

A number of clubs are now, or are about to start shooting ACTA Sporting Clays. Elsewhere in this edition is a suggested layout for this new clay target game. The layout of a ground is only limited by the imagination of the participating club committee. It can easily be set up on existing trap, skeet or ball trap layouts and can be shot as a 25 bird event, or in multiples of 25. A grading formulae is yet to be finalised, but it is suggested that perhaps AA grade may be 85%+, A grade 75%+, B grade 65%+ and C grade below 65%. Provision will be made on the 1994 card for recording scores, all scores to count.

A disappointing aspect of the introduction of ACTA Sporting Clays is the very negative and selfish reaction by another shooting organisation (or should I say some of its hierarchy) to our plan to conduct a National Championship in the discipline. 
All States Skeet Championship Sponsored by the Australian Skeet Shooters Association









SUGGESTED SPORTING CLAY LAYOUT


The rules for ACTA Sporting Clays are yet to be decided but when they are they will be basic and they will be kept to a minimum. I cannot at this stage even contemplate what they will be in content other than the event shall be of 25 targets or multiples of 25 targets. Decisions such as whether the event shall be shot gun down or gun up must be made quickly. It was hoped that the rules would be available for this edition of the CTSN but this was not possible.

The suggested ground layout as shown is only a suggestion as I mentioned in the Presidents Notes, layouts are governed only by the imagination of the committee setting the ground up.

It is suggested that in an event of 25 targets each shooter shoots 5 targets from each stand, consisting of 3 single targets and one double. The single targets being double barrel birds. The conduct of the event is that shooter one shoots his first target, then shooter two etc until each shooter has in turn shot his 5 birds from his particular stand. All shooters then move to the next stand (as in a trap squad) shoot the next five birds and so on until they have shot the 25 targets. In a 50 target event the second round would consist of 1 single bird and two sets of doubles from each stand.

In front of each shooting stand is placed a small board indicating the traps each target will be thrown from. To illustrate this an example would be . . . on station 1, the shoot may shoot single targets from traps 2, 5 & 8 and a double from traps 1 & 6. All traps are clearly marked as to their respective number also.

1993 STATE COACHES CONFERENCE

On August the 27th & 28th, the State Coaches Conference was held at the Travelodge Airport Hotel. The conference was attended by all states, Miss Gina DiLullo of the National Office and Mr Ross Silvester, Chairman Coaching Council.

As it had been for the previous year, a pre-conference meeting was held Friday evening, where the 1992 minutes were read and confirmed, business arising handled and the state reports tabled. This meeting was again to prove worthwhile because of the agenda workload set for Saturday.

From the minutes, business arising pertained only to administrative matters and in fact over 90% of the program laid out for 1992/93 had been attained.

State reports followed with each state tabling reports that in general, showed that coaching and coaches were beginning to assist ACTA members.

- Qld: The horrendous drought is having a big effect on the economics with the state, however 4 zone seminars were conducted. A major breakthrough has been achieved with TAFE acceptance of a Firearm Safety Course.
- NT: In the last 12 months, a resurgence of coaching interest has taken place, with request by members to undertake accreditation. Coaching of the state team again proved successful and is an ongoing program.
- NSW: Coaching within the state through the zones is attracting good attendances and NSW is presently drawing up guidelines for junior and female development/training squads. A short video has been produced, which NSW will use in a statewide promotion early 1994.
- WA: In the near future, will swing back to the tradition 1 state coach, after trailing a joint coach program. Level 1 & 2 accreditation seminars are being run with good attendance. As it is with some states, coaches complain of 'too much paperwork to justify their accreditation'.
- Vic: The school person program has heightened the coaches activities with an estimated 600 individual students being involved. This program is of vital importance for the future of shooting. Coaching throughout the zones is active with new interest being generated.
- SA: Although the economic situation within SA is not good, coaching is finally beginning to emerge, with more and more requests for coaching and seminars.
- Tas: Unfortunately due to the resignation of the state coach, no report was tabled.

Saturdays component of the conference began at 9.00am and the state coaches welcomed Miss Gina DiLullo and Mr Ross Silvester to their first full meeting with all members of ACTA Coaching Council.

The meeting then proceeded to the agenda items and following are those items with relevant comments.

State Coaches Procedures Manual

A copy of this manual was presented to each state coach, as well as the National Office. This manual contains data that a state coach needs to know on an ongoing basis. It is designed to be passed on, if a state coach changes.

Level 2 Accreditation (Revision)

The level 2 program was tabled for final viewing by those assembled. This revised accreditation schedule is now in the hands of the Australian Coaching Council. The course is mainly

an update using the original course as its basis. The main changes apart from current reference materials, are:

- (i) 24 months Level 1 accreditation before starting.
- (ii) 60 hours practical coaching over the 2 year course.
- (iii) 2 weekend programs during the 2 year course.
- (iv) Improved coaching principles agenda.

ACTA Coaches Information Booth: DTL Nationals

As a promotional project, a display and information booth will be instigated at the 1994 Brisbane DTL Nationals. It's concept is based on:

- (i) Opening an avenue for potential coaches.
- (ii) Avenue for coaches to discuss coaching.
- (iii) Expose the National Director of Coaching and State Coaches for individual contact.
- (iv) Assist in the gathering of feedback for problem areas and shooters needs.

If successful, the intention is to expand to an annual program covering each Nationals.

Raising the Profile of the Coach

From the open letter published in the CTSN, only one (1) letter was received. However, coupled with data the state coaches had to offer, many points were raised, some being:

- (i) 5 year plan required ASAP.
- (il) Targets set for development.
- (iii) Improved and advanced training manuals.
- (iv) Advanced state seminars.
- (v) 'Dear Coach' column in the CTSN.

All the items discussed, will be maintained, investigated and instigated as time and projects permit.

Coach of the Year

A proposal to instigate an annual award for a Coach of the Year, was discussed to start for the 1994 Year of the Coach.

This is being pursued now, to be in place for 1994. It is envisaged that the award will start at club level and nominees progress from zone to state to the national award.

Junior Development and Talent Identification Program

A program was tabled for discussion. The program to be designed to start at club level and progress through states for selection of a junior training squad from the relevant National titles.

Much ground work is to be carried out and a workable format to be prepared. The program is going to need the support of all from club to state and from coaches and club members.

Female Development Program

A similar format as the junior program to promote and enable more females to participate.

Considerably more topics were discussed, with the preceding being of the major topics. Other topics were:

- (i) 1994 Year of the Coach.
- (ii) 1994 State and Zone Coaches conference.
- (iii) Coaches insurance.
- (iv) Posters.
- (v) Video production.
- (vi) Accreditation and coaches.

The meeting closed at 4.50pm after what was considered an innovative conference, with a program for 1994 that will require involvement and support from a wide selection of ACTA accredited coaches and executive members.

All in attendance were thanked for their efforts and input over the two days.

In closing, it was restated that what had been proposed and discussed would not happen overnight, but would be ongoing projects for 1994.

Winchester announces major prize increases for 1994 'Top Gun' awards

Winchester Australia have substantially increased their trophy list for the forthcoming 'Top Gun' awards of 1994. Up to a quarter of a million shotshells are on offer for the year as well as a ASE90 Beretta shotgun for the Overall High Gun winner at the Brisbane Trap Nationals. In dollar terms this shows approximately \$65,000 worth of awards on offer for the year.

The most substantial change has been the major support that will be offered to Winchester ammunition users at all State Carnivals in 1994. In previous years only Overall winners of the major events were eligible for rewards, but in 1994 all grade winners and ladies, junior and veterans winners are eligible for awards at DTL, Skeet and UIT State Championships. Grade winners will also be eligible for awards at the National Skeet and UIT Championships for the first time next year.

Responding to constructive comments from many shooters over the past two years, Winchester have also included High Gun awards for major Skeet and UIT Carnivals in 1994 which are advertised in the Clay Target Shooting News. This will hopefully balance up against the awards that have been on offer at only major DTL Carnivals in past years. Also for the first time next year Winchester will recognise long run breaks in events as diverse as Double Rise, Single Barrel, Skeet Doubles and Ball Trap, once again hoping to even up the chance of competitors being eligible for awards in all disciplines and events. The 1994 Overall 'Top Gun' winner will again be decided independently by the National Shooting Committee, but next year the winner will be eligible for a massive 20 cases of target loads. More than enough ammunition to keep the average shooter loaded up for 2 years.

Full details of awards appear on the back cover of this issue of the CTSN with the registration form enclosed. To be eligible, the forms must be completed and returned to Winchester by no later than March 31st 1994. Awards commence from January 1st 1994.

FOURTH VICTORIAN ISU GRAND PRIX SERIES

He was selected alongside some of Australia's most successful athletes including Queensland freestyle swimmer Daniel Kowalski, the heir apparent to Olympic gold medallist Kieren Perkins. Olympic swimming finalist Joanne Meehan and Barcelona diving representative Rachel Wilkes.

The 200 athletes will all receive a scholarship from the MLC Junior Sports Foundation which includes a grant of \$2,000. The scholarship also provides a supply of sports clothing and an invitation to attend one of three national sportscamps aimed at helping the athletes make the transition to senior competition.

Vincent has been supported by the MLC Junior Sports Foundation for a number of years. This is his second consecutive listing on the MLC Top 200.

The success of the MLC program since its inception in 1981 has been outstanding. Past recipients of MLC scholarships include Barcelona Olympic medallists Kieren Perkins, high jumper Tim Forsyth and swimmers Hayley Lewis and Susan O'Neill.

Thirty two members of the Junior Sports Foundation were selected in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics team, and many of this years MLC Top 200 will feature in the 1994 Commonwealth Games. Star marksman, Michael Diamond, is a former MLC scholarship holder and in 1992 was named the NSW MLC Junior Sports Achiever of the Year.










Overall High Gun, G. Redmond and President, N. Berry.





5 BIG WINNERS IN SEPTEMBER TOP GUN

Gary Redmond from Queensland and Craig Bentley from South Australia have both had an outstanding August and September in the 1993 Winchester 'Top Gun' awards.

Gary, who uses AA1250's won the overall two day High Guns at three major DTL carnivals in Brisbane, Bundaberg and one of Australias' most prestigious carnivals in Tamworth. Gary joined the Top Gun' awards this year after a very successful 1992, where he would have been eligible for many awards, but had not joined the award scheme due to the fact that he used many reloads for minor competitions. In 1993 he assures us that he only uses factory loaded ammunition and now only drinks factory distilled rum.

Craig Bentley also won three two day High Gun awards in September with wins at Southern York, South Australian and Wilkawatt Clay Target Clubs. Craig has had five claims this year under the awards.

David Cunningham captured a unique double for 1993 at the recent Wagga Skeet Nationals by winning the Overall High Gun. He now holds both the UIT and American Skeet High Gun awards and has already won a massive 8,000 rounds of shotshells through the award scheme this year, he will be very hard to beat now for the Overall Top Gun of the Year to be judged by the National Shooting Committee in December.

Brian Thomson, who is now a New Zealand resident followed up last years Overall High Gun by winning this years National Skeet Championship. Brian receives 2,500 shotshells for his 125 straight in Australias' 'Blue Ribbon' Skeet event. Brian used AA1200 9s whilst David opts for the faster AA1250 9s.

Victor Ferteklis from Darwin has taken his award claims to four with wins in the Northern Territory Olympic Trap Championship and across the gulf at the Cairns two day DTL carnival. He receives 500 rounds for each of his wins.

Other winners this month include last years Overall 'Top Gun' winner in Steve Atkins who shot 300 straight at Tamworth to win 500 rounds of target loads, Irvine Wynard from Queensland wins a case of shotshells for his win in the two day High Gun at Redcliffes two day carnival. Carol Ogden from the Melbourne Gun Club has won the Overall Ladies National Skeet High Gun and receives 1,000 shotshells for her tremendous win. Carol is probably the most loyal and longest serving lady skeet shooter in the country and her win has proved most popular in skeet shooting circles. This win and her selection to represent Australia at the 1991 World Championships proves that perseverance does pay off.

Glen Hayden once again receives 500 shotshells this month for one of the more outstanding efforts since 'Top Gun' commenced. Glen shot the first 104 straight in the South Australian State Olympic Trap Championship held at the International Clay Target Club in Adelaide on September 25th & 26th. He becomes the first person to claim a break prize in the UIT disciplines since the inception of the award scheme. However from 1994 a break of 75 in U.I.T. Trap and Skeet will be all that is needed to obtain 'a bonus case of target loads. At the same carnival Robert Dower was successful in winning the SA UIT Skeet Championship and also receives 500 shotshells for his win.


