New Zealand visit

Recently Allan Kenny, Robert Nugent and myself visited New Zealand to meet with the executive of the New Zealand Clay Target Association. I believe our meeting to be the most positive meeting that has been conducted between our two associations and as a result shooters in both countries will benefit greatly.

Discussions took place on the establishment of a revamped Glenn Cup teams match. The emphasis will be on a higher profile for the event, and each participant being selected as an international representative. More on this as the criteria is formalised.

Both associations will endeavour to provide their shooters with package deals to enable them to travel to each others nationals. Each association has given an undertaking to carefully address each others rules, with a view to introducing similar rules (trap and skeet) in both countries.

The CTSN and Gunshot (New Zealand's magazine) were compared and it was agreed that articles of interest to both should be printed in each others magazine.

A full report of this meeting will appear in a later edition of this magazine. Many other issues of joint interest were discussed.

DTL World Championship

News just to hand is that the first World Championship in DTL shooting will be held in England in September 1994.

The International Council of Great Britain & Ireland met recently and agreed the broad outline plans for the event which will be conducted over 200 targets. Entries will be on an individual basis, with teams nominated from participating countries in each of Seniors, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans. Precise dates, venue and details will be decided in the coming months.

Executive Director

As you read this magazine the position of Executive Director will have been filled. A large number of applications were received for the position from people of exceptional qualifications and experience. The selection of the successful applicant was a difficult one for your executive and with the support of all shooters, their introduction to the sport of clay target shooting should be a pleasant one.

C.T.S.N. Shoot Calendar

C.T.S.N. in future will contain a calendar of State, National and International Championships in all disciplines. This will be consistently updated as dates and venues are confirmed.

Skeet Nationals 1993

Dates for the 1993 Skeet Nationals at Wagga were changed to 16, 17, 18 & 19 September, so that a three person team can be selected to participate in the World Skeet Championships in San Antonio, Texas in October.

Trap Nationals Veterans High Gun

The winner of the Val & Fred Horton Trophy over the six National Championships will be regarded as the Veteran High Gun winner and will receive the Royal Blue High Gun Sash.

Rules

As from July 1, no I.S.U. shooter can be downgraded until the end of the calendar year 1993.

Ball trap shall be shot under A.C.T.A. Rules. Where ball trap is used for I.S.U. Eliminations, U.I.T. Rules shall apply.

Wording changed in rules 4.5, 4.7 etc, from legal target to 'standard target'. Note will be included in rules that recommended target be a straightaway from lanes 1 & 5 and thrown 48 metres.

Finance

\$5,000 be provided in the budget for promotion of A.C.T.A., National Championships, and International Teams through Inspired Concepts Pty. Ltd.

There will be no increase in subscriptions or per capita payments to the states for 1994.

The budget for 1993 was approved.

Promotion & Development

The National Office will soon be offering a service to clubs by supplying shirts and caps with club logos. The office will also print and supply flyers to clubs advertising club shoots from advertisements placed in the C.T.S.N.

A three monthly interim membership will be offered to new shooters for \$10. If after the three months the shooter wishes to continue in the sport, the \$10 is deducted from his registration fee. If he does not continue, the \$10 is not refundable.

Australian Shooting Association

Bill Jones NSW (2 years) and Graham Mahoney Vic (1 year) were elected as A.C.T.A. delegates to the A.S.A.

ACTA Talent Squad

The meeting accepted in principle a proposal from New South Wales for the establishment of a talent identification squad taking in all disciplines of clay target shooting.

1994 Trap Nationals

The 1994 Trap Nationals will be conducted at Brisbane Gun Club from April 9 to April 14.

New Executive Director

The meeting confirmed the position description and financial package for the appointment of the new Executive Director.

Many other matters were discussed by the Committee, the results of which will become noticeable over time.

NOTICE TO ADVERTISERS

Clubs intending on advertising shoots being held very early in the month, are advised to advertise the details in an earlier edition to that of competition, to avoid disappointment of the material not reaching the reader in time.

Of the yes answers, 13 favoured Easter, 3 during school holidays, 3 early March, 3 October/November, and 2 April. The other 3 did not suggest a time.

- Eighty one respondents made comments.
- Twenty complained about the quality, variety and prices of the food.
- Six asked for phono pulls at Trap Nationals to overcome slow pulls and need for paid referees.
- Five asked for grade High Guns.

Other comments included nominations too high, 10 traps at all Nationals, practice too expensive and too far away from competition traps, National Grounds, no National Grounds as they like to travel to all states, better system of nominating and squadding, scoreboards too slow.

U.I.T. WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

At 11.30 pm on the 5th June 93, the second contingent of the A.C.T.A. Team boarded an Alitalia 747 bound for Rome with the World Cup in Milan and the World Championship in Barcelona. David Cunningham, Craig Meuleman, John Summers, Glen Hayden and myself settled back to wait out the 22 hour flight, with only a short refuelling stop in Bangkok to interrupt us.

Upon arriving in Rome, we disembarked out on the tarmac and were bussed into the arrivals area and the waiting customs and police. It was here that we learnt the art of filling in the firearm forms, Italian style, as had our first group some days prior. The delay seemed unnecessary to us, but on seeing the many and varied cultures passing through the customs, we accepted their situation for what it was and patiently completed each set of forms. This delay caused us to miss our connecting flight to Milan, but as it is a so called 'shuttle run', the Alitalia staff soon had us on another flight.

Once at Milan Airport, we were met by a member of the Italian Federation. After our luggage had been located, we were quickly despatched to our hotel (called the 'Jet') at Malpensa, being some 40 minutes down the Autostrada. It was here we joined forces with Russell Mark, Michael Diamond, Geoff Mark and Dexter Barnes, who had arrived before us after competing in the Beretta Cup.

With the two groups joined, Michael informed me that his shooting bag had not arrived with his case and gun. Alitalia was doing a search. The general consensus was that as Michael's last lost item (ex New Zealand) had gone to Fiji, his bag had to have gone to the Riviera. We never did learn for we duly received a message only of where to pick up this piece of wayward luggage.

Next morning the team was bussed to Fagnano Shooting Grounds and viewed for the first time, a magnificent shooting facility. It consisted of 6 ISU Trap and Skeet layouts against a dark green forest of trees set into a low mountain range. Training got underway and by that afternoon, all looked right for some good results.

With training completed, we effected a quick change before being taken back to the town of Fagnano and the Opening Ceremony. All attending countries lined up and paraded through the narrow cobbled stone streets before re-forming in the town centre facing a very ancient Municipal building, complete with a waterless moat.

Competition got underway in hot and humid conditions and from the beginning, the scores indicated the high skill levels of the competitors. At the end of day one we were looking good with Michael equal leader (74/75), Glenn (72/75) and David in the skeet (70/75). With hot and humid conditions continuing, the event concluded with Michael in the finals (122/125) behind Pelliello of Italy (124/125).

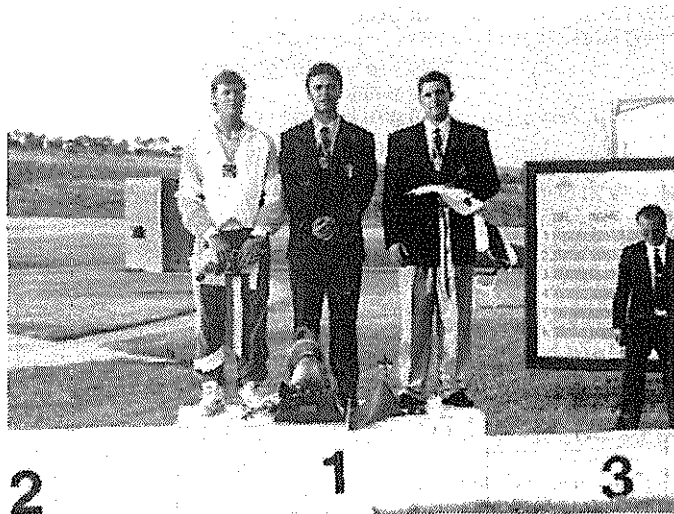
The finals were something else with the Italian TV network having 4 OB (Outside Broadcasting) units in place to give direct broadcast to a stated 60 million people throughout Europe. The trap final saw Michael shoot his way into 3rd position with a 146/150 and David miss the skeet final on a countback to be outright 7th (117/125). Other scores of note were Glenn (116/125) - MQS and Geoff (112/125) MQS.

Training started the next morning for Double Trap and with Desiree having arrived the previous evening our World Cup Team was complete. With conditions overcast and humid, the Double Trap began. Resulting scores showing how some countries have taken his relatively new match to heart and selecting specialist shooters. At days end, George Digwood of Great Britain had set a new World Record of 186/200 and Susan Natrass of Canada a 138/160. Australia shot well with four MQS's being gained by Geoff (121/150), Russell (123/150), Glenn (125/150) and Michael (130/150). Desiree being placed 7th with 93/120.

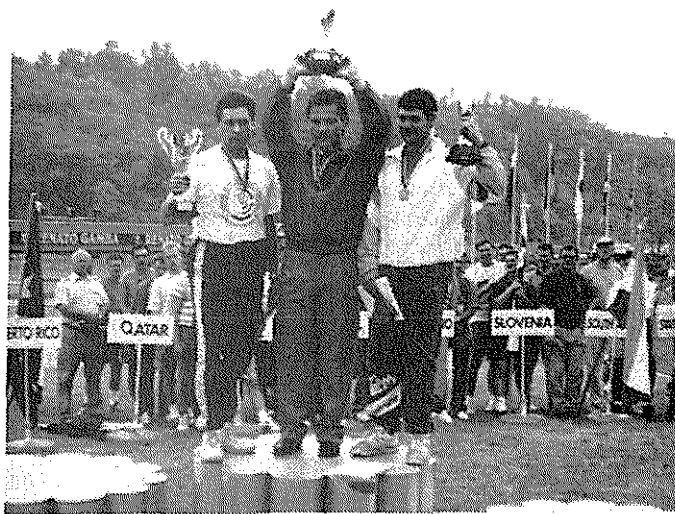
After a 5.45am departure from our hotel, we cleared Milan airport with a minimum of fuss bound for Barcelona. An hour and twenty minutes later, we were all lined up waiting patiently again as the immigration officer readjusted our passports with the correct entry visa. While this was taking place, a long queue formed of others waiting to clear customs. We were glad to finally escape to our luggage, as some of the people in the queue, very loudly voiced their opinion with what we believed was a lop sided view of our 'parents heritage'.

With the assistance again of Gina's (of the home office) carefully assembled documents and the Spanish Federation, we cleared customs and were taken directly to the shooting grounds at Mollet del Valles. Upon arriving at the grounds all the firearms were placed in an armoury where they would stay until the team member shot or was leaving to return home. While this was happening, nominations and other administration duties were handled before we gratefully headed for our hotel some 20 minutes away.

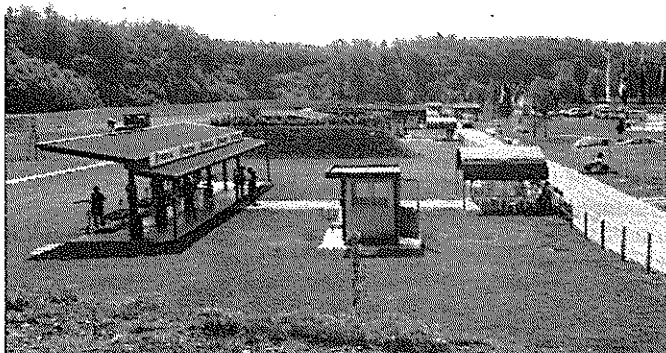
John Maxwell had joined the World Championship Team replacing Geoff in the Open Team and together the trap team undertook training. Mollet del Valles Shooting Grounds, the venue of the 1992 Olympics, consist of 3 beautifully lawned layouts with a different background to that of Fagnano. As in

Italy, we completed training and after a quick change headed for the Opening ceremony, which like Fagnano was held in the town centre. Unfortunately for the competitors and officials, we all had to stand for nearly two hours before the parade started, making for a lot of very tired people.

A record attendance of 33 countries and 152 individuals had nominated. The trap competition started sharp at 8.00am in hot and humid conditions. As the day ended, John Maxwell had carded a 74/75, Michael 72/75, Russell 71/75, Glenn 69/75 and Desiree a 71/75. The finals for the trap ended with the Open going to M. Venturini (Italy) 148/150. Ladies G. Usieto (Spain) 117/125 and Juniors to J. Lakatos (USA) 122/125. Australia came in 4th in the teams with Michael 121/125 (9th), John 120/125 (13th), Russell 118/125 and Glenn 120/125 (6th Juniors). Desiree with a 115/125 came 9th in the Ladies.

With the Double Trap training out of the way, competition got underway at 8.00am with a lot of new faces arriving into the top teams. At the end of the day, these specialist shooters had pushed to another new world record with J. Lakatos (USA) 191/200. Glenn Hayden in the Junior division was smoking along and going into the last round, was high on the leader board. At pair 21 and again at pair 23 he faulted, but Glenn's professional attitude and dedication showed through and he won a silver medal after a shoot off.

A display rarely seen by a referee nearly turned the Ladies final into a riot, when he became erratic in his decisions of hit, miss and 'dusted'. The assembled crowd actually stopped the shoot until the necessary and ongoing corrections could be made. Australia recorded 4 MQS's being Russell (129/150), Michael (133/150), John (136/150) and Glenn a 137/150.

Training day for the skeet arrived and this signalled the departure of the trap team from sunny Spain to the cold of Australia.

As with past events the skeet got underway at 8.00am. After 5 days our team was anxious to put good scores on the board. This they did and at the end of the day Australia was equal team leaders and John Summers was equal first place. The extra work he had done with his new Beretta, had paid off with 74/75. David was right on his tail (73/75) and Craig a 71/75. At the final count, we had let one too many slip away and the event went to D. Clark (USA) 149/150, another world record. Ladies to S. Diomiva (Russia) 122/125 and the Juniors to U. Frontini (Italy) 123/125.

Australia finished 7th in the teams with John (120/125), Craig (119/125) and David (119/125).

June 21st arrived, in all too quick a time. After clearing customs we settled back for a short flight to Rome and then that 22 hours to home. Well, that was our plan, however Alitalia had another. After arrival in Rome we were finally advised that they had misplaced our 'Jumbo'. It was found and eventually some 7 hours later we gratefully lifted off.

If you think that this story had a happy ending . . . guess what? I and the Skeeties landed at Terra Australis - Melbourne, found the guns had decided to have a holiday away from their owners and remained in Rome.

THE NEW WINCHESTER 24 GRAM LOADS

The third load in the new Winchester series of target loads is made up of three cartridges, all carrying 24 grams of shot, and designed for the UIT disciplines of trench and international skeet.

It wasn't all that long ago that shooters were free to use 36 grams for trench, and the movement down through 28 grams and now to 24, which is $\frac{7}{8}$ of an ounce, is seen by many as a drastic one, and for good reason. 24 is after all only two thirds of 36.

However, the same can be said of this that has been said already of the 28 gram movement in down the line trapshooting. It certainly is a change, but that's all it is, because everybody's under the same handicap. If it affects you, it equally affects the people you compete with.

Now, the cartridges themselves; all three of them are loaded in size $7\frac{1}{2}$, and the 1350 is offered in number 7 as well. The number 9 load is to be found in the standard antimony 1300.

To begin with, there is the International 1300, which is loaded in the gold case with the standard hardness of shot. Then there is the International 1300 in the red case; it features the new, higher level antimony shot which is stated by Winchester to be six percent and which has been discussed in detail in the test run in the last two issues of the ASJ. Lastly, there is the International 1350, to be found with a high base in the black case, and also having the high antimony shot.

When moving to seven eighths of an ounce in a 12 gauge, the shooter enters a whole new context, and it tends to create its own rules. Some general points should be made about it.

It is certain that patterns of this light weight may be more efficient than people are aware. Consider the physical size of the charge, for instance.

The standard shot weight in Australia has long been 32 grams. In my experience, many people are reluctant to use less than this because they think they will lose killing power in their ammunition on a ratio'd basis as the number of pellets in the cartridge declines.

This is a long way from true. The fact is that all sorts of other influences exist in the cartridge than just the raw number of pellets it contains. When the drop is made from 32 to 30 grams, the efficiency of the pellets may be greater in the lighter load than it was in the heavier. In other words, more pellets may start off in the heavier charge, but they may be so deformed along the way that they don't arrive as a useful part of the pattern.

One possible reason for this is that while the 32 gram load is longer than it is wide, the charge of 30 grams in a standard 12 gauge bore is fairly close to square, that is, about .730" in height and width.

And, when a further drop to 28 grams is brought about, then patterns may become even more efficient; could it be because the charge is actually undersquare? Perhaps it could; it seems to follow that the shorter charge has more room to move to rearrange itself as it goes through the trauma of chamber and choke cone passage, and not only that, but a smaller percentage of the pellets will be forced into abrasive contact with the hard surface of the bore.

In the matter of the 24 gram load, the charge is a long way undersquare, and so much so that Winchester has produced a specially designed wad with a dome-shaped protrusion that stands up from the floor of the shot cup and which causes the shot when loaded into it to have a concave base line.

This may have a marked effect on performance in its own right; the time allocated to this test has not been sufficient to separate the effects of this wad out from the other specifics of this new cartridge.

However, the 24 gram load taken as a whole when put through the usual three-quarter choke test barrel gave patterns that were very significantly tighter than are usual for other cartridges in the Winchester line used in the same barrel.

All three cartridges in the trap sizes gave patterns ranging between 70 & 77%, when the usual for this barrel is between 60 and 65%. This indicates a marked tightening of choking effect.

Just how marked is best summed up this way.

Taking the several different Winchester target loads, in 32, 28 and 24 gram shot weights, and ignoring the antimony contents of the different loads, I averaged out the total strike of the 7s and the $7\frac{1}{2}$ s in the thirty inch circle at forty yards which has been fired out of this barrel.

Disregarding pattern percentages, the three figures are very interesting: the average number of strikes for the 32 gram load was 264; for the 28 gram load it was 212; for the 24 gram load, it was 223 – in other words, there were more actual pellets in the downrange pattern with the 24 gram load than there were with the 28 gram.

It wouldn't surprise me if the average non-patterning shotgunner were to shake his head in disbelief at this, but those who look for advantage and monitor their guns' performance will understand at once that this is quite on the cards. The lesser amount of shot is being used far more efficiently than the greater amount, in this case.

And it may well be in your case, also.

All three of the 24 gram loads have the same propellant in them, one unavailable to the reloader. It tends to make their pattern characteristics similar, and I suspect that the wad, also common to all three loads, has a big effect as well.

Pattern quality in all of the 24s was consistently higher than normal, and into the good range on the Oberfell and Thompson five point scale of poor, fair, normal, good and excellent. This helps confirm my belief that the differences between the loads are fairly subtle.

A comparison conducted between the two 1300s showed the high antimony version to have patterns six percent tighter at forty yards through the .025" test barrel. This was using $7\frac{1}{2}$ shot, and I suspect that most people will come to favour this size in the high antimony offerings as being one way of keeping the pattern count up at full range at rapidly retreating trench targets.

There are several things to say about using these loads in competition.

The first is that I have no doubt that chamber cone work will become more and more popular as people seek the pattern density improvement that it can give if properly done.

In any shooting context when it is feared that the patterns may be sparse, it is obviously important to save every pellet possible. A trench shooter who isn't listed amongst the quick ones may find it awkward to put in a second barrel with effectiveness that he once used to when cartridges were heavier. The chamber cone work, because it has the likelihood of further reducing shot distortion, will often increase the pattern density very nicely.

Another thing that is important here is that when people begin using the lighter loads, they should check the point of impact that they have against the standard loads that they've been used to, and see if there's an alteration.

In one gun, the 1350s gave me a mean point of impact over ten centimetres lower than with either 32 or 28 gram loads.

This is a known phenomenon and it is no criticism of the new cartridges. What happens is that the high speed coupled with the reduced muzzle flip combine to leave the muzzle pointing lower at the instant of discharge, and as a result the pattern falls lower on the target. This phenomenon depends very much on the individual gun. In many under and overs, the upper barrel is the one most affected.

To conduct such a test with a tightly choked trap gun, just take some paper and shoot at a mark on it from about twenty-five metres, preferably a series of three, then draw a circle freehand around the pattern and mark the spot where the centre is. Observe the three in relation to the point of aim; average them, and that will give a good guide to where the gun is shooting. Don't forget, the figure will increase at a full forty-yards. It can be surprising how far different loads will walk up and down the pattern sheet.

The remedy may be as simple as using one cartridge rather than another, or it may be necessary to do a little stock work to adapt to a new point of impact altogether. If this is the only ammunition used through your favourite trench gun, this shouldn't matter.

To sum up, this line of cartridges is made with the usual Winchester attention to detail, and when properly used will give good service. In my testing they were all found to pattern with well above average quality, and although new to the Australian market, and of a style we have never had here before, they are specialist loads which are more than capable of doing what they've been made for.

The following committee positions were filled: President Mr Col Willis; Vice President Mr Tom Wellington; Secretary Mr Harrild (Hal) Linton; Treasurer Mr Ken Green; Range Captain Mr Charles Selke; Purchasing Officer Mr Gus Buerchler; Assistant Secretary Mrs Betty Buerchler; Publicity Officer Mr Mick Roche (elected at subsequent meeting 26/9/67); Patron Sir George Fisher; Vice Patron Mr J. Foots; Trustees Mr Gus Buerchler, Mr Ken Green and Mr Tom Wellington.

December 3, 1967:

First trial shoot at Kalkadoon Park.

December 7, 1967:

Affiliation with Australian Clay Target Association sought.

January 7, 1968:

First official shoot at Kalkadoon Park.

April 3, 1968:

Board of management gives permission for the erection of a building at Kalkadoon Park.

June 22, 1968:

Official opening of Mount Isa Gun Club.

July 20, 1968:

Club house is moved to present site at Kalkadoon Park.

October 15, 1968:

First Annual General Meeting of the Mount Isa Gun Club.

November 3, 1968:

First organised and official night shoot.

July 14, 1974:

Committee decide that juniors may join the Mount Isa Gun Club if they wish.

July 13, 1975:

Decision is made to erect an honour board.

December 12, 1975:

Decision is made to allow social members to join the Mount Isa Gun Club without being required to join the A.C.T.A.

April 1976:

First Royal Flying Doctor Service Charity Shoot.

July 11, 1976:

Motion by Gus Buerchler that Mount Isa Gun Club discuss the possibility of skeet shooting being conducted at the club.

November 14, 1976:

Mount Isa Gun Club orders a set of skeet traps.

October 11, 1977:

Skeet traps have arrived and installation is in progress.

October 25, 1979:

Reduced nominations for ladies, juniors and veterans introduced.

July 6, 1980:

Motion is passed at special general meeting that a new clubhouse be erected at Kalkadoon Park.

September 15, 1980:

Decision is made to cease using paid scorers. Club members to be utilised instead.

February 16, 1982:

Decision is made to install telephone at clubhouse. Motion to purchase (1) club trap gun and (1) club skeet gun passed.

February 24, 1985:

New clubhouse officially opened by David Woodall, Patron of Mount Isa Gun Club, and is named in honour of John Newman.

August 28, 1985:

Visitors book introduced for all charity and novice shoots. Visitors to sign book prior to shooting.

February 29, 1986:

Practise trap installation and commissioning completed, and practice trap now fully operational.

June 7, 1991:

Mount Isa Gun Club becomes an incorporated body.

March 16, 1992:

'D' grade is re-introduced.

May 15, 1992:

Motion is passed to purchase (4) Miroku 9000 Trap Guns as High Gun trophies for 1993 25th Anniversary Shoot.

March 21, 1993:

18th Annual Unisys Royal Flying Doctor Service Charity Shoot.

June 12, 13 & 14, 1993:

25th Anniversary Shoot and Copper City Championships.

GUN REVIEW: BERETTA SUPER TRAP

Beretta's Super Trap sets the pace for DTL

Beretta's successes in the clay target shooting world goes without saying. The oldest manufacturing dynasty in the world, nearly 500 years old, has certainly moved ahead of its opposition since the introduction of the 682 series boxlocks. The fore-runner, the 680 series, set the pace for Beretta but it never realised the popularity and success enjoyed by the later 682 guns – the 682 Super Trap is certainly no exception!

Upon arrival, I was not quite sure what to expect. Once the packaging had been removed the deep navy blue hard case shooters have long come to recognise had itself taken on a new look – it was re-shaped with tighter curves at the corners and slightly curved sides. The familiar combination lock and twin fastening clips were still in place, as was the full length hinge. After opening the case I was certainly confronted with something different, pieces of combs and extra rubber butt pads which first appeared as a mystery. A closer inspection was to reveal all!

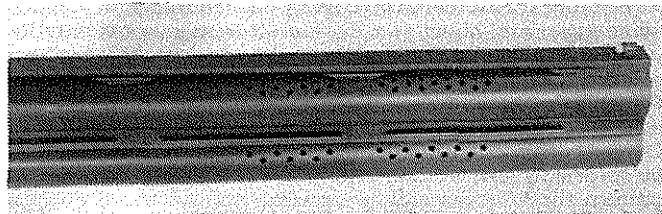
The smart, satin finished silver action was the same but a red handled screw driver floated about in a compartment separate to the barrels and stock/receiver. This was the key to the mystery and upon inspection of the receiver/stock it became evident the extra slivers of walnut were interchangeable combs of varying heights whilst the assortment of recoil pads presented different thicknesses which could be interchanged to adjust the length of the stock. The Beretta Super Trap was certainly different from what I expected. A glance at the barrels realised these had also been ported. Now this was certainly an amazing direction for one of Europe's biggest gunmakers. A close inspection of the chambers also showed that Beretta had gone as far as they dared to lengthen chamber forcing cones, whilst remaining within the strict rules of Italian proof. Proofed to 1200 kg/sq. cm the Beretta Super Trap sports 2 3/4" chambers and is built to withstand the highest practical pressure from fast burning trap loads.

At a glance

To those, such as myself, who are familiar with the 682 series of Beretta sporting arms the Super Trap maintains all of the magnificent features which have seen Beretta as the top selling guns throughout the world. Their popularity in England and America has seen the Australian distributor, Olin Australia, (namely Winchester), often without stock the demand for Beretta guns is so high. The replacement hinge pins, trapezoid shoulders and their keeping with world trends in trap and sporting shooting innovation have assured Beretta as the market leader. The Super Trap is testament to the progressiveness of the company and its willingness to keep abreast of current trends which provide shooters with exceptionally well made guns for a moderately premium price. Although a little beyond the means of some shooters they are, in my opinion, guns which produce the best shooting results from very ordinary shooters. Unfortunately the uncertainty of the Australian dollar has meant that prices have increased but I am led to believe Beretta shotguns are cheapest here in Australia, certainly when compared to the UK and the USA. I also firmly believe a Beretta 680 or 682 shotgun is a gun which can always be appreciated for its long-lasting design and excellent materials of construction. This further assures they are an investment for a life-time of shooting.

The barrels

The barrels are coated with Bruniton, (a teflon-like finish), rather than blued. This provides excellent protection from rust and an extremely serviceable surface for the laziest of shooters. The 5mm high rib is ventilated and posted directly onto the top barrel. This exposes the greatest amount of barrel surface and provides the utmost of cooling. The 10 mm wide, parallel rib was fitted

with a white barrel-type bead sight fitted just short of the muzzle and a smaller brass bead fitted well short of midway. This is a standard type sighting system found on most trap guns of recent manufacture. A cross-hatched anti-glare pattern was applied to the rib to avoid distracting reflections and provide the utmost sight picture for total shooter concentration.

Probably the most startling innovation with the Super Trap is the barrel porting which is very prominent. This appears to be high voltage electrical spark-discharge induced rather than drilled. The pattern has obviously been given a great deal of thought for the Beretta design is reported to reduce recoil in the vicinity of 11-15% and reduce muzzle flip between 40-55%. The porting holes are arranged with 23 in the top barrel and 16 along the bottom, a design which Beretta has obviously tested extensively to provide the utmost in desirable affects. The ports begin 24" from the end of the breech and finish 2 1/4" short of the muzzle – just as the chokes of the 29 1/2" barrels begin. Beretta, no doubt, have figured trap powders have completed most of their burning by that stage so the wad and shot column have been imparted with the necessary momentum to form a sound pattern, as the projecta passes through the choke, whilst maintaining good muzzle velocities to break targets. (Testing of the Super Trap, along with other similarly ported guns, did show a slight drop in muzzle velocity but a significant decrease in recoil and muzzle flip – there has to be concessions made somewhere!) I will state though targets were smashed to pieces by this gun, especially when using high velocity 24 gram loads.

Although the barrels were only 29 1/2" I was somewhat amazed they only weighed 1.490 kg. This might have been as a result of the barrel porting although I believe Beretta could have gone the full 30" to pick up the necessary weight for a trap gun, in my opinion around 1.55-1.60 kg. (Winchester specify barrel weights from 1.5-1.60 kg, although they do receive lighter barrels in shipments which seem just as popular). Although the barrel porting does noticeably tame muzzle flip the barrels should be of a suitable weight which provides smooth swinging and follow-through momentum. Lighter barrels, in my experience, tend to stop the gun after it has been fired, for they do not have the weight and consequent momentum to keep the barrels moving – thereby enabling the shooter to automatically follow-through their target. The other side of the coin is that lighter barrels initially move quicker, provided the shooter does not 'jump' the target, and if high velocity loads are combined follow-through is not so important – I suppose it all depends on your own preference and shooting technique. Ventilated side ribs complimented the barrels and would assist with barrel cooling as well as reduce wind resistance when shooting at quartering targets.

The chokes of the Super Trap measured full for the over barrel and improved modified for the under. The exact values have been included in a Table 1 of this presentation and detail dimensions and pattern percentages using 28 gram, high antimony loads – as used by top shooter, Russell Mark.

Beretta are bound by very tight laws of proof and as a result popular modifications, such as overboring, are not permitted. Beretta have evaluated the virtues of forcing cone lengthening though and have taken their new specifications as far as Italian proof laws will allow them – most Beretta competition guns now have 20 mm long forcing cones, a significant increase over the 7 mm former forcing cone length. The virtues of this modification

includes the reduction of perceived recoil and the tightening of patterns, for less pellets are deformed as they pass from the chamber into the bore. The decrease in perceived recoil is resultant from the reduced resistance the projectiles (wad and shot column), encumbers via longer and flatter forcing cones. Of course all of this happens within a handful of microseconds but after shooting a gun with such modifications there is a noticeable difference.

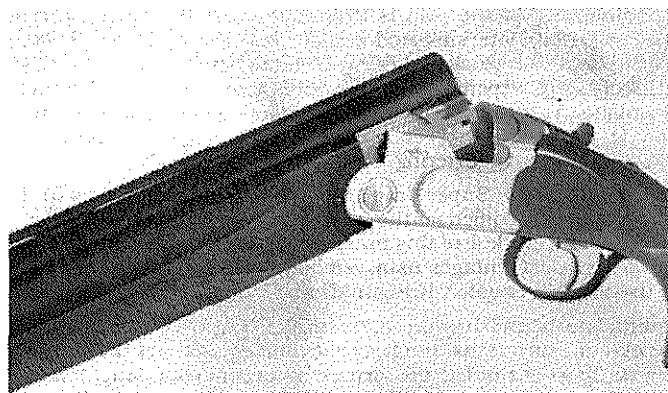
The extractors on the Super Trap are typically Beretta and were precisely timed and positive in their action. The bifurcated jointing system places the barrels into a lower profiled receiver than is possible with an under-jointed gun. This ensures a close hands-in-line feel about the Beretta and coupled with the balance Beretta have been able to achieve with the 682 models these guns are truly a pleasure to handle. Two pins protrude from the receiver wall upon closing the barrel as the top lever moves across, toward centre. These provide the locking mechanism and ensure the integrity of the gun – it is a proven system used by Beretta for many years.

Replaceable hinge pins and shoulders on the 682 Beretta, including the Super Trap, are conveniently designed for easy replacement should the event arise. Such attention to design and practicality have won Beretta many followers amongst shooters and gunsmiths, alike.

The receiver

The receivers of all 682 Beretta shotguns are forged and finished from the one piece of specially formulated tri-alloy steel, (nickel, chromium and molybdenum). This is later especially heat treated to improve wear-resistance whilst a final treatment developed in the Beretta laboratories seals the receiver and provides excellent resistance from corrosion – the reason why Beretta 682 receivers remain so clean and attractive for so long! The 682 Super Trap has very little cosmetic change with the exception of the black trigger guard which has 'SUPER' stamped in guild on the bottom. The trigger has a pleasing shape and is adjustable to enable the shooter to comfortably set the pull length from the pistol grip, although I do wish Beretta would supply the blade screwdriver required for this task. Both trigger pulls were crisp and measured the same – 3 ½ lb. The top of the receiver was blackened and finished with an anti-glare stipple to compliment the anti-glare sighting plane of the rib.

The top lever was similarly stippled before being given an anti-glare finish that was closer in colour to that of the Brunton coated barrels, rather than the greyish finish found on the top of the receiver. Its shape and thumb-bearing surface were pleasant to the 'feel' for they were smooth and rounded. The tang mounted safety catch fitted to the Super Trap is non-selective, (as is to be expected), and was quite difficult to move back and forth on the test gun, (it would no doubt eventually wear-in from new). Anyway, most shooters will simply place the catch in the 'fire' position for it is not automatically activated when the action is broken.



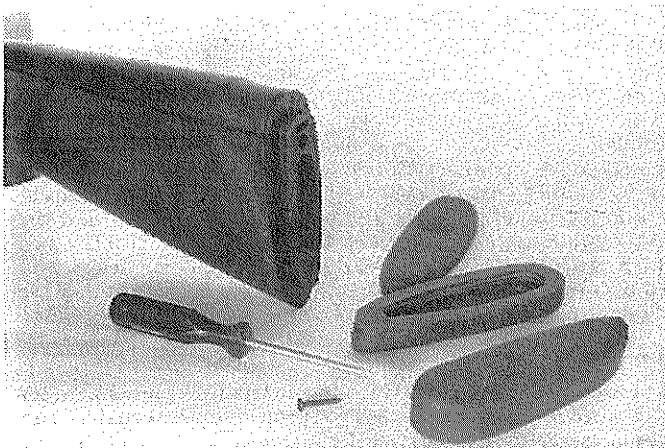
The receiver and woodwork are typically Beretta 682, with the exception of the adjustable stock – certainly a great innovation from one of the world's greatest gunmakers.

The inner mechanical parts of the receiver were well finished with coil springs loading the hammers. Beretta have successfully used this system with their boxlock actions for many years now and the trigger mechanism lends itself well to adjustment, by a gunsmith, should the trigger pulls need to be lightened.

The stock and forend

The stock and forend were well matched for colour. The stock of the sample Super Trap had quite a deal of figure and was finished, as was the forend, in a satin polyurethane finish. Checkering appeared to be machine-cut and ran 20 lines/inch. The pattern on the forend was excellent for it provided a wide coverage for most hand sizes whilst the pistol grip pattern, I felt, was a little narrow. The pistol grip of the stock was typical of Beretta – a high, well curved grip that provided an excellent hands-in-line feel about the gun.

Interchangeability with the comb and butt pad are certainly new directions taken by Beretta, possibly to compete with the plethora of interchangeable stock hardware found on the American market. The three height settings attainable with the combs provided have been listed in Table 2 accompanying this review, for the combinations with the interchangeable butt pads are too extensive to list here. It was obvious Beretta had given a great deal of thought to the concepts of comb and butt pad interchangeability for they have gone to a great deal of effort to provide something different. It is quite unique how the combs slide forward once the retaining screw has been loosened, (after the butt pad has been removed). The simplicity of both interchangeable systems is a credit to the minds in the Beretta designing team. Whilst I found the combinations easy to manage they are restricted to the three combs and three pads supplied. *Although most shooters will find a suitable height and length to adopt I can't help feeling the benefits should also include cast.* At the moment this dimension has not been included. Crompton has an adjustable pistol grip whilst Kreighoff have a totally adjustable comb. I feel it also reasonable to suggest at this point that regardless of the type of adjustment you have, if you do not have the gun set-up by someone who knows what they are doing, all efforts will be in vain! The Super Trap obviously has an advantage over guns which have no adjustment but I would not go so far as to say it offers the ultimate, just the best on offer at the moment! It is indeed fortunate that Beretta have utilised a black spacer to separate the comb slivers for, as must be expected, the combs do not all match in colour and grain – the black spacer at least breaks the contrast. It was pleasing to see they provided the phillips head screwdriver for the comb and butt pad adjustment, it may only be a matter of time before they finally provide the screwdriver for the trigger foot adjustment!

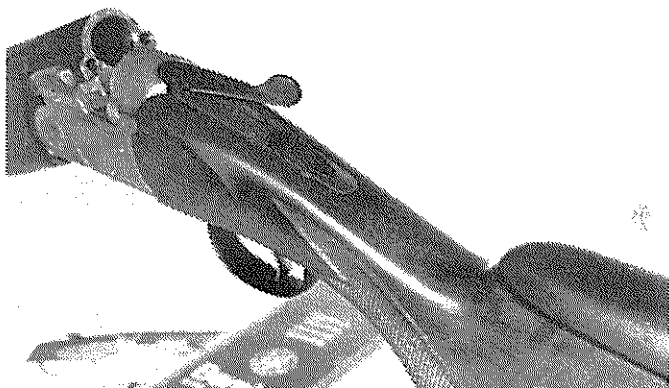


The basics of the adjustable stock from Beretta, also includes a screw driver to affect alterations. All pads and comb slivers are provided with the gun.

Conclusion

I found the Beretta Super Trap to be a very well made and designed gun, well suited to DTL. The barrels were 1.490 ported, (which is the lighter end of Winchester's specifications), although a search through racks at gunshops will yield guns with heavier barrels if a heavier barrel is preferred. The barrel porting is quite a step for Beretta but they have obviously realised the benefits, in fact they have even published the benefits in English magazines. Forcing cone lengthening just about goes as far as Beretta can, within Italian proof laws, but their commitment to introducing new models with the latest technology is testimony to the greatness of Beretta. I feel their new adjustable comb and butt pad innovations are great, for the person who may not be able to afford a custom stock, but it is a little restrictive as cast has been omitted. The methods of interchangeability is brilliant and given more experience with this concept I feel sure Beretta will eventually offer the ultimate option.

Shooting the Super Trap was a pleasure during testing. It handled 24 and 28 gram loads with ease. I felt it had a preference for 24 gram loads as super fast 1 350 loads used during tests smoked targets, seemingly with a minimum of recoil. The muzzle blast from the porting was as expected although all shooters and referees should wear ear protection. The realised comfort and reduction of muzzle flip, when shooting a ported gun, far outweighs the noise factor, especially when good hearing protection is worn. Basically, I found the Super Trap a marvellous gun to shoot and I would have no hesitation in recommending it to other shooters who seek the most from an off-the-rack competition gun, but shop around for I feel there will be significant differences in prices between stores. Good luck and safe shooting.

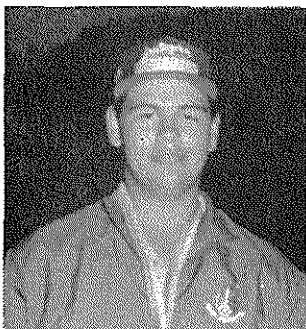

Promotion at it's best !!!

An initiate idea, passed around at a zone meeting in early 1992, to promote the sport of clay target shooting and get people to participate came to fruition with an overwhelming response on the 20th June.

Rod Prior (the maker of fine furniture) from Tamworth put forward the initial idea of making a television commercial to promote a 'blanket' coaching/intro day, covering all clubs within the Northern Zone Clay Target Association. Money? Cost? -with the help of N.B.N. Television's new office in Tamworth, a figure of \$2,000 was established to A) make the commercial and B) put the adverts on the television.

After another zone meeting it was agreed that every club within the zone would be charged \$4.00 per head of affiliated shooters within their club - to raise the required amount plus a 'bit extra' to cover participation certificates, handout brochures etc.

And the money flowed in - not one club was late with the payments - all paid and the project was up and running.

The date was set for Sunday 20th June and the advert was made.

The Zone Committee compiled a handbook, which ensured that every club was doing the same thing at the same time - e.g. day commences at 10.00am with a cuppa, welcome talk and signing of the visitors book and so on.

The program was set at 50 targets, all the same, with a fee of \$15 to cover the targets and the necessary shells - all single barrel. Each club then made their own decision regarding charging for lunch or providing it free. Press releases went out and parcels of certificates and brochures also went to every club in the week leading up to the 20th.

The day arrived - great conditions - and the people flocked in - 68 at Tamworth, 38 at Guyra, 31 at Coffs Harbour, 22 at Yamba, 56 at Newcastle, just to mention some. Every club was over the moon, and although not all clubs have returned their survey forms, at the time of this report, verbal indication is that over 400 people, new shooters and novices, attended zone wide.

The zone had already set the 29th May 1994 as the date for the next year, with fingers and toes crossed that the 1993 day would be a success.

The N.S.W.C.T.A. Executive met on Saturday 19th June - the day prior - and the Northern Zone delegates took along the video of the advert, the Executives clapping and congratulating all round was the icing on the cake. So impressed were they, that the 29th May 1994 ill be an introduction/coaching day for every club in the state!!

Every zone has picked up on the television advert, and with the help of the Northern Zone, will put together their own activity plans, using the Northern Zone's guidelines, brochures, certificates, etc. to help them. The N.S.W.C.T.A. has very generously given each zone \$400 to go towards their promotion exercise - for which all zones are very grateful.

To end off - all clubs are now turning to their guideline booklets, and under taking the section - follow up. So we are now hoping that if at least one from every 10 who attended actually joins up and continues within the sport, things will look much brighter in Northern NSW, and we know that we have made a concerned effort towards attracting new shooters.

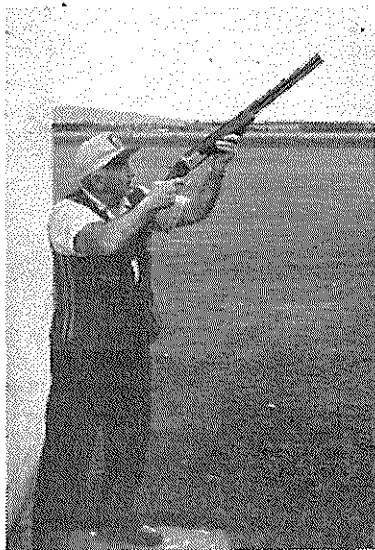

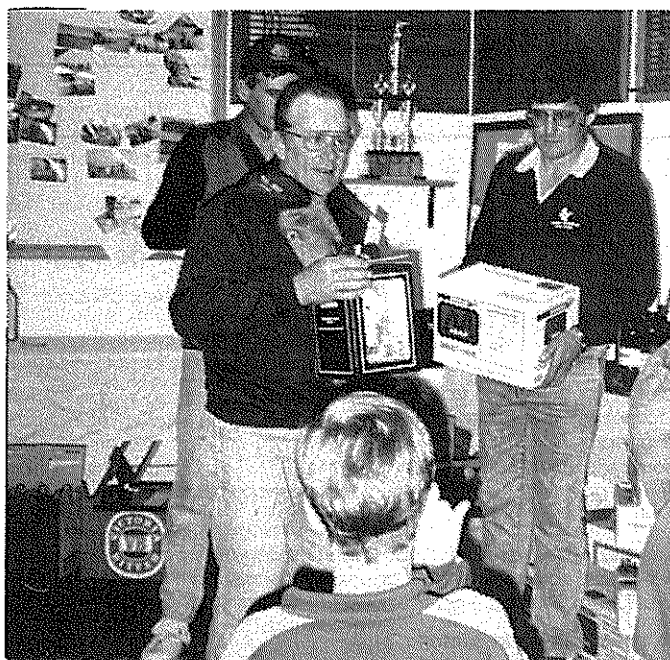
MOUNT GAMBIER GUN CLUB

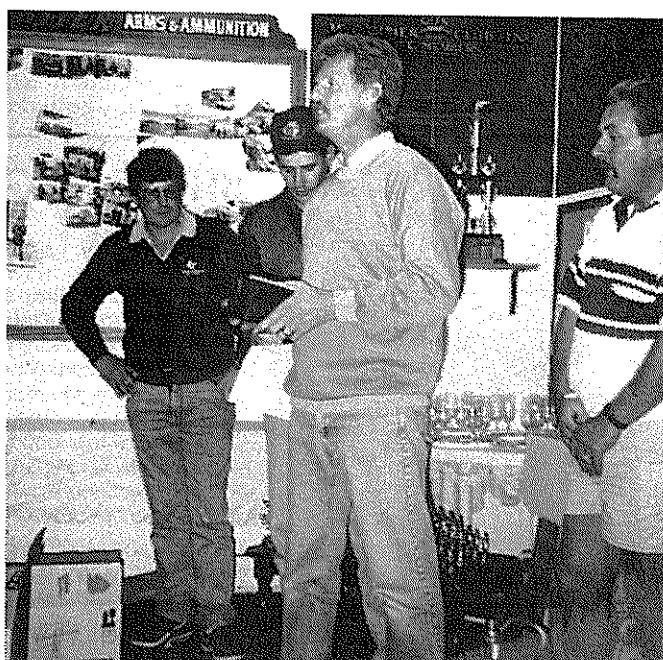

Sunday highlights

Sundays 'Police Club/Make a Wish' shoot has certainly secured its place as one of South Australia's biggest shotgun events with in excess of 130 trophies for shooters of all grades and abilities. With all eyes clearly focused on the huge array of trophies shooters from all over South Australia and Victoria set forth to do battle in the fifth annual charity shoot. Bob Andrews lead the field early taking Overall and AA grade class of the Pointscore Championship with a perfect score of 81/81. David Flavel finished the day with an unbeaten 100/100 winning the AA grade and Overall prize in the Double Barrel Championship. However it was south west Victorian shooter Phil Britten who demonstrated nerves of steel in taking a winning double of the Overall and AA grades in both the Medley Championship and High Gun awards who scooped the pool and went home with an impressive trophy haul that included a microwave oven and return trip for two to Sydney. A grade honours were evenly shared between Adelaide shooter Vern Beyer, St Arnaud shooter Gary Devlin and Geelong's Brian Hunter. Local shooter Chris Wright dominated the B grade section winning all three events and the High Gun, a performance that has almost certainly earned Chris a promotion into the A grade competition. C grade was keenly contested all day with victories being recorded by veteran shooter Cliff Mayberry and up and coming shooter Ken Atkin.

During the days shooting there was a special class especially for members of the police force. Allan Vilcins of Mount Gambier Station had a narrow 1 point victory over Mildura's Neil Phipps in the regular shooters section whilst local policeman Bob Moulder showed his fellow station mates how to do it in the non regular shooters section.

Over the days competition the Annual Police versus Gun Club Shield Trophy was also contested. With both teams tied at the end of the qualifying round a shoot-off was required to determine the winners. In what a gun club spokesman described as dubious circumstances the police team emerged victors by several targets.

The final event of the days shooting was the Annual Media Challenge trophy. This year saw the emergence of a new force in the media shotgun shooting when the SE Telecasters team outshot two year reigning champions the ABC by two targets. The Border Watch team finished a narrow third only a further one target afield whilst for the first time in the history of the event 5SE was unrepresented.

LADY CHAMPIONS OF OUR SPORT

Over the last decade or so lady shooters have been given much more encouragement to take up clay target shooting, both competitively and for just good fun. In most cases they are encouraged by a member of the family who are already involved with both trap and skeet shooting. However one thing does bother me; as a coach I see many of the ladies struggling with a gun that does not suit them. In most cases the gun used was either hubby's or the brother's gun and is far from fitting her; it being too long; wrong pitch; unbalanced; too low at the comb, etc. When this is the case the poor girl will never shoot well. She will suffer bruising of her face and shoulder, but worst of all she will never be able to control or point the gun accurately. Added to these problems is the fact that she is seldom given correct instruction and coaching. It must be remembered that a woman will usually have a smaller body frame than the male, thus she must be specially fitted, otherwise she will never be able to score well and enjoy her shooting as she should.

I well remember teaching my own two daughters, Barbara and Jennifer, using a 20 gauge auto. I would give them valuable practice at shooting moving targets by bowling paddy melons over the surface of grassless clay pans. In this way they could see where the shot pattern landed and how important it was to lead the target. It was very pleasing to them to see how the melon splattered when hit. My having two daughters who took up shooting clay targets and became very good at the sport has given me an urge over the years to see other females take to the game and do well. When it is all boiled down there is no reason at all why the ladies cannot shoot just as well as the men. This is a fact that is now being proven in other countries world wide, however they must have everything going for them.

Some time back I approached a lady shooter from Kerang who I had known since she took up shooting in 1980. Her name is Faye Burton, husband Ken is the manufacturer of the well known 'Ibis' range of clay target traps.

I was petrified of guns when I first met Ken Burton in October 1979, but after travelling to a lot of gun clubs with him and scoring for squads, he convinced me to have a shot. I am a natural left handed person, but when Ken showed me how to mount the gun to the shoulder, he put it on my right shoulder and I have therefore always shot right handed. I never knew there was any other way.

I fired my first competition shot on May 1, 1980 at the Cohuna Gun Club in a 10t novice event and shot 4/10, I was delighted. I didn't think I would hit anything, I was so scared.

In October of 1980 a coaching day was held at Deniliquin Gun Club and Ken took me along. Newton Thomas, Pud Burgess and Barney Rooke were the coaches. Barney told Ken the pitch of the gun was wrong for a female and jacked the back out with a piece of cardboard. I improved out of sight, actually hitting 7/10. About one month later George Biggs came to the Kerang Gun Club and told Ken the gun was too long for me. He measured it up and told Ken to cut $\frac{3}{4}$ " off the stock. It was Ken's gun not mine (a Grand European - Winchester) and we were only going together (I was still Faye Taylor then), however Ken went home and chopped $\frac{3}{4}$ " off the stock.

The next weekend we went to Frankston Australia Gun Club and I shot 59/60 in a pointscore event and won my first Overall Sash without even having to shoot off. George Biggs had been right, I never looked back.

Over the next 12 months I went from C to B grade and from 11m to 14m. In 1982 I made the Victorian Ladies State Team and came second in the National Ladies Double Barrel Championship in Adelaide. When AA grade first came in, January 1992, I was only in B grade, but on Australia Day of that January at Cohuna Gun Club I shot the best that I have ever shot, still using the same Grand European Winchester gun, and was regraded to AA grade, the first woman to do so. Following a shoot off with Russell Mark at Kerang Gun Club in a single barrel championship which I won 37/37 at night, Russell congratulated me and called me AA Faye, a name which has stuck.

Since then my list of achievements have grown and below I list some of the major ones, although not necessarily in order:

Won selection in 8 of the last 10 years of Victorian State Ladies DTL Team; Won selection in the Australian Ladies Mackintosh Team on 5 occasions; Won selection in the Open Australian Mackintosh Team in Tasmania 1990; Won the National Ladies Double Barrel Championship twice - 1985 and 1990; State Ladies High Gun on three occasions; Ladies section winner of the National Single Barrel, Pointscore and Champion of Champions on numerous occasions; National Ladies High Gun winner at Tasmanian Nationals; Member of 1st Ladies Trench Team to compete in Oceania Games; Won individual silver medal at those games.

Summary

The person who has helped me to succeed in the sport I love is the one who introduced me to the sport, Ken Burton.

The shooter I admire most in shooting is Russell Mark, because although he has made it to the top, he still finds time to advise and help coach the youngsters or anyone else who asks. He is a great ambassador to our sport.

My biggest thrill in shooting was making the Open Australian Trap Team and making the Ladies Australian Olympic Trap Team to the World Championships.

My biggest disappointment in shooting is never having made the Open State Trap Team, yet making the Open Australian Team.

World Championships

Being one of the first three women to represent Australia at the World Championships would have to be one (if not the) proudest moments of my life. Although I personally did not shoot as well as I had hoped for, I did the best I could on the day. I would love to have the time over again and know what I know now.

The other competitors were no different to us except they spoke a different language, although they all had specialist coaches, team coaches etc and we had none. The only real training we had was 1 week at the 'Institute of Sport' so considering we came 4th in the Womens section as a team, think of what we might have done with a bit of solid coaching.

Desiree Huddleston shot the best of us and was unlucky to not make the cut in the double trap. We didn't even know what the cut was going to be until the day we shot. However it was a great experience and one I will never forget.

More recent shooting feats

May 1992 - Broken Hill Gun Club, shot 235 straight for Ladies Australian Break Record (as yet has not been beaten).

April 1993 - International Gun Club, SA (Nationals) 3rd in Ladies National Single Barrel, after losing shoot off with Los Lloyd.

April 1993 - Mildura Gun Club, shot 179/180 in shoot off for A grade (came 2nd) actually missed 200th target, break wise counting e/o etc. Although I shot really well all weekend (shot 7 possibles out of 15 events) I won nothing but they gave me 2 metres extra handicap. I am presently AA 20 metres.

My pet hate is those people who believe that women should not be allowed to compete at international level (and there are plenty of them prepared to tell you).

COACHING COUNCIL

Visualisation is becoming a very important and powerful tool in any athletes skill repertoire. To further explain Mr Peter Smith, Northern NSW Zone Coach has put forward the following article in way of explanation. I recommend it to you and hope it will assist with the improvement of your performance.

Mental Rehearsal

By P. T. Smith, Northern NSW Zone Coach

Most people have heard 'mental rehearsal' mentioned but I wonder how many really understand what it is all about or how to accomplish it.

The topic of mental rehearsal needs special attention because it is possibly the most important psychological activity that can be employed prior to a competition.

Mental rehearsal has an increasing effect on performance as the level of competence of the shooter becomes higher. Thus, it will be only marginally effective with young and/or inexperienced competitors, but, it will be extremely important in affecting an experienced shooters performance.

The reason that mental rehearsal works is that in imagining an impending performance, the body is physiologically and mentally predisposed to perform.

A few points to be noted are:

Competitors should be familiar with the area of competition so that features from the area (trap house, shooting lanes, sky, trees etc) can be added to what is imagined.

Always mentally rehearse a complete round. Mix the targets up (left and right swingers, straightaways, quartering etc).

Each imagination should yield a positive and desired result.

At least one rehearsal, preferably more, should precede a competition performance.

The rate of rehearsal should approximate the actual intended speed of the performance. Never in a hurry nor in slow motion.

The capacity to mentally rehearse takes time to learn and each individual can eventually do it in their own way, so here is an example of how to go about it.

Sit back, close your eyes, and vividly imagine the following scene. It is a bright and sunny afternoon at your local club trap layout, you are number three shooter and number one shooter has just broken his target, number two shooter is preparing to call for his target and you are starting your concentration build-up by saying to yourself, see the target, catch the target, fire, see it break and follow through, (or whatever you have worked out for yourself to get your concentration onto the task at hand). It is your turn to shoot, so, mount the gun, call, break the target, open the gun, take out the empty shell, etc, etc, using the same routine you usually adopt. Repeat the procedure until a full round of 25 is completed and you are satisfied with the result.

Mental rehearsal is a skill to be learned and it takes practice. You need to think in pictures, not in words. Not telling yourself to break the target, but seeing it break.

This is a brief explanation of a very lengthy subject and I hope it helps those shooters who were wondering what it was about.

WACTA COACHING COUNCIL

Level 1 Accreditation & Refresher Course

The West Australian Clay Target Association held a Level One Accreditation and Refresher Course on May 8th & 9th which was sponsored by the Ministry of Sport and Recreation.

There were six candidates wishing to undergo accreditation, plus other accredited coaches in attendance coming from various parts of the state who wished to upgrade their skills and knowledge as a coach.

The shooters wishing to undergo accreditation were Rod Graham (Boyup Brook), Les Hall (Peel & Dist), Ray Fuller (Busselton), Bruce Maley (Northam & Dist) and Jeff Green (West Australian).

The Level One Coaching Kit was unveiled and presented to each of the candidates and was well received.

The lecturers covered a multitude of topics over the two day weekend. The topics included the role of the coach, basic instruction methods, skill acquisition, psychology, physical conditioning and fitness, mental preparation, relaxation, attention and concentration techniques.

The practical side of coaching was handled by John Harris the Northern State Coaching Director and he was assisted by Mr Vince Marney (Bunbury) and Des Neale (Esperance), who were called in at very short notice and each did a fine job. Thanks also must go to Mr Peter McBride for supplying a few 'guinea pigs' for the occasion.

Some of the interesting points raised during the seminar among many were:

Many shooters like to practice, but were they practicing effectively or just shooting targets?

Practice should be where a shooter has identified a shooting problem and they then formulate a plan to work on to correct it. A club coach should be able to help identify the problem and advise methods to overcome it.

Home grounds may provide a good environment for skill development but this may not allow development of automaticity in other settings.

In other words, if you set your sights on becoming a good shooter, then you must be prepared to do some travelling and be prepared for changes in background, climate, standard of equipment and facilities.

Regular exercise is important, as this will help your reflexes, reduce your fatigue and stress factors in competition. It was suggested that isometric exercises may help, but there are dangers in this form of exercising, only those muscles and joints which are to be used specifically for shooting need to be exercised, if useful gains are to occur. Stretching exercises before training and competition prepare your body for the coming activity. It is wise to stretch those muscles that are involved in the activity plus any that are under increased stress because of position e.g. back muscles.

Stretching should be done slowly to a position of slight discomfort and should be held for 10 seconds. Repeating your stretches after activity will help to minimise stiffness and muscle soreness.

As a coach you should help the shooter stick to and concentrate on the process of performing and not the end result, the rewards will come at a later stage.

The most effective style for coaching is where a coach can appreciate the strengths of the shooter and can accommodate their idiosyncrasies and accept their own position in the overall pursuit of peak performance.

Goal setting is a common phrase used at seminars by psychologists etc, but as shooters and coaches we tend to believe it is a waste of time, but if used correctly and often enough it should give a systematic way of going about what we want to accomplish.

The seminar was very informative and it helped identify some of the problems the coaches, especially those under instruction were going to have to face and how to deal with those situations when they arise.

Next year more seminars will be programmed for both Level 1 and Level 2 coaches.

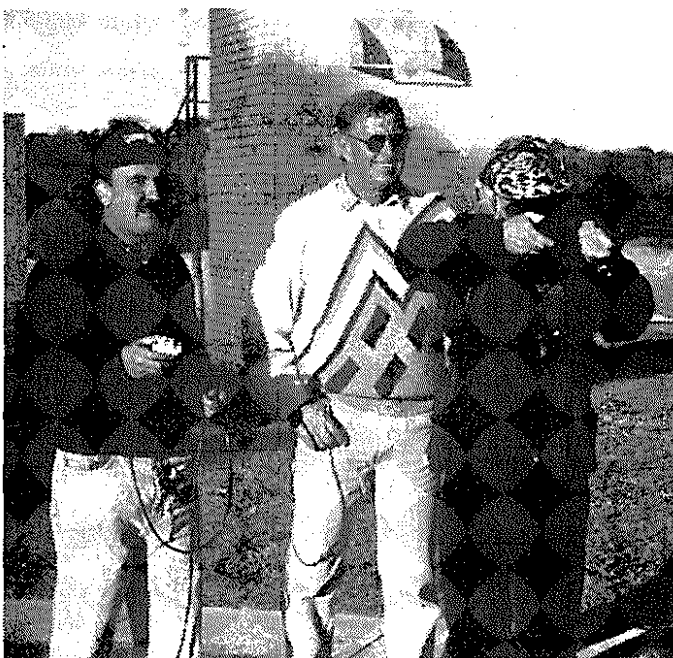

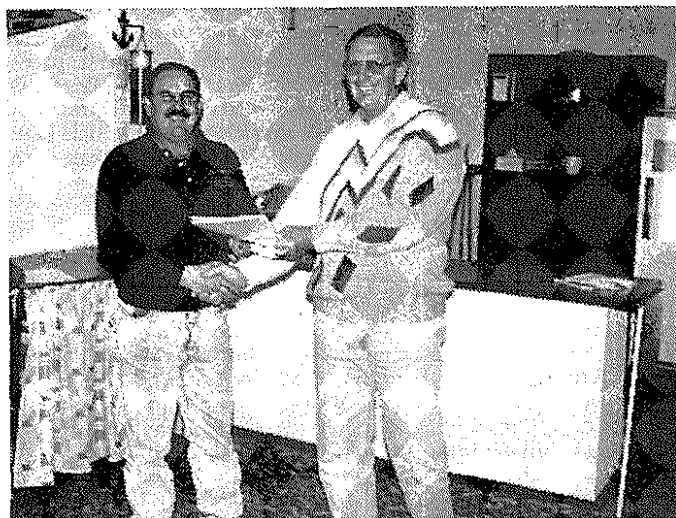
Approximately 3.30pm the visiting shooters from Carnarvon did a fly past the club on their way back home.

However, Jeph died suddenly five days earlier; and when the sash was presented, Peter handed it back and suggested that it hang in the club-house "in memory of a good sport."

Peter could have said two good sportsmen.

Jeph had been a Wonthaggi Gun Club member for over 20 years.

Son-in-law Wayne Parks of Inverloch is president. Jeph's three sons, who live locally, have been president (Graham), secretary (Ian) and on committee (David).

For years Jeph's wife Dorothy, provided the sponge for the cake with which Wonthaggi programs conclude. Mrs Kent, her daughter and daughter-in-law have put in hours in the club's canteen. Mrs Kent and Jeph also sponsored an annual event.

Jeph enjoyed all forms of field shooting, and relished friendships formed in the field and at trap. Many associates from the Gippsland trap circuit were at the big funeral.

Jeph was a 49 year member of the Masonic Lodge. His great grandfather selected most of the Kent country at nearby Dalyston in 1879 when the countryside was a forest. Jeph and his father added farms at nearby Kilcunda and Woolamai.

Jeph is best remembered around Wonthaggi as a great full-back with Dalyston in the 40s and 50s. He also filled the position in local league teams and in the country team which was never beaten by the town (Wonthaggi). His kick-in was once marked in the centre of the normal sized Dalyston ground by another 6ft. 15 stone team mate who, with another magnificent kick, goaled. The pair got great distance with drop kicks that employed more toe than instep.

Jeph was a member of the Dalyston hall and recreation reserve committees, and did a lot of voluntary work when the disused hall was shifted to the reserve and underwent a transformation and became the district's top dance hall.

His sporting interests in recent years were indoor bowls, shooting and fishing.

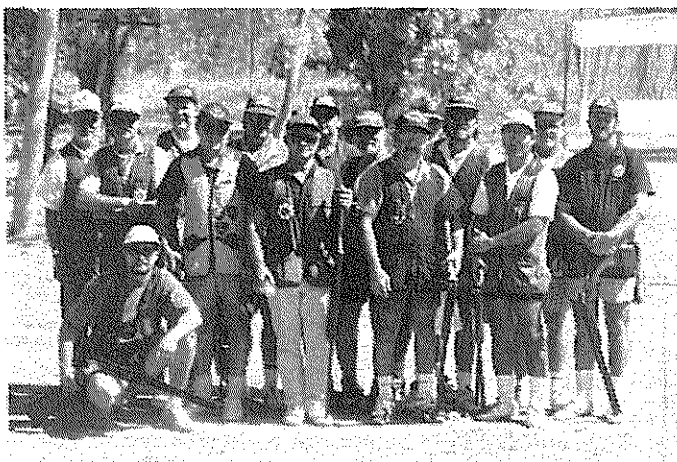

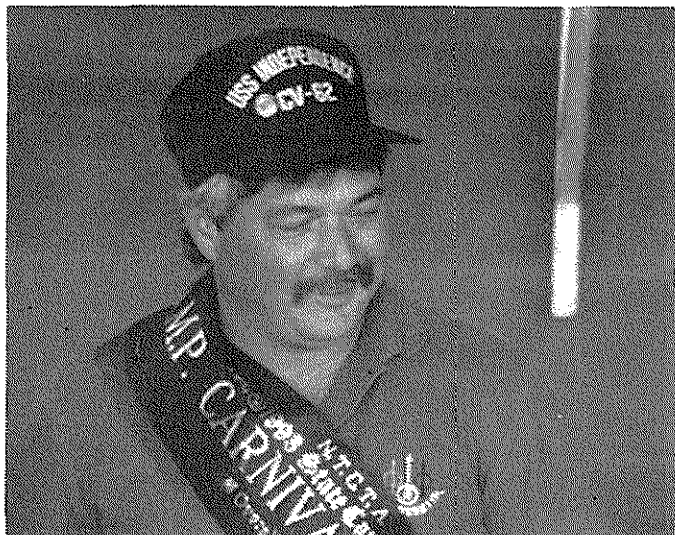

1993 NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

Conditions of Entry

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 25, two visits to the traps.
3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF TARGET shall be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and or score throughout the period of competition. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.
14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s), and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition. High Gun over 400 targets of the National Program.
17. The Overall Winner in any event shall not be eligible for additional recognition in any Grade or Section (full nomination). Competitors other than the Overall Winner in any event shall be eligible for recognition in any Grade or Section in which they are eligible to compete (full nomination). Competitors entering in any specific section of an event shall only be eligible for recognition in the section entered (reduced nomination). ONE NOMINATION ONLY MAY BE PAID-OPEN OR SECTION.
18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.
20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
22. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

Handicap Cards

Nominations will not be accepted from any shooter who cannot produce a stamped handicap card or have the handicapper approve the reason for not being able to do so.

The issue of a duplicate card by the handicapper will incur a charge of \$20. All shooters from AA to C grades must present their card to the handicapper for stamping prior to nominating.

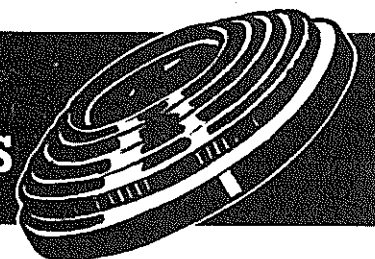
