Donald Mackintosh

A champion professional shooter, Donald Mackintosh won a game shooting event, the Prix Centenaire de Paris, during the Olympic Games of the Second Olympiad in Paris in 1900.

Because of confusion surrounding these games, his performance remained unrecognised as an Olympic Victory for many years. It is now acknowledged by both the International Olympic Committee and the Australian Olympic Committee, qualifying

Mackintosh for gold medal status among other Australian Olympic champions.

At the Paris Olympics, Mackintosh also tied for third place in another shooting event, the grand Triz de l'Exposition.

1995 5 Stand Sporting Clays Nationals

1995 will see the joint ACTA-SSAA Sporting Clays Nationals conducted in Victoria. It remains at this stage for the allocation of a site and date for the event, and for a decision to be made on the number of targets thrown.

It has been suggested that the event should be held quite separate to any other National Carnival and that the competition to be decided over 200 targets. The event will most definitely be shot over 5 Stand Sporting layouts only and the host venue would have to be able to have at least 4 layouts.

5 Stand Sporting Difficulty

Whilst on the subject of 5 Stand Sporting it is worth mentioning the difficulty associated with some grounds. One of the reasons for introducing this very enjoyable discipline was to offer our members another alternative clay target game. One of the quickest ways to kill a new discipline is to make it so difficult that shooters stay away in droves.

What does it matter if 40 shooters attend and 10 shoot possibles? Our disciplines are based on possibles. To be fair to all, we must also look at establishing a standard across all clubs shooting Sporting. It is pointless a shooter consistently shooting 22/25 at Smokum Gun Club, being rightly proud of his AA status, and finding that the very best he can achieve at Chippum Clay Target Club is 17/25, no matter how often he shoots there.

Coaching

Qur National Director of Coaching, Murray Alexander, has also been appointed interim New Zealand National Director of Coaching. It is very pleasing that this has happened and can only strengthen the relationship, and joint ventures, with our closest international neighbours. With the Glenn Cup and the Glenn Trophy matches now being recognised as truly international events, one can only look forward to the betterment of both our countries competitions and camaraderie.

International Competitions

I join all shooters/members in wishing our teams well in Milan (Italy), Victoria (Canada) and Newtown (Wales).

Australia, I believe, has presently some of our best ever competitors and we look forward to many medals returning home from these events, but whatever the results, we know all will give of their best.

Over the past couple of months there has been two changes to our committee.

Pud Burgess (NSW) and Jim Bitossi (NT) have decided to stand down. On behalf of the ACTA I would like to thank them both for their contributions during their term on committee and wish them well in their 'retirement'.

Editor's Mailbox

All comments regarding changes to the rules as suggested in the May CTSN have been forwarded to the rules committee for consideration. Any rule changes which are to be implemented will be published in the September edition of the magazine. We would like to thank all those clubs and members who put their submissions in writing.

Dear Sir,

I read with interest John Dyas' comments (May issue CTSN), regarding the introduction of the Sporting Clays discipline by the ACTA, in particular his views that gun position and time delay make it too difficult for trap and novice shooters.

The points he has raised are valid but I would ask him to consider these comments, including my view on the introduction of our 'new' discipline, the setting of targets and difficulty of layouts.

The Sporting Clays discipline is meant to represent simulated field shooting. In other words, while the targets should be similar for all shooters they may not always be 100% exactly the same due to the types of machines and facilities used. In fact it is the variety of targets thrown that make shooting this discipline so interesting and enjoyable (not my comments but those I have shot with for many years and those who visit our club). For myself and many of my shooting colleagues, simulated was a way to keep our 'eye in' during the remainder of the year when game seasons closed. I believe that this is how the whole discipline originally began.

Obviously with the introduction of this discipline a common sense approach is needed when putting together a course. Club Committees should recognise the need to cater to the beginner as well as the experienced shooter attending these shoots and select an appropriate mix of targets. If Committees are not doing so then it is the responsibility of members to make themselves heard be they tyro or experienced shooter. Criticism, so long as it continues to be constructive should always be welcomed.

It is not necessary to throw all targets as 100 mph crossing mini's or battue's screaming across the horizon in order to make targets challenging to the shooter. In fact on just as many occasions I have witnessed the 'crack shots' miss on a slow crossing standard target as on the mini described. Target size and speed, surrounding environment and location as to where the target will be shot, visibility and importantly the angle at which targets are to be thrown should be considered to make the course interesting and challenging, but above all enjoyable to shoot. The targets should be thrown resembling as closely as possible the movements of some form of game and be shot in an environment (facilities and terrain permitting), with this in mind. This is where the experience of field shooters can be of an advantage in the designing of the layout.

Regarding gun position, at the recent National Sporting Clays held at our club (Gold Coast & Albert), anywhere just 'off' the shoulder (not necessarily below) was deemed acceptable, with C and Ladies grades permitted to mount the gun, in this way I believe everyone was catered for including the novice shooter. I might add that very few (if any) of the C graders opted to mount their guns and many shooters agree that it is in fact more difficult starting in the 'gun up' position due to proper sighting of the target. To my way of thinking the Field & Game have the right answer in allowing the butt to be positioned anywhere 25cm below the top of the shoulder, however I would still be in favour of the option for the novice and Ladies.

In any case I believe the shotgun was designed for shooting in this fashion and to this day I have yet to see anyone walking in field or paddock shooting rabbit or quail with the gun continually mounted to their shoulder. The same can be said for standing or crouching in wait to shoot ducks!

To suggest doing away with the time delay between the shooters call and appearance of the target in this discipline is ridiculous unless of course shooters wish to stand directly over, under or alongside a trap or skeet house, have all the targets on the course thrown as 'straight aways' (no incoming or overhead/behind targets where there is a wait involved before shooting), have all targets thrown in an open area (no trees, hills or groundcover preventing instant sighting of the target), or have all clubs wishing to implement a sporting layout purchase automatic traps. What an assortment of targets to shoot and imagine the pleasure we would have in shooting on such a layout. Eliminating the time delay would make it impossible to set any sort of a course simulating field conditions, thus defeating the purpose of this discipline. Where manual release traps are used, often with some kind of signal or call to the trapper, it is not possible to throw targets as would be the case from a trap or skeet house manned with an auto release trap. Furthermore due to the terrain of the layout it is often not feasible to install anything other than a manual trap. In any case what sort of time delay are we talking about here? Targets have a three second period to appear before 'no target' is called, generally targets are thrown within one to two seconds - at most!

Finally, I would like to say that Sporting Clays is far from becoming an elitist discipline. From my experience and involvement over many years (whether it be named Sporting or Simulated), this discipline has always been shot for the fun of it, unlike the competition sometimes experienced in DTL or Skeet (which I also shoot). I know for a fact that it is the very difference in targets, rules and relaxed social conditions in which we shoot that have contributed to the growing number of people participating in Sporting Clays. I would invite anyone looking for an enjoyable day's shooting to visit our club and try our Sporting targets.

I have decided to write this letter after a very enlightening experience which occurred at the recent Skeet Nationals that were held at the Melbourne Gun Club. This was only to be my second Skeet Nationals that I have attended, and even though I was fortunate enough to be a medal winner at the Nationals at minor grade level (being only a relatively new competitor to skeet shooting) this was not the highlight of the Nationals for me.

After having seen some of the best skeet shooters from Australia and New Zealand, with many of them being international competitors, it was a truly pleasurable experience to watch two shooters of the calibre of Brian Thomson and Adrian Cousens shoot off for the Overall High Gun by shooting doubles off station 4 (arguably the most difficult station to shoot in this type of event and a 'sudden-death' scenario if ever there was one), but this was still not the highlight of the Nationals for me.

The highlight of the Nationals came quite unexpectedly for me in the shoot off for the Junior High Gun. With two very pleasant and well mannered young men in Ross Salpietro and George Barton, the two juniors were left to battle it out for this very much sought after trophy. Over the previous four days I had the pleasure of shooting in squads with both of these young fellows and found their friendly attitude and competitive spirits an inspiration which would surely enlighten many shooters of today.

I am sure many of you can imagine the exhilaration that was felt by many of the people looking on when they saw these two very likeable juniors locked together after four days of competition. The shoot off went to Station 4 with George Barton being the victor (after Ross Salpietro had his chance to win when George had missed one on a previous station). As both juniors had conducted themselves impeccably throughout the four day program and showed outstanding sportsmanship at the conclusion of the contest, it really was a sight to behold and a shame there can really be only one winner. I felt truly honoured to have witnessed this wonderful sportsmen, and I feel with young shooters of this calibre coming up through the ranks, things can only improve for the sport of skeet shooting.

INSURED PERSONS — Registered shooters with the Australian Clay Target Association, Voluntary Workers and Honorary Club Members of the Association.

AGE LIMIT - 5 and 65 years of age.

Scope of Cover

The Compensation provided shall only be payable when any Event shall happen to an Insured Person whilst such Insured Person is engaged in the following activities on behalf of the Insured;

- (a) Engaging/Playing in official club matches/activities including championship, club or state representative matches/activities.
- (b) Engaging in organised training or practice for activities as described in (a) above;
- (c) Travelling directly between the matches/activities in (a) or (b) above, and the Insured Person's residence or place of employment or the premises of the Insured;
- (d) Staying away from the Insured Persons home district during a tour for the purposes of participating in representative matches/activities;
- (e) Engaging in administrative or organised social activities of the Insured.

Claims Procedure

- (a) Written notice must be given to Us at any of Our offices in Australia within thirty days after the occurrence of any Event in respect of which a claim has arisen or may arise.
- (b) All certificates and evidence required by Us shall be furnished at the expense of the Insured or any claimant hereunder and shall be in such form and of such nature as We shall prescribe.

Public Liability Policy

in the interests of all registered shooters

SUMMARY

The Public Liability Policy that has been arranged for the ACTA by C E Heath Casualty & General Insurance Limited is designed to provide specific protection for the Association and its registered members.

The ACTA Public Liability Insurance Policy protects the Association and its members from being sued for alleged negligence/blame attaching to an incident causing property damage or bodily injury.

If any person is injured in any way where no blame can be attached to the ACTA and its members, any claims that may be made would not be recognised under the policy conditions as it would be classified as a claim against a policy that the person may have in force on a personal basis or in the case of a registered shooter, a policy arranged for them by the ACTA.

Protection is afforded to the following who, subject to certain conditions, are considered to be members of the ACTA

- 1. State associations
- 2. Registered clubs
- 3. Registered shooters
- 4. Voluntary workers
- 5. Club visitors participants and observers
- 6. Life members/sponsors

1. STATE ASSOCIATIONS

Organising and controlling shooting events in accordance with the rules and regulations of the ACTA.

2. REGISTERED CLUBS

- (a) Subject to payment of the prescribed affiliation fee as may be decided by the ACTA from time to time.
- (b) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and ACTA.

3. REGISTERED SHOOTERS

- (a) Subject to the payment of the prescribed registration fee as may be decided by the ACTA from time to time.
- (b) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and ACFA.

4. VOLUNTARY WORKERS

(a) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club, State or National Association whilst undertaking their voluntary duties.

NOTE: Paid personnel such as trappers, trap mechanics or any other paid staff are subject to the provisions of the Workers Compensation Act and protection must be obtained for them from the appropriate authority.

- 5. CLUB VISITORS (participants and observers)
 - (a) Must be registered as such (club visitor) on the register to be maintained by each club for that specific purpose.
 - (b) Must at all times be under the control and supervision of registered ACTA shooters

- (c) Must be participating in accordance with the rules and regulations of the respective club, State Association and ACTA.
- (d) Visitors, other than children who must be under the care of a responsible person, must at all times sign the visitors' book which must be provided by all clubs for that purpose.
- (e) In the event of a visitors or visitors to the club negligently causing injury or damage to any person or property, any actions that may be taken would need to be directed towards the person or persons concerned.
 - NOTE: Any organised event for participating visitors, such as school children etc. who are not registered with the ACTA must have been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly. Should this requirement not be complied with then difficulties could and may possibly arise in the event of a claim under the Public Liability Policy.
- 6. (a) Clubs who have life members or similar, where no affiliation fee is paid to either the club or the ACTA by reason of their inactivity in the sport at Club and/or ACTA level are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to "registered shooters".
 - (b) Clubs who may have sponsors or the like attending their premises as "Honorary Members" on a more frequent basis than would be seen to be a visitor are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to registered shooters.
- 7. Clubs conducting events that are outside the rules pertaining to regular competition, which are broadly known as "Novelty Events" are fully protected under the terms and conditions of the ACTA Public Liability Policy providing that all other conditions relating to safety etc. have been complied with.

This protection extends to shoots conducted between different shooting disciplines such as a combination of clay target and field game.

8. Clubs electing to become Incorporated bodies should be able to use the master ACTA policy to fulfil the requirements of Incorporation, therefore eliminating the need for any club to maintain a Public Liability Policy in addition to the ACTA master policy unless cover in excess of \$5,000,000 is required.

Paid employees must at all times be protected under the Workers Compensation Act.

Situations arising that may not be covered in this policy summary will be clarified upon request.

The existing policy therefore extends to all persons likely to be on the grounds for a Club, State or National event.

The need for individual Clubs or State Associations to undertake a policy of their own is eliminated other than they may require cover for an amount in excess of the existing \$5,000,000.

- 10. Cover is extended to include
 - (a) Visitors attending National, State, Zone, International Championships are exempt from the requirement to sign a visitors register.
 - (b) Member to member whilst participating in any event.
 - (c) Erection, demolition, alterations, additions to buildings including club houses and trap houses for the portion of the work undertaken by voluntary workers.

- Cover does not extend to any works carried out or undertaken by contractors or sub-contractors.
- (d) Registered shooters involved in coaching or instruction are indemnified.
- 11. All shooting events must be sanctioned under the rules of the National body.
- 12. NOTE: Club shooters, not registered with the ACTA are not covered under any circumstances other than operating as a voluntary worker at an organised event. This category of shooter-member is solely a club responsibility and insurance cover should be considered at all times as a club expense.

13. FOR INFORMATION

Further extensions included within the policy are member to member, food and drink, care custody and control, medical and welfare facilities, tenants' liability, hoists cranes and unregistered vehicles, car parking, cross liabilities.

14. Clubs on leased premises are indemnified in respect to tenants liability.

Property owners providing leased premises are required to have an existing policy to be indemnified as a property owner.

Clubs hiring premises to a third party are indemnified under the policy.

15. NOTE: The summary details as described have been confirmed by the Association's Insurers, C E Heath Casualty & General Insurance Limited as being an accurate advice to members of the cover contained in the policy document.

Bonus 'Top Gun' Awards Spread Australia-wide in June

The bonus Winchester Top Gun' awards which commenced on June 1st have already proven popular with competitors winning awards in all categories from most states in Australia.

The new additions to the award scheme have been specifically aimed at shooters in the minor grades and categories who in the past have found bonus shotshells hard to win. We apologise for any inconvenience caused in our June advertisement due to printing errors on our behalf in the final proof copy. This was rectified in July CTSN and this copy should be referred to for any reference in regard to our bonus award scheme.

We must emphasise that for any competition to be eligible for Top Gun' awards that the events must be advertised in the CTSN. The reason for this is two-fold. Firstly it lets us keep track of what competitions are being conducted throughout Australia which are eligible for awards and secondly we are trying to promote better use of our Clay Target Journal as we believe its future depends largely on clubs utilising it as their primary source of advertising.

A disappointing aspect of our award scheme has become evident with a small number of competitors claiming awards that they were not eligible for. The first and foremost condition of entry is that upon registration a competitor must use solely Winchester-Australia produced ammunition for the remainder of the year to be eligible for awards. To use another brand or even reloads will render them ineligible for any 'Top Gun' awards for the rest of the current year. We have had a number of participants informing us of shooters who have broken their eligibility awards. This helps us keep our records up-to-date and ensures our legitimate entrants that fairness will prevail in the award scheme.

Our awards this month were well spread out with probably the biggest winner being former ACTA Executive Phil Grove from Darwin. Phil receives 1,000 target loads for winning the Northern Territory Single Barrel Champtonship conducted at their annual carnival at Alice Springs.

Changing of Programs

I wish to draw your attention to page 6 of the 1994 Blue Books, regarding clubs who wish to change the date for one of their shoots or schedule an extra shoot. It clearly states "no member clubs should vary an approved program or date, or conduct an unapproved program without consultation with the NSWCTA".

This has now become a problem with several clubs changing dates or conducting an extra shoot, without permission to do so. This includes clubs conducting field shoots. All clubs in each Zone are allocated a shooting day each month within that zone. This is done to ensure clubs in near proximity to each other are not shooting on the same days. Permission must be sought from your zone to change your shoot day to another day.

Once your shoot program has been printed in the Blue Book, it cannot be changed to another day without permission of the State Secretary. Great lengths are taken when compiling the blue book to ensure major clashes do not occur.

It is also a By Law of the Association that clubs who change dates without approval will not be allocated any major shoots for the next year, and in addition, the Committee has also now decided that clubs who allocate shoots or change dates without permission, will not have their clubs annual program printed in the following years Blue Book. Hopefully, this will deter those clubs who continue with this practice.

1995 State Carnivals

A total sum of \$3,323 was raised and handed over to the representative of Camp Quality, Mrs Jill Smith.


Approximately half the money raised was through a raffle that was conducted during a six week period prior to the shoot and the prizes were drawn on the day of the shoot.

On this third single barrel target Michael drew the hardest target on the program and missed it, so Silver to Italy and the Bronze to Michael. Russell shot 117/125 to be placed 13th with Graeme 113/125 43rd, Steve Haberman just managed to shoot an MQS with 112/125 with Steve Atkins just missing out with 109/125. In the teams event the USA won the Gold Medal with 360/375, the Silver to Italy 355/375 and Bronze to Belgium 351/375, 4th was Australia with 351/375, beaten by a count back for the Bronze Medal by Belgium.

Tuesday the 31st of May and Double Trap Day shooting for Australia was Russell Mark, Steve Atkins and Steve Haberman with Graeme Boyd and Michael Diamond shooting MQS. At the end of 75 pair four shooters Mirco Cenci (Italy), Mickey Rouse (GBR), John Oppio (USA) and Steffan Daebel (Germany) had 140/150. Russell Mark went into the final fifth with 137/150, Russell needing to finish fourth to make the World Cup Final in Double Trap, having already made it in Trench did just that. Good luck Russell in the final in Munich. The Gold Medal went to Mirco Centi (Italy) 186/200, Silver to Mickey Rouse (GBR) 182/200 and Bronze to John Oppio (USA) 181/200. Steve Haberman finished in 10th position 135/150 and Steve Atkins 18th 132/150, both Michael 131/150 and Graeme 121/150 achieved their MQS. In the

On our last night in Italy we attended the Closing Ceremony so with a Bronze Medal to Michael and a Gold Medal to the Double Trap Team, the whole trip was extremely successful for Australia. Congratulations to all and a special thank you must go to Graeme Boyd from all others in the team for his effort as Team Official.

Veteran's Return to France

A glorious page of war history was re-created, when specially struck medals were presented to thousands of Allied army, navy and air force personnel involved in the D-Day landing in France.

Among the Allied veterans who received the commemorative medal, struck by the Regional Council of Normandy (France) was Gunnedah man, Cec Herbert.

The presentation took place in l'Abbaye aux Dames d Caen, which was built between 1060 and 1080 and founded by Mathilda, wife of William the Conqueror.

Mr Herbert was a flight captain in a squadron of Stirling bombers, engaged in special duty operations over France, Holland, Belgium and Norway.

Mr Herbert was despatched to England in 1943 to join a squadron of Stirling bombers engaged in high-level bombing.

The Stirling, however, were then redeployed as low level aircraft, supplying food, ammunition and personnel to resistance movements in German occupied France, Belgium, Holland and Norway in the lead up to the Normandy invasion on June 6, 1944.

"We used to drop containers, fitted with parachutes, off the bomb racks," Mr Herbert said.


"It was an operation initiated by M15 special branch, which had made contact with the resistance groups on the continent and then trained and sent in organising agents.

There were resistance forces in each country but they operated haphazardly. This was the operation which made them all far more effective fighting forces," Mr Herbert said.

The Stirling aircraft were also used as glider towers, taking troops in behind enemy lines.

"There were three main gliding operations — D-Day of course, Arnhem and the crossing of The Rhine. I missed Arnhem, because I was in hospital, and I'm glad I did. Our squadron lost 63 planes and many others were badly damaged. It was a disaster, the last major setback of the war for the Allies," Mr Herbert said.

Flight Lieutenant Herbert flew a total of 17 missions, three before D-Day and the rest after the invasion, as the tide of the war started to turn for the Allies.

"There were no Australian units involved in D-Day but a large amount of personnel, including myself, were dispersed among Royal Air Force and Royal Navy units," he said.

The 50th anniversary medals were presented to veterans and posthumously to family members during their stay in Normandy.

Mr Herbert spent 10 days in the Normandy region, attending anniversary celebrations and visiting battle sites.




