









National President's Notes



Why should we change?

One of the most negative statements I often hear when new rules, regulations or changes in the day to day running of our association occur, is 'why should WE change?'

The greatest accolade for any sportsman/woman is to win individually, or to be part of a winning team in international competition. Australia enjoys a reputation world-wide as being a great sporting nation and is currently enjoying success in cricket, rugby, tennis, swimming, the list goes on. Our achievements at the Commonwealth Games were the best ever, albeit against limited competition.

Our success in shooting on the world stage in the past two years has been outstanding, but where do we go from here? What of the future......

Governments and sports administration will not continue to fund sporting events and sports that are not truly International, nor will they continue to fund athletes that are not achieving results or improving with each event. Experts tell us that in 10 to 15 years Australian Rules Football will be a leisure sport only, and that the International codes will be attracting the competitors and funding, as well as the supporters.

We, as the major shotgun sport in Australia, must ensure that our representatives become more and more competitive and that we afford all with talent, the chance to represent their country.

Why should we adopt the type of shooting overseas? Why should we change our format of shooting? Why should we shoot five targets per lane DTL? Why should we change our coaching standards? Why should we change our cartridge loads?

These are just some of the questions I am asked continually ... I guess the best reason we should consider some of them is to allow Australia to win world recognition in the shotgun arena, to allow some of our fellow members the opportunity to wear green and gold, and to attract government funding and to attract corporate sponsorship ... and to survive.

Skeet Team selection: Glenn Trophy

The five member Skeet Team to represent Australia in New Zealand to compete for the Glenn Trophy is Adrian Cousens, Ian Hale, Neil Dimmick, Reg Clarke and Scott Wright. These shooters were selected from the All Australian Skeet Team (400 targets), being the top five placegetters over the 1994 Skeet Carnival.

Obligation to members: politically

An association such as ours has an obligation to all its members, in that it must respect each ones particular political pursuit, and that as an association, it does not align itself to a particular party.

Shooters, and shooter representatives in New South Wales are to be commended for their actions in establishing the Shooters Party, and in their strong endeavour to have a candidate elected to state government solely on the issue of firearm ownership and shooters rights.

We, as an association, are in no way aligned, nor have we contributed as a body, to the Shooters Party. Our legislation fund is to fight the introduction of any legislation we believe to be unjust that is contemplated by any government. It is to ensure that we can shoot unencumbered by harsh regulations in the future.

Should we, as a result of being apolitical, be penalised in any way by restrictions or removal of sponsorship and advertising in this magazine, then we must question the concept and purpose of the particular party.

Editor's mailbox

Dear Sir

The Bathurst Gun Club had its licence to operate revoked by the NSW Commissioner of Police – the grounds for this revocation was Public Safety.

Bathurst Gun Club decided to appeal this condition and the case was heard on 11th October 1994 at Bathurst.

Barrister Mr Peter Lever-Naylor (a clay target shooter) appeared for Bathurst Gun Club and I was called as an expert witness.

As a result of this appeal the licence was re-instated as from the 11th October 1994.

While this issue of Public Safety was resolved in favour of the Gun Club, the club still has difficulties to be resolved with Bathurst City Council. However these are separate issues.

This case has very important implications for clay target shooting in that I understand that it is the first revocation order issued in NSW against a gun club for this reason.

The basis for the issuing of this order was that under some conditions of high wind, shot from trap shooting was encroaching on a nature reserve and people visiting this nature reserve were reported to have complained.

In the defence, I submitted samples of factory ammunition and the shot that these contained plus SG and a solid slug. In addition I submitted test patterns shot on paper from a distance of 80, 100 and 120m. The cartridges used were Winchester 1200 in size $7\frac{1}{2}$. At 120m it took 3 shots to get 1 pellet on a sheet approximately 1m square and this pellet did not penetrate – the gun used was full choke trap gun of top quality.

The reason for the use of $7\frac{1}{2}$ shot (Winchester) for purposes of testing was that any thinking reasonable clay target shooter had long since given away the use of No. 6 shot for 28 gram loads. This argument was based on pattern density and pellet energy requirements for the breaking of clay targets. Both the Magistrate and Police Prosecutor accepted this position.

Let me make it very clear that this case would, in my opinion, have been lost if No. 6 shot had been nominated.

The argument I presented simply would not apply in the case of No. 6 shot and a very detrimental judgement could have been made against clay target shooting.

As I understand it the law tends to use previous judgement, unless overturned by a higher court, as precedents.

From this appeal a number of important principles are established.

- (a) Clay target shooters should, in any dealings with various authorities, be both firm but polite and educated in the subject.
- (b) Any appeal should be well prepared and devoid of emotion.
- (c) Witnesses should involve themselves in extensive preparation, some of which may be wasted effort, but must be prepared for any reasonable eventuality.
- (d) The court seemed to be impressed with actual evidence such as shot of various sizes, most people not familiar with shotguns seem only to think of shot being Buck Shot.

This experience, my first, extended my education and was well worth the hassle.

I believe from this case and any reasoned argument, that the ACTA should immediately ban the use of No. 6 shot, it is both unnecessary and its use has the potential to sow the seeds of our destruction as a sport.

For those unthinking enough to want to persist in its use, let them go elsewhere; there is no sensible reason for the sport to be put at risk for such a non issue.

To the editor

Over recent years there have been a spate of rule changes, which appear to have had no real benefit, and have succeeded only in confusing shooters, and spoiling the enthusiasm for DTL shooting.

Personally, I feel the following points should be addressed, before any further rule changes are implemented.

What are regulation targets? Can we have this clearly defined, so that all clubs, to the best of their ability, throw the same targets.

Further, if the angles of (targets to be thrown) are to be reduced from less than 45 degrees, left and right of centre, making it easier to shoot targets, thus lengthening shoot offs, then it seems obvious that a new approach to finding winners has to be found. Less than 5% of shooters at major tournaments are involved in very lengthy and expensive Double Barrel shoot offs. That's fine, the downside however, is that 95% of the shooters are being bored out of their minds.

The DTL World Championships in Wales was a real learning experience. It showed quite clearly, that if we are going to have reduced angles, then hand-in-hand with the reduced angles, we must adopt Single Barrel or Pointscoring shooting.

Wales also showed, that 5 man squadding, with 5 targets per lane before moving, is far quicker and much more satisfying. It enables the shooter to remain more focused, and certainly is an advantage to not only the older shooter, but to disabled and wheelchaired shooters.

It is my firm conviction that the above matters should be addressed without delay, to help arrest, what I feel is an obvious decline in interest in the DTL discipline.

We need to put Australia in step with other countries of the world, so that we might more closely fit the criteria for holding the proposed World Championships in three years time; and more importantly to the DTL shooters of Australia, make the sport more interesting and challenging.

CTSN deadline for January issue

Due to the Christmas period being upon us, the copy deadline for January 1995 cannot be extended and <u>must</u> close on November 30.

Classifieds section

A poor response has been received so far to this new idea. Shooters requested that we had a cheaper 'classifieds' section, so let's see it supported. It is a very cheap way to advertise a product throughout Australia.

Rule changes

Effective January 1, 1995

Rule 1.10(b) & Rule 5.14(b) - Rewrite

The competitor fails to shoot because his gun is unloaded, or because the safety catch was faultily adjusted or jarred back, whether from his oversight or not, or because of any other cause chargeable to his oversight or neglect (no target shall be allowed for the first target of any visit to a trap if a safety catch is engaged).

Should this happen in a double rise event, the first target should only be declared lost and a proof pair shall be thrown to determine the result of the second shot only. However, a shot shall be fired at each target in the proof pair.

(In rule 5.14(b) (Skeet) Double Rise to be changed to Doubles).

Rule 2.1(a) - Add words underlined

All appropriate 15 metre scores (common mark) shall be recorded for percentage performance classification, irrespective of how the event is run.

Note: All targets that are shot under common mark conditions will be entered on the ACTA shooters record card – with the exception of Double Rise events <u>and those shot Targets only</u>.

Rule 2.1(i) - Rewrite 2nd paragraph

A shooter may be upgraded after shooting 200 targets, but he must shoot 600 targets, 3 sets of 200 targets, at a lower grade percentage to be downgraded. All scores after the last grading must be carried forward onto the new record card.

Rule 2.1(q) & Rule 6.1(h) — New Rule

All wins shall be recorded with a OW (overall win) or GW (grade win) beside scores on handicap cards.

Rule 2.1(n), Rule 6.1(g) 4th paragraph, Rule 6.2(b) — Delete the following

Once attaining A grade a shooter cannot be reclassified as C grade.

Once attaining AA grade a shooter cannot be reclassified as B grade.

Any C grade shooter having recorded a 50 target break shall be re-graded to B grade.

Rule 2.3(c) — Rrewrite (ii) only, Add (iii)

(ii) Maximum Handicap 25 metres.

(iii) All Handicap Events must be of at least 25 targets or more.

Rule 2.3(e) --- Delete

1 metre backward movement to apply to group winners in a Group Handicap event (regardless of score).

Rule 2.3(e) - Changed to

There shall be No group handicaps

Rule 2.3(g) --- Rewrite

Back mark for all Handicap shooting to be 25 metres.

Rule 2.3(h) — Rewrite

Any competitor winning overall in any Championship event from behind his ACTA handicap mark will be re-handicapped to that mark.

Rule 3.13 - Delete last sentence

Targets only, must be entered on the shooters card.

4.27(c) - New Rule

Minimum participation age shall be subject to State Law.

Rule 2.1(h) — Add to 2nd paragraph, after (amounts if possible)

i.e. Continental & Single Barrel.

Rule 2.1(h) - Delete last sentence

If he has not shot at 200 targets during the year, he shall be graded on percentage of the targets shot at up to the time of registration.

Rule 6.1(g) — Rewrite (3rd paragraph)

A shooter must shoot a minimum of 3 consecutive groups of 200 targets at a lower percentage, to be downgraded. All scores after the last grading must be carried forward onto the new record card.

Rule 2.3(i) - Rewrite

All shooters who shoot 50 targets straight from or behind their handicap mark and are not re-handicapped under Rules 2.3(c), 2.3(d), will be handicapped 1 metre.

A shooter can only be re-handicapped 1 metre per event, except as in Rule 2.3(c), 2.3(h).

Rule 2.4(a) — Add to

(refer Rule 2.3(c), 2.3(d)

Rule 3.25 Ball Trap — Rewrite

- 1. Championships
- a) All Commonwealth, State, Zone Championship, and Club Events must be conducted using A.C.T.A. Rules.
- b) All Commonwealth, State Zone Championship to be of 50 targets (minimum), 75 for 100 targets.
- 2. Grading
- a) Until such time as a shooter records his initial 50 Ball Trap targets, he shall be placed in the same class as his grading under ACTA Rules.
- b) Gradings are to be as follows: AA 95% and over, A 85% and under 95%, B 75% and under 85%, C under 75%.
- c) A shooter may have his grade increased after shooting 200 targets, but must shoot three (3) consecutive groups of 200 targets at a lower grade percentage to be downgraded.
- 3. General
- a) Cartridges for all Ball Trap events shall restrict shot loads to a maximum of 28 grams and to a shot size no larger than No. 6.
- b) All shoot offs shall be conducted squad system, first miss and out as per Trap Rule 1.24.
- c) When Ball Trap is used as an ISU Elimination. ISU Rules, shall apply. Cartridges used in ISU Eliminations are to be of 24 grams maximum.

Note: It was intended that a full printing of the 1995 rules be published in this CTSN issue, however due to a revised rule book format, and the delay caused, the full print will now be contained in the January issue.

World Masters Games

BRISBANE September 26th – October 8th

The Fourth World Master Games held in Brisbane were a huge success. For all sports, a total of over 23,000 competitors had registered for the event. This was far in excess of the games organisers best estimates that had projected about 13,000 as the best entry level possible.

The clay target events were held at the Brisbane Gun Club starting on the 30th September and ending on 6th October and thanks to the superb efforts of the volunteers in the office and on the shooting ranges, were enjoyed by all. A total of 162 shooters registered for the clay target disciplines over the games.

Shooters in attendance were from all states of Australia, New Zealand, Canada, England and Denmark and all countries were successful in the medal race. Comments were received from the overseas shooters remarking on the hospitality and the wonderful reception they had been given by the Australian shooters. A shooter from England later wrote and commented in his letter that Australia had done itself proud by conducting the best event he had ever taken part in, of world class quality.

The first medal event was a 50 target Double Barrel Championship with 137 shooters vying to be in the first medal presentations. Medals were available in all grades AA-A-B-C and in age groups of 35-44 years, 45-54 years, 55-64 years and 65 years and over.





1994 State Coaches Conference

On October 16th to 18th, the annual State Coaches Conference was conducted, this time the venue being the Australian Institute of Sport, Canberra.

This year being the 'Year of the Coach' the conference was expanded to include those States Zone Coaches that were able to attend. The expanded conference was to include one day for the annual discussion making component and two (2) days with the A.I.S Sports Specialists.

The conference began at 8.45am on Sunday 16th with the 1993 minutes being confirmed. There were several points of business arising from these minutes and these were numbered for general business.

State reports followed with each State Coaching Director presenting their's to the assembled group.

- **Gid** Mr John Mitchell had only been State Coaching Director for one week, however, coaching was continuing to flourish with a junior program being put into place.
- Tas Tasmania has formed into four zones using the telephone codes as area designate.
- **SA** Mr Phillip Mules has been the State Coaching Director for only six weeks. Junior school coaching is progressing well and the state has appointed a co-ordinator to assist the State Coaching Director.
- **NT** Coaching was reported as steady with Level 1 courses in place and the profile of clay target shooting and coaching being boosted through the media.
- Vic Mr Ian Hale has been the State Coaching Director for some six months. New zone coaches are being investigated and the schools program is gaining strength.
- **NSW** A major junior development program has been instigated and receiving total support from the NSW executive. The program could be used as a role model for all states.
- **WA** A promotional video tape for the introduction of juniors and novices into the sport was presented to the assembled coaches.

All state reports were accepted and Western Australian being congratulated for the video tape as were the other states for their commitment to coaching.

The meeting then proceeded with the agenda and following are these items and relevant comments.

Level 1 Course Presenters Modules

A set of modules and overheads were presented to each state for use with their Level 1 course. These presenters kits now enable Level 1 courses to be conducted by each state with a uniform and standardised format Australia-wide.

ACC/ACTA Accreditation Update Review

After discussion it was agreed to retain the current points system that is currently in place for accreditation <u>renewals</u>. However because of the confusion created by the 'ACC log book' and ACTA's 'coaching report sheets' a new handicap style 'card' would be produced. This card would have only points on it and a list of Level 1 & 2 points, it will be introduced January 1st, 1995.

National Junior Development Squad Selection Review

A lengthy debate ensured as a solution for perceived shortcoming of selection were discussed. The current selection criteria for the squad was discussed in length by all state and zone coaches in attendance. After much deliberation, the current form of selection was to be retained. This being from each disciplines National Titles, using the following guidelines, but with additional criteria.

- 1. DTL National DB, SB and DB Points
- 2. Skeet 3 events as shot, not including Skeet Doubles
- 3. ISU Trap 3 events as shot
- 4. ISU Skeet 3 events as shot
- 5. Double Trap 2 events as shot

Once selected the following criteria is to be adhered to:

- a. Must enter into his/her State Coaching Scheme.
- b. Shooter must reasonably comply with 'A'. If non compliance, then may be dropped from the squad and the next qualifier at the Nationals will take their place.
- c. Maximum age of Junior to be such that they can attend the next Nationals of that discipline as a Junior.

Insurance

This ongoing subject was discussed in length, with a list of coaching specific queries being placed before the ACTA. After investigation a more defined interpretation should be available.

Vision

As no suitable data or video's had been located it was agreed to begin investigation of clay target specific data with the A.I.S. and other optical avenues. Also a Sports Vision booth for the DTL Nationals would be investigated.

Year of the Coach

An overview of the program was given and discussed. As it was viewed as a most worthwhile award several changes were agreed to, these were:

That there be promotion of the award in the CTSN three times in the ensuing year, with the nomination form appearing in the August edition. Each club nominee would be forwarded directly to the National Director of Coaching. The National Director of Coaching to put all nominees before an independent committee for assessment. The winner to be announced in December CTSN.

Following dinner the presentation of the ACTA Club 'Coach of the Year' was conducted with the winner being Mr Peter McBride of the West Australian Gun Club (article elsewhere). To conclude day 1, a video presentation on the Commonwealth Games (clay target component) was viewed showing Russell Mark and Ian Hale in action.

Day 2 of the expanded Coaches Conference began with a welcoming address by Mr Lawrie Woodman, Director of the Australian Coaching Council. An overview of the ACC's 1994 Year of the Coach was given including that that had already taken place and what will still take place prior to years end.

After the welcoming address the ACC & AIS specialists took over to deliver their presentations.

ACC's *Mrs Rebecca Layton* delivered a session on 'presentation skills'. The theme of 'your on before your on' was pursued with many areas of presentation to a sponsor being investigated.

Psychologist Ms Vicki de Prazer (AIS) then presented a session on 'conflict in sport'. This was to include 'what causes conflict/how it occurs/who with and solutions'.

Following a lunch break Ms Lynn Gunning (AIS) took over for a session on physiology 'defining skills'.

To finish the day *Mr* Harry Wardle (AIS) presented a session on 'strength and conditioning'. This subject covered the areas on strength and muscle building that was deemed necessary to a clay target shooter.


Day 3 restarted with a second session with sports psychologist *Ms Vicki de Prazer* on the subject of what coaches viewed as necessary in a psychology video tape. From there the topics ranged from goal setting, mental, rehearsal, cue words and recovery from mistakes.

The final presenter was *Mr John Baker (AIS)* who presented an overview on biomechanics and it's relationship to clay target shooters including the effects of recoil.

With the presentations all completed all that was left was a short question and answer period before the departure of the various states representatives.

In conclusion all the participants were thanked for their attendance and for taking advantage of this special 'one off' conference in the Year of the Coach. It was hoped the enthusiasm generated during the conference would be carried on back in the individual states and zones.

Wednesday 21st


Following a full day of competition the coach again headed back for the motel. Social drinks and the evening meal followed, leaving all competitors a free night to do anything of their own choosing.

National Training Squad in Adelaide.


The final of the Skeet and Trap was held, with Adam Vella setting an Australian record and unofficially equalling world record by shooting 149/150 – great shooting under the conditions.





The NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, the organisation which conducts the Government's mandatory firearms safety awareness testing for new applicants for shooters licences, promoted, on behalf of its parent body, the NSW Shooting Association, the 'Shooting Sportsman of the Year Awards' for the third consecutive year.

The awards were made at a most impressive presentation dinner held on Friday 14 October 1994 at Sports House in the Wentworth Park Function Centre Complex in Glebe, Sydney.

Host for the evening was television personality, Ron Wilson, and the Guest of Honour was NSW Leader of the Opposition, Mr Bob Carr, MP. The evening saw over 350 guests representing all the affiliated bodies and many of the clubs involved in the sport of shooting in NSW in attendance.

Other special political guests were Senator Baume, representing the federal Shadow Minster for Sport, Mr Ivan Petch, representing the NSW Minister for Sport Recreation and Racing, Mr Richard Face, NSW Shadow Minister for Sport, Recreation and Racing and Mr Jim Kaldis, MLC.

Other distinguished guests included, Ms Helen Brownlee, Chairperson of the NSW Olympic Committee, Arthur Tunstall, Secretary General Australian Commonwealth Games Association, and Alistair Macpherson, President of the Australian Shooting Association. In addition, the leaders of the sport in NSW, many industry personalities as well as shooters were present.


The awards were based upon each of the nine shooting disciplines affiliated with the NSW Shooting Association nominating two finalists from their clubs in NSW. The first nominee received a silver medal and \$200 cash prize, and the second nominee bronze medal and \$100 cash prize. These disciplines include target shooters and hunters.

This year three of the finalists were Commonwealth Games medallists from Victoria, Canada. They were Phil Adams from Forbes, Bob Dowling from Dubbo and David Clifton from Caringbah, in Sydney.


The overall winner was selected from all these nominees by the Board of Directors of the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council for the award of a Gold Medal and \$1,000 cash prize. The awards were in recognition of outstanding performance or achievement in competition shooting or a related shooting sports activity.

The winner was Commonwealth Games record holder, Phillip Adams from Forbes. Phillip was presented with his Gold Medal and winner's cheque by Bob Carr.

Phil is probably Australia's best known and most successful shooter in recent years. In the past year, he has won the NSW and ACT State Championships in free pistol and the South Australian Championship in air pistol. He also won the Australian National Championship in free pistol. He was placed 8th in the World Cup in air pistol and 8th in the World Championships in centrefire pistol. His most successful period this year has been at the Commonwealth Games, where he won the gold medal in the free pistol pairs and a silver medal in the centrefire pistol pairs and another silver in centre fire pistol individual event. Phil is from the Forbes RSL Pistol Club and was nominated by the NSW Amateur Pistol Association.

The presentation was made on behalf of the NSW Shooting Association by Mr Arthur Tunstall, our Chef de Mission to the 1994 Commonwealth Games.

In addition to the Shooting Sportsman of the Year awards, the General Manager of the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, Mr Paul Andrews, presented a special award – 'Firearms Safety Officer of the Year' to Laurie Shaw of the NSW Field and Game Association, Dubbo Branch. The award was in recognition of his outstanding performance as a safety officer and for his overall contribution to the sport. Laurie has personally conducted over 300 safety tests and has been an extremely strong supporter of the firearms safety scheme and the sport in general.

All target shooting disciplines and the hunting organisations in the NSW Shooting Association were well represented and treated to an excellent dinner and top class entertainment during the evening.

Both Labor's Bob Carr and Liberal Senator Michael Baume made speeches at the time of their presentation of medals to the winners and pointed out the valuable role that shooters can play in the control of feral animals in our environment.

The President of the NSW Shooting Association, Mr Alex Comino said this event was important not only to recognise our current champions and outstanding achievers, but also to encourage other shooters to get involved, particularly at higher competition levels of the sport. This is one way to ensure we will have world class competitors for the 2000 Olympics and beyond.

NSW Clay Target Association

Bronze medallist for the Clay Target Association is Clive Barton from the Tamworth Clay Target Club. Clive has specialised in skeet events, having won the 1993 Junior National Skeet Championship. He was a member of the team which won the teams match and was the overall junior winner of the Commonwealth Skeet Championship. He was selected to attend the World Skeet Championships in Texas, USA and finished 7th overall in a field of 800. In 1994 he was the winner of the Coca Cola Skeet Championship and 7th qualifier for the NSW State Skeet Team. In the 1994 ISU State Skeet Championships he was the open overall winner and won selection to the State team. In the National ISU Championships this year he was the runner-up in the Commonwealth ISU Skeet Championship. He finished 4th overall over a four day competition and earned a reserve place for the Commonwealth Games team and the World Championship team. Although not placed in the World Cup in Beijing, he did finish ahead of all other Australian team members.

The NSW Clay Target Association's silver medallist is Les Chant from the Albury-Wodonga Clay Target Club. Les was the NSW State Junior Champion in down the line trap shooting in 1993, but has reached even greater heights in 1994. He won the Tasmanian State Junior Trap Championship and was the overall State Junior High Gun winner. He also won the 1994 South Australian Junior Trap Championship and he was a member of the team which won the Commonwealth Postal Teams Match. At international level this year he won the New Zealand Junior National Championship, making a clean sweep of the major awards. In England he was the winner of the Junior English Handicap event and his most outstanding success this year was winning the inaugural World Junior Down the Line Clay Target Championship in Wales.

The nominee is Mr Fred Schmetzer, an Accredited Level 2 Coach and the New South Wales Coaching Director.


This award is not connected with our own ACTA Coach of the Year, conducted for the first time this year.

The NSW Junior Masters was shot in conjunction with the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Point Score with Heath Saunders winning the 3 events.



Brisbane Gun Club

Col Wheatley an active committee member and a past president of the Brisbane Gun Club has returned from a brief sojourn in Normandy and the UK. He and his wife attended the D-Day commemoration ceremonies, thus reviving 50 year old memories and friendships.

Although he has revisited the UK several times since World War II, he had not made it to Normandy, of which he had many a birds-eye view during the summer of 1944.

Col flew as an air gunner in Lancaster with 46th squadron RAAF, a unit of RAF Bomber Command in those days, and as such took part in the mammoth pre-landing aerial bombardment on D-Day involving about 1,000 heavy bombers and 5,000 tonnes of bombs between midnight and dawn. The object of this attention was the numerous coastal gun batteries covering the invasion beaches.

While this exercise was only partially successful, it played its part in the overall scheme. Bomber command role was normally confined to smashing large industrial installations and railway marshalling yards etc. not pin-point bombing of gun batteries at night. However, on this important occasion it was a case of all hands on deck and owing to the many and varied deception measures put into place to divert enemy attention away from Normandy, the operation was a complete surprise with very little resistance being encountered.

Col said the various ceremonies held in France as well as in England were superbly organised, even though the influx of tens of thousands of visitors and vehicles created some unavoidable problems. He thought the most moving part of all was the genuine gratitude displayed by the French people who greeted their former 'liberators' with uncharacteristic warmth.

Following the Normandy visit, Col spent several weeks in England renewing contact with an old air crew member, an avid



fly fisherman. He did not get to break any targets over there, but on his return made up for this at the club where he is a keen competitor.

After the war, Col worked in the Bureau of Meteorology in Brisbane and completed a degree in economics at the University of Queensland. He then joined the Department of Industrial Development and retired from a senior position in that department.

Col now enjoys an active retired life, travelling, fishing and shooting.

Australia to become a party to the Council of Europe Anti-Doping Convention

Australia will become the first non-European country to become a party to the Council of Europe Anti-Doping Convention on the use of drugs in sport.

The Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA) was invited to join the convention because of its position as an acknowledged leader in the international fight against drugs in sport.

The decision to join the convention was announced by the Acting Minister for Foreign Affairs, Senator Bob McMullan, and the Minster for the Environment, Sport and Territories, Senator John Faulker.

The convention is recognised for being one of the best existing government instruments for co-ordinating international efforts to combat the use of drugs in sport. Signing the convention signals Australia's continuing commitment to this cause, and will enable Australia to maintain its leadership role in the leadup to the Sydney Olympic Games.

The Council of Europe, which is the largest inter-government political organisation in Europe, involves 32 European countries and has its headquarters in Strasbourg, France. Members of the Anti-Doping Convention include a number of leading Olympic countries such as Germany, France, Italy, Spain and the United Kingdom.

The convention obliges countries to:

- conduct competition and out of competition drug testing
- establish an accredited drug testing laboratory
- implement education programs and information campaigns
- negotiate agreements with organisations from other countries to test each other's athletes
- adopt appropriate legislation or regulations to restrict the availability and use of banned drugs.

The WACTA State Team Elimination Carnival was held the long weekend 1st-3rd October at the International Shooting Complex at Whiteman Park.


The Tournament Director, Geoff Faulkes, had his team well trained and the only thing left to chance was the weather.


Event Four the 50t State Skeet Championship returned only one possible 50/50 and Bob Benjamin left his gun in the rack





Winchester announce a prize increase for the 1995 'Top Gun' awards

Winchester Australia have released details of their 1995 'Top Gun' awards scheme with some major award increases.

In 1995 the Overall Top Gun' of the year will receive a Beretta 682 shotgun as well as 10 cases of the target loads of his or her choice. Top Gun' of the year winners in Ladies, Junior and for the first time Veterans will each receive 2,500 shotshells.


Skeet shooters will be pleased to note that all two day Skeet Carnivals from January 1st will be covered under the awards. In the UIT disciplines each State Double Trap Championship receive prize increases for overall, grade winners, ladies and juniors.

One area that we have had to restructure the award scheme is for breaks. In Skeet we have reduced the break required for a bonus case of shotshells to 250 and 400 for two cases. In DTL the break has needed to be increased to 350 for one case and 600 for two. The reason for this is simply that the ACTA has now adopted a policy of setting traps with a preferred distance of 48 metres and angles parallel to lanes 1 and 5, therefore breaks of 300 and even 500 have become commonplace and to keep a balance in the award scheme a slight increase has been deemed to be necessary.

In 1995 a total of well over 250,000 shotshells are on offer, as well as two Beretta 682 shotguns. We have tried to reach an equal balance amongst all Winchester shotshells users, but as always we encourage constructive criticism.

As you would have noted this year's special bonus offer to all our 1995 'Top Gun' entrants is a pair of 'Peltor Shotgunners' earmuffs. These have been specially developed for clay target shooters and have a very low profile. They are on offer well below their retail value.

The awards commence on January 1st and a new registration form must be completed and returned by all entrants before an award can be claimed. No registration will be taken after February 28th. Please read the conditions of entry carefully and good luck to all participants.







Guidelines for the importation of firearms into Western Australia from interstate

All firearms including air rifles are subject to strict licensing and control in this state. Every firearm must be registered or licensed to a person or an approved organisation.

Where firearms are being brought into Western Australia by interstate visitors or intending residents, the firearms must be surrendered to the first available Police Station at the point of entry or nearest their place of residence when firearms arrive in personal belongings arriving at a different time.

Visitors to the state wishing to carry the firearms whilst travelling through the state may make application for a temporary permit to possess and carry the firearm only. Such permit does not allow the firearm to be used under any circumstances. A temporary permit for firearms considered low powered can be issued at the station when the application is made, providing the applicant satisfies the requirements for the issue of a permit.

Application for concealable firearms and those considered high powered can only be approved by a commissioned officer of the Police Force or this office.

Temporary permits cannot be issued for prohibited firearms and such firearms are seized and held by Police until arrangements are made to return the firearm to the state of origin or to a place where such firearms can be licensed. Temporary permits can be issued for a maximum period of three months and renewed for a further three months for a particular firearm in any twelve month period. The current fee for the permits is \$4.00 per month or part thereof.

To qualify to obtain a license or permit, the applicant must satisfy the Commissioner of Police or his delegated officer that:-

- a) the issue of a license or permit would not be contrary to the public interest,
- b) the person is a fit and proper person to hold a firearm license; and
- c) the person has a good reason for requiring and possessing the firearm to which the application relates.

Members of approved firearm clubs or organisations and farmers reasonably requiring the firearm for the purpose of destroying vermin on land used by them for agriculture are deemed to have a good reason for requiring specific firearms.

Firearm club members must be financial and active members in accordance with the Constitution of the particular club. There are several types of firearm clubs in this state which adequately cater for the needs of most firearm enthusiasts.

Persons other than members of firearm clubs and farmers making application for a firearm license must provide letters of authority to use the firearm on land for the purpose of vermin destruction. The firearm would then, by necessity, be one which would effectively and humanely destroy the nominated vermin present on the property.

There is no land in this state where a firearm can be used without the express or implied consent of the owner or person in charge of the land.

A person may license more than one firearm, however, they must show good reason for requiring each and every firearm and the onus is on the applicant to demonstrate a good reason.

Self protection is not considered a good reason for requiring a firearm.

For the purpose of licensing, firearms are divided into four categories, namely, concealable, low powered, high powered and curio.

Concealable firearms have very strict licensing and control conditions and are generally only issued to members of approved firearm clubs and the use is restricted to club ranges only. Any other application is considered on the merits of the case provided by the applicant.

Low powered firearms are those considered for use on small game and vermin and include air rifles, .22 calibre rifles and shotguns.

High powered firearms are those considered suitable for destruction of medium and large animals. Licensing of these firearms is restricted to use on suitable properties with vermin of a type requiring the particular firearm for humane destruction.

Curio firearms are divided into three categories and relate to firearms manufactured before the year 1900; firearms for which ammunition is no longer commercially available; and those considered to be collectors items, or having special sentimental value to the owners.

A firearm licensed as a curio cannot be used or carried under any circumstances and the license is only to possess the firearms.

To qualify to license a firearm as a collectors item, the owner must demonstrate that he is a collector of particular type of firearms and the particular item is a collectors item to him personally. Providing that the owner can satisfy the Commissioner of Police of that requirement, consideration will be given to licensing the firearm as a collectors item whilst it is in that person's possession.

To qualify to license a firearm on the grounds of special sentimental value, the owner must provide a history of the firearm and demonstrate the sentimental significance of the firearm to the owner personally. Providing that the owner can satisfy the Commissioner of Police of that requirement, consideration will be given to licensing the firearm as a curlo whilst in that person's possession.

Persons visiting the state for short periods from interstate are not encouraged to bring firearms into the state as they would find it difficult to qualify to obtain a license due to the time factor.

Interstate competitors involved in organised international firearm competition can obtain a temporary permit for the duration of their visit by providing support letters from the organisers of the competition or their home clubs.

Interstate group permits are available to visitors, providing that their home club makes a written application to this office and provides details of the competing members (name, address, the day or days of the competition, and the occasion). These permits can be issued for a period not exceeding twentyeight (28) days.

All applications, except Interstate Group Permits, for firearm licenses and permits must be made personally and the firearms are to be inspected by Police prior to a license or permit being issued.

Failure to obtain a license or permit for possession of a firearm is an offence and the firearm could be subject to forfeiture to the Crown.

Prohibited firearms which cannot be licensed are those which are not pistols, that are centre fire, semi-automatic which have or are capable of having a bulk loading capacity of eight (8) or more rounds of ammunition, or those firearms considered to be firearms closely resembling the preceding description or military type firearms.

When the owner of a firearm has any doubt as to the classification of a particular firearm and time permits, he should write to the Officer in Charge, Firearms Branch, 210 Adelaide Terrace, East Perth, WA 6004, giving full details of his firearms so that further assistance may be given, or phone (09) 222 1203.


Many shooters camped at the grounds and turned up for a hearty breakfast on Saturday and Sunday mornings.




A most successful Bullseye Firearms Phil Becker Memorial Shoot was held on Saturday 16th October. A large field of 45 shooters took part in the competition.




