





Queensland ISU Carnival

Townsville Gun Club

The fact that ISU Clay Target shooting is alive and well was confirmed at the State ISU Carnival held during late June at the Townsville Gun Club in far north Queensland.

In all, nearly 50 shooters from Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria plus the entire New Zealand ISU team including their Commonwealth Games representatives were in attendance, to make for one of the most enjoyable weekends of shooting had by many for some considerable time, in what were nearly perfect winter weather conditions.

Local shooters, together with shooters from as far north as Cairns and as far south as the Gold Coast, Brisbane, Warwick and the Sunshine Coast were extended the normal welcome by the Townsville management and members, and without exception, enjoyed the hospitality and facilities the club offered.

The Queensland State Olympic Trap Championship was well contested by six squads of shooters, with many good performances being recorded. The course of the event also saw the conducting of the State Postal Teams event with the Queensland team comprising — Grahame Wyatt, Andrew Larsen, Peter Stein, C. Scott, Bob Simpson and Greg Newey.

Following the good competition in the Olympic Trap event, Commonwealth Games team member Russell Mark, from Victoria, finished with the excellent score of 123/125. Brian Wistrand from New Zealand also performed exceptionally well, posting a very good 120/125, as did fellow Kiwis, Graham Ede on 117/125 and Bill Beecroft on 116/125.

Top Queenslanders, Peter Stein on 117/125 and Bob Simpson 115/125 made up the top six shooters for the weekend, and filled places in the 'final'.

At the completion of the 125 targets, Geoff Jukes and Len Norman were going into the 'final' on 113/125, followed by Brian Thomson on 111/125 and Brian Prosser on 109/125. R. Devine made up the six on 96/125.

Following the 25 target 'final', Len Norman emerged from a lean spell to be the 1994 Queensland ISU Skeet Champion by one target.

A very successful weekend's shooting was conducted, and congratulations must go to well known Townsville administrators Tom Comerford, Daphne Leeds and Noel Beale, who along with Andrew Larsen and others, made the weekend enjoyable for the visitors and locals alike.





World Down the Line Championships September 9-11, 1994



Mark Crevatin

Mark is a well known Sporting shooter and in this field has had utmost success, both in Australian and International competition. He commenced field shooting under the guidance of both his father and grandfather. To his credit he has applied himself to ACTA trapshooting and has become well known around the traps.

He has been notching up a large number of wins with some big breaks (his highest break is 550) in recent months, including the annual Central Grand Prix at Maryborough, his second win at this event. He has represented Victoria in State Trap Teams and figured amongst the runners up in State Titles.

Mark, a machinist aged 23, is a member of the Melbourne Gun Club, which is also his favourite club. He shoots a Beretta 682 loaded with Ballantine ammunition.



Roger Duthie

Roger Duthie is 39 years of age and commenced shooting part time at the age of 20, five years later in 1980 he took up the sport full time with his preferred discipline being Down the Line.

Roger started shooting with an A grade Browning, he now uses a Beretta SO5 which he loads with Winchester 1250 HA No. 7 in the first barrel and 1300 HA No. 7 in the second barrel.

Roger is registered with the Hamilton Gun Club in Victoria, his favourite ground to shoot at is the Echuca Gun Club, Vic.

His list of wins is impressive, with Mackintosh Team Representation achieved on seven times. His highest break is 680

which was shot at the Brisbane Trap Nationals this year, where he won the Blue Ribbon Event, the National Double Barrel Championship. In 1991 Roger was most successful in Perth at the National Trap Series being victorious overall by winning the Overall High Gun. Roger has made the Victorian State Shoulder to Shoulder 5 Man Team four out of five times, along with winning every State Title at the Victorian State Carnivals.

Rogers main shooting goal has been to represent Australia overseas, something wonderful that he has achieved. His other main goal concentrates on shooting to the best of his ability.



John Farrell

John aged 50 commenced shooting in June 1981. As a teenager when living in Bourke NSW, he was first introduced to the sport of clay target shooting by his late father, Hugh Farrell, but it was not until 1981 when moving to Coffs Harbour that he began trap shooting on a regular competitive basis.

Down the line shooting has always been Johns preferred discipline, mainly because most neighbouring clubs in his district only offer down the line. However, if there were more closely located ISU Trap layouts within the area, he would certainly follow this discipline as he believes the challenge to be greater. However, John has continued with down the line and has achieved considerable success particularly over the latter years.

He shoots some skeet and enjoys doing so, with the past twelve months seeing his skeet shooting on the improve.

John shoots a Miroku 9000 Grade 5, 30" barrel, full and half chokes with extended forcing cones and ported bottom barrel for trap. For skeet shooting he uses his Browning A Grade. His tip to new shooters when purchasing their guns, is to stress the importance of the right advice on correct gun fit as this determines average or good scores.

Ammunition fired is always Scorpio 7½ 28 gram since their introduction for down the line shooting and No. 9 for skeet.

Home club involvement: During the 13 years in his home club of Coffs Harbour John has held positions ranging from Club Captain (7 years), Armourer/Vice President, Club Coach and currently is President of the club.

His favourite shooting grounds are Coffs Harbour, Brisbane and Tamworth clubs. At Tamworth he has shot his highest breaks, being 292 and 376 in consecutive events. However John's most outstanding performance having attended three Nationals, two in Brisbane and one in Adelaide, was this year at Brisbane where he gained equal 1st position in the Mackintosh team as well as winning AA grade gold medal in the Aust/NZ Trap Championship.

During Johns years of gaining experience in down the line shooting he attributes most of his success from watching and observing performances of fellow shooters, namely Doug Ellis (Guyra), Ray Hammond (Guyra) and Roger Vidal (Inverell). Whilst observing these and other first class shooters, John looks at improving his technique and as well tries to excel at all times. This year he has enrolled in a Level 2 coaching course to enable him to help others as he has been helped.

John's main goal since competing at clay target shooting has been to represent his country, he has achieved this by determination and dedication to the sport.



Bill Iles

Bill Iles of Hurstbridge Victoria, commenced shooting in 1976 at the Metropolitan Clay Target Club.

At club, zone and state level he has won in Trap DTL, Skeet, Trench, Tower and Ball Trap Championships. Overall events total 1350 plus.

Bill has to his credit the 1986 National Double Barrel Title, 1993 & 1994 National Single Barrel Titles, 2 National Double Rise Titles, Mackintosh Team High Gun honours and not surprising Overall National Trap High Gun honours on four occasions. His wins in Commonwealth Overall Championships total 54.

He has represented Australia in overseas competition in all three disciplines:

Trap Teams: England 82 shooting 300/300pts; New Zealand 1994; Wales 1994; A Mackintosh Team Member 12 times.

Skeet Teams: USA 1986; Skeet Team Member 3 times.

Trench: Italy 1985; Brunei 1990 winning Gold in the teams and individual.

Bill was the first Non American to shoot 200/200 at the Grand American, this was in 1982.

He has had much success in P.N.G. at their National Titles winning 5 out of 6 events.

Bills latest claim to fame came at the 1994 New Zealand Nationals where he shot 1827 to win their National Single Rise Title and record a break of 1927 there.

Bill shoots a custom Beretta 682 Trap Gun 32" with barrel porting top and bottom, backbored to 0.735 with the forcing cones done by Ian McGeoch. The stock is custom made to suit by Kevin Wright of Ballarat. The cartridges used are Champion made by Ballantine Ammunition. Bill has three 682 Beretta guns, one each for Trap, Sporting, Skeet & Trench, all have been given the McGeoch & Wright full custom works.



Denis Lymn

Denis commenced shooting in 1979 on a Sunday afternoon when an Italian friend brought his hand slinger to Denis's farm and they shot a few clays among the sandhills. Prior to this he had never seen the sport in action, but he knew it was without a doubt the sport for him. The Volunteer Involvement Program (VIP) has allocated more than \$20,000 worth of sporting equipment and clothing to recognise sport and recreation volunteers through the VIP Recognition Awards.

Without volunteers, many sporting organisations and clubs would struggle to meet the competing pressures of finding funding, providing adequate facilities, encouraging registrations, administrating. 
Victorian ISU Grand Prix Series



The Broken Hill Gun Club Tower

By Lost Target

As many members of clubs would know there is usually a lot of talk that goes on before anything is ever done on major projects to improve their club facilities. It usually starts with someone bringing up the idea, then you get the for and against, knockers and those that just don't want their club to go ahead which usually means that the idea is lost for years or never comes to happening.

Well this is just what happened at the Broken Hill Gun Club, but with a different result. For as many years as I can remember, or about 10 years, there has been talk about building a Tower Layout, and yes I can hear you all saying, who wants a Tower, nobody will shoot it, it's too easy, it's going to cost too much, we can't afford it, it will never get used, the list could just go on and on, for about 10 years, or the members can think positive and get right behind the people wanting to put the work in.

Thanks to McLauchlan Motors and Engineering and the keen members of the Broken Hill Gun Club the Tower that is on the front cover of this magazine was built. From a monthly meeting in March 1993 to around April 1994 the Tower was up, just under 12 months. Not bad hey.

It is made from 4½ chute liners purchased from Pasminco Mining Broken Hill. The chute liners are 10ft long and 5ft in diameter, ¼" plate steel tubes. They are used on the mines to go between levels so miners can climb from level to level. There is ½ a section in the ground along with ½ a ton of reinforcing rod and mesh, all welded together. Approximately 10 cubic meters of concrete holds the base together. All sections are welded together and the whole lot is welded to the ½ section in the ground. There is 3 sets of ladder in the tower joining 3 landings. Housed in the top section is a Winchester White Flyer mounted on a bracket that can be tilted so as to throw targets downwards. The inside is completely lit with fluoros, with 4,500 watts of QH light on the top rail which is 13 metres high for shooting at night.

The Tower looks really good at night when lit up, and at night Double Rise Tower looks quite spectacular to watch and to my surprise very easy to pick up when shooting. It took about 50 litres of paint to paint the Tower after it was decided how we were going to paint it. There were quite a few letters written to various cartridge manufacturers to see if they were interested in painting it as a big cartridge, but there were no takers, I guess they couldn't picture how big it was going to be. It

would have looked quite a sight as a big cartridge on the cover, wouldn't it? Well we are still open for offers but I bags not painting it !!!

Well, that's a short story on how, what I think is the best Tower in Australia, came to be. It is used every monthly shoot and every Wednesday night for practice because it is easy to set up with volunteer trappers always willing to have a look from the top.

Cartridges of the Past

A very popular cartridge of the 1930s was 'Rhenwest' brand loaded by Harvey Shaw Successors of 560-6 Lonsdale Street, Melbourne. They were loaded into German made empty cases with Walsrode powder, also of German manufacture.

Chandlers hardware were the Australian distributors, and this is evident by their trademark of the kangaroo on several packets.


There are several different case colours with yellow being the most popular, also in 16, 20 and 410 gauges. Blue was used for one ounce loads (nothing is new in the shooting world), and both high and low brass red was used. Some cases carried the additional case print 'Specially waterproofed for duck shooters'.

The accompanying photograph shows several of the many different Rhenwest packets produced. I would be keen to hear from anyone with different ones such as 'clay target load' or any other different colours of cartridges. Brown was possibly used and perhaps purple.


Harvey Shaw also loaded cartridges to order for various companies, similar to what Ballintine and Scorpio do today. These included Henry B. Smith, a woolbroker of Spencer Street, Melbourne; Speedite brand for Harris Scarfe Ltd of Adelaide; New Zealand Loan & Mercantile Agency of Melbourne; Pays Stores of Kerang Victoria and the Western Stores & Edgleys Ltd of Dubbo and other NSW towns. All of these brands loaded to order are rare today.


One of the interesting facets of badge collecting is that every now and again you come across a badge of a club that no longer exists, and despite inquiries, remains a little of a mystery. One such badge I have in my collection is that of the 'Cadnite Gun Club'.

Around the Clubs: 1947

By George Biggs, ACTA Historian

From the Editors Notebook 'News'

Champion of Champions Cup 1947

So many requests have been made for the complete scores in the 1947 Champion of Champions Cup, shot at North Coburg on June 16 that we have decided to append the same below:

'Dock-an-Doris' (D. Watson) Vic 49/50, A.F. Burns Vic 45/50, 'Duxbae' (H. James) Vic 44/50, J. McCraith Vic and J. Bryant Vic equal 43/50. Major General W. Bridgeford Vic, H.R. Donnelly and J. Berry NSW equal 42/50.

The Australian Teams Championship, decided in conjunction with the above event resulted: Coburg No.1. Team 68/80.

Affiliated clubs should make a point of having an official scorer in attendance at all shoots. A recent incident reported to the Association revealed an occasion where an actual outright winner of the main event was incorrectly scored. A state of confusion followed and he was restored among those in the shoot. Considerably upset, he missed out immediately. The reason for all this was that no fewer than four or five 'casual' scorers had a finger in the scoring 'pie' with the unfortunate result indicated.

Registered shooters at September 1947 numbered approximately 900 of which only 20 were on a handicap of 18 yards and over. No one was more than 20 yards. Almost all shooters resided in the eastern states.

In a letter to the then Association Secretary Mr 'Bill' Mc-Cullough from the great English trapshot Mr W.P. Grosvenor, Mr Grosvenor explains his experiences on his second visit to America to compete in their big events and the 1912 Olympic Games. His letter follows and is self explanatory.

"I have twice visited the United States and competed under their 'one barrel 1½ oz of shot conditions'. I have also had the pleasure of shooting against their best exponents at the Olympic Games on three occasions, 1912 when we finished second gaining silver medals.

If my considered opinion is of any value, I would again state emphatically that the USA trap shooters are outstanding in their ability and much above our best.

At Antwerp in the 1920 Olympic Games the Americans had in their team at least three shooters with the most wonderful averages and runs of several hundred straight".

Mr Grosvenor goes on to say:

"I have always considered that we in Britain and probably you in Australia have always followed the wrong line in using two barrels and short events. As I previously stated Canadian and USA shooters use mainly one barrel and run events to 25 targets and this accounts for their general superiority. When we reorganised clay target shooting after the first world war I did my best to get this style adopted here, but with only minor success. The bulk of the shooters, with their more limited experience, voted for the old style of two barrels and this stands today. I did convince them to run 100 target programs, of four 25 clay events. American and Continental style shooting of a 25 target event is shot through at nearly double the speed of our leisurely English events. Percy Stanbury, one of our best here is a deliberate style shooter. Enoch Jenkins, a Welshman, was high gun at Berlin in 1936 over the whole meeting of 500 targets. In the actual championship Jenkins finished fourth and registered 269/300.

In the Olympic Games the traps are set to beat the gun all the time, not to enable a high score to be made. The difficulties of this have to be seen and endured to be believed".

Jack Govett

The Loddon District Police Trap Club and Bendigo Clay Target Club have lost one of their strongest members and supporters with the death of Jack Govett after a short illness, aged 67 years.

The first gun club Jack joined was the Tandara and District Gun Club and their function was to organise hare and fox shoots in the pre World War II years. As well as his involvement with clay target clubs, he was a very keen field shooter and attended duck openings, without exception. In addition to his transport business, Jack also successfully conducted a farm at Tandara which happened to be right in first class quail country and it was quail that brought many shooters from clubs all over to shoot on Jack's property.

Jack joined the Huntly Gun Club (later to become the Bendigo Clay Target Club) when it was formed in the early 1950s and has been a continuous member since. When the Loddon District Police Trap Club was formed in 1981, Jack immediately became a member and rarely missed one of their shoots. He generously donated trophics each year for annual awards within the club. He often stated that his travels with the club throughout Australia and New Zealand, and his 'trip of a lifetime' to Canada and the USA, were the undoubted highlights of his shooting life.

As an added interest to his attendance at shoots, he fervently collected badges and patches relative to shooting and shooting clubs. He attended a number of Trap Nationals with his badges in a gun case where he would set himself up and begin his trading.

Jack was a Shire Councillor with the East Loddon Shire for 12 years as well as being a member of the Dingee Bowling Club. He was a community minded person who served in many positions with organisations in the Dingee area. He will be sadly missed by his large number of friends, and by the clay target shooting fraternity in general.

Stewart Stanley

The members of Boggabri Gunnedah Gun Club were saddened by the sudden death of their member Stewart Stanley on the 7th August.

Stewart was a true sportsman in all aspects of gun shooting and a willing supporter in club affairs. He was a man who liked to travel and support neighbouring clubs. Our sympathy to his wife Nola.
