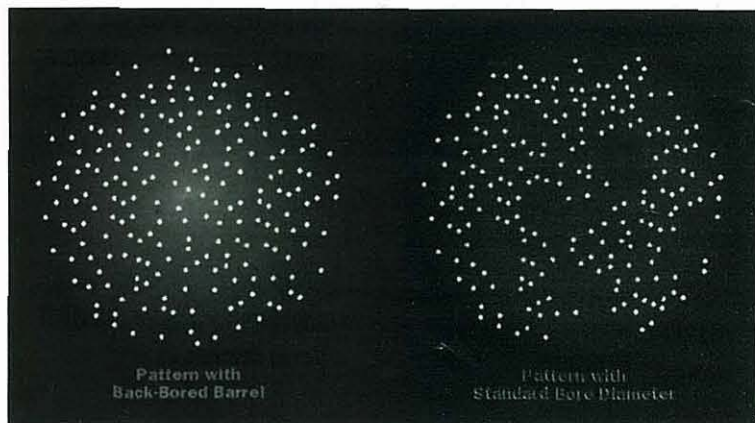

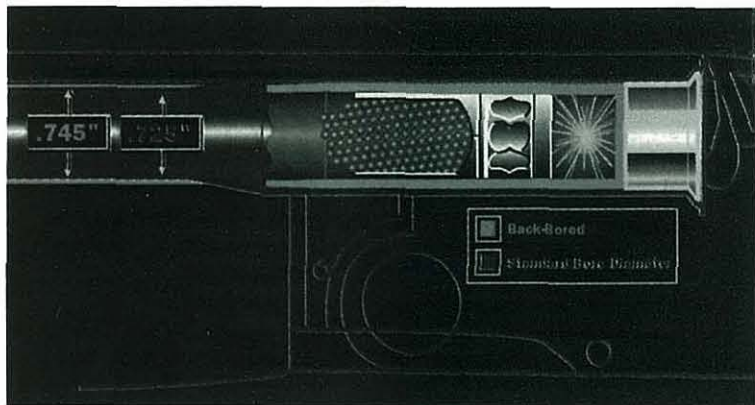

Shoot Calendar

Last months CTSN carried for the first time the shoot calendar. All state secretaries are asked to forward their major shoot dates for the next three years to the office so as they can be included in the calendar.

Any club that has a major shoot of 2 days duration or more, is also asked to send in their dates for inclusion.

Package Deals: Grand American and NZ Nationals

Negotiations are still being conducted with travel agents/airlines in an attempt to obtain the best possible deals for ACTA members to travel to these events in 1994. As soon as a suitable package is negotiated, we will advise all those interested via this magazine.

1995 World Police and Fire Games

Melbourne has been awarded the 1995 World Police & Fire Games. These Games are expected to bring some 20,000 visitors to Victoria including an estimated 7,000 of them as competitors. The Games are open to all full time Police and Fire personnel, or retired members of these services. Some 54 sports are listed on the program, including Trap, Skeet and Sporting Clays.

The venue for the clay target events is Frankston Australian Gun Club. A large number of referees and officials will be required to assist in the running of these Games, which will take place between the 25th February and the 4th March. Shoot Offs — Double Barrel Events

Comments are being sought from shooters around Australia about the following — in club Double Barrel events, shoot offs to be conducted as follows:

Event 25tgt Double Barrel — once shoot off has reached 25tgt, competition changes to points to finality, thereby reducing the probability of a long shoot off.

Event 50tgt Double Barrel — shoot off still going at 50 targets, change to points.

This suggestion is being made to reduce the number of targets used by clubs in long shoot offs. There is no suggestion to change State or National Double Barrel Championships.

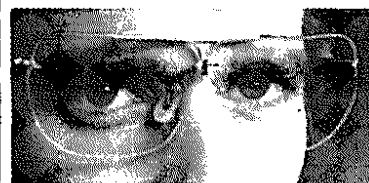

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

In the August edition of C.T.S.N. an article by Ron Forsyth claims that the reduction in shot load down to 28grams and 24grams should affect everyone equally as all shooters are under the same handicap.

I suggest that shot load reduction only serves to put the 'mugs' like myself further behind the 'crackshots'.

There can be no disputing the fact that less shot either reduces the diameter of the pattern or thins out the pattern, especially near the extremities, or a combination of both.

For those who have the ability to hit the target with the centre of the pattern there will be no difference, but for those of us of lesser ability who rely more heavily on the extremities of the pattern this can only result in more 'lost targets'.

Dear Sir

I am writing to express my views on some current trends and general apathy in clay target shooting at the moment.

I heard some rumours that the prizes for AA shooters should be of a higher monetary valuation than other grades, yet nominations would be the same for all grades. I believe this idea is to try and make 'C' grade shooters (who are the majority of our membership) try harder to obtain 'AA' status thus improving their standards all the time. While this is a good idea, some 'C' graders will not ever attain much higher grades for a number of reasons: age, determination or lack of, frequency of shooting etc. Also some 'C', 'B' or 'A' grade shooters just shoot for the fun of shooting and for the social contact derived from mixing with others at their club. This social shooting aspect I suspect will come as something of a shock to some 'AA' grade shooters whose whole ambition seems to be to win at any cost, to put in as little as possible to the sport, and their own clubs, and generally behave with a superior attitude. How often do you hear the expression "There is no fun in our sport anymore".

If more 'AA' shooters actually became accessible to some of the lower grades and helped with coaching you might be surprised at how a happier atmosphere would develop around your club. If shooters are shooting possibilities or close to it they will then go home happier with their day's shooting and then will come back to the next shoot or may even travel to other shoots boosting numbers at nearby clubs. It would be a snowballing effect.

We have to realise that unless numbers attending shoots can be increased, our sport is ultimately doomed.

This is not detracting from our coaches who do a great job, but it is interesting to note that not one coach is in the top 50 shooters in Australia. Again I must stress that I think the people who have undergone training as coaches are to be greatly admired. They are volunteers giving up their time and effort for very little reward but I just think some of the top shooters in each club should be allowed to coach at club level and can contribute a great deal.

It seems unfortunately, bad manners and bad sportsmanship are creeping into our sport. How often do you see someone miss a target only to see the gun fly open, the empties spit onto the ground in anger, and quite often a torrent of abusive language. This more often than not is a 'AA' shooter or if not, a young 'C' or 'B' grade shooter emulating one of our so called champions.

If you miss a target there is only one person to blame in 99% of cases and that is yourself. Learn a little self discipline and set a standard for others to aspire to. The others in your squad have paid for the privilege of shooting in that event and why should they be put off by some selfish competitor.

One last thing before I get off my soapbox is sponsorship. Nearly every member of a club can afford \$40-\$50 once a year to sponsor one event at their local club, with say, two out of three events

being fully or partly sponsored, clubs can afford (1.) To put on better trophies; (2.) Pay 1st & 2nd in each grade; (3.) Make a profit which means better facilities. Think about it, \$50 (or \$25 twice a year) is not much to sacrifice.

Be prepared to chip in and help out with scoring and refereeing, or if you can't do these ask if there is something else you can do, write up the scoreboard etc.

More helpers means less work for the committee and again a happier and more cohesive club.

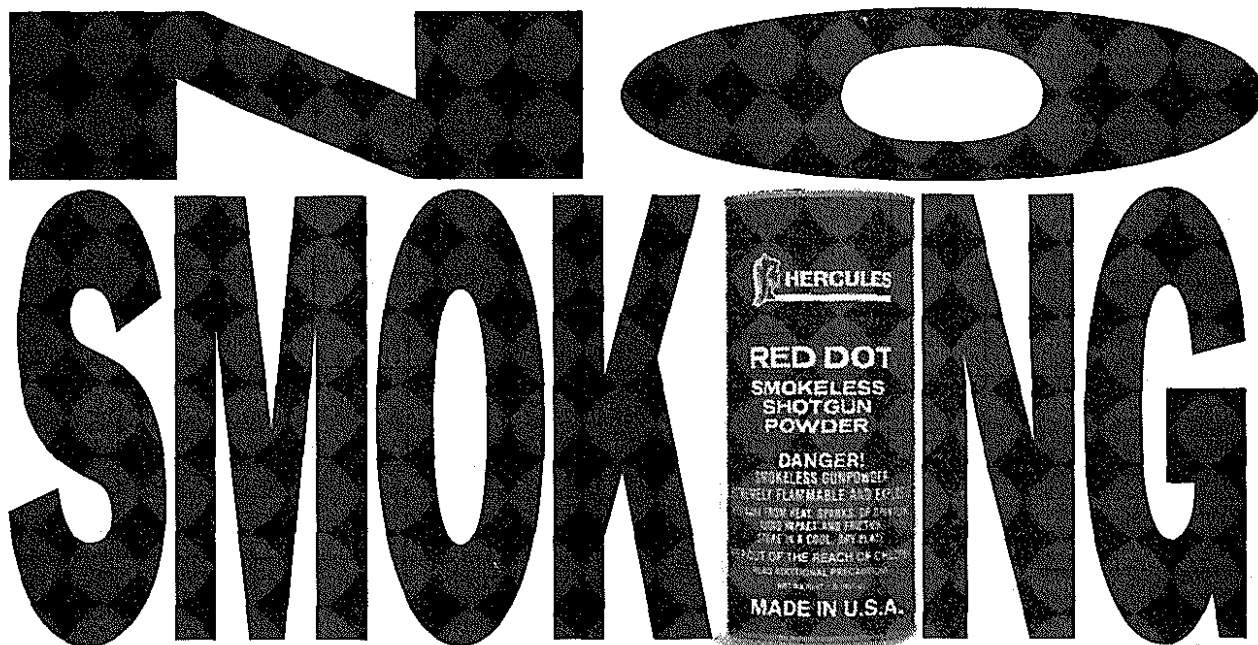

The 'Yorkshire Trophy' as shown on the front cover of this month, is now in its tenth year of competition in Australia, is to be shot for again this month at the N.S.W. Gun Club. The winners name is engraved on the trophy and he receives a sterling silver badge, which is a miniature representation of the trophy, and a sash.

The trophy was originally commissioned by a Mr Fred Birkby and presented to the Harrogate Gun Club, Yorkshire, England in 1937, for competition in a warm up shoot as a preliminary to the opening of the English game shooting season which starts on the 12th of August each year.

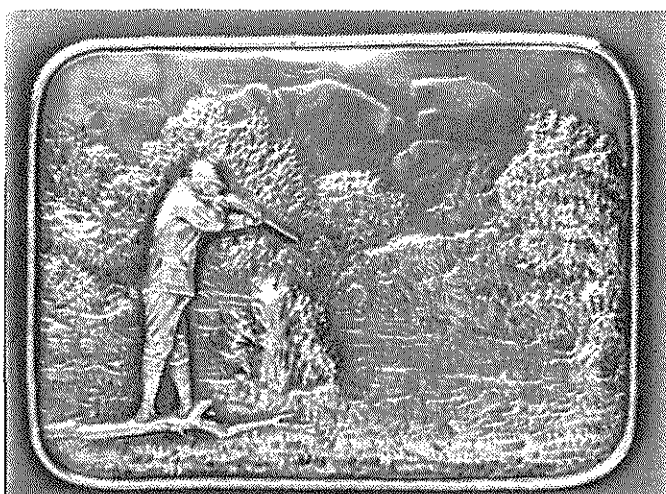
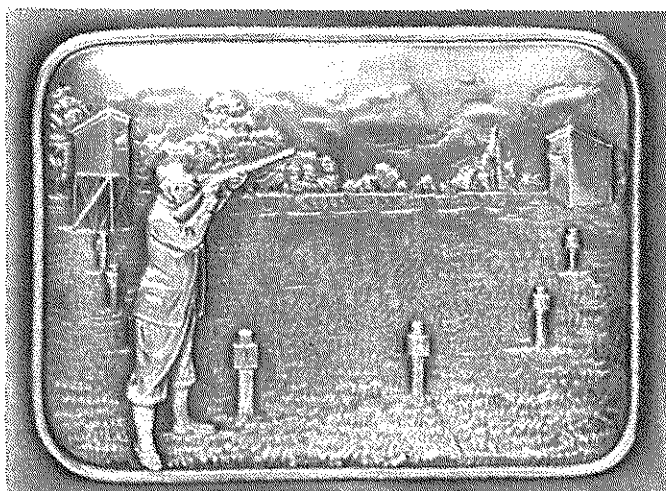
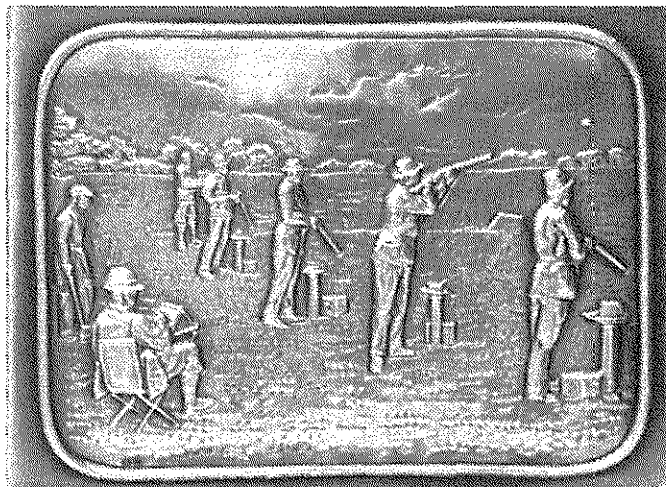

HOW WE SMOKED 'EM IN 1954

The venue: Australian Gun Club Australian National Championships

At this time the Association was known as the Australian Pigeon Trap Shooting Association. This title was later changed to Australian Clay Target Association.

The highlight of the 1954 Nationals was the National Double Barrel Championship at 60 targets from 16 yards followed by the Champion of Champions from 20 yards.

The top 25 scores in the National Championship gained a place in the Australian Team to contest the Mackintosh International Teams match.

The 1954 Nationals were as usual held on the grounds of the Australian Gun Club at Burwood, Victoria over the long weekend in March. The event was well organised and ran very smoothly. All states were represented, it was pleasing to see a considerable team from W.A. who made the long trip across the desert. Unfortunately we did miss the usually big number of Queenslanders, due to heavy summer rain making it impossible for a lot of formidable shooters to leave their outback properties.

No fewer than 215 shooters faced up to the traps for the opening event, the 1954 National Championship. Interest in the event was held throughout, only one competitor, Johnny Bryant of Blackburn, Vic. to score a possible 60 to win outright. Several shooters finished with one down and shot on to decide the placings. Eventually the young Cobar shooter Doug Osborne became runner up with 69/70, followed by Sperry Marshall from Tasmania with 68/70. Best woman shooter with a score of 53/60 was Barbara Biggs from Melbourne.

The Champion of Champions Cup followed, 40 targets from 20 yards, double barrel. A shoot off was required to determine the winner. Thomas missed his first target in the section and Quinton continued with an unbroken sequence to win 45/45. Dougie Osborne was still showing good form and finished with a 49/50.

The third and final day of the meeting was the Mackintosh International Match of 100 targets shot from 16 yards. Frank Johnson high gunned the event with a score of 99/100. Frank shot brilliantly throughout the event. Second high gun went to J. R. Bushby of NSW with a 98/100. Ron Headon of Hay, NSW took home the first prize in the Grand Australian Handicap, score 59/60.

Herewith a snippet from the archives of Fred Hudson, one of our life members and a very well known shooter both in Australia and overseas a few years back.

It is of particular interest to the NSW Gun Club because Alan Waters was a life member and active shooter at the club until his death last year and Malcolm Fuller is still very much with us, shooting well too.

The Australian Restoration and Acclimatisation Society, I believe was the forerunner of the Field & Games Association. The Sesqui-Centenary was of the First Fleet arriving in Australia, not obviously, of the shoot.

"The Sesqui-Centenary Clay Target Shoot was conducted at Pagewood, Sydney. The shooting ground was close to the Pagewood Film Studios, and East Lake Golf Course. Later General Motors was established on the site near the corner of Bunnerong Road and Wentworth Avenue. NSW Gun Club member A. G. Waters won two events, John G. Fuller won the junior event and his younger brother Malcolm was runner up. In the handicap event A. G. Waters won the trophy."

Skeet Championship — Queenslander's win

Scoring 49 hits out of a possible 60, J. W. Raleigh of Queensland won the 150th Anniversary Skeet Championship shoot conducted by the Australian Restoration and Acclimatisation Society, at Pagewood against 46 marksmen from NSW, Victoria, Tasmania and Queensland. W. Rainbird (Tas.) and J. Bryant (Vic.) were equal second with 43 hits. The junior prize was won by J. G. Fuller (NSW) with 32 hits. He beat his younger brother Malcolm Fuller for first place by one target.

Seven shooters tied for first place in the handicap event and divided the first seven prizes. In the clay bird handicap five tied for first. Both skeet and clay bird trophies were won by A. Waters (NSW) after 'shooting off' with the leaders in the handicap.

Skeet Championship Trophy and plaque won by J. W. Raleigh (Qld.) with 49 hits, W. Rainbird and J. Bryant 43. Junior prize J. Fuller with 32 hits.

Handicap Trophy and Clay Bird Handicap won by A. Waters.

DONALD MACKINTOSH AUSTRALIAN OLYMPIC CHAMPION

It took more than 70 years for an Australian shooter to be properly recognised as an Olympic champion.

Even now, many books do not include Donald Mackintosh in their lists of gold medallists at the 1900 Paris Olympics. Others list him incorrectly, as an archer.

The problems arose because of disorganisation at the Paris Games, and also because Mackintosh received stake money and thus wasn't an amateur.

Mackintosh was widely known as the 'best shot in the world' and in Paris he won gold and bronze medals for live pigeon shooting.

But it wasn't until 1976 that Mackintosh's name was properly listed in Bill Henry's *Approved History of the Olympic Games*.

For many years there was a Donald Mackintosh gun shop in Elizabeth Street, Melbourne. He died in 1951.

GUN REVIEW: BROWNING 325 TRAP

Browning B325 32" Trap Gun is excellent value and offers shooters all the features sought in a competition DTL gun.

The Browning B325 Trap Gun

There is little doubt in my mind that Browning, (Japan), make a sterling firearm. The various firearms from the Japanese factory which I have recently tested have all proven to be extremely well designed, well finished and amazingly priced for the unbelievable value they offer. Whilst this might sound as if I have shares in the Japanese company, I can assure readers it is not the case but I don't mind going on record as stating that I am most impressed with the guns which have recently come from the Japan - developed, of course, in co-operation with Browning in Europe.

I believe shooters have gone past the stage of psychological destruction many felt when selected Browning shotguns were designated for manufacture in Japan. It is true the wonderful B25 and B125 guns are still made in Belgium but the guns which are made in Japan are in many ways every bit as good, if not in some aspects, better than their Belgium cousins. Modern mass production methods, coupled with excellent engineering skills and state-of-the-art design within the Japanese factory have left the charismatic draw of the older style Browning shotguns to Belgium. This is, in my opinion, an excellent choice for Browning now have the best of both ends of the gun market without sacrificing quality - a very rare situation which largely benefits the shooter by keeping prices realistically structured at an affordable level.

At a glance

With its 32" barrels the Browning B325 Trap gun certainly looked formidable as I removed it from its packing. Whilst I have not shot any trap competitively for some time I was interested to shoot the 32" gun to observe how trends have changed over the past 10 years. Immediately I lifted the gun to my shoulder I realised the B325 was heavier than normal. With its beefy forend and palm swell pistol grip I felt in command. After bringing the gun to my shoulder more than a dozen times I felt as if I meant business - this was a gun I could shoot!

As with every gun that I have reviewed from the Japanese factory, the bluing was impeccable. A low rib was fitted to the top of the barrels along with two sights. The stock and forend matched so well in grain and colour one could be forgiven for thinking they were from the same piece of walnut - maybe they were! The receiver of the Browning 325 Trap was quite plain with only a fine border of engraving on each side and the familiar Browning logo and stag's head embossed into the receiver as well. The lines about the action were clean and smooth whilst the wood to metal fit was faultless - even around the rear of the trigger guard and tang. The stock was well finished with quite a plain piece of walnut, but the grain was straight through the pistol grip and had been well filled before the sealing coat of polyurethane was applied. The checkering was machine cut and quite well executed. The pattern on the pistol grip was extensive and afforded a firm, controlling grip whilst the forend was pleasantly flat on the bottom, supporting flutes along the upper of each side for a firm but comfortable grip. The Browning B325 Trap must be one of the few remaining guns supporting a gold coloured trigger which is actually gold plated. This completed the gun, as did the ventilated recoil pad - priced at around \$2,300, this was a gun ready for action.

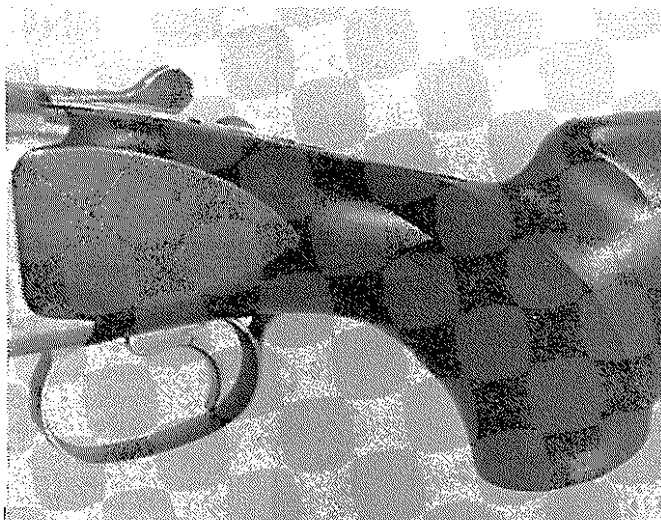
The barrels

As already mentioned, the deep, lustrous blued finish on the barrels was perfect. At 1.63kg, these are about the weight most trap shooters seek - any heavier and the gun would become awkward and lacklustre. Solid side ribs separate and support the top and bottom barrels whilst an 8mm high ventilated top rib completed them. This was not directly posted onto the top barrel but was laid with a bottom rib. The ventilated slots were quite long, facilitating cooling. A white barrel bead was fitted for a front sight with a smaller white bead located just short of half way for a mid-sight. The 13mm wide top rib ran parallel most of the barrel's length, featuring a short taper at the receiver, down to 9mm.

The bore of the B325 Trap provided for review measured 0.727 in each barrel, suggesting the barrels were not overbored. Running the Stan Baker barrel gauge through the chokes the top barrel measured slightly over full, at 0.680", whilst the bottom barrel ran out to 0.695". This matched the full and improved modified designations on the left hand side of the monobloc for each of the barrels. Browning are certainly spot-on with their manufacturing and quality control, after all, the barrels do the most of the work! Typical two-piece Browning ejectors were in place. These were selective in operation. The huge, full-width trapezoid bite at the bottom of the monobloc was ably assisted by the equally large forward chopper lump which rotated about the full width hinge pin. This robust locking mechanism has long been used by Browning and effectively performs the task of maintaining the integrity of the action. It is designed to wear into the gun over time, hence the trapezoid shape of the bottom slide and rear bite of the barrel.

The receiver

Although it was not ornately engraved one must remember the 325 Trap gun is basically a work horse - pretty engraving and flourishes do not make it shoot any better, in fact the lack of engraving often keeps the price of a gun at a reasonably affordable level. The shape of the receiver was flowing with a distinct lack of tool marks on the body. The straight and squared lines were sufficiently worked to present a clean edge, without being sharp to the touch. Forged and milled from a single, solid block of high strength steel the grey glaze on the receiver is of a special, long-lasting and durable nitride finish. To complement this the top lever and trigger guard are also finished with the nitride process to provide a striking appearance which is also very serviceable.



The broad design and stylish 20 lines/inch checkering provide an excellent surface to grip on the B325 Trap.

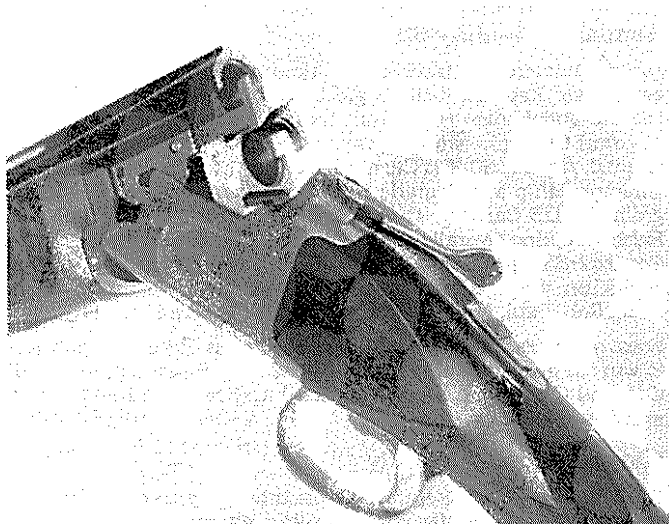
As with all Browning Citori grade guns, the B325 Trap gun has a large but very stylish trigger guard. Its unobtrusive fullness in shape is ideal for shooters with even the largest of fingers – a comfort to those who might be tired of belting their trigger finger against the front of a smaller shaped trigger guard. The gold plated trigger certainly completes the gun for it contrasts perfectly with the deep blued finish of the barrels. Selective in operation, it also has three pre-set positions which can be utilised to enable the shooter to find a comfortable length from the pistol grip. This is adjustable plus or minus 5 mm and a suitable allen key was provided for the task. The trigger pulls measured 4¾ lb for the bottom barrel and 5¼ lb for the top. These, of course, could be altered to suit by a gunsmith for a nominal charge.

The tang mounted safety on the B325 also serves as a barrel selector for either under or over barrel. This is quite a novel variation for most trap guns are designed without a selective trigger, (which reduces cost). Browning have obviously deemed it necessary to provide trap shooters with an option. A connecting rod for automatic safety engagement was included in the packaging for those who find comfort and confidence in such a mechanical device. Personally, I found the non-automatic safety operation desirable and preferred to leave the connecting rod in the box!

The stock and forend

These were very well matched, as mentioned earlier, and designed with all the needs of the competition trap shooter in mind. The rake of the pistol grip could have been improved marginally to move the shooters hand up the grip but apart from that all was nicely finished and well designed. Length of Pull measured 14¾". Drop at Comb, 1¼" and Drop at Heel, 1⅝" – typical measurements for Browning trap guns. The fore iron catch attaching the forend to the barrel was positive and firm, providing an excellent grip for the shooter. The fullness of what Browning call their 'semi-beavertail' forend would not be overbearing for most adult shooters but I feel lady shooters could prefer a sleeker design, unless they had a longer palm – which is not usually the case.

The ventilated recoil pad was an appreciated addition although, with many DTL shooters opting for 28 and 24 gram loads, recoil seems not to cause the concern formerly found with 32 gram and handicap loads. Stock dimensions are included in Table 1. of this presentation. Generally, the dimensions of the B325 suited me well.

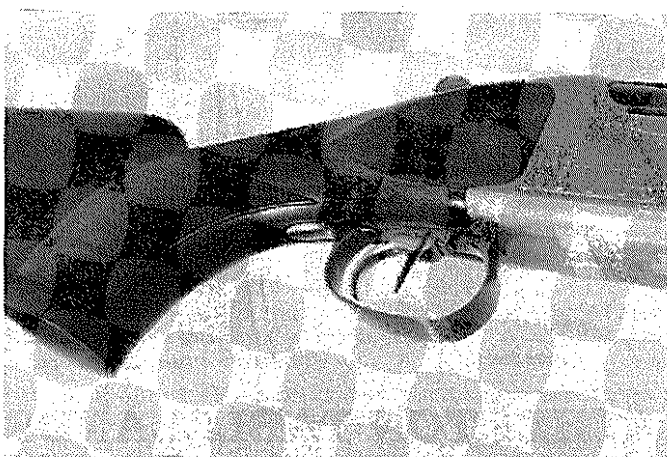


Two piece, selective ejectors have long been a trademark of Browning shotguns — the B325 Trap is no exception — it is every bit a Browning!

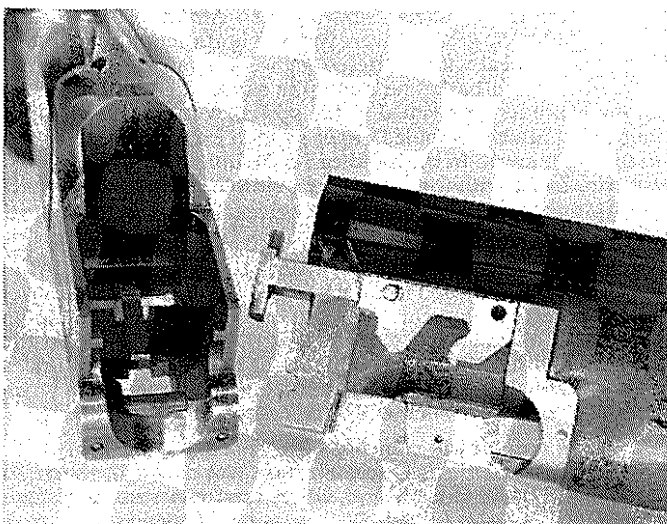
Conclusion

During field testing of the B325 trap I found it to be quite steady and well suited to 28 and 24 gram loads. At the pattern plate the gun posted an amazing 94% pattern through the top barrel and 84% through the bottom barrel shooting 28 gram Jailing shells in size 7½ shot. These patterns smoked targets consistently, but if you were not on-target there seemed to be no latitude. Chipped targets were very few and far between! The configuration of the gun submitted for testing seemed well suited to DTL but I felt it lacked the liveliness to attack ball trap and UIT Trap. This was only my personal assessment but I otherwise found it quite steady and well suited to standard DTL targets.

So far as the integrity and value of the gun, I found the B325 Trap represented a sound investment. At a shade over \$2,300 discounted, (the recommended retail was \$2,500), there were no real contenders in its class. As an added thought, with the closer relationship now enjoyed by the ACTA and Field & Game , I believe the B325 Trap could serve well as the base for a custom sporter – for many successful overseas shooters are using 32" barrellled guns. Not many 32" sporters are made, especially priced at \$2,300. This is going beyond the scope of this review but it does provide 'food for thought', particularly since the B325 has a low rib. Good luck and safe shooting.

RECOIL

What is recoil? Where does recoil derive from? How can we overcome recoil and still get good results?

Let us see what Mr Newton has to tell us about recoil.

Gases are liberated which expand immediately with great violence and in every direction. The walls of the chamber of the barrels are sufficiently strong to withstand this violence, and consequently the full force of the expanding gasses is directed along the line of the barrel, (both forwards and backwards). The backward force is exactly the same degree of strength as the forward force.

Some of the backward force is absorbed by the weight of the gun. As you can see, in the writings of Major Sir Gerald Burrard, there are ways to calculate how much actual foot pound recoil you receive with different types of loads. Various techniques are considered to contest recoil. (Porting barrels, lengthening forcing cones and backboring are some of these techniques.) The question is are these practices actually working without a loss in some other way, such as distance impact velocity? Lengthening forcing cones is one technique that could be of benefit. Through the projectiles smoother entry in to the restriction of the barrel, marginally lesser recoil is possible.

If you are thinking to have the forcing cones of your old gun lengthened, make certain the work is carried out by a reputable gunsmith. Do not forget to ask for a signed statement that your barrels were pressure proofed after changes were made. (There are some guns on the market that have these techniques built in by the manufacturer and carry a warranty.)

As far as back boring and porting goes I am not convinced, nor have I seen, that these techniques are of great advantage in the battle to reduce recoil.

There is however a way to combat recoil in a positive method. The solution is shot shell. A good cartridge manufacturer should tune his shot shells to get maximum foot pound energy at the target with minimum muzzle velocity. It is the muzzle velocity and the weight of the projectile in combination with selected components of a cartridge that will give recoil. Recoil is not created by breech pressure. It is dangerous to believe the severity of recoil can indicate breech pressure. Physical recoil and actual 'felt' recoil are different. The felt recoil has to do with the nervous system of the individual shooter and one shooter may feel a different recoil sensation to another shooter (same cartridges used). I have tested reloads, which where sent to me for safety testing, with pressure as high as 16,000 psi. (In England proof tests are carried out around 1,200 bars or 17,405 psi. SAAMI standard for a 12 gauge 2³/₄" chamber gun is 18,600 US psi.) These shells were a long way over the highest useable pressure limit of 12,000 psi. The recoil of these reloads was somehow acceptable, and to me did not feel any different to some factory loaded shells with 10,530 psi and a muzzle velocity of 1,298 fps. The detected fault was in a 1 grain propellant overload, and the use of a hotter burning primer with a medium burning propellant. The hotter flash of the primer contradicted the burning rate of the propellant. The propellant ignited too fast and higher immediate gas pressure was created, which in return produced Wave Pressure. (I don't recommend you do this test with your gun as it could lead to an accident.)

Physical and 'felt' recoil may be more pronounced from an inferior made gun (mass produced guns made to a price could well be inferior in some way). To place the stock of a shotgun in a wrong position on the shoulder will aggravate felt recoil. Presuming you can mount a shotgun and your gun is of high quality, well designed, precision made and fitted, lower recoil can be noticed from cartridges with perfect matching components and tuned to give supreme performance. A wrong primer in combination with the wrong propellant will produce an upset in performance and give recoil. The types of crimp for the shell can change pressure and velocity and give more recoil. Different wad pressure will give

variation in propellant performance. All this and more has to be taken into account while designing formulations for shot shells. Without the right test equipment it would be almost impossible to design a good formula for cartridges. In the old days a test could have taken a long time to complete. Nowadays, with the help of electronic equipment and computers, the working out of a shot shell formulation is accurate and takes only a couple of days to complete. However, it is important to know how much velocity or foot pound energy is required at an extended target distance. Some shot shell manufacturers will tell you the muzzle velocity of their individual types of cartridges. Other than for identification purposes, this means absolutely nothing to the shooter. After all it is the distance velocity and consequently, foot pound energy, that breaks targets or kills game.

Muzzle velocity is only a reference to the technician, in the make up of formulas. As you can see from the test results Test 1 and Test 2. Both tests have practically the same muzzle velocity (V1). There is however a difference in the distance velocity of 80 fps or 24.38m (V2). The difference was achieved through superior formulation and better tuning of the shot shell in Test 2.

TEST 2

As I like to say the load was 'balanced and tuned' to give maximum distance performance without excessive muzzle velocity. It is regrettable to see the method is not used to its fullest. The balancing or tuning method seems to be known by only an extremely small number of technicians. The procedure is time consuming and, because time is valuable, a lot of cartridge manufacturers have taken the attitude 'close enough is good enough'. Glossy advertising will then help in selling their precious cartridges.

TEST 3

Test 3 load reveals if a cartridge formulation is appropriately balanced and tuned the load will give maximum distance velocity for a lesser given muzzle velocity. Even though test 3 load has a higher distance velocity in comparison to test 1 load, the physical and 'felt' recoil of test 3 load is less due to lesser muzzle velocity and fastidious component selection.

In a nutshell it is not necessary to receive excessive recoil to get maximum performance at a target. All you have to do is find the cartridge produced by the manufacturer who is prepared to spend that little extra time in perfecting his shot shells and not just talk about it. Don't let anybody talk you in to a specific shot shell. Be critical and find out yourself if the cartridge you want to use is giving you superior performance. Let the product do its own advertising.

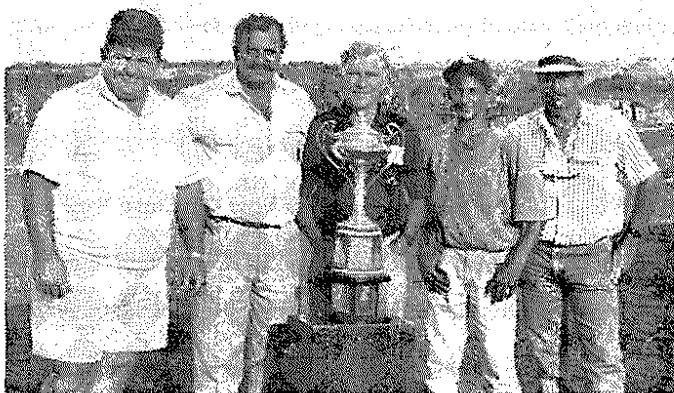

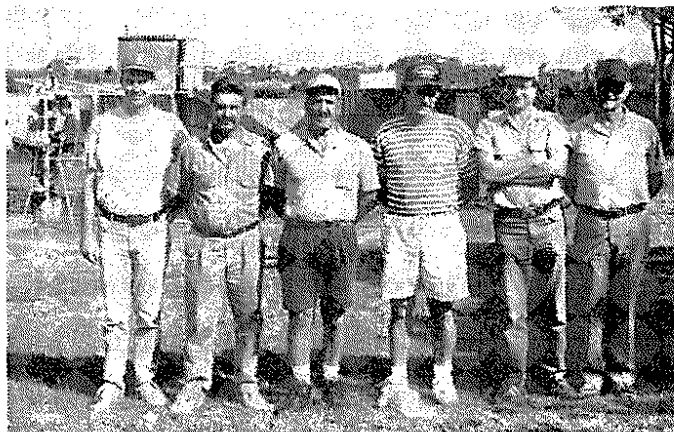

ASSA NEWS

The ASSA has made a mistake.

As you can see we have cancelled our Skeet Promotion Carnival. We did this for several reasons. It is not fair to ask the normal shooter to take leave for nearly two weeks to attend skeet tournaments. Also because the ACTA have moved the Skeet Nationals forward to September it has caught a number of shooters off guard. Many shooters have rung and told us that it would have been okay to run this carnival in November, but to organise business and family commitments under such short notice, these shooters are just going to be able to make the minimum four days of the Nationals.

Our New Zealand friends have contacted us and said that because of the date change they will not be able to attend as well. As far as we know there will be only one or two Kiwi's attending in total. The Kiwi's are gearing up to come to the ASSA Open in February.

To those people that had intended on shooting this promotion carnival then do not despair. The Griffith Gun Club will still run this fundraising shoot on the Sunday and Wagga Gun Club are still running the Pre National tournament. Both of these tournaments will offer the skeet shooter much needed practice for the Nationals. Please note however that it is not mandatory to attend these shoots to be eligible for trips to New Zealand.

The ASSA will be running the 1994 ASSA Skeet Open over the Tamworth Gun Club's annual two day Skeet Carnival in February, 1994. There will be an event on Friday and also on Monday to make this shoot 400 targets. Kevin Weatherall, the President of the Tamworth Gun Club will ensure that this will be a shoot not to be missed. The Akubra Company, Air New Zealand and Winchester Australia have already offered their assistance. We are positive that the generosity of last years sponsors will be repeated.

There will again be five trips to New Zealand offered for the first person past the post in each grade plus a junior shooter. Also the team shooting will be one person in each grade and either a lady, junior or veteran. The success of the lucky number shoot offs means that this will also be repeated in Tamworth.

Once again there will be five (5) trips offered to New Zealand at the 1994 ASSA Skeet Open. The nine trips offered over the skeet promotional carnival have been cancelled.

It will be one of our aims to ensure that we can have a fixed date every year to run the ASSA Skeet Open. We originally wanted to run the Open in May 1994 but it seems that the Skeet Nationals are going to be held in Melbourne at that time. It is our proposal that there should be two major (400t) skeet events held each year spaced at least six months apart. It is our intention to work with the ACTA so that we can choose the most appropriate skeet program for the years ahead. We want to ensure that the majority of shooters can participate at the most appropriate venues in the best possible weather conditions. Obviously this will take some time to arrange but we think that in the long run if shooters know 12 months (or more) in advance then they will be able to plan their shooting calendars in such a way that they can attend these major tournaments.

By having two major tournaments spaced six months apart it will mean the best possible skeet team will be chosen to represent Australia. Hopefully by having team selection over two separate tournaments it will eliminate the flash in the pan efforts and the most consistent shooters over the year will be selected. With luck, both the ACTA and the ASSA can benefit from the experience gained by these team members on their overseas travels by implementing new ideas and practices witnessed at the overseas venues and ensuring that Australian skeet is in line with the rest of the world.

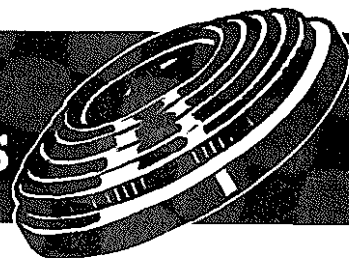

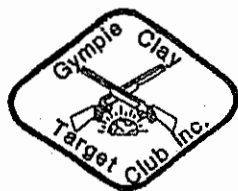

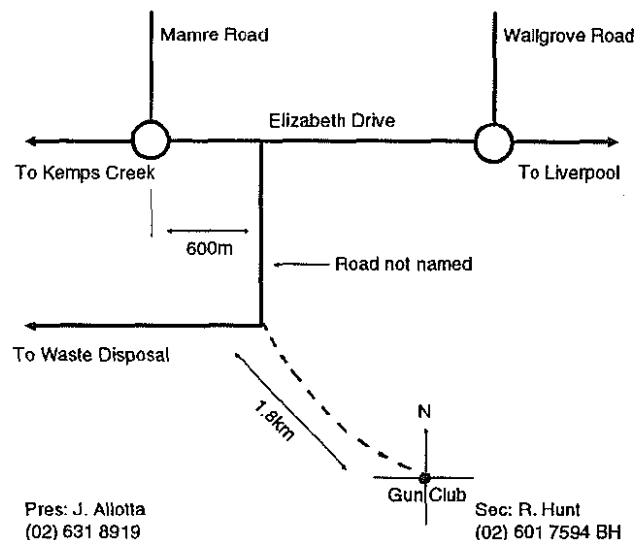
