





14th Australian Police Trap & Skeet Championships

Taree-Wingham Gun Club October 1994

Victorian State Trap Carnival — 1994

Echuca Gun Club was the venue, the weather generally was kind to the shooters, and some outstanding performances made the 1994 Trap Carnival one to be remembered. As usual Club President Ron Traill and his crew had the grounds in top shape for the three days of shooting.

Event 1. State Handicap

Conditions were good as the first event got underway. Entries totalled 157, with four possibles after the 50 targets. The shoot off went just 17 targets, Wayne Parks from Wonthaggi off 20 metres beating David Flavel Jeparit also 20 metres, third place David Hagarty Brewarrina NSW, fourth Glen Beer Deniliquin and fifth Bill Iles Melbourne. Local girl Joanne Kerr took the Women's section, Ashley Bolwell Toolondo the Juniors, and Frank James Kerang the Veterans.

Event 2. State Double Rise Championship

This was won outright in fine style by Roger Duthie from Hamilton with 49/50. Steve Haberman Geelong 47/50 took AA grade first, Jon Whittaker Echuca 2nd AA 66/70, Bill Iles Melbourne third AA 65/70. Phillip Down Nepean topped the A graders with 46/50, Steve Rigney Boort second A grade 45/50, and Ron Traill Echuca third A grade 41/50. The major trophy in B grade went to Rod Williams Melbourne 43/50, second B grade Kane Sing Echuca 41/50, third B grade Ben McGaw Foster 39/50. Conrad Robb Echuca 41/50 was C grade first, Robert Aird Cohuna 33/50 second, and David Hallam Hopetoun 31/50 third. George Smith Cohuna was top Veteran 39/50, Phillip Down Nepean doubled up by being the top Junior with 46/50, and Leonle-Young Peters Newcastle NSW took the Womens section with 39/50.

Event 3. State Double Barrel Championship

Entries numbered 206 in the Big One. After the 50 targets, 28 shooters lined up for the shoot off. A further 60 targets saw 9 shooters still shooting. At 170 we were down to 5, who seemed to settle down for a long afternoon. Paul Ryland missed at target 238, leaving Bill Iles, Arthur Turner, Glen Hayden and Jason Jolly to fight it out. Bill departed along with target 351, Jason Jolly let 418 get the better of him, and seven targets later Arthur Turner missed, Glen Hayden shot his, becoming the Victorian Double Barrel Champion for 1994 with the excellent score of 425/425. In the grades Arthur Turner Warren NSW with 424/425, was first in AA, Jason Jolly Sebastopol 417/418 second, and Bill Iles Melbourne 350/351 third. A grade first went to Bruce Hooper Echuca 72/73, second Ossie Hayek Colbinabbin 71/72, and third Barney Rooke Wagga NSW 64/65. In B grade Peter Keeley Frankston Australian beat the field with 62/63, second John Kelly Echuca 60/63, and third Mohammed Hayek Colbinabbin 55/57. C grade first was Robert Kemp Deniliquin 46/50, second Matthew Johnson Maryborough 47/52, and third Conrad Robb Echuca 46/52. The Veterans section was won by Barney Rooke Wagga 50/50, Juniors Justin Waldron Echuca 50/50, and Womens Faye Burton Deniliquin 48/51.

Event 4. State Single Barrel Championship

Glen Hayden completed a great second day of the carnival by also winning the Single Barrel Championship. His was the only clean score, a top performance after the concentration needed to shoot 425 straight to win the Double Barrel Championship. Joe Attard Morwell 62/63 took AA grade first, Mark McInnes Narrabri NSW 61/63 second, and Ron Glenn Deniliquin 55/57 third. Junior Craig Henwood Melbourne with the good score of 49/50 was first in A grade, second Steve Landsborough Maryborough 56/58, and third Bill Perks Melbourne 55/58. Geoff Cameron Deniliquin 49/54 took first in B grade, Joanne Kerr Echuca 48/54 second, and Col Sanders Wangaratta 45/50 third. The C graders were led by Phil Smith Deniliquin 43/50, second Matthew Johnson Maryborough 42/50, and third Robert Aird Cohuna 42/50. The Veterans section saw Col Sanders Wangaratta win with 45/50, Juniors Craig Henwood Melbourne 49/50, and Women Joanne Kerr Echuca 46/50. 191 shooters had competed in the Single Barrel Championship.

Event 5. State Pointscore Championship

Of the 181 entries, only Tony Plum of Benalla shot the lot single barrel, to win with 150/150. In the grades Roger Duthie Hamilton 209/210 was first in AA, second Barry Humphrys Melbourne 208/210, and third Chris Carrol Cerberus 175/177. A grade first went to Ray Peatling Cohuna 148/150, second was Wayne Barry Melbourne 159/162, and third Ossie Hayek Colbinabbin 158/162. Evergreen Frank James Kerang 152/156 beat the B graders, second Justin Dale Albury 151/156, and third Luke Cassells Maryborough 144/150. C grade first was won by Kane Shepherd Maryborough 137/150, second Leigh Wilkinson Wonthaggi 136/150, and third Paul Kirley Mansfield 130/150. Frank James Kerang also took out the Veterans section with 146/150, Justin Waldron Echuca the Juniors 148/150, and Faye Burton Deniliquin the Womens 141/150.




Day 2 High Gun was won by D. Beelitz with 113/113.




B Grade High Gun winner M. Booker, with President P. Rundle.




A Grade and Overall High Gun winner D. Beelitz, with President P. Rundle.

Level 1 Accreditation Course

SA GUN CLUB - 16-17 DEC '94

With his appointment as South Australian Coaching Director fresh in his mind, Mr Phil Mules, decided the time was right to take a fresh look at coaches in his state.

Due to one reason or another, coaching programs and accreditation courses had lapsed in recent times. Phil despatched a letter to all South Australian clubs requesting 'expressions of interest' for individuals with 'club support' to undertake level 1. The resulting replies were overwhelming, as some 18 people were nominated to undertake coaching accreditation.

After several long phonecalls and much planning, the course was programmed for 16th and 17th December 1994. The National Director of Coaching, Mr Murray Alexander would be in attendance and undertake several presentations supported by SA Coaching Director, Mr Phil Mules and John Ellis, recently retired SA State Coaching Director.

The course was programmed close to years end so that momentum generated by Phil would not be lost, with the first component of the course being held the Friday evening at the South Australian Gun Club.

Attending were 15 eager new coaches, including 1 female, several already accredited coaches, the SA Coaching Director, National Director of Coaching and the SA Coaching Co-ordinator. Also in attendance was the WA State Coaching Co-ordinator, who had taken the opportunity to sit in on the course to observe how another state conducted accreditation programs.

Friday evening at 7pm, the course got under way, but not before that 'Murphy' character slipped in and tried to jinx the overhead projector. However the problem was quickly solved and the course began.

The course introduction was explained by the National Director of Coaching and an overview given of what lay ahead within the program given.

Following this introduction, Murray then moved into the role of the coach, explaining the 'who's and why's' of coaching.

After a short break, the SA State Coach, Mr Phil Mules then presented a component on program planning and goal setting. Shortly after 10pm the evenings proceedings were halted and a short socialising time taken.

Saturday morning at 9am, the next component began with the National Director of Coaching delivering the sports psychology section. After a short break, Mr John Ellis stepped in to present the communication skills component followed by Phil Mules and Murray Alexander on characteristics of a shotgun. The last section was expanded and a lesson on gun fit was included.

With the lunch break concluded, a 'hands on' run down on the basics of shotgun shooting was conducted out on the skeet and DTL layouts. As this section concluded, the budding coaches separated into their already announced groups for two practical coaching scenarios.

Each group was further halved with one half to do the practical coaching of a novice shooter and the other half to be observers of that coaching. One group was despatched to the DTL layouts and the other to the skeet and then the practical component began. At the completion of the allotted time, all moved back to the club rooms to present their findings. Each practical coaching group had elected a spokesperson and they presented what they had attempted to do. The observers had likewise appointed spokespersons who then presented their observations. To gain another view point, the novice shooters were then asked for their comments.

The discussion that followed from the given scenario enabled all to see coaching from different angles and hear what others saw, felt and heard.

To conclude the weekend course, a discussion was held, giving those assembled the opportunity to discuss the program. The assembled coaches were given assignments from the level 1 work book and after final instructions on the years program including the appointment by their state coach, supervising coaches to assist them during the required 30 hours or practical coaching.

The South Australian Clay Target Association must be thanked for supporting this accreditation program, the South Australian Gun Club, for the use of their facilities and the personal efforts of the South Australian Coaching Director, Mr Phil Mules.

In closing, it is my observation that South Australia has begun a revitalisation of it's coaches and if the observed enthusiasm is an indication, then a new generation of coaches has arrived.



Only Tasmania does not have these reciprocal rights.

How many times do we hear 'it doesn't matter how I present material to our local media, our club still cannot get coverage' -I guess anyone who has filled the position of publicity officer for their club can relate to just that. 


The citation for the degree was for the outstanding contributions and service to the science of astronomy.

Caboolture News MARTIN GOUGH MEMORIAL SHOOT NOVEMBER 1994



ASDA calls on FINA to increase out of competition testing

The Australian Sports Drug Agency (ASDA), recognised internationally as having one of the leading anti-doping programs, has called on FINA (the International Swimming Federation) to implement on a large scale year round unannounced out of competition drug testing.

ASDA's call is timely as the innuendo and finger pointing continues at the World Swimming Championships in Rome.

Chief Executive of ASDA Steve Haynes says the high reputation of swimming is being damaged and clearly FINA needs to show leadership in dealing with the drug accusations.

"Finger pointing and innuendo are not going to solve the problem. What ASDA's anti-doping program has shown is that out of competition testing is clearly an effective way of deterring drug use."

"Australia's elite athletes can be drug tested at anytime throughout the year. Last year 55% of the 2,802 drug tests conducted by ASDA were out of competition tests."

While ASDA has urged FINA to increase out of competition testing Haynes says that ASDA would be more than pleased to host any overseas country who wished to visit Australia and learn from its anti-doping program.

Already this year ASDA has hosted a visit from the Chinese Anti-Doping Commission. A return visit by ASDA is planned to take place.

"If we can extend our anti-doping program to other countries and show what can be achieved then hopefully this will lead to fairer competition for everyone."

"In the end we must all strive to achieve the level playing field."
