NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S NOTES



ACTA Sporting Clays

Members of Executives of the ACTA, SSAA and Field & Game Federation (Australia) met recently in Melbourne at a meeting chaired by Mr Neal Tamblin of the Australian Shooting Association. The meeting was convened to deal with an objection by the Field & Game Federation to the ACTA and SSAA conducting the ACTA/SSAA Sporting Clays Nationals in April.

The outcome of the meeting was that any shooting organisation in Australia has the right to conduct a National Championship within their own right for their members. The fact that we have chose to combine with the SSAA for our Sporting Clays National does not alter this right.

The promotion of shooting and unity of all shooting bodies in Australia should be the primary principle of all the shooting groups.

Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting of the ACTA will take place in the Pandanus Room, Carindale Hotel-Motel, cnr Old Cleveland Road and Carindale Street, Carindale, Queensland on Friday 8th April 1994 at 8.00pm.

International Teams

The Executive is at the moment taking steps to help our International Teams perform to their highest capabilities whilst affording all our shooters the opportunity to represent their Country. Possibly one step in this direction would be requesting our shooters, once selected in a team, to give a firm commitment to concentrate solely on that particular discipline in the year of selection. That is to say, once a shooter accepts his place in a DTL trap team for an overseas competition, he then is not eligible for selection in a team to shoot skeet or ISU. I believe it is an issue that will be unpopular with some, but supported by most. The Executive will make a firm decision prior to the staging of any selection shoots.

Rules

Very few responses were received from members in relation to the request of suggestions on improving the Rules. Each States input will be looked at and any amendments to the Rules should be put forward in the April edition of the CTSN.

Licence Requirements — Nationals

The Queensland Firearms Registry has requested that visitors to Queensland for the Nationals should make application to them at least 1 month prior to travelling to Queensland to be issued with a visitors permit. The cost of the permit is \$5 and an application form has been inserted in the magazine for this purpose.

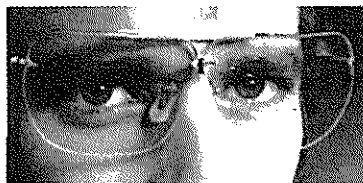

Conditions of Competition — Entry

Entry into the 1994 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1994 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors **must** produce their 1993 and 1994 registration cards, before nominating, to the 1994 Nationals Office Handicapper. Where a competitor was not registered for 1993 he/she must produce his 1994 registration card.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into a number of divisions. Exceptions to this rule are events where there are separate Championship titles for Ladies and Juniors, these events being the: National Double Barrel Championship, National Single Barrel Championship and the Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship.

Shooters may nominate in any one section of an event — Open, Ladies, Junior, Veteran.

Shooters who are eligible for, and elect to pay a reduced nomination (60% of open nomination) to enter a specific section, shall only be eligible for the section entered, as well as all High Gun awards.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved shooters shall be eligible for the Open team irrespective of the section nominated for. In addition to Open teams, shooters shall be eligible for team selection for the section nominated, Ladies, Junior, Veteran.

To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans — are those competitors over the age of 65 years on April 9, 1994.

Juniors — are those competitors who, on April 9, 1994 will be under the age of 18 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination, shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No. 6.

Random ammunition weighing will take place during the course of the tournament.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be full fluoro. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified — an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard. This applies to trap grades, **Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans** divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Womens, Juniors and Veterans who have elected to enter the Open section, will be indicated on the High Gun Scoreboard as: OL, OJ, OV.

Practice, subject to trap availability, will be available throughout the championships. Tickets may be purchased at the designated area.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

If, for any reason, the event cannot be completed on the day it commences, the management reserves the right to stop shooting at any time, if considered necessary.

In such a case, the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Services and Facilities

Catering: The catering service will be provided by an outside contractor. Arrangements are being made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu at reasonable prices.

Trade Displays: Commercial organisations associated with clay target shooting have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products connected with the shooting sports. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting.

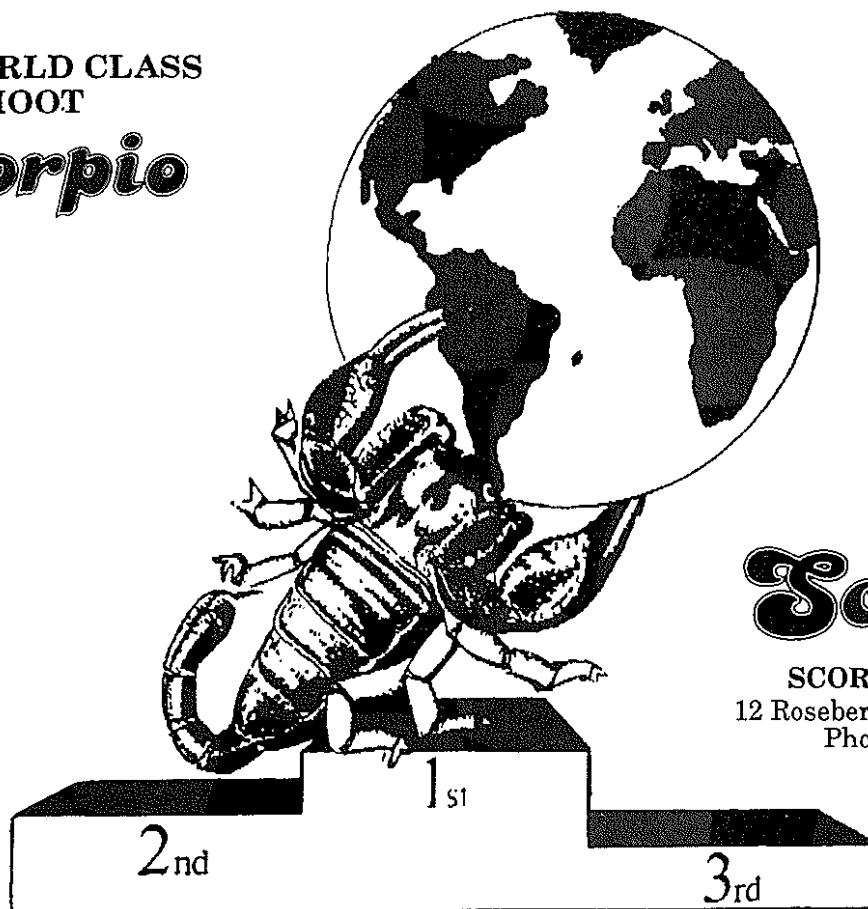

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
NOTE: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office whose decision shall be final.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. **Should the two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET shall be incurred.**
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT**. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
- Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scores are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- Options sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of

the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

- Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun awards, Section(s) and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition.
- A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- Nominations will close daily at 11.00am.
- The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors — Tournament Director to adjudicate.

SPORTING CLAYS

The Australian Clay Target Association Inc. wishes to clarify its position with regard the statement that we "... will participate at the international level" as mentioned in our press release published in the January 1994 edition of our magazine.

We wish to advise that it is not our intention to participate in Sporting Clays at an international level at this juncture.

CLAY TARGET SHOOTING RULES

Any reference in these rules pertaining to 'him' will also mean 'her'.

Safety

- (a) All guns must be (immediately) opened upon removal from a gun rack or car to determine that they are indeed empty.
- (b) All guns carried on or about the shooting ground must be held in a position of safety, with the breech open and unloaded at all times.
- (c) Shooting on the grounds at any place other than the firing point at legitimate targets only is prohibited except where a patter plate is installed, and then only with the permission of club management.
- (d) Shooting, holding the gun in any position other than orthodox is prohibited (with the exception of a physical disability). Any shooter acting in this way will be immediately suspended by Referee or Management and reported to the Executive Committee in writing. Minimum penalty three (3) months suspension.
- (e) The shooter will not close his gun until the result of the (previous target) has been called. The shooter must immediately open the gun upon having fired at this target, and must not attempt to turn around or move back until his gun has been opened and unloaded.
- (f) Shooters experiencing a misfire or malfunction must remain with the gun pointed in the direction of the target flight until the referee arrives to adjudicate.
- (g) During any event, competitors must remove all cartridges from their guns immediately upon the red signal at the traphouse, or if any official directs them.
- (h) No competitor shall close their gun to fire until all persons on the shooting pads have withdrawn.
- (i) Before the shooter may call for a target he must adopt the ready position with his feet firmly positioned and within the limits of the stand or one foot on the pad.
- (j) All stands are to have muzzle restraints to limit the arc of fire to safe areas.

Procedure

- (a) A competitor must be at the firing point within two minutes after having been called by the official referee, scorer or a member of the Club Management. Failing therein, he may be disqualified or penalised with loss of targets and may be re-squadded in the last squad at the discretion of the Club.
- (b) When at the firing point ready for competition, the competitor shall distinctly give the command specified by the referee or a similar command to the referee and thereafter the competitor is in the competition.
- (c) If a shooter deliberately delays the competition, or acts in a dishonest, unsportsmanlike or unsafe manner, the Committee may give him a warning, or fine him one target, or disqualify him from the competition.

SPORTING CLAYS

The following are Interim Rules which will be in place for the duration of the 1994 Australian Sporting Clays Nationals and through to the 31st December, 1994.

Shooting Range or Grounds

- (a) Following the configuration of the grounds, a sporting clays range must be equipped with a sufficient number of traps so that the competitor will shoot under conditions as near as possible to field shooting.
- (b) In order to simulate the above, targets shall be thrown at various speeds, singles or doubles, from in front or from behind, low or high, straight away, crossing, quartering or incoming, from either side, in the open or partly hidden by trees, bushes or other obstacles.
- (c) A shooter may only fire when a target has been thrown and it is his turn to shoot. It is forbidden to aim at, or shoot at another shooters target. It is also forbidden to aim at or shoot intentionally at living animals or birds on the course. Where there is a likelihood of a shooter pointing his gun towards the trap or the trapper, the host club must erect muzzle pegs to ensure that the trapper is protected at all times. Referees must be aware of these pegs, and instruct the squad accordingly.
- (d) In no case must the shooter move to the stand before the preceding shooter has left it, and it is his turn to shoot.
- (e) When setting up a sporting clays course, the club concerned must make sure that the traps are positioned in such a way that they afford maximum safety to the trapper, shooters and also any spectators.
- (f) The shooting station is defined as a clearly marked area from where the shooter will shoot his target or targets.

Rule 1. Trajectory of Targets

- 1a. At each stand, the trajectories of the targets must be similar in height, angle, distance and speed for all shooters. Targets must not be thrown from traps which are oscillating.
- 1b. At each stand which has targets on report the targets must be thrown in the same order for each shooter.
- 1c. The traps will not be changed during a round unless the target becomes unreasonable to shoot.

Rule 2. Traps

- 2a. Targets will be propelled by, and launched from any mechanical device which can achieve the desired trajectory and speed, using approved targets, at the shooters call or within 3 seconds thereof. Release may be by any means capable of producing the required release as described above.
- 2b. Devices which propel more than one target are acceptable.
- 2c. Devices propelling targets of more than one type, and devices capable of providing targets at varying angles may be employed, but only in such a fashion that all targets presented are the same for all shooters.

Rule 3. Organisation of Competitions

- 3a. The shooting will occur in squads with a maximum of 5 shooters.
- 3b. Shooters may shoot for targets only at the discretion of the host club.
- 3c. At each station the shooters will rotate the start eg. No 1 Shooter No 1 Station, No 2 Shooter No 2 Station and so on. At 5 stand sporting clays the station is completed before moving on to the next station, 5 shooters at 5 stations rotate until 25 targets are attempted.

- 3d. The shooting must occur without interruption, the shooter only allowed to pronounce the necessary words of command, or possibly to appeal, or to answer the referees questions. However, the referee can at any time interrupt the shooting.
- 3e. At all shoots a sighter target must be thrown at each station of the first round except 5 stand sporting clays where a target from each trap will be shown to the squad.
- 3f. At all shoots a sighter will be thrown for the first shooter and for the first shooter of subsequent squads only for the first round of the day. Sighter targets will only be thrown for second and subsequent rounds on the same layout if the target types, colour, trajectories, or the shooting station has been altered, or if a single target has been replaced with doubles or (vice-versa).
- 3g. A round will consist of 25 targets with no more than 6 pairs of doubles per round. Five stand sporting (level 3) 10 pair per round.
- 3h. A round may include: (1) single targets. (2) Simultaneous doubles — where two targets are released simultaneously. (3) Singles on report — when the second target can only be released when a shot has been fired at the first target. (4) Following pair (Rafale) — two single targets released one after the other in rapid succession. Piggy back doubles — or two targets released one on top of the other.
- 3i. All rules applying to simultaneous doubles also apply to rafale.
- 3j. Two cartridges can be used on each single target, but only two cartridges to be loaded into the gun at the one time.
- 3k. The shooter must be ready to commence shooting when called, and must take enough ammo and equipment to complete the round.
- 3l. In case of a malfunction of a trap during the shoot the referee will decide if the shooter is to continue at the next station or at the same station after repairs have been made.

Rule 4. Referees and Scorers

- 4a. The referee shall announce all specific conditions relating to a station before the squad commences shooting eg. number of targets, the target sequence whether single or doubles. He should also ensure that the shooters are in the correct order.

Rule 5. Officials

- 5a. Officials shall be any of the following. Club Captain, Shoot Marshall, ACTA Executive Member and Referees. They shall have absolute power over all proceedings where safety of competitors and others are concerned.
- 5b. The shoot marshall, after receiving a complaint from any other referee or official, may deduct a target or disqualify a competitor for: —
 - 1. Breaches of etiquette, good conduct or safety.
 - 2. Any incident which is likely to bring the sport into disrepute, or give any shooter an unfair advantage during competition.
- 5c. Refereeing — Squads will be responsible for their own refereeing an scoring, except where referees are appointed by the Shoot officials. Shoot officials may decide to have shooters referee following squads, and this will be undertaken as requested.

Rule 6. Protests

- 6a. All protests shall be settled immediately by the referee or if necessary a disputes committee as laid down by the National body.
- 6b. It shall be the responsibility of the competitor to check his score with the scorer before leaving the shooting pads (cages) or sporting clays course. Any protest must be lodged immediately.
- 6c. The referee may be assisted by a scorer who will record on the score sheet the score announced by the referee by placing a 1 for a hit and a 0 or X for a lost target.

- 6d. The referee of each squad will return the completed score sheet to the official scorers immediately on completion of the round. The referee will place his name and signature on the completed sheet before handing the sheet over.
- 6e. Any protests must be accompanied by a monetary fee set by the Committee which will be returned to the competitor if his protest is upheld.

Rule 7. Targets

- 7a. All targets whether they are broken or not remain the property of the host club.
- 7b. Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown as well as Mini, Midi, Battue, Rocket, Rabbit or Flash targets may be thrown or any other sporting clay target approved by the association.
- 7c. Target type and number for any stand will be at the discretion of the Shoot officials.
- 7d. Target type and number will be the same for all shooters and will total 25 targets per round.

Rule 8. No Targets

The referee will call 'no target' and the shooter will be asked to shoot again both singles and doubles to determine all scores regardless of whether the shooter has fired or not.

- 8a. When a target is not of complete construction.
- 8b. When a target is of a different colour to other targets used on that station during the round.
- 8c. When a target breaks leaving the trap.
- 8d. When a target has an abnormal trajectory or velocity deemed by the referee.
- 8e. If a target is thrown after a delay of more than 3 seconds.
- 8f. If a target is released before the shooter says ready or some word of command.
- 8g. If the target hits any obstruction before he has two clear shots when the target is on its normal trajectory.
- 8h. If the shooter does not maintain the ready position after having called for the target. (If the shooter has been warned once for the same reason during the same round, the target will be lost).
- 8i. If the shooter has been clearly disturbed.
- 8j. If another shooter fires at his target.
- 8k. If the referee cannot decide for any reason if the target has been hit or missed in either doubles or singles.
- 8l. If any target of doubles collides and breaks before the shooter fires.
- 8m. If the target is thrown from the wrong trap.
- 8n. If two targets are thrown simultaneously, when a single should have been thrown or vice-versa.

Rule 9. Two Singles Second on Report

- 9a. The second target when shooting singles on report is released immediately on report of the gun. However, the shooter must be prepared to receive this target up to 3 seconds later.
- 9b. If a shooter has a malfunction on the first shot when shooting singles on report he will be able to repeat the pair of targets.
- 9c. If a shooter has a malfunction on the first shot when shooting singles on report and has already had at least one malfunction he will be able to repeat the pair of targets being scored 0 on the first barrel and the result on the second.
- 9d. If the second target is thrown simultaneously or before the second shot has been fired the pair will be repeated for a score.
- 9e. If the second target when shooting singles on report is a no target or the first malfunction of the round occurs the result shall be scored on the first shot either hit or miss as the case may be and another pair of targets thrown. The shooter

then will fire at the two targets in the same order as before and the result of his second shot will then be scored.

Rule 10. Tied Shooting Shoot Offs

10a. If two or more shooters in an individual event or two or more teams in a teams event have the same score in a competition the shoot off for placings will occur by shooting one full round of 25 targets on a course decided by the host club. If after this round is completed the scores are still tied the shooters will begin at station 1 (pad) proceed on a normal round until a difference shown on the score sheet after an equal number of targets have been fired at.

10b. A competitor eligible for a shoot off is not permitted to practice that event between the event and the shoot off. To do so is automatic disqualification.

Rule 11. Shooting Stance

Gun butt to be held at waist level in all shoots except for those competitors within the grade of 'C' where gun position is optional. When the shooter is ready he will call ready or some word of command. At his discretion the referee or trapper will release a target or targets any time from 0 to 3 seconds after the call. If the gun is moving before the target is visible a warning will be given (one per round of 25), further infringement of the rule will be scored as a lost target. At all stations the gun must be mounted to the shoulder when fired. It is forbidden to dry fire or enact a shot outside of the shooting stations.

Rule 12. Refusals

The shooter has no right to refuse any normal target unless he has not pronounced the necessary word of command or if the target is thrown and a delay of more than three (3) seconds. The shooter has to signify he does not want to shoot by opening his gun or by raising his hand.

Rule 13. Malfunctions

In sporting clays there will be one malfunction allowed per round of 25 whether it be the gun safety catch on, forgot to load, faulty cartridge, gun not closed etc. If further malfunction occurs the competitor may use another gun to finish the round. Any malfunctions after one malfunction per round the target will be deemed lost.

Rule 14. Gun and Ammunition

14a. All smooth bore shotguns are allowed providing their calibre does not exceed 12 gauge and their length to comply with state laws.

14b. No additional handicap will be given to shooters using guns of calibre smaller than 12 gauge.

14c. Straps or slings must be removed before competing.

14d. Ammunition to be any commercially available field load or its equivalent in hand load not larger than No. 6.

14e. A maximum of two cartridges are allowed in any gun at any one time.

Grading Formula

AA Grade	85% to 100%
A Grade	75% to 84.99%
B Grade	65% to 74.99%
C Grade	0% to 64.99%

To be decided on a shooters last two hundred and fifty (250) targets with the highest and lowest round of 25 deducted = 200 targets.

Upgrading will take place every 250 targets. Downgrading every 500 targets with the highest and lowest 25 deducted from each 250. All completed rounds of 25 including shoot offs will be used. All ungraded shooters will be graded on their first 50 targets, which will then become part of their first 250 targets.

When Lady, Junior or Veteran classes are programmed as well as Open, entry can only be in one class.

Shoot organisers have the option of combining AA and A grade.

SPORTING CLAYS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The National Titles will be run annually as joint titles with the SSAA and the ACTA. The control of the event and of Five Stand Sporting in Australia will be vested in a committee of four, being two from SSAA and two from ACTA management. This committee will meet as often as its members see fit or at the request of either Association represented.

Number of Targets

National and State Titles will be conducted as Graded events of 125 Targets over 2 days. 75 targets on the first and 50 targets on the second day.

Exhibition Round — National and State Titles.

The top five placegetters in National and State Titles may be requested to participate in an exhibition round of 25 targets following these events.

Optional Purses

An optional purse may be run over each day of the National Title and over the title as a whole.

National Meeting

A special meeting of all interested shooters will be held at each National Title to allow input into sporting clays. Decisions to change any rules will be ratified by the members of the Joint Governing Committee, following direction from their respective Associations management body.

Special Rule Changes

Changes to these rules deemed necessary for safety reasons, to abide by Government Legislation, or to alleviate any 'Loophole' in these rules may be made by the Joint Governing Committee without notice.

1993 PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE AGM

1993 saw the continuation of administrative changes within the ACTA commenced in 1992. All members of the Executive have contributed to the running of the Association and the future is now one of consolidation and optimism.

Sub-committees again were re-shuffled for maximum effectiveness and the Shooting committee now combines the old Rules, National Championships and Shooting committees. The seven (7) person Management Committee is working exceptionally well, and regular teleconferences keeps all up to date with the workings of our Association.

Members of the Executive to retire during the year were Phil Grove and Bob Fox from the Northern Territory, Leighton Martin from South Australia, Noel Deeley from Queensland and Bill Eagle from Victoria. The Association members are indebted to the services to the sport of these persons and each is to be thanked for their particular input during the years they served on the Executive.

New members we welcomed to the Executive were Bronte Evans and Jim Bitossi (Northern Territory), Guy Yoannidis (South Australia), Tom Meadows (Queensland) and Ron Traill (Victoria). The input of these new members has already added greatly to our Association and we look forward to a long association with these members.

I must thank Mr Ian Hill for acting as temporary Executive Director and so ably running our office for us whilst we took steps to appoint a permanent Executive Director. Thank you Ian from all.

Mr Graeme Brown has been appointed as our new Executive Director and we welcome him to our Association. Graeme is settling in ably and we look forward to a long and happy partnership with him. I am confident that the Association will advance with his assistance.

1994 is the 'Year of the Coach' and Mr Murray Alexander has been extremely busy as our Director of Coaching. Murray's job is not easy and I congratulate him in the manner he has carried out his duties. I ask all members, clubs and states to promote coaching during 1994. One hears complaints from time to time re the requirements for our coaches, but this is not restricted to our sport, as all guidelines and stipulations for coaching are outside our control.

A much closer liaison has been formed with our closest international neighbours, New Zealand and the re-organisation of the Glenn Cup can do nothing but enhance our relationship. The teams to compete in both Trap and Skeet sections are now recognised as International Teams, and positions for places in these teams will be keenly sought.

The 1993 Skeet Nationals were conducted at Wagga Wagga in slightly damp conditions which did not in anyway effect the shooting, scores and atmosphere. David Cunningham was a worthy winner of the High Gun and Reg Clarke, Christian Naudin and Clive Barton were worthy Australian representatives at the World Championships in the U.S.A.

The introduction of ACTA Sporting Clays met with adverse comment and action from outside the ACTA. The Australian Shooting Association's adjudication that all shooting organisations in Australia should be able to conduct National Championships in varied disciplines for their members is a very positive and encouraging feature for the shooting sport. Our decision to combine with the Sporting Shooters Association Australia to conduct the First Australian Sporting Clays Championships is seen as a step forward in the right direction. to promote the shotgun sports.

The Trap Nationals in Adelaide were conducted in a very friendly but competitive atmosphere and Bill Iles produced the goods over the program to come out on top with the High Gun crown. Thank you to Graham Michell, and the South Australian Clay Target Association and the International Gun Club for a very well conducted Nationals.

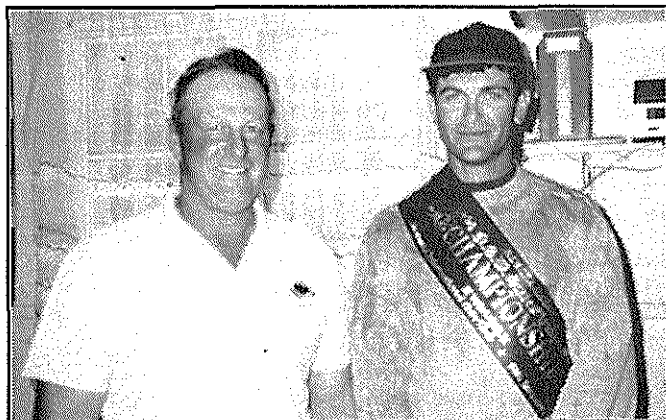

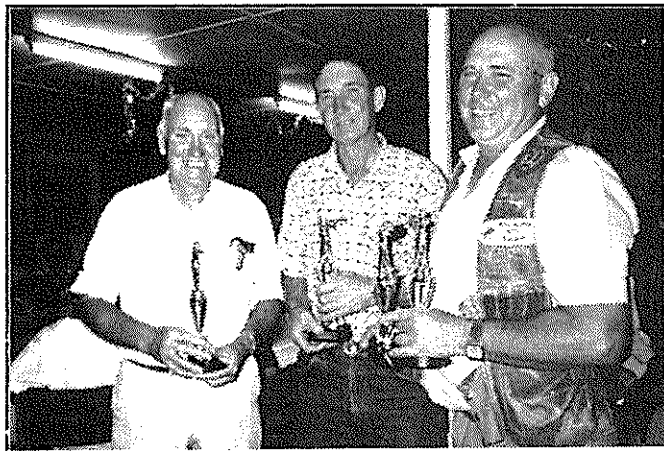

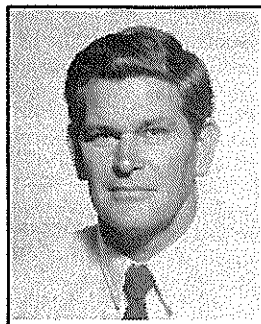

EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

The National Executive following numerous complaints are endeavouring to fix the problems with the current shooting rules. I congratulate them as in the past we were stuck with the rules until their expiry date.

In response to the Executive's open invitation for comment I put forward the following as a means of invoking comment, good, bad or otherwise from shooters.

The handicap rules as they stand and the proposed changes will destroy handicap shooting at least at small club level. Let's face it, club level is where we get our experience, hopefully for the day when we tackle an open shoot against top competitors. You can't get experience if clubs no longer hold handicap events because of the unfair rules.

On five occasions at our club in 1993 a handicap event was not held as the winner would have copped a metre for amounts ranging from \$7.50 to \$15. The event being a \$5 cash divide with a 50% return to the shooters.

A handicap system where two shooters receive the same penalty for vastly different prize values and competition standards is hardly fair. Now, it appears, that where clubs put on an event with substantial prizes in metreage groups, only the overall winner will be penalised. Hardly fair on the club shooter who would do a metre for a \$7.50 win.

In common mark shooting we use percentages to even up the competition. Why couldn't we use 'Accumulated Value' as a means of making things fairer for all in handicap events.

By having a system whereby everyone was penalised a metre after having accumulated (say \$500) in winnings, cash and or trophies — regardless of whether it was for 1st, 2nd or 3rd or a metreage group event, would, I think make everyone much happier and certainly be fairer for all.

Top shooters may reach the 'Accumulated Value' quicker because of the greater trophy values offered at Open Shoots whilst the club shooter will take longer because of lower prize money and less competition. Some shooters having not won anything will, under the proposed new rules, actually come in a metre or two subject to minimum distance by grade. All in all I think things would even itself out and be fairer to all.

All handicaps events be 20 or 25 targets to create consistency between clubs (State, Commonwealth and National 50 targets).

Penalties to apply regardless of entry fee or score shot.
