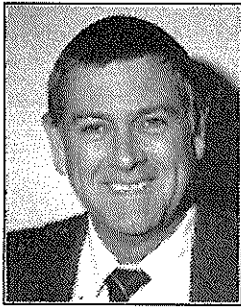

Encouraging shooters

Quite often during conversations with shooters as I visit various clubs, the most common question asked is .. what can we do to increase participation numbers?

If we had a ready answer, we would make millions selling it to sporting groups around the world. However, a number of common factors are raised time and time again. Finance, high standard of competition (in all grades), number of clubs shooting in close proximity, opposition from other shooting organisations are some of the commonly raised points.

In talking to clubs that conduct practice nights, often referred to as "Dad's Army" due to our elder shooters taking part, it is interesting to note that most of these clubs enjoy high participating numbers. This then leads to the question, "why do shooters attend these days/nights?"

Perhaps it is time we addressed our current trophy, prize, handicap formulae (both grade and distance), number of targets per event and method of shooting. Perhaps we break the competition into various sections whereby the shooter elects which prize division he wishes to compete in, and pays the appropriate entry fee. If he wishes to shoot only for a small trophy as recognition of winning the event (could be a badge or sash) he pays the base fee. If he wishes to compete for a substantial trophy, he pays a higher fee and if he wishes to compete for a major cash component he pays accordingly.

So an event could be conducted as follows:

- 50 target double barrel - Badge only - entry \$10
- Major Trophy - entry \$20
- Major Cash - entry \$30

With the major cash \$20 per shooter entering that division would be returned to the winner.

This is only a scenario, but it could be well worth considering as the shooter contributes as he elects. The number of entries in each group would govern the number of grades etc. Could we have your ideas?

One of the main things that we must do is to get enjoyment and fun into shooting. As a recreation we must enjoy it, and then we will come again and again.

1996 — Recruit a shooter

In line with the above, if each member of the A.C.T.A. gained one member for 1996, we double our membership. Sounds so very easy - guess you know someone who enjoys a challenge and is looking for an outlet. Bring him/her along and encourage them, do not try to make them an expert at their first outing. You will never see them back.

They may only have half a dozen shots at their first visit to your club, but if the atmosphere is friendly and they are made to feel welcome, they WILL come back.

Don't forget to set aside 30th June for National Promotional Day.

Federal Gun Laws

The media is constantly reporting that many meetings are taking place between politicians, police departments and the various so-called interest groups on the introduction of Federal Gun Laws.

Seems odd that established shooting organisations, such as ours, are inevitably overlooked in being included in these "discussions". Without question we should be the very first included. I guess the real reason we are not included is that we would find commonsense solutions to all the perceived problems and could travel freely throughout Australia competing in our sport.

Wouldn't it be great not to have to continually be applying for permits for other States and to travel either by road, air or sea without feeling like a criminal just because we happen to be clay target shooters with a gun as baggage.

One can only assume that the inevitable outcome of these meetings will in some way impose on us much more than that of the real issue of firearm misuse.

Should further information on this subject be forthcoming, I will detail it in this column.

The shooters enjoyed a delicious lunch organised and prepared by Jackie Poggioli and Ruth Selke with assistance from the other ladies involved in the Club. The Atherton Club members are fortunate that they have a such a hardworking and dedicated group of Ladies supporting the Club. The Club is very proud of the quality and standard of the lunch and smokos provided by these Ladies at all our Shoots.

During the lunch break the club took the opportunity to present Jackie and Ruth with a gift in appreciation of all the work and effort they have given the club over the last year. Gifts of appreciation were also given to Marge Tait and Jill Piggott who run the office so efficiently during the shoots. The Secretary, John Suner, was also presented with a gift of appreciation, as was Gill Collins, the club's Groundsman and Caretaker who, at 83 years of age, is the club's oldest member and possibly the oldest shooter still actively involved in shooting in Queensland. Our Barman Hal, who celebrated his birthday today, was also given a gift in appreciation of all the work he has given the club. Hal, who can no longer shoot due to health reasons, still gives his time and effort to supporting the club.

The Club also made history at the Christmas shoot with the awarding of the first Honorary Life Membership since the formation of the Club in 1991. The Honorary Life Membership was awarded to the club's treasurer Robbie Draper in recognition and appreciation of his dedication and commitment to the formation and development of the Atherton Tableland Gun Club. 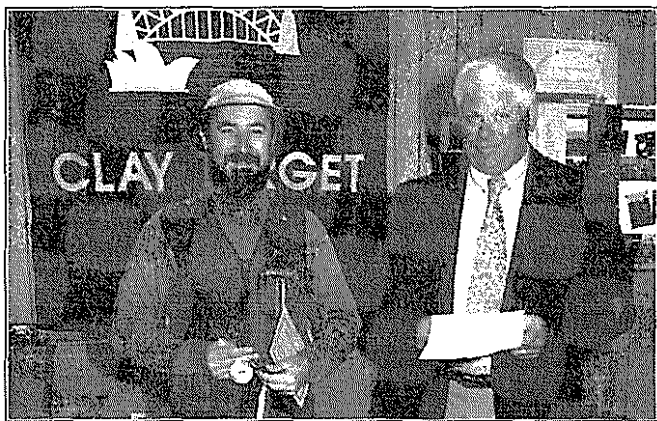

During this session Vicki touched on the benefits of maintaining diaries, as well as the mental, physical and technical components involved in competing.

With lunch over and with our volunteer bus driver, Max McKowen, everyone headed for the Majura Park Gun Club. We were met by Kim Nealon and members of the Club and made most welcome. The Squad members were broken up into groups and, while one group undertook High Speed

filming for recoil, others used the pattern board to verify all guns shot where the owners thought they did.

During the afternoon both Russell Mark and John Summers arrived to begin their section of the program. Following the evening meal, everyone assembled in the A.I.S. Gold Room to listen to Russell and John discuss International Teams and commitment to the future. With the emphasis being on "What do you want to achieve", the discussion left no doubt to the assembled Squad that to achieve genuine dedication was required.

Tuesday morning and the first part of what was to be a long day began. The Australian Sports Drug Agency (A.S.D.A.) presented Drugs in Sport. As in past years, this left no doubt as to what can and can't be used.

On arriving we were met by Michael Diamond, who was to be the specialist Coach for the day. Again the groups were split into their disciplines, but not before all the Coaches watched and observed Michael putting the Double Trap people through their paces. The day proceeded at a hectic pace with as much time as possible being given to each individual. Rules for Shooting A.C.T.A SPORTING CLAYS — Rule 3.31

Additional Rules to be read in conjunction with A.C.T.A. General Rules

Shooting Range or Grounds

(i) Following the configuration of the grounds, a sporting clays range must be equipped with a sufficient number of traps so that the competitor will shoot under conditions as near as possible to field shooting.

(ii) In order to simulate the above, targets shall be thrown at various speeds, singles or doubles, from in front or from behind, low or high, straight away, crossing, quartering or incoming, from either side.

(iii) When setting up a sporting clays course, the club concerned must make sure that the traps are positioned in such a way that they afford maximum safety to the trapper, shooters and also any spectators.

(iv) The shooting station is defined as a caged area from where the shooter will shoot his target or targets.

(v) All stands are to have muzzle restraints to limit the arc of fire to safe areas.

(a) Trajectory of Targets

At each stand, the trajectories of the targets must be similar in height, angle, distance and speed for all shooters.

At each stand which has targets on report the targets must be thrown in the same order for each shooter.

The traps will not be changed during a round unless the target becomes unreasonable to shoot.

(b) Traps

Targets will be propelled by, and launched from any mechanical device which can achieve the desired trajectory and speed, using approved targets. Release may be by any means capable of producing the required release.

Devices which propel more than one target are acceptable.

Devices propelling targets of more than one type, and devices capable of providing targets at varying angles may be employed, but only in such a fashion that all targets presented are the same for all shooters.

(c) Squads

The shooting will occur in squads with a maximum of 5 shooters.

Shooters may shoot for targets only at the discretion of the host club.

No.1. Shooter will commence at Station No.1., and after each station change he shall continue to commence the shooting on each station. Each station must be completed before moving to the next station, 5 shooters at 5 stations rotate until 25 targets are attempted.

(d) Procedure

A target from each trap will be shown at the commencement of each round.

A round will consist of 25 targets with no more than 10 pairs of doubles per round.

A round may include: (1) Single targets. (2) Simultaneous doubles - where two targets are released simultaneously. (3) Singles on report - when the second target can only be released when a shot has been fired at the first target. (4) Following pair (Rafale) - two single targets released one after the other in rapid succession. Piggy back doubles - or two targets released one on top of the other.

Two cartridges can be used on each single target, but only two car-

tridges to be loaded into the gun at the one time.

The shooter must be ready to commence shooting when called, and must take enough ammunition and equipment to complete the round.

The order of shooting targets shall be marked on a board placed in front of each station.

(e) Targets

Regulation Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown as well as Mini, Midi, Battue, Rocket, Rabbit or Flash targets may be thrown or any other sporting clay target approved by the association.

Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the Shoot officials, but shall number five (5) in total.

(f) No Targets

As for general rules Trap and Skeet with these additions.

If double targets collide and break prior to being fired at.

If a target is released from the incorrect trap.

If two targets are thrown simultaneously, when a single should have been thrown or vice versa.

In a simultaneous double, either from a single or from two traps, either target is broken on leaving the trap, or breaks prior to being fired at.

In a rafale pair, if either targets are broken on leaving the trap, or breaks prior to being fired at.

(g) Doubles with Second on Report

The second target when shooting doubles on report is to be released immediately on report of the first shot.

If a shooter has a malfunction on the first shot when shooting doubles on report he will be able to repeat the pair of targets.

If the malfunction occurs on the second target, the result of the first shot counts. A proof pair will be thrown to determine the result of the second target.

If the second target is thrown simultaneously or before the first target has been fired upon, proof pair thrown to determine the result of both targets. If first target fired upon, abide by result, proof pair thrown to determine result of second target.

(h) Ties

If two or more shooters in an individual event or two or more teams in a teams event have the same score in a competition the shoot off for placings will be decided by the host club, on not less than ten targets.

A competitor eligible for a shoot off is not permitted to practice that event between the event and the shoot off. To do so is automatic disqualification.

(i) Gun Position

Gun position is optional. When a shooter is ready he will call pull or some word of command. At all stations the gun must be fired from the shoulder.

(j) Guns and Ammunition

All smooth bore shotguns are allowed providing their gauge does not exceed 12 gauge and their length is not less than 63cm overall.

No additional handicap will be given to shooters using guns of

gauge smaller than 12 gauge. Straps or slings must be removed before competing.

Ammunition to be any commercially available load or its equivalent in hand load not larger than No.6., and be not greater than 28g or (1oz) struck measure or equivalent.

A maximum of two cartridges are allowed in any gun at any one time.

(k) Grading Formula

AA Grade 85% to 100%

A Grade 75% to 84.99%

B Grade 65% to 74.99%

C Grade 0% to 64.99%

To be decided on a shooters last two hundred (200) targets.

Upgrading will take place every 200 targets. Downgrading every 600 targets. All completed rounds of 25 including shoot offs will be used.

All ungraded shooters will be graded on their first 50 targets, which will then become part of their first 200 targets.

Shoot organisers have the option of combining AA and A grade

(l) National Titles

Shall be a minimum of 150 targets. Two days may be taken to conduct this event.

(m) State Titles

Shall be a minimum of 75 targets.

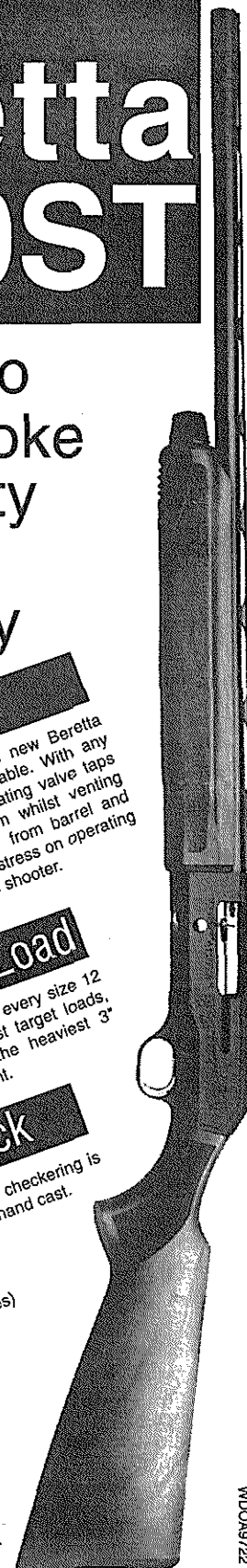

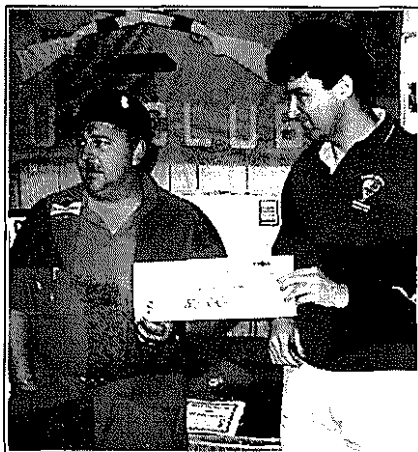

The Club wishes to invite all clay target shooters and their families to support our 1996 Camp Quality Shoot.

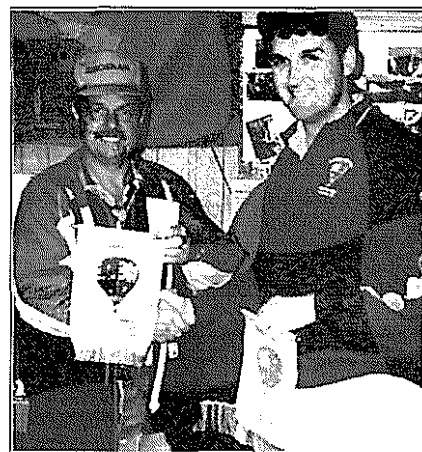

To Stan's wife Lil and family, all members extend their

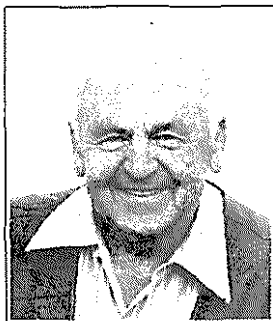
warmest thoughts and sympathy.

— Special Ballot Meeting —

11/12/28

Nobel Clay Bird Club Committee meeting. A letter received from the Gun Clubs Association (G.C.A.) requesting a reply re affiliation with the G.C.A. stating they are willing to extend the time until January 31st, 1929, for a decision.

22/1/29

Special Ballot Meeting held at the Mitre Tavern
Mr J.W. Sutherland in the chair.

30 members and Committee were present, Mr Sutherland opened the meeting and introduced Mr Poole and Mr Miller who were to act as scrutineers for the ballot to take place. Ballot was then taken and result declared as follows: Against joining the G.C.A. 44; For joining the G.C.A. 36.

Mr Sutherland proposed a vote of thanks to Mr Poole and Mr Miller for the very thorough manner in which they handled the ballot.



Tom Power, Melbourne Live Bird Club

Tom was Secretary of the Melbourne Gun Club before and during the war years. Note the method of gun mounting. 26/2/29

Club Committee Meeting Mitre Tavern

Chairman Mr J. Sutherland, Committee present Messrs L. Bloom, Hall, Shilling, Rutledge, James.

Mr Guthrie, Manager for Nobels was present. Mr Guthrie addressed the meeting to explain his attitude towards the club and that he wished a Nobel club to join the G.C.A. as his company's policy was to foster all kinds of shooting and he would like to hold Championships on the Nobel Gun Club grounds and while he realised that there was a great number of the members who were against joining, he did think it could be overcome by forming two clubs and that the second club be called another name and not register or that the present club pay 21 shillings and join and then withdraw if not satisfactory.

A great deal of discussion took place by the members of the committee and visitors. Mr Hall very clearly defined the position of the clay bird club stating that the club must abide by the majority vote taken at the special meeting called and asked Mr Guthrie if his company were willing to allow the club to carry on as usual and Mr Guthrie said decidedly yes. It was then agreed to allow Mr Guthrie to take the name of 'Nobel' from the present club and that they would rename the club and carry on without joining the 'Gun Clubs Association'.

Mr L. Bloom moved and seconded by Mr Hall that the new name of the club would be Melbourne Amateur Clay Bird Club (carried).

The President Mr J.W. Sutherland then intimated that as he was a live bird shooter more than a clay bird shot he thought that it would be better for the club if he resigned and would wish the club every success and give it every help possible. He then tendered his resignation which was received with much regret and be recorded in the minutes. Mr Sutherland proposed Mr O. Evans for President, seconded Mr C. Hall - carried unanimously.

Mr Horrie James proposed a vote of thanks to Mr Guthrie for his interest in the club and thanking him for coming to

the meeting and enlightening the members (carried by acclamation).

Committee Meeting 5/3/29

Mr O.D. Evans President; Committee Messrs Anquith, Bloom, Hall, Richards, Ruttledge, Sainsbury, Shilling.

The President Mr Evans explained to the meeting that he had a meeting with Mr Guthrie whose wish it was now

that the club retain the name of the "Nobel Clay Bird Club". It was then moved that the motion passed at the previous meeting relative to renaming the club be rescinded, and that the club's name be "The Nobel Clay Bird Club" as originally suggested.

It was moved by Mr Ruttledge that the Secretary write to the Gun Club's Association of Victoria advising it that Nobel Clay Bird Club decided not to affiliate with the G.C.A. Mr Ruttledge also suggested sending a letter to all members of the club notifying them of the result of the ballot, re affiliation with the G.C.A.

Committee Meeting 27/5/29

A letter from Mr Cooper wanting to know about how to form a clay bird club at Cann River in East Gippsland and what requirements were needed. The Club Secretary was instructed to write to Mr Cooper and give him all information possible and state that the Nobel Club is the foremost clay bird club in Victoria, and that the automatic trap at the ground is the only one of its kind in Victoria. Also to invite any member of his club to the Nobel club if they should be in Melbourne at any time.

2nd. Cartridges

The Secretary was instructed to have notices in the club pavilion that 2nd cartridges can only be used from the 18 yard mark and over, and also a notice that in future, when a competitor accidentally fires a cartridge before he is ready to shoot, it is to be counted as a first barrel shot and he only has the second barrel to fire when he calls pull.

Committee Meeting September 9, 1929

Letter from the 'Gun Clubs Association' was received asking to be advised if the Nobel Gun Club had definitely decided to join the G.C.A. or decided otherwise.

Mr Shilling took exception to the wording of the letter as he had when Secretary Pro Tem, carried out the instructions of the Committee and sent to the Secretary of the G.C.A. notice that the Nobel club had decided not to affiliate with the G.C.A.

Letter in reply to the G.C.A.

After much discussion of the matter Mr Ruttledge moved

that the following letter be sent to the Secretary of the G.C.A.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 5th and would like to point out to you that on the 11th March last you were advised that our club had decided not to affiliate with the G.C.A. As some of our members have expressed a desire to join the G.C.A. the matter will be brought before the General Meeting on September 25th and you will be in due course advised of the result. Signed O. Evans 14/10/29.

Annual Meeting 25/9/19 held at Mitre Tavern

Notice of Motion

Mr Sharp moved that the Nobel Clay Bird Club affiliate with the Gun Clubs Association of Victoria. Mr Sutherland said he had much pleasure in seconding the motion.

Mr Shilling moved as an amendment, that the Nobel Clay Bird Club try and get some agreement with the G.C.A. of Vic without actually affiliating. Mr Sainsbury supported the amendment.

Mr Evans supported the motion. Mr Hislop on being assured that affiliation would not make it compulsory to have sweepstakes, supported the motion, as it would allow several shooters to compete again. Mr Corbett supported the motion and said that shooting at the Nobel club was much cheaper than any other club.

Mr Hall spoke in favour of the amendment, as he could not see that the club would gain by affiliating. Mr Sharp said he could not see why the G.C.A. should have to alter their Articles of Association to suit the Nobel club.

Mr O'Shannassy spoke in favour of the amendment and said the G.C.A. appeared to be very anxious for the club to affiliate. He thought affiliating would re-act against the novice shooters.

The Chairman then put the amendment which was lost 8 voting for it.

The motion was then put and carried.

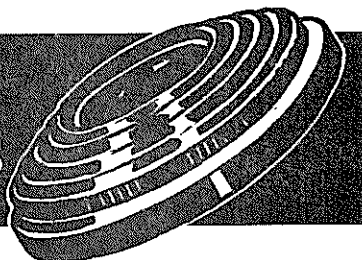

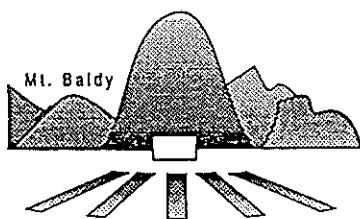
