When I first heard ACTA had decided to introduce sporting clays I thought at last trap and skeet shooters won't have to travel to Field and Game venues and compete under different rules and regulations and (for the beginner) difficult targets. This can make a days shooting frustrating and, in some cases, a complete waste of time.

Sporting clays as shot in the UK are so popular because the new trap and English skeet shooter, can go along and be fairly competitive. If he/she enjoys the challenge of sporting clays he/she can move into FITASC (Field & Game), as a trap shooter moves into trench, skeet shooter onto ISU, or he/she can choose to remain with the easier discipline.

So what's the difference and what's my point? Gun position and time delay !!! You try to get your average trap shooter who has only shot trap to go along to your sporting clays, stick his trap gun on his hip, call pull, wait, mount his gun and shoot a fast crossing mini or piggy back double and enjoy missing it all day. Come on, please let's not have another elitist discipline. We have got ISU and trench for that.

Please do away with gun position and the delay. Make it fun for all or you'll not make it at all !!!

## **RULE CHANGES**

The Executive Committee at its recent meeting considered rule changes which have been recently published in the magazine.

A number of submissions have been received from shooters and clubs, and their comments and suggestions were very much appreciated.

The proposal is that the rule changes will be implemented as from July 1994.

Once the changes have been implemented they will continue to be monitored by the committee.

Before their implementation we are looking for shooters and clubs comments on the changes and we will be taking these comments until the end of June. Please forward same to the National Office.

The Rule Changes will be as follows:

- 1. Continental and Single Barrel will be deleted from Cards.
- 2. Minimum participation age shall be subject to State Law.
- Minimum Handicaps shall be: C grade 11 metres, B grade 15 metres, A grade 18 metres, AA grade 20 metres. To a maximum of 25 metres.
- Downgrading movement every 400 targets, Upward movement after 200 targets.
  - Downgrading shall be compulsory (if scores are at a lower percentage than the current grade), 1 grade per 400 targets.
- The common mark percentage of all grades shall go up by 1%. AA 98%+, A 95%-97%, B 88%-94%, C up to 87%.
- 6. The 50 break from C grade to go to B grade is to be deleted.
- A shooter cannot remain in a grade higher than his last 400 targets indicate.
- 8. There shall be no Group Handicaps.
- 9. All wins to be recorded with a 'W' on score card.
- Handicap Compulsory forward movement after every 100 targets if no win takes place.

## Two World Cup Bronze Medals to Australia

The Olympic Trap Team which represented Australia at the recent World Cup in Nicosia, Cyprus has won a team bronze medal and individual bronze. The team consisting of John Maxwell, Adam Vella and Russell Mark shot a combined total of 363/375 to finish one point behind the winning Russian team and lost a countback for second against the Italians. The United States finished in fourth position two points behind the Australians. A total of twenty-one teams contested the team competition.

In the individual event, Russell Mark won the bronze medal with a total of 145/150. A new world record was established by Giovanni Pellielo from Italy with 149/150. This was particularly good shooting considering the gusty wind conditions experienced on the last day, especially in the 'final'. Seventy-eight shooters competed in the event (in World Cup competitions a maximum of three per country is allowed to enter the event). John Maxwell finished 11th on countback with 121/125 and Adam Vella finished equal 25th with a score of 119/125. Russell and John received 14 and 6 points towards their selection in the 1996 Olympic Team from this event.

In the Double Trap, Russell Mark finished 10th with 135/150, therefore receiving a further 7 points, Adam Vella finished 16th with 133/150, but unfortunately as Adam is not part of the National Training Squad in Double Trap he is ineligible to receive an Olympic Qualifying point for the event. John Maxwell finished in equal 30th position with 129/150.

From Cyprus the team went on to Cairo in Egypt for the World Cup event in Olympic Trap only. Both Russell and John made the final in this event finishing 4th and 6th respectively. Russell lost the shoot off for silver and bronze medals against Americans Josh Lakatos and Todd Graves. These three shot off with a score of 140/150 with the winner, Phillip DuPont of Belgium winning by just one point on 141/150. Russell and John received 13 and 11 more Olympic Games Qualifying points from this event. The Australian Team finished fourth in the teams event. John finished with a total of 137/150 and Adam 27th with 108/125.

In all, the team was pleased with its results picking up two medals and narrowly missing out on another two. It was only the second time in history that two Australians have made the same final in a world event (the first being the 1991 World Cup in the USA where Russell Mark and Michael Diamond won individual Gold and Bronze medals). Russell received a total of 27 Olympic selection points in Olympic Trap and 7 in Double Trap whilst John Maxwell received a total of 17 points in Olympic Trap. Adam Vella handled the pressure of international competition well enough for his first time to be part of a winning team. Russell should now qualify for the prestigious World Cup final in Munich held after the Commonwealth Games in September.

Trophies will be presented at the end of each day's events, Nominations include contribution to the Discipline Fund. Interpretation of the program with be made by the attending members of the ACTA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

## 1994 NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

#### Conditions of Entry

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
  - Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
- Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 25, two visits to the traps.
- While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF TARGET shall be incurred.
- Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re squadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and or score throughout the period of competition. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area.
- 14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of

- the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 16. Persons paying a reduced nomination are considered eligible for all High Gun Awards, Section(s), and Overall. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition. High Gun over 400 targets of the National Program.
- 17. Open/Section Competitors are those paying Open or Full Nominations but who are also eligible for a Section. An Open/Section Competitor winning 1st, 2nd or 3rd Overall or 1st in a Grade, is NOT eligible for a Section Prize as well. An Open/Section Competitor winning 2nd or 3rd in a Grade will be eligible for a Section Prize as well.

  Persons eavight Reduced Nominations are eligible for their
  - Persons paying Reduced Nominations are eligible for their Section Only.
- 18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
- 19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.
- 20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
- Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 22. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in any State hosting the National Trap Championships.

#### Handicap Cards

Nominations will not be accepted from any shooter who cannot produce a stamped handicap card or have the handicapper approve the reason for not being able to do so.

The issue of a duplicate card by the handicapper will incur a charge of \$20. All shooters from AA to C grades must present their card to the handicapper for stamping prior to nominating.

The targets were of English manufacture (CCI), the full fluoro targets broke very consistently and there was no reports of targets dusting.


### **Target Settings**







Tommy Harris of Tumit, Overall 'Mulwex 100', Jim Allen, President is at the score board.


By mid afternoon the committee was starting to relax, another day another dollar, no problems, no hiccups.

As the double rise event was taking place, who won this and who won that were being sorted out in the clubhouse. By  $4.30 \, \mathrm{am}$  everything had been done.



The highlight of the shoot (they say the winner writes the history books) was surely the loss by the Gold Coast and Albert Clay Target Club of the Kilima Motel Shield. This is back to back losses to the Gold Coast. Well done lads. The Roma team of Robert Nugent, Alan Pack, Robert Rosenberger, Andrew Faulkner, Julian McEwan and Michael Kelly were as normal, extremely humble in victory. The team's non-shooting captain, coach, fearless leader and star of our television ad, Dale Colley, accepted the Shield from an overjoyed President of the Gold Coast, Mike Murphy. The shooting seemed to take second place to most of the other activities, however I suppose some people may be interested in





## A DAY YOU'LL NEVER FORGET

In the following story Tim Catling of Katanning, Western Australia tells of his experience on a day, at a place that he will not want to forget.

Dear George

I hope this finds you well and all the best for 1994.

Enclosed is a photo of the three place getters in the 1968 National Points Championship held in Adelaide.

George, I found this old photo when I was looking for something else and it occurred to me that the record set that day in Adelaide of 459/459 still remains to this day and that after 25 years is something of a record in itself. So I thought as ACTA Historian you may find this of interest, along with readers of the shooters news.

My memories of that day are still very clear and I will always be grateful to Hillary Baynes of SA, because he lent me his Browning Auto, after mine had broken down the day before in the Double Rise event.

After the 12 possibles got down to just 3 and then B. Watson missed his first barrel on his 82nd target, which left Newton and I to battle on. We shot on and on, with my auto miss feeding a few second barrels and I was just saying to myself that it didn't matter because if I didn't hit it with my first, then it was all over anyway.


Then Newton missed his 153rd target on the first barrel and took his gun off his shoulder and then realising that it was still whole proceeded to break it so far out.

That left me to shoot mine with the first barrel to win and I can still see that quartering left target breaking as clear as if it was yesterday.

Harry Cox (the shoot marshall) remarking that it was the best single barrel shooting seen at a Nationals in his memory, is a remark I will treasure always.

Coming across this photo brought back a wonderful memory.

Anthony Winston Bradshaw, better known as 'Braddy' is back in the limelight once again following his win in the New Zealand Mini Target Championship held at the National Championships at the Christchurch Clay Target Club in March. As all Australian Top Gun entrants enjoy reciprocal rights with New Zealand, Tony received 750 shotshells for his win. He previously won this event 15 years earlier setting a New Zealand record at the time. Tony was in the South Island on his honeymoon with his new wife Pauline when he 'saw the lights on' at the gun club and thought he would drop in. Speaking to Tony soon after his win he said he was disappointed the shoot off didn't go longer as he hardly raised a sweat and his top barrel was still cold. He described the scene around the grounds after the shoot off as similar to an Arnold Schwarzengger movie with 'dead and wounded all over the place'. Tony said the Christchurch fire brigade came along to the club after they heard about all the 'smoke' he was leaving in the sky. The referee complained he couldn't see any more because Tony was hitting them so hard all the 'soot' was blowing back into his eyes. Braddy put in some serious training before this event by 'working out' at Werribee's Master Wok Chinese Restaurant at least three times weekly. The 120 kilogram Bradshaw used 1300 H.A. loads to pulverise the mini targets 'back from where they came'. It sounds like a nightmare, but Tony's got the Silver Fern' to prove its reality. The legend lives on!

Also at the New Zealand National D.T.L. Championships, Allan Kenny from Hobart continued his good form from the Tasmanian State Titles by winning the Point Score Title after amassing 110 consecutive first barrel hits. Allan is better known as the hard working Vice-President of the A.C.T.A. He receives 1,000 target loads of his choice for his championship win.

Other March winners in the Top Gun' awards include Roger Vidal from Guyra for winning the Northern Zone two day D.T.L. competition at this home club. Roger received 500 shotshells for his victory. Ross Salpietro from Victoria wins 250 shotshells for his first place in his States Junior Skeet High Gun. Ross uses AA 1250 9s. Carol Ogden wins the same award for the Ladies High Gun. In Toowoomba, Ray Maroske proved too strong over the two days of their annual competition and wins 500 rounds for his efforts, Mark McInnes wins the same award for his High Gun victory at Newcastle.

The traps along the course's seven stations are manned by Singleton's Scouts and their supervisors, which are both a great money spinner and marvellous experience for the lads.

The layout is set up along a small creek where the bank and trees are utilised to provide interesting and challenging targets. The speed and distance of the targets vary greatly. Some shooters have been seen carrying a great variety of loads in an attempt to master the course.

Station one is a double rise with one straight away target and one that falls away to the left very quickly.

Most shooters like this station to begin the round, with the chance of shooting 4 from 4 more than a possibility.

Then comes 2 pairs of targets with a difference. On the shooter's call the first target flies up the creek, towards the shooter and passes overhead about 6 or 7 metres above the shooter. On the report of the first shot a second target is released from next to the shooter and flies out and over the creek bank. Some shooters find the first of these targets very easy to break, but to others it is a source of great frustration. Sometimes it seems that a choke like a trombone would be the answer to the problem.

Station 3 is a pair of double barrel targets that are almost straight away, but are launched from below the creek bed. The answer here is to shoot quickly before they get away too far.

The station known as the 'cross-over' is next. The first target flies right to left with the shooter attempting to score with double barrel. The next target is released left to right, double barrel again. Finally a pair are released from the right, then left on the report. There is a reasonable distance to the targets with the speed varying greatly depending on the direction of the breeze.

Station 5 is a set of double barrel and double rise targets that are close enough and slow enough to revive one's confidence if the 'cross-over' has taken its toll!

The 'rabbit' follows. Three double barrel targets that travel low the ground are released diagonally across the shooter. Plenty of lead is needed at this station. In the background is an aptly named pepper tree that would now contain enough shot to make a mining venture financially viable.

Station 7 has four targets to bring the tally for the round up to 25. The first target is released from 4 or 5 metres above the shooters head. The trap is set up on a platform in an old ironbark tree, and the target travels down and away from the shooter.

before disappearing into some shrubbery. On the report a second target is released that travels from next to the shooter, parallel to the ground along the creek bed.

Possibles are hard to come by, but AA graders have consistently scored 22 plus. A good C grade score would be 16/25.

Trophies have always been of a high standard. In recent years TVs, chain saws and refrigerators have been on offer.

Apart from the trophies though, Singleton offers a weekend of great fun, and an interesting change from down-the-line shooting. Keep the June Long Weekend in mind, and give Singleton a try.



### Commonwealth Olympic Double Trap Championship



#### National Olympic Double Trap Championship



## TALES FROM THE PAST

Around 1880, some twenty years before the introduction of clay targets, glass balls were being developed as a target for trap shooting in England and Europe. History tells us about the lengthy challenge matches at glass ball shooting during the 1880s.

In earlier times, prior to glass balls, live pigeon trap shooting was the popular form of shooting throughout Europe and England.


W. W. Greener in his book, 'The Gun and it's Development', relates how in July 1880, Captain A.H. Bogardus succeeded in scoring ninety-nine birds out of one hundred; the forty-seventh falling dead out of bounds. This extraordinary score was made in a match with a Mr Rimmell, an Englishman, for two hundred and fifty dollars a side.

Bogardis on thirty yards, Rimmell on twenty-eight yards, one hundred birds, straps, weather fair, and birds in good condition.

Both shooters used English double barrel guns and cartridges loaded with dittmar powder and one and one quarter ounces of number six shot.

Glass ball target shooting, a pastime that became popular, firstly in England and later became fashionable and developed by Captain Bogardus in America.

Glass balls when first introduced, were merely coloured glass. Further improvements were to checker them to prevent the shot from glancing off and they were also filled with smoke or feathers. The quickest time recorded for breaking one hundred glass balls with a shot gun was just under five minutes.

Captain Bogardus, the great American wing shot, made a match against time in December 1879 and succeeded in breaking five thousand and five hundred balls in a few seconds under seven hours and twenty minutes. Of the five thousand and five hundred shot at, he missed three hundred and fifty-six. He used an English gun with two sets of barrels and changed the barrels no less than fifty-five times.

Dr W. F. Carver, an American who spent sixteen years of his life among the American Indian tribes, attained great skill with the rifle, and made his debut in San Francisco as a professional marksman. He also visited Europe, and astonished all with his remarkable performances; coins, glass balls, oranges, etc, thrown into the air, were hit with the greatest of ease, in fact, his aim with the rifle was apparently unerring. His greatest feat was before the Prince of Wales when he broke one hundred glass balls consecutively with his rifle.

On February 7th 1881, a match was shot off at the Welsh Harp, Hendon between Dr Carver, the champion American, and Mr W. Scott, a celebrated English shot. The final score was Dr Carver sixty birds, Mr Scott sixty-two birds. The stakes amounted to five hundred pounds. The birds were the quickest seen during the whole winter months and the weather was vile, the greater part of the match was shot in a blinding snow storm.

I am indebted to Greg Kean for the following story. Greg was an executive member of the original Melbourne Gun Club which was situated at Tottenham on the west side of the city. The club ceased operations in the late 1950s when live bird shooting was banned in Victoria.

Dear George,

This yarn came to me from C. B. (Barney) Medway, now departed.

Barney came from the Benalla district and he was a smallish fellow with a handy way with words.

His shooting days were tapering off when I knew him, but he was always on for a yarn.

Anyhow as Barney told it, the great Dr. Carver from the US of A, with his reputation as the greatest wing shot in history, arrived at the New South Wales Gun Club (I think it would have been at Sans Souci, which is now part of the Mascot Airport. The clubhouse and the dog kennels and bird cages were still there a few years ago) and he challenged any person in the world to shoot him a match from 30 yards, 100 birds up, and one hundred pounds a side.

He was challenged five times and he won each time, although Jack Neeld ran him close when he shot 93 to the Doctors 94.

I knew Jack Neeld's son, another Jack and I had discussions with him about it, but he lacked a sense of history and was only mildly interested, although Errol Bullen, another member of the NSW Gun Club of my days there, confirmed Barney's story.

Carver then came to the Melbourne Gun Club (at Brighton I think) and challenged anybody in the land, to shoot against him, on the same conditions as in Sydney.

There were several takers and once again Carver won each match. In one of these matches, after he had shot about twenty birds straight, the Doctor walked off the mark and called for a strip of lead, he said he felt he was over swinging and wanted to wrap the lead around his barrels to slow himself down a little.

After pocketing the loot and running out of challengers, Carver issued an open challenge for five hundred pounds a side, 100 birds up.

This offer went untaken for a few weeks while Carver won about every event he wanted to win in the daily competitions of those days.

Then one Friday, the Grant brothers from Skipton, walked into the club on one of their occasional visits. They worked as rabbiters on very ordinary wages and their ability to shoot at the club was limited.

According to Barney they were 'pretty fair shots'.

They had never heard of Carver but when told of the challenge they had a little discussion, pooled their money and drew straws to see who would do the shooting.

Bobby drew the long straw, and after checking that the Carver money was up, they paid their five hundred, and the match was set for the Saturday a week away.

A great crowd came along for the event and over fifty bookmakers stood up to do battle with the punters, (these were the days before sprung traps) and the odds would have been five to two on, or worse.

Anyhow with much excitement, huge betting, and a break for lunch, the bid day saw the great Carver shoot 99 out of the hundred, and in Barney's words "it wasn't bloody well good enough, Bobby shot the 100".

#### Donald Mackintosh

World Champion Australian shooter and founder of our sport. Well before those of us who are shooting today were born, Donald Mackintosh was making a name for Australia on European shooting grounds and at the leading gun clubs of England in the 1890s.

The following story is a personal sketch of Donald Mackintosh by an un-named Australian journalist of that time and was published in a leading Melbourne daily newspaper and magazines.

A few reminiscences of the three Final Challenge Cup competitions below will interest shooting men.

A few little incidents entering the humour of these competitions will interest my young shooting friends today. I had many friendly battles before winning the Melbourne Challenge Cup, being the holder on ten occasions. When the final stage was reached it resulted in a tie, and the late J. L. Purves, QC (who had himself held it five times) remarked: "Oh, why bother coming back for your cartridges every shot. Take your magazine out, you will hit them till the cows come home." (score 61 out of 64).

The Paris Challenge Cup was shot for in the famous Bois de Bologne. On each of the three competitions a different nationality tied — namely, H. Journer (France), Edgar Murphy (America) and Marquis de Villavisiocia (Spain). Like the old Melbourne Gun Club,

jokes went round, and an American wag, noticing my earnestness to win, began to pile up various things, such as coats, empty cartridge boxes, etc, under the cushion of the big deck chair I sat on until it was heaped to the arm rests. I sat on that chair as if feather coated, much to the amusement of my wag friend and his followers, who, after the victory, gave me a hearty handshake and a hearty laff. Score 50 straight, 30 yards.

The English Challenge Cup was shot for on the Gun Club's grounds at Wormwood Scrubs, London, under International Champion conditions, 25 pounds each, and attracted entries from over a dozen nationalities, including America.

Unlike other clubs, no barracking entered the game, and it is still dreadfully fresh in my memory going out on the mark in dead silence, twenty-four times in a tie with Mr Vernon Barker (then Champion of the Gun Club, England). On the previous Saturday, I had a similar experience with the same man. When nearing the final, in dead silence, our footsteps on the asphalt being the only sound. I overheard an old veteran remark, "Vernon will beat this man." Colonel Ned Hopwood replied in most dignified tones, "Oh, no, there is no certainty; this man shot him to a standstill last week." On nearing the final Mr. B. suggested tossing a coin, and on my decision to keep on he had a good old brandy and missed the easiest bird in the whole three competitions. Score, 60-62, off 30 yards.

Now, as an older and perhaps a wiser man I will say, in the words of the Hon. R. Beresford, these were stirring times, but, after all, was it really worth while — Give me a day in the field at snipe, where I first learned how easy it was to miss.

It was he who inspired a very great interest in the sport in a number of very keen shooters there, and from that interest the Ballandean Gun Club came into being in September 1960.

It was Jan Elliott's influence which was responsible for Queensland's one and only Car Shoot very successfully conducted at Ballandean in May 1963.

Jan was a Foundation Member and Life Member of the Ballandean Gun Club and will never be forgotten by those who knew him.

## Malcom Fuller

It is with great regret that I report the death of Malcom Fuller on March 18, 1994, after a three month struggle with liver failure. Malcom as a first class gun shot and founder of the Fuller Firearms Group, was known to a very large number of

Australian and overseas shooters as well as being highly regarded in the firearms industry around the world. He will be universallymissed.

Malcom was this club's longest serving active shooter, he joined the N.S.W. Gun Club Ltd, on November 11, 1951 and was still shooting very well until illness prevented him from continuing last December. Initially Hargrave Park and Pagewood Gun Clubs were his home grounds, however he shot wherever he could with considerable distinction. We have press clippings recording him winning trophies at the Sesqui Centenary Celebration 2 day shoot at Pagewood Gun Club in 1937, aged 13, he subsequently won the N.S.W. Gun Club Skeet Championship while still 13. He was a regular visitor at gun clubs around Sydney until he turned 18 when he enlisted in the A.I.F.

Malcom's life long hobbies were shooting and spearfishing, after the war he was able to turn his hobbies into his business, founding the Fuller Firearms Group, now run by his sons, David, John and Adrian. The name Fuller quickly became synonymous with the import of quality firearms and ammunition and the firm rapidly became the leader in it's field under his astute management.

Malcom travelled widely both in Australia and overseas, he was welcomed everywhere. In the U.S.A. he competed regularly in the American Grand National winning events and posting many good scores, as well as many other American competitions. He also shot in Great Britain and on the continent. On the continent he mainly shot 'flyers', performing well, particularly at Monte Carlo. He was widely known in New Zealand, he was the first Australian to win a New Zealand National title, the Single Barrel in 1965, subsequently he won the New Zealand Skeet Championship 1971. He represented Australia in teams against New Zealand many times, he was an Australian Mackintosh member several times, his score in Adelaide in 1993 was exceptional.

Malcom at all times was a gentleman and the epitome of a sportsman, his achievement of 55 years at the top of his sport is undoubtedly unique, his shooting friends around the world will deeply regret his passing.

We extend our deepest sympathy to his wife and family.




