





The Mid Wales Shooting Ground, Trefglwys, owned and operated by Arthur Williams, was the setting for the 2nd World Down the Line Championships. The first World Championship was conducted in 1948.

These Championships came about as a result of the ACTA in 1993 suggesting to the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association that there was a need to establish a recognised World Championship for DTL shooting. Mr Brian Carter, the then Executive Director of the CPSA, took our suggestion to the International Shooting Committee and the event was well on the way to becoming a reality.

In all 15 Australian shooters made the very long journey and participated in the event. The Championship consisted of a 250 target qualifying round, followed by a 50 target final for the top 10% of competitors in each section. The event was scoree as a pointscore event and was shot five per lane. The team event was shot over the first 200 targets of competition. There were sections for Overall, AA, A, B and C grades as well as Ladies, Juniors and Veterans divisions. Teams shot for titles in Open, Junior, Ladies and Veterans sections, Entries totalled 410 shooters in all.

There were 11 individual countries represented and some 31 teams took part in the contest. Organisation was first class with each shooter shooting at some stage over all 10 traps and at a different time each day. All were aware of the time they would be required to shoot the event, this being posted on the day prior. All referees and scorers were paid officials and did not shoot, which added to the smooth running of the shoot.

Throughout the competition rain fell fairly consistently causing some discomfort, possibly more so in the car park than on the shooting track.

The Australian No. 1 team of Mark Crevatin, Roger Duthie, John Farrell, Bill Iles and Dennis Lymn shot very consistently throughout the Championship, so much so, that on the 2nd and 3rd days of competition, a very large crowd followed their every move. The teams shooting certainly impressed as they were the recipients of a standing ovation after they shot the last trap of the team event. I guess a score of 373/375 points is worthy of acclamation.


In the week prior to the Worlds, Bill Iles announced to the English he had arrived for a visit by winning the English Open 'Handicap by Distance' by shooting 100 straight from 23 yards.

The Australians went to the Championship to win the Team title, and win it they did by 11 points over the Irish A team, with England A a further 9 points down.

An outstanding achievement was that of our 'Chippa' Les Chant in winning the Junior title by, would you believe, 11 points from the red hot favourite, John McDonald, the current Open Scottish Champion.

Bill shot exceptionally well to end up with the silver medal overall and his score of 895 out of a possible 900 points speaks for itself. Mark Crevatin with a score of 888/900 finished in equal 5th AA, and our other team members were not very far behind.

The 3rd World Championship is scheduled to take place in 1997 and I attended a meeting of the International Clay Pigeon Shooting Council and argued Australia's case for conducting the event. I am very confident that we will get to host it, but this will not be known until later this year.

This was a most successful trip for Australia and it is pleasing to see Australia achieving so much on the International arena of clay target shooting.

P.S. If you ever intend to travel to the United Kingdom to shoot, and just happen to be travelling through Singapore, please ensure you have the necessary paper work from there, it will save problems.

Commonwealth Games Victoria, B.C., Canada

Following the departure from Italy a group of 27 including Craig Meuleman, Graeme Boyd and myself headed for Canada via the U.S.A. Russell Mark and Ian Hale along with the remainder of the World Championship team returned to Australia.

Our first stop was the J.F.K. Airport in New York City. After clearing our luggage and firearms onto domestic, we had several hours to waste as we waited for our connecting flight to Seattle on the West Coast.

As luck would have it, a tremendous storm swept over New York and so the inevitable delays began. Finally we boarded our flight, only to sit on the tarmac for nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, waiting in line for take-off.

Some five hours later we landed in Seattle where the usual panic for luggage and equipment began. It was here we suffered our only loss, with one of the Running Target competitors rifle going astray. After a full days stop over, which everyone spent sight-seeing, we boarded a Super Cat (ferry) including the returned firearm and headed for Victoria, $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours away.

Our home for the next three weeks was to be the University of Victoria, conveniently situated beside the main athletic stadium and only 20 minutes by bus to the city centre. Following our registration and securing of firearms at Heals Range, Craig, Graeme and I settled in to acclimatise to the milder weather and time difference.


With Winchester Silver cartridges bought with us from Italy, Craig and Graeme were able to have several training days prior to Russell and Ian and our ammunition from Australia arriving. The grounds were in a magnificent setting, off to one side of the 1,000 metre rifle range, back against a forest of fir trees. Each discipline had two ranges specially constructed for these Games and as we arrived, the workers were putting the final touches to them.

On the 11th August Russell and Ian arrived via the Qantas Charter flight completing our team. It was at this time a similar debacle to that of the ammunition to Italy raised its ugly head in the form of a non-arrival of our consignment to Canada. On checking with the Games Transport Officer, it was found that although he had informed us (before leaving for Italy), our ammunition was already in transit, in fact no such movement had taken place. It took some five days of frustration and frayed nerves before we finally received the ammunition consignment.


All this time only limited training could be done and this was only achieved through the generosity of Graham Ede of the New Zealand contingent. The first competition (August 15th) was the Trap Badge Match and due to the ongoing ammunition situation I was forced to withdraw Russell, with Graeme having just enough left of the NZ supply to compete. Results weren't as we wished being shot over banded clays (not as advertised full fluro) and Graeme only carded 82/100.

Next day was the Skeet Badge Match and for the first time since our arrival it began to rain. But nothing could dampen the skeeties and at the end of 100 targets Craig, Ian and Brian Thomson (NZ) had tied on 95. A countback was applied and Brian declared 1st, Craig 2nd and Ian 3rd.

Following a lay day marked by the thankful arrival of our ammunition the Opening Ceremony took place.




Skeet ranges.

August the 18th is a day that will stay in Clay Target Shooters memory as the day Ian Hale carried the Australian flag in the Opening Ceremony. The pride we felt with Ian was compounded as we entered the cheering capacity packed stadium. It really was a moving moment. The ceremony lasted several hours during which Queen Elizabeth II opened the Games and the Indian tribes of Canada performed rituals of their history.

Saturday 20th was overcast but warm for the first serious event of the Trap Pairs. Russell and Graeme now with their own ammunition felt confident and started well. Several trap problems arose as the day wore on with rounds lasting up to 35 minutes due to broken targets and slow releasing machines. At completion of the event our duo had put together a less than exciting score of 180/200. This placed Australia 6th behind Northern Ireland 188/200, Canada 187/200 and England 186/200. 'Back to the drawing board of basics'.

With another lay day out of the way it was the Skeet Pairs Match, and as with the badge match, down came the rain. Yet this did not detract from some great shooting which for the first time was over full fluro targets. At the half way mark Australia lead by a target and were shooting well. Suddenly in Ian's final round some 'cad' pinched the lead from his cartridges and vital targets escaped through the pattern. Even with Craig's 95/100, Australia finished 4th behind Cyprus 189/200, New Zealand 186/200 and Scotland 186/200.

No one can describe the pressure that now came onto Russell and Graeme as they trained hard in preparation for the Trap In-

dividual Event. Both knew they were capable of a far higher performance, and called on their vast experience to improve. Unfortunately the required higher performance eluded them and both finished day 1 down the list. The second day saw both improve, but too many banded targets had landed in one piece.

The event went to 1st Mr M. Singh (India) 141/150, 2nd Mr G. Leary (Canada) 140/150 and 3rd Mr A. Alglou (Cyprus) 137/150.

So now we had only the Skeet Individual event to go and two last chances for medals. This time the weather was kind to the skeeties as Friday 26th turned into a crystal clear and warm day. Both Craig and Ian shot well and at the end of day 1, Craig led with 73/75 with Ian equal 5th on 71/75.

Saturday 27th was another clear and warm day and the excitement that had eluded us at the trap range suddenly was with us. Craig came in early with a 47/50, followed by Ian with a 48/50 and Australia had two finalists.

Craig led the way hitting each target hard leaving only a puff of fluro dust, eventually followed by Ian hitting them equally as hard. On station 4 Craig hiccupped and let one by, followed by another on 6 to record a 23. The last target that Ian shot will remain etched in his memory for it gave him a clear round and a gold medal.

From carrying the Australian flag to winning a Gold Medal, a dream had come true. But for every winner there are always losers and no one can take away that gut wrenching feeling one has when your best on the day was not good enough. For all the Australians watching, this is the emotion seen as Craig was the first to congratulate his sparring partner for his moment of glory.

Final results were: 1st Ian Hale (Australia) 144/150; 2nd C. Kourtellas (Cyprus) 143/150; 3rd A. Austin 143/150; 4th C. Meuleman (Australia) 142/150.

The celebrations started and it was fortunate that next day was the Closing Ceremony (late afternoon) for several nameless shooters were very late risers. For everybody the Closing Ceremony was another bag full of memories to go with the many others obtained during these Commonwealth Games.

For Ian, Craig, Graeme and myself it only left the long trip home, with Russell heading to friends in Boston for a long overdue rest prior to competing in the World Cup Finals in Munich.

UIT World Cup Final Munich

The International Shooting Union, 1994 World Cup Final, a sporting highlight, was celebrated from September 7-12 on the Olympic shooting range of 1972 in Munich-Hockbrück.

Every year since 1986, world cup events have been held in which the world's ten best shooters of each discipline can qualify for the UIT World Cup Final according to a specific qualification system. Amongst the ten shooters representing seven countries successfully qualifying this system, Australia's Russell Mark acquired the right to compete in this elite World Cup Final in the Double Trap men (150 Target) event.

In addition to qualifying on the completion of the World Cup events attended during the year, Russell automatically qualified being victorious with a score of 141+48/189 at the 46th UIT World Championships held in Fagnano, Italy, ranking first of the best four receiving an invitation to the exclusive Final competition in Munich.

What began as a wet, cold day, completed with the sun shining for a very successful and happy Australian shooter, and supporter.

The competition began, Russell's first round of 46, placed him equal second with Bade, USA and was up against Pera, Italy on 49. Second round, he dropped to 6th place, after scoring a disappointing 43. If he wanted to see any medals, he had to perform.

Russell achieved a perfect 50/50 in his third round which is only the third perfect score recorded in World competition since Double Traps inception in 1988. The 50 placed him in third position for the 'finals'.

In the 'final' Russell top scored with a 47 leaving him in a three way sudden death shoot off with Lance Bade and John Oppio both from the United States. All three tied a score three points below his World Championship and Australian record score one month earlier in Italy.

Oppio felt the pressure first on his second pair and fourteen pairs later in sudden death Bade did the same. Russell now becomes the first clay target shooter in the history of the UIT to win both the World Championship and the World Cup Final in the same year. He is the first person from the Southern Hemisphere to win either competition.

In the Ladies section, Demina of Russia scored 138/160 to win from Pusila of Finland, the current World Champion on 136/160.

Thanks to Russell's cool head, he now successfully is ranked 'Numero ono' in the world. In what ended as a very exciting nail biting final (especially for one other very proud Australian cheering amongst the American team), Russell Mark was to be presented with the 1994 World Cup Final Gold medal. In addition he received a fantastic crystal trophy to place on his mantle piece, and a personally engraved S05 Beretta with two sets of barrels. But most importantly, he has now secured a place in the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta.

Congratulations to Russell on a very well deserved victory.



Register a record

COBAR 1966

(an extract from that time)

A Narromine man made clay target shooting history at Cobar at the weekend when in a series of competitions, shooting from varying distances and finishing up under flood lights, he set up an Australian record that experts believe may never be broken.

He is Kevin Heywood, Narromine farmer and grazier, who shot a total of 501 clay targets and was still going strong when the competition ended.

The program at Cobar included the State Team elimination and was attended by a large gathering of shooters from all over the State, including professional representatives of shotgun cartridge manufacturers.

The State elimination is a 50t event with the shooters standing 18 yards behind the trap house. Kevin made the team and scored in the top 10. The next event was a \$400 handicap of 40 targets double barrel. Kevin shoots from 27 yards, that being the maximum mark. He missed his first target in this event and ended up with a score of 39/40, which is an outstanding achievement from 27 yards. After missing he went on to shoot the other 39 and began to accumulate the greatest unbroken score that has ever been put up by a shooter in Australia in the one day.

Next on the program was the Far Western District Double Barrel Championship. 20 targets from 16 yards. Fifteen shooters scored 20/20 and continued to shoot on 'miss and out'. Ninety minutes later there were three left: D. Scowcroft (I.C.I.), P. Burgess (Cobar) and K. Heywood. Scowcroft missed his 354th target and retired with third place. Heywood and Burgess continued shot for shot until it became too dark. It was then decided to finish it under flood lights using white targets.

A delay of 45 minutes ensued while waiting for it to become dark enough to allow targets to be seen clearly under flood lights. Upon continuing Burgess missed his 384th target making Heywood the winner with 384/384. This score is an Australian record for the number of targets shot by a shooter in one event.

The last event on the program followed. 15 targets from handicap. Kevin got them all, making a total unbroken score of 436.

The record for an unbroken score on the one day at this stage was 452 held by Newton Thomas, a cartridge demonstrator for I.C.I., who might well be called the 'great white father' of clay target shooting in Australia.

In view of this the Cobar club decided to stage their club double barrel championship. 20 targets from 16 yards, to give Kevin a chance to beat the record. He shot the 20 targets and went on to win it scoring another 35 in the shoot off, giving a total unbroken score so far of 491.

At this stage everyone wanted to see if he could make it to 500 so the club put on another event of 10 targets sweepstake off handicap.

Kevin shot the 10, making a total of 501 and making a record that will stand for a long time, and possibly never be broken.

Thus ended a wonderful exhibition of shooting not only by Kevin, but by Scowcroft and Burgess, who had the ability and staying power to run him so far in the championship.

There was no more time for further events so it was not possible to see just how many more he would have got before missing one.

With around 30 shooters arriving from as far away as Sydney, Illawarra, Ulladulla, Batemans Bay and Shoalhaven, it was going to be a great day.



International Shooting Union

The International Shooting Union was originally founded in 1907 and reorganised in 1921 to become the Union Internationale de Tir. The I.S.U. is formally recognised by the International Olympic Committee as the sole controlling body of Amateur Shooting Sports at international and worldwide levels of competition.

The Union members are those National Shooting Organisations which are recognised and affiliated with their National Olympic Committee and currently represent 109 different countries.

U.I.T. World Championships are conducted every four years, usually two years after the Olympic Games. Shooting events for which World Championships are conducted include 300 metre rifle, smallbore rifle, pistol, running target and clay target (trap and skeet). The 1991 World Shotgun Championships were conducted in Perth, Western Australia.

Background and History of the Olympics By George Biggs, ACTA Historian

Australia's first crack at Olympic Games Shotgun Shooting took place at the Melbourne Olympic Games in 1956. It was our introduction to International Clay Target Shooting, we fielded a two man team and gained quite a lot of experience in many ways. The event at that point in time was at trap shooting only. International Skeet came to Australia in 1973 when the World Moving Target Championships were staged in Melbourne, 28 countries competed in both Olympic Trap and Olympic Skeet events of 200 targets per shooter each event.

History of the Modern Olympics (with thanks to the National Sports Information Centre and Australian Sports Commission)

The revival of the Modern Olympics was the brain child of the Frenchman, Baron Pierre de Coubertin. He believed that international competitions between amateur athletes would help promote friendly relationships between people from different countries. Despite strong opposition in 1894, de Coubertin assembled 79 delegates from 12 countries to attend the interna-

tional congress for the re-establishment of the Olympic Games. It was unanimously decided to hold the first modern Olympics in Athens in two years time.

The Athens Games of 1896 were a great success. The Olympics had returned to the land of their birth. On April 5th the Games were opened by King George of Greece, in front of a crowd of 60,000. The first competition of the Modern Olympics was the first heat of the 100m which was won by Francis Lane (USA), in a time of 12.5 sec. American James Connolly was the first Gold Medal winner when he won the triple jump with a jump of 13.71 metres. Australia's lone representative, Edwin Flack, a 23 year old accountant working in the United Kingdom, became not only our first Olympian but our first Gold Medal winner. Flack won the 800 and 1,500 metre track events. He was also leading the marathon until fatigue forced him to withdraw around the 37 kilometre mark.

The next Games were held in Paris and St Louis but unfortunately were overshadowed by the Paris Universal Exhibition and the Louisana Purchase Exposition.

Interim Games were held in 1906 in an attempt to revive the flagging Olympic movement. These Games were held in Athens, but were not numbered in sequence. Twenty countries attended and the Olympic concept was put back on track.

1908 in London saw the best organised Games so far. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) had decided in 1907 to award medals to the first three places in all events. This was followed on successfully at Stockholm in 1912, where electrical timing equipment was used for the first time in running events.

After World War I the resumption of the Olympics in 1920 at Antwerp saw the first Olympic flag unveiled in front of the 29 nations who participated. The concept of the Olympic oath was also introduced.

In 1924 the Games were held in Paris and saw an enormous increase in the number of competitors -4,000 from 44 nations. It was the first time all sports were being organised by their international governing bodies.

For the 1928 Games in Amsterdam the Dutch architect, Jan Wils, designed the latest in arenas. At these Games, the burning of the Olympic flame throughout the competition, the release of doves at the Opening ceremony to symbolise peace, and the erection of a large results board were seen for the first time.

In 1932, Los Angeles provided a purpose built village, a vast stadium and an operating profit to host the most successful Games to date. The use of photo finish equipment was also introduced in track events to decide close finishes.

The 1936 Games of the 11th Olympiad were held in Berlin, where the most politically motivated Games on record took place. Although the facilities were even more lavish than in Los Angeles the Games were no sooner established as a world event, than they were stopped again for war.

The 1948 Olympics were held in London. Germany and Japan were not represented, but 59 countries attended.

In 1952 the Games of the 15th Olympiad (the 12th set because of the wartime cancellations), were held in Helsinki with Japan and Germany readmitted. This was also the first appearance of the Soviet Union.

Melbourne was the site of the Olympic contest in 1956. The threat of war in Hungary and Egypt caused five nations to withdraw their teams but did not interfere with the scheduled events. For the first time at the closing ceremony the athletes from all countries entered the stadium together, symbolising the friendship of the Games. The idea came from John Wing,

an Australian born Chinese boy, in a letter to the chairman of the organising committee.

The 17th Olympiad in 1960 in Rome was not affected by any major political disputes, and went ahead as planned.

The 18th Olympiad in Tokyo in 1964 was the first to be celebrated in an Asian country. This Olympiad was not affected by the decision of the International Olympic Committee to exclude athletes from South Africa because of the practised policy of racial separation already active in that country. However the following Games in Mexico in 1968 only proceeded after threats of a boycott by African, Black American and Soviet block countries to force the continued exclusion of the South Africans.

Munich in 1972 was interrupted by a violent attack on the Israel compound by Palestinian terrorists during which 9 Israelis, 5 terrorists, and a West German policemen were killed.

Boycotts again plagued the Games of the 21st Olympiad in Montreal, when most of the African countries withdrew their athletes because of an earlier tour of South Africa by a New Zealand football team.

The 22nd Olympiad of 1980 in Moscow lacked the participation of the athletes of the United States and at least 35 other countries in a protest against the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan.

In 1984, the Los Angeles Games were attended by the Chinese for the first time since 1952, but the Soviet Union and most of its allies withdrew their athletes, alleging insufficient security.

No major political disputes marred the 24th Olympiad of 1988, when the Games were held at Seoul. The 1992 Games, celebrating the 24th Olympiad were hosted by Spain in Barcelona and all nations participated win the spirit of the Olympics.

Maradona positive — timely warning for all athletes

The Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA) said the anouncement by Federation Internationale De Football Association (FIFA) that the recent positive test result involving Diego Maradona serves as a timely warning for all athletes.

Soccer star Maradona returned a positive test result for the banned stimulant, ephedrine, which is found in common medications. In a similar fashion many commonly available medications, including cough and cold medications Sudafed and Codral cold and flu tablets, contain banned substances.

This news comes as a timely reminder to Australia's athletes, that they are responsible for determining whether any medication they use contains banned substances.

ASDA, regarded as having one of the most successful education programs, has a number of services and resources to assist athletes and others to find out such information. These include:

Drugs in Sport Handbook — A special booklet listing permitted medications by generic and brand name. The booklet also provides information on drug testing procedures and inadvertent doping.

ASDA Hotline — By calling the Hotline Number 008 020 506 between 9am-5pm Monday to Friday, athletes can ask if medications they are taking, or have been prescribed, are banned or not. It is not necessary to provide names and all calls are treated confidentially.

Wallet Card — ASDA has produced a wallet card for athletes listing some of the permitted medications (without prescription) that athletes can take for common health problems e.g. asthma, allergies, hayfever, diarrhoea, vomiting, pain/inflammation, colds and coughs.






Puckapunyal was reformed not so long ago, but has gone into recess again. It seems that the existence of these clubs rely on the attitude of the Area Commander at the time.

Generally better known as 'Doc' Evans passed away on September 27, 1994 at the age of 68 years.

Doc' was a man of strong faith and character, a highly respected shooter, and a friend to many. He was an active member of the Victorian Gun Club. He will be sadly missed.

Francesco (Frank) Petriella 20/2/25 - 6/7/94

It is with great sadness that I advise of the passing of Frank Petriella after a short illness.

In 1959 Frank emigrated from Italy to enjoy a 'better life' in Australia and settled in the Cooma district of New South Wales where he worked on the snowy mountains scheme.

Frank had developed a keen interest in shotguns in Italy where he hunted game regularly with a muzzle loader, taking up clay target shooting and live pigeon shooting for a brief period during the 1940s.

It was here that Frank developed his handloading skills, reloading all of his ammunition and this was an attribute he carried to Australia.

He was a service of almost inexhaustible knowledge on the subject of shotgun reloading of all gauges from the twenty gauge to the twelve. His particular passion was the smaller gauges, particularly the twenty and twenty-eight gauges of which he owned several.

The Zoli 20 and the Beretta 28 were regular companions on his journeys to his beloved Menaro region, where he hunted ducks and quails with his faithful pointers, even until just before his passing.

His eldest son John began clay target shooting in 1970 and it was here that Frank's interest and promotion of clay target shooting commenced.

There were no ISU facilities available at the time and Frank was convinced that this facility should be available to shooters wishing to attain the highest possible standard and be competitive with other shooters throughout the world.

His interest was fanned in 1973 with the World Moving Target Championships being conducted in Melbourne, and it was there that he made the decision to promote the ISU disciplines in the Canberra District.

Frank was an inaugural member of the ACT International Gun Club, formed in 1974. He was instrumental in having ISU facilities constructed at the Majura Road grounds in 1975, and had a hand in the running of the National Trench Championships held there in November the following year.

A keen interest in the ISU disciplines were now established in the area and this interest quickly spread to the Riverina district. ISU facilities were established at Griffith, Downside and West Wyalong Gun Clubs with the help and assistance of Frank Petriella.

During he late 1970s Frank was involved with the ACT Shooting Association in efforts to establish a National Shooting Ground for all shooting disciplines. Unfortunately this venture did not reach fruition as the ACT was found wanting in terms of suitable available space.

Frank and other family members helped the National Training Squad when they visited the Australian Institute of Sport each year in Canberra. He always made time available to help out on the grounds, cooking, trapping, scoring or indeed in any possible way during their stay.

He was a regular attendee at prominent ISU events particularly the National Championships where he was an important source of knowledge for many shooters experiencing rough times. He was always willing to assist those in trouble and gave his advice freely. Many Canberra International shooters also benefited from his advice during Sunday morning practice sessions.

Frank did not forget his roots and he often visited the Cooma (Berridale) and Tumut Gun Clubs along with family members when time permitted.

Frank Petriella was a life member of the Canberra Clay Target Club (formerly ACT International Gun Club) and he will be sadly missed by all members and friends.



During the course of the meeting, Mr Ron Mitchell presented to the Club the beautiful silver cup, won by his father, the late W.J. Mitchell in 1914. Mr Mitchell asked that the Cup, now to be known as the W.J. Mitchell Trophy, be shot for each year.

Th Club Patron, Mr John Houston, in acknowledging the gift and thanking Mr Mitchell on behalf of the Club, pointed out that it was a significant gift to receive in the Diamond Jubilee year of the Club. He pointed out that the older clubs, particularly in New Zealand, were making a big thing of preserving their historical records, trophies and the photographs of the past, all of which created a tremendous interest.

Later, it was announced that the Committee had made Mr Mitchell an honorary life member of the club in appreciation of the gift.

Gun club cup to J. Headon Re-print from 1968

John Headon had to sustain a shoot off with veteran Harry Cox, and another young competitor Alan Pocock to win the Hay Gun Club Cup on Saturday afternoon. In the evening T. Salafia, of Coleambally, won the Mitchell Cup outright; the only one of the field to shoot a possible 20/20.

The two cups are regarded as the blue ribbon events among the local club shooters. They are both shot for under handicap conditions, the Gun Club in daylight and the Mitchell Cup at night.

At ceremonial time, because the current Hay Gun Club Cup had not arrived from its former holder in time, the original Hay Gun Club Cup, now known as the 'Mitchell Cup, had to do duty in both presentations.

The Mitchell Cup, first known as the 'Lincoln Cup' was shot for first in 1914, and won by the late W.J. Mitchell.


