

1995 State Coaches Conference

Brisbane, 18th-20th August

The Conference venue for 1995 had changed to Brisbane to take advantage of warmer climate and continue a plan of venue rotation.

A Friday evening meeting got underway at 6.30pm to accept the 1994 Minutes and Business Arising. With this completed, the meeting moved onto State Reports. Each State Coach having previously tabled their Report, then delivered their Report and answered any questions. This section of the Conference closed at 7.45pm and dinner was enjoyed at a small Italian restaurant.

Saturday morning Agenda started at 9.00am with all State Coaches assembled being Victoria - Gary Cassells, NSW - Fred Schmetzer, Queensland - John Mitchell, NT - Greg Chan, SA - Phillip Mules, WA - Vince Marney, Chairman Coaching Council - Ross Silvester and the National Director of Coaching - Murray Alexander.

First on the Agenda was the Coaches Accreditation Review. Since 1st January 1995, Coaches Accreditation had been undergoing a program of renewal under the guidance of the Australian Coaching Council. A great many Coaches had not renewed or had not had their Accreditation renewed and to ensure all had been done to keep them on the 'active' list, each State Coach gave a brief overview of their States efforts in this direction. The final consensus was that the Coaches remaining within the system and those entering Accreditation were the workers that would

genuinely benefit the sport. However to overcome any situation of an Accredited Coach failing to have had the opportunity to renew, one last advertisement would be placed in the C.T.S.N.

Next came the Coaches Booth / Display at National Events. Following only a partial success at the 1995 booth at Melbourne, a rethink of its objectives and what we wished to achieve was conducted. The results of the rethink were that the booth was a worthwhile project with the following alternatives:

- 1. Better siting of the display
- 2. Better use of profile Coaches
- 3. More individual contact
- 4. Wider selection of worthwhile videos
- 5. The selection of informative handouts

Level 3 Accreditation review followed next and all State Coaches had an opportunity to discuss this circulated document. After a round table discussion, the revised Level 3 was accepted and now moves onto the Australian Coaching Council Technical Committee for official acceptance. If all goes well, a new Level 3 program should be able to begin in January 1996.

Probably the main Agenda Items were next and these ended up being broken into three (3) categories: 1996 Junior Development Squad; 1996 Female Development Squad; 1996 Junior Talent Development Squad.

The 1996 Junior Development Squad was first to be discussed in an ongoing program of refinement. A decision was agreed that here be no real change to the format except for a defined number in each discipline. Involvement with the State Coach would become of higher necessity and degree, and once a Junior is selected in a discipline, he/she is to remain committed to that discipline whilst part of the Development Squad.

With the Junior Development Squad agreed to, the Female Development Program (Double Trap) was brought into play. So as not to re-invent the wheel, it was agreed that a Squad of Junior Females would be instigated using the Junior Development Squad guidelines. By doing this, identified females would be involved in a program run correctly with other Development Programs, thereby using all resources available for their benefit. The decision on a Female Development Squad (Double Trap) does not preclude any Junior Ladies from a position in another discipline.

To try and open up the Junior Development Program, a National Junior Talent Squad was discussed. This Talent Squad was aimed at a program to identify and advance juniors with talent based on a State Program. Guidelines were agreed to for 1996 and the National Director of Coaching will now investigate the infrastructure needed to support this 'self funding' program. Some of the guidelines for the program that the camp will be held either SASI (South Aust) or the Brisbane Shooting Complex, there is to be two camps of three (3) days - 1 for standard trap and skeet and the other for ISU disciplines, States to do their own selection and maximum age similar to that of the Junior Development Program.

The day progressed on with many other subjects being discussed in an open and non political forum. The topics covered: 1. A.C.T.A. Coach of the Year. 2. A.C.C. Coaches Code of Ethics. 3. Level 1 Course Questionnaire. 4. Course Presenters Manual. 5. Videos and 'Fee for Service' Coaching.

A final topic that received good airing was Practical Coaching. The National Director of Coaching raised the subject asking each Coach to look into the use of High Profile Coaches who had undertaken accreditation. The reason being that these people were identifiable by all A.C.T.A. members and their knowledge was eagerly sought by others. By involving them in Coaching sessions, not only did shooters interest and knowledge improve, but other supporting 'Club' Coaches gained first hand knowledge. Tasmania has already begun with a Coaching weekend in September using Russell Mark and John Summers.

A short list of identified Profile competitors who are Accredited Coaches was tabled, and when approached correctly, are willing to assist wherever possible.

Greg Newey, Queensland, Level 2. Peter Quire, SA, Level 3. Michael Diamond, NSW, Level 1. John Maxwell, NSW, Level 1. John Summers, Vic, Level 1. Russell Mark, Vic, Level 1. Deserie Huddleston, Vic, Level 1.

Prior to closing a presentation was made to the retiring N.S.W. State Coach in Mr Fred Schmetzer. Fred had completed his Level 3 Accreditation (the last under the old course) and all assembled Coaches congratulated him. The announcement of Freds retirement was sadly received, but fortunately it only means from the administrative side of coaching to commit more time to practical coaching and just a little to his family.

The conference resumed Sunday morning at the Brisbane Gun Club, where an ongoing program on Vision research was discussed. The Queensland Coaching Director has maintained a program with an Optometrist - Mr Graham Searle and it was with great interest that all State Coaches listened. After several hours of discussing the eyes and what they actually can and can't do, the 1995 State Coaches conference ended.

It had been another worthwhile Conference and the progress of Coaches and Coaching is definitely beginning to obtain the credibility so many have worked hard to achieve.

Congratulations and thanks to Mr John Mitchell for his effort in organising and co-ordinating the Conference and all State Coaches who had given their time to attend and be involved.

The last event for the day was the Leonora Fish and Chips




High Gun winner Garry Kelly receives his sash and Gold Nugget from Lance Hurst Manager of Minesite Rehabilitation.

The conditions were just so perfect for smashing black clays as all the records proved. Foxy dropped out after missing his 147th target, but achieved his 250 Break Badge and 2nd AA Grade, then Tom Vodden was next to say goodbye after his 173rd target, Tom won 1st AA Grade but was sadly 2 targets off his 200 Break Badge. Kalgoorlie shooter Mick Rowell and Geraldton Gary Kelly were still going strong, but there was just no stopping Kelly on the day and Rowell dropped his 179th target and finished off with a score of 178/179 and left Kelly still standing with no more competition. Day 2 was the Red Sash Day. Two State Title Championship events were on the program, the first being Double Rise Tower. Each year our Club is supported by Mick Demasson who owns Demo's Cafe in town, and was an inaugural member of the Leonora Gun Club and sponsors an eye opener event preceding the State Title. This year it was a 5-Pair Double Rise Tower discipline which saw 3 shooters shoot the possible to qualify for the shoot-off. Another Geraldton shooter, Mick Watson, Kambalda's Tom Vodden and Leonora's Jim Hurst were all competing

They continued the shoot-off and Jim Hurst proved he was a dominate leader in the Tower that weekend by winning the event with a score of 48/50. Max came in 2nd 47/50, 3rd place went to David Fox 35/40, 4th position was won by Neale Johnson 34/40, 5th place Alan Hocking 33/40 and the 6th place went to Gary Kelly 35/40.

The 6th event was The Mount Edon Goldmines 50 Amateur (American) Trap Angles Single Barrel and, once again, the dominate D.T.L. shooters Gary Kelly and Lex Shipp were in yet again another shoot-off, but there was just no stopping Kelly over the weekend and he won the overall and the State Title Championship with a perfect score of 75/75. Lex won 1st AA Grade 74/75, 2nd place went to Eddie Toomey 49/50. The A Graders had a shoot-off which saw Alan Hocking winning 1st place with a score of 79/80 and John Page coming in 2nd. B Grade was won by Mauri Urquhart 47/50 outright, and 2nd place went to Esperance shooter Eric Hoggard 51/55. The C Grade winner was new shooter Leonora's Jamie Andrew's 45/50, and our visitor from Broken Hill N.S.W., David Woolcock, was 2nd 44/50.

The 7th event on the program was sponsored by the best pub in town, The Central Hotel 25 Double Barrel Handicap. There were Gold Nuggets in excess of \$1,000 for trophies to be shared out amongst 7 winners. Gary Kelly was once more in the shoot-off for 1st along with Kalgoorlie's Mick Rowell, but this time the sash and overall winner was Mick Rowell 75/75, Gary was 2nd, David Fox 3rd 69/70, Jim Hurst 50/51 was in 4th place, Neale Johnson 49/50, Leonora's President Ken Green picked up his 2 Gold Nuggets finishing in 6th place and Vince Oliveri from Geraldton was 7th, scoring 29/30.

The last event of the day was the Golden Clay Mystery Shoot and Mystery Shoot it was! The object of the event was all shooters were grouped into their respective grades and they were to move along each layout and, as soon as they missed a target, they were out. Now just to make things interesting, there were Gold Clays placed in each trap house and, if a shooter was lucky to shoot a gold clay, he won a Gold Nugget regardless. Well, since there were some huge break badges achieved at the Club, we thought that the event should be single barrel since there was

It seemed only fitting that this award was won by Geraldton's C Grader Justin Pirrattina, who went to AA Grade after his performance over the 2 days, and he joined A.C.T.A. for the first time in 1994. 


SSAA or ACTA and it was encouraging to see the positive interaction amongst them.



Peter Wells, left, congratulates winner of highgun David Cunningham






