## National President's Notes

#### \$100 Club Insurance and Affiliation Fee

I have received a number of enquiries as to the increase in affiliation fees. The 1996 Club Affiliation Fee has increased to \$100 per annum. The main reason for this increase is that the A.C.T.A. has negotiated through our Insurance Brokers, BRA Australia Pty. Ltd. an excellent Public Liability insurance package covering all members. Clubs will therefore no longer need to have their own Public Liability Coverage (unless they wish to be insured for more than \$5 million), and will represent considerable insurance savings to clubs, some of whom currently spend in excess of \$500 per annum. Also, with this increase in fee the ACTA has agreed to pay the \$1,000 excess on each claim made under this policy. This is an excellent coverage for all in ACTA. We are also in the process of negotiating building and contents insurance for Clubs, should they desire same. More on this as it comes to hand. A full and detailed summary will be published shortly in the CTSN and will be available from the National Office.

## 1996...Introduce a new member to the A.C.T.A. - Target 2000

Whatever your preferred discipline - Trap, Skeet, I.S.U. or A.C.T.A. Sporting - why not introduce a friend, workmate, or neighbour to clay target shooting.

During 1996 we will begin our campaign to increase our membership by at least 2000 nationally and to this end the major drive shall be a National Promotional Day on Sunday, 30th June.

## Birds Only...National Championships

It is interesting to note that the C.P.S.A. (U.K.) introduced the option for shooters to compete in National Championships in 1995 for birds only.

The reasons stated is two-fold:

- 1. The option does not mean a significant detraction from the overall prizefund, and,
- 2. An opportunity to participate in a major event is available to those shooters who might otherwise not be able to afford to attend.

It is an interesting innovation - I would be interested to hear of the general memberships' view.

Mr. Graham Mahoney has decided to stand down from his position on the A.C.T.A. and V.C.T.A. On behalf of the A.C.T.A., I would like to thank him for his contributions during his term on the Committee and wish him well in his "retirement".

# 1995 Victorian State Trap Carnival

Maryborough & District Gun Club in Central Victoria was the venue for the 1995 Trap Carnival. The grounds were presented in top shape by the Club and, although numbers were down on Echuca last year, three days of enjoyable shooting took place with some good performances on the score board.

#### Event 1. State Handicap

We had seven possibles after the 50 targets, one on 11 metres and the rest between 20 and 23 metres. First was Terry Pigram Wangaratta 81/81, second Craig Weaver Moulamein NSW 80/81, third Nessa Jenkins Sebastopol 66/67, fourth Hedley Harmer all the way from Geraldton WA 59/60, and fifth Nathan Cassells Maryborough 54/55, who also took the Junior prize with his 50/50. Nessa Jenkins also doubled up by winning the Womens section with 50/50, and Jack Hughes Scbastopol was successful among the Veterans with 51/53.

Event 2. State Double Rise Championship

Russell Mark Sebastopol, with an excellent 49/50, took the Double Rise Championship Red Sash and Silver Victoria Badge outright. Overall second after a shoot-off was Paul Ryland Melbourne 65/70, and third Mark McInnes Narrabri NSW 63/70. AA Grade first was Steve Atkins Echuca 56/60, second Les Chant Albury 54/60, and third Kevin Wright Geelong 62/70. In A Grade Malcolm Absalom Boort was the winner with his 44/50, second Peter Mills Cerberus 50/60, and third Wayne Parks Wonthaggi 58/70. B Grade first went to Ian Perks Bendigo 44/50, second Luke Cassells Maryborough 48/60, third Susan Milroy Alexandra 47/60. Justin O'Brien Woods Point with 43/60 beat the C Graders, second was Nessa Jenkins Sebastopol 48/70, and third Kevin Wilde Sebastopol 45/70. Susan Milroy doubled up by winning the Womens section 41/50, while Jack Matthey Noorat was top Veteran with 41/50. Luke Cassells picked up his second Medal by being best Junior on 49/60.

Event 3. State Double Barrel Championship
The wind had got up on the Saturday morning, but the change in conditions did not deter the 32 shooters who shot the possible in the Double Barrel. After 175 targets four remained,
Wayne Parks and Roger Duthie missed in the 250's, and we were left with Russell Mark and Nathan Cassells still going and showing no sign of weakening. Finally at target 351
Russell shot his, Nathan missed, and Russell made it a brace of State Titles in two days after his victory in the Double Rise Championship. Third overall to Russell and Nathan was
Wayne Parks Wonthaggi with 255/256. Roger Duthie Hamilton was first in AA 232/233, second Steve Haberman Geelong

168/169, and third Bill Eagle Echuca 168/169. A Grade first

went to Peter Kerr Echuca 100/101, second Terry Pigram Wangaratta 81/82, and third Bill Woodward Nepean 75/76. The B Graders were led by Brian Hunter Nepean 65/65, second Keith Vagg Noorat 64/65, and third Kane Shepherd Maryborough 73/74. Top of the list in C Grade was Rodney Saligari Echuca 48/50, second Peter Sing Echuca 66/69, and third Justin O'Brien Woods Point 65/69. Nessa Jenkins Sebastopol again beat the women with 50/53, Fred Poon Wonthaggi Veterans 50/50, and Nathan Cassells Maryborough another Junior Medal 50/50. The delay to the start of the Single Barrel Championship caused by the long shoot-off for the Double Barrel has prompted the organisers to schedule the Single Barrel before the Double Barrel at next year's Trap Carnival.

Event 4. State Single Barrel Championship Four shooters shot the 50 targets in the Single Barrel, Steve Atkins, Robert Nisbet, Rob Viney and Roger Duthie. In the

shoot-off, Robert Nisbet Echuca outlasted the others to win the Red Sash & Silver Victoria Badge with the score of 85/85. Second overall was Roger Duthie Hamilton 84/85, and third Rob Viney Geelong 61/62. AA Grade first went to Steve Atkins Echuca 55/56, second Jim Finis Mildura 69/70, and third Dexter Barnes Deniliquin 75/77. Keith Calder Frankston-Australian took A Grade first 54/55, second went to Wayne Calaby Sebastopol 53/55, and third Kevin Geppert Moulamein NSW 50/52. B Grade first was Syd Anstee Bendigo 47/51, second Brian Hunter Nepean 51/56, and third Keith Vagg Noorat 50/56. Justin O'Brien Woods Point led the C Graders with 56/50, second was Kevin Wilde Sebastopol 48/54, and third Steven Parks Wonthaggi 47/54. Nathan Cassells Maryborough picked up his third Junior Medal of the Carnival with 49/50, Chris Geppert Moulamein NSW took the Womens Section with 45/50, and Bryan Addison Geelong beat the Veterans with 48/50.

#### Event 5. State Pointscore Championship

As further evidence of the good targets and excellent shooting at the State Carnival, eight competitors shot the lot in the Pointscore Championship. It took another 26 targets to sort out the winner, who was Steve Haberman Geelong 228/228. Overall second was Steve Atkins Echuca 227/228, and third Jim Finis Mildura 210/211. Interstate visitors took the top placings in AA Grade. First was Mark McInnes Narrabri NSW 176/177, second Ian Merrick Cessnock NSW 170/171, and third Rob Godfrey Geelong 155/156. A Grade first went to Bill Woodward Nepean 150/150, second Daryl Hunt Wangaratta 176/177, and third Joe Attard Morwell 175/177. B Grade first made it a double for Syd Anstee Bendigo 158/162, second Robert Hunter Nepean 157/162, and third Ian Perks Bendigo 144/150. Nessa Jenkins topped off a good Carnival for her by winning C Grade with 141/150. Second was Trevor Mullins Mornington 140/150, and third Justin O'Brien Woods Point 141/153. Nathan Cassells made it four out of five Junior Section wins (his brother Luke won the fifth) with 147/150. Joanne Kerr Echuca took the Womens Section 144/153, and Keith Mules S.A. was top Veteran with his score of 149/156.

# Bute Gun Club Last shoot at old grounds



## Club Junior Coaching Day

The small club of Crookwell, which is situated in the southern part of NSW country, have for some time encouraged juniors. Along with the rise in juniors and new members came the problem of these shooters not being coached properly.

Earlier in the year four of the clubs juniors travelled to the Narrandera Junior Classic and they all shot personal best scores. They won a number of titles and importantly caught the eye of coach Fred Schmetzer.

The club, at present, has two juniors representing zone - one going on to make the State Junior team, and another club junior in the Australian Junior Trench team.

One of the major problems facing the club is that with most of our juniors and new shooters coming from rural backgrounds, don't have the financial backing to travel the long distances to coaching days. Time is also a factor with most of the shooters, working weekends and after school to get enough money to shoot once a month. They do have one advantage, gaining natural talent in field shooting because they start at an early age in the farms.

The clubs next step, therefore, was to organise a coaching day for their members. This was done with Fred Schmetzer and set down for 21st October.

With a 10am start, 10 juniors and 14 C graders turned out on a misty morning. First off was an hour talk by Fred on the mechanics of the sport. Most importantly, eye alignment, the use of peripheral vision for target identification were all discussed at length followed by a session of questions and answers. The shooters then went out to shoot some straight aways, with some of the more advanced shooters broken up into groups and given a rotation of tasks to perform. By the time everybody went through their tasks it was 1.30pm and with Fred losing his voice, the coaching session finished to enable our monthly shoot to commence.

The morning proved to be greatly appreciated by the club, and in particular those members who attended. A follow up day is planned for 1996.

Clubs in all sports need juniors and C graders or your club becomes stagnate and loses its appeal. These coaches are available whether in your own club or a day set up by a state body.

Our appreciation goes to Fred for a difficult job made simple and understandable for the new shooters and if clubs want to approach Fred they can do so on 069 557270.





# 1995 NSW Shooter of the Year

The annual NSW 'Shooter of the Year' awards were held for the fourth year in a row in Sydney, but this year, the event was moved to the more glitzy setting of the famous Luna Park.

The awards, conducted by the NSW Shooting Association, and its subsidiary body, the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, were held on Friday 3 November 1995.


The special Guest of Honour for the evening was NSW Minister for Sport and Recreation, the Honourable Gabrielle Harrison MP. The evening was compared by Master of Ceremonies and Channel 10 television personality, Ron Wilson.

The function was attended by over 200 guests representing all shooting clubs throughout the state. Other special political guests were Senator Bob Woods, representing the Federal Shadow Minister for Sport, Mr Michael Richardson, representing the NSW Opposition Leader; and the Honourable Jim Kaldis, MLC from the NSW Legislative Council.

Leaders of the sport, other distinguished guests and representatives from the firearms industry combined well with the many representatives from target shooting and hunting clubs. An enjoyable evening with an excellent dinner and top class entertainment in the impressive surroundings of the Luna Park function rooms was had by all.

Numerous deserved nominations were submitted by shooting clubs from throughout the state, but only two finalists from each of the shooting disciplines in NSW could be selected, making a total of 18 finalists. The first finalist received a sterling silver medal and \$200 cash prize, and the second finalist was awarded a bronze medal and \$100 cash prize. The awards were in recognition of outstanding performance or achievement in competition shooting or a related shooting sports activity in the preceding year.

The bronze medal for clay target shooting went to Ben Kelley of the NSW Gun Club at Terrey Hills. Although he is only 18, Ben already has a very impressive list of achievements in clay target shooting. He was the Victorian State Junior Champion in 1994, the South Australian

A grade Champion and South Australian State Junior Champion in 1994. This year he was selected to train at the AIS in Canberra as part of the national junior development program and is a scholarship holder on the Olympic Athlete Program.

In the Oceania Championships this year Ben was the winner of the Senior Mens Overall Championship in Olympic Trap and came 3rd in the Senior Mens Double Trap, securing an Olympic quota place for Australia in the 1996 Atlanta Olympics. In June this year Ben participated in the World Cup and Grand Prix in Finland, earning a bronze medal in the Senior Mens Teams event in double trap. He moved on to the World Championships in Cyprus and came 3rd overall in the Junior Olympic Trap. He also received a bronze medal in the Junior Teams event, was placed 5th overall in the Junior Double Trap and 4th Overall in the Junior Teams Double Trap events. In addition, in the 1994 World Championships, he was a member of the Australian Team which won the silver medal in the Open Teams event. Ben is rated as number one National Junior in both Olympic Trap and Double Trap Clay Target Shooting. Ben was a well deserved winner.

The Clay Target Shooting silver medal was awarded to Michael Diamond also from the NSW Gun Club. This year Michael has focused his attention principally at higher level competition, but, last year in the New Zealand Trap Nationals he won the Overall High Gun event and established a new world of 2048 consecutive targets. This year Michael won the gold medal in individual and in teams in the double trap clay target event at the Oceania Games in Auckland. He was also the double barrel overall winner in the Australian Olympic Trap Nationals conducted in Melbourne and the Overall High Gun winner in the Mackintosh International Teams Event. On the International scene, Michael participated in the World Cups and World

Championships. In Korea, he won the World Cup gold medal in Olympic Trap and also equalled the world record. He followed this up with a silver medal in the World Cup in Japan in May, and then in the World Championships conducted in Cyprus in July, Michael again won the silver medal. A splendid achievement.

The overall winner of the Gold Medal and \$1000 cash prize was selected from the 18 nominees and the 1995 Shooter of the Year and gold medal winner was also Michael Diamond. His record was impressive even among the many quality performances recorded by all the finalists.

Michael was presented with his medal and winner's cheque by the Minister for Sport and Recreation, Gabrielle Harrison.

During the presentation ceremony, the President of the NSW Shooting Association, Alex Comino announced that the NSW Shooting Association had formed a consortium and responded to the Government's call for the private sector to build the 2000 Olympic Games shooting facility. The proposal put forward was for the entire facility to be built at no cost to the Government. Mr Comino said; "All forms of shooting have a focal point in the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney and the Shooter of the Year awards play an important role in encouraging all shooters."

Also on the night, the Chairman of the NSW Firearms Safety Awareness Council, Charles Copeman, presented a special award of 'Firearms Safety Officer of the Year' to Robert Pye of the Cacciatore (Diana) Association. This award was in recognition of his outstanding performance as a safety officer, particularly within the Italian community and for his overall contribution to the sport. Robert has personally conducted over 300 firearms safety tests and is an extremely strong supporter of the firearms safety scheme and the sport of shooting.


## 1995 Olympic Discipline Nationals





## Tips on how to shoot your problem target at trap or skeet

By former Victorian State Coaching Director, George Biggs

I well remember as a beginner clay target shooter when a hard right angle target would frighten the hell out of me from station 5. A hard left from station 1 also had me in lots of trouble before I could figure out what I was not doing the proper way.

In those days some 45 years back we were all self appointed experts on how to shoot better scores at clays.

Strangely enough I have never had a problem with the straight away from any station, simply because I have always recognised the angle and swung up quickly and smoothly, touched the target with the bead and pulled



the trigger and followed through. I have learnt very early in my career how important it is to swing and follow through, the swing is important. Proper foot position, especially on lane 5 is vital. Most shooters who have trouble with the straight away and there are lots of guys who simply cannot face this target with much degree of confidence. If you are one of these shooters, this is what I would suggest you try doing.

Firstly check with someone you know can give you the correct following advice.

- 1. Does your gun fit you as it should?
- 2. Are you mounting the gun correctly on shoulder?
- 3. Is your face properly positioned on the stock?
- 4. Remember correct footwork on each station is vital.

Note: If these 4 details are not correct, you will not have gun and eye alignment, which means you will not be pointing the gun where the eye is looking. This will mean a lost target.

Having checked that your gun fit is ok and that we have no problem in mounting on the shoulder and pointing on target, let's look at how we are positioning our body on each of the five lanes. Most shooters seem to have trouble with the straight away from lane 3.

Position of the feet must be the first consideration as you get ready to call for the target. Remember, do not call until you are ready!

Photo 1 will show comfortable well balanced position of feet that will allow free and easy body movement either left or right or anywhere in between. Note how the left foot is pointing to a position similar to one o'clock on the clock face, the right foot is pointing to a position just past two o'clock, and the feet are roughly about 12-15 inches apart. Both knees are just slightly flexed to allow body weight to move from one foot to the other if required.

The gun when properly mounted on your shoulder will cross over the base of the left big toe towards the little toe during the process of swinging the gun on to and with the target. At this point a little more weight should be transferred to the left foot and a slight lean forward from the waist. This will help to keep balance and lessen the effect of recoil, while all this is happening do not forget to keep your cheek snug down on the comb.

Failure to keep your head down on the stock is the reason many straight away targets are lost. Slowing down the swing of the gun on to target or stopping the gun swing as you come on to the target are bad habits some shooters find hard to break.

Another bad habit is moving the gun before the target appears.

Looking down the Barrel.

Photo 2 shows what you should see as you look down the



barrel rib with cheek snug down on the comb of the stock.

Note how the two bead should look as you align the gun and shooting eye. Also not how the centre bead is not touching the base of the front bead. It is preferable to have a couple of inches of rib visible behind the front sight bead.

As you swing on to the target the muzzle should just brush the bottom of the target, which should be wholly visible on the end of the muzzle. Lead is established, trigger is touched off and follow through is completed as you see the target break.

One point to remember here is don't ever blot the target out with the muzzle, if you do you will probably shoot high and miss, which often happens on a straight away target.

Photo 3. Note how the butt of the sock is nicely in on the shoulder allowing the shooters face to be naturally positioned on the comb in a natural look ahead position without strain.

Note also the angle of about 45 degrees at which the gun is across the chest when properly mounted on the shoulder.

Incorrect gun positioning on the shoulder will causes no end of trouble, simply because you become unaware of what is causing poor gun pointing.

Target lead and how do we handle it. I am sure very shooter will know that if a target is moving at a certain speed we cannot point the gun directly at it and hope to break it. What we have to do in order to break the target that is travelling around 60-70 miles per hour, is allow for the distance the target will travel while the shot pattern is getting out to where it will break the target.

Position of gun hold and target lead are individual factors to a certain extent because of the variations in individual reflexes. Some people will be fast and others

will be not so fast, so you must learn to figure out your own leads and other positions to suit your own style. The leads I have quoted here are actually only for reference purpose, remember lead is relevant to the speed of your gun swing. So if I swing faster than you, I will not need quite so much lead, this is why it is impossible to give a person an exact measurement of what lead he should allow. The best advice is swing fast on to and past with trigger let off as you see the lead ahead of the target and follow through. The swing will take care of the lead factor providing you do not stop or slow down the gun swing as you approach the target. Slowing the gun swing is the cause of many targets being lost.

Maximum concentration should be on seeing the target bright and clear as it leaves the trap house. The powers of concentration should be operating 100% in order to get maximum results shot after shot. Concentration is to do mentally what we must do physically.

Due to limited space in this magazine it is not possible for me to go into an indepth description of all the problems associated with shooting the problem target. If the reader is still interested he/she will find interesting reading in my recently published book on 'How to Shoot Better Scores' at trap and skeet shooting, also on video tape. 

#### Sports Vision Workshop

A very successful sports vision workshop for the N.S.W. Junior Development Squad, their parents and coaches was held on Saturday 4th November 1995 at the Illawarra Gun Club, Dapto.

It was particularly pleasing that so many parents were in attendance to learn more about the relationship and benefits of good sports vision to athletic performance. "A very helpful day", "a very well presented eyeopener" and "it was a great lecture" were some of the comments from those who attended the workshop.

Only two of the thirty in the group were aware of sports vision. This tends to match with the typical results from sports vision screenings performed at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, the 1994 Lillehammer Olympics and at some recent Australian Championships. For example:

- \* 37% of athletes had less than 20/20 vision;
- \* 39% of athletes had never had a professional eye examination;
- \* 35% had visual symptoms affecting their athletic performance;
- \* 36% needed follow-up care for protective eye wear or contact

During the workshop, members of the Australian Optometrical Association spoke about the different types of sports vision as well as involving athletes in a number of demonstrations showing how sports performance is affected by vision.

Several key points were made during the presentation. These include:

- \* have regular eye examination from an optometrist;
- \* protect your eyes properly during sport;
- \* specific sports eyewear is available;
- \* contact lenses are ideally suited for sports and young children can use them;
- \* there are sports vision accredited optometrists with specialised equipment and knowledge to enhance your visual skills.

At the end of the presentation the squad members were given two information folders to take home - one to keep and one to pass on to their coach or club. Each member also received an Olympic t-shirt, courtesy of Bausch and Lomb, who are sponsors of the 1996 Aus-

tralian Olympic team and the Atlanta Olympic Games, and who also sponsored the free workshop.

Clay Target Shooting is one of 10 N.S.W. sports to be offered this sports vision awareness program which aims to target junior N.S.W. athletes to give them the benefit of a new edge to add to their sporting performance.

Obviously, anyone attending a field shoot at any venue away from a club's registered range is not covered by any A.C.T.A. Insurance whatsoever. The organisers of these types of events take on that responsibility. Shooters are urged to consider these facts carefully.


