National President's Notes



Shooting — Is it a sport?

One of the most difficult aspects of our sport is getting the media to report our outstanding achievements. The efforts of our shooters in winning World titles often only rates one or two lines in our national papers and it is almost impossible to have any wins at all noted on television.

Over the past 12 months our national office has submitted articles telling of our achievements to sports publications and have virtually been totally ignored.

One of the major flascos at the moment involving shooting is the announcement that Manchester is not going to include shooting in the 2002 Commonwealth Games.

It appears our major supporters are the rural media and we should be doing everything we can to get as much publicity as possible ... and every effort must be made to see that shooting is continued as a major part of both the Olympic and Commonwealth Games. Letters, individually, to the Minister for Sport is one way we can start trying to get our message across.

Shooting is one of the four original sports of the modern Olympic Games and every effort must be made to keep it there.

Production of Handicap Cards

We have mentioned before the requirement of all shooters to produce their handicap cards at all shoots.

We have all heard the excuses for failing to produce cards, the most common being 'I left it at home, sorry just forgot it'. If this was the case, then surely it would stand to reason they would at times forget their gun, their jacket, their shells ... no it is only the handicap card.

Discussion has taken place at National, State, Zone and Club level as to the enforcement of a rule pertaining to failure to produce your card. All other sports that involve the production of a handicap card refuse to allow anyone to participate unless the card is produced.

I have often said that we have too many rules in our sport, and that most rules are introduced due to the failure of a very few to conform to an acceptable standard. If the minority failing to produce cards, whatever the reason, were to suddenly start producing theirs, then the Rules Committee would not be considering penalties for 'failure to produce a current handicap card.'

Badge Collectors

Last year in this column I made mention of the possibility of forming a 'collectors club' and invited interested people to drop me a line. The response to the suggestion was minimal to say the least, with only five persons responding. Since that time, I have been asked by a number of others as to how they can join, as they have believed the 'club' was in existence.

I am now open to suggestions as to how we may get the 'club' off the ground. Perhaps we can start to compile a list of clubs that have badges available, perhaps each collector could forward a list of their wants or swap badges they have available to me and I will pass the information to other collectors. Perhaps we could start off by having a badge designed for the 'Clay Target Insignia Collectors Club'. Lets have your thoughts.

Australia Remembers 1945-1995

Currently this program is being promoted throughout Australia and I am sure within our membership we have veterans of World War II with stories that could be reproduced in the CTSN for the interest of all. Perhaps there are members that can submit articles of interest on the activities of gun clubs during the war years. We look forward to any contribution.

1995 World Cup

Seoul (Korea) and Chiba (Japan) 25th April – 13th May

Fifteen shooters were chosen to represent Australia at the World Cups in Korea and Japan, quite a large team, with one official. The team comprised of — Coach/Manager, Greg Chan:



With two World Cups 'back to back' the tour was always going to be a long one and it was with this in mind that I left Darwin on the 25th April, with Brett Hall, heading for Melbourne to pick up the flight to Seoul. It was the long way north, but turned out to be much cheaper than going direct from Darwin to Seoul via Singapore.


Korea

After picking up the Victorian team members, we flew to Sydney to meet up with the NSW/Qld members. Ten pm saw us on a Korean Air DC10, and finally on our way. Ten hours later (7.30am Korean time) saw us touch down. After clearing customs, a one hour wait for the bus, a one and a half hour sit on the bus (stationary) and a two and a half hour ride on the bus, we arrived at our hotel – the Hotel Dong Seoul. The hotel was of good standard, although the rooms were on the small side. There were advantages, such as a Pizza Hut down the road, and a 24 hour convenience store across the street.

The first day was unofficial practice, so we caught cabs to the range and knew immediately that the traffic was going to be a problem. Very early starts (5.45-6.00am) were going to be the order of the day, to catch the early buses. The trap shooters shot two rounds on the official practice day and all were happy with their form, although the juniors were a little nervous. That afternoon we attended the opening ceremony which was a pretty spectacular affair.

Day 1 Trap: Russell 73, Michael 74, Filipo 71, Brett 64, Damien 65. A good effort with Michael sitting equal 1st, Russell equal 2nd and Filipo still in with a chance.

Day 2 Trap: What a day this turned out to be. Michael punched 50 (last 100 straight), going into the final on 124, in 1st place. Russell on a 48 also made the final on 121 in 6th place. Filipo landed a 48 to finish on 119 in 11th spot.

The final looked like this:

Michael had not only won the Seoul World Cup, he had also won another quota spot for Atlanta. Russell finished fourth and Filipo 11th, giving them all Olympic points. It's a pity they didn't have teams matches in Korea. We'd have won silver behind the Italians. The award ceremony was something special, winners are grinners' etc.

Double Trap: Unfortunately the Double Trap was held without a practice day (they practiced one round each after the trap final), so Michael and Russell had to back up straight away. After finishing 1st and 4th one day, then shooting again the next day was a big task. Our specialist Double Trap shooter, Craig Tilley, led the way with 133 and 10th spot, Brett shot a nice 131 to gain his MQS, Russell 128, Michael 127 and Damien 115. The event was won by W. Schanz (Germany) 138+46=184+2. Descrie led the ladies on 98 (11th) with Iona 61, Gleniss 68 and Dot 81. The event was won by Xiang Xu (China) 108+33=141.

The skeet team had arrived on the 29th and settled in well. Skeet practice went well, with all the guys feeling confident.

Day 1 Skeet: John 70, Craig 67, Barty 62, George 60. The boys were just off the pace but needed a big finish to have a chance.

Day 2 Skeet: Craig nearly pulled it off. Shot a perfect 50 to finish on 117, but only one target away from 10th place. John shot 45/115, Clive 43/111, Barty 40/102 and George 37/97.


That completed the shooting in Korea and the next day the Trap/Double Trap shooters were to leave for Japan.

We decided to leave the skeet shooters in Korea for the extra four days, as it would be much cheaper, and hopefully they would be able to practice. Unfortunately, George Barton had to fly home as the Japanese refused to let any competitors under eighteen compete.

Meanwhile, while the skeet was on, the Trappies got down to some serious shopping. The local shopping area was called Itaewon, a bargain hunters dream for clothing, shoes, watches and bags etc. Everybody had a ball buying up, but one person stood out as the 'best', the 'supreme bargainer'. Iona, she bargained the locals down on everything she wanted, and heaps of things she didn't. She made a sport of it!

At this point I should point out, we actually had sixteen shooters. Brant Woodward competed for NZ but roomed with us and was included in all our shooting and travel arrangements.

After three or four nights of Pizza Hut, three of the ladies, Brant and I decided to try something different. The five of us went to a restaurant to have 'steak'. The owner couldn't speak English so we had a meal that was barely enough for five people, a round of drinks and asked for the bill. 175,000 wan – about \$350! Brant and the 'supreme bargainer' discussed the price with the owner. Some mention was made of wanting a steak meal, not a whole cow and we walked out about \$200 lighter – back to Pizza Hut.

Japan


On May 4th we flew from Seoul to Chiba. The Hotel New Tsukamoto would be home for the next nine days. Trap practice was the next day. The range was most impressive with two separate skeet, two trap and one combined trap/skeet layout, complete with electronic score boards. All three trap layouts were connected by a huge tunnel, large enough to drive a fork lift into. The range was only 35kms from the hotel, but took between one to one and a half hours, so again early starts would be needed.

Day 1 Trap: Russell 71, Michael 70, Filipo 68, Brett 60, Damien 61.

Day 2 Trap: Russell 47/118, Michael 48/118, Filipo 43/111, Brett 44/104, Damien 40/101. Russell and Michael both qualified for the final.

Day 2 Skeet: John 45/114, Craig 44/110, Clive 46/112, Barty 38/100. The conditions were just as bad as day one. Event won by Abdullah Al-Rashidi 122+24 and Kuwait's first quota spot.

Saturday 13th May and we are heading home. We arrived at Narita airport for our Qantas flight home. John, Craig and I check our bags through to Melbourne, only to be told we are overweight. After allowances made for sporting teams etc, we are still forty kgs over which was going to cost us \$3,000! We were stunned. After John threatened to put on ten shirts, five pairs of trousers etc. to lighten the load, we protested to the airport manager, who finally said he would turn a blind eye and not charge us anything. Nine hours later we arrived in Sydney, then on to Melbourne. After spending the night at Melbourne airport, I arrived back in Darwin at 2pm the next day.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the ACTA for the opportunity to do this trip. The team members, a very special thank you. Your co-operation, team spirit and overall behaviour was commendable. You deserve all the success you had, and I am proud to have been a part of it. I wish you all well for the future and hope that one day we may get to do it all again.



1995 A.C.T.A. 'Coach of the Year'

In 1994, the A.C.T.A. Coaching Council instigated the 'Coach of the Year' award which recognises an outstanding Club Coach within the Australian Clay Target Association. The successful candidate for 1994 was Mr Peter McBride of the West Australian Gun Club.

This year, 1995, the A.C.T.A. Coaching Council is asking you to nominate your Club Coach as an entrant in the 1995 'Coach of the Year' award.

This notice is to bring to your attention that the culmination of the award is in September 1995, but now is the time to think about what your Club Coach does for you.

In the August edition of the C.T.S.N. there will be a nomination form for you or your club members to fill out for the nomination of your Club Coach.

Editor's Mailbox

Dear Sir.

The argument as to whether we should have a National Shooting Ground has been continuing for some time. However on the assumption that the economic argument will prevail and a National Ground be developed I submit these thoughts.

Because the bulk of shooters come from the Easter States it is logical that the site should be located there.

Our sport is a highly polluting activity i.e. noise, and unlike motor sport where noise suppression devices can be used, such are not available to us. It follows then that the possibility of finding a site in the capital cities where significant restrictions on usage will not apply is for all practical purposes a pipe dream.

Of course if somebody has sufficient influence to have an act of Parliament enacted to free us from the existing laws regarding noise pollution this condition would not apply é.g. the act exempting Mt Panarama, Bathurst and Eastern Creek racing events from strict compliance with EPA regulations.

It seems then that the Grounds will have to be in a country area.

This then leads to other problems and these include overcoming the very specific problem of who will have us.

As shooters we are or should be aware of the concerted attacks we have to endure with the projected image of us being anti-social. We know that this is a lie but as a group have, at this time, not been able to satisfactorily counter it.

I find some of the suggestions regarding a National Ground that includes such things as Motels etc., to be unrealistic.

<u>First</u>, such an approach would make us competitors to existing business in the area – we want these people to welcome us not organise to obstruct our development – we already have enough enemies without generating more.

<u>Second</u>, our area of specialty is in the operation of clay target shooting certainly not in the hospitality industry where experienced people can go broke. Even in our area of specialty this expertise is suspect, our membership is diminishing.

<u>Third</u>, the massive amounts of money needed to achieve this end particularly if we take up the notion of competing with local industry.

It seems then that we could profitably examine existing facilities with the view to adoption of one of them as the basis for future development.

To this end I suggest that Wagga meets the requirements for such a development.

- The Wagga Gun Club exists in a form whereby National Trap and Skeet competitions have/can be conducted – this without any immediate demand for funds.
- Long term usage is, I understand, guaranteed at a very nominal rate.
- The Council, Chamber of Commerce and Moteliers Association would welcome such a move.
- The local media outlets, namely print, radio and television give good coverage to shooting – a pretty rare thing you would have to agree.
- 5. There is no restriction on the use of the site noise pollution is not a problem and the type of development surrounding the club ensure that this will continue.

There are a number of arguments that I have heard raised against Wagga and these include:

- a. It always rains during major tournaments.
- For skeet the sun can be a problem in the afternoons.

I have shot at Wagga probably as much as any non-resident and am not impressed by either of the above arguments.

Regarding (a) above I have looked and found no rain forests in the Wagga area. I therefore suspect that excepting unseasonable climatic variations, no real effort has been made to check for major events. There was a two day skeet shoot during May this year and the weather was delightful.

Regarding (b), again selecting the time of year where the problem of sun is minimised would be a first step with the second being that shooters can reasonably be expected to ensure that their equipment includes correct eye protection.

At the National Skeet Shooting Association grounds in San Antonio USA the problem of sun exists in both the morning and afternoon. At the World Championships 4 gauges are shot and all shooters get their turn at looking into the sun—in other words the afternoon sun at Wagga is not without precedent.

The Wagga facility has been developed to its present stage by a club not a National or State organisation and full credit to them.

I repeat the Wagga facility <u>exists</u> and we shooters are <u>wanted</u>. These are, I believe, powerful arguments for the adoption of Wagga as a National Ground if indeed such a step is considered necessary.

The Coaching Clinic was well run and covered all aspects of the sport from safety, role of the coach and hands on teaching over the two days.


While the six of us were at the clinic on Saturday, Vince went out to the range in the afternoon to give other members some hands on shooting tips.


Sunday morning and back to class just before we were allowed out to the range, to see if we had learnt anything – all went well!



Many of the visitors had not before seen competitive shooting of any kind, and after a short demonstration, those interested were invited to take part.


Florence Doyer of Belgium said that she knew that very good guns were made in Belgium, but she had never seen or handled one, so she was pleased to try clay target shooting.

Our Patron, Ian Armstrong, demonstrated his skill by breaking his target convincingly.


All in all, the day was a success and Cowra Gun Club is convinced of the value of a combined Promotion Day to bring clay target shooting before the public in a positive way.







With bellies full and bodies rested the shooters were called back to the traps for 25 targets Points Score. This time it was Mick McGill who shot the perfect score to win A grade. Ron Power once again picked up the B grade with 60/75 and Sam Edmonds, determined to avenge his defeat in the earlier event, won C grade easily with a good score of 69/75. Sam was also the shooter drawn to shoot for the Mount Isa Gun Club members jackpot, but unfortunately for Sam he missed his fourth target.

The final event for the day was 25 targets Single Barrel. Bruce Murphy and Jim Edmonds both carded 24/25 in the event and were sent out to battle out A grade. Seven targets later it was all over with Bruce winning A grade with a final score of 31/32. Once again the lack of competition in B grade was to Ron Power's advantage as he won the grade with a score of 16/25, and Sam Edmonds won his second C grade trophy for the day with a score of 18/25.

With competition ended for the day, President Neil Sinclair presented the trophies to the winning competitors and also made the announcement that due to the current industrial situation in the city, the Royal Flying Doctor Service Appreciation Cup Shoot which was scheduled for Sunday 21st May, had been postponed with a date to be set later.

Neil also announced that the Mount Isa Gun Club Annual Shoot, which was to be held on the Queen's Birthday weekend in June, has been cancelled.

The action on both these shoots was taken as the Mount Isa Gun Club felt it would be unfair to ask people to dig into their pockets and support these events in the current climate.

We can't shoot good scores with a poorly fitting gun

One of the biggest problems confronting the average shooter when he decides to buy a trap gun is the fact that in most cases he has to put himself in the hands of the guy behind the counter of his local gun shop, or a friend who has a gun for sale.

The result is, he can finish up with a gun that quite often is not suited to his purpose. In most cases his gun is:

- 1. Too long or too short.
- 2. Too heavy or too light.
- 3. Barrels too short, and not the right choke.
- 4. Stock is too low etc.
- 5. Or gun out of balance and feels like a cricket bat.

It is impossible to over emphasise the importance of proper gun fit, especially for the competition shooter.

Equally important and which goes hand in hand with gun fit, is correct gun mounting.

I never cease to be amazed at the large number of our medium to good shooters that shoot trap and skeet targets who are severely handicapping their shooting performance by continuing to use a gun that is either not a proper fit, or they are not mounting and checking it correctly.

Many shooters will buy a gun from over the counter at their local gun shop or from a fellow shooter and pay a big price, thinking that because the gun is highly priced it will automatically shoot the way he wants it to. This is of course not the way it works.


I often see shooters trying to adapt themselves to an ill fitting gun in order to get a proper alignment and sight picture. This practice can be successful some of the time but not every time. I have heard it said that a good shot should be good enough to shoot with any gun he picks up! Fact is that very few shooters, if any can do just this, remembering that champion shots are not born that way, they only become brilliant by keenness, application, coaching, practice and more practice with the **correct equipment properly fitted**.

A well fitted gun will give greater comfort during the act of firing and will provide for greater gun control, recoil effect will be reduced and greater gun pointing accuracy will develop. The wise shooter will strive for an absolutely perfect gun fit. It is only then he will achieve greater performance.

The problems arising from a badly fitting gun are numerous. These problems are with us whenever a shot gun is used, whether for field or clay targets, because shooting a shotgun is an instinctive pointing action.

In other words we don't aim at the target as we would do with a rifle, we simply point the muzzle at the moving target, as one would point a finger, looking only at the target. The trigger is pulled the instant a sight picture of gun and target relationship is formed. Without proper gun fit it is not possible to consistently do all that is necessary in order to shoot well.

Buying a new gun can be something like buying a new suit or new dress 'off the hook'. Almost always it needs to be altered in some way before we can wear it in the way we want it to look and be comfortable.





 Note how the eyes are positioned above the guns action, with eyes level in their most efficient way. Head and shoulders are also in a natural upright position. A gun mounted in this way will point where the eyes are looking. All this will only happen when a gun is correctly fitted and properly mounted.



 In this drawing, the shooting eye is below the rib line, due to his face and head being positioned too far forward and down on a stock that has too much drop at the point of comb. This practice will cause low shooting as well as a bruised cheek. The gun manufacturer has exactly the same problem. Because we are all built differently, it is not possible to manufacture a standard gun that would fit everyone, hence the need to have a personal fitting to suit the physical characteristics of the person.

Vital gun stock statistics are the following:

Length of pull Angle of pitch

Drop of heel Drop at comb

Shape of comb

Problems connected with an ill fitting stock are many such as loss of gun control during the process of firing, bruised cheek and shoulder, excessive recoil, inaccurate gun pointing, poor alignment of gun and eye.

The young shooters and the lady shooter, because of their physical build, will always require specialist gun fitting, as well as instruction in the correct way to mount and point a shotgun.

As an example of how gun mounting goes hand in hand with gun fit, I'll quote a recent happening -

A shooter whose gun I had recently fitted and made altertions to both length and pitch rang me one evening with the news that he thought I had made his stock too short. When I inquired how he arrived at this decision he said, "Well when I fire a shot I get a bump on the nose from my thumb, which had not happened prior to the stock being altered."

At this point I became aware of what was happening. He was in fact mounting his gun in the same manner he had done before it had been shortened, with the butt out on his upper arm. He had forgotten how I had explained that the butt needs to be in on the shoulder where it will be closer to his face for a correct and easy gun alignment. His problem was that because of incorrect mounting, he had in fact made a well fitted gun appear too short.

One other common fault is the incorrect positioning of ones hand around the pistol grip section of the stock. This is the hand that more or less controls the gun through its entire movement during the act of mounting and firing. Any inconsistency here will no doubt effect ones performance, even to the point of flinching.

Unfortunately, due to limited space in this magazine it's not possible for me to go to an indepth description of all the problems and remedies associated with gun fitting. However if the reader is still interested he will find interesting reading in my recently published book titled 'Shooting the Clay Target' available at ACTA office and most sports stores and direct from me. Price \$20.

In the meantime, don't let anyone tell you that proper gun fit is a lot of rubbish because nothing is further from the truth. Fact is that unless your gun fits you properly, and you have been shown the correct technique of gun mounting and gun pointing, you can forget about becoming a really good shot.

This position applies even more so when the shooter tries his hand at International Trench and Olympic Skeet, where precision timing, perfect gun fit and gun mounting are so important in order to put good scores on the board.

After the shoot, one of the main fund raisers was the auction of donated goods, where one could buy anything from hay, to a duck, at ridiculous prices.



If your shooting was causing some frustration, a pin ball machine was in the club house and for a \$1.00 donation, skills could be put to the test there.


Raffles were run during the day, and even a sweep on the Queensland Guineas, all in the name of raising a few dollars for some very worthy Bush Fire Brigades.




Chris Poole (left) accepts his prize for novice grade, event 2. Ian Mitchell (right).




Bush Fire Brigade Charity Shoot — Singleton Clay Target Club — 6-5-95.






