Orange(#45) Dull cloudy days. Blocks blue light and enhances the orange of the target.



Sunset Orange(#49) Bright, hazy conditions. Slightly darker than orange to absorb scattered or stray blue light.



Ranger Bronze(#50) Very bright, hazy sunlight. Stray blue light absorbing qualities which enhance target outline.



<u>Light Purple(#47)</u> Combines grey and vermilion. It dampens the green and enhances the orange target against tall trees.



Pale Yellow(#48) The light colour tint allows this lens to be used indoors, outdoors, flat light, or at night.



Vermilion(#46) Highlights conditions where there is poor background such as trees. Enhances the target against the background.



Yellow(#43) For hazy, foggy days or late afternoon. This will block out much of the blue light.



Brown(#44) A blue blocking lens for bright open background and bright glarey days.



Clear(#42) For shooting indoors when no contrast between target and background is desired. Also, excellent for safety lens while hand loading.



Grey(#41) Transmits all colours at the same level. For use on bright days. Does not enhance target, just brings light down. Use in direct sun conditions.

Event 2, the 50T D/B, and once again possibles were the order of the day with 15 being recorded. At the end of shooting on Saturday there was still six shooters in the shoot-off after having gone to 300. The shoot-off continued at 8.00am on Sunday and another 100 targets later saw Merv Hass victorious over Mike Swale who dropped his 400th target.

Event 3 on Saturday was the 25T points, with once again possibles the order with 12 being recorded. The shoot-off for this event was held on Sunday after the completion of the D/B shoot-off, with Geoff Fett from The Sunshine Coast outlasting Mike Swale 216/216.

Event 5, 25T D/B and 25T points, and once again excellent shooting saw 8 possibles on the board. After deciding enough was enough, Paul Clarkson from Brisbane and Mike Swale shared the spoils.

Event 6, the 25T D/B 20m; for the most this was the last opportunity to be big and 13 at least thought so. At the end of the day George Hogarth emerged the victor on 86/86.

The Overall High Gun was Mike Swale with 299/300.

For those shooters out there who like seeing red scores on the board, then this weekend would have been a joy to see.

Excellent shooting and targets set correctly made this a most enjoyable and memorable weekend for all those who attended.

It is to his memory that the N.S.W. Gun Club have set up the Charles Waterhouse Memorial Trophy. It is hoped that as many as possible will attend at this competition to honour and respect the passing of Charlie Waterhouse so that he lives on.

1995 President's Report to the Annual General Meeting

1995 again was a very successful year for our Association.

Our shooters continued to produce outstanding results, both internationally and domestically. Our Association had a very stable year and it was a successful year financially.

Our first international trip for the year was to the Oceania Games in Auckland, New Zealand, with one of our largest contingents of shooters ever to travel overseas together. Our gains were outstanding with no less than six quota spots being gained, and records falling in most events. The Oceania Games included for the first time team form DTL and Skeet in the hope that we can strengthen these events within the Oceania region and encourage some of our Pacific neighbours to participate in the Oceania Games. Graham Michell ably managed the team, with coaches Col Burt and Fred Schmetzer efficiently carrying out their duties. The wins of individuals and teams are too numerous to mention. Congratulations to all.

March saw a number of our shooters back into New Zealand for their Nationals. Australia again dominated with Adrian Cousens winning the individual Skeet and our Glenn Trophy team of Adrian, Neil Dimmick, John Withers, Reg Clarke and Scott Wright successful in bringing the trophy back to Australia.

In the trap events Roger Duthie (Minis), Bill Iles (Single Barrel and High Gun), 'Chippa' Chant (Single Rise) were our Champions.

Also in March, we hosted the inaugural Australasian Pacific 'Grand Prix' at the Brisbane Gun Club. The 'Grand Prix' was, as they stated, a resounding success. Congratulations must go to the Organisers, and all involved are confident of the future success of this event.

March was certainly our busiest month with Melbourne Gun Club and the V.C.T.A. hosting the 1995 Trap Nationals. A hot air balloon 'dropping in', a few European wasps and good weather provided the backdrop for a very successful Nationals. Our Kiwi friends again crossed the Tasman to provide International competition, but despite their enthusiasm, the Glenn Cup was wrested from them by our team of Michael Diamond, Russell Mark, Steve Atkins, Robert Nisbet and Dino Oliviero.

Our best event was the Double Barrel with some 574 entrants fighting it out, until Michael Diamond's score of 749/749 won him the title. Our thanks to all who contributed to the success of the event.

We again had reason to stand tall in June with Steve Haberman becoming World Double Trap Champion at the World Championships in Cyprus. Our team performed extremely well winning no less than seven medals. Ben Kelley is also to be congratulated for equalling the Junior World Record in the trap event. Our gratitude to all involved.

Illawarra Gun Club played host to our second Sporting Clays Nationals which we host jointly with the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia and all who attended thoroughly enjoyed themselves. Congratulations to David Cunningham on his Overall win of the title.

The third Nationals are to be hosted by the V.C.T.A. and Melbourne Gun Club and will take place on November 29, 30 and December 1 1996.

Our 1995 Skeet Nationals were hosted by Townsville Gun Club and again proved successful. Again we had a number of New Zealand visitors who managed to "steal" some of our titles. The Overall High Gun was Ray Porter of the Brisbane Gun Club.

Our Olympic Discipline Nationals were moved to October and it was West Australia's turn to take the limelight. The magnificent W.A. complex again made it a pleasure for shooters to attend

The Overall Trap High Gun at the end of the Carnival was Brant Woodward with a score of 357/375, Junior Trap High Gun was Nathan McDonnell 353/375, and Ladies High Gun Lisa Smith 319/375. Clive Barton of Tamworth took the ISU Skeet High Gun with 360/375.

1995 saw the introduction of our revised method of scoring Pointscore events, and now that shooters have become familiar with it the vast majority are in favour of it.

Next year we are to host the World Down the Line Championships which will be held at Wagga immediately following our Trap Nationals.

The very efficient and professional team from New South Wales are already well into the organising of the event and no doubt it will be a success.

Murray Alexander has again been extremely busy in his role of National Director of Coaching and he is ably assisted by each State Coaching Co-ordinator. With the requirements demanding much time in these positions, these people are to be congratulated.

The Australian Sports Commission again must be thanked by all for their continued support to our sport. In addition to the A.S.C., we must also express our gratitude to our sponsors Winchester Australia, Fuller Firearms, Olimpyc Targets and Raytrade for their generous support. Without these sponsors our Association could not provide the outstanding trophies at any of our Nationals.

Thanks also to all those sponsors whom have supported our Club events, it is very much appreciated. We must also thank the organisations, individuals and clubs with their continued contributions and advertising in the C.T.S.N.

During 1996 you will continue to see changes for the better in the Clay Target Shooting News due to the efforts of the Promotional & Development Committee, our Office Staff and Mr Jim Shepherd. We are grateful for their input.

In order to attract new members to our Association a National Clay Target Day is being organised for June 30 1996. This everybody's chance of promoting and strengthening our sport by increasing members. Remember all its takes to 2 or 3 members per club and we have an additional 800 members. So keep this day free and bring along a friend.

During the year Mr Graham Mahoney retired from the National Executive and I would like to thank him sincerely for his time and contribution to the ACTA. We welcome Mr Vince Mollica to our National Executive and look forward to his input and trust that it will be enjoyable and productive.

In closing, I must sincerely thank all members of the National Executive, and our National Office Staff of Graeme, Leanne, Gina and Manon. Their support and input has been outstanding.

It then becomes each A.S.A. affiliate's responsibility to be mindful of their obligation under their particular "field of interest".

Field & Game is not an assigned "field of interest" of the A.C.T.A. - fact clearly obvious to most, especially the N.S.W. Field & Game Association.

The Southern Zone meeting which was held to discuss the very issues Mr. McGee refers to was unable to attract any representative of the Shoalhaven Club - this being unfortunate, as attendance would have led to Club members being better informed.

Whilst Mr. McGee's definition of "field of interest" may look good to some, I doubt insurance companies or courts of law would be interested.

The Shoalhaven CTC has chosen their direction without inquiry to or consultation with either the Southern Zone or N.S.W. Clay Target Associations. Fortunately, some other N.S.W. Clubs have contacted the State Office for information and have been satisfied with the outcome.

in our nation's history. A lot of Club history and memorabilia that is peculiar to each gun club was lost for evermore.

At around the same time, Local Government was casting it's beady eye on available land to establish a new Shire Office complex. Yep! EGGC range land was the apple of that beady eye. What was airport land, that formed part of the overshoot

safety zone, was rezoned by Local Government as residential development. Late 1993 the Club acquired land for a new shooting complex. After much negotiations with DOLA and the other leases (mining), we had 800m x 400m of virgin goldfields bushland. Clearing and fencing started.

Meanwhile shooting carried on at the old range, sometimes interrupted by developers being in the safety zone. This can tend to make a Club's annual shooting program redundant on the day. 1994 also saw the introduction of the 2 shifts in 24 hours in the mining sector, having dire results on attendance to both shoots and busy bees. In 1995, EGGC could no longer shoot on home range, as the new range was under construction, and the old range was encroached by housing development. Our nearest neighbour, Kambalda Gun Club was in recess, largely due to the 2 x 24 hour shift rosters. EGGC made its presence felt by occasional 460km

round trips to Leonora (magnificent hosts), and thus enhancing the friendly rivalry that exists between us.

Local businesses rallied when called upon, and we are very grateful to them for the invaluable assistance. At long last, the day is here. February 4th 1996, or first official shoot on our new range, at 1:30pm with the temperature hovering at about 43 degrees C, nineteen shooters pitted themselves against such trying conditions.

Entries in your 1996 Shooters Record Book....The Correct Procedure

It seems that some shooters are having a problem with filling in their Shooters Record Book. I hope this explanation will be of help.

DTL Section:

All Double Barrel/Points Targets shot under Common Mark (15metres) conditions, will be entered on your card under the Double Barrel columns.

After 200 targets, (or after the end of a Shoot-off, or end of the Event) a shooter will be re-graded if necessary.

For Downgrading - 3 x consecutive 200 targets at a lower grade, will apply.

After 200 targets, ALL columns will be ruled off.

1996 D.T.L. Nationals

All shooters are advised that the A.C.T.A. has changed the colour of the targets for the Nationals to full fluro.

The choice of fluro targets for the Nationals was made by the A.C.T.A. National Executive, who accept full responsibility for target choice, which was not the recommendation of both the Tasmanian Gun Club and the Tasmanian Clay Target Association.

Other Events Column:

Scores shot Continental or Single Barrel will be entered in this column.

Only ONE of these scores shall be used in calculation of a percentage once 200 targets Double Barrel are ruled off.

Your Progressive Total (Double Barrel only), will be recorded in this column. After 200 targets all Columns will be Ruled off.

All WINS must be recorded in the 'W' Column, either GW (Grade) or OW (Overall).

DTL Handicap Section:

All Handicap Scores, shot under competition conditions will be entered on your Handicap Card.

These scores will be ruled off after 200 targets are shot.

Inward Movement of 1 metre will apply for every 200 Handicap targets shot, unless a penalty has been incurred, within the 200 targets.

1 metre Backward movement will apply to any Handicap Win regardless of score.

All scores will then be ruled off.

A shooters Handicap Mark will not be changed if his/her DTL Grade is Downgraded. This will change only if the shooter is re-graded upwards, then only to the lowest of that grade.

Skeet Section:

All Skeet targets, (in full rounds of 25), shot in competition, will be recorded in your Score Book, under this section.

A shooter will be regraded if necessary after 200 targets (8 \times 25 tgts).

For Downgrading - 3 x Consecutive 200 targets below Grade percentage, will apply.

All Wins will be recorded, either GW (Grade) or OW (Overall) in the 'W' column.

Tower Section: As with DTL.

Ball Trap Section: As with DTL.

Please Note: Grade percentages of these Events are different, please check your Rule Book.

ISU Sections: Olympic Trap & Skeet

All Double Barrel/Skeet targets will be recorded in your Score

After 250 targets are shot, re-grading will apply if necessary. This will then be ruled off.

In Trap, if 250 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, regrading will not take place until completion of the Event.

Downgrading will apply only after 3 x consecutive 250 targets are shot, at a lower percentage.

ISU Double Trap Section:

These will be recorded in the Doubles column only.

A Shooter may be upgraded after 150 pairs, but must shoot 300 pairs at a lower grade percentage, to be downgraded.

Remember shooters, it is ultimately your responsibility to make sure your 1996 Registered Shooter Record Book is filled in correctly.

Please check your book after every shoot.

Victorian Level 1 Accreditation Seminar

Maryborough, 10th & 11th February 1996

Following his appointment as Victorian State Coaching Coordinator, Mr. Gary Cassells began the task of resurrecting Coaching within his State.

Victoria, due to varying reasons had, over the past few years, suffered a downturn in Accredited Coaches. Gary identified these areas and set about injecting a new enthusiasm into his Coaches and the search for new Accreditation candidates.

This enthusiasm appears to be working as there appears now to be a steady trickle back of Coaches that had previously appeared disillusioned. To further demonstrate that Coaching is alive and well in Victoria, Gary received requests from Clubs and individuals for an Accreditation Course to be conbatoub

As an Accreditation Course under the new revised format had not previously been conducted in Victoria, Gary made contact with me and together we programmed a course for February 10th & 11th at Maryborough Gun Club. The numbers soon grew to an extent that Accreditation Courses will now be conducted in other Zones to ease the numbers at this initial

To maintain the momentum of Coaching, Gary involved several Level 2 Coaches and Zone Coaches as presenters alongside myself to spread the workload and obtain a solid base for future courses. The attending Coaches were:

For the course, 12 members were invited to undertake the weekend course which formed part of the full 12 months program. The attending members were:

Saturday morning got underway at 10.00am with an overview of the Course and what is involved in the 12 months of the program. This was followed by the component - Role of the Coach and Instructional Methods - both presented by myself.

John McVitty then delivered his first task on Program Planning and Goal Setting. With a short break for lunch taken it was Jim Shepherd's turn to present the difficult subject of Sports Psychology. Layout, then the Skeet Layout to discuss the various methods involved in the Basics of Shotgun Shooting.

As the day proceeded a set of practical coaching scenarios were presented to the now divided groups to instigate a practical involvement in a Coaching situation. With the guinea

pigs for this practical section being Gary Cassells - D.T.L. and Jim Shepherd - Skeet, the trainee Coaches undertook their assigned tasks. After a set time we all headed back to the Blub rooms where each group leader presented their findings and observations.

To add to the overall picture of Coaching, two Coaches had been assigned to the task of observing all the practical work. and both Frank James and John McVitty presented their overviews to this segment.

Finally, the course came to its conclusion with a round table discussion on the two days and naming of the Supervising Coaches and those under their care.

For Gary and myself the weekend had been a great success and would now lead into other Accreditation Courses being conducted in other Zones throughout Victoria.

To the participants who spoke with enthusiasm about the course, we wish you enjoyment for your involvement in Coaching. To Phylis James who continually assisted us over the weekend, thank you, as well as to Gary and Jim's wives who prepared the meals.

Thanks also to the Maryborough Gun Club for the use of their facilities, the Coaches who presented the different sections, and the V.C.T.A. for their support.

Rule 1.18 Walk Up

(a) change 25 metre mark to 22 metre mark

change 22 metre mark to 20 metre mark

Hence the Rule shall read: Walk-up events shall be shout double barrel from No.3 lane, squad system. The competitor shall load his gun at the 22 metre mark; when ready in this position he commences to walk at a normal walking pace, holding his gun in such a position that the butt of the gun must be level with his hip and cannot be mounted to the shoulder until the target is released. The Referee shall release the target between the 20 metre and 15 metre marks inclusive, the mark being unknown to the competitor, having previously been determined by an indicator or dice. No.1. competitor shoots at one target, he then returns to the rear of the squad, each competitor doing the same in turn.

Rule 2.3(h)

Delete: All shooters who shoot 50 targets straight from or behind their handicap mark and are not re-handicapped under Rules 2.3(b), 2.3(c), will be handicapped 1 metre. A shooter can only be re-handicapped 1 metre per event, except as in Rule 2.3(b), 2.3(g).



On the weekend of the 3rd and 4th of February, the Collie Clay Target Club held the 1996 West Coast Open.


