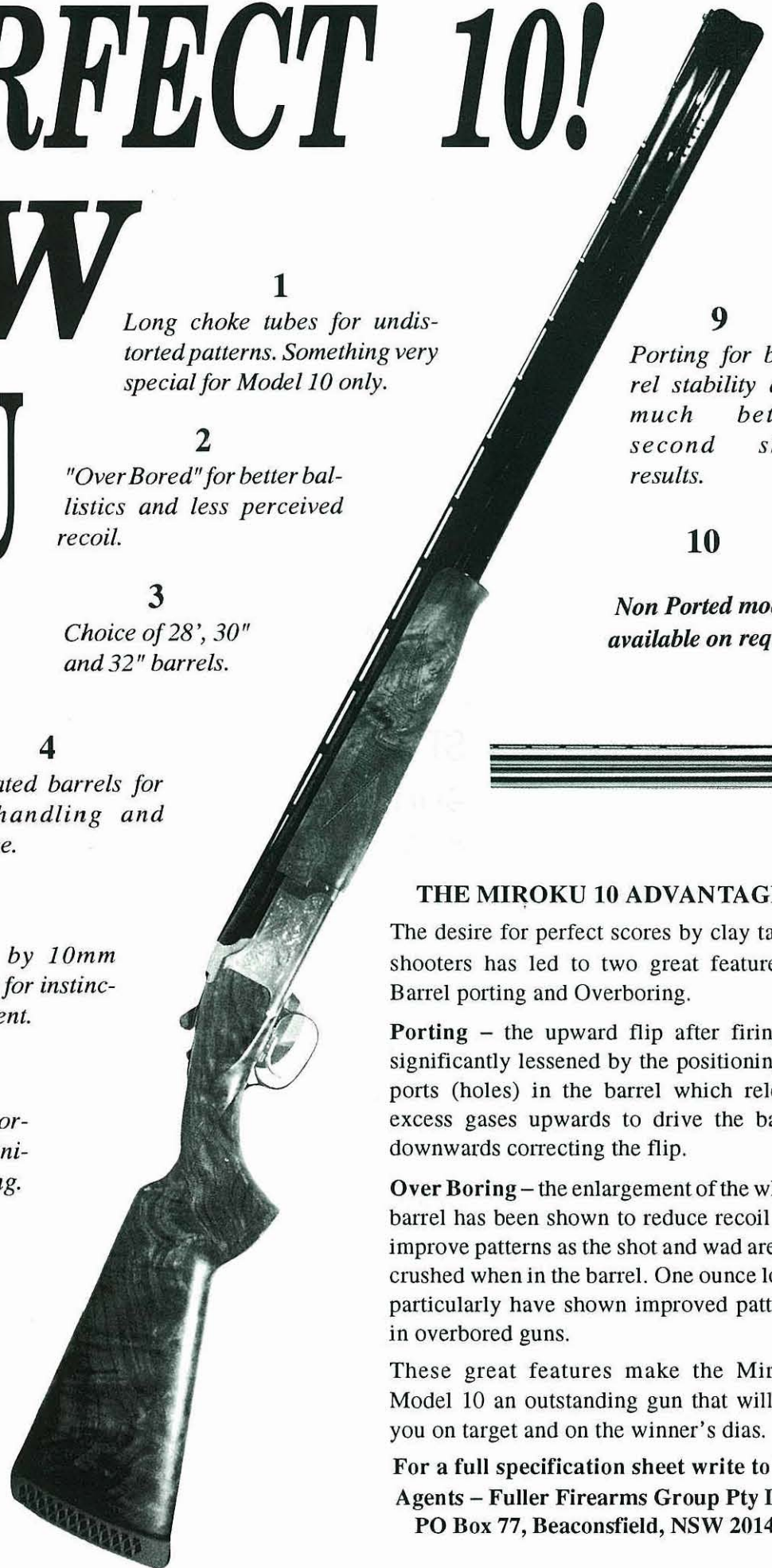

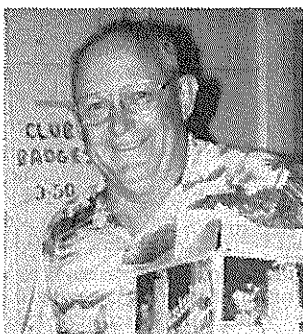

Charlie Edwards

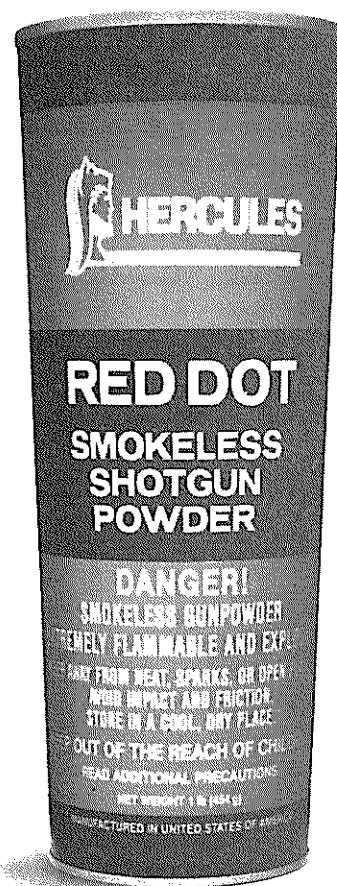
It is with sadness we report the death of Charlie Edwards on February 21, 1993.

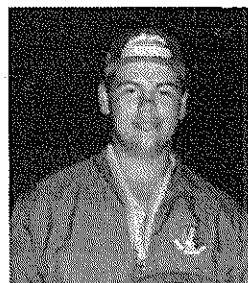

COACHING COUNCIL

'Do you use one or two eyes'

While travelling around gun clubs competing or coaching I am always amazed at the number of shooters that compete with one eye closed, therefore giving away an advantage to the target and other competitors. If a shooter has a compatible master eye and shoulder he or she should endeavour to learn the skill of shooting with both eyes.

The following article is an extract from a book titled 'An Insight to Sport' (featuring trap shooting and golf) by Dr. Wayne F. Martin, O.D. Hopefully reading this may encourage you to master the skill of (binocular vision) using both eyes while shooting.

Extract — 'An Insight to Sport'

The visual requirements for one eye are the same as for the two. Colour, direction and speed identification are required. The eye movements - versions, rotations, accommodation, convergence and fixations - are required. Peripheral awareness and visualisation are a part, and, if prescription eyewear is needed to see clearly or relieve accommodative eyestrain - wear it.

As we look at the advantages and disadvantages, only you can make the final decision. But when participating in other sports - football, basketball, ping-pong etc, we keep both eyes open. During our awakening hours in all other activities: work, play, driving the car, jogging, talking and listening, we use both eyes. When we watch others shooting we keep both eyes open. That is why their shooting looks easy. Then why would you want to close or partially occlude an eye when lining up to shoot? Any method of occlusion breaks the normal habitual pattern of our daily seeing. Blocking out light, reducing the stimulus and disrupting the normal visual pattern, seems an odd way to attempt to effectively function.

Shooting with one eye is usually due to the bad habits learned early as a junior or novice. Many of us first started by aiming with a BB gun. Closing the eye seemed to be the accepted way of doing it, but incorrectly. Aiming is two dimensional, it may be done with one or two eyes.

The inexperience of handling the gun, insecurity of performance, too much attention and concentration on alignment of the gun barrel and sights, and the fear of shooting causes many to close an eye. When bad habits are learned they become difficult to eliminate. As is often repeated, bad habits are comfortable.

Shooters using only one eye often experience visual confusion when attempting to learn with both eyes. They are so ingrained at aiming down the barrel and sights the habit is difficult to break. The learning process of shooting with the two eyes can be discouraging. But it is best to miss all the targets while learning to do it right than to break some with the one eye and never be a consistent winner.

The one eye shooter may experience the anxiety of not breaking as many targets during the switch over. Yes, the scores may drop, even be disappointing, but high scores in the beginning are not the goals of the relearning process. To improve any skill, sometimes one must take a step backward before going forward.

Any change can be difficult. For example, in my game of golf I developed the bad habit of shifting my weight and rearing back on my right leg. I went to a top teaching professional in Seattle for help. I shall always remember his first glance at my swing. When I asked how to improve and practice his lesson, he replied, "Go to the driving range, obtain a bucket of balls, take out your sand wedge and emphasise keeping your weight on your left foot and leg. Don't worry about the ball or where it is going."

"How long will it take?" I hurriedly asked.

"Well, maybe a bucket, maybe 15 buckets or never," he replied.

This was a tough, ingrained bad habit learned incorrectly, I sought professional help after the fact, but, using what I learned from his instruction and several lessons, I practised intently and most of the time have corrected the problem. It wasn't easy. It required dedicated practice.

Learning to shoot is no different than learning any other sport. It seems common to wait until poor habits are developed before seeking professional instructions. A word to the wise; in each

sport, find the best qualified professional instructor available and prepare yourself for many practice sessions.

The column 'Tech Talk' in the American Shotgunner publication had an interesting article on one-eye shooting: "Keeping one eye closed destroys your depth perception, and in most cases keeps a shooter from ever reaching his or her full potential as a competitive shooter." Truer words will never be spoken.

On the shooting range, as an observer, try the experiment by occluding an eye and watching targets thrown. The targets will seem smaller, faster and have less colour. Of course, upon removal of the occlusion the targets will be brighter, larger and slower. They will seem to float and be easier to see. Look around at the trees, other objects and the general terrain and background. There is noticeable difference in the judgement of depth and space.

Whenever one eye is closed or an occlusion is applied, both eyes are affected. Even though one eye may not see the moving target equal awareness to pursue that target is accomplished through the physical design and reciprocity. The covered eye is denied the vision experienced by the fixing eye, but is still retains conscious reflexes, aware of the location and wants to act. By design, to function efficiently depends on the eyes working together as a team.

Experiment: For a better understanding of how the two eyes are designed to receive equal stimulation, place a divider made from an 8 inch by 11 inch cardboard, or other opaque material, between the two eyes of a friend. Have your friend look across the room and shine a flashlight into either eye. Observe the eye not receiving the light, its pupil will constrict. Remove the light and both pupils will dilate back to normal. The direct stimulus to one eye indirectly stimulates the other. They are designed as a team.

Instead of using a light, cover one eye completely and you will observe the uncovered eye to dilate, become larger. Whenever an eye is closed or occluded a message is signalled to the brain, "Dilate to prepare for dim or night vision." Vision actually is reduced, reaction time is reduced, pursuit movement is allowed, performance is restricted.

These two simple experiments confirm the interaction play between two eyes. They should increase your understanding of how the eyes are designed for teamwork. As an observing professional, whenever I see those shooters tampering with their vision I am appalled at what they may be doing to their performance and visual efficiency.

Sure, one eyed athletes do achieve in sports but do they ever reach their full potential? I agree with the writers of 'Tech Talk' in American Shotgunner, they don't think so.

Whether you choose to learn with one or two eyes, that is your choice, but remember, the components and visual requirements to break the target are the same. It seems, though, that if you have two of everything - use them. Your goal should be to develop those skills that will improve your scoring, shoot with consistency, who knows, you might make it to the top.

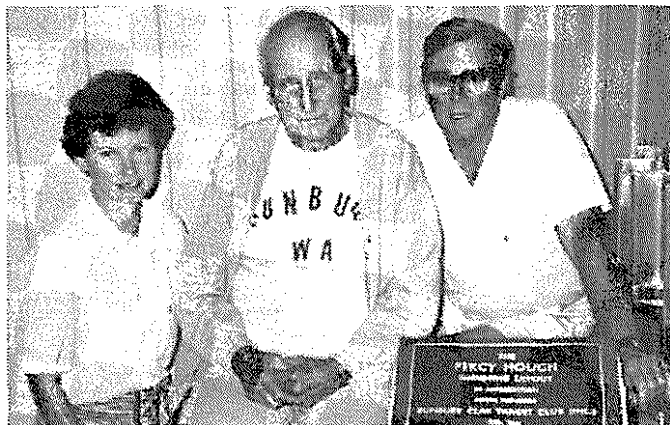
Members are extremely grateful for Percy's contribution and look forward to many years of use out of the new machines.

ECHUCA GUN CLUB

Echuca Gun Club celebrated its centenary on March 14th 1993 with 4 x 50t events which drew 70 shooters. Competition was very strong with top shooters attending from a large area.

Echuca Gun Club was first formed as a live bird trap club in 1893, although we haven't much information in the early stages until 1920, when shooting over traps became a regular sport. In 1933 the club moved to grounds within town boundary, which was home until 1980.

The club house was burnt down in 1937 which caused a recess until 1939 when the club moved out to Wharparilla Hotel, some 7 miles out of town. This move was for one year. War breaking out caused the club to be closed till 1946. When shooting restarted it was on the original grounds. A new clubhouse was constructed of red gum slabs with various extensions being added in following years. Clay shooting became regular every second month with live bird shoots on the alternative month.

1953 saw the second snipe clay trap installed and lights fitted to both layouts. Clays were shot every second Wednesday night with fields of 60 to 80 shooters competing. Some nights the fog became a problem but didn't stop the keenness of competitors in those days.

1959 live bird shooting was banned by the Victorian Government. Echuca held the last legal shoot in Victoria on New Years Eve.

A third clay trap was installed in the late 1960s. By the 1970s skeet was being investigated but the ground wasn't big enough so the club negotiated the lease of the adjoining paddock, which took years to eventuate, and was never used for competition. The local pistol club was using the range whilst preparing their own range.

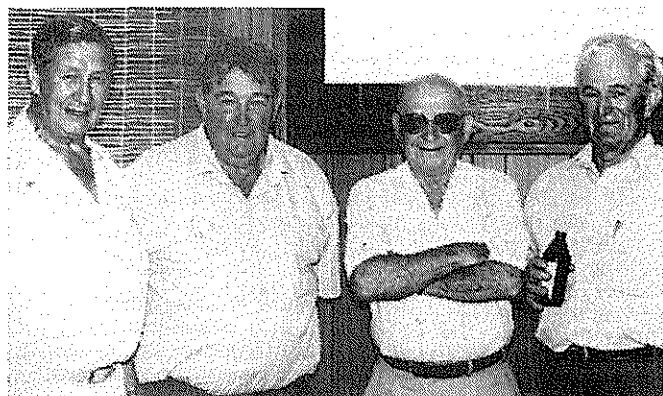
1978 a decision was made to look for bigger grounds which could accommodate more traps such as ball trap and skeet. Various grounds were inspected with suitable background being an important component, finally settling for grounds at Echuca West, which is the present day location.

In 1980 club members went about building a five trap layout, all equipped with lights and concrete tracks, and two skeet layouts and a modern clubhouse. To make this possible the adjoining land holder made the necessary land available.

Whilst construction was taking place the sale of the old ground was finalised and sold to Kreglinger Wool Company. November 1980 the new range at Echuca was officially opened.

1981 a full time resident caretaker was employed, the whole trap area was sown with lawn, State carnivals were hosted twice.

1986 Echuca was called upon to host the Australian National Championships. Club members rallied and another six layouts were installed making 11 layouts in all, complete with concrete tracks etc, also a new 10m x 12m toilet block was installed. All this was achieved without the need to borrow money. The 1986 Nationals saw record fields of nearly 900 shooters.

In 1987 the club purchased a tractor and mower to handle the increased area of lawn, ball trap was also installed that year.

1989 National Championships were again held at Echuca. Despite the very wet conditions they were again very successful. The club grounds are available for any future Nationals that may come to Victoria.

In 1990 the clubhouse was air-conditioned and sheds constructed for storage of equipment.

The clubs most successful shoot is our Boxing Day Carnival which has been going for over 30 years and attracts 130 plus competitors annually.

The 1993 Centenary Shoot was high gunned by local member Steve Atkins. Full results of the shoot may be found in the shoot report section.

CAN YOU REMEMBER?

1940-1941 early days of World War 2. I guess very few of our present day shooters would have been competing around this time. It was a period when our time and thoughts were fully occupied with other more serious business. Clay target shooting went into limbo. Unfortunately, the outbreak of war in late 1939 was a severe blow to our sport, as we were just beginning to form up nationally, however, a few clubs continued with the odd fund raising shoot to raise money for food parcels etc. that were sent to our troops overseas.

I am indebted to a fellow shooter who joined the old Coburg Gun Club on the same day as I joined to begin our shooting career at clay targets. His name is Jack McCraith and is well known throughout the shooting world. Over the years Jack has won hundreds of titles at all disciplines of shotgunning. He has supplied the following story of several events that occurred during the war years in Melbourne. During 1940 & 1941 large numbers of American troops began arriving in Australia before moving north to battle zones. During their stop over in Melbourne many of them from the 19th bomber group turned out to be clay target shooters at home. Apparently the US Air Force at that time used Trap and Skeet shooting as a part of training for airgunners. This type of shooting is an introduction to hitting moving targets.

Jack relates how he first contacted the Americans at our RAAF Station at Point Cook, the program for the day being Trap shooting using the so called tracer shells. This was a cartridge especially made by I.C.I. for training. Positioned inside the wad was a magnum pellet that lit up as the wad travelled behind the shot. The idea was to indicate where the shooter was pointing, relative to the target. Unfortunately, they didn't always work as wind would often blow the fibre wad off course. It was around this time that I.C.I. commenced to manufacture clay targets. The Americans spent many weekends with us at the Coburg Gun Club before they moved on.

Jack tells the following story of how he, with other members of the Coburg Gun Club, took a party of Americans on a duck shoot into N.S.W. on the Darling River. One of the party was a Colonel James Murphy, a very keen shooter who was later appointed judge advocate for the murder trial of American soldier Leonarduski who was later hanged for the murder and rape of a woman in Melbourne.

During the war years, also in the duck hunt party was a Captain Coudowan and five others. They headed for Menindee on the Darling for a couple of weeks hunting and fishing. At that time the Darling River was alive with Murray cod and ducks were plentiful.

Our American friends brought along a couple of army cooks and also an ample supply of petrol. This was a time during the war when petrol, to the average motorist, was available only in ration tickets. Hundreds of so called gas producers were fitted to cars and trucks, providing the only means of transport.

Jack goes on to talk about young shooters and their scores today. Jack believes that clay targets are easier to shoot today due to the fact that they are easier to break and guns are better suited to the game. He recalls how clays were often made by backyard manufacturers and quality control was far from perfect. Jack was President of the Coburg Gun Club for a period of years after the war - he talks about how the club used to rig up a large netting arrangement out front of the trap to catch targets that had not been broken - it was no surprise to pluck out many targets with 6 & 7 holes through them and not broken.

In the early 1950s Victoria was the centre of live bird shooting - a total of 45 registered bookmakers on an average of 4 shoots weekly. It was Jack's opinion that Australian shooters are among the best in the world.

Jack's original A.C.T.A. badge is No .31. He wonders if other older shooters have their original badge. Jack joined the A.C.T.A. at the age of 16 and is now aged 76. He says he has every A.C.T.A. magazine since then.

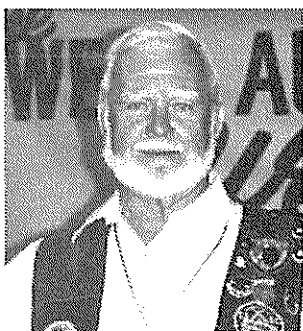
He relates how difficult it was in the period just after war ended, supplies of material such as clay targets, cartridges and traps were just not available until almost 12 months after war ended. Even then they had to be imported and were in short supply long after.

Jack recalls how a few dedicated shooters struggled to carry on the sport in post war. We were lucky to have as Secretary Bill McCullough who held the position pre-war and agreed to carry on in a voluntary manner until membership grew.

The Melbourne Olympic Games of 1956 was a highlight of our sport. It was our first try at International Trap. Our Two Man Team was selected from virtually one elimination event, resulting in John Bryant and Clem Mudford, two Victorian shooters, being selected to represent Australia. Winner of the gold was Bruno Rossini of Italy.

Several years after the Melbourne Olympics Jack visited Salamanka in Spain where Rossini was competing in big money events at live birds and winning. He was in fact a fully paid professional. How come these fellows are allowed to compete at Olympic Games? What chance do we have?

SHOOTER/COACH PROFILE



Name: Peter Field McBride
Date of Birth: 20-6-24

Commenced shooting:

I was asked to join the Eastern Goldfields Gun Club at its inception and I enjoyed the challenge shooting provided. I shot regularly between 1952 and 1965 before recommencing again in 1988. I had previously shot clays in the R.A.A.F.

Preferred discipline:

Trap mainly because I first shot this discipline, however, I enjoy skeet and have coached a number of shooters in both Skeet and Trap.

Gun details:

Remington 1100 in trap, as I sometimes 'freeze' when using an under and over. Strangely I do not have the same trouble with my under and over in Skeet!

Ammunition used:

Reloads at approximately 1300 eps, I use factory loads at the Nationals, although I find my own are just as reliable. Cost is a factor in using reloads.

Coach and support:

Roy Alexander was the first person to give me any coaching back in 1954, later Newton Thomas and Frank Bailey, and since rejoining the sport in 1988, Murray Alexander has been most helpful and supportive.

Successes:

Probably the most memorable success was winning the 1964 Commonwealth Double Barrel Sparrows, although I have won numerous titles and placings in Club, District and Zone Championships, I won the 1958 & 1960 WA Mixed Tgts Championships.

Favourite ground and home ground:

Whiteman Park is my home ground and the most favoured because of its top class layouts and backup. In general most

country clubs have better traps and atmosphere, although really, I am happy to shoot on any ground.

Highest breaks:

My highest break in trap is 174 and in skeet is 52.

Goals yet to achieve:

Just once I would like to make the Australian Open Team. I have always regretted being away from the sport from 1965 to 1987. I would also like to coach a new shooter to national level.

Advice to new shooters:

Have the gun fitted properly, then find a good coach and listen to the advice given.

Ignore 'helpful mates' and do not be worried if it takes time to achieve consistent good scores.

Concentrate on one target at a time and definitely not the last one shot at!

Frustration on the shooting tracks:

Some things which frustrate me while on the shooting tracks are:

1. Talkative shooters.
2. Referees poor gun safety.
3. Shooters who have no idea of etiquette.

If at practice, I stop the squad and call their attention to what they are doing, although in competition, I try to ignore them and keep concentrating on my own targets. If safety is bad, I would report them to the Shoot Marshall as soon as possible.

What influenced you to take up coaching:

A desire to help others achieve their potential as shooters and to promote the sport as a safe challenging occupation. Also importantly, to give back to the sport some of the pleasures I have had over the years.

Common skeet errors and ways to remedy them:

Wrong hold position and stopping the swing through at the moment of firing. Both these faults can be corrected by demonstration and coaching.

Common trap errors and ways to remedy them:

Some common faults:

1. Again stopping swing through and wrong feet position which prevents smooth swing through at extreme angles
2. Wrong gun mount to face and shoulder.
3. Gun cost.
4. Too high a point position on the traphouse.
5. Lack of concentration.
6. Sight focus too short.

Point by point coaching would be needed to correct these faults and the scope of the faults would vary from shooter to shooters.

Coaching problems and your remedy:

Shooters who do not concentrate or do what they are told, and secondly an outsider walking up and offering advice. Patience is the only way to handle the first point and a stern, but quiet order to 'butt out' for the second.

PROFILE ON RUSSELL MARK

Interviewed by Alan Maher

(Continued from April issue).

Alan: *Talking about Beretta, when you have to get some work done on your gun do you send it back to Beretta or is there someone on the local scene that you have confidence in?*

Russell: There are certainly some very good gunsmiths in Victoria, but I have been lucky enough to get back to the Beretta factory nearly every year for the last few years and I have had all my major gun work done there.

Alan: *Well, we have covered the greatest shooters, some technical aspects, general information, now let's get down to some of the things people want to know about the ACTA as an Organisation. You have been a member for a long time. Within the ACTA, what do you consider the future of clay target shooting in Australia really is?*

Russell: Well, I guess we are at the crossroads in a lot of senses now. We have had some problems with gun control etc, and a stage there not so long ago where a lot of people were being forced into the sport, but maybe for all the wrong reasons. I think the sport of competitive clay target shooting really has to look towards the sporting field to harness all of our resources in the one area. If the proposed UIT event of 5 stand sporting, which a lot of people haven't heard of yet, comes to Australia it's a direction I would love to see the ACTA control. There's a resource there where we can get a lot of Field & Game shooters shooting our discipline and it could become a UIT event within the next 4 to 8 years. It has to start somewhere and I would like to see the ACTA get a hold of it.

Alan: *I am pleased to say Russell that steps have been taken in that direction. Only early steps, but at least the wheels have been set in motion.*

What are your thoughts on a National Shooting Ground?

Russell: I think if we lived in Utopia it would be great. I hear a lot about a National Shooting Ground and where it should and shouldn't be, and I have heard places like Deniliquin or Downside or similar. Now I am sure they could be capable of building tremendous gun clubs, but I guess the reality is that we just haven't got enough shooters to economically find a National Shooting Ground viable. You need somewhere where you can have 20 DTL traps for instance. That's an enormous amount of ground needed. I just can't see that we have the shooters in the sport at this stage to do that. In my mind if the ACTA was ever to get some Government money to do it, you would put it in a place where you would get a lot of tourism, where you could take your family every year. Maybe a place like Sydney, the Gold Coast or Coffs Harbour, somewhere where you could fly into easily and take your family, but at this stage to be honest, I just can't see that we have got the shooters to economically find it viable.

Alan: *Do you think that with the grounds that we have in the various States, for example in Perth, where we all know they have got a magnificent complex, in South Australia the State Shooting Park is very capable of being developed into a very good shooting ground or the Brisbane Gun Club, which hosted the Commonwealth Games, or, that instead of a National Ground, we should be looking to establish a good facility State-wise in every State so that shooters in the State who might not want to travel to Nationals still do have the very best shooting facilities to compete under.?*

Russell: I am sure that is hitting the nail on the head. I think every State should set up a State shooting ground. I'm sure that would be a lot easier to administer and be more economically viable than one big ground that we would have to go to every year. The grounds like WA and SA are fine examples of what can be done, but I am sure that we are just not ready for that National Ground. Each State should really look at setting up one ground where maybe they could have all their State carnivals every year and use the current system we are using to roster the Nationals.

Alan: *What about rostering the Nationals? There has been a roster set up to the year 2000 and that means that the three Nationals will be taken around the various States. What is your feeling on that? Should we roster them around and take the sport to the people, to the shooters, or should we try and isolate some of these Nationals onto, say the eastern States, and ask the shooters every year to come to the one ground? What I am really saying is, should we take the sport to the shooters or should we bring the shooters to the sport?*

Russell: I think the system at the moment is working reasonably well. The DTL Nationals in Victoria, Queensland and New South Wales to every one in South Australia, Tasmania, Western Australia is fair. I would have one criticism, that is, I think it is nearly time to combine the Skeet and DTL Nationals. I don't think 130 shooters for the Skeet Nationals should be classed as a success and I think that if you put the Skeet Nationals on a couple of days before the Trap Nationals you would probably get a lot more people who would shoot both - I would certainly be one of them.

Alan: *Russell would you be prepared to give away some DTL targets to make sure that the Skeet shooters retained their 400 targets, or do you think that if you combined them both that we would have to do away with some Skeet targets, or alternatively could we lengthen the program by four days and turn it into a ten day plus pre-Nationals for both Trap and Skeet?*

Russell: Yes, I think that is the way to go. I don't think you have to substitute any targets. I am sure the ideal National DTL title isn't 50 targets, in fact I find that to be quite a joke because it's more of a raffle than an event to find the National champion. 50 targets just isn't enough and until we can find a way to shoot 100 target events, there's not much we can do about it. I find that generally, the people are happy at the moment with the format of the Nationals as they are and if you combined the two I think we would get a lot more shooters.

Alan: *Well, there has been discussions on that, but with the Nationals program set to the year 2000, there doesn't appear to be any sign of that happening in the short term, particularly over the next 6 or 7 years anyway. On DTL again, and our current handicap system - as you well know there has been a recent rule review and it appears as though the handicapping rule is going to be changed completely. What do you think of the current system? Forgetting the proposed new system, which you no doubt have some knowledge of, why isn't it working and does it need to be changed?*

Russell: Yes, I am sure it does. I haven't come across a competitive 25 metre shooter in 15 years of shooting now. I have seen some good performances put up from time to time off the 25 metre mark but I haven't seen anyone who has been able to handle it properly. It's always a problem when you look at the Nationals and the High Gun board there and see that there hasn't been a National High Gun winner off 25 metres for well over a decade. To me that just shows the handicap system isn't right. I think the biggest problem is that a AA grade shooter can shoot off 18 metres or off 25, that 7 metre gap in that group was just killing everyone at the Nationals. I find that at club level people just weren't willing to sacrifice doing the metre in a local shoot if they were going to go to the Nationals. It's a sad case of affairs but that was what really caused the demise of handicap shooting in Australia.

Alan: *On the ISU teams, what do you think of the current selection procedure, discounting the fact that there are amendments necessary in relation to the new ISU rules of 125 targets and the minimum qualifying scores as such? How was the selection procedure accepted overall - what are your feelings on it?*

Russell: I thought that the system that I had seen drawn up in the journal in November, 1991 was excellent. It was clear cut. Everyone saw it in black and white and they could understand how the teams were picked. In a year such as this where it is not really having any bearing on who gets to go to the Olympic Games or what quota spots will be selected, the system was great. First past the post is exactly what people are looking for. They can see that this year the door is open for anybody to virtually start their stepping stones towards the next Olympic Games - I hope that format follows on.

BREAK BADGES

April 1993

Alan: *There may be a slight problem there Russell. The UIT magazine gave indication that for the first time ever there will be quotas in 1993, country quotas for the Olympic Games shot at the World Trap & Skeet Championships - 1 Trap, 1 Skeet and 1 Double Trap - so if that is the case, a revision may be necessary as the format was devised on the basis of first past the post subject to justification because there were no quotas involved. Do you feel that because there are quotas involved, we should be sending away our very best shooters to get those country quotas, or should it still be an opportunity for somebody to come up through the ranks?*

Russell: We have to leave the opportunity for new people to get involved in the sport and that's the reason I took the sport up because I could see that was how it was going. We must allow new people to get into the Australian team, and of course at the ISU Nationals they are going to have to perform very well to do it because it's not just a matter of a shooter walking up and making an Australian team. Over 6 days and 375 targets you are going to at least have to show that you have the capabilities of being able to represent Australia.

Alan: *It can happen though Russell. We have seen examples in 1991 where a young Victorian shooter, Matthew Howden, around 17 years of age, shot very well in Adelaide and came into the Open National Training Squad in around about fifth position. Matthew could have shot himself into the team, being a member of the National Training Squad.*

Russell: I think the difference between 5th and 3rd at a Nationals, when a three man team is selected, is very great. I mean, there would be a big difference between the 3rd best shooter in Australia compared to the 5th best shooter, when only the top 3 represent Australia.

Alan: *That's the ISU teams, what about the DTL and Skeet teams? As you know we are entering into agreements with other countries where Australia and New Zealand have already started the ball rolling. We have sent teams away to Wales to contest the Van Diemen Trophy, where Australia had reasonably good success. Didn't win, but shot very well. We are going to do that on a bi-annual basis - that's for DTL, and we hope to have Skeet teams going away every second year. What is your feeling on that?*

Russell: I thought this year's Nationals in Wagga were excellent simply because there was that added bonus of making the Australian team, and I am sure the DTL and American Skeet shooters certainly deserved to have the opportunity of making a team. I thought also that it was an excellent way to select a team. That's what people are after, whether it's an ISU team or an Australian, DTL or Skeet team. There is an enormous amount of personal pleasure being able to represent Australia in any discipline and I would like to see that continue.

Alan: *Just closing, obviously being a member of an Australian team is a very proud occasion for anybody and I am sure one of the greatest memories you will ever have in the sport is the fact that you were selected to represent your chosen sport as a member of the Australian Team. It would be a great feeling.*

Russell: There is no doubt, I can still remember the round that I had to shoot to get into my first Australian team and that feeling will never go away. I suggest to any new shooter if they were going to take the sport seriously, to set a long term goal of making the Australian team. It gives you the opportunity to travel around the world to meet a lot of very good people and see the other side of the sport. I couldn't recommend it more highly.

Alan: *A last word of advice, Russell. To me the message is loud and clear, there is a fair bit of dedication necessary. Obviously you need to have ability. Don't get involved in politics. Don't get carried away with too much of the mental things. Put your best foot forward. Put the effort in and if you have the ability it will shine through and you will get the results.*

Thank you Russell for the time spent in giving us an insight into your views, which I feel sure will be of interest to all who read this.

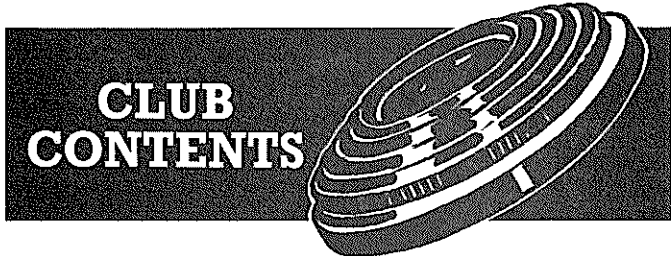

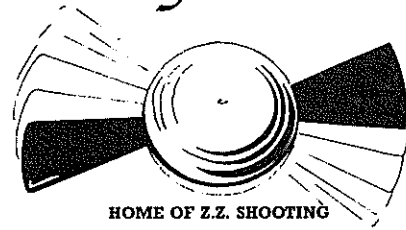

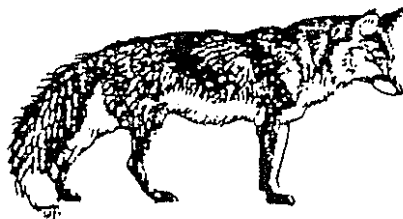
