



National President's Notes



Release Trigger Guns

With a number of shooters now using release trigger guns I have been asked to point out that there are sections within our trap and skeet rules specific to release trigger guns.

Perhaps the rule causing most concern is Rule 4.14(b)(iii) which states, "All release trigger guns used by ACTA shooters and overseas visitors shall be clearly labelled 'RELEASE TRIGGER' –in a conspicuous place near the breech. Such labelling to be consistent, with 12mm width marking tape."

There are a number of shooters using release trigger guns with only the letter R marked on the bottom of the pistol grip. This clearly does not meet our rule requirement.

Sound Familiar?

Recently I was guest speaker at a sports dinner in the rooms of a hockey association. Pinned on the wall was a notice with the following words of wisdom ... "This Association has no set physical fitness program. Members get enough exercise running down the executive, jumping to conclusions, flying off the handle, knifing other members in the back, flogging dead horses, dodging responsibility and generally pushing their own barrow, that a fitness routine is totally unnecessary."

Points Scoring Procedure Change

As of the 1st July 1995, the method of scoring points events will change. A hit with the first barrel will still carry the value of 3 points, a hit with the second 2 points, and a miss will score zero. However the scoresheet will be marked 1 for a first barrel hit, 2 for a second barrel hit, 0 for a miss, and at the completion of the event the 1 will be converted to 3.

It may sound complicated, but in reality simplifies the process. The score sheet becomes much easier to read for all concerned and it eliminates the possibility of a 2 being read as a 3, or vice versa. It makes it much easier for scorers and office staff to total scores. A detailed explanation appears elsewhere in this months issue.

1995 National Trap Championships

The Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships for 1995 were hosted this year by the Victorian Clay Target Association and Melbourne Gun Club. The championships ran from Saturday 25 March to Friday 31 March and in line with the Victorian tradition, we experienced all four seasons during the Nationals.

SATURDAY 25 MARCH

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, teams representing each State and Territory competed for the prized Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the State Team in Open, Ladies and Junior divisions. After the success of having this event prior to the Opening Ceremony, this again proved popular, and helped create a fantastic atmosphere to open the championships.

There was a slight delay when a hot air balloon with a crate load of passengers 'ran out of gas ' and dropped in on the gun club grounds. After refuelling with the help of their support team and a bit of encouragement from Bob Buchan, the balloon took off and the shoot got under way.

The Open teams event was successfully won by the 'two blues', New South Wales, being represented by Mark McInnes (Capt), G. Thatcher, G. Kable, I. Merrick and C. Weaver. They only dropped one target to score 124/367 to win narrowly from Tasmania 123/365 with Victoria in third place 122/365.

The Ladies from New South Wales were successful in completing the double by winning the Ladies Team event. The team was lead by Janenne Kidd (Capt) with Leonie Young-Peters and Glenniss Lawrence shooting 69/75 to defeat South Australia 67/75 with Queensland third 66/75.

The Juniors event went to the team from the Northern Territory. Tony Padondonakis (Capt), Ari Syrimi and Chris Despotis scored 73/216 to defeat Victoria 72/209 and Western Australia 72/208.

It was great to see so many teams entered for the Shoulder to Shoulder State Teams event and congratulations to all states in turning out some very well dressed participants.

The Perpetual Trophy for the best presented team, which was judged by some of the New Zealand contingent in attendance was won again by South Australia who had donated the Trophy some years before.

A piper then lead all teams in a march past the crowd of spectators as Mr Glenn Woodhatch, National President welcomed everyone to Melbourne and introduced dignitaries present, Mr Robert Buchan, President Melbourne Gun Club, Mr Graham Mahoney, President Victorian Clay Target Association, Mr Peter McLellan MLA, Member for Frankston, representing the Minister for Sport, Recreation and Tourism and Mr Alan Mabey, President NZCTA.

The championships was then declared open by Mr McLellan MLA, who welcomed shooters from around Australia, a large contingent from New Zealand lead by Mr Alan Mabey, National President as well as shooters from America and Great Britain.

Mr McLellan, a keen shooter, then fired the opening shot under the watchful eye of National Director of Coaching, Murray Alexander and successfully hit the target.

Mr Graham Mahoney and Mr Bob Buchan issued last minute instructions to all shooters and the individual events were under way.

Grand Australian Handicap — 50t

The first event attracted 520 competitors including 18 from overseas. At the end of fifty targets ten possibles, which included three juniors, shot off for the Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge and the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy.

After an extra 25 targets P. Taylor, R. Mark and M. Italia were still in there to decide the winner. P. Taylor was the first to drop away missing his 78th target. M. Italia kept with R. Mark until his 91st target and with R. Mark hitting his successfully, won the Grand Australian Handicap event. Russell Mark became the first shooter to win the event twice having won it in 1993.



SUNDAY 26 MARCH

Australian Double Barrel Championship - 50t

Winchester Australia proudly sponsored this event and the ACTA is most grateful.

The Australian Double Barrel Championship over 50 targets was hotly contested. A total of 574 competitors nominated, of which 228 AA grade, 171 A grade, 116 B grade and 59 C grade. After 50 targets 92 shooters had not missed a target, and so the shoot off for the first prize began.

With 100t behind them 26 shooters remained in the contest. This was whittled down to 10 shooters after another 100t, including Nepean shooter Phillip Down. After 225 targets Steve Atkins, Roger Duthie, Michael Diamond, Phillip Down and Glen Hayden were vying for the championship. Roger Duthie missed his 246th target, and on his 278th target. Phillip Down, the only junior left in the event, missed his target. With sunset fast approaching Steve Atkins missed his 447th target to take Overail third place.

The shoot off continued into the next morning, with Michael Diamond and Glen Hayden going target for target. These two shooters in their early twenties continued through the morning until Glen Hayden missed his 749th target, leaving Michael Diamond as champion.



Womens Double Barrel Championship - 50t

This event was run in conjunction with the Open Double Barrel Championship and attracted 39 starters.

This was very keenly contested and eventually only Pauline Clark, Warracknabeal Vic shot the fifty straight to win the championship and receive the June Gawith Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge. A shoot off was required for second and third between Cheryl Arnol, Cressy Tas, and Nanette McCallum, Bothwell Tas. After an extra two targets, Cheryl Arnol was successful over Nanette McCallum.

Junior Double Barrel Championship - 50t

This was also run in conjunction with the Open event with 47 juniors vying for the title.

Nathan Cassells, Maryborough Vic shot 53/54 to finish in Overall third. Shane Pinner, Albury NSW shot 112/113 to be runner up to Phillip Down, Nepean Vic 277/278. Phillip received the Anthony Bradshaw Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge.

MONDAY 27 MARCH

Australian Single Barrel Championship - 50t

Ten shooters shot the possible 50, scoring 150 points and shot off for the Kable Smith Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Southern Cross Badge.

Michael Diamond NSWGC out shot everybody to win his second major event of the championships with a score of 309/309. Runner up from Sebastopol club was Russell Mark with 308/309, with one of our New Zealand friends, Ray Everett in third place 306/309.




The Womens High Gun was also a tie with Susanne Pay and Cheryl Arnol both having 286/300.




A Sub Junior division was included in 1995 with a Royal Blue Sash to be awarded to David Glenn of Deniliquin for his score of 370/475.



Winchester announce new 'Top Gun' awards

The major reason for the change is to make the ACTA DTL Nationals one of the last big events eligible for awards and therefore keep the 'Top Gun' of the year category wide open until the end of the shooting season.



Wombwell, M. Nash, D. Flavel, M. Dumesney all divided the cash.

When you describe individual achievements and name the person there is always someone who says "what about me?", but having said that I will go against the tide. One of the outstanding wins at this carnival was Jack Hughes of Sebastopol Gun Club who won B grade in the DB, with a score of 27/28. New method of recording Points Scores

On the 1st July, the method of recording points score events will change.

As of this date the scoresheets will be marked with a 1 for a hit with the first barrel, 2 for a hit with the second barrel and 0 for a miss. The referee will call "one" for a hit with the second barrel and "lost target" for a miss.

At the completion of the event, all '1s' will be multiplied by three and added to the '2s' to give the total.

All this may sound complicated, but in fact it will streamline the addition of the scores, it is easier to differentiate between 1s and 2s, rather than 3s and 2s, thereby making the task of adding the scores simpler for scorers and office staff. The new method being introduced is used in all other countries shooting points score, therefore we will not experience problems with visitors from overseas refereeing the event in the future, and likewise, visitors from Australia to these countries will not create confusion.

The only change needed in our rule book is to section 4.32(a), where the sentence 'These points scored will be called by the referee and scored by the scorer accordingly' will be removed. Added to the first sentence shall be, 'The referee will call "one" for a hit with the first barrel, "two" for a hit with the second barrel, or "lost" for a miss, the scorer marking the scoresheet as called. At the completion of the event all '1s' will be multiplied by 3, added to the '2s', which will give the total score.'

Below are two score sheets showing examples of both the old and the new. I am sure the majority will agree the new is much simpler.

Rule Changes

Effective July 1, 1995

As a result of the National Executive Committee meeting held in Melbourne during April the following rule changes have been ratified and will come into effect as of July 1, 1995. Please take note of these important changes, along with the points scoring rule change.

Rule 1.15 - Change to

During an event, a hit with the first barrel shall be called and marked as 1, a hit with the second barrel shall be called and marked as 2. A miss with both barrels shall be marked as 0. At the completion of the event the 1 shall be valued at 3 and be added to the 2s and 0s to give a total for the event.

Rule 1.8(i) — Add

when only the primer fires -or is missing.

Rule 1.27(c) — Add

When running Graded Sweeps/Cash Divide each grade monies to be divided between that grade.

ACTA/ISU Double Trap Grading Rule 3.28(b)(ii)

A shooter may be upgraded after 150 pairs, but must shoot 300 pair at a lower grade percentage to be downgraded.

ISU Teams Rule 3.29(b)(i) - Change

Ladies and Junior Teams to be 3 members.



City of Melbourne Skeet Championship - 75t





to bring/send their best handicap shooters to compete for this most prestigious shield.



ASDA completes crucial strategic planning for next three years

What is ASDA planning for next three years?

ASDA has recently completed its 1995-97 Strategic Plan. This plan sets out the direction and the major areas in which the Agency will be focusing during the next three years. The Strategic Plan was developed following extensive consultation with a broad range of people who represent sport including coaches, athletes, administrators, government and other support people such as doctors and sport trainers. The Strategic Plan sets out the Agency's Mission and the main areas in which ASDA needs to concentrate to ensure that the mission is achieved.

ASDA's mission is to ensure that Australian athletes are able to compete in sport which is free from banned doping practices.

To achieve this ASDA will focus on six broad areas. These are deterrence, education, international response, co-ordinated national response, client participation and improving the efficiency of the Agency's operations.

What does this mean for sport?

ASDA will continue to conduct an event and out of competition drug testing program. The Agency will endeavour to work more closely with national sporting organisations to ensure that testing is planned to achieve the maximum deterrence and to assist with the development of appropriate education and policy initiatives to support a testing program. This will include work with athletes, administrators and coaches. In addition the Agency will be increasingly involved with conducting both event and out of competition drug tests for international sport federations.

Testing at the international level will continue to be enhanced by ASDA's work in the international arena. ASDA will increase its work with international sporting federations, particularly with the sports of international concern to Australian athletes. The primary objective will be to encourage the implementation of more comprehensive out of competition testing programs.

As a party to several anti-doping agreements ASDA will continue to represent the interest of Australian athletes in its work with countries such as Norway, United Kingdom, Canada, New Zealand, France, China and the United States of America. ASDA will work with these countries with the aim of improving the international response to doping in sport including again advocating for more out of competition testing.

ASDA will continue to provide an information service including the Drugs in Sport Hotline, printed and audiovisual material relevant to drug testing procedures and drug use in sport. In addition, ASDA will continue to work with coaches, athletes and administrators to develop education initiatives that address concerns surrounding the use of drugs in sport. The Agency will continue to actively encourage input, in to plan-

ning and conducting its activities, from all of its clients through such mechanisms as the Athlete Advisory Group. ASDA will also continue to support teachers to provide drugs in sport education.

State based sports drug education units (SDEUs) will be maintained and extended to other centres with high performance athletes to ensure that ASDA has continual contact with the sporting community. SDEUs will also work closely with State/Territory Governments as they introduce Complementary Legislation. Complementary Legislation will enable testing to occur at the State/Territory level. SDEU project officers will play a major role in developing education programs for athletes, coaches and administrators who are affected by this.

To ensure that athletes are not disadvantaged between State/Territories ASDA will work with governments from all States and Territories to facilitate the developments of a National Drugs in Sport Framework. This framework will provide guidelines for a consistent response to DIS between all States. It will set out the roles and responsibilities of all parties involved and provide guidelines for education, policy and testing.

Finally the Agency will continue to liaise and work with peak sporting bodies such as the Australian Sports Commission, Australian Society of Sport Administrators, Australian Olympic Committee, Confederation of Australian Sport and Sports Medicine Australia.

Mildura Easter Carnival attracts good field



Achieving a career goal



The first step in introducing the modern shotgun sports of trap and skeet to truly international competition was taken at the recent Oceania Games in New Zealand.

I understand that this was as a direct result of action by the immediate past President of the NZCTA. Further I understand that the intention of this Association is to push for inclusion in the Commonwealth and eventually the Olympic Games. This is not the first time that such an attempt has been made, the USA has also made such moves.

That such a move has taken so long, considering the participant level in the activities, tends to reflect unfavourably on us all. Considering that all other sporting events at the Olympics cater for a wide variation in actual events eg. swimming, distance and stroke variation, athletics, etc., why then alongside the ISU discipline cannot trap and skeet be included. Just think of the thousands of shooters who would contest such selection.

However, before such a step is undertaken the games of trap and skeet must be brought in line with what is truly the international game. In skeet for example the distance that targets travel should be increased to that which is standard in the USA. In trap and I say this with some hesitation as I now do not shoot this discipline, the local game of double barrel would need replacing by single barrel or perhaps point score.

The NZ people are to be commended on their action in this matter and should be supported without reservation by the ACTA subject only to us adopting a truly international form of trap and skeet.

Shooting Clay Targets versus Golf

Shooting clay targets if often referred to as a 'noisy golf' in the U.S.A. An analysis of the two sports highlights aspects of technique common to both.

- Correct stance and address to the target area, be it clay target or a golf ball.
- b. The need for visual concentration on the target.
- c. The importance of a smooth swing to hit the target.

A major variation in similarity would be that the target (the ball) is stationary when struck by the golfer, while both the shooter and the target are in motion before the clay is broken.

The novice golfer is aided in his quest for improvement by a mountain of magazines, books and videos explaining every detail of the golf swing, technique and course tactics, all testimony to the popular image of this sport.

The novice clay target shooter is not so lucky when it comes to a reference suitable for Australian conditions.

My needs for such a reference have been satisfied by a concise manual 'Shooting the Clay Target' written by George Biggs. I can quickly look to this manual for assistance in the recognition of the many faults in technique that confront the average clay target shooter. I have seen many novices come and go during my brief period of participation in the sport, perhaps a reference as mentioned above would assist in building enough confidence in the new shooter to persevere with the sport.

Shooter wins senior Sports Star award

Shepparton dental prosthetist, Stephen Atkins has been named the 1994 Senior Sports Star.

The 33 year old Tongala trap shooter was a member of the three man Australian team which took out the gold medal in the teams event in the Olympic Double Trap world title in Italy in June.

The Australians defeated the United States by a single target with Atkins placing 18th individually.

Atkins, who lives in Tongala with his wife Helen and three young children, runs his business Aztec Dental Laboratory in Wyndham Street, Shepparton.

Atkins has been one of Australia's top trap shooters for a number of years and only last week returned from the World Cup in Peru where he and his two Australian Team mates collected a silver medal in the teams event while his 10th placing in the individual rankings earned him valuable bonus points which are vital for Olympic selection.

Forty-three countries contested the World Cup this year, however, this performance was not taken into account by the judges when selecting the senior sports star of 1994.


Shane Naylor, who last week won his fourth Australian 100m title, was judged on last years performances which included representing Australia at the Commonwealth Games in Victoria Canada where he was a member of the 4x100m relay team which collected a silver medal.

The 27 year old Tatura sprinter was announced the senior outstanding achiever in 1994.

Atkins and Naylor share many similarities as they battle to raise finance for interstate and overseas trips while trying to raise a young family.

On accepting the award, Atkins said the hardships of finding the money to compete internationally made life hard for Australian athletes.

"Shane would probably understand this". Atkins said, indicating the predominantly Tatura based table where Naylor, his family and friends sat.

"The Italians at the World Cup are paid \$80,000 Australian dollars a year each to train and compete" Atkins said.

"It's hard sometimes to get there on our own steam to try and have a go, but it was terrific in Italy, it was a real buzz".

Naylor does not have a job and his wife, Gabrielle, and baby daughter Georgia, must go without many luxuries so he can continue his ambition to become the fastest man in the world.

While Atkins has his own business, it does not flourish while he is away shooting and the bills continue to mount.

The \$1,500 presented to Atkins by MITA Copiers Victorian Dealer manager, John Griffin, will help him make a few hard decisions over the next two days as he ponders whether or not to go to Cyprus for another shooting competition.

"Every little bit helps" Atkins said.

And at a later date he will be able to take his wife and family on a seven day tour of Tasmania valued at \$1,700 and presented by Shepparton Travel Centre proprietor, Jock O'Connor, and Tasmania's Temptations Holidays.

Naylor received luggage from Goulburn Valley Spports Assembly president, Tom Montgomery.

"Since I've moved back to the Goulburn Valley on a permanent basis I'd like to thank the people of the area in general for their support", Naylor said on accepting his award.
