

National President's Notes

PROPOSED NEW GUN LAWS

At the time of writing these notes I am unable to come to grips with the proposals put forward by our Federal Government in relation to new gun laws.

They have not addressed the issue surrounding incidents such as happened in Tasmania, but in reality have succumbed to the media.

What they have effectively done at this point is to place all law abiding firearm owners in the category of criminal, and promoted a psychiatric killer to hero in the minds of the minority anti gun radicals who seem to have the attention of the media.

Your National Executive will be fighting all the way, with what money we have in the Legislation Fund, to try and bring some sense to this injustice, and will be fighting to preserve your right to own and use semi automatic and pump action shotguns in our sport, and also the right you have as a citizen of this country to retain and use property you legally obtained and wish to use in hunting, vermin control or target shooting. We have committed no offence to bring these unwarranted restrictions upon us.

As I have stated earlier, the Government has been duped by a very vocal minority who have portrayed all firearm owners as to why the tragedy in Tasmania took place, as with such atrocities in the past. The unfortunate result is that political parties, to win votes, run with the media. Unfortunately, there now appears to be less votes in supporting firearm owners, than in supporting the greens, the liberationists or any of a multitude of trendy factions within our community. To endeavour to change this, each and every one of us must lobby their local State and Federal Politicians to the fullest, and each politician must then be made to state where their individual support is, and if it is with us, then stand up and be counted.

It is a sad state of affairs when States are discussing legalising drugs on one hand, and then taking away our firearms on the other. There is no doubt if all these impositions are passed, then the next target will be what few firearms we have left. The media love to use the term weapons for our firearms and we must emphasise to all, that we do not use weapons.....but sporting equipment.

Another issued raised in the campaign against the ownership of firearms is that put forward by the Australian Medical Association claiming some 500 plus deaths in Australia each year as a result of shootings. This figure includes suicides, to which end no amount of restriction will stop someone determined to end their own life. It is rather neglectful of the AMA not to mention that in New South Wales alone in 1992/3 some 27,337 people were admitted to hospital as a result of incorrect medical procedures, whilst in the same period 144 persons were firearm related admissions. Makes you wonder how priorities are decided.

The Australian Clay Target Association National Trap Championships for 1996 were hosted this year by the Tasmanian Clay target Association and Tasmanian Gun Club. The championships ran from Saturday 6 April to Thursday 11 April and the weather was very cool and windy.

SATURDAY 6 APRIL

Prior to the Opening Ceremony, teams from ALL states and the territory competed for the prized Australian Clay Target Association Cup presented to the State team in Open, Ladies and Juniors division. This was the first time ever that all states were in each division, congratulations.

The Open teams event was successfully won by Victoria, being represented by Russell Mark (Capt) Nathan Cassells, Roger Duthie, Joe Attard and Rob Viney. They only dropped one target to score 124/369 to win narrowly from Western Australia and South Australia both on 124/365.

The Ladies from Tasmania, fielding a team for only the second time, were successful in winning the Ladies Team event, The team lead by Nannette McCallum with Elaine Bennett and Cheryl Arnol dropped just one target to score 74/217. They defeated Victoria 73/216 and Queensland 72/212.

Victoria was also successful in the Junior teams event with a score of 74/219. Craig Henwood lead his team of Marc Crimmins and Luke Cassells to victory over New South Wales with 72/210 and South Australia 71/208.









Passing of a President

Story by George Biggs, ACTA Historian

Allan (Tup) Pedersen of Drouin passed away March 16 in his 88th year.

Tup was born in Drouin, Victoria. His father was a farmer and his grandfather was a market gardener. Few people could envisage that Tup would enter the motor trade, let alone spend more than 65 years in the industry.

It was about 1948 that Tup decided it was time he commenced to get a little enjoyment from life, and being a country boy his thoughts turned to shooting. At his point in time Clay Target Shooting was becoming the in thing, and Tup liked what he saw.

The early days in East Gippsland in Victoria saw several gun clubs that were formed around the beginning of the century. They were of course live bird clubs.



Around 1925 clay targets were replacing live birds, resulting in most of the live bird clubs changing over to clays.

It was 1948 when Tup decided to take up shooting clay targets. I remember him coming into Hartley Sports Store one afternoon. He told me he was going to take up shooting clays more seriously and wanted to know what kind of gun he should buy. He joined the Moe Gun Club and used an old side by side Hollis Double Barrel Field Gun for a few years, but had recently switched to a Browning Auto.

During the early 1950's the 'Browning' Under and Over gun was beginning to filter through to Australian trap shooters. Tup fell in love with this type of gun and purchased a Model 'C' grade gun which he used for the next forty years. If my memory serves me correctly the going price was around \$200. Over 40 odd years of clay target shooting Tup had won in excess of 200 Championships at both Trap and Skeet.

The Drouin Gun Club was formed in 1950 and officially opened by the then A.C.T.A. President Jock Wilson. The club had a membership of 65.

Tup was elected President with Stan Turner Secretary. The club carried on until 1982 when they disbanded to join up with Morwell Gun Club. Tup served on the ACTA Executive Committee from 1956 to 1977. He was appointed Vice President 1974 and National President 1975 serving 2 years. Tup still attended shoots and enjoyed the friendship of old and new shooters at the age of 88 years.

One of the highlights of Tup's shooting career was a trip to the U.S.A. where he shot in the 'Grand American', an event that is billed as the biggest shooting tournament in the world. He brought back trophies from several shoots that he attended whilst there in 1975.

During December of 1987 Tup and his wife Enid visited the Australian Masters Games in Launceston, Tasmania where he shot in all the shot gun events. He remarked to me at the time that he and Enid enjoyed themselves so much they had decided to travel to Alice Springs for the Northern Territory Masters Games in October the following year -1988.

Sure enough they did visit Alice Springs and they actually did drive up.

Tup had attended every National Championship Series for the past 40 years.

Tup was an Honorary Life Registered member of the Australian Clay Target Association.

Tup's greatest love was clay target shooting where he achieved considerable notoriety.

In more recent years he participated in Veterans competition and travelled Australia wide.

His main interest outside his business was his Presbyterian Church. He was a faithful communicant member of the Church and held the post of Treasurer for a period of 46 years. Tup was the architect of many financial arrangements for the Church.

God bless you Tup, you will be missed around the traps.



Lost Bird



Dear President

I wish to refer to the 1oz shot load now being used by shooters, and now enforced by the A.C.T.A.

When the above was first thought up, the general idea seemed to be, that it was desirable for young shooters to use the lighter loads, in order to reduce recoil damage etc to their shoulders and enable shooters of all ages to shoot long breaks, without shoulder damage.

Over a period of time I have checked and made a few tests myself, and the following may be of interest.

It amuses me to see someone take a shell or two from a shooter and weigh the load to check if it is loz load.

Let us look at an extreme example. If No 7 trap shot load is used it will be quite different to say a BB Hunting load of weight from the same loz bush.

Eg No 7 shot weighs different to No 6 shot. Different brand shot weights vary eg; Azar, Winchester & Tower by Ballantine, some of the main brands used.

Using a 1oz bush from a Pacific loader, you may get variations, eg Azar over 1oz, Ballantine Tower can be under 1oz, Winchester from 1250 new shells rarely weigh the full 1oz, and so it goes on.

Further, some lead has less recoil than others, Azar very high grade hard shot and coated with graphite is very easy to use, compared to other shot.

The most interesting tests that I made concerned powder, in controlling recoil, and this is what it is supposed to be about.

Eg; Vetcom D20, PSB, etc very low recoil fast and clean can be used with 1oz loads of shot, with less recoil than some other powders with 1oz loads.

Heavy powder eg GM3 Winchester and in particular older powders, all will have higher recoil with 1oz loads than the above at 1oz loads.

Medium powder as Mulwex A530N is in between and quite good at the moment.

If recoil was the reason for changing to loz loads, I can only say it is a big joke, nothing has been gained by the shooter. The people that have gained are big companies and ammunition manufacturers.

If you are in America, components and shot shells would be half the cost they are in Australia, they have big competition.

In Australia the main one company hands out 5c with one hand, and takes \$1 with the other.

It would make more sense if 1&1/16 oz loads became the maximum load DTL & Skeet with No 6 shot being the max for DTL, anything less the choice of shooter.

Lead is also a rip off in this country, at the moment the lead price is at an all time low due to not being used in paint, petrol and building industries.

Further I am wondering these days if ACTA is quite up with the needs of all its members, rather than a few top shooters.

Dear Sir/s

With limitless doubt the use of full fluro targets at the recent Nationals at the Tasmanian Gun Club spoiled the event for many shooters.

Proof of this lies in three factors: a) Much disquiet among many shooters; b) Rumour of a circulated petition of protest; c) Relatively lower scores as compared to other Nationals.

This club has one of the best backgrounds for clay target shooting in Australia, and you know it. It surpasses Melbourne at which 'blacks' were excellent. The club has conducted two previous Nationals at which no known complaints about 'blacks' were forthcoming.

Fluros are excellent against trees and background hills, of which the Tasmanian Gun Club has none. Fluros are less easy to see against a blue sky and very poor against clouds. Since you are not able to foretell the weather and were fully aware of the excellent flat background, then "Why did you choose fluros?"

During the Tasmanian State Carnival you were able to assess black target suitability, so "Why did you choose fluros?"

Some two months prior to the Nationals three influential people viewed blacks, fluros and banded with the recommended targets being black, so "Why did you choose fluros?"

Is it true the decision was taken by an Executive 'ring around'? How many of the Executive who helped make the decision have never been to the ground prior to the 1996 Nationals?

Is it an Executive secret agenda to deny Tasmania the Nationals ever again?

In hindsight many people believe you made an error of judgement, but we know neither an explanation nor an admission will ever emerge.

For the future might I add a little of my own experience and wisdom in suggesting that the ACTA set in place a constructive policy that sees that the host club recommends the target colour, a recommendation the ACTA accepts on every occasion.





Our local hot shot Don Molina won the first major event, the Kerang Ibis Trap Gift with 112/112.





Bereffa's 390ST Super Sporting (Transition Model)

It is quite obvious the popularity of sporting clays has had an enormous impact on shotgun design throughout the world. In keeping with the progressiveness of Beretta, one of the worlds largest gunmakers, a state of the art gas operated semi-auto, the 390ST Super Sporting, has been developed specifically for sporting clay shooting. The model reviewed is the transitional 'Super Sporting' for the top of the range model has a stock with a set of adjustable combs, this is expected to arrive late 1995.

For several years Beretta have made significant sporting clay, 'sporter', double barrel guns so it goes without saying they have more than a fair share of knowledge when it comes to designing a gun. The popularity and dominance of Beretta under and over shotguns in sporting clays, throughout Australia and the world, is testimony to their gun designing ability and success.

A total thoroughbred, the 390ST transitional sporter supplied for review is a great looking gun. Configured for sporting clays it has a magic feel about it and a stock design that places the shooter's eye looking straight down the centre of its barrel. The advanced technology of barrel porting and a lengthened forcing cone have been adopted by Beretta, whose extensive research has proven such innovations to be practical additions rather than cosmetic. The 390ST Super Sporting is a full-on competition semiauto with many other features that I believe set it far ahead of its competitors.

At a glance


At a glance, the 390ST Super Sporting looks every part the gun it is supposed to be. The stock and metalwork finishes are faultless, presenting a gun that is worthy of the price commanded. The checkering is well placed and functional whilst the woodwork, although plain, is straight grained to the point of practicality. It was pleasing to find a quality recoil pad fitted to the butt of the 390ST Super Sporting despite it being a comfortable gun to shoot. This complemented the gun perfectly. The matt finish on the barrel, the red translucent fore sight, the raised rib and barrel porting presented the gun as a formidable contender for the use at any level of sporting




The stepped rib and excellent wood to metal fit make the Super Sport an excellent choice for sporting clays.

The Barrel

Offered in either 28" or 30" configuration, the 28" barrelled version sent for review actually measured 27", so if you are looking for a longer, rather than shorter barrel, my advice would be to opt for the 30" barrelled version. This aside, the barrel of the Super Sporting was well finished in Bruniton, (a Teflon like protective coating), and fitted with a superb stepped rib, essential for the sporting clay shooter. The stepped rib, in my opinion, is an excellent design adaption for a sporting clays gun for it enables the shooter, when coupled to a respective stock height, to keep their head up whilst shooting thereby reducing eye strain and allowing the shooter full sight of the target at all times. Low ribs on competition semi-autos are of little benefit, in my opinion, for they tend to cause fatigue that a competitive shooter can well do without. Having the rib on the Super Sporting raised and also tapered towards the muzzle, from 10mm to 8mm, seems to subconsciously draw a shooter's attention to an alighting clay, a feature realised by Beretta with the design of the Super Sporting. A translucent red barrel sight was fitted to the rib just back from the muzzle to aid with pointing.

Obviously users of semi-autos, being a single barrel gun, do not have the same option of more than one choke selection, as with under and over shotguns. Thankfully Beretta have provided their proven mobil choke, interchangeable choke system with the gun to provide users with a range of 4 chokes, as desired - for the variations of target size and distance whilst shooting sporting clays can find either, tighter or more open chokes lacking. To assist users with efficient choke tube changes Beretta have provided a new generation wrench - larger in size and shaped like a propeller, to facilitate positive grip and quick changes.

The gas operating system utilised by the Beretta Super Sporting is located within the barrel ring and is quite unique in design. It contains a minimum of working parts, none that need replacing! It is through its simple design that most loads, from loz up to 1 oz of shot, can be passed through the mechanism without the need to reverse friction rings or switch across any latches. (Some 'light' 28 gram loads will not cycle in the ported models unless factory modifications are completed). The system involves a heavy spring loaded washer that sits on the front of the barrel ring/gas chamber, covering bleed-off holes in the front of the chamber. This is tensioned to purge excess pressure from the barrel ring/gas chamber that houses the piston. The gas piston, in turn, held in position by the magazine sleeve is connected to the bold with the bolt under pressure from a recoil spring in the stock. Upon firing, the gases of combustion are harnessed to cycle the action whilst excess gas is purged from the front of the gas chamber and redirected through a vented, steel insert in the front of the forend. A very simple but extremely clever gas operating system. Due to the simplicity of the compensating action shooters can even use a multiple of different loads, at the same time, without needing to make any changes. Such is the purpose of a 'self-compensating' system and Beretta seem to have it perfected.

Another innovative design by Beretta with the Super Sporting is barrel porting. This has long been a contentious issue but Beretta's use of this most efficient system of reducing recoil and muzzle flip appears to confirm its benefits. Noise can be a problem for bystanders although a shooter wearing ear protection would sense little increase in noise level. Personally, I have found muzzle porting to be a great device in reducing recoil and muzzle flip, especially when using heavier loads of 1 3/16 oz. and 1 1/4 oz. Such barrel modifications in a semiautomatic are almost necessary, for semi-autos do not have the weight forward, as does a conventional gun with two barrels, to prevent muzzle flip and tame recoil. Fortunately I had a standard field grade 390ST on hand to compare with the ported Super Sporting. Shot for shot, the barrel porting on the 'Sporter' was certainly beneficial.


It was interesting to note, as an influence from the American market, the 390ST Super Sporting is provided with a barrel proofed for both 2 3/4" and 3" cartridges. This was common with guns made in America but was rarely seen with European guns, including Beretta, until their popular acceptance in America! This undoubtedly

provides yet another option for shooters to double their sporter as a field gun although shot loads in sporting clay competition is restricted to 1 1/4oz., maximum. Shooters might also be encouraged to pattern their gun with their favourite 2 3/4" loads for cartridges discharged in a longer chamber tend to tighten patters.

The Receiver

Precision machined from a lightweight, high strength, aircraft grade alloy the receiver of the Super Sporting is very functional in design. The top of the receiver and bottom edge around the loading port have been rounded for reduced weight and ease of operation. The rearward, underpart of the receiver has been scalloped to provide clearance and comfort for the shooter's trigger hand. Gone are the days of rigid corners with uncomfortable edges. On the top of the receiver grooves have been machined into a flat, uppermost surface to complement and align with the beginning of the barrel and its stepped rib. This provides an uninterrupted sighting plane for the user. The whole upper surface of the receiver has also been treated with a brushed, matt finish to avoid any distraction or interruption to concentration from glare or reflections. All positive features adopted to enhance shooter comfort and provide the optimal in concentration/performance.

Although only a four shot gun, one in the chamber and three in the magazine, this is not a disadvantage for the sporting clay shooter - where only two cartridges can be loaded at a time. The addition of a magazine cut-off on the left hand side of the receiver is a bonus and obviously an off-shoot from the field model - the basis of all 390ST actions. The trigger mechanism is smooth and crisp, releasing at 4 1/4 to 4 1/2 pounds, with the generously sized trigger guard housing the safety catch forward of the trigger. The gilded trigger is a pleasant cosmetic addition that compliments the overall appearance of the gun.

The bolt release button is located on the right hand side of the receiver and operates comfortably without requiring excessive pressure. A trap for those unfamiliar with the operation of Beretta semi-autos is the provision of a carrier locking button, just rearward of the chromed carrier, located beneath the breech. This small button must be depressed before the bolt can be locked rearward to display an empty breech.

Once familiar with its activation it becomes second

nature. In my experience, those unfamiliar with the action of this button have a hellish time trying to keep the bolt open after shooting, (which normally happens when the gun is emptied upon firing). On the occasion when only one of the two shots loaded is fired, and the gun is manually unloaded, the bolt will not remain rearward, exposing the chamber, until the carrier button is depressed. I do not consider it to be a negative feature, it's merely a peculiarity of Beretta semi-autos and part of knowing the gun.

Detaching the trigger plate and its mechanism for cleaning is easily achieved by removing a single pin. The trigger plate is firstly moved forward within the rearward part of the trigger plate then rotated downwards. Replacing the trigger plate after cleaning is just as easily affected by the bolt release button must be released at the same time of its replacement to enable its mechanism, inside the receiver, to clear the carrier. Once mastered this process is quickly affected and with a minimum of effort.

Unloading the magazines of some semi-autos can be a dangerous operation for the inexperienced particularly when the bolt of the action is required to be manually activated to cycle all of the cartridges through the breech to eject them. Fortunately the 390ST action can be emptied from the magazine by simultaneously pressing the bolt release button and depressing the cartridge carrier. This not only enables the gun to be emptied safely, but also quickly.

The Stock and Forend

Shaped from walnut and coated in a clear, resilient high gloss polyester the straight grain of the stock and forend is attractive and practical. The provision of a solid, black recoil pad compliments the stock and offers added comfort whilst shooting, without interfering with gun mounting. (A bevelled upper edge on the recoil pad further enhances gun mounting). The stock and pistol grip is quite full and typical of Beretta guns, pleasantly thick and chunky. This adds balance to the gun whilst providing enough wood to alter the stock height if required. Beretta provide two preconfigurated washers that fit between the stock and the rear of the receiver. These can be used to alter both the length of the stock, cast and height of the comb. A plain washer is available upon order for shooters to make their own adjustments, if desired. Several stock options are also available with the Super Sporting, including a monte carlo with three interchangeable combs. Check with your local gun dealer will confirm which options will be available to shooters in Australia.

Checkering, on both the stock and forend, was well executed and finished with a double lined border. With the age of machine checkering upon us the checkering at 20 lines/inch, was exceptionally clean and excellent in coverage, pattern and form. It provided a firm and comfortable grip for both hands whilst shooting. The front of the receiver had a sturdy flange in which to locate and support the forend wood. This is an especially appreciated addition by a devotee of semi-autos for many older models eventually split their forend or expand sideways and become unsteady to grip. Beretta have certainly attended to this fault.

In Competition

This is the section I most enjoy, the practical testing of a review gun. To say the Beretta 390ST was a pleasure to shoot would be an understatement. It functioned perfectly

with a wide selection of ammunition cycling different loads and cases with ease. The perceived recoil was certainly reduced, in fact other shooters who fired the gun commented they had hardly felt any recoil at all. No doubt there is some recoil but the Super Sporting, through its excellent design, contains recoil to a minimum.

Weighing in around 8 pounds (3.7kg), the Super Sporter did not feel its weight, even when loaded with four cartridges. During the competition shooting I found the gun to perform equally as well as my regular semi-auto; it swung well and moved quickly to pick-up targets early. The targets that I hit were destroyed, confirming pattern tests that also yielded good, even patterns. The choke tube spanner was certainly a great improvement over the older version for changes could be affected with a minimum of delay - an important factor when the pressure of shooting is upon you, especially if you have not viewed the targets at the next station and altered your choke to suit, and you are the next competitor to shoot. I found the 27" barrel to be in order for my style of shooting, at least my scores did not reflect any signs of suffering as I changed guns between rounds.

Conclusion

Being a devout semi-automatic user, due to severe back restrictions as a result of two lower back operations, I appreciated the balance, quickness and reduced perceived recoil of the Beretta 390ST. The stepped rib and barrel porting are two great features on a competition gun I believe are essential if shooters are to maintain there concentration, shoot comfortably and avoid fatigue. The Beretta 390ST represents state of the art design in a semi-automatic, gas operated shotgun with many worthwhile features not found on other brands. After grabbing the sporting clays market with their fine under and overs it appears Beretta are seeking the same with their semi-autos. Innovative design and progressive thinking have obviously contributed to the design of the Super Sporting 390ST - it is certainly a gun that I would be proud of owning. At around \$1,700 retail it is not a cheap gun but for the competitive sporting clay shooter, it is not expensive either. The Australian distributor, Winchester (Australia), warrant the gun for 5 years and at the time of preparing this review, you certainly cannot, in my opinion, buy better! Until next time, good luck and safe shooting.

In response to the resolutions of the Police Ministers Conference the Executive Committee of the Australian Clay Target Association was convened in Melbourne on 20th May, 1996.


Arising from the meeting the following matters are to be forwarded into a document to go to the Police and Sports Ministers in all states. The Executive has resolved that:




