



## EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir.

#### Re: Need to change rules

#### Item 1. Baulk

Rule needs to be changed to, baulk can be paid anytime between the qualifying targets so a not be a distraction to other squad members (discussion, some times overheated, takes place whilst other shooters look on, and when shooting resumes will miss). Baulk must not be paid later, in shoot offs but finalised there and then or as under current rule re baulk.

#### Reason

Time and time again over 30 years shooting (competitive) I have seen shooters miss out on a possible through interuption of claim for a baulk and its reason there of. A competent referee should be able to distinguish a genuine request and without hesitation say 'do you shooter wish to shoot the baulk now or at the end of the round'. ie, later . . . the squad then continues on. Shooter at the point of interest to shoot the target he missed from lane in question, scorer to mark lane 5 3 2 or whatever.

#### Item 2. Shooter calls and shoots trap house, or ground

Rule should read (if shooter) calls and shoots trap house by mistake one shot and does not follow target when it is in the air and shoots again this is to be No Target, providing when he calls the target, it would still be on the plate in the opinion of the referee. This is very easy to distinguish, this rule has seen much discussion and people have been suspended through its interpretations believe it or not (arguments over its rule) most say call and shoot, you wear it even if its not off the plate.

#### Reason

Time and time again I have seen nervous shooters shoot the ground or trap house and everyone come down on them LOST LOST LOST, you shot at it. Of course the seasoned shooter knows that it is a terrible rule, the clay was not even off the plate. The rules are made up by us to promote and enjoy the sport not to put some poor innocent learner who is a bit jittery out of a prize or event.

#### Conclusion

Once again shooters are asked by the ACTA and States for input to rule changes. I am now putting pressure on Rules Committee to decide on these valid unfair rules to be addressed and take up as such and then seeing how interested the letter here has been, what do members think . . . 'let me know'.

Dear Sir,

I preface this letter by informing you that in the last twenty years as a registered referee that I have pressed the button for some of the best shots in this country without one word of dissent from any shooter as to any ruling I have made — until now.

On Sunday February 13th, I was asked to officiate at a fifty target Continental event. The squad had shot at a few targets when a shooter on lane five refused a legal right swinger. His next target was a left swinger which although was again legal brought about another refusal.

I asked the competitor his reason for his refusal of the target and he said that both targets were released too slow much to the astonishment of the remainder of the squad. I then handed the button to my scorer, an experienced shooter and shooting proceeded.

There are referees who have turned in their badge after an incident such as this and I must say that I was more than a little embarrassed, however I intend to referee whenever called upon. I conclude by saying that the 'refusal rule' is ambiguous but I give fair warning that if this happens again, providing that the target and pull were legal, I shall count the third refusal as 'lost' and the shooter concerned can take it up with club management.

Dear Sir.

Having shot DTL competition for the past 14 months I have noticed that many shooters I have spoken to are not too happy with many of the clubs grading systems.

One problem seems to be that due to a drop off of competitors a lot of clubs have reduced their grades from 4 to 3, therefore mixing both AA and A under the one grade. Many A grade shooters I've spoken to no longer see the sense in paying nominations to compete against AA shooters. Adding to the problem is the fact that AA shooters competing in 3 grade handicap events reduce their mark. Does this mean that A grade shooters will have to look for 4 grade events only?

To address this problem I feel some clubs may need to reduce the value of the trophies, rather than the quantity, therefore encouraging shooters to win their own grade.

Is this problem an ACTA or an individual club problem or both?

I stress that this letter is not to discriminate against AA shooters or any specific clubs, but rather to have clubs encourage all grades of shooters in this sport.

Dear Sir,

As I am required to take a prescription drug for fluid retention I was particularly interested in the advertisement placed in the February issue of the CTSN by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.

Curiosity got the better of me and I called the number. Imagine my surprise when I was informed that the prescribed drug I take (Natrilix) contains a banned substance under the ASDA guidelines.

The conversation with the ASDA proved very interesting. I also learnt that there are many 'over the counter' cough mixtures and the like that also contain banned substances which can be detected up to seven days following the last dose.

There are, of course, ways around the problem of a prescription drug with a banned substance in it. There is often another name that does the same or similar job but does not contain that substance. As a last resort, your doctor can write a letter stating that the particular drug with the banned substance is the only one available to you and you require it on medical grounds if he cannot find a substitute for you. It must be noted that such a letter has to be lodged with the National Association of your sport to be effective.

I would urge all shooters considering attending Nationals to make themselves aware of the requirements of the ASDA. Just think how disappointed you would be if drug testing took place and you have just won a National Title.

It is also equally important for the ACTA to make clear their stance on drugs and drug testing. There is no guarantee that drug testing will take place at the Nationals. Similarly, there is no guarantee that it won't so please be warned.






To me this has been one of the most enjoyable State Carmivals that I have attended and to whereever you may be reading this report... 'good shooting' and we hope to have you back again next year.

#### **Event 2. All States Skeet Championship**



The Frankston Australian Team of Bernie Mack, Ian Hale, David Cunningham, Mal Briggs and Bob Old took the Teams Match with 847/875.



# A Simple Guide for the Compilation of Shooters Handicap Cards

This booklet is dedicated to the memory of Lola Charles 1927-1993, Executive Member N.S.W.C.T.A. 1983-1993. Sadly missed.

#### History

In early 1993 several new rules were introduced that caused some confusion in how the handicap cards should be filled out.

Along with these rule changes and the introduction of the revised handicap card in 1994, the whole procedure of placing scores on the shooters handicap card has become totally confusing.

This booklet is designed to hopefully make this process a little more understandable.

#### Introduction

Since the introduction of the rule changes the two rules that have caused the most confusion are Rule 2.1(a) and Rule 2.1(h).

Just to refresh your memory, Rule 2.1(a) states the following:

 All appropriate 15 metre scores (common mark) shall be recorded for percentage performance classification irrespective of how the event is run.

#### NOTE

All targets that are shot under common mark competition conditions to be entered on the ACTA shooters card, with the exception of Double Rise events.

And Rule 2.1(h) states the following:

 It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to progressively mark the shooters card with his 15 metre results and after each 200 targets regrade the shooter if necessary.

#### NOTE

All shooters having shot at 200 targets would be graded. Any one (1) bad score entered on the Double Barrel competition would be wiped off and transposed for any one (1) good score from another event competition (off equal target amounts if possible).

It is this note to Rule 2.1(h) that has caused the most problems with the handicap cards and the regrading of shooters.

# Placing Scores on the Handicap Card — Rule 2.1(a) Double Barrel Events

In the past all Double Barrel (D/B) scores were added together and placed on the shooters card as a combined score.

If this was to happen now under the new rule system Rule 2.1(h) would not be able to be applied correctly. To overcome this problem all individual event scores should be entered on the shooters card as is stated in Rule 2.1(a).

#### Example

Consider the example where the following program was offered to shooters:

Event 1. 10tgt D/B Eye Opener Event 2. 25tgt D/B Championship Event 3. 25tgt P/S Championship Event 4. 25tgt S/B Championship

As was stated previously, in the past the Double Barrel (D/B) scores were added together and placed on the shooters card as a combined score, this is shown in Figure 1.

This is all well and good but for Rule 2.1(h) to have any chance of working then the scores should be entered on the shooters card as shown in Figure 2.

Notice that in the Event Score/Targets column has been divided into two columns, one is headed  ${\bf Other}$  and the other is headed  ${\bf D/B}$ .

This is done so that when it comes time to apply Rule 2.1(h) the handicapper will be able to distinguish between Double Barrel (D/B) scores and the other event scores, how this happens will be shown in later examples.

#### Single Barrel and Continental Events

If only it was so simple to include only the Double Barrel (D/B) scores on the shooters card, but Rule 2.1(a) states that "ALL targets that are shot under common mark competition conditions are to be entered on the ACTA shooters card", this includes Single Barrel (S/B) and Continental (Cont) targets.

#### Example

With the above in mind, if we now take the program from the previous example, all the scores from that program should be entered on the shooters card. After entering the scores, the shooters card will now look like Figure 3.

Notice that the inclusion of the Single Barrel (S/B) event, in the **Other** column on the card, had no effect to the progressive total.

#### Regrading Using Rule 2.1(h)

You may have thought that the previous procedure was a waste of time. However, as you will see, without placing the scores on the shooters card in this way great difficulties will be encountered in applying the regrading Rule 2.1(h).

Let's now look at the procedure that is required to apply Rule 2.1(h). This has been broken down into two simple steps to make it a little easier to understand.

#### Step 1.

As is the normal rule, regrading only takes place after the shooter has shot at 200 targets, that is 200 Double Barrel (D/B) targets.

Example

Consider the handicap card of the shooter called I. Gotit at Figure 4.

Notice that he has competed in several events including Double Barrel, and Other events i.e. Single Barrel (S/B) and Continental (Cont) events. These scores have been entered on the card in separate columns.

The total number of Double Barrel (D/B) targets shot at has reached in excess of 200 targets, therefore the card is to be ruled off and the shooter is to be regraded.

#### NOTE

If only the Double Barrel (D/B) scores were taken into account, as shown in Figure 4, then the shooter would have a percentage of 93.6%, therefore he would remain in B grade.

However this is not the case, and step 2 will explain further.

#### Step 2.

The next step under Rule 2.1(h) is to substitute one bad Double Barrel (D/B) competition score for one good score (of equal target amounts if possible) from another event competition. This sounds complex but let's consider the following example.

#### Example

Under Rule 2.1(h), I. Gotit's score of 22/25 for a Double Barrel (D/B) event can be replaced with the Other event score of 24/25. This will effectively change the progressive total as shown in Figure 5.

With the substitution of scores, I. Gotit's percentage has now increased to 94.6%, this would regrade him to 'A' Grade as shown in Figure 6.

#### Conclusion

As has been seen both Rule 2.1(a) and Rule 2.1(h) work hand in hand and must be applied together.

Without the scores being entered on the shooters card as shown it would become nearly impossible to substitute scores of equal value from Double Barrel (D/B) events with scores from other events as required under Rule 2.1(h).

If the steps that are laid out in this booklet are followed by all club handicappers then hopefully the confusion that has occurred in the past may be rectified.

# SHOOTING THE CLAY TARGET

By George Biggs, former Victorian State Coaching Director

#### A simple, commonsense approach to coaching

Forty odd years experience with the shotgun and ammunition and how to use them both in the field and at clay target shooting has convinced me that there is an urgent need for our Australian Coaching System to have a standard in depth coaching manual on correct coaching and teaching procedure in order to provide uniform coaching instruction for trap and skeet shooting at the zone and club level.

When I first commenced using the shotgun it was a case of figure things out for yourself and by trial and error and lots of practice. At that time there was no one around to show you how and what to do in order to shoot a moving target.

If our sport is to grow and prosper we have to promote and offer expert teaching advice to the beginner so that he/she will quickly begin to shoot targets. Given the right instructions and encouragement this will surely happen.

It's not uncommon to see a beginner shooter in a squad at trap or skeet — miss a target and almost right away he begins to get advice on how to shoot. Advice like, you're shooting behind or you're lifting your head, you're stopping your gun, etc. etc. All this advice is negative to the new shooter and the not so new shooter. It does indeed only confuse him and he begins to think, what the hell do I have to do to hit the darn thing?

Actually at this point, I see no reason at all to tell the shooter what he is doing wrong, it will only give him more detail to think about. What the instructor needs to do is explain and if necessary demonstrate to the pupil, not what he is doing wrong, but what he must do in order to hit the target.

I am sure a lot of advice is given with the best intentions to shooters about what they are doing wrong, but unfortunately it is not always the best advice.

During my 40 or so years of coaching and teaching the skills of shooting the clay target I have become very much aware of the fact that to help the shooter who needs help is to explain to him and demonstrate in a very simple manner the importance of the basic fundamentals that concern hitting the moving target.

All too often we see a shooter being given advice on how to shoot a particular target. The station no. 3 lane and the shooter is having trouble breaking the target from this position, especially the straight away target. What the shooter wants to know is, "How do I overcome this problem?"

One of the most common problems and one that is almost always neglected when instructing the new shooter is, does his or her gun suit the shooter. Does it fit and have they been shown how to mount it properly on shoulder in order to obtain correct gun and eye alignment? This is a much neglected subject.

#### Qualities of a coach

Without contradiction, to be a successful coach does not mean being a world champion shotgunner, however he must have experience and a complete knowledge of the techniques involved and be able to communicate with his pupils. Being a good coach and teacher is not always an easy job.

#### Coaching with the aid of the video camera

When used in the hands of a very well informed coach, the video camera becomes a very useful aid to coaching and trouble shooting. In the hands of a good coach the video camera can help to solve many problems relating to a shooters bad habits.

The video has an immediate effect on the shooter when the tape is played back by the coach who can explain where the faults are happening and bad habits develop.

Care should be taken to be sure the cameraman gets the right angle that will show up the trouble spots.

A still greater interest can be created by the coach, if when he is filming the coaching action, he can use a microphone which will record his commentary on the tape as it goes through the camera.

This procedure will provide lots of discussion when the tape is played back.



I know I'm a good shot, but sometimes as a coach I could do with some help, This manual will do the trick.

At the halfway point after the second round there were 7 possibles 50s.



The Blayney team of J. W. Smith, D. Piotrowski, G. Bunting, P. Griffith and J. Caltibianco shot a steady 122/125 for a total score of 491/500, which meant that the Newcastle team of J. Blazley, B. Barratto, R. Hibbert, H. Yates and M. Height had to shoot 125/125 to tie the score, a hard task.

They crashed with their worst round of 116/125 to finish on 482/500. In the meantime the Marconi team of B. Samuels, J. Boulos, G. Rootes, E. Boulos and Chris Young carded 120/125 for a total of 482/500 and finished equal second with Newcastle.

This is the first time in 20 years that the teams event has been won by a club outside the Sydney/Wollongong and surrounding areas.

Graeme proved to be a model of consistency at the National U.I.T. Trap Championships in Melbourne by winning the Overall High Gun over the six days shooting. He receives 2,500 shotshells for his win. He also won the honour of representing Australia at the Commonwealth Games in August in Canada. Graeme last represented Australia in 1983 when he was part of the Olympic Trap team which won the Bronze Medal at the World Championships. Other winners at the same tournament were Desiree Huddleston in the Ladies Olympic Trap High Gun, Ben Kelley in the Junior Olympic Trap High Gun, (Ben also made the Open Double Trap Team to represent Australia in July at the World Titles), Brett Hall in the Junior Olympic Trap National Title, Filippo Petriella in the A grade section of the same event. In the U.I.T. Skeet, Katie Light won the ladies honours whilst Barty Brighent won the Juniors.

At the South Australian Trap Carnival in Adelaide Tony Rohrlach won 2000 rounds for his wins in the State Single Barrel and the Overall High Guns, Les Chant won the Junior High Gun again, Keith Larcombe the Veterans and Lynn Beelitz the Ladies. The State Double Barrel was won by Darryn Nicholls from Broken Hill and he received 1,000 bonus shotshells for his win. Grades and 500 shotshells were won by Alan Vilcins 'A' grade and Daryl Taylor in 'C'. Other winners include Eric Hall for the A grade section of the Points and Frank Agostino for his grade in the Single Barrel.

#### 14th International Clay Target Championships


The Championships were conducted at the Norfolk Island Gun Club from February 7th to February 10th 1994, in warm and gusty conditions.

People who never pick up a shotgun suddenly became avid 'clay busters' and get really serious about breaking targets. Some get bitten by the clay bug and become full time members and shooters, and others become charity shoot specialists.

Every year however it is the total novice, someone who hasn't used a shotgun and in fact has probably never fired a firearm, who is the backbone of the Charity Shoot. To cater for these shooters each year the Mount Isa Gun Club conducts gun familiarisation sessions every Wednesday and Friday afternoon in the lead up to the Annual Unisys Royal Flying Doctor Service Charity Shoot.

The aim of these sessions is to provide training in the safe handling and use of firearms as well as coaching to make hitting those speedy little clays just a bit easier. Regardless of previous experience these sessions are the ideal place to learn new skills or hone existing ones and should be attended by everyone who intends to compete in the Charity Shoot.

"Early expectations aimed at attracting between 400 and 500 participants and at this stage we shouldn't have any problems reaching these figures," he said.

"Interest has really picked up, and the trickle of paid up entry forms is quickly becoming a flood. All of a sudden, people are realising the Games are no longer next year, but this year!"

The Clay Target program offers double barrel sweepstakes and championships. Olympic trap, and skeet sweepstakes and championships, beginning on September 30 and concluding on October 7.

The closing date for entries for the Games is July 15, with a World Masters Games entry fee of AUS\$95 providing two weeks of world class sport and entertainment, including the Welcome Ceremony and Parade, Wine and Food Frolic, and the Shooting sports participants' function.




