


# **National** President's Notes

### **NEW GUN LAWS**

One of the most difficult things one has to do in life is at times to try and foresee the future. At the time of writing these notes, no firm decisions have been made in relation to the introduction of proposed new gun laws. There are plenty of rumours and speculation re the proposed buy back of semi-automatic and pump-action shotguns, but nothing concrete. It is also rumoured that members of recognised shooting bodies will be able to retain their semiautos and pumps providing magazines are modified to hold only two rounds.

I have had a number of our members contact me regarding other firearms they own, such as .22 rifles. Unfortunately, as a shotgun specific sport, we can only successfully negotiate on shotgun matters. It may seem narrow and selfish, but sadly it is the truth.

It has also been stated that we have not been seen to be actively engaged in defending our members' rights. I can assure all that all Executive members have attended many meetings and rallies, and have been to the forefront. To get onto National television, and into National news, we would have had to have made some outlandish statement or threat. When approaches were made to the media to put our points across we were told: "We are not talking about you people, you seem to be doing things right".

Mention has also been made of our legislation fund. The amount being held could have been spent on 3 or 4

television commercials, or on 6 or 7 paper advertisements, and would have all been gone without achieving anything. Instead, we prepared a professional submission to be presented to as many politicians as possible, and at the time of writing this, is being taken notice of. It will also be used to assist in legal representation should shooting bodies mount any challenges in courts, and it will be channelled to any area the National Executive feels will have the most positive result in defending our sport. We would be extremely negligent if it was shown that it was wasted without any real chance of achieving a positive result. Let's hope when you read this, we have been wise in our decisions, and we can get on with out shooting.

### NATIONAL PROMOTION DAY

The National Executive has decided to postpone the National Promotion Day after approaches from a number of States. It was felt the media would be very harsh in criticism of such an event, and that some sections of the community would actively try and discredit our motives.

The feeling is that a promotion should be run at the Christmas shoots for best results. We have had a considerable amount of handout material produced and this will be distributed as soon as a day is decided upon.

### WORLD DOWN-THE-LINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Full details of the event, entry fees and opening date for entries will be released soon. Interest is considerably high and it is hoped there will be no harsh restrictions on overseas competitors bringing firearms into Australia

### — Editor's Mailbox —

Dear Glenn,

In response to calling for articles of interest in your column of the ACTA News, I forward to you two charts for publication:

- 1. The International Lead Shot Size Chart; and
- 2. The Number of Pellets in Different Charges of Lead Shot. Both charts were compiled by Sergeant Paul McFawn (AFP Ballistics) as part of a research paper whilst he was undergoing forensic ballistics training. They have previously been published in the Association of Firearms and Tool Mark Examiners (AFTE) Journal and been assessed by both peers and supervisors. To our knowledge, the charts provided a world-wide "first" and, consequently, were acclaimed by firearms and ammunition examiners to assist in the day-to-day practice of forensic ballistics.

They may be of interest to shotgunners generally and those interested in re-loading. Paul gives his permission for you to publish the charts, if you see fit.

Further to your call of interest, perhaps a question to be asked that will stimulate some research and replies:

"What do the letter designations in "Letter Size Shot" represent?" Some learned persons in overseas ammunition factories suggest, e.g. that L.G. = large grapeshot; S.G. = small grapeshot; others suggest that S.S.G. = small swan grapeshot and others are just guessing, particularly when it gets down to A.A.A. size and B.B.'s. The invitation to reply has been extended to many people, some have replied but are unable to quote and validate with reliable

Perhaps it is time we opened the question to readers of the ACTA News - the designations are listed on the charts - it might be interesting!

# **Submission On Proposed New Gun Laws**

The Executive Committee of the Australian Clay Target Association recently met and it was agreed that a submission be prepared for distribution to Parliamentarians.

This submission is now being printed in this magazine for the information of all members, keeping them, as well as other interested parties, informed of the ACTA's position.

### 1. CLAY TARGET SHOOTING

The sport of clay target shooting originated in 19th Century Europe and North America. Clay targets, and machines that throw these targets to simulate the flight of a bird, were developed around the turn of the century. The sport was introduced into Australian in 1924, although it has been shot in Australia using 'Glass Balls' since the 1880s.

Clay target shooting is a family sport open to all ages, with members ranging from school age to competitors in their eighties.

### 2. THE AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET ASSOCIATION INC.

The Australian Clay Target Association Inc. (ACTA) is the peak body for the legitimate Australian sport of clay target shooting. As such, it is responsible for drawing up the rules and regulations governing the sport in Australia.

ACTA is the peak body of affiliated State and Territory bodies. There are some 300 affiliated clay target clubs and approximately 8000 registered clay target shooters throughout Australia. ACTA affiliated clay target clubs around Australia regularly hold practices and official competitions for their members. Every shooter must be registered with ACTA before entering into competitive shooting.

New ACTA members are instructed in all aspects of shotgun shooting, including gun safety and etiquette. Professional coaches, accredited through an Australian Coaching Council approved Accreditation Scheme, are available across Australia to lift the standard of shooters' skills and safety practices.

ACTA is also responsible for the selection of Australian shotgun shooters for International clay target competition events including

- the Olympic Games
- the Commonwealth Games
- the Oceania Games
- World Championships
- · World Cups.

### ACTA is affiliated with

- the Australian Olympic Committee
- the Australian Commonwealth Games Association
- the Oceania Shooting Federation
- the Confederation of Australian Sport.

ACTA is supported by the Australian Sports Commission. ACTA's patron is The Right Honourable Malcolm Fraser, A.C., C.H.

ACTA is also affiliated with the Australian Shooting Association (ASA), which is affiliated with the International Shooting Union (ISU) as well as other International Shooting organisations.

### 3. ACTA'S INTERNATIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

- ACTA competitors have achieved outstanding results in International competitions in recent years.
- To achieve these results our athletes have borne a considerable personal cost.
- Australia currently ranks among the top three countries in clay target shooting in the World.
- Since 1994, ACTA has achieved three World Championships and one equal World Record.

Details of recent International achievements for Australian clay target shoots are listed in Appendix A.

### 4. ACTA'S POSITION

- ACTA is an independent sporting body and has no links with any Australian shooting bodies apart from ASA.
- ACTA's members use only competition-style firearms for competition sports.
- ACTA's clubs pride themselves on their exemplary safety record.
- · ACTA's members are law-abiding citizens.

ACTA supports in principle moves for uniform and practical gun laws to make Australia a safer place to live. ACTA does not support or condone the statements being made by certain extremists purporting to represent the gun lobby and therefore shooters generally.

### 5. ISSUES OF CONCERN TO ACTA

ACTA wishes to raise the following concerns in response to the resolutions of the Australasian Police Ministers Council Special Firearms Meeting.

### 5.1 Discrimination against Juniors, Handicapped,

### Veterans and Ladies

For competition target shooting in Australia, the proposed Category A double barrel over and under shotgun is the most popular competition firearm.

Junior, Handicapped and Veteran shooters, and some Ladies, experience difficulty with the recoil of double barrel shotguns. Accordingly, ACTA permits these shooters to use the proposed Category C semi-automatic and pump action shotguns with a magazine capacity no greater than five rounds. They are, however, restricted to loading no more than two shots in competition shoots.

The new categorisation means that Australian Junior, Handicapped, Veteran and Ladies shooters could be prevented from competing effectively in target shooting.

ACTA safety regulations allow no more than two shells to be loaded at any one time in semi-automatic or pump action

shotguns. The various clay target disciplines permit only one or in some cases two shots per target. ACTA would be agreeable to limiting the magazines of semi-automatic and pump action shotguns so as to restrict the number of rounds able to be inserted.

Semi-automatic and pump action shotguns with a magazine capacity no greater than five rounds could safely be reclassified from Category C to Category A, if the A classification was restricted to registered shooters in competition target sports only. This would also result in significant savings in the buy back proposal.

It should also be noted that many international clay target teams use semi-automatic firearms. The new categorisation will effectively prevent these teams from competing within Australia.

ACTA urges that semi-automatic and pump action shotguns with a magazine capacity no greater than five rounds be reclassified to Category A for certain groups of registered shooters in competition target sports.

### 5.2 Shooting under supervision for non-licensed shooters

ACTA's current policies allow prospective new members who are not yet licensed shooters to attend strictly supervised 'trial shoots'. The supervisors are suitably qualified and accredited persons.

ACTA's policies also permit juniors under the age of 18 to shoot under strict supervision in accordance with current State requirements.

ACTA wishes to receive reassurance that under the new regulations it will be able to continue its carefully controlled and supervised shooting activities for non-licensed shooters.

### 5.3 Restrictions on quantities of ammunition

The sport of clay target shooting requires the use of large amounts of ammunition. While only one or two shots per target are permitted, shooting procedures in the various target sport disciplines involve 25 to 100 targets per round. ACTA limits the size of the shot in the cartridges to no greater than 6.

- Competitors in clay target competitions may use 500 to 600 cartridges per day.
- Shooters in training for National, Commonwealth, Olympic, World Championship, World Cup and Oceania Games events may use up to 200 cartridges per day in their training programs.

The new restrictions on quantities of ammunition will

- · restrict the training programs of competition shooters
- place our international competitors under a grave handicap
- severely jeopardise Australia's world standing in target shooting sports.

ACTA urges that no restrictions be placed on ammunition quantities for people in recognised target shooting sports.

### 5.4 National competitions

The new regulations refer only to participants in shooting sports recognised in the charters of such major sporting events as the Commonwealth Games, Olympic Games, Oceania Games, World Championships and World Cup.

The new regulations give no recognition to participants in shooting sports in Australian National Competitions approved by the National Body (ACTA).

No allowance is made for existing or future Australian National shooting sports which are not currently recognised by the charters of the above international events.

ACTA urges that the terms be extended to include participants in shooting sports approved by the National Body as National Competitions.

### 5.5 Club membership

ACTA believes that all shooters should belong to an association that controls the field of interest in which they participate.

ACTA is concerned that the new regulations requiring registered shooters to have valid membership of an approved club may lead to a rush of membership applications from people who are not genuine competition shooters, but who are joining simply to fulfil a legal requirement for becoming registered shooters.

ACTA advises that, in order to minimise this risk, it would recommend that its members attend at least four competition shoots per year, and would cancel the membership of any person who did not comply with this minimum requirement.

### 5.6 Safety Training

ACTA has had a well-developed, Australia-wide Coaching Scheme since the mid-1970s.

- The first and foremost consideration in the Coaching Scheme is Safety Training.
- The Coaching Scheme is set up with a National Director of Coaching through State Coaching Directors to Zone Coaches down to Club Coaches.
- The Coaching Scheme operates through ACTA's affiliated clubs throughout Australia.
- The course is comprehensive and standardised across Australia.
- The course instructors are accredited by the Australian Coaching Council through ACTA.
- The course is designed to bring members to the required standard, with a focus on firearms law, firearms safety and firearms competency.
- The course is outlined in a Firearms Safety Code which emphasises safety and storage issues.
- The content of the course and the skills of the instructors are monitored on a continuing basis by the Australian Coaching Council and ACTA.
- There is also a strong focus on assessing the suitability of the person for membership of ACTA.

ACTA is very proud of its long-established nation-wide coaching infrastructure.

ACTA notes the Police Ministers Council resolution that all jurisdictions are to require the completion of an accredited course in safety training for firearms for all first time licence applicants.

ACTA advises that in view of its long expertise in this area, it is prepared to consider approaches from Police Ministers or any of their colleagues for advice and/or assistance regarding compulsory safety training for first-time licence applicants.






Overall High Gun — Craig Gray (Morwell) pictured with State President Vince Mollica, and Bob Buchan





Rule 1.20 (1) iv ADD

Until such time as a shooter records his initial 50 Tower targets, he shall be placed in the same grade as his current ACTA down-the-line grade.

Rule 4.23 (b) ADD

The Association shall keep a register of shooters, and no person may enter, or compete, at any Association competition, or Event, or at any Competition, or Event conducted by a member or members, or subcommittee, appointed for that purpose, unless such person is registered with the Association as a registered shooter, and is not in arrears with his registration fees. The Association shall have the right of refusing to register any person as a registered shooter without giving any reason for such refusal. The registration fee payable by a registered shooter shall be such as the Executive Committee shall from time to time prescribe. The Association shall have the right to de-register any registered shooter for conduct which the Executive Committee decides is unsportsmanlike, or for any breach of the Rules or by-laws of the Association, or for failing to observe the decision of the Association.

Rule 2.1 (a) Replace with

Note: All targets that are shot under 15 metre (Common Mark) competition conditions to be entered on the ACTA shooters record card — with the exception of Eye openers, Double Rise and those shot targets only.

Rule 1.10 (J) Replace with

In all events competitors must shoot from their approved marks. If a competitor shoots from any other mark, the target is LOST.

Rule 1 13 (h) Add

Handicaps shot double barrel are to be recorded for handicapping purposes.

Rule 3.24 (a) Replace with

High Gun shoot-offs at Nationals shall comprise of Skeet targets from 2, 4 & 6 (normal skeet, consisting of 10 targets in all) and 1 pair of Doubles from Stations 3 & 5, continuing until a result is achieved. Delete (1 full round of skeet).

Rule 3.28 (b) ii Add

Until such times as a shooter records his initial 50 targets (25 pair) double trap, he shall be placed in the same grade as his current ISU grade.

Rule 1.1 (q) Add

Mobile phones or like Devices, Must not be Audible during competition.

Individual scores from Individual events (not a total of days shooting) must be entered on Shooting Cards, for transposition purposes. Brackets of 200 targets, shot the previous year, can be carried over, for Downgrading purposes.

### ATTENTION ALL CLUBS

Trial of New Zealand Standard Targets

We are hoping as many clubs as possible will trial for us, and give us their opinion of the New Zealand Target setting, in the next six months. We believe this is a more consistent target, (particularly in windy and adverse weather). It is also very difficult to drive this target, a complaint that is made continually to this Committee. This would be the main difference. This target will be considered a legal target, therefore will go on the cards.

(taken from the NZ Rule book)

"For standard target shooting, the throwing elevation above the level of the shooting stations at 22.86m forward of the trap will be 4.9 metres (plus or minus 0.5m), and a properly released target, will carry 48 metres (plus or minus 5m) if measured over level ground in calm weather conditions."

ACTA settings shall apply apart from the above.

Please NOTE. A STANDARD TARGET is one thrown 48 metres in still air, with the angles set as a STRAIGHTAWAY TARGET from lanes 1 and 5.



dreaded 'no ammo demon' appeared. However, this time it was only held up in LA with red tape and after many phone calls to Ansett International, Ray Andrews and myself drove to LA and retrieved it.

Day One of the competition began at 8.30am and by the end of the day, we had some happy and not so happy people.

Day Two started with intermittent rain and by the end of the 5th round the scores stood at - Michael 122, Russell 118, Fillipo 110, John 118 and Adam 120. Michael made the Final in 5th place following a 24 moved to Equal 2nd with four other finalists. Then disaster struck as Michael called for his target in the 'single barrel sudden death shoot off for 2nd and 3rd', no shot was fired. The Referee walked over and took the gun, looked then called lost. Somehow during the time it took to reorganise the shoot off. Michael had flicked his safety catch on. It was possibly the hardest time Michael will ever have to endure, but to his credit he stood by the scorer, head up and

on lost sleep, and having some unofficial practice, we were ready for competition.





Whilst the road and gate to the Robe Gun Club has now closed, the pathway to the memories will forever remain open.




National DTL High Gun as well as a National Single Barrel Champion and also the National Champion of Champions. He uses a 32" Beretta 682 with 1250 7s.


Pizza Delivery








Singleton Raiders!!


