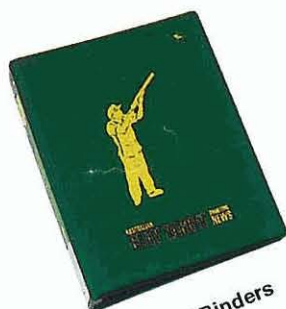

Rules

This agreement between two of Australia's major sport shooting bodies can do nothing but benefit and promote clay target shooting. As part of the agreement, reciprocal rights will be extended to members of each Association to compete and participate in the sporting clays discipline.

New Zealand Nationals

As can be seen from the advertisement appearing below, we have finalised a package deal to visit New Zealand for their National Championships. All we now want are the members to avail themselves of this deal and to make up a group to make an all out effort to wrest a few titles from them. If you have not visited this beautiful country, now is the opportunity to do so.

If this trip is successful, we will set about organising package deals to visit other major shoots. A visit to Vandalla, Ohio for the Grand American would be a great trip !!!

Game Fairs

At least two Game Fairs are to be held in Victoria in February.

The first is to be held at the Frankston Australian Gun Club on the 5th & 6th, and the second will be held at Elmore (on the site of the Elmore Field Days and the Colbinabbin Clay Target Club) on the 19th & 20th.

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

It was good to see more shooters making use of the mailbox, if more shooters gave their feelings, it would give the people who pull the strings a direction to follow.

To recap on a couple of stories in September CTSN one on 28g & 24g, we have a 22m shooter who shoots a possible in handicap and on asking him what load he uses he produced a handful of 24 gram factory loads that answered all questions about lighter load, as for 28 gram loads, I was using them 18 months before it was the rule, and the ones I miss is my fault.

Another story regards AA & A getting a larger slice of the cake, if B & C shooters are paying the same entry fee, they should get a fair slice of the cake. Most clubs I attend, the greater number of shooters are B & C shooters.

These shooters do not stay in B & C because they want to, but because of the amount of shooting, age, sickness and just the love and enjoyment of shooting and friendship that they continue shooting. B & C shooters are either going up or coming down the ladder and I can tell you, when you are ageing, it is hard to stay on top. Leave the valuations of trophies the way they are or we will lose the B & C shooters.

The only suggestion I have to make at this time is, I would like points events to be scored at 2 + 1 instead of 3 + 2. If a shooter misses a single barrel or double barrel target, is only down one point, missing a target is three points down in points, yet both shooters are only down 1 target, or either go back to high guns being scored on targets and not points.

Lost Bird

Dear Sir,

As the person recently appointed to the position of Promotion and Publicity Officer for the N.S.W.C.T.A., I would like to endeavour to see the sport of clay target shooting promoted in a very positive manner.

The only publicity we receive — is what we provide ourselves — publicity doesn't come to us — we must do it.

How many clubs have problems getting their results in the local newspaper? Does your local television station attend your events? Does your local radio station have a sports show?

Let's start with the local paper — if your club is having difficulty getting results printed — make an approach to the sports editor or the editor in charge, establish what their requirements are. They may require type written material delivered to the paper office by 10.30am each Monday for example.

Have a media day at the club, inviting all media representatives. It is much easier for them to run stories if they have some idea of what they are talking about.

When you have an open shoot coming up, does your publicity officer or any club official make approaches to the media? Remember good publicity and exposure of our sport goes a long way towards a better image.

Promotion — something else we must all in some way make an effort to do. Sunday 29th May 1994 will see just that at every club within NSW. Starting in the Northern Zone in 1993, when every club held a promotional day, following extensive television advertising and local publicity — with an overwhelming response — 1994 will see the same effort but with every club in the state taking part. The program will be overseen by each Zone to allow local knowledge to assist planning and preparation of the entire day.

If we promote our sport in the correct manner, numbers will increase, but, we have to do it all ourselves.

Dear Sir,

A group of members of the Mount Isa Gun Club, myself included, were sitting around after a practice round or two discussing how well or poorly we had performed, when the subject of chokes and cartridges entered the conversation — sound familiar. We discussed the progress in technology of cartridges an in particular wad construction over the years. It was on this matter that the following issue was raised and on which we would like some expert clarification.

The issue of debate was whether or not the shot remains contained within the leaves of a plastic wad as it passes through the choke area. Naturally we were concerned with the effect this would have on the shot pattern.

We would appreciate having this subject addressed by a relevant expert in Editors Mailbox.

Dear Sir,

I would like to draw shooters attention to the fact the Downside site is still available to the ACTA as a National Shooting Ground (contra to some rumours).

Some of the features worth considering are as follows:

It is centrally located, within a days drive of 80% of all ACTA shooters. If located on lower north coast, the majority of shooters will have to travel longer distances. Victorians and South Australians who have attended National and State Titles at Wagga in the past will travel longer, 10-12 hours more than at Downside. Detrimental to attendances in the future I may suggest.

National and State Titles held in this area in the past have been extremely well patronised by interstate shooters, with the financial benefits most obvious to executive members. 1993 NSW Trap Carnival held in the Riverina drew 230 shooters of which 50 were from Victoria. This proves shooters will travel to this area. National Titles in 1992 attracted 525 shooters.

Downside site has an average range temperature of 21.8°C (Port Macquarie av 22.1°C). Riverina area is not known for its high winds, most coastal areas have winds.

Downside sites rainfall av 574mm over 103 days, or 22 inches. Port Macquarie has 1,550mm over 133 days or 62 inches. Three times the rainfall. Nine months of the year it receives over 5 inches of rain per month. Would you like to shoot in that?

The Riverina's highest humidity reading is 66%, lowest of 29% with an average of 46%. Port Macquarie's highest humidity 82%, lowest 60% giving an average of 77%. Rather high?

Wagga's airport has a P.C.N. rating of 13 (Ports airport has a rating of 11).

Downside site is 15 minutes from central business district where a proven number of motels, restaurants, recreational and alternate sporting facilities are available. The Wagga Wagga City Council would support this venture fully as shown by its past involvement in its co-operation with previous delegations inquiring into the feasibility of such a venture.

The Downside site is approx 1,000 acres, well drained, flat terrain of which 80 acres is most suitable for a caravan park, cabin type units, tennis courts or other sporting facilities. It is separated from the main area by an access road, giving a quiet and peaceful environment, a short distance from the main shooting area.

40 DTL traps can be installed in a straight line facing a south easterly direction eliminating all sun problems. The unused portions could be leased for agricultural purposes without interruption to shooting, further boosting financial coffers.

I believe a greater number of shooters would support your appeal for financial assistance if given the chance to show their preference to the Downside site. Shooters interests and opinions would be appreciated.

ACTA National Ground — Gold and Platinum Cards

Interested parties have been contacting the ACTA office asking the following two questions.

1. What do I get for my money?
2. If I sign the Support Statement am I bound to my commitment?

It is envisaged that if the project goes ahead, it will include all the facilities the public expect at their holiday destination. This is one of the reasons for the proposal being sited along the NSW Mid North Coast, a popular tourist destination. Differing discounts on accommodation and services will apply to card holders. Time share proposals are also under consideration. However, until the Executive have some idea of the monies available for the project, details of discounts and privileges cannot be finalised.

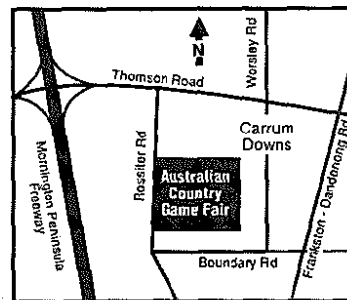

Sporting Clays

THE BEGINNING OF A NEW ERA

Following discussion the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) and the Sporting Shooter's Association of Australia (SSAA) have formalised an agreement to jointly market 'Sporting Clays' in Australia, and that each Associations members will be recognised with reciprocal rights when participating in 'Sporting Clays' on each other grounds.

This agreement will allow members of either Association to compete at all levels, from a National Championship, to club practice without the burden of an additional national membership fee. To facilitate a speedy amalgamated approach the first 'Australian Sporting Clays Championship' jointly sponsored by the ACTA and the SSAA will be held on the Gold Coast at Easter 1994.

Along with known target sequence 'Sporting Clays' events 'Five Stand Sporting' with unknown target

sequence will continue to expand and become an integral part of 'Sporting Clays' under this joint leadership.

A committee formed from both Associations will be responsible for the promotion and control, and will participate at the International level with membership of the 'International Sporting Clays Federation' which represents Sporting Clays shooters from North, South and Central America, England and Europe.

A common set of rules and grading system is being jointly developed which will be user friendly without detracting from a competitive aspect.

This unified approach will not only be beneficial for shotgun shooters, it will cement a partnership between two associations whose common interest aims are to lift the profile and acceptability of shooting in the community.

VICTORIAN STATE TRAP CARNIVAL

Melbourne Gun Club was the venue, and how well it looked following the recent rains and flooding. The weather threatened for much of the three days, but generally conditions were ideal with very little wind.

State Handicap

Nominations totalled 149 for the State Handicap which opened proceedings on the Friday morning.

At the end of the fifty targets, seven shooters had shot the possible, ranging in handicaps from 17 to 22 metres. The shoot off went just fifteen targets with Glen Hayden victorious on 65/65 from Terry Boucher, with Phil Grainger 3rd, Steve Atkins 4th and Leonie Peters 5th.

Dot Trindall was the womens winner 49/50, Craig Henwood juniors 49/50 and Tom Gannon veterans with 46/50.

State Double Rise Championship

Two 49s led the field after the 25 pairs, Steve Atkins and Bruce Webb. Five further pairs saw Steve Atkins win the title with 59/60 from Bruce Webb's 58/60 which won him AA grade. First A grade was R. Wiffen 46/50, B grade Tim Signorotto 42/50, and C grade first was won by former National President Tup Pedersen 41/50. American visitor Connie Schiller took the womens division with 42/50, Mitch Foon the juniors 45/50 and Jack Matthey the veterans on 40/50.

State Double Barrel Championship

Conditions were good as the first of the 192 entrants took to the tracks. Fifty-two shooters (27% of entrants) shot the lot, ensuring a long shoot off.

At 110 targets 24 shooters were still there, at 170 15 remained. On and on they went, still five shooting at 280 targets, David Nielsen, Mark Crevatin, Bill Iles, Tony Bradshaw and Robert Godfrey. Bradshaw went to sleep on target 281, Crevatin let 359 go and the other three shooters went on. David Nielsen missed target 402, Robert Godfrey 419, which left Bill Iles the winner, adding yet another State Title to his long list of successes at State and National level.

Robert Godfrey took AA grade 418/419, Robert Hunter A grade 100/101, Trevor Nash B grade 74/75, and Chris Wood C grade 48/50. Faye Burton beat the women with 49/50, Justin Waldron the juniors on 145/146, and Tom Gannon took the veterans section with 50/50.

State Single Barrel Championship

The single barrel attracted 183 entries and got underway long before the double barrel shoot off was completed.

Seven shooters shot the possible, and in 33 further targets we had a result. David Nielsen won with the fine score of 83/83. Mark Crevatin topped AA grade on 82/83, Craig Henwood A grade 54/56, B grade first went to Ian Stark 47/50, and C grade Mark Milroy 42/50. Connie Schiller again beat the women with 47/50, Chipper Chant juniors 59/61, and Tom Gannon made it a double in the veterans with his score of 48/55.

State Points Championship

Sunday dawned fine and cool with little wind, State Points C'ship and last chance to shoot well and make the state team.

Entries totalled 173 and at the end of fifty targets there were 4 possibles, 3 AA graders Rob Viney, Alan Blease, Steve Haberman and lone B grader Kane Sing.

Kane Sing was first to falter, followed by Alan Blease. Rob Viney and Steve Haberman settled down to fight it out. Suddenly, Steve Haberman had to pull a second barrel at target 21 and it was all over. Robert Viney was the State Points Champion for 1993, with 213/213. Steve Haberman took AA grade 212/213, Reg Walker A grade 169/174, Kane Sing B grade 150/150, and M. Hayek C grade 138/150.

Carmel Carlon topped the womens scores with 145/150, Nathan Cassells the juniors on 156/159, and Bill Henwood veterans 136/150.

The State Teams shot at the completion of the points championship, with Glen Hayden High Gun of the Open Team.

'TOP GUNS' DOMINATE IN NOVEMBER

Some of Australia's best clay target shooters have won prizes in the Winchester 'Top Gun' awards in November. Four of this month's winners have made it through to the final twelve competitors to contest the year by prize of 7,500 shotshells.

Craig Bentley from South Australia takes his total award claims up to seven with High Gun wins at the Port Pirie and Port Augusta two day shoots. Craig has now become the most prolific winner in the award scheme since its inception.

Neil Berry has won the two day High Gun at Gladstone in Queensland for the third time this year. Other Queenslanders to win their first awards at two day carnivals include Alan Denton (the current New Zealand Triples Champion) at Gemfields and Ray Collinson at Atherton in the far north of the state. This will no doubt become the first of many awards for Ray, as from 1994 all State Olympic Trap eliminations are covered under the award scheme, and Ray has been very successful in this area for many years. Jeff Nash from N.S.W. also wins 500 shotshells for each of his two day High Gun victories at Grafton and Cessnock. Gary Rootes also wins a case of shotshells for his win at The Forest.

Victoria had its two major carnivals in November with the D.T.L. Carnival providing 1,000 shotshells to Robert Viney of Werribee, for his win in the State Points Championship and another 1,000 to Glen Hayden for his Overall High Gun victory. The U.I.T. Carnival at Werribee proved successful for Craig Meuleman in the Skeet and 250 shotshells for Deserie Huddleston in the Ladies Olympic Trap and Kevin Gillespie in the Junior section.

The 1994 awards have now commenced, with registration still being open until March 31st. Next month's C.T.S.N. will carry the name of the 1993 Overall 'Top Gun' winner, to be decided on by the members of the National Shooting Committee.

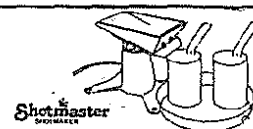

NATIONAL TRAINING SQUAD A.I.S. CAMP

November 15th-19th 1993

Under the National Sports Program, the ISU National Training Squad undertook a live in camp at the Australian Institute of Sport. The camp, funded through the Australian National Sports Program, was designed to bring the squad together for both practical and theoretical training. Included in the itinerary were study programs that would form part of ongoing projects designed to be of benefit to all A.C.T.A. members.

These programs may not supply immediate answers, but would begin to make available the data needed by shooters as directly related to our sport. As more research would be instigated, different or modified methods would be used based on these first documented programs.

On Sunday morning 14th Philip Petriella picked me up from the A.I.S. for a quick visit to the Canberra International Gun Club. Here I met with a group that would unselfishly give their time to ensure the program was successful. Mr Frank Petriella, a stalwart of ISU programs, would operate the Trench computer box, Damien Newcombe would load the traps, John Taylor and Graham Hatherley would ensure the Skeet machines operated.

Back at the Institutes' Hall of Residence, the first of the Training Squad were arriving and by evening all of the first group had arrived.

Day 1 Monday the 15th and the first group were at the Sports Science building for a hand, eye co-ordination test. Fred Schmetzer (bus driver and tourist guide) picked up the second group from the airport and returned in time for all to complete the tests.

The squad now consisted of Michael Diamond, Russell Mark, John Maxwell, Geoff Mark, Greg Newey, Craig Tilley, Glen Hayden, Deserie Huddleston, John Summers, Ian Hale, Clive Barton, Brian Prosser, myself and two coaches undertaking components of their Level 3 Accreditation, Fred Schmetzer N.S.W. and Vince Marney W.A.

Following a short break for lunch, we all headed for the gun club and the second of the programs. This began immediately and was an attempt to gauge the effects of recoil on each individual using a high speed camera from an overhead position. This we

hoped would help to better understand the gun-shoulder-face relationship upon the gun firing. Filming was conducted in the 3 disciplines — Trench, Double Trap and ISU Skeet.

During the latter part of the day a competition round was conducted so as to allow Mr Peter Davis from the Psychology Department to conduct a heart rate monitor profile on each of the squad. Back at the Institute and after dinner, a group discussion was held to get the squad members' view on requirements of future programs and where attention is needed.

Day 2 Tuesday the 16th began with a session on warm up techniques and general fitness as pertains to a clay target shooter.

Ms Kerry Johnson conducted the session so as each squad member could sought out ways that best suited them, as well as information on strengthening the muscles used by a clay target shooter. With Kerry agreeing to compile the data asked for, the squad headed for the gun club.

The program for the remainder of the day was a 100 target match to be scored using a much modified score sheet. With the two coaches being given areas of responsibility, the match was allowed to run its course. At the completion of the match, the data sheets were gathered for collation onto stat sheets, which will assist in helping to identify problem areas in the squad members shooting profile.

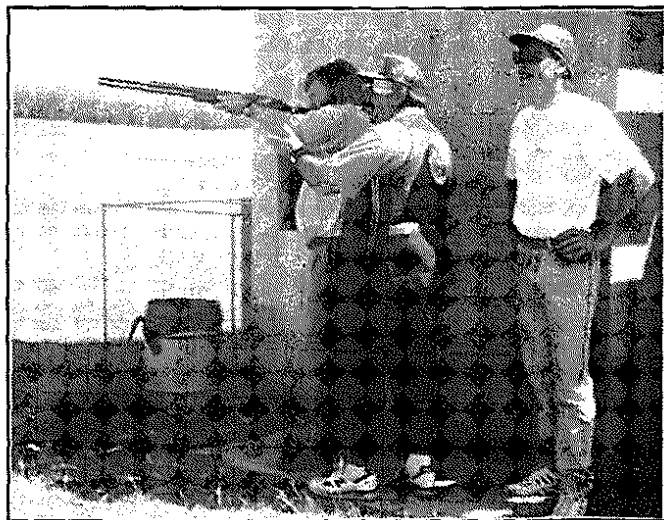
During the afternoon our new Executive Director, Graeme Brown along with the National Sports Program Co-ordinator, Bob Kershaw, turned up to view the team at work. Before they departed, both had fired at and hit clay targets on the skeet range.

Following dinner, the squad settled into a projector room to begin reviewing the previous days recoil filming. The results were startling and showed even with 24gum loads the effects on the shoulder to face were more than anticipated. John Baker, the video specialist, along with the squad members discussed the film at length to find ways of improving the quality and definition of the recoil effects for an ongoing program. This included camera positioning, different clothing, no ear muffs and onto the subject of a gun camera.

Fred Schmetzer had taken a suggestion from the previous evening and tried a demo tape for comment. The idea was to film the preparation of our top shooters from varying angles up to the point of calling for a target, thereby showing different methods employed by these competitors to arrive at the same position. Apart from one 'different body angle' it was agreed it was a worthwhile project and to be pursued for use by coaches and the Coaching Council.

Day 3 Wednesday the 17th and onto Sports Psychology with a Miss Vicki de Praza. Vicki discussed the different aspects involved in practice and competition from goal setting to the ability to overcome poor performances. After this discussion, it was back to the gun club where she would watch the squad at work and discuss problem areas individually and in groups. These discussions brought out many situations and problems, but before anyone realised, Vicki's time had run out and she headed for home, not before she too had broken a clay on the skeet range.

During these discussions another 100t match was conducted, again using the modified score sheets. At days end the scores were tallied and showed the depths of ability contained in this National Training Squad.

Day 4 Thursday the 18th found the squad on the road early heading back to the gun club. The first section of the day was devoted to Double Trap with the main emphasis placed around Deserie. To conclude the day and the practical section of the camp, a mini competition was held where each person had to shoot a round of trench and a round of skeet. A lot of good natured stirring took place, but in the end Michael with 25/25 Trench and 24/25 Skeet won through, from Ian Hale with 23/25 Trench and 24/25 Skeet. As a team, the Skeeties won the day subject to all bribes being paid.

Day 5 Friday the 19th was departure day, but not before the Sports Specialists, Mr Peter Davis, reviewed the results from the heart rate monitors and how they related to the individual. Peter then presented an overview of the physical and strength training that needs to be undertaken. Finally, the hand, eye co-ordination results were discussed. These results are for data base information of the A.I.S. and each squad member's profile folio.

Unfortunately Vicki de Praza had taken ill and was unable to attend for her final presentation, but a report will be made available to each squad member.

Much has been stated about reports and data being compiled in the above story. All this information is being made available to each state coach for use by all A.C.T.A. members as well as completed files being retained at the National Office.

Programs instigated will be revised and continued as future projects, culminating in useful and useable information either in written or video form.

In closing, special thanks must be expressed to the supporters of this A.C.T.A./N.S.P. program. Without their support, the National Sports Program would not have been the success it was. 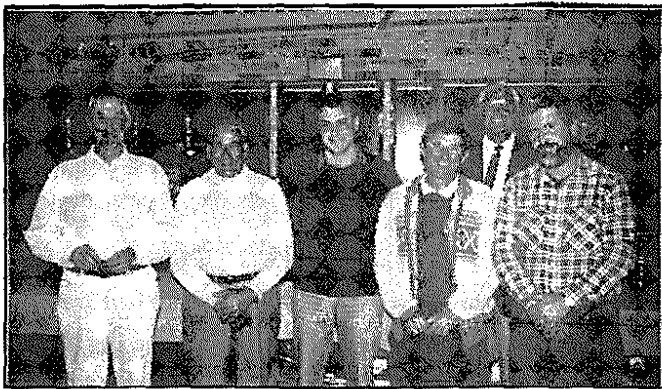

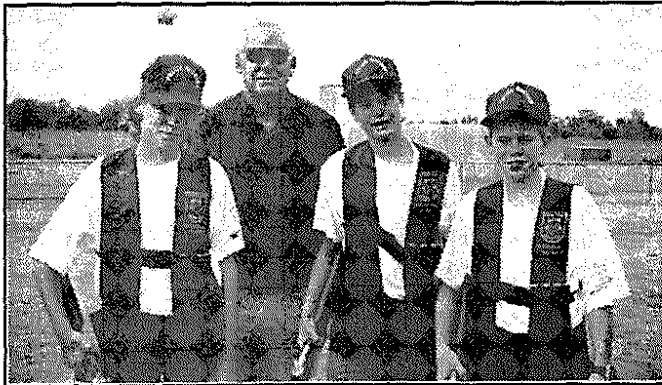

In Tasmania, bad weather is a major contributor to low shoot attendances for six or seven months of each year. When wind and rain combine with bitter cold, shooting becomes unpleasant and shooters' averages plummet.

In this state, we have 212 registered shooters, only a few of whom shoot regularly. Whilst the need to attract new shooters is well established, it would seem apparent that we are not meeting the needs of many of the people already belonging to our association.

The most successful clubs should be those with the best facilities, those who offer consistent targets, thrown over a good background, at competitive prices. However, we've all seen shooters willing to shoot abominable targets, in appalling conditions, at atrocious prices. How can club managements possibly cater for such fickle customers?

Regardless of weather, or who won, shooters who feel welcomed and their contribution appreciated, whose families are treated with respect and friendliness, are more likely to remember the day as pleasant and are more likely to return, hopefully, with a car full of friends.

SHOOTING SPORTSMAN OF THE YEAR 1993

The NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, the organisation which conducts the Government's mandatory firearms safety awareness testing for new applicants for shooters licences, sponsored the Shooting Sportsman of the Year Awards in 1993 for the second year. The Council is a subsidiary company of the NSW Shooting Association, which in itself is the umbrella body for all shooting disciplines in NSW.

The awards were made at a presentation dinner held on Friday 15 October 1993 at Sports House in Wentworth Park Greyhound Racing Complex in Glebe, Sydney.

Host for the evening was Channel 10 television personality, Ron Wilson, and the Guest of Honour was His Excellency the Governor of NSW, Rear Admiral Peter Sinclair, AC. Over 300 sportsmen and women and their partners representing all the affiliated bodies and many of the clubs involved in the sport of shooting in NSW were in attendance.

Each of the shooting disciplines affiliated with the NSW Shooting Association nominated two finalists from their clubs in NSW.

Nominees from the NSW Clay Target Association were Deserie Huddleston and Lynne Teale.

The Clay Target Association's bronze medallist was Lynne Teale from the Bega Gun Club on the far south coast of NSW. Lynne has a long involvement in shooting through her husband, Neville, and is an active organiser and supporter of firearms activities in the area. She is the treasurer of the Far South Coast Firearms Association, is a Range Officer with her club and holds the position of Club Secretary, Publicity Officer and Handicap Officer.

She has been a very active organiser and coordinator of events such as the Veterans Games at Wagga, the Clay Target Nationals at Virginia in South Australia, Riverina Zone Carnival, the Bega Christmas Shoot, and most recently, the Bega Country Style Muster Shoot, held in November.

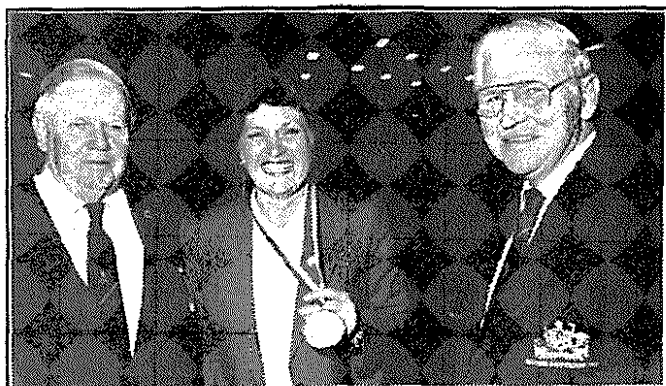
Silver medallist from the NSW Clay Target Association and also winner of the Gold Medal award as Shooting Sportsman of the Year was Deserie Huddleston from the NSW Gun Club at Terrey Hills. Deserie was presented with her award by the Governor of NSW, His Excellency, Rear Admiral Peter Sinclair, AO.

This is Deserie's first year in top level international competition and already she has gathered an impressive list of victories.

In the past year, she was the overall winner in the NSW State Titles held in Canberra in November, scoring 100 targets consecutively, the first woman in the world to complete this feat. Her overall score was 193 and the present women's world record is 194. She followed this up in January this year with selection as a member of the Australian Open team at the Oceania Titles in New Zealand.

In February, she was the overall winner in the Australian National Down The Line Clay Target Championships in Adelaide and was also the winner of the women's double barrel event. She made a clean sweep of the Australian National Olympic Clay Target Championships in Darwin, winning the City of Darwin, the Australian National and the Commonwealth Olympic Trap Championships, the National Double Trap Championship for women and was the winner of the women's Overall Championships.

In June, she competed in a World Cup in Italy and was placed seventh in the Womens Double Trap. In July, at the World Championships in Barcelona, she recorded the third highest score in the Womens Olympic Trap and was unlucky to be placed ninth in a count back to determine the placegetters.

Most recently she was invited to attend the World Cup Final in Munich in August, an invitation extended to only the top 12 shooters. Although Deserie was ill, suffering from pneumonia and unable to take any medication because of the rigid drug testing rules, she finished tenth overall, ahead of the current world champion, a very creditable performance.

The evening was hailed as a great success by the Chairman of the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, Mr Charles Copeman, who said it was important not only to develop the sporting talent already evident, but also to ensure we encouraged and properly trained our young competitors for the 2,000 Olympics. This evening was one way to encourage all shooters, whether or not their discipline is an Olympic one, to strive for their best.

WARATAH STATE NOTES

1994 NSW ISU

The ISU elimination series and selection criteria for the ISU State Teams has been under review for some time. After consultation with Bob Huddleston, and a recommendation from him, the Executive Committee has decided to accept his proposal which is as follows:

1. The teams be selected on a first past the post basis.
2. That 4 events at 4 separate clubs plus the State Carnival be the minimum requirement for selection in the State Olympic Trap team, and 4 events at 2 separate clubs plus the State Carnival be the minimum requirement for selection in the State ISU Skeet Team.
3. Shooters may attend as many shoots as they wish and then count their four best scores (only one score per club allowed for Trench).
4. There will be no set elimination series, but all events of 100t and more will count.
5. In 1994, we will have a final elimination as a substitute for a State Carnival in late November.
6. In 1995, the State Carnival will be moved to late November, and thereafter will be the last event for each calendar year.

It is hoped that these changes will be well received by the shooters and we thank Bob Huddleston for his interest and effort.

Shooting Sportsperson of the Year

As has already been reported, Deserie Huddleston won the 1993 Shooting Sportsperson of the Year Award, which was announced at a presentation dinner in Sydney in October. This is really quite some achievement, particularly for a woman in a sport which consists of predominately male competitors. SCHOOL STUDENTS CHAMPIONSHIPS

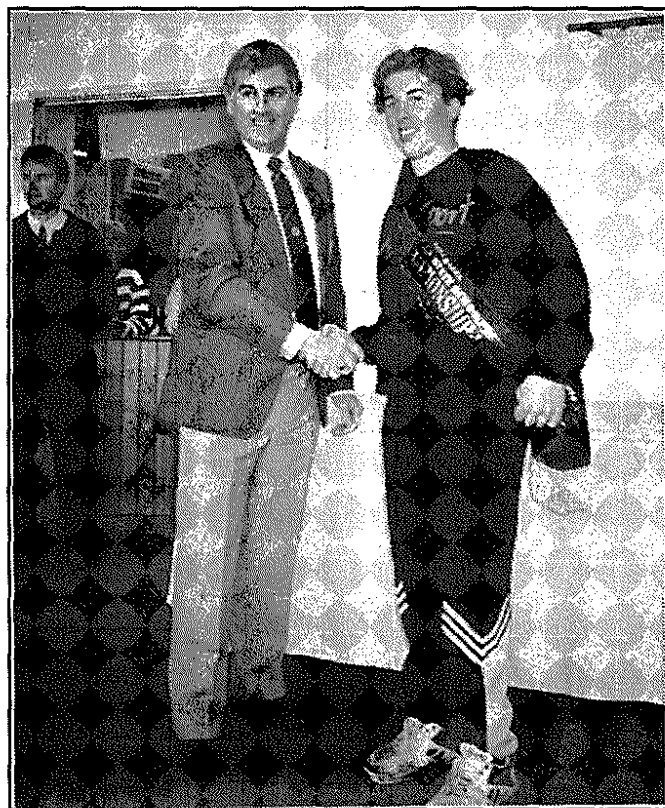
This years Victorian school students championships were a great success despite the industrial unrest that threatened many of the schools extra curricular activities.

THE 80 YEARS AND OVER BOYS

The Golden Oldies of our Game

Tup Pedersen of Drouin, Vic.

As a youngster in the early part of this century, Allan (Tup) Pedersen was destined to become a farm hand. He was born in Drouin, Victoria just 85 years ago. His father was a farmer and his grandfather was a market gardener. The land was in his blood and nobody, not even Tup, could see any other future for him. Few people could envisage that he would enter the motor industry, let alone spend more than 63 years in the industry.

At the age of 14 Tup took a job with one of Drouin's car dealers (Drouin Motors). The only qualification Tup needed was a driver's licence that cost him 2/6 (25 cents). After about 12 years behind the scenes Tup and his partner bought the place for the sum of 1,500 pounds (\$3,000), including the buildings. Despite a very good start, Drouin Motors faced tough times during World War II, when car sales plummeted and petrol rationing was introduced. However, the end of the war signalled a period of high turnover for Drouin Motors and Tup and his partner, George Clark, found it a good time to consolidate the business.

It was in 1948 that Tup decided it was time he enjoyed some recreation, and being a country boy, his thoughts turned to shooting. Clay target shooting was just beginning to reorganise after the war and so Tup took a liking to what he saw.

The early days of Gippsland in Eastern Victoria saw several gun clubs that were formed around the beginning of the century. They were of course live bird clubs. Around 1925 clay targets were replacing live birds, resulting in most of the live bird clubs changing over to clays.

It was 1948 when Tup Pedersen decided he would take up clay target shooting. I remember him coming into Hartleys Sports Store one afternoon. He told me he was going to shoot clay targets more seriously and wanted to know what kind of gun he should buy. He had joined the Moe Gun Club and used an old Hollis double barrel hammer gun for a few years, but had switched to a Browning auto.

About this time (early 1950s) the under and over gun by Browning was beginning to reach Australian clay target shooters. Tup purchased a model 'C' grade. He still has this gun today and has used it very successfully for over 35 years. Of course I had to make an alteration to the stock, which was originally a so-called field stock with a lower comb measurement. If my memory serves me correctly the going price was around \$200.

Over the 40 years that Tup has been competing at clay target shooting, he has taken out over 200 championships at both trap and skeet.

The Drouin Gun Club was formed in 1950 and officially opened by the then ACTA President, Jock Wilson. The club had a membership of 65, with Joe Oliver as President. Later, Tup Pedersen was elected President with Stan Turner, Secretary. The club carried on until 1982, when they disbanded to join up with Morwell club. Tup served on the ACTA Executive Committee from 1956 to 1977. He was appointed Vice-President in 1974 and National President 1975, serving for 2½ years. Tup is still attending shoots and enjoying the friendship of old and new shooters at the good age of 85 years.

One of the highlights of Tup's shooting career was a trip to the USA where he shot in the Grand American, an event that is billed as the biggest shooting tournament in the world. He brought back trophies from several shots that he attended whilst there.

In December of 1987, Tup and his wife Enid visited the Australian Masters Games held at Launceston, where he shot in all the shotgun events. He remarked to me that he and Enid enjoyed themselves so much, they had decided to travel to Alice Springs for the Northern Territory Masters Games in October the following year (1988). Sure enough he and Enid did visit Alice Springs. They actually did drive up.

It was at the Melbourne Gun Club a couple of weeks after their return from Alice that I had the opportunity to talk with them over their trip. It was obvious that he and his wife Enid had really enjoyed the shoot. Tup described the welcome they received from Club President and members and said it was out of this world. People just couldn't do enough for them. The President, Mick Marella and the Secretary Sue O'Grady were fabulous. The catering was really something to talk about.

Tup won a bronze medal in the 50 target points and a silver in the 30 target double. At the closing ceremony Tup was presented with a gold, silver and bronze for his effort at the age of 80 years.

Tup has attended 42 of the last 45 Nationals series. Sadly Tup's wife, Enid, passed away in 1990.

SYDNEY CLAY TARGET CLUB

1993 Anniversary Shoot — 13 & 14 November

Once a Committee has decided to hold an event of the size of this one, the planning usually takes many months. The SCTC Committee decided to hold an "Anniversary Shoot to Remember" at our meeting only two months previously. It all seemed so easy at the time, plan a program, buy a few prizes, seek some sponsorship, advertise it and hey presto, the required number of shooters would turn up on a perfect day and everyone would have a good time.

Then came the details, — how many events, how many targets, which traps to use, what prize value for each event, nominations cost, forms, sweeps, squad sheets, catering, raffles, scoreboards, shelter, practice — the list was suddenly three pages long. After a few more committee meetings, endless lists, thousands of phone calls to each other, hours at work typing this, faxing that, prizes to be quoted on and then purchased (Janenne, why are the best prices at shops the furthest distance from each other?), a few weekends working at the club and we had it all organised.

The morning of the 13th rolled around. Everyone on the Committee was to be at the club at 7.00am to set it all up. The one thing we had no control over was, yes, you guessed it, the weather. At 8.00am it was raining very heavily and the ground was covered in fog. A mass suicide was contemplated, but then we thought, what the heck if no one turns up, we could all shoot against each other and for once the committee could go home with prizes to match the effort we had put in.

By 9.00am shooters were arriving and by 9.30 the first five squads were ready to go and guess what — it stopped raining. In total on Saturday 81 shooters were competing for the vast array of magnificent prizes. We had our first day finished by 5.15pm.

The winners on day one were:

Event 1. 25t Graded Sweeps EO — \$10 from every nomination was put into each grades prize pool and 12 x AA received \$25, 4 x A received \$55, 3 x B received \$46 and one C grader Steve Dervis received \$90.

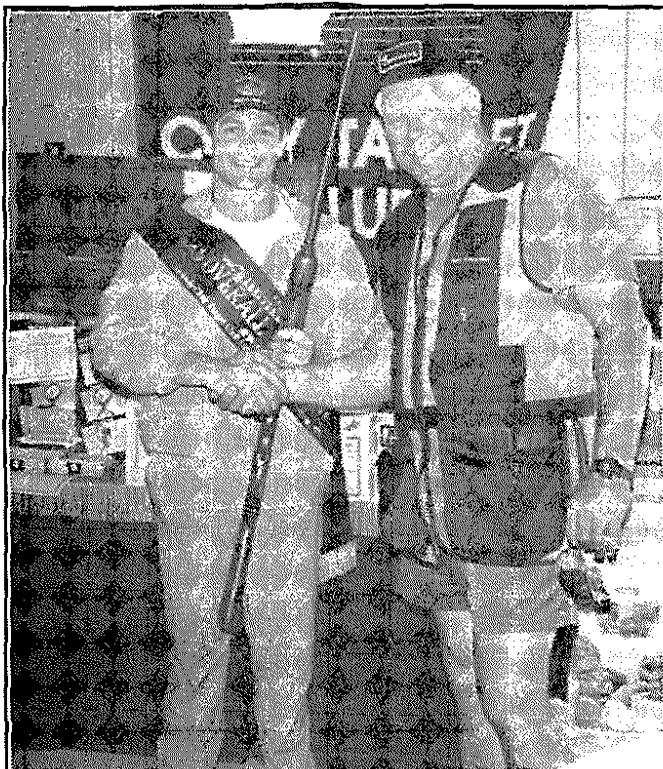
Event 2, 25t SB. Arthur Turner won AA with 44 over local shooter Rocky Carbone. 14 year old Luke Young won A with a perfect score and a not 14 year old Mal Tilley was second with 29/30. Alan Keevers (who built a new table to hold all our prizes — thanks Alan) won B with R. Said 2nd. Peter McGlinn won C grade.

The main event of the day carrying first prizes of microwave ovens then followed. Conditions were perfect and we hoped for lots of possibles and a big shoot off. Michael Diamond won AA from Ross Hibbert with a score of 158. Shane Samuels won A with 96/97 from Paul Farrugia, John Osman (a new shooter) won B with 38/38 from G. Event 4 was a 20pr DR. This was shot 5 pairs over 4 traps. Michael Diamond showed us all how to shoot double rise with 37/40 from Ivan Petrina on 36/40. E. 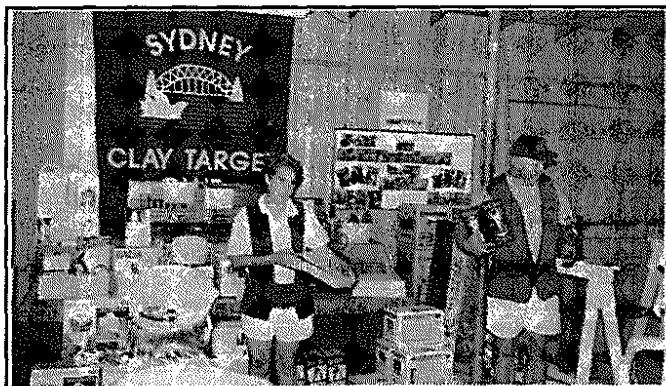

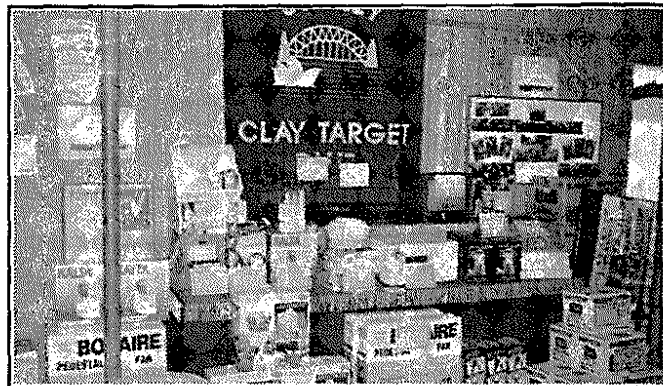
Michael Diamond being congratulated by Sydney President, Gary Kennerson. Michael won the Overall High Gun.

25t Fisher Firearms Points Score sponsored by Fisher Firearms was contested with only 2 possibles for the event being produced. F. Agostino was the overall winner.

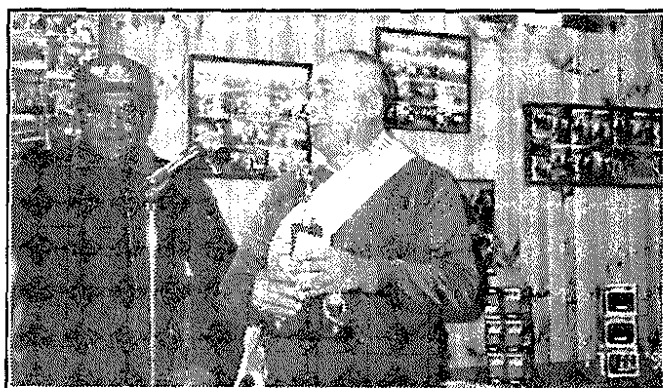

Sundays High Gun was sponsored D. Dean and won by L. Dimasi 149/150, well done Larry.



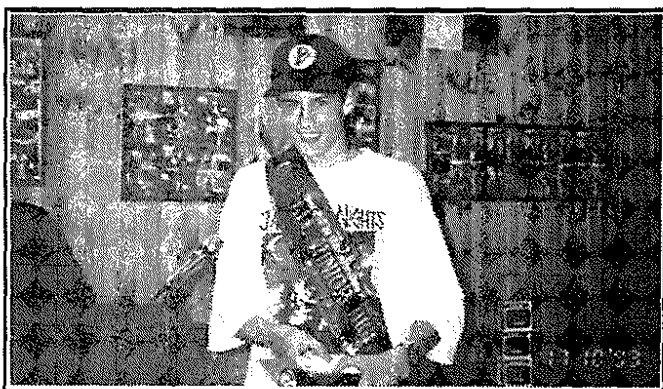
Larry Dimasi, Overall High Gun.

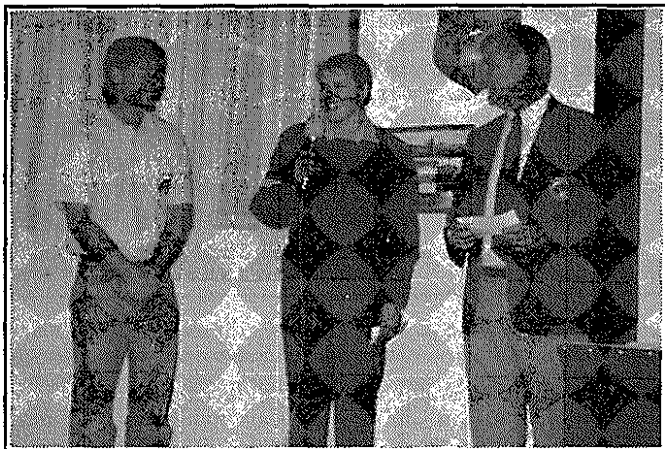

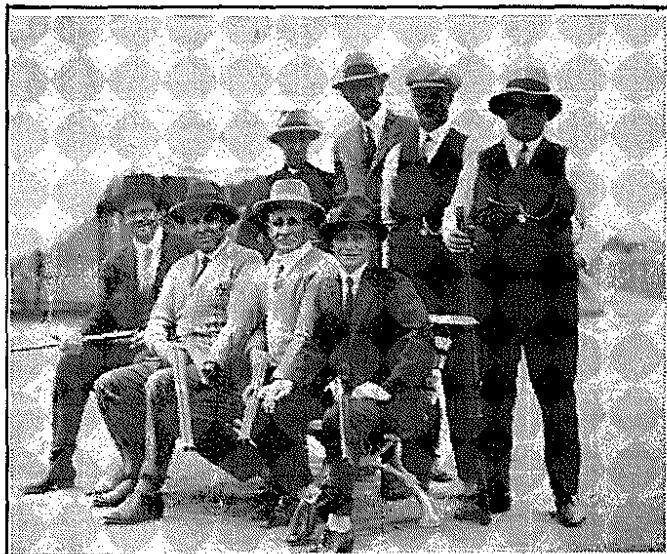

Top Guns The Foremost Eight

The competition was a 5,000 pound purse, \$10,000 dollars in todays money, Melbourne Gun Club, Tottenham Victoria, October 1926.

In early days before the introduction of clay targets, trap shooting was a popular shooting sport especially in country areas.

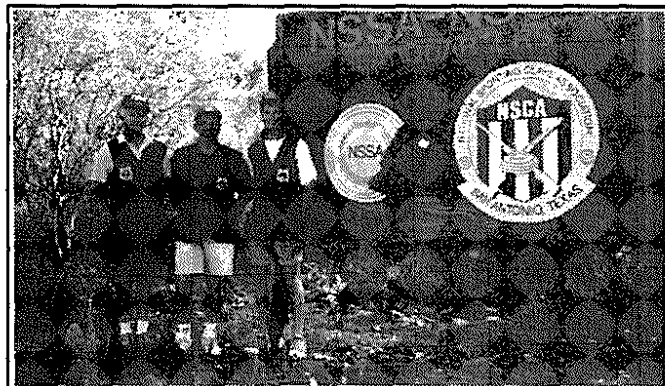

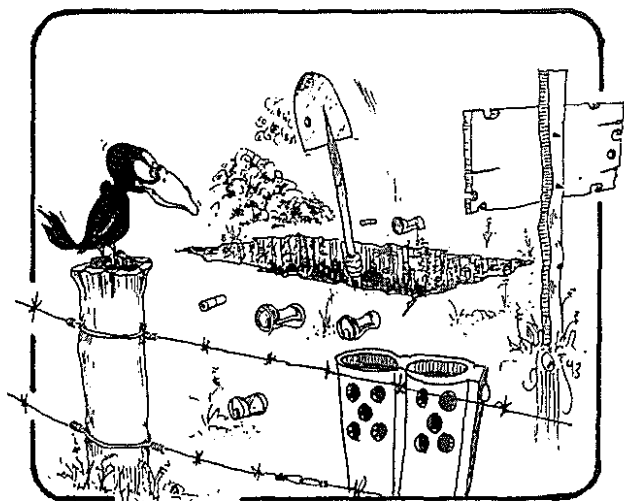

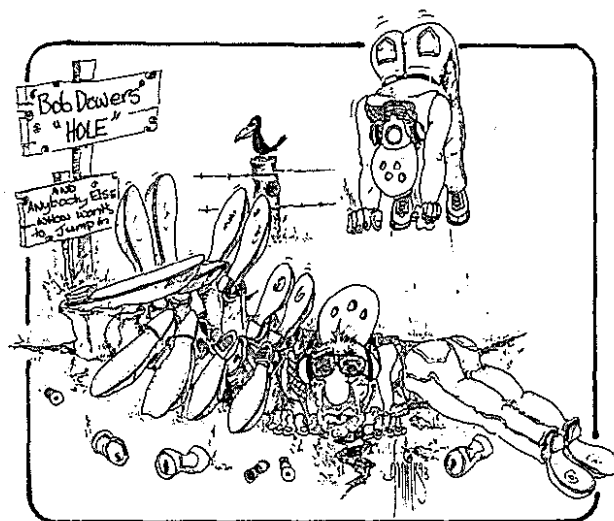

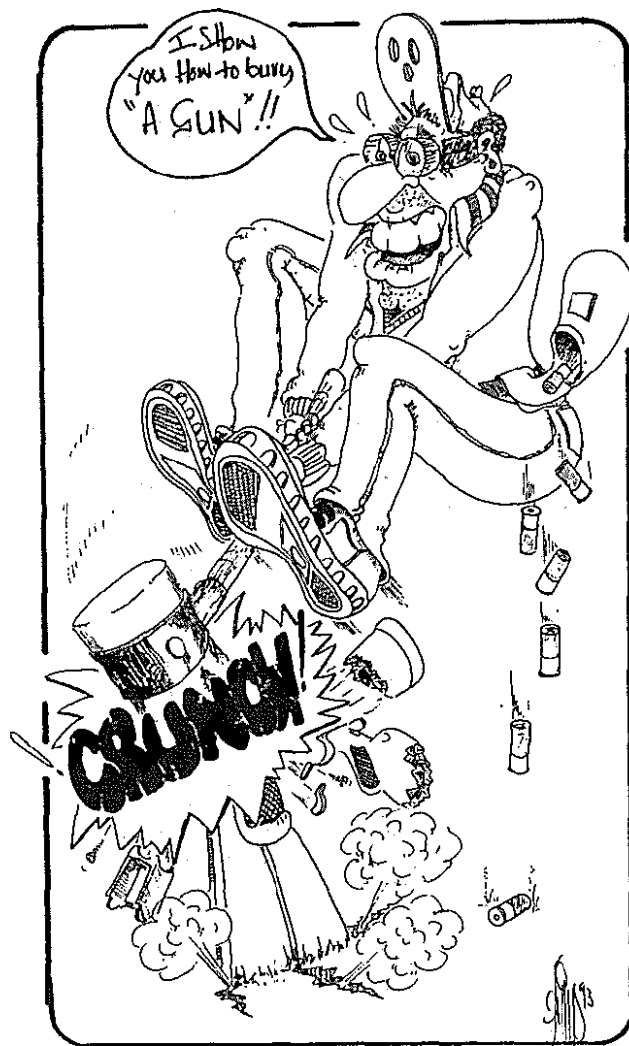

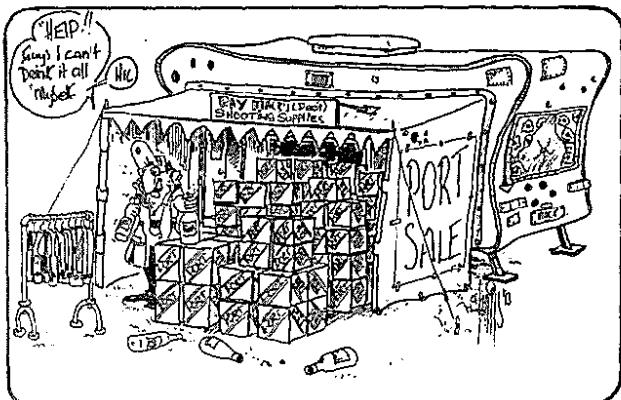

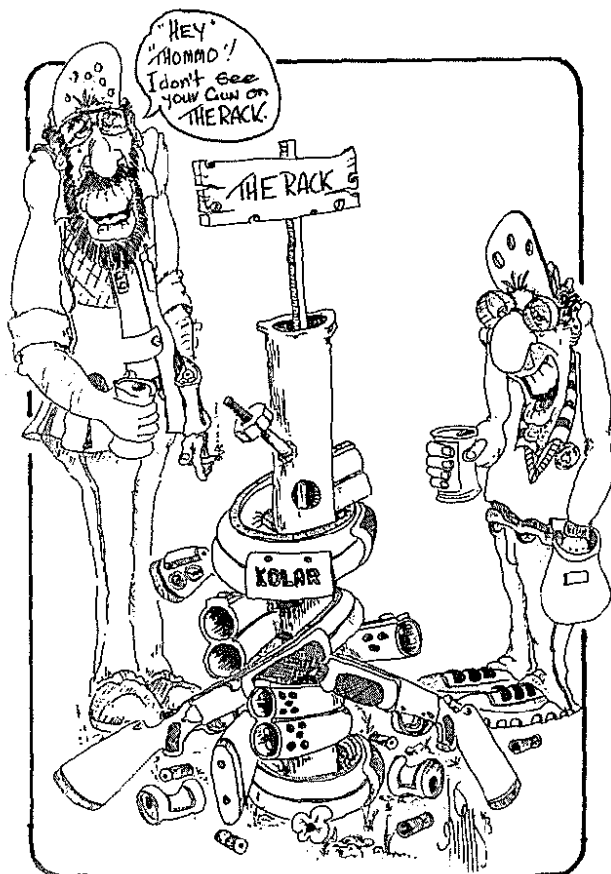

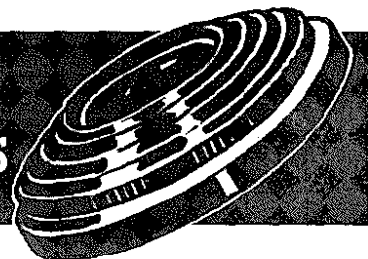
