In my experience there are no winners other that the legal profession in such ventures.


CTSN


SCORES ENTERED IN SHOOTERS RECORD BOOK

Please note: As per rule2.1(h) 2.3(a) it is the responsibility of a designated club official to note the club, the date and to fill out the scores.

It is the shooters responsibility to ensure that this has been carried out that all scores entered are correct and that the progressive total column is completed.

Shooters should also note that if a downgrade is not accepted after the appropriate 600 targets, ie 3 brackets of 200 (at a lesser grade) then the shooter must accept the higher grade for a further 600 targets.

For downgrading purposes progressive brackets of 200 targets shot in the previous year at a lower percentage is to be carried forward to the next year.



Blue Manna Carnival

The Bunbury Clay Target Club held their annual 2-day Blue Manna Carnival on the long weekend of 2nd and 3rd March 1996.

As a trial, a 50T DB Fools Pool event was held on the Friday night which attracted 31 shooters.

For the early birds on Saturday morning a cooked breakfast was served at the Club, courtesy of Walter and Sandy Lew and Vince Marney. Then down to business with the first event, the P.J. Usher Memorial 25T DB, which went to a shoot-off of 80/80 before J. Boschetti emerged the winner.

Five possibles came in out of the last event, the 50T DB Koombana Cup and, after a lengthy shoot-off, David Fox won with 146/146.



State Trap Carnival - Cobar



U.I.T. Rules

Updating of Current Rules to become effective 1st January 1996

Special Technical Rules for Final Competition in the Olympic Shooting Disciplines

1.1. In the qualification events of Trap, Double Trap and Skeet ties will not be broken according to General Technical Rules 12.2., if the first three place winners tie. The classification for the first three places in the Qualification rounds will be made according to the rules set down for places 4 to 6 (clay target) according to section 12 of the appropriate Special Technical Rule book. In cases of unbreakable ties the Jury shall decide by drawing lots.

1.1.1 Finalists in each event: Trap, Double Trap and Skeet: 6 Competitors.

1.1.1.2. Trap, Double Trap and Skeet: Ties among two or more shooters must be decided according to places 4 through 6 under Special Technical Rules 12.1.4. Ties in the sixth place will be broken by shoot off in accordance with Rules 1.8.4.2, 1.8.4.3 and 1.8.4.4

1.2 Reporting to the Range for Finals: Team Leaders are responsible and must present their shooters, at the Preparation Area, and report to the Jury at least 20 minutes before the scheduled starting time, complete with all their shooting equipment needed for the final event. They must be dressed and have only the required shooting equipment. They will be given their new start numbers imprinted with their placing, family name, and Olympic abbreviation of their National Olympic Committee, which must be won on the back, above the waistline.

1.2.1. deleted.

1.8.4.1. In case of tied scores after the Finals series the shooters who are tied will shoot off until the tie is broken. Starting positions will be decided by lot drawn by the Jury.

1.8.4.2. Trap - All tied shooters will shoot one shot station after station in sequence until a "Lost" target is recorded. Each shooters shall load his shotgun with only one (1) cartridge on each station. Each shooter must shoot at the same number of stations and targets. The shooter who records the first "Lost" target is the loser. If th shooter has loaded the shotgun with two cartridges and fires at the target with one shot only the result must be recorded and Special Technical Rule 6.1.7. applied. If two shots are fired a "Lost" target will automatically be recorded.

1.8.4.3. Double Trap - All tied shooters will shoot a regular double, station after station in sequence, in the order decided by the Jury, starting on station 1 to station 5 until the tie is broken. All tied shooters must shoot on the same number of stations and at the same number of targets.

1.8.4.4. Skeet - All tied shooters must shoot at regular doubles only in sequence on stations 3-4-5 in the starting order decided by the Jury. All tied shooters must shoot on the same stations at the same number of targets. The shooter who hist the least number of targets on the respective station is the loser.

1.9.1.1. In case of an allowable malfunction, the results of all th other finalists should not be shown. The other finalists must wait until the shooter(s) with the malfunction shoots (in the allowed time). After that, all the results should be shown together and the Final can continue.

Special Technical Rules for Clay Target Shooting

2.8 Ear Protection: All shooters and other personnel in the immediate vicinity of the firing line are to wear ear plugs, ear muffs, or similar ear protection. Ear protectors incorporating any type of receiving devices are not permitted for shooters.

12.0 Tie Breaking: Ties in Olympic events for men and

women (specified in Article 3.2 General Regulations) will be decided according to STR for Final Competitions in Olympic Shooting Disciplines, Art. 1.8.4.

Ties in non-olympic events and categories will be decided as follows:

Ties for shooters with perfect scores will not be broken.

Ties for the first three places must be decided by a shoot off. All shooters tied for third place will be ranked according to the score from the shoot off series.

If the shoot-off time is not announced in advance, the shooters involved must remain in touch with the Jury, whether personally or through their Team Leader in order to be ready to shoot when the shoot-off is called. Shoot-offs should be started within a maximum of 30 minutes after regular shooting is completed (see Rules T.12.1.1., D.12.1.2. and S.12.1.3.

T.12.1.1. Trap: If two or more shooters have equal scores for the first three places in the event, they will all shoot one shot station after station in sequence until a "Lost" target is recorded. Each shooter shall load his shotgun with only one (1) cartridge on each station. Each shooter must shoot at the same number of stations and targets. The shooter who records the first "Lost" target is the loser. If the shooter has loaded the shotgun with two cartridges and fires at the target with one shot only the result must be scored and rule 6.1.7 applied. If two shots are fired a "Lost" target will automatically be recorded.

D.12.1.2. Double Trap: If two or more shooters have equal scores for the first three (3) places in the event, they will all shoot a regular double, station after station in sequence, in the order decided by the Jury, starting on station 1 to station 5 until the tie is broken. All tie shooters must shoot on the same number of stations and at the same number of targets.

S.12.1.3. Skeet: If two or more shooters have equal scores for the first three (3) places in the event, they will all shoot at regular doubles only in sequence on station 3-4-5 in the starting order decided by the Jury. All tied shooters must shoot on the same stations and the same number of targets. The shooter who hits the least number of targets on the respective station is the loser.

12.1.4. Individual 4th through 8th places ties must be broken by the scores of the last round of 25 targets (25 doubles for men or 20 doubles for women in Double Trap). In case of an unbroken tie, the round before the last round must be counted, etc. If the results of all rounds are equal, ties must be decided by counting from the first target of the last round (next to the last round etc) forward until a zero is found and the shooter with the most hits in succession must be given the higher place.

12.1.5. Individual scores ranking 9th place and below must be listed in equal rank in alphabetical order by family name in the Latin alphabet with an appropriate number of spaces left


After reading 'Presidents Notes' in March issue of CTSN and your invitation to members for items for a better magazine I would like to suggest the following.

The first full daytime shoot of the year was held last Sunday (March 10th) at the Mount Isa Gun Club, and it would have to be called successful. Eighteen shooters attended, including the President and Secretary of the newly formed Cloncurry Gun Club.

Fifty targets of Skeet was called for first up, with the opening shot being fired at 9.30am. Phil Leddick strung together a very respectable 49/50 to claim A Grade, with Neil Sinclair holding out to win B Grade 44/50. Rod Cusack's 41/50 was quite a good score under the prevailing conditions and earned him the C Grade trophy.

Due to the Club holding it's Annual General Meeting at the Shoot, only one event was shot before the break.

With hunger pangs fully sated and the future of the Club decided, it was "Once more into the Fray", this time with 50 Targets Pointscore. Cloncurry Gun Club President, Gary Brown, wasted no time in putting his claim on A Grade with 147/150.

On this occasion none could match him and the trophy was his. A very determined Mick Coleman held out Neil Sinclair and Ron Power to win B Grade with 134/150, while Betty Fawcett put her name on the C Grade trophy with a score of 126/150.

The second event after lunch was the "Front Marker Special", Handicap, and Sam Edmonds had to do it the hard way. Shoot 24/25 and then beat Martin Allen in the shoot-off.

Sam finished with 28/34 to claim first place with Martin just one point behind in second. Third place wasn't a giveaway either. Ted Matthews and Brian Palethorpe shot it out over 12 shoot-off targets before Ted emerged victorious with a final score of 34/37.

The finale of the day was 25 Targets Continental and once again Ted Matthews loomed large with a score of 25/25. Not to be outdone, Bruce Murphy also carded 25/25 and then went on to defeat Ted in the shoot-off.

The final winning A Grade score 38/38. Ron Power had no trouble picking up his only win of the day and took home the B Grade trophy with his well shot 24/25.

C Grade once again called for a shoot-off, this time a three-way event with Greg Moncrieff, Sam Edmonds and Martin Allen. Threes figured predominantly in C Grade as it only took Martin 3 shoots to defeat the opposition and claim C Grade with 24/33.

Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"

The outstanding International event of 1996

The Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" of Olympic Discipline clay target shooting held at Brisbane Gun Club, Queensland has now come and gone, and has been hailed by all concerned as an outstanding success and certainly the major International competition of the region's shooting calendar.

In all, nearly 150 shooters from ten countries and every mainland State of Australia competed at the "Grand Prix". Shooters from England, Ireland, Japan, Singapore, Sabah, West Malaysia, Hong Kong, New Caledonia, New Zealand as well as our own enthusiasts competed during the week of events.

Prior to the commencement of the competition, the A.C.T.A. National Training Squad comprising all of Australia's top Open, Lady and Junior shooters in Olympic Trap, I.S.U. Skeet and Double Trap attended a three-day "live in" training camp, utilising the Brisbane Gun Club's facilities and learning from many specialist coaches in a variety of fields.

International competitors for the competition were very keen to do well, with many from the northern hemisphere arriving early to acclimatise after the severe northern winter. Kevin Gill and Terry O'Connor from England, and Tom Allen were all scheduled to be amongst the first to arrive, but the "Irish" factor saw Tom Allen miss a connecting flight and spend St. Patrick's Day still in transit from Heathrow.

More locally, our friends from New Caledonia and some of the large New Zealand contingent also came in early to take

advantage of the programmed practice sessions.

The first official day of the competition was "official practice day", Monday 18th March. Practice took place all day, with ranges open for Olympic Trap, Double Trap and I.S.U. Skeet practice. Conditions were warm and humid, a bit of a shock for many, but certainly to the liking of the shooters from Sabah (Borneo) who made mention that it was a "bit cool".

With a full morning of practice also programmed for Tuesday 19th March, the scene was now set for the conducting of the first event - a 60 target Double Trap Badge Match to be shot over two layouts, 15 pair (30 targets) shot at each visit. The "big guns" were expected to show the expertise in the double trap events and the predictions proved not to be wrong, Adam Vella and current World Champion Steve Haberman recording the top score on the day. National Training Squad and team members Russell Mark (Victoria) and Phil Melvin (W.A.), along with juniors Brett Hall (N.T.) and Nathan Cassells (Victoria), Englishman Kevin Gill,

Queenslanders Angelo Zappala and Greg Newey and Lady Olympian Deserie Huddleston (Victoria) were all up amongst the top 10.

Day two and the commencement of the first of the major events the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" in Double Trap. 150 targets shot in three visits each of 50 targets, with the top six shooters in the open and ladies sections to contest a final at the end of the competition to determine overall placings.

Round one and 1994 World Champion, Russell Mark of Victoria, was out to prove he was the one to beat both here and, hopefully later in the year, at the Atlanta Olympic Games, recording 48/50 after missing his last target. Everyone else in the field started slowly, Craig Tilley on 44/50, Greg Newey and Tom Turner on 43/50, while Brett Hall, Mark Crimmins, Bob Simpson and Adam Vella all recorded 42/50. Deserie Huddleston headed the ladies section on 39/50, two targets ahead of Ann Maree Roberts with Gleniss Lawrence from Canowindra, N.S.W. a further four targets back on 33/50.

The second round of the double trap saw good improvements from Steve Haberman 46/50 and Adam Vella 45/50, while Russell Mark and Tom Turner both recorded 44s, Russell retaining the lead by five targets from Adam Vella and Tom Turner. Descrie Huddleston continued her consistent form to increase her lead with 37/50, again the best score of the round in the ladies section.

After 150 targets, Russell Mark had again proved his prowess being first into the final on 136/150, followed by Adam Vella on 133/150 and Steve Haberman on 129/150. Tan Chee-Keong from Hong Kong 127/150, Nathan Cassells 123/150 and the Englishman Kevin Gill 122/150 made up the final six.

Again Russell Mark showed why he is amongst the World's best shotgunners - 45/50 and the Gold Cup and medal.

With the Double Trap competition completed and out of the way, the Olympic Trap and I.S.U. Skeet specialists began their competitions, commencing with a 50 target Badge Match in each discipline. But first the official Opening Ceremony.

New Queensland Premier, Bob Borbidge, was all set to officiate, but a last-minute engagement saw the Minister for the Environment Brian Littleproud stand in. The Minister made special mention of the fact that he had shot at the Brisbane Gun Club some years ago, and showed great interest in our sport. It was good to have a receptive politician in our midst, especially one whose portfolio would normally be seen to be distantly divorced from our sport.

The I.S.U. Skeet Badge Match was always going to be a battle of the Melburnians, but few had thoughts that some of the favoured competitors would not perform well on the day and be in contention for the top spoils.

Olympic Games representative Craig Meuleman got off to a flying start to record a clean 25 in his first round, one of the very few recorded during the week. Fellow Olympian David Cunningham fired a 23/25, with John Summers and 1995 "Grand Prix" Champion, Eugene Hernu of New Caledonia, both on 22s.

Another round of "ups and downs" and Craig Meuleman took the first event with a good score of 48/50.



The first of the Olympic Trap events also saw a fine start for one of our Olympic hopefuls, Michael Diamond, who carded a clean 25/25 to set the scene for things to come. Russell Mark, Adam Vella, Kiwi Brian Wistrand, Ben Kelley and '92 Commonwealth Games Gold Medallist John Maxwell all started with 24s to lead a tight bunch after the first round. Michael, however, was not about to surrender the lead position and slotted another 25/25 to take the match leaving the rest of the field over the minor placings. A few hiccups during the day saw the competition running a little late with the last few squads having to compete their second round a day or two later, but despite this problem all was travelling well so far.

Thursday morning, 8.00am and again the weather was fine and quite hot and humid early, and the first of the two day matches was about to kick off. The Pacific Coast Olympic Trap Championship again saw Michael Diamond set the pace during the early stages, recording 24+23+25 (72/75) in the first three rounds to take the early lead from current Queensland champion Greg Newey, who had notched up 22+25+24 (71/75). No one else could manage over the 70 mark for the day, Filippo Petriella on 69/75 being the closest with Adam Vella, Russell Mark and England's Kevin Gill all one further back on 68/75. Cheng Shu Ming from Hong Kong started well, recording the first clean 25/25 of the competition, but fell away in the next few rounds, but no so Michael Diamond, who consolidated on day two to finish up the match in first spot on 117/125 and take the top spot in the final. Following the completion of the day's shooting on Friday, the large contingent of shooters from Japan arrived to get in a couple of rounds of practice prior to the commencement of the main events. The Japanese shooters were part of the Japanese Winchester Top Gun Club, and were hosted during their visit by Winchester Australia through Wayne Pilkington and Queensland State Manager Bob Dupuy. The leader of the contingent was Mr. Hiroshi Matsumoto, Prosident of the Japanese Shotshell Company.

Again an 8.00am start for the early squads, and the best performance of the round was recorded by number two shooter in the squad, Jeff Tonna of Victoria, proving that early morning light at Brisbane can't be used as an excuse by everyone. Michael Diamond continued his track towards making the Olympic Trap competition a clean sweep by also recording 24/25, as did New Zealand Junior Scott Wilson, who performed extremely well and consistently over the entire competition, indicating that he will certainly be a Kiwi to contend with in the years ahead.

With another 24/25 to Diamond in round two, and 24s to Nathan McDonnell of Port Macquarie and Illawarra Kiwi Brant Woodward, it appeared that the round would go through without a clean 25/25, but Jim Ellis of Canberra proved that to be wrong. The second and third rounds saw a few of the fancied shooters experiencing problems, with Russell Mark posting a 19/25 in round 3, as did Kevin Gill of England in the second 25. Terry O'Connor, Gill's English team mate, was not having a good time, starting the day with a pair of 19s. Tom Allen of Ireland, who has been reportedly shooting well at home, was also not quite getting it together, and by his own admittance was shooting the targets well but the odd few were getting away - but coming out of the cold winter conditions to the heat and humidity of Brisbane was sure to affect even the best of shooters.

Fifty targets to go in the Australasian-Pacific Olympic Trap "Grand Prix", and world number two Michael Diamond on 72/75 holding a one target lead over Junior Nathan McDonnell. Ben Kelley was on 70/75 with Jeff Tonna on 69/75, one ahead of Adam Vella and Jim Ellis. Russell Mark had slipped pack following his 19 and needed a good final 50 to make the top six.

Russell must have done the sums, because he put in the finish of a true achiever - 50/50 for the final day. Michael Diamond kept on doing his job, but managed only 44/50 in the last two rounds, 116-125 - good enough to put him into the final in number one spot, followed by Ben Kelley on 115, Nathan McDonnell 114, Russell Mark 113, Jim Ellis 112 and Adam Vella on 112.

And the result - a clean sweep of all three Olympic Trap events to Michael Diamond, proving that he really is a "class act" and, regardless of the conditions and surrounding environment, the top shooter generally comes out on top.

Craig Meuleman, however, started off with a shocker, carding 17/25 to put him in a position which he would find it very difficult to recover from. Summers also had a hiccup in the second round, but luckily for him so did everyone else. Top scorers in the round were Clive Barton, Len Norman, Kiwis Paul Wilson and Malcolm Duff, and Ken Jones from Sydney.

After the third and final round for day one, the match was still anyone's. John Summers had a one target lead on 67/75 from Len Norman, with Kiwi Geoff Jukes and Eugene Hernu of New Caledonia one target further back on 65. David Cunningham, who had not found form during the competition, was on 64/75, two ahead of 1995 National High Gun Winner Clive Barton and Olympian Meuleman, both with plenty to do.

The last 50 targets of the competition and the scores were not to improve. Summers headed the list for the day 24 and 21, 45/50, while Cunningham's 44/50, Meuleman's 43/50, Hernu's 44/50 and Clive Barton's 42/50 were not enough to bridge the gap between them and Summers.

John Summers' score of 112 over the 125 targets saw him into first place in the final. Cunningham was next, followed by Hernu, Norman, Meuleman and Barton, but Summers' lead was too much and he went on to take the "Grand Prix" Gold Cup and Medal.

The Ladies trophy was won by Club member Kellie Arroitta with a good score of 43/50 from novice shooter Helen Becke with a score of 38/50.



The trappers, refs, and scorers, without your effort these shoots don't run smoothly.


Again to Libby and George, many thanks, and to the workers spending three weekends getting ready, only 3 hours to clean up, great effort friends.







When you are having one of those days By George Biggs, Former Vic. State Coaching Director

Many times I'm asked the following question by shooters who happen to be having one of those days when they simply cannot put a good score together, In spite of the fact that the previous week they scored very well.

The typical question runs like this — "George, tell me what's the cause of me shooting like a champion one week and the next week I couldn't hit a bull in the backside at 30 feet if he were standing still in a 40 acre paddock?"

Well, to answer this question correctly, we must firstly explain a few details that concern shooting a fast-moving target with a shotgun and, in doing this, we must explain the basic fundamentals that are involved in our sport of shooting trap and skeet, etc.

1. Firstly, let's have a look at our gun - is it the right type for what we need it for - is it a proper gun for our needs, and does it fit us as it should? Remember, a gun that fits you correctly will not bump your cheek or shoulder.

2. Have you been shown the correct way to position your gun on your shoulder, and the right placing of your hands on the stock and forend?

3. Have you learnt correct feet positioning on all stations at both trap and skeet? Try to adopt an easy upright stance with both knees only slightly bent - this position will give you freedom of swing and balance. Always feel free to swing with the target.

4. Learn where to focus your eyes when you are looking for the target as you call. Be relaxed but alert, and keep your face and head on the comb. At this point an ill-fitting gun can cause lots of trouble.

5. Learn to visualise your actual movements of shooting the target before you call for its release. It will only take you a split second to run the thought through your head. Practice doing this and it will become automatic every time you shoot targets.

6. The whole action should go something like this - as you step onto your mark:

* Be sure your feet are positioned correctly for the particular shot.

 * If it's a skeet shot the body needs to be facing a point on the field that is just 10 to 12 feet past where you want to break the target.

* Now mount the gun correctly on your shoulder, be sure it is in the correct place in and up to your cheek where it should be. Do not drop your face down to the stock.

* Now the muzzle should be pointing to a spot, on the line of target travel, about 12-15 feet out from the trap house opening. Keep the gun pointing just below the line of target travel.

* It's now the moment of truth. Focus your eyes back (halfway back) to the trap opening - and call for the target. As the target leaves the trap, see the front edge of the target, and as the gun muzzle comes from behind, open up a daylight lead, pull the trigger, see the target break and follow through with gun swing.


* This whole process of visualising the shot is a splendid system to build concentration.

* Remember, it's a case of mind over matter, and concentration is possibly 90% of our requirements for successful clay target shooting.

Concentration is to do mentally what we must do physically.

Station 5 at trap shooting seems to bother lots of right-hand shooters, and this position shouldn't be the case if he has his basics under control. The correct mental approach on this station is vital, a quick mental vision of what is required to be done in order to score. Make sure your stance position is correct (see picture) and gun is correctly in and up on your shoulder. Check to make sure that gun and cheek position is correct. Be careful not to let the stock get away from its position under your cheek as this often is the case and results in a lost bird.

Remember to always keep your cheek snug down on the comb.

You will then point the gun where the eye is looking.

When all this preparation is put in order, you are then ready for any angle of target travel.

Learn the basics of Clay Target Shooting

* Regardless of whether you shoot trap or skeet, the basic technique remains the same.

* Learn the fundamentals involved.

* Learn how to practice them always:

(a) Proper gun fit;

(b) Correct gun mounting;

(c) Body and gun control;


(d) Good stance position;

(e) Watch for the target leaving trap;

(6) Learn to concentrate;

(7) Select a suitable gun hold position relative to trap house;

(8) Shoot one target at a time and don't think about what you've just missed.




Skeet shooting station 8 high

Skeet Station 8 high pic shows Station 8 high target being broken over head. Note how the gun has followed through after breaking the target. Due to the low position of the camera the target flight appears much higher than it really is.

Visualising the shot should go like this - as you step on to the station, be sure you have correct foot position (this is vital). Remember that if we start right we have every chance of finishing right. Face a position where you will shoot the target. Now point the gun roughly 12-14 inches to right of trap opening and up about 12 inches. This position will bring the gun muzzle on line with target as it leaves the trap - pause for a second, call and swing with the target, firing when gun muzzle covers the target, you should actually shoot straight at the front edge of the target and follow through. Concentrate and focus on the leading edge of the target. Preparation and timing is actually what trap and skeet shooting is all about.

Visualising the shot on Station 6 low. Take a couple of seconds to quickly run through the action in your mind what you must do to successfully shoot this target.

Gun point should be about 14 feet out from the trap opening. Body is facing a point just right of the centre station where the target will be broken. Now turn back to where your gun point is and focus eyes right into trap opening. This practice will enable you to see the target clearly leaving the trap. Swing with it and as you see a lead of about 6 inches, fire and follow through. Keep your face snug down on the comb. Remember that the target is a rising one, so keep the muzzle up with it, or you will shoot under it as is often the case.

The Sport of Clay Target Shooting

Man has always liked to use guns. He uses them for both hunting and recreational shooting such as the gentlemanly sport of Clay Target Shooting. This short story will explain to the reader why countless wives, sweethearts, girlfriends, lovers etc. watch their men go forth at least once a week to his Gun Club and spend countless dollars shooting at little bits of clay being thrown into the air by some strange machine hidden in a brick or steel box. How can anyone but a simpleton derive any pleasure from doing such a silly thing (not to mention the wasted dollars). Nevertheless, men and women venture forth to take their place on their appointed lane, call pull, and then send two barrels of lead pellets (possibly some 400 odd) smashing into the air with the hope that some of these pellets will meet at the same place the target is so that the target will be smashed, or at the very least a recognisable piece broken off. If this happens, the happy shooter will hear the word ONE called by some unlucky mug who has been suckered into being the referee for the squad. In a lot of cases however, the call will be LOST and a dejected shooter swears (under his breath of course) as he ponders what went wrong. Usually he blames anyone but himself for sending a few more dollars down range without success.

Is this all that happens at these Gun Clubs countless wives ask themselves? The above would take about twenty minutes to shoot a round of 25 targets. How do they fill in the remainder of the day?

Let me explain so all will be revealed so you can enjoy your man's chosen sport.

It's Sunday morning and fingers are itching for a shot. The blue book

comes out and the well worn pages inform the "Shooter" that his Club has a competition commencing at 10.00am. Being well stacked with brownie points, the ammo, gun, glasses, muffs, cleaning rods, oil cans, rags, snap caps, hat, sunscreen, wet weather gear, gumboots, towel, shooting jacket and other important necessities get thrown into the car and our "Shooter" is off to seek fame and fortune.

He arrives at the Club for the 10.00am start, bounds from his car and proceeds to the office to pay his nominations. On the way over he runs into a few mates from other Clubs and they discuss the weather, the program, shells, who else is coming and eventually get to the office to pay up. It's now about 11.00am. He stands in line with other shooters, meets a few more mates and finally pays his dough at approximately 11.20am. He is very relieved when the handicapper doesn't put him up a Grade so he returns to his car to put the all important gun together. A few more mates come over to see if he still has the same gun an indepth conversation commences about which brand of gun is the best.

Noon comes around and the shoot marshall calls for squad one. Because we have been talking to the mates, our "Shooter" gets into squad eight so he has another hour to fill in before it's his turn to prove that his gun is the best. He walks over to the canteen meeting a few mates on the way and orders a steak sandwich and a coke. He consumes this at his leisure whilst listening to his mates talk about how they have been shooting, and finally it's his turn to shoot. Back to the car, this time avoiding mates as he has to get down to trap one in a hurry or he will be penalised a target for being late. In his haste he forgets to take his glasses but decides that he really doesn't need them.

He did need them and his score of 19-25 really puts him in a foul mood. The referee was a jerk giving slow pulls, fast pulls and the guy next to him was moving all the time. The wind was moving the targets around only when he shot and his eyes were watering.

On the way back to the car he avoids his mates in case they ask what was his score, puts the gun in the car and waits for the next round. He thinks he will try some bigger shells to give him an advantage over his mates, and this time he will take his glasses.

It's now about 3.00pm and he goes out for his next event. Again the ref was a dope who didn't know the rules and the guy on number one lane should not have been in this squad as he was a new shooter and was upsetting his rhythm by being too slow at calling for his target. The wind was still blowing a little and the fly that landed on his barrel just as called pull certainly cost him a target. Score this time 23-25. Much happier.

Talks to the mates on the way back to the car and discusses why they didn't shoot as well as he did. Offers advice and suggests they should use his shells, his glasses and gives a little coaching on the side. We are feeling pretty good at this stage of the day and, with one event to go (the dreaded pointscore), the shooter decides to go and have a chat to some of his mates - the ones he has not caught up with as yet.

"Squad 8, trap 4" the shoot marshall calls and the muscles tense in the shooter's stomach as he takes his lane for this make or break event. "Pull" he calls and is rewarded by a perfect straight-away target, a target that even the novice shooter could smoke. Bang, bang, LOST. Down three points with the first target. What did I do wrong? he asks himself. Everything felt right, My feet were right, the gun was in the right position, I'm sure I didn't lift my head. What the bloody hell did I do? "Pull". Bang, bang, LOST. Damn he cries to himself. Another three points down. Bloody hell, I hate this sport. Scratchy seconds, a few more LOST calls and finally the event is over and so are the shooter's chance of glory today. Fifteen points down in just the pointscore. Goodnight dick.

It's 4.30pm and the day's shooting is over except for the shoot-offs. The shooter decides that he won't be in one so why not clean the gun. Bugger the bloody gun. It shot badly all day so why should he clean it. Besides, the mates want to have a chat and a beer. All the gear gets thrown into the boot and it's up to the Clubhouse for a drink and the presentations to the winners. Who wants to listen to winners raving about how good they shot. They were lucky and I know I'm a better shot any day than those mugs. Another beer please.

The shoot-offs finish about 5.30pm and the presentations begin. "I would like to thank The Club and the" yak, yak, yak continues for another 30 minutes so it is now 6.00pm and time to head for home. One last discussion with the mates about the day's events, the targets, the light, the wind, the other shooters, the referee, the trappers, the traps themselves, the shells used and the guns occupy another 30 minutes, but finally the time has come to return to the wife, girlfriend, lover, etc. etc.

The shooter arrives home at approximately 7.30pm to be greeted at the door with a loud "where the bloody hell have you been". "I hope you had a good day because I've been washing, ironing, cleaning the house, washing the dog and the other car." A smile comes to the lips of the shooter as he meekly says "Dear, I had a wonderful day".



Thoughts and Suggestions that may be of Assistance following previous Promotion Days in N.S.W.

1. Attendance will be an unknown factor. Some indication is gained from phone enquiries, however, others will just turn up on the day.

2. Individual Club members really need to become involved. When up to 100 eager people ranging from 10 to 70 turn up, you really do need all hands on deck. Clubs in N.S.W. have had up to 120 participants

3. All handout material needs to be given at the end of the day with the participation certificates. As mentioned previously, have everything in bags, otherwise it will be put down and left behind.


4. Involve all the media outlets in your area. The in-person approach may be necessary. Yes, it takes time but it will be worth it in the long run.

5. On the day keep it simple and, remember, all guns do not cost \$15,000. Keep it in perspective.

6. It is very off-putting for visitors to stand back and watch a squad of the Club's top shooters breaking every target, and then go out and try to do the same after being told how easy it is!!

7. Follow up after the day - say, a month later. A standard letter to everyone who attended, keeping in touch, encouragement, etc.

8. When your new participants come along to a Club day, remember - plenty of encouragement, assistance, advice - preferable from just one person. If possible, assign one Club member per new shooter for a few months.



Introduction

Sunday 30th June 1996 10.00am

For the first time, every Club in Australia will be taking part in the introduction/ promotional day that is now in its third year in N.S.W.

This guideline booklet is supplied to assist every Club to conduct the day in the same manner and to provide assistance in the actual arrangements of the day.

The A.C.T.A. will be providing information brochures, handout leaflets, booklets, advertising posters and participation cards.

The success of the exercise will depend on the amount of effort put in by each club and the amount of support given by each Club's members.

Further on throughout the booklet, separate sections will give more detailed information which may be seen as "old hat" to some Clubs who have run successful promotion days in the past. However, there are Clubs who will be undertaking this project for the first time, and every little bit usually helps in the end.

Prior Planning by the Individual Clubs

This exercise is working successfully in N.S.W. and is gaining in participation numbers attending each year. Although it may seem overwhelming for some Clubs first up, if all your members become involved, it becomes quite easy to handle.

It is very important that every member of each Club fully understands the plans for the day, how the day will be conducted, what it will cost, and so on.

Once the advertising posters are put up around the towns and editorial material appears in the local press, everyone will need to be able to answer enquiries directed to them by anyone who sees the advertising and wants more information.

The success of the day will depend on how well your Club promotes itself and what you have to offer. The more your Club puts into the day, the more possibility you will have of getting members later down the track.

It is understandable that Clubs in remote areas will have difficulty in gaining extra media coverage, so those Clubs will have to rely on the posters and "word of mouth" from their own members.

CONTACT PERSON

Each Club should have a contact person - this may not necessarily be the Secretary. Anyone who is easily accessible by phone and who has a bit of "promotional" ability. This person's phone number will appear on the posters and should be included in the media releases.

The contact person will be the one who speaks to the media, looks after enquiries, and so on.

HELPERS

A few members will need to get together to help fill in the details pertaining to your Club on one of the brochures - a bit of hand-writing. The kits will then need to be "bagged up" - few helpers will see this job done quickly.

The Program for the Day

Starting Time: 10.00am

Start with a cuppa and a friendly welcome.

Have each Club member wear a name tag of some sort. A name tag for each visitor is also advisable.

With everyone welcome, ensure that the visitors' book has been signed with complete details.

Commence with a welcome from the President:

Short history of the Club
 What the day is about
 The day's program

Club Coach's explanation of clay target shooting:

Explanation of D.T.L. shooting and guns used
 Explanation of Skeet shooting and guns used
 Explanation of I.S.U. shooting

Club Coach's safety instruction:

Firearm safety
 Shooting etiquette
 Suitable clothing
 Ear protection and glasses
 Basic fundamentals of shooting

To avoid boredom, keep this as brief as possible. Try to keep it down to 20 minutes all up.

SHOOTING PROGRAM

As provided by National Director of Coaching Murray Alexander.

Remember - safety is the most important issue.

All shooting is to be single barrel.

DOWN THE LINE

1. Traps to be set on straight away

2. Minimum distance - maximum legal height

3.1 coach or experienced member per visitor

4. Ammunition to be controlled by members - hand visitor the cartridge when it is their turn to shoot

5. Ammunition to be the lightest load available -Winchester 1200 or equivalent

6. 5 shots per visit - maximum 4 visits.

SKEET

 Station 7 - Low House
 Set on minimum distance - standard height.
 Shooting fundamentals explanation continued as the group and individuals on the tracks as shooting progresses.

Keep advice and instructions simple. Reinforce safety.

Additional members to move around non-shooting visitors to ensure they feel welcome. Encourage at all times. Depending on the numbers in attendance, more time may be available for visitors to participate in more than 20 targets later in the afternoon.

CONCLUSION

The Club President presents "Participation Certificates" and kits to all participants.

Thanks visitors for viewing and participating in our sport.

Any questions may be taken over a provided tea to round off an enjoyable day.

Cost

20 targets and 20 shells (where possible) should be a maximum of \$11, or you may like to say \$20 for the day, which will include lunch and morning and afternoon teas.

If Clubs are able to gain sponsorship or are in a position to provide this day at no charge or a reduced cost, that is their decision and they should be congratulated for being in that position.

Handout Kits

Introduction to Clay Target Shooting booklet from A.C.T.A. Clay Target Shooting - general information leaflet, which has space on the back to list Club President, Secretary and Coach - names and phone numbers.

Safety and Etiquette leaflet

Attendance and Participation Card

Each Club to include their own annual program and details of shoot day fees (targets only and competition), ammunition costs, etc.

Membership Form and Fees

Police Firearm Safety Code booklets relevant to each State.

Follow-Up after the Day

Having had every person who attended sign the visitors' book and provide their address, the Club now has all that is necessary to make contact with a Club newsletter or just an invitation to come out again. Provide everyone who attends the day with a copy of your Club's

shooting program and details of a contact person so they may make contact themselves, if they wish.

When they do come back to a shoot - if it is a competition day, allow them to shoot for targets only for a while. This will assist in keeping the costs down.

Encourage attendance on practice days if your Club has them. Make them aware that the Club has a coach who is only too happy to assist them.

Most of all, make them feel welcome and encourage them to come back again.

Once they have been a few times, take the opportunity to discuss the A.C.T.A. Interim Membership - \$10.00 for three (3) months - with them.

Explain what is obtained with the A.C.T.A. membership and that should they join as an interim member, their \$10 is deducted from the full A.C.T.A. membership.
