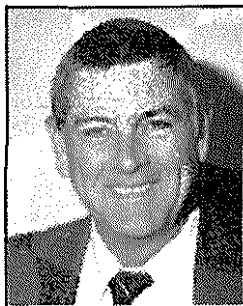

NATIONAL PRESIDENT'S NOTES



National Championships . . . Programming

It has been suggested that standard annual dates for all Nationals and State Carnivals should be fixed.

Many shooters also believe that these Carnivals should also be spaced over the full twelve months, rather than all virtually in the first six months. The scenario could possibly be:

- ISU Nationals commencing the second weekend in February
- Trap Nationals commencing the third weekend in April
- Skeet Nationals commencing the fourth weekend in October

In line with these dates, each State could then set their own Carnivals. If the above was to be the case, then shooters could put their shooting plans in place for some time.

As with all proposals, there are also issues against, such things as climatic conditions of host states, international events to be conducted in Australia, as well as our own participation in overseas events would create some necessary changes.

Whatever your thoughts, I believe, we, the National Executive must give shooters as much notice as possible of all our events.

Recognition of Long Breaks

With some very notable big breaks being recorded by shooters in recent times, notably the scores of Bill Iles and Michael Diamond in New Zealand and previous to that, Russell Marks record at Tamworth, the question of what should constitute long breaks is now being asked.

Should shooters be able to carry an unbroken score in a particular discipline from one shoot to the next, until the run is broken by a miss? This would allow the shooter to shoot other types of events also between.

An example would be, a shooter would compete in and win the double barrel event at Melbourne on day 1, shooting 210 targets. One week later competing at Maryborough, firstly in a single barrel event, recording 24/25, and then winning the double barrel event with a score of 140, his break would then be 350, the single barrel taking no part in the double barrel break.

The shooter would carry forward his double barrel scores at various shoots until he missed a double barrel target.

If this was the case, then it could also apply from country to country shooting similar disciplines, i.e. New Zealand to Australia and vice versa.

Establishment of Records

Quite often we receive inquiries at the office to establish if a particular feat is an ACTA record. Many of these inquiries cannot be decided because it has not been the practice to keep a list of achievements in the past.

With this in mind we are to commence a record of achievements by shooters. A list will be published in a forthcoming issue of the CTSN, and then we will rely on the input of our readers to establish, if in fact, the published name is the holder of a particular record. It will cover such topics as: the youngest/oldest registered shooter to win overall championships in open competition; the longest break set by junior shooters (male and female); the most overall championships won by a shooter, both male and female.

It will be a bit like the Guinness Book of Records for Australian Clay Target Shooting. The only way it can be commenced is by your input. If you believe you hold, or know someone that possibly could hold, a record let us know. It will be published, and if no other shooter can claim to better it, it will become the standard for the record.

Rules

Further to the proposal in last months magazine, any rules changes which are to be altered will apply from a date to be fixed later this year. Comments for all of rule changes should be sent to National office no later than June 30, 1994.

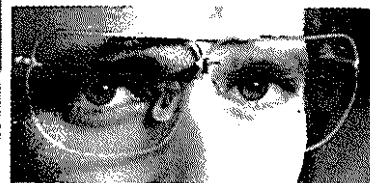

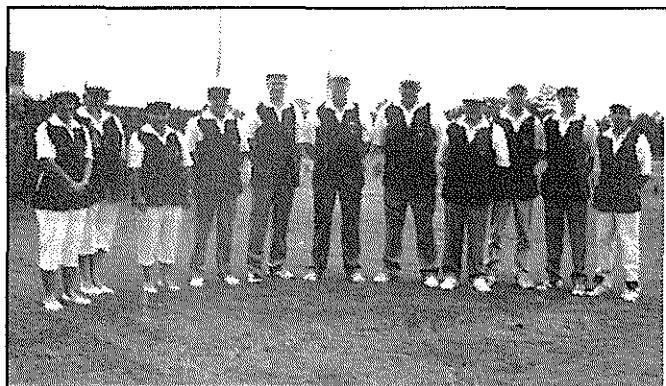
1994 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Australian Clay Target Association's National Trap Championships for 1994 were hosted this year by Queensland Clay Target Association and Brisbane Gun Club. The Championships ran from Saturday April 9 to Friday April 15 and in line with the old adage 'beautiful one day, perfect the next' Queensland turned great weather on with temperatures in the mid 20s on most days. A revamped Trap Nationals program was conducted with the program going for seven days instead of six which had been the case in the past.

SATURDAY APRIL 9

Prior to the opening ceremony, teams representing each State and Territory, competed for the prized Australian Clay Target Association Team Shield presented to the top State team in Open, Ladies and Junior divisions. This was the first time that the Ladies and Juniors had shot at the same time as the Open team. This proved to be very popular with everyone and helped create a great atmosphere for the opening ceremony.

The Open Teams event was won by the host state Queensland being represented by Doug Smith (Captain), Neil Berry, Dennis McIntosh, Gary Redmond and Greg Stevens. The 'Bananabenders' did not miss a target during the whole event to score 125/370 to win narrowly from South Australia 125/367 with Victoria coming in third with 124/365.

In the Ladies event New South Wales, represented by Lyn Blake, Karen Kennerson and Janeene Kidd (Captain) scored 73/216 to defeat Victoria 72/211 and Queensland 71/206.

The Juniors was a closely fought out contest by five states with Victoria led by Nathan Cassells, together with Justin Waldron and Wayne Barry being successful with 75/222 on a countback from New South Wales 75/222 and South Australia 72/210.

A perpetual trophy for the best presented team, which has been donated by SACTA was appropriately won by South Australia. All states are to be complimented on the high standard of dress and they are a credit to all involved.

As music came from the pipe band, all teams marched past the crowd of spectators as Mr Glenn Woodhatch, National President, welcomed everyone to Brisbane and introduced the dignitaries Mr Dan Moffitt, President Brisbane Gun Club, Mr Tom Meadows, President QCTA, Mr Alastair McPherson, President Australian Shooting Association, Ms Laurel Power MLA, State Member for Mansfield, Cr Graeme McDougall, Brisbane City Council and Mr George Ellis, President NZCTA.

The Championship was officially opened by Ms Laurel Power MLA, State Member for Mansfield whom welcomed shooters from around Australia, a large contingent from New Zealand led by Mr George Ellis NZCTA National President as well as shooters

from America and Great Britain. Cr Graeme McDougall, Brisbane City Councillor opened the shooting by firing the first shot of the tournament (successfully hitting the target on only his first attempt at shooting a shotgun) under the watchful eye of the Shoot Marshall Mr Colin Witt.

Mr Tom Meadows Tournament Director issued the final instructions to all shooters and the individual events were under way.

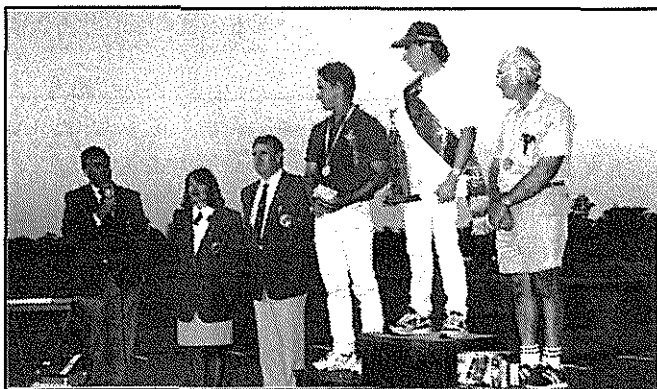
Grand Australian Handicap — 50t

A field of 420 squadded for the Handicap, which included 18 of our Kiwi friends. At the end of fifty; sixteen possibles shot off for the Royal Blue Sash, Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy and Silver Australia Badge.

These included two juniors from New South Wales in Andrew Kingdom and Les Chant. After 30 targets in the shoot off, the following shooters were still in there; Andrew Kingdom, Jason Jolly, Bill Iles, Brad Webb and Tom Turner Snr.

Bill Iles was first to drop away after nine targets with Andrew Kingdom following three targets later. Tom Turner Snr dropped away after the twenty-third leaving Jason Jolly and Brad Webb to fight it out. Eventually it was Brad Webb who dropped his target leaving Jason Jolly the Overall winner.

SUNDAY APRIL 10

Australian Double Barrel Championship — 50t

Fuller Firearms Pty Ltd proudly sponsored this event and the ACTA is most grateful.

The Australian Double Barrel Championship over 50 targets was hotly contested. A total of 467 competitors nominated for the event. After 50 targets nearly a quarter of the field had not missed a target and so the shoot off began with 122 competitors. As a result of the large number in the shoot off a final result was not known until the next day.

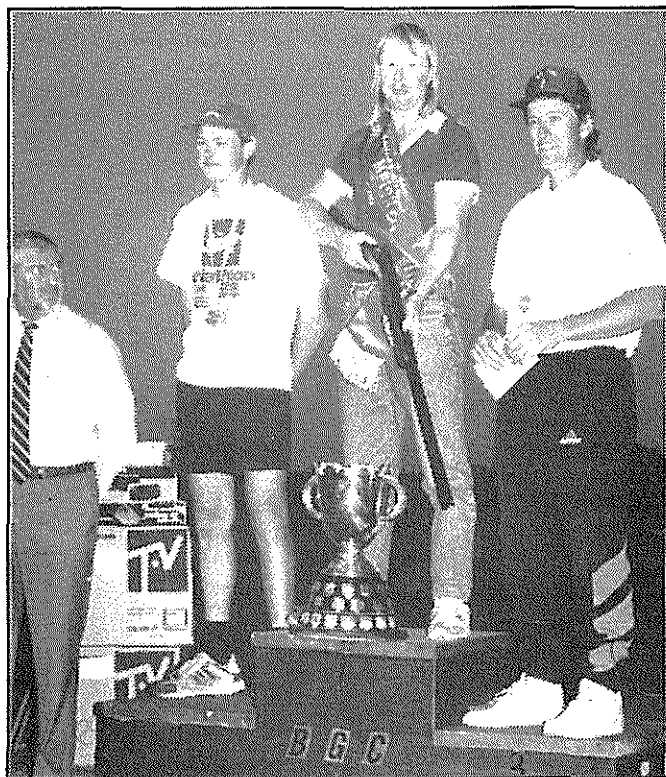
After the 120 targets nine squads of shooters still remained. A further eight targets later 24 shooters were still vying for the Double Barrel Championship. Eventually it came down to a battle between six shooters, they being Nathan McDonnell, a junior from South Australia, as well as Craig Bentley also from South Australia, Gary Hayden from Victoria, Tom Turner Jnr NSW, Roger Duthie Vic and Phil Grainger Vic, over 500 targets had been shot.

Nathan McDonnell missed his 546th target to finish with 545/546 which was a very commendable effort by this junior from South Australia.

Tom Turner Jnr finished six targets later leaving Craig Bentley, Roger Duthie and Phil Grainger to tough it out for the Championship.

Eventually it was Roger Duthie, Hamilton, who hit 634 targets taking overall first. He was presented by Paul Taylor with a shotgun kindly donated by Fuller Firearms, the Jock Wilson Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge. Second in the event was Phil Grainger, Geelong, with 633 targets followed by South Australian Craig Bentley with a score of 616.

Bill Francis from Chinchilla was successful in the Veterans with 102/103. In the grades Tom Turner Jnr Cessnock won AA with 551/552, Shane Habermann Terranora Lakes A grade 223/224, Glen Rea Burdekin B grade 111/112 and C grade Patrick Tankey Majura Park 55/56.

Womens Double Barrel Championship — 50t

This event was run in conjunction with the Open Double Barrel Championship and attracted thirty starters. This was very keenly contested and eventually only Carmen Carlton Geelong shot the fifty straight to win the Championship and receive the June Gawith Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge.

A shoot off was required for second and third between Karen Kennerson Sydney and Deserie Huddleston NSW GC. After an extra 47 targets Karen was successful finishing second with Deserie being Overall third.

Junior Double Barrel Championship — 50t

This event was also run in conjunction with the Open event with 35 juniors vying for the title. A number of juniors shot the first 50, after an extra 65 Anthony Kowald Katanning dropped a target to finish overall third 115/116. This left Clem Cunningham Dorriggo and Nathan McDonnell Mt Gambier to compete for the title. Clem Cunningham missed at 141 to finish overall second 140/141 leaving Nathan McDonnell 141/141 to receive the Anthony Bradshaw Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge. Nathan went on to shoot 545/546 which may be a record break for a junior . . . well done Nathan.

MONDAY APRIL 11

Australian Single Barrel Championship — 50t

The ACTA is very grateful of the sponsorship of this event by Winchester Australia.

The Single Barrel event attracted 416 starters which included 20 of our overseas visitors. After 50 targets ten shooters had the possible. After another 20 targets in the shoot off four competitors were left. They were Jon Whittakers, Dick Piotrowski, Shane Yates and Bill Iles.

Jon Whittakers missed his 71st and Dick Piotrowski his 72nd. Two targets later Shane Yates was to miss leaving Bill Iles Melbourne taking out Overall with 74/74. Bill was presented with a shotgun by Bob Dupuy representing Winchester and the W. Rainbird Perpetual Trophy, the Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge.

In the grades Jon Whittakers Echuca won AA grade 70/71, Clem Cunningham Guyra A grade 64/65, Les Moore Goondiwindi B grade 49/50 and Eugene Surawski Warwick C grade with 49/54.

The Veterans division was taken out by Barry Nasser Clermont 49/50.

Womens Single Barrel Championship — 50t

This event was run in conjunction with the Open event and 18 women competed for the trophy.

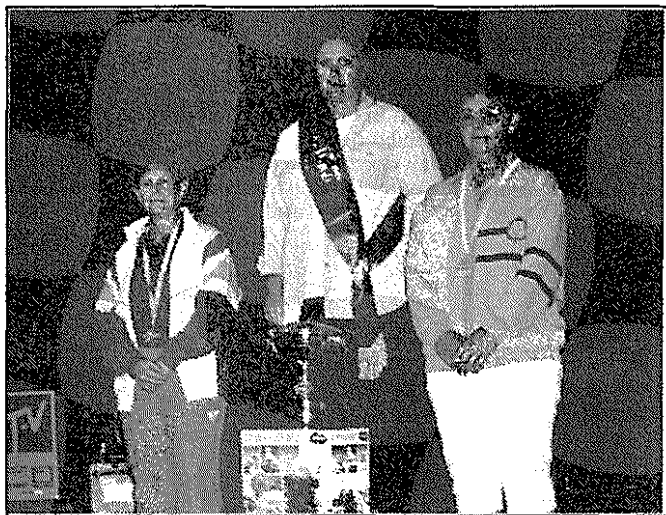

Junior Single Barrel Championship — 50t

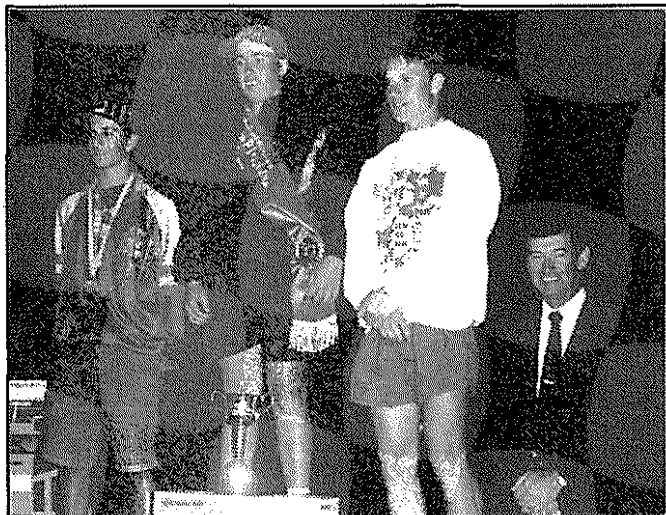
This event was also run in conjunction with the open event and 29 juniors competed for the trophy.

Australia/New Zealand Trap Championship — 50t

The ACTA is most grateful for ITP Pty Ltd sponsorship of this event.

Another beautiful day with lots of block out and wide brimmed hats being the order of the day.

This was the last chance to shoot a good score and qualify for the Mackintosh Team; the event attracted 400 competitors — 122 Qld, 113 NSW, 72 Vic, 28 SA, 18 WA, 15 Tas, 12 NT and 20 overseas.

Ten shooters shot all 50 with the first barrel and shot off for the Kable-Smith Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Southern Cross Badge.

Jason Jolly, Sebastopol outshot everybody to win back to back titles with 177/177, the same score that he shot in Adelaide.

He was presented with the trophies by Mr Frank James representing ITP Pty Ltd.

Runner up to Jason was Jeff Webster of Crookwell who shot 176/188 to finish overall second. John Porter Brisbane, one of our hosts for the Nationals, finished overall third with 171/174.

Barry Nassar Clermont followed up his good form from the previous day to take out the Veterans trophy.

Champion of Champions — 75t

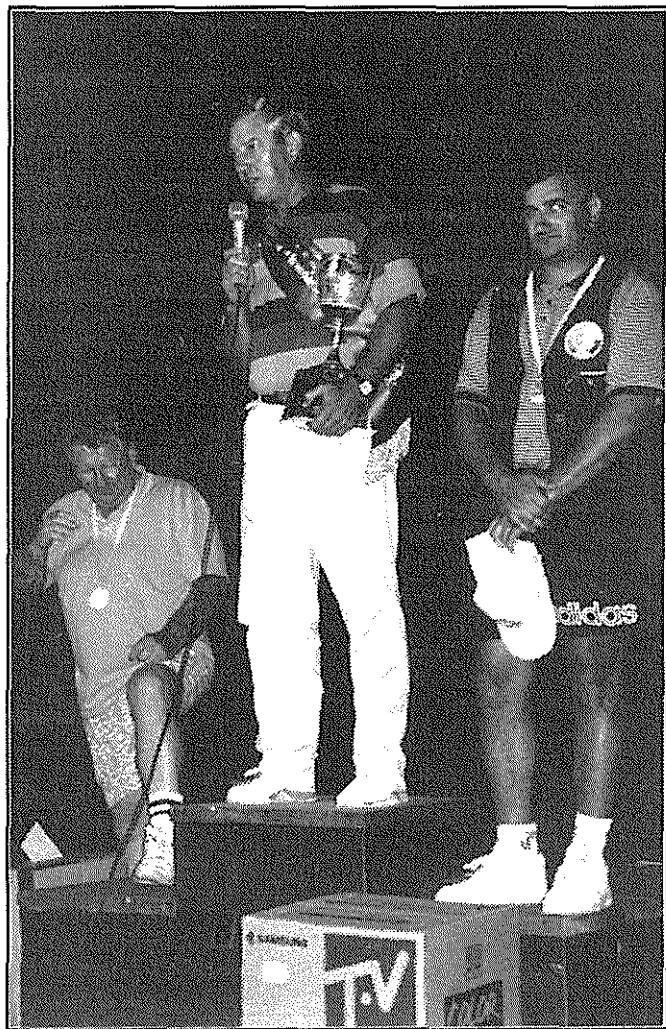
Olimpysc Targets/Scorpio Cartridges, again sponsored the Champion of Champions for which the ACTA is most grateful.

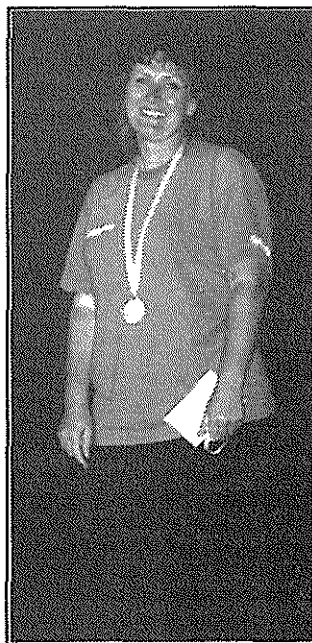

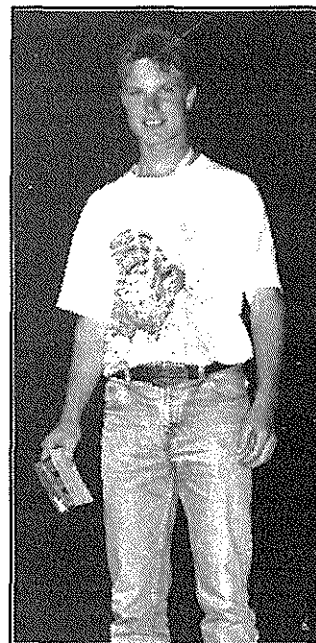

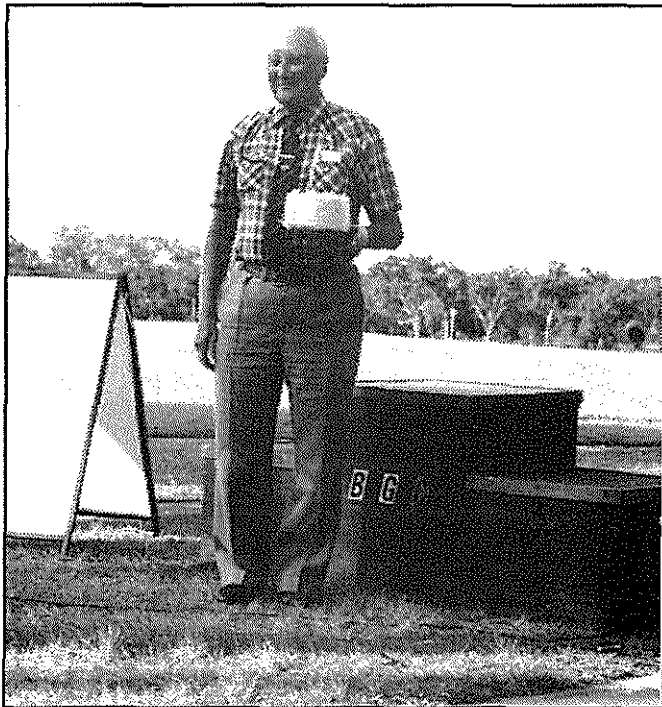
Bill Iles had a very successful time in New Zealand earlier this year and said that he cherished this trophy and was looking forward to going to New Zealand next year.

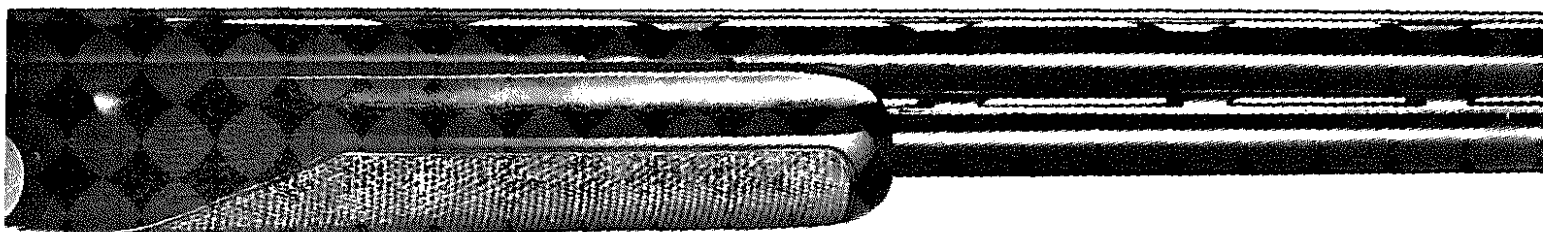

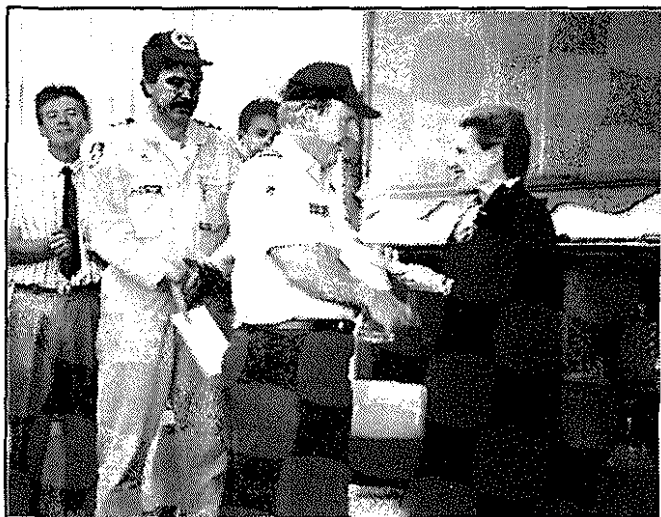

The shooters survey attracted 84 participants of which 23 indicated their interest in attaining Coaching Accreditation. One question (No. 7) produced interesting results on the point of 'What subject should an Australian produced video be on?'

6. Mental Approach
7. Shooter Etiquette
8. Basic Fundamentals.

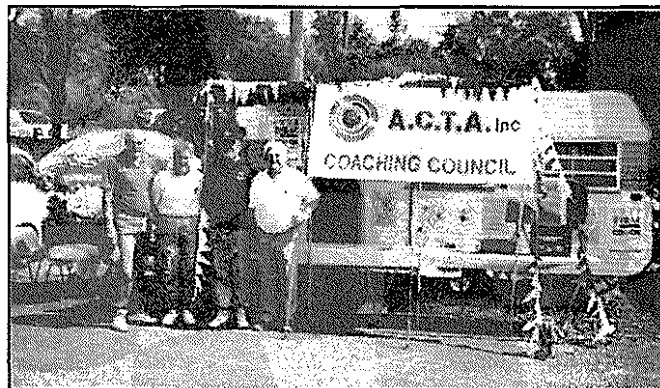
The coaches questionnaire had 33 participants with similar interesting results, one being question No. 8. This question dealt with 'How do you feel we could better the provision of coaching in shooting?'

5. Administration to promote better prospects rather than the negative

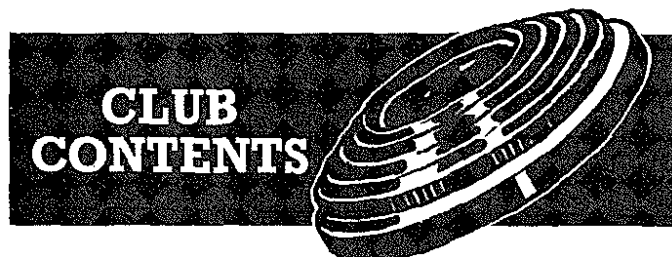
