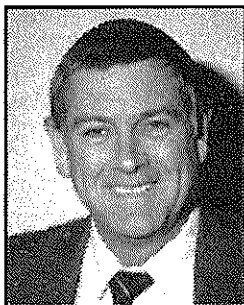

National Ground

The Executive are continuing their inquiries into the establishment of a National Ground, and the feasibility of such a venture.

There is no doubt that such a proposal has been around since the ACTA was formed and the arguments are many, for and against, but one thing is certain ... if such a venture is to become a reality, the time to start the venture is now.

With the cancellation of this years duck seasons and the continual push for the abolition of blood sports, more and more firearm owners will turn to the clay target sports for recreation and we must put our hand up to gain as many of these shooters as members of our association as we can.

The fact of the above paragraph is that governments, both state and federal, are at present open to funding possible alternatives to blood sports. Another factor in the establishment of a National Clay Target Ground is the Sydney Olympics.

Many people argue that it is great to be able to visit a different venue each year. Just as many claim that the competition is the principal concern, not the tourism. Our major sponsors support the establishment of a National Ground, so the debate goes on ... but it still remains the goal of any sporting body to have their own National venue.

History

In my notes last month I quoted extracts from a copy of the 1992 Victorian Gun Club's Annual Calendar and it certainly aroused interest among some of our shooters. I was asked if there were other inclusions worth noting, and there most certainly is.

There is a list of some 20 shooters listed as 'Breaking Shooting Rules'. The offences listed included: misrepresentation, wagers, money owing, obscene language and all those listed were 'suspended until such time as clearance is granted by the Council'. Hard times ...

Australasian-Pacific 'GRAND PRIX' a resounding success!

Conducted on one of Australia's best Olympic Discipline clay target shooting facilities, under some of the most testing of weather conditions, the inaugural Australasian-Pacific 'GRAND PRIX' held between 8th and 13th March, at Brisbane Gun Club, has been claimed as an outstanding success, and amongst the best ever ISU competitions conducted in Australia.

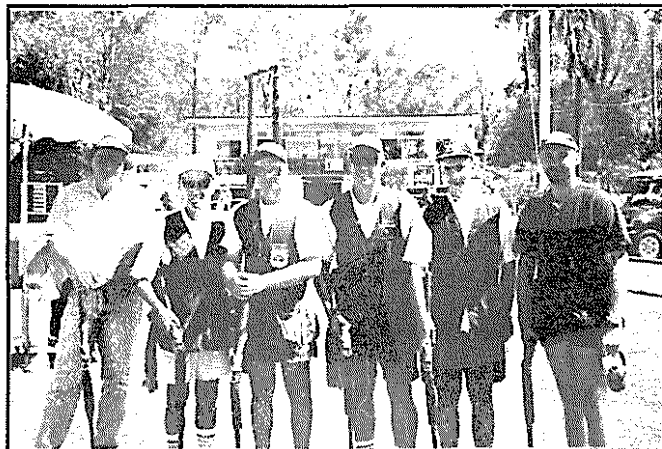
The Organising Committee were extremely fortunate to have received sponsorship for the tournament from Winchester Australia, the Fuller Firearms Group and Austral Gun Company, all of whose assistance was greatly appreciated and helped towards the overall success of this international flavoured competition.

The Organising Committee itself was a real mix of experience and enthusiasm. Chaired by Brisbane Gun Club President, Dan Moffitt, and with David Menck as Secretary, in charge of organisation and promotion, the depth supplied by the Tournament Director Jim Kelly and Greg Newey, Brian Prosser co-ordinating the skeet and Peter Stein running the Olympic Trap, and Ed Connell in the office, the 'GRAND PRIX' was always going to be the success that it turned out to be, especially given the help of so many other Brisbane Gun Club people.

Brisbane Gun Club grounds were presented in immaculate condition following recent seasonal rain, and if the weather on the dawning of the practice day was any indication, the following five days would make for a very memorable competition. Not a cloud in the sky, but as the days rolled on, the humidity often evident in Brisbane at this time of year became another factor that the shooters at the 'GRAND PRIX' tournament would have to contend with.

For some, including Dr Suphamit Chittayasothorn, from Thailand, and the delegation from New Caledonia, headed by Bourail Gun Club President Eugene Hernu, practice had started a few days earlier, even though there had been quite a few problems getting our visitors guns through Australian Customs. Tournament Director Jim Kelly, spent many hours trying to organise gun permits.

The weather didn't let us down – day one of the 'GRAND PRIX' tournament was sunny, but the humidity was in the high 80s. However, it was the same for everyone, not easy conditions for some of our interstate visitors, especially those from Melbourne, and country areas with colder climates, like Canberra.

At starting time we were honoured by the presence of Mr Alastair MacPherson, President of the Australian Shooting Association, who accompanied by Brisbane Gun Club President, Dan Moffitt and the Organising Committee, performed the Official Opening of the Inaugural 'GRAND PRIX'. Mr MacPherson spoke briefly about the direction in which the shooting sports are heading, and offered encouraging words to those keen to pursue their involvement in Olympic Discipline clay target shooting.

The first series of events on the 'GRAND PRIX' program, were the Pacific Coast Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet Championships. Competitors from all mainland states (except SA) and visitors from New Caledonia, Thailand and New Zealand, had entered what was assured of being a memorable competition.

The first round of the Pacific Coast Olympic Trap Championship saw a few surprises, with current World Double Trap Champion, Russell Mark of Sebastopol Gun Club in Victoria, carding the only perfect 25/25 of the round. Former Kiwi, Brant Woodward of Illawarra recorded 24/25, as did Queensland State Team Member Angelo Zappala of Burdekin. 23s were also scarce, with Adam Vella of Frankston, Kevin Perkins of Illawarra and former World No. 2, Jim Ellis of Canberra, remaining ahead of John Gilopidis, Greg Newey, David Menck and Peter Stein who were the only 22s.

Round 2 of the Olympic Trap Championship saw little change, Brant Woodward carded a 25 to take the lead from Russell Mark on 48/50. 'Perko' and Jim Ellis were next on 47/50, and the next 50 positions were anyone's guess.

The third and final round on day one finished with Russell Mark once again taking the lead from Brant Woodward, with Kevin Perkins 'hanging in'.

Top junior at the end of the first day was Damien Webster of Crookwell, with Lorraine Lloyd of Sydney heading the Ladies

section, and Cam McClymont leading the way in the Veteran's section. The top international competitor at this point, was Laurie Coppins of New Zealand.

At the other end of the Brisbane Gun Club complex, the Pacific Coast ISU Skeet Championship was also well under way, with former NSW Champion, now Sunshine Coast resident, Brian Prosser heading the field on 68/75, one target ahead of Australian representative Clive Barton of Tamworth, and Eugene Hernu of New Caledonia. Junior, George Barton of Tamworth was 'sitting pretty' only two targets further back on 65/75.

After a further 50 targets, Brian Prosser maintained his lead going into the final, but after another 25 and a 'station-by-station' shoot off, Clive Barton emerged the victor to take the first Gold Medal of the tournament.

Local club member Kel Madsen took A grade honours from Len Norman. B grade went to Eugene Hernu from fellow New Caledonian Eric Louet, and Dr Suphamit Chittayasothorn from Thailand. C grade winner was Bruce Cosgrove of Canberra.

The second day of the Pacific Coast Trap Championship saw Russell Mark and Brant Woodward continue their good form to go into the 'final' equal on 116/125, with Adam Vella and Ken Stevens on 111/125, Kevin Perkins on 110/125 and Frank Vella on 109/125 making up the top six.

Russell Mark emerged the overall winner recording a 23/25 to leave Brant Woodward with the silver medal only one target behind.

After two days of hot humid weather, the temperature dropped slightly for the big event, but the wind picked up, making many of the Olympic Trap targets very testing. Teams had now been nominated for both the trap and skeet events, with the Victorian team of Russell Mark, John Gilopidis and Jeff Tonna favoured in the Olympic Trap, and the Queensland team of Brian Prosser, Len Norman and Kel Madsen seen as the ones to beat in the ISU Skeet.

The Olympic Trap 'GRAND PRIX' started in brilliant sunshine with quite a stiff breeze making the targets interesting. No 25s were recorded in the first round. Greg Newey of Warwick and Steve Webb of New Zealand recorded the only 24s and the only two 23s went to Adam Vella and John Porter. 22s were also scarce with Kevin Perkins, Frank Vella and Glen Kable 'hanging in' on 22/25 after the first round.

Round 2 on the first day didn't see great improvement. Adam Vella added to his good 23/25 in the first round by shooting the only 25/25 of the round. There were no 24s and only three 23s — to Brant Woodward, Jeff Tonna and Russell Mark, who needed all the help he could get after his 'ordinary' 18 at the first visit.

The final round of the day saw 25s to Brant Woodward and Jeff Tonna, while Adam Vella and John Porter notched up the

only 24s. A real hard day at the office for most of the field of nearly 60 shooters.

The situation at the end of day one of the Australasian-Pacific Olympic Trap 'GRAND PRIX' - Adam Vella 72/75, John Porter, Steve Webb and Brant Woodward 68/75, Greg Newey 67/75 and Jeff Tonna 66/75.

The placings in the ISU Skeet were also being hotly contested. Eugene Hernu of New Caledonia lead the field on 66/75, from Clive Barton on 64/75 and Brian Prosser on 61/75. Kel Madsen, Junior George Barton and Ray Porter were in contention to make up the final six with 50 targets to go.

And make the final they did. Eugene Hernu carried on his good work of the previous day to go into the final in first spot on 108/125, 3 targets ahead of Clive Barton on 105/125 and Brian Prosser on 102/125.

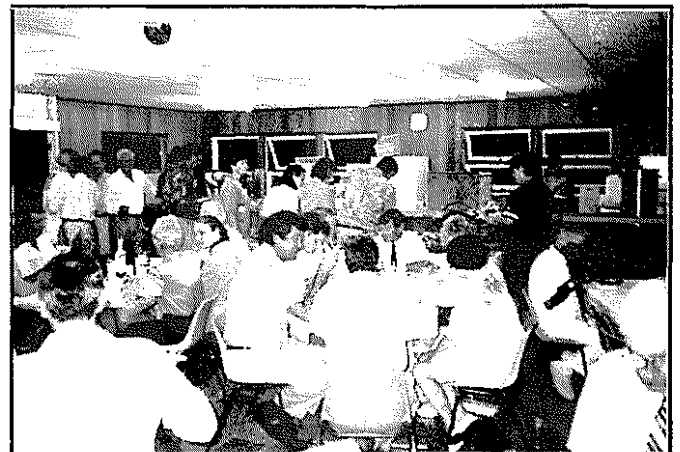

New perpetual Overall High Gun Trophies were also presented during the evening by the sponsor - Brisbane Gun Club President, Dan Moffitt. Winner of the ISU Skeet High Gun for the carnival was popular New Caledonian visitor, Eugene Hernu. The Olympic Trap High Gun was shared by Victorian Adam Vella and ex Kiwi, Brant Woodward from Illawarra.

A really great night, and without doubt the first of many such nights at future 'GRAND PRIX' tournaments. liott-Forster, who took the bronze hardware. A great teams event and obviously the forerunner of many great tussles to come in the future.

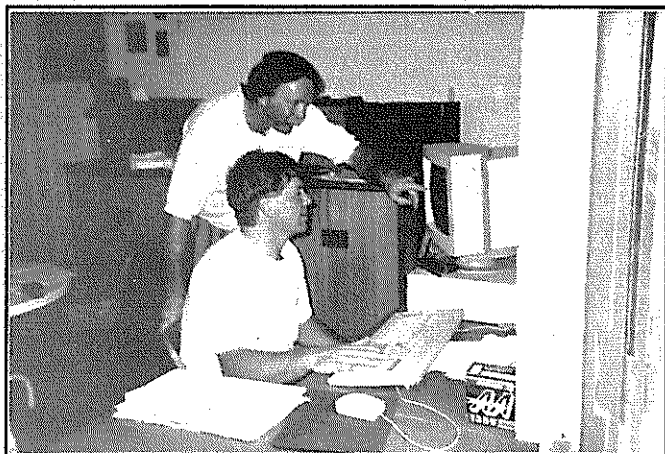

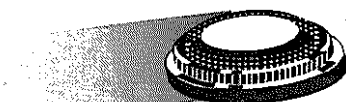

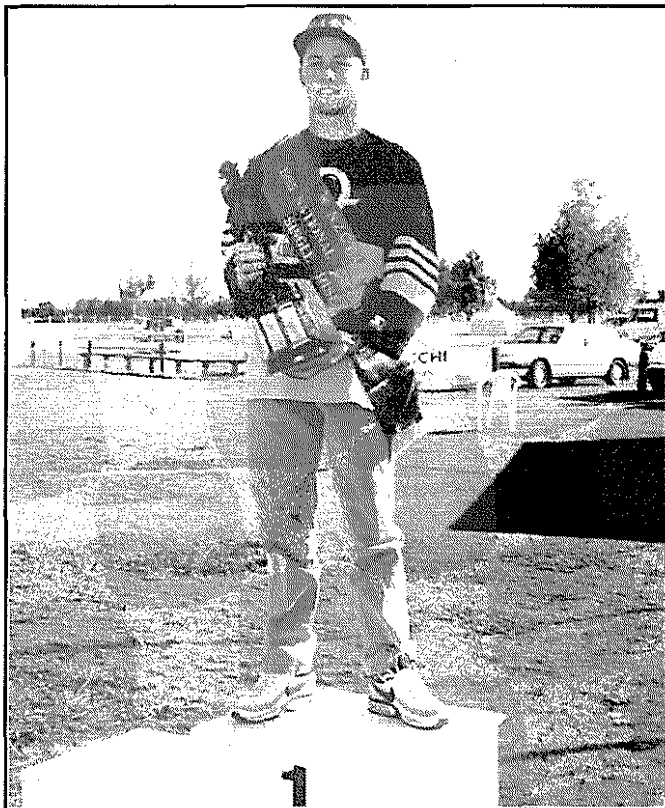

After being approached by the State Coach Fred Schmetzer, a 2 day coaching seminar was decided to be held for Trap and Skeet on 25th & 26th February 1995 on the club grounds at Cecil Park.

It was decided to hold Trap on the Saturday and Skeet on the Sunday, at the normal starting time of 10.00am

Saturday 25th February — Trap

Fred Schmetzer arrived at 9.00am and by 9.30am 12 shooters were in attendance for the first session. The shooters comprised of beginners, 'C', 'B' and 'A' graders and also Winchester Rep Howard Smith.

The seminar began precisely at 10.00am. Fred was introduced to all by Club President Dave McLeod.

Fred began the seminar with the theory behind clay target shooting. His first point being correct stance, followed by correct gun mounting, focusing on the target, then follow through and lastly gun fit and proper choke and shot size.

Fred presented his points on portable whiteboard which were informative and clear.

Fred then introduced a rag which appeared to resemble an Afghan's dirty loin cloth covered in red spots, but it turned out to be the choke pattern that his gun throws. He uses this as a demo for the theory part of his coaching seminars. This concluded the theory part of the session, so it was out and onto the tracks to put theory into practice.

The group was divided in two. Beginners, 'C' and 'B' graders in one, and 'A' and 'AA' in another. 'C' and 'B' graders went on to shoot 10 targets each, and Fred assisted them where possible. Gun fit, in most cases was obviously lacking, but these problems were able to be fixed. Then, the 'A' and 'AA' graders took to the tracks and while being filmed with a video camera, they shot their targets. Fred corrected a couple of problems, being stance and gun hold, and used the video later to spot any missed problems these shooters were having.

After lunch, a second session was run, with 25 shooters in attendance. Several DTL shooters were questioned of their benefit in attending a coaching seminar at Cecil Park Clay Target Club. All agreed that they will attend any other future coaching days.

Sunday 26th February — Skeet

Sunday 26th February was allocated for Skeet coaching with a 10.00am start. The morning session was attended by 14. These consisted of 'AA', 'A', 'B' and 'C' grade shooters, and even two lady shooters.

Fred began the theory of shooting, covering the basics of gun mount, stance, pattern, etc. After this there was a short question time from the floor which covered topics such as eye exercises, cartridge speed, shot size, mental attitude, etc. Then it was on to the stations.

Fred asked each individual to point out their problem stations, to which he offered possible solutions.

A second session was run after lunch and was attended by two shooters. Shooters were asked if they had gained from their coaching session with the State Coach. Several have since requested that Fred Schmetzer be asked to hold another coaching weekend sometime in the near future.

In conclusion, shooters who attended the coaching session at Cecil Park Clay Target Club seemed to have benefited from this experience. Hopefully this will be reflected in their scores.

We all look forward to the next time State Coach, Fred Schmetzer attends Cecil Park Clay Target Club.

Phil Britten from the Noorat Clay Target Club in Victoria used 1250 HA 7½s to win his first National Championship, the Single Barrel at the recent A.C.T.A. Trap Championships held at the Melbourne Gun Club. Phil receives 4,000 shotshells for his 58 straight to capture the title.

Another first time winner at the Nationals was Tasmanian lady shooter Cheryl Arnol, who captured the Overall Ladies High Gun as well as second in the ladies section of the Double Barrel. Cheryl takes home a bonus of 1,750 shotshells for her fine efforts.

Other significant winners at the National Carnival were Keith Mules from South Australia who earned 2,000 'Top Gun' target loads for his victories in the Veterans Single Barrel, Points and Overall High Gun. Glen Hayden also won 2,000 target loads for his second placing in the Double Barrel and a massive break of 748.

The National Trap Championships proved to be an outstanding success for Winchester users with six out of the seven major open titles going to Australia's leading target load manufacturer. It is always disappointing to see shooters win any of the events on offer, particularly in grade sections, with Winchester ammunition and then realise they have failed to join the 'Top Gun' award scheme. Many thousands of shotshells on offer this year at the Nationals could have been won if only a registration form was filled out prior to the event.

Particular mention must be made to two of Winchester's leading shooters in Michael Diamond and Russell Mark. Michael set a new record score for the National Double Barrel Championship with 749 straight and also collected the National Points and the Mackintosh Team High Gun. Russell became the first person to win the Grand Australian Handicap twice as well as the Overall High Gun for the week.

At the New Zealand Nationals earlier this month, Adrian Cousens established a new record in Skeet with a 479 break

as well as an earlier break of 341. Adrian also won the National Championship bringing his weeks total bonus shotshells to an impressive 5,000 rounds. Les Chant won 2,500 target loads for his Single Rise win and Roger Duthie 1,500 for his Mini Target victory, Jon Whittakers also won 1,500 shotshells for his second in the Single Rise and a 420 break.

1994 President's Report to the AGM

1994 will go down as perhaps the most successful year ever for our international competitors. Our achievements for the year were outstanding, and congratulations must go to the shooters who reached these heights on our behalf.

The year commenced with the successful staging of the Olympic Discipline Nationals at the Melbourne Gun Club. The Melbourne club and its members are to be congratulated for the presentation of their facilities, and it is now accepted as standard that the venue is so well presented.

March saw us heading to New Zealand with our trap team and what a trip it turned out to be. The efforts of Michael Diamond and Bill Iles became world wide news in trap circles, and I believe it will be many, many years before their records are broken or equalled.

The Brisbane Gun Club and the Queensland Clay Target Association were our hosts for the 1994 Nationals and accolades must go to them for once again, the event was of first class standard and despite a little intervention of storms, all ran smoothly.

Prior to our Trap Nationals we joined with the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia to stage the first Sporting Clays Nationals and despite a less than expected turnout by shooters, everyone agreed that it is an event to continue. The relationship formed with the SSAA can only be of major benefit to members of both organisations. It is expected that our second Nationals will be held in Victoria later in 1995.

Our 1994 Skeet Nationals were also held at the picturesque Melbourne Gun Club, and in fading light, Australia was victorious against our New Zealand friends in the Glenn Trophy. I believe the current rapport we have with New Zealand is essential to the shooting sports in the southern pacific and with the support of the New Zealand executive, ably led by George Ellis, this interaction will continue benefiting members of each organisation enormously.

It has often been said that the press is loathe to report favourably on the shooting sports, and it seems this may well have been the case in the Olympic Games of 1902. It took some 92 years for the recognition of the gold medal won by Donald Mackintosh to come to fruition. I was fortunate to be able to attend the Australian Olympic Committee dinner in Sydney and receive a presentation attesting to this great shooters achievements so long ago.

The first of our World Cup wins for 1994 came in the Double Trap in Milan, Italy. Steve Atkins, Steve Haberman and Russell Mark made up the team. Michael Diamond also put Australia in the medal winners with a bronze in the trap.

To the World Championships and for the year Russell Mark's two gold medals were outstanding, the World Cup final in the Double Trap has really stamped him the man to beat in Double Trap. Also in the World Championships a silver medal to Craig Tilley, Ben Kelley and Russell (on a countback) is worthy of mention.

On to the Commonwealth Games, and what was appearing to be disappointing for the clay target events, turned to smiles with the 'Grand Old Man' of skeet, Ian Hale, coming up gold. The honour bestowed on Ian on being selected as the flag bearer for Australia was another high point for Australia's shooters, and a fitting reward for Ian's dedication to the sport.

Our trip to the World Down the Line Championship in Wales was most successful. The team of Bill Iles, John Farrell, Denis

Lynn, Roger Duthie and Mark Crevatin were a credit to Australia, as both ambassadors for the sport, and as competitors. Their gold medal win was fantastic and their individual efforts great. 'Chippa' Chant firmly stamped himself as a future international with a runaway win in the junior section of these championships. His score of 890 was only six points behind the overall winner. A truly great effort.

The World Championship has been awarded to Australia to be conducted in 1997. As yet no venue or fixed date has been set, but it will be an event for all to attend.

During the year we had Jim Bitossi and Pud Burgess retire from the National Executive, and Mark Bulluss and Andy Sanders join us. To the two retiring gentlemen, we thank them sincerely for their time and contribution, and we welcome the two new members. Ammendments to UIT Rules

Effective as of 1st January, 1995

General Technical Rules for All Shooting Disciplines

2.8 Ear Protection:

All shooters and other persons in the immediate vicinity of the firing line are urged to wear ear plugs, ear muffs, or similar ear protection. **Ear protectors incorporating any type of electronic device are not permitted for shooters.**

3.17.5.3 Each range section must be capable of operating independently.

7.5.2.1 This **should** be done by the Chief Range Officer under the supervision of the Jury.

7.5.3 **The drawing of lots and the allocation to relays may be done under the supervision of the Technical Delegate(s) using a computer program designed to provide a random selection.**

Special Technical Rules for Final Competition in the Olympic Shooting Disciplines

1.0 The full program must be shot in each Olympic event according to UIT Special Technical Rules as a 'Qualification Round' for the finals. If there are more competitors than there are **firing points** available eliminations must be conducted according to UIT Rules before the Qualification Round (General and Special Technical Rules Section 7).

1.1 In the qualification events Rapid Fire Pistol, Sport Pistol, 10m Running Target, Trap, Double Trap and Skeet ties will not be broken according to General Technical Rules **12.2 if the first** three place winners tie. The classification for the first three places in the Qualification rounds will be made according to the rules set **down** for places 4 to 10 according to section 12 of the appropriate Special Technical Rule book. In cases of unbreakable ties the Jury shall decide by drawing lots.

1.1.1 Finalists in each event:

Trap, Double Trap and Skeet — 6 competitors.

Ties among two or more shooters have to be judged as places 4th through to 10th according to the Special Technical Rules valid for that particular discipline.

A drawing of lots by the Classification Jury will determine Final start positions:

- when several shooters obtain the maximum score in a qualification event,
- when an unbreakable tie occurs among two or more finalists, or
- when an unbreakable tie occurs among two or more shooters on the last Final start position (e.g. eighth and ninth place) to determine who will shoot in the Final.

1.2.1 All competitors in the Final will be given new start numbers **showing their** placing number, family name and Olympic abbreviation of the National Olympic Committee, which must be worn on the back above the waistline.

1.8.3.1.5 deleted

1.9.1 In case of an 'allowable' malfunction the shooter is allowed to complete or repeat the unfired shot(s) or series twice during the Finals, including shoot-offs, if he can repair or replace his gun or ammunition within 3 minutes after the malfunction has been declared 'allowable'. **In the case of a 'non-allowable' malfunction, no re-shoot is allowed.**

Special Technical Rules for Clay Target Shooting Trap, Double Trap, Skeet

2.8 Ear Protection:
