National Ground

The National Executive has an ongoing commitment to our sport to investigate and follow up proposals by government and sports groups to assist in the establishment of facilities for shooting either at state or national level.

With the advent of the 2000 Olympics in Sydney and the building of a new shooting complex, the ACTA must take all steps to see that such a facility is retained after the Olympics.

It seems ironic that Sydney, Australia's largest city, is not able to host a National Championship in any of our disciplines because no such venue exists.

I see now as a very opportune time to speak with the NSW Government, the Sydney Olympic Committee and all other interested bodies in an attempt to secure a permanent shooting site, in other words, why not have a National Ground.

Badge Collecting

Two months ago in this column I mentioned the number of inquiries I had had personally from people who collect club badges and patches and the possibility of starting a collectors club and writing a small article each month in the CTSN.

There has been a number of positive replies to the suggestion and it appears that a column will be included in the CTSN. At this stage we are still looking at ways to improve our magazine, including an increase in the information content and a collectors column certainly may become part of the CTSN.

1994 National Skeet Championships

By contrast to the rain which was present at Wagga last year, Melbourne turned on fine, but cold and windy conditions for this years National Skeet Championships.

Nearly 150 skeet shooters were present at Melbourne Gun Club, host for this years Nationals. The grounds were in very good shape thanks to Club President Bob Buchan and his hard working committee.

Mr Geoff Craige MLC Member for Central Highlands officially opened the Championships with the National President Mr Glenn Woodhatch. The State Teams, after completion of their matches, were piped in to stand beneath their state flags. They were joined by a strong contingent of New Zealanders who had made the trip across the Tasman. All states were represented in the teams matches.

Mr Craige, under direction of newly appointed Victorian State Coach Ian Hale, fired the opening shot, smoking the target and getting the championships off to a good start.

State Shoulder to Shoulder Team Matches

Each state was represented in the Open Teams event. All states are to be congratulated on the dress of the teams as they all looked resplendent in their shooting jackets. The competition was fierce with only four targets separating the first three teams.

Queensland came in third with 241/250 with New South Wales 244/250 coming a close second to the South Australian's who shot 245/250. The winning team consisted of Bob Dower 50, R. Jones 49, K. Holmes 49, C. Jacobs 47 and L. Charles 50.

In the Ladies Shoulder to Shoulder Match over 25t each, New South Wales 70/75 were runners up to the Victorian Team 71/75 whom consisted of C. Carlon 22, K. Light 24 and C. Ogden 25.

In the Junior Shoulder to Shoulder Match the New South Wales Team of C. Jones 22, M. Faber 23 and G. Barton 24 had a total of 69/75 to be successful from Queensland 65/75.

National Skeet Doubles Championship

Starters numbered 119 in this the first individual Championship of the Nationals. After 100 targets four shooters had scored 97, they being Brian Thomson NZ, Ian Hale Frankston, Max Barton Toowoomba and Neil Dimmick Brisbane.

Neil Dimmick was first to drop a target. After 6 targets Ian Hale followed and accordingly finished overall 3rd with 116/120. This left Max Barton and Brian Thomson to fight it out for the Overall Trophy. Brian Thomson won 129/132 when Max Barton dropped the 32nd target of the shoot off.

Brian Thomson NZ received the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and the Paul Johnston Perpetual Trophy with the score of 129/132. Overall second was Max Barton 128/132 and Ian Hale third 116/120.

Neil Dimmick 102/106 took AA grade with Adrian Cousens 104/108 second and R. Everett 114/120 surviving the shoot off to be third.

In A grade R. Jones 95/100 was successful followed by G. Barton 100/106 and G. Woolston 99/106 third.

B grade saw a win to one of our lady competitors Katie Light 96/100 with C. Smith 90/100 coming in 2nd and D. Hansford 90/102 third.

D. Bruce 86/102 took C grade followed by R. Williams 85/102 and N. Bruce 79/100 3rd.

The Ladies section was won by Sue Thompson NZ 93/100, Reg Clarke 96/100 won the Veterans and George Barton 94/100 the Junior section.

B. Thomson took AA 122/124 with R. Everett 103/104 2nd and W. McCarthy 110/112.


Barney Rooke was successful in A grade 108/110, George Viskovich NZ 107/110 2nd and C. Jacobs 98/101 3rd.


AA grade saw Chris Naudin NSW 110/111 with Glenn Arnol Tas 109/111 and 3rd Neil Dimmick 131/133.

Overall 2nd went to John Withers 149/150 and overall 3rd was won by Adrian Cousens 140/141.


G. Searle NZ 135/136 was successful in AA grade whilst Ian Hale 129/130 was 2nd and B. Thomson 128/130 3rd.


High Guns

The sporting competition in North Queensland is the Suncorp North Queensland Games and in 1994 Mount Isa was the host city.

The Mount Isa Gun Club was proud to be a part of the Games and conducted the Northern Zone Trap Carnival as our contribution to the Games on the Easter weekend.

With almost perfect conditions and fifty-seven competitors, thirty of whom were visitors who came from all over Queensland and the Northern Territory, excellent competition was assured.

Competition commenced at 9am on Saturday with the Northern Zone Double Barrel Championship and 139 targets later Mount Isa's Bruce Murphy claimed the Overall sash and A grade Gold. The Northern Zone Single Barrel was Rob Cusack's all the way. Overall and A grade Gold with 45/45. Geoff Archer once again won A grade Silver and Ted Matthews put his name on the medal tally with the Bronze. Sunday morning saw competition commence in the Champion of Champions event and the Atherton Butcher, Morrie Costa, swept all before him to win Overall and B grade Gold with an excellent score of 175/175. That was to be Morrie's last B grade win as he bypassed A grade and went straight into AA. Well done Morrie. Mount Isan Rod Maxwell had to be content with the A grade Gold for his effort of 174/175. Greg Matthews and Bill Koitka made A grade a clean Mount Isa sweep by winning Silver and Bronze. In B grade Silver went to Peter Henderson and Bronze to Frank Guerra while in C grade John Wilkinson Jnr and Les Wilson took Gold and Silver leaving Bronze medal to Nev Anderson.

The finale of the Games, as far as the Clay Target fraternity were concerned, was the Northern Zone Double Rise Championship and Townsville's Tom Comerford won Overall and A grade Gold with 28/30. John Wilkinson Snr held out Trevor Bennett to take Silver leaving the Bronze to join Trevor's other trophies. Mount Isa didn't get a look in B grade. Frank Guerra, Peter Henderson and Neil Sheather, Gold, Silver and Bronze was the order of the day, while in C grade Les Wilson won Gold, John Wilkinson Jnr won Silver and Mick Coleman was the Bronze Medal winner.

Tom Comerford was awarded the Sash for Overall High Gun with an excellent score of 224/230. Diane Reeves' score of 200/230 earned her the Ladies High Gun and Derek Bruce with a score of 215/230 won the Junior Division High Gun.

At 3.30pm on Sunday afternoon Zone President, John Wilkinson Snr, called on Matt O'Neil, the Chairman of the Suncorp North Queensland Games Foundation, and the presentation ceremony commenced. Following the medal presentation the Unisys computer raffle was drawn and a very happy Greg Moncrieff got to take home a Unisys personal computer.

While there were many highlights to the North Queensland Games the excellent breaks of 187 and 183 shot by Bruce Murphy and Rod Maxwell and the sterling performance of Morrie Costa, B grade to AA grade in one step and a break of 179 in the process must rank with the best.

All three shooters broke the old record of 176 which was set by Mick McGill quite a few years ago and that in itself is quite an achievement.





National Coaching Council

By M. Alexander, National Director of Coaching

One of the questions often asked of Coaches is to explain in simple terms the different shooting methods we employ to hit targets. This request has prompted me to print the following article which is taken from the A.C.T.A. Basic Coaching Manual. This question shows that we need to remember and retain basic fundamental knowledge, when we are fine tuning our skills.

Never feel embarrassed to ask or recheck the 'basics' as you will be surprised as to how many of the Elite shooters do just that.

Shooting Methods

The shotgun as distinct from a rifle, is a smooth bore pointing firearm, used for shooting moving targets. Shotguns fire a cartridge containing a quantity of lead shot, unlike a rifle which fires one projectile. Because of the time lapse between the pulling of the trigger and breaking the moving target, a different style of shooting is required. This style has become known as Lead, Swing or Forward Allowance.

i. SWING-THROUGH

This method possibly gives the best results. The gun muzzle starts from behind the target and is swung through the target. The trigger is pulled as the muzzle passes the target, the momentum carries the muzzle through to obtain lead. Care must be taken not to stop the swing as the trigger is pulled.

ii. POINTING OUT

Here, the shooter passes the muzzle through the target and when the required lead is obtained, pulls the trigger maintaining the lead. The muzzle must not stop after the trigger is pulled.

iii. SUSTAINED LEAD

The shooter positions the gun with the muzzle in front of the target, obtains the correct lead and pulls the trigger. This is a similar style to 'Pointing Out' and often used in Skeet.

iv. SPOT SHOOTING

With this style, the shooter estimates the required forward allowance and pulls the trigger while the muzzle is stationary. This method is extremely difficult to master and is least used.

All four (4) methods may be used as occasions demand, but as experience is gained, the Swing Through method will generally offer more consistent results.

To assist the pupil in understanding swing and follow through, have them complete this simple task.

Place two (2) easily seen pegs approximately 20 metres away from the pupil and 10 metres apart. At the midway point between the pegs, place another clearly visible object (this represents the target). Have the pupil start from one peg and swing the mounted gun through to the other peg. As the gun muzzle passes through the central object, have the pupil pull the trigger and without stopping the gun, complete the follow through to the second peg.

This demonstration should enable the pupil to see and understand the gun swing and follow through required to break targets.

1994 West Darling Championships

With 80 shooters nominating for the next event and with only 15 possibles the shoot off for Overall in the Hand Crafted Furniture Supplies Gift was not expected to go very far. Steve Haberman from the Geelong Gun Club who is a regular to our club shot another good score of 225/225 to win. Second in AA grade was Brett Dunstan 224/225 from Kerang, with local shooter Ross Walsh taking third 221/222. John Dunstan won A grade with 37/38 with Graeme (Gonzo) Young 36/37 from the Boort Gun Club taking second. Another local shooter Wayne Channing 27/28 got the third place trophy. 


Cunnamulla Gun Club

Full Page \$200 — Half Page \$100 — Quarter Page \$50

As most of you should be aware, the NSWCTA is printing the Blue Book for 1995. As a means of keeping the costs under control and still be able to offer clubs/businesses advertising at a very reasonable rate, we found it necessary to request that clubs abbreviate, reduce or clarify their programs in order that the number of pages needed to print the book may be reduced, and hence costs lowered.

This will effect everyone, as the cost of the booklet will be passed on to the shooter, and we felt shooters would be more interested in a booklet for \$3 than \$5 (an example only). The actual cost has yet to be determined, but will be very reasonable.

The request to keep programs under control does not effect every club. Very many are most considerate and quite happy to co-operate to a reasonable request. However, I am astonished to learn there are a few clubs who feel the requests are unreasonable. Perhaps they were unaware of the reasons outlined above.

The April club newsletter detailed all of the necessary facts, but should you have any further enquiry, please contact me.

'Evergreen' Doug Smith Leads May 'Top Gun' Awards

Australia's most prolific National Champion, Doug Smith from Queensland, has again proved his undoubted ability at the Queensland State Trap Carnival held at Gemfields by winning the Overall High Gun for the three days of competition. Doug received 1,000 shotshells for his win. Other winners over the Carnival included Gary Redmond in the State Points who also receives 1,000 shotshells, Peter Field in the State Single Barrel and again another 1,000 rounds, Barry Nassar and Dorothy Trindall each receive one case for the Veteran and Ladies High Guns. Tommy Comerford proved he was back in good health again by winning 'A' grade in the State Single Barrel and takes 250 shotsliells as a bonus. Other grade winners included Neil Berry in the Points, Stafford Smith, Gary Redmond and Doug Smith who all receive 250 shotshells.

Adrian Cousens put several years of high class competition in the United States to test at the recent American Skeet Nationals held at the Melbourne Gun Club. Although his results were probably not quite up to his own high standards he still won the Overall High Gun for the four days and received 2,500 shotshells for his victory. Narrowly behind Adrian was New Zealands Brian Thomson who took the Doubles Title back across the Tasman with him as well as a further 1,500 targets loads as New Zealand Top Gun' entrants enjoy reciprocal rights with Australian entrants.

The South Australian State Skeet Championships produced a bonus case of shotshells for Ron Smith and Bob Dower for victories in the State Title and the Overall High Gun.

Other winners this month at major two day DTL Carnivals and 500 complimentary target loads include Craig Bentley at Monarto in South Australia, Roger Duthie at the South East's two day shoot, Bill Eagle at Broken Hill's annual competition and young Les 'Chipper' Chant at Cunnamulla's two day competition in Queensland. Les has had an outstanding year in the 'Top Gun' awards so far having now claimed seven different awards in the first 18 weeks of the year in four different states as well as New Zealand. John Blazley wins a case of target loads for his High Gun victory at Gunnedah.



Presidential Medal Recipient — 1993

The Executive Committee of the Australian Clay Target Association was pleased to announce at the Brisbane Nationals that a Presidential Medal for 1993 had been posthumously awarded to Mr Jim Forbes of South Australia. Jim unfortunately passed away recently and the following is an extract of a profile prepared by his son Jim Junior.

"Being introduced to live pigeon shooting at Gilles Plains (South Australian Gun Club) in approximately 1947 by Ross Chester, a farmer, late of Nairne.

Within two years Jimmy in his 1928 Morris Cowley was shooting at nearly every club in South Australia and every November, travelling to Melbourne to shoot in the Australian Live Pigeon Trap Shooting Championship, coming fourth in 1952, also the Coburg Grand Prix.

With the banning of live pigeon shooting, Jimmy fell in love with clay shooting. Shooters from other sections of the sport joined arms, and names such as Don Fleetwood, John Kellin, Les Shearingham, Les and Mike Papps joined in the clay target sport, most of these were pistol shooters.

Jimmy with the help of some of these new members and the likes of Bobby Mules, Harrold Lawson, Archie Commons, were able to persuade the S.A.G.C. to replace their old Plus trap with a new remote controlled Snipe trap.

It was not long before keen support for clay shooting began to develop. Pushing this support was Jimmy.

Arousing enthusiasm at Mount Barker with stalwarts at the time like Ross Chester, Reg Shepherd, Geo McGuinness, Carl Wittkowski, set out and formed Mt Barker Gun Club after a couple of picnic shoots at Paechs, west of the town, finally locating at Paul Liebelts, adjacent to the rifle range.

It was not long, and some of the Langhorne Creek rifle shooters joined the Mt Barker club bringing in friends such as Johnny Woodrow, Joe Woodrow, John McGuinness, Terry Roberts etc. Some of the 'Creek boys' included Fiddle Diddy and Arty Polts, who always arranged a drop of refreshment at shoots.

On November 23rd 1953, the Alexandra Gun Club at Milang was opened. Forbsey, Ross Chester, Johnny Woodrow had set the ground out, the handicaps were sign written stakes. The trap was one of these new Snipe traps from Melbourne that Adelaide and Mt Barker had.

Soon Jimmy helped with the transport of Menindee Gun Club from pigeons to clays with locals identities Bill & Lol Ayres, Dick & Bob Ayres, Doug Prescott, Tookery Gardner, Butch May, Jack Black to name a few.

Jimmy won a contract to put in a bore at the Willunga Post Office, which others had great difficulty in doing. The PMG Dept was so pleased with the outcome of the finished bore, that they got him to put a bore down at the Bute Post Office (in the mid north of SA). Whilst working there he met Tom Burke, Freddy Gill, Howard Commons and a few others and so Bute Snowtown Gun Club came into being.

Working at Bute, Jimmy had a drilling stem crush his hand and from memory had about ten breaks in it and ten times as many stitches as a wheat bag. Did this stop him shooting, not likely,

In the early fifties Jimmy slipped off one of his drilling riggs and hurt his back to such an extent that he was in sheer agony and virtually paralysed from the arms down. His work mate, a World War 1 veteran could not drive.

He loaded Forbsey in behind the wheel of the Ford Prefect ute and Jimmy drove his workmate home, and then himself home, all the way in bottom gear. No one was home when Jimmy got there, so he opened the car door and fell out and lay there for over two hours until help came.

Our local doctor at the time was the young Dr Freddy Giesler that later was awarded an MBE for services above and beyond the call of duty (on Eyre Peninsula), came out to Jim and gave him the once over and a morphine injection.

9pm, Freddy was back again and worked on him until 3am.

Freddy was back again next morning at 8.30, eating scrambled eggs before working on Jim again.

That day, with help to and from each lane, Jimmy made selection into the South Australian team. The Doc arrived on Sunday morning, giving him another workover. Alas, guess who got the High Gun Trophy in the SA Team.

X-rays on Monday revealed that his back had no gristle between the vertebrae, and the specialists informed him that he would be in a wheelchair permanently within two years. 30 odd years later he was still going.

He went on to win National Championships and a hell of a lot of State and Regional Championships."

Atherton Tableland Gun Club

The Atherton weather is once again slowing down the building program of the Atherton club. The skeet houses are only half way to completion at the middle of May, when it was hoped that the skeet layout would be operational by this date. The year so far has proven to be a busy one for club members, for not only has the building program been an ongoing plan, members are endeavouring to attend Annual Shoots at as many clubs as possible.

The new lights have been installed on one trap and it is hoped that the other two traps and tower will have new lights installed by the club's Annual on the 22nd & 23rd October. The wood heater has been installed in the club house and was certainly welcome at the May shoot when cold and damp conditions prevailed. When winter arrives it may be difficult to get shooters to leave the warmth of the club house for the tracks.

The night social shoots the club holds on a Friday once a month are proving very popular, and look certain to be continued in the future. The format of 2 events of 15 targets each, a barbecue and a TV to watch football is a social night that is enjoyed by shooters and onlookers.

Due to heavy use of Atherton Rifle Range by the Rifle Club and the Army in the first half of the year, the Atherton club has had to exchange dates for it's monthly shoots with Silkwood. But from July the club reverts back to its set day, the fourth Sunday of each month.
