GUN LAWS

At the time of writing these notes, it still has not been decided if we can keep our semi automatic shotguns or not. Because this situation still remains, it certainly supports the theory that the proposed laws were done in extreme haste, and without consultation.

Last month we printed our submission in full and as a result I have had a number of phone calls. By far the majority of the callers have supported our actions, but the odd one has not been what you would call supportive. This only highlights the difficulty in pleasing everyone, no matter who or what you represent, and this should be the way of a democratic organisation. We can only attempt to please the majority of our members. In all our submissions our Association is restricted to clay target shooting and the firearms used therein. Lets hope a decision is made soon, and that it allows us to continue our shooting without further impediment.

The postponement of the Promotion Day was done after discussion and debate with members of the National Executive. It was decided the best course of action was to postpone the day due to the very adverse coverage the media was giving to shooting and shooters in general.

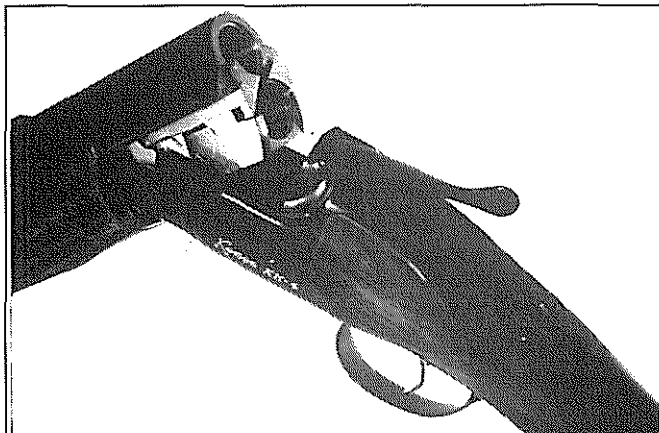
We look forward to seeing you all at next years annual shoot. Remember, Rockhampton hosts both the Central Zone QCTA and the Queensland Skeet Championships in September.

KEMEN

The Formula 1 Shotgun for the Competition Shooter

For a recently formed gunworks, the Armas Kemen, in Eibar, Spain, has excelled in the production of high quality, custom shotguns for the discerning shooter - whether Trench, DTL, Sporting or Skeet. Kemen makes guns for all disciplines. With the principal gun maker previously experienced with AYA and his own gun works, accumulating over thirty-five years of experience, the Kemen gun works has aimed high at hand made custom guns to satisfy the growing demands of discerning shooters by providing a custom gun at a 'value for money' price. By maintaining strict quality control with their guns Kemen have attracted the attention of many of the world's best shooters, including George Digweed and Richard Faulds, (sporting clays and double trap), Dan Carlisle (skeet) and Antonio Perez (live pigeons and zz). These shooters represent the pinnacle of their sports and Kemen is their choice for continued success.

For this presentation I actually had two Kemen shotguns, the basic model KM-4 Standard and the KM-4 Extra Gold. Whilst I have had the opportunity to handle and view many magnificently engraved 'best' guns not all were available for testing. The two Kemen were both tested thoroughly for this presentation and I might say at this point they were both very hard hitting and comfortable guns to shoot.

The KM-4 standard trench gun was supplied with well constructed and finished leather and canvas case. The inside of the case was lined with felt and the gun was supplied with its own gun socks. A large stock spanner was attached to the top of the case. A small compartment in the case contained a plastic receptacle holding two spare firing pins and v-springs, a tool to release the trigger lock and another special tool to remove/replace the v-springs. A certificate of proof and the customers stock dimensions were also contained in the compartment.

Assembling the gun was performed with ease. The barrels mated perfectly with the receiver and once located, the forend pressed into position. The KM-4, once assembled, looked and felt magnificent. A high competition rib was fitted to the barrel and combined with the monte carlo stock the Kemen looked every bit the thoroughbred it was supposed to be.

The Kemen distributor in Australia, John Gilopidis, had already been inundated with inquiries, having sold over twenty models in Australia in the first twelve months, including two \$30,000 special orders. Several shooters have also ordered additional barrels for their Italian Perazzi guns, for these are compatible with the Kemen.

With a 10 year guarantee on Kemen guns and barrels it is little wonder they have become so popular amongst more discerning

shooters, especially since the turnaround for a Kemen KM-4, customised and fitted to the client's specifications, can be supplied within six weeks. This is a great deal faster than any gun of similar quality.

Weighing 3.65kg, or around 8 pound on the old scale, the KM-4 measured 47" overall. The 29 7/8" barrels weighed 1.539, a good weight for fast trench targets. The high rib reminded me of the famous Perazzi DB-81 whilst the monte carlo stock was high enough to place my shooting eye 2mm above the rib, thereby providing excellent vision of the target at all times. The balance of the gun was pleasant, measuring slightly forward of the hinge pin. The feel to the gun was a great, for the forend and pistol grip were comfortable whilst the overall visual pleasure of the gun provided confidence and pleasure.

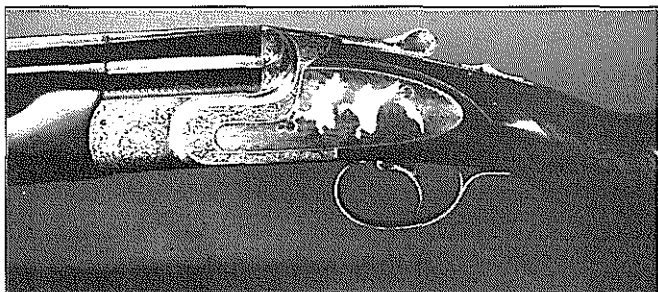
The Barrels

The 29 7/8" barrels, according to the customer's order, were custom choked to 6/10, (24 points of choke), and 9/10, (36 points of choke), marginally over half and just under full choke, respectively. This method of choking is related to 0-40pts of choke where 0 points of choke is cylinder bore, 20 points is modified and 40 points of choke is full. An inspection of the bore, using a Stan Baker barrel gauge, confirmed the bore to be 0.736". This is overbore from a standard 0.728". The chokes in the KM-4 were fixed whereas the KM-4 Extra Gold of Gilopidis' was fitted with Briley, (Spain), interchangeable choke tubes. These are an option that can be installed at the factory.

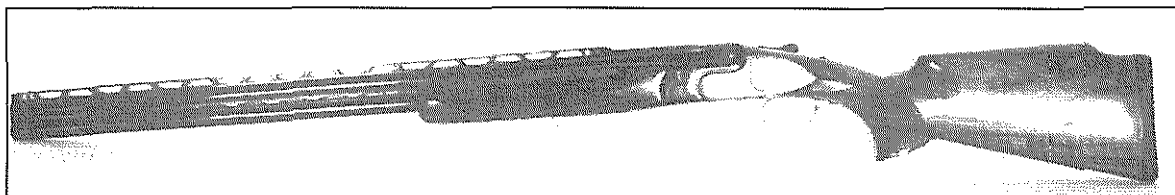
The bottom barrel of the KM-4 Standard measured 0.711, indicating 25 points of choke whilst the over barrel measured 0.701, 36 points of choke. This corresponded well with the customer's order. A measurement of the forcing cones indicated they were 0.55" long. This is longer than most guns, (around 3/8"), but not nearly as long as can be found on some competition guns - up to 4" in length. A surprise was the chamber length, at 76mm, instead of the standard 70mm for a competition gun. Three inch chambers are quite extraordinary although this might be the 'sweet' formula Kemen have struck that endows them with an awesome reputation for their 'hard-hitting' ability. (Oberfell and Thompson have reported markedly improved patter efficiencies with shells shorter than a gun's chamber.)

The parallel rib, 11mm high and 11mm wide, was most striking. It stepped nicely from the end of the chamber and was solidly constructed, although a few machine marks remained around some of the posts - higher grades would probably be finished to perfection. A white, half barrel-type front sight was fitted just back from the muzzle whilst a smaller brass bead was fitted as a mid-sight. The rib was file cut in a curved pattern and provided an excellent sighting plane, free of distraction.

All metal work involved with the barrels was magnificent, except for the machine marks mentioned on the rib base. Proofed to 1200 Bar



Although not presented herein the engraving and gold inlaid game scenes were magnificent on the higher grade KM-4 extra gold.

the KM-4 reviewed would be able to handle high pressure loads with ease. The sturdy, one piece ejectors were well timed and activated when the gun was completely opened.

The Receiver

Furnished with a deeply blued finish and tastefully embellished with the model number on both sides in gold, the receiver was very stylish and sleek. The lower frame of the Kemen, obtained by utilising bifurcated hinge lugs provided the gun with refined, low profile lines.

To disengage the trigger lock mechanism a small tool is placed under the rear of the trigger guard to engage a catch. This is then pushed across to release the mechanism. Once out of the receiver the lock work on the Kemen is well designed. Manufactured from high grade metals and hand finished, each and every part works with precision. The large v-springs utilised for the hammers are similar to those used by Perazzi and have a reputation for fast lock times but have also been known to collapse under extremely cold conditions. Whilst a user may never need to replace their original springs, or firing pins, it is comforting to know spares, accompanied with the necessary tools, are included as standard.

Trigger pulls were most accurate of any gun I have tested. Each repeatedly released at precisely the same value with the bottom hammer requiring 43oz., (2lb. 11oz.), and the upper hammer 48oz., (just on 3lb.). Both were very positive and extremely well tuned. The trigger foot shape was exceptionally comfortable with just the amount of rake for positive releases.

The design of the top lever was notably comfortable and smooth in action. It provided the necessary leverage to release the firmly fitted barrels with ease. A tang mounted safety catch was non-selective and fired the bottom barrel first. The trigger guard was generous in size and complimented the gun's lines.

The Stock and Forend

The wood to metal fit of the stock and forend was excellent, with the forend clamping into position very firmly. The checkering on both stock and forend was completed at 22 lines per inch. A triple border surrounded the checkering and although 'best' checkering is usually finished with a single border, without overruns, the triple border on the Kemen had overruns on some of the points - this was one of the few criticism I had of the KM-4. The other was two plugs in the forend to fill wood faults. (Surprisingly, the 'Extra-Gold' model also had filling in the forend.) Gilopidis advised this was due to a shortage of high grade, faultless walnut. A concern that has apparently been overcome by now sourcing walnut from Turkey. The stock and forend matched very well and the grain of the stock wood was well filled to provide an ultra-smooth finish. A black, non-ventilated, sorbothane Kick-Eez recoil pad was fitted for additional comfort.

Over the Traps

Testing the KM-4 Standard on a trap lay-out, shooting continental, proved to be quite enjoyable. The claim by the Armas Kemen people of the gun's 'hard-hitting' ability were substantiated as 28 gram Ballantine 1300 Special loads powered targets. Although I consider myself a very ordinary trap shooter the gun felt great with the light 28 gram loads, making shooting a pleasure. The barrels moved quickly and handled target angles very well. I might even concede that I probably shot above my ability.

Although higher in the stock and rib than what I am used to I was keen to shoot some sporting loads, although the gun is not designed for that purpose. The chokes were a little tight for sporting but the gun handled all loads, including some sprightly 34 gram loads, with ease. The sorbothane pad not only enabled the gun to come quickly

to the shoulder, it also absorbed any additional recoil from the heavier 34 gram loads.

Whilst the Kemen KM-4 Standard on test was basically a trench gun I found it quite good on other disciplines. I would imagine it would excel on ZZ targets as well. The KM-4 was very well made and custom ordered at a price most 'out-of-the-box' guns begin at. At \$7,170 the standard model did not have a spare trigger set. These could be purchased additionally with the gun for \$1,150, or at a later date for \$1,391. Obviously, a spare trigger set fitted to the gun at the time of manufacture was cheaper. Extra barrels cost \$2,860 if ordered with the gun. A list of other options is available from the distributor, John Gilopidis, by phoning 03 9311 0380.

The KM-4 Standard and Extra Gold models were very refined guns, I have included some photos of the engraved action of the Extra Gold as part of this presentation. At \$18,397 for a standard KM-4 Extra Gold, i.e. without extra trigger sets, barrels etc, it represents good value in comparison to guns of similar quality. It can be custom ordered and supplied within 8 - 10 weeks.

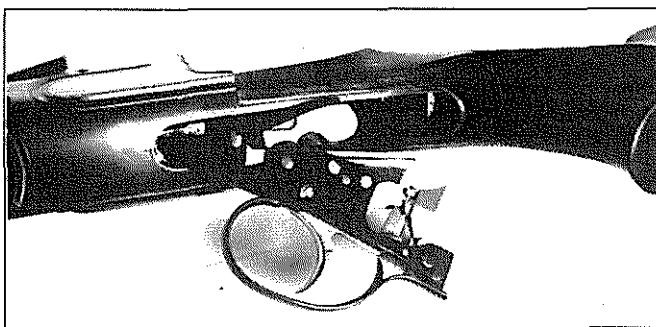

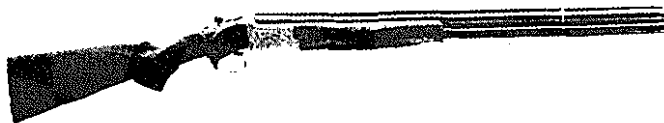

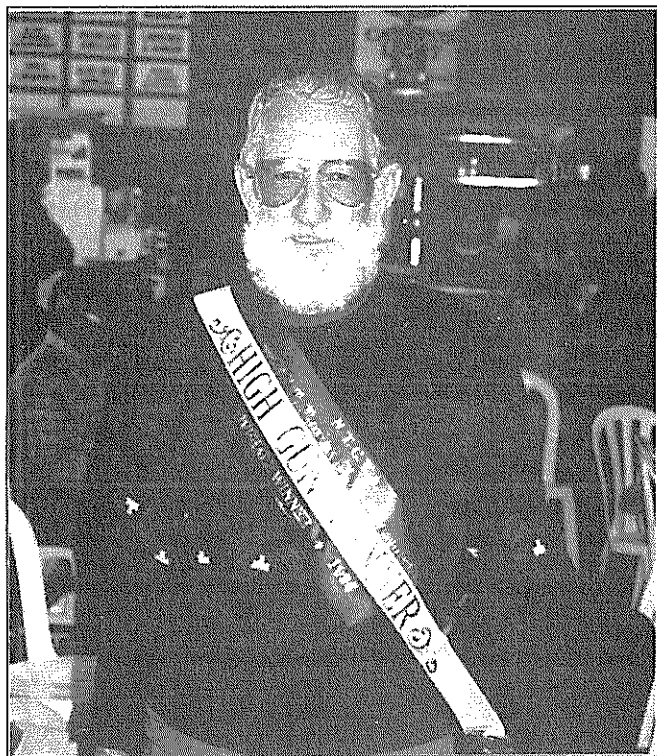

The second event on the program was the 50 target Paul Weis Memorial Skeet Championship won outright by Barry Mundt with 50/50.

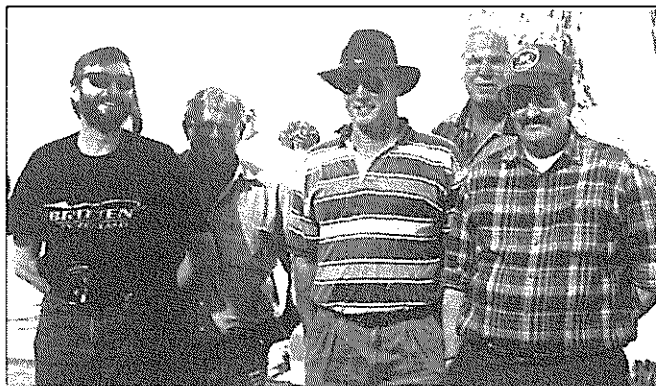

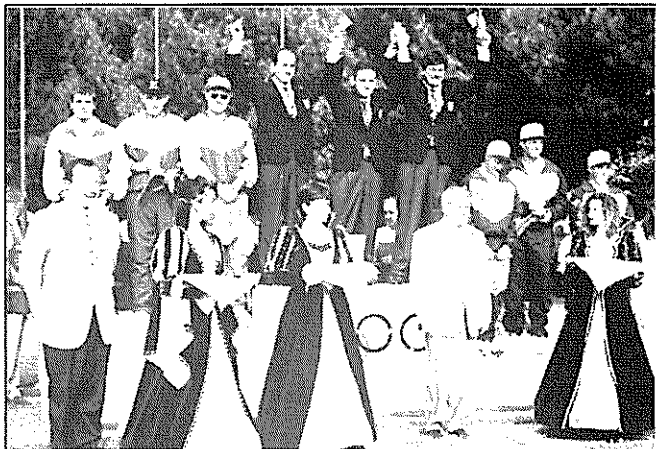

No one was up to the task and Overall and A grade belonged to Bruce. Ron Power held out to win B grade with 48/50 while former Port Denison shooter, now resident in Mt Isa, David Stitt won the C grade shoot off with 52/57, and of course those ladies from Normanton Dianne & Cherie Reeves, did their mother and daughter act again winning Best Lady & Best Junior.

The cash prize events are always held on the Sunday of the Mount Isa Gun Club Annual, and the first of them on offer was next to be contested over 25 targets.

The final results were to be A grade first Rob Cusack 50/50, second Mike Collins 47/48. B grade Ron Power 24/25, second Mike Coleman 26/28, C grade first to Cloncurry shooter Graeme Lake 24/25 and second placed in C grade Betty Fawcett 21/25.

Handicap was used to sort out the second of the cash prize events and this time Mt Isa's Mick Coleman came to the fore taking first place with 37/37. Betty Fawcett came in second on 36/37 with Bruce Murphy 32/33 and Ted Matthews 31/32 filling third and fourth places.

The finale of the weekend, as always, the Farewell Event consisting of 10 targets points score. Eight shooters tied for A grade all with 30/30.

Local shooter Ron Power 30/30 won first place in B grade with another local, Mick Coleman 28/30 taking second in that grade.

Cloncurry stalwart Graeme Lake placed first in C grade with 26/30, and Mount Isa's Anne Coleman won second place in the grade with 25/30.

With the competition over and done it was into the clubhouse for presentations with Mount Isa Gun Club President Neil Sinclair officiating. The question on all lips, and the cause of trying to remember those maths lessons of long ago (for some) was this. Who would be the Overall High Gun of the shoot. Well when all the scores were added up one man was two points clear of the rest. That man was Atherton Gun Club's Mike Collins whose 310/325 earned him the Pump-n-Power High Gun Trophy. An average High Gun Trophy was also presented and as Neil didn't know about it he was most surprised when Vice President Mick Coleman announced the winner. Neil Sinclair with a score of 287/325 was the Average High-Gun of the shoot.

The Mount Isa Gun Club extends sincere thanks to their sponsors, Pump-n-Power, Winchester, Hastings Deering, Ted's Refrigeration, Byrne Electric, BP Car Wash, Steelcon, Ultimate Kitchens and the Steamit Group whose generosity made the 1996 Annual Shoot such a successful event.

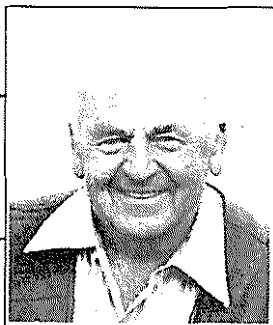

How to Shoot Better Scores

How, Why and Where to look for the Target

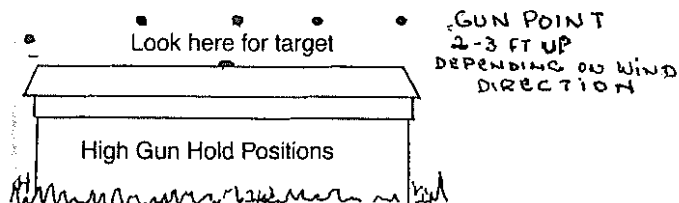
The next time you miss a target ask yourself this question. "Did I really see that target leaving the trap bright and clearly?" Your answer will surely be "well no, not really, I only saw it after it got out a bit further, causing me to make a hurried shot that resulted in a miss."

The problem of seeing the target quickly begins at the trap house, which means we must focus our complete concentration on seeing the target as quickly as possible as it leaves the trap house. This advice applies for both Trap and Skeet shooters, I am quite sure some shooters will say "OK, what's the bid deal in seeing the target so soon?" Well the answer is simply that the further out you see the target, the more certain you are prone to make a quick jab at it and stop the gun as you fire, and for sure the chances are you will miss the target. In order that you break target after target you simply must see the target clearly as it is leaving the trap every time you call for it.

The main reason shooters fail to see the target leave are lack of know how on what is the correct procedure in pointing the gun on the trap house before calling for the target. At this point we will assume that you have a trap gun suitable for clay target shooting, that the gun fits you correctly and that you have been instructed in the proper way to handle it. What you should be aware of is the importance of good gun fit, proper gun pointing and gun on shoulder position. If these details are not right then you will never be able to correctly control your gun, and if you are not able to do this you will never be able to point accurately on the target, hence your scores ill suffer and you will possibly have a bruised shoulder and a sore cheek.

Gun point on the trap house

I never cease to be amazed at the number of shooters who pay scant attention to proper procedure when calling for the target. It matters not whether you shoot one eye or two eyes, your concentration should be just over the front edge of the trap house roof where the target will emerge. This is the critical area where target travel direction will be known.

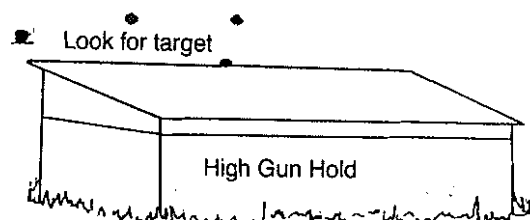


GUN HOLD POSITION ON TRAP HOUSE

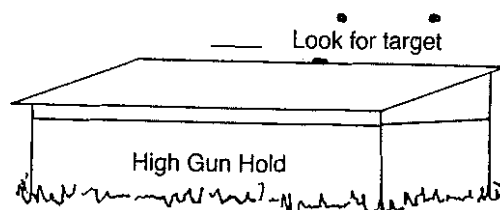
You must completely disregard everything else while you form a quick mental picture of correct procedure for shooting the target. When this mental picture is complete, call for the target. You will find that the whole action of tracking the target, lead, fire and follow through, becomes easier and more of an automatic action - provided you keep you eye on the target and your face on the comb all the way out until the target is broken. This is my favourite technique and one of the basic fundamentals of shooting clay targets, both trap and skeet.

There are two methods of gun hold on the trap house. Possibly the most common style and one that most shooters have been instructed to practice, is to hold the gun with the front sight bead just sitting on the front edge of the trap house at the locations corresponding to each lane (see drawing).

With his gun held at this point the shooter will focus for eye contact with the target about fifteen inches up from the hold point where he will pick up the target angle as it leaves the trap. It is important that you do not move the gun until after the call and before the target appears. At this point you must be sure to keep you cheek down snug on the stock and keep it here all the way up and out to the point of breaking the target. Any diversion from this detail will mean a lost target for sure. The forend method is the one I would suggest for the shooter who has to close one eye.

Another method of gun hold on the trap house is the one I have used personally all my shooting career, but unfortunately it is only the shooter who shoots two eyes that can adapt this style. The method calls for the gun to be held at a point above the trap house up to 2 to 3 feet, depending on wind conditions. (See drawing) The shooter will still focus for eye contact with the target, actually looking under the barrels for the target. This is a style that has a lot going for it, in that it cuts down on gun movement and tends to make the shooter concentrate more intensely on seeing the target leave the trap - this is what we want. The shooter who shoots one eye cannot adopt this style, because when the left eye is closed the view of the target leaving the trap is lost. To overcome this problem the one eyed shooter would have to wait for the target to arise above the gun. In so

doing, he cancels out the advantage he would otherwise have.

The main advantages in the high gun hold are that the amount of gun swing is reduced and the actual gun movement is not so fast, therefore allowing for greater accuracy of gun point on the target.

(See drawing) Lane 5 can be a problem for the right hand shooter if he does not position himself properly - an extreme right angle from lane 5 can frighten the hell out of the new shooter and a lot of not so new shooters, if they are not prepared for it, so make sure you stance is right and that the gun and cheek position is right. Be careful not to let the stock get away from its position under you cheek, as is often the case. Keep cheek and gun stock together always. You will then be pointing the gun where you eye is looking.

Shoot with two eyes open if you can, however it's not the end of the world if you discover you can not shoot with both eyes open due to the fact that you are a right shoulder shooter and have a left master eye. When this is the case you must obviously do one of two things - either change over and shoot from the left shoulder - or stay with the right shoulder and close the left eye. Actually some of our prominent shooters do just this and shoot very well indeed, so do not worry too much about this problem.

One method I would suggest you try is to keep both eyes open as you look for the target leaving the trap, then as you swing the gun up to and on the target, simply wink or close your left eye as the gun draws on the target and actually fire at the target with one eye shut. This practice will ensure a final alignment of gun and target. This practice may also help you to eventually keep both eyes open.

Here are a couple of good tips that I have found helpful:

1. The recipe for good shooting is simply a good knowledge of the basic fundamentals involved in shooting moving targets and a complete application of them always. Gun fit, gun handling and gun mounting are vital statistics that should concern the clay target shooter.

2. Proper gun fitting and gun mounting will bring your gun and eye into alignment. You will then be pointing the gun where you are looking, and if you keep your eye on the target you should then have no problem hitting the target.

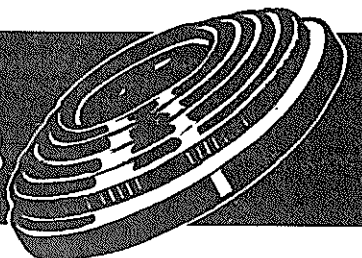

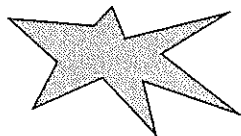
