National Gun Laws

At the time of writing this column the final issues surrounding the National Gun law debate is still to be resolved.

Crimping is no longer an issue with John Howard enforcing his own personal opposition, despite an agreement between all State Police Ministers to allow it.

It has been indicated that members of the ACTA will be eligible to obtain a C Category licence and be allowed to keep their semi-automatics for clay shooting only. This in itself is a win for the National Executive and their efforts in drafting the proposal presented to all Police Ministers.

I can only hope there will be no more impositions forced upon us simply because we own firearms and enjoy shooting clay targets.

Brisbane Gun Club

30 Year Anniversary Shoot

On Sunday 30th June 1996 the club celebrated the 30 year Anniversary of its establishment on the Belmont Shooting Complex.

One hundred and four shooters contested the events and in presenting the trophies President Paul Clarkson welcomed the "golden oldies" and visitors who made the shoot such a success. He also thanked the sponsors for their generous support by donating trophies for all events.

Shortage of time only allowed by a brief address by the Patron, David Evans, on the history of the club which dates back to the last century. He referred to a record of it being known in 1916 as the Queensland Gun Club which operated in the Rocklea area, a Brisbane suburb. In the 1930s the Hedley Park Complex was constructed on the edge of the Brisbane Airport. In 1941 this property was resumed by the Commonwealth Government for use by the USA Air Force. After WWII shooting was conducted at Myrtletown, a Brisbane suburb and in 1953 moved to Tingalpa which is close to the present site. In 1954 the club affiliated with the then A.C.P.T.S.A. as the Brisbane Metropolitan Gun Club and in 1956 the name was changed to the Brisbane Gun Club. In 1959 the Brisbane Gun Club flag was designed and has remained unchanged.

On the 26th June 1966 the club was officially opened on the present site by the then Lord Mayor of Brisbane, Mr Clem Jones. The club is grateful to the Queensland Rifle Shooting Association who administer the Belmont Shooting Complex for their continuing support and co-operation extended by them to this club.

It can be said that the day was a great success with the opportunity for the large gathering to socialise and reminisce.

The proceedings were completed by President Paul Clarkson cutting the large thirty year anniversary cake.



First of all, that is before I get into the skeet shoot results, I must say a fantastic congratulations to Michael Diamond, Russell Mark and Deserie Huddleston for their magnificent results at the Olympics.

Every member of the Broken Hill Gun Club sends their congratulations, you should all be so proud, well done!

The two day skeet shoot attracted 35 shooters overall and was held on Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 July. This number of shooters is really good to see at a skeet shoot, and they all braved the very cold and very windy conditions quite well.

With the SA State Team in attendance, readying themselves for the Nationals, there was going to be some good scores shot.

The first event was the Broken Hill Bottle and Recycling 50t Skeet Doubles Championship. 25 targets on each layout and quite a bit of wind would see only one score in the mid forties. Overall Ross Walsh 46/50. Grade placings A: Bob Dower 51/56; B: James Zammitt 43/50; C: Greg Higgins 41/50; Ladies: Carmel Ford 33/50; Vet: Alan Pearson 39/50; Jnr: Owen Zammitt 36/50.

Event two was the McLauchlan Motors and Engineering 50t Skeet Handicap. This event always brings out the burglars, however they would still have to shoot a few targets to decided who was going to be the best and take the trophy and sash.

1st Paul McLauchlan 80/84, 2nd Brett Howe 79/84, 3rd Owen Zammitt 59/66, 4th John Fleetwood 60/70.

After a great tea the Don Williams Contractors 30t Night State Single Barrel Championship got under way shot under some very trying conditions. These conditions experienced by some competitors, let us know the winning score would have to be very close to a possible.

Overall & B grade Hayden Bevan 28/30, 2nd Bruce Cook 27/30; A grade Ross Walsh 22/25, 2nd A. Schrimer 21/25; Junior & C grade to Aron Lynott 26/30 with Greg Higgins taking C grade second 24/30. No ladies or veterans competed in this event.

Sunday morning saw the start of one event that every shooter should have been waiting for, the South State Industrial Supplies 100t Skeet Championship. It was still very cold and very windy so to take this event out would need a great deal of concentration. As it turned out this event would decide the Overall High Gun for the weekend.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1.In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISU Skeet and rounds of 25 Pair for Open/Jnr Double Trap and 20 Pair for Womens Double Trap.

3. Nominations to be received by the time of 3pm of the day prior to the beginning of the Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director. All squads shall be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.

5.Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.

6.Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.

7.Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

8.All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

9.Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated as scorer/referee or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the services of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role SHALL INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.

10.Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11.All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12.All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed Jury.

13.When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

14. High gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for high gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective high gun.

15.Women and Juniors shooters only are eligible for their

section as well as the open event.

16.A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.

17.Practice of card playing at the Nationals Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas, or such areas as may be determined from time to time.

18.The UIT Rules will be used to determine the OA placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.

19.Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.

20.Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

21.An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

23.I am in compliance with State licensing laws in my State of residence and in the State where this competition is being conducted.

To all ISU Shooters, A message from the Shooting Committee

Sincere congratulations to Michael Diamond, Russell Mark, Deserie Huddleston, Ann Maree Roberts and John Maxwell for their fine achievements at the Olympic Games - Australia is very proud to have these shooters invited to shoot at the World Cup Final at Monticatini, Italy in September.

Unfortunately, this coincides with our own National ISU Titles being held in Adelaide so it is the decision of the Shooting Committee that these people will be awarded 10 points for 1st, 9 points for 2nd, 8 points for 3rd for their scores shot in Italy; the same points being awarded to those actually participating at our own National Titles. The Training Team will then be selected from the top 7 scorers with the 3 competitors shooting in Italy added in to make up the squad of 10, and 4 will be selected for the Ladies Double Trap as Deserie and Annmaree will be in Italy as well.

The National Training Squad will be selected as per the National Training Squad criteria. Eliminations will be held at the Frankston Gun Club (October 24th, 25th, 26th, 27th), the Melbourne Gun Club (November 21st, 22nd, 23rd, 24th) and the third elimination will be held at the Brisbane Gun Club's Grand Prix in March 1997, over all the programmed events.

The two eliminations in Victoria will have Trap shot on the first 2 days and Double Trap and ISU Skeet shot on the final 2 days.

The Oceania Teams will be selected from the Nationals and the first 2 eliminations. The following Teams will be selected providing New Zealand enters enough teams to make up the competition:

Trap: Open (2 Teams) A & B; Juniors (2 Teams) A & B; Ladies (1 Team) A.

Double Trap: Open (2 Teams) A & B; Juniors (2 Teams) A & B); Ladies (2 Teams) A & B.

ISU Skeet: Open (2 Teams) A & B; Juniors (1 Team) A (with a B team if enough participants); Ladies Nil.

The World Cup Teams will be selected from the Nationals and best 2 out of 3 eliminations as per the selection criteria.

Due to the fact that the World Championships will be held in November (just after our 1997 Nationals in October) the 1997 World Championships Team will be selected from the 1996 Training Squad.

The following information should also be noted - the Oceania Games will be the first MQS shoot for the year 2000 Olympics and the new MQS percentages for Men and Women's Double Trap are as follows: Men Double Trap 150 Targets - Old MQS 120, New MQS 118; Women Double Trap 120 Targets - Old MQS 90, New MQS 87. MQS for Trap and Skeet remain the same.

Please also note the following: (detail of rules and technical data handed down by the Chairman of the UIT Clay Target Committee, Mr Medhat Wahdan); From the technical meetings in Italy and Germany the following items will be enforced.

1. Shorts no shorter than 15cm above the knee and of a respectable design (not cut off jeans).

2. Advertising to be strictly adhered to including gun advertising i.e. 1 brand only per gun.

3. No guns to be closed, pointed or shouldered outside the designated areas (strictly controlled).

4. For the collecting of cartridges for testing, they will be taken from the identified competitor: A-Trap: As the competitor leaves station 5 on their way back to station 1. B-Skeet: As the competitor completes station 4 and waits to move to station 5.

5. All contact with competitors is to be polite and diplomatic if

at any time they are to be spoken to on any breach or clarification of the rules.

6. Major breaches to be reported to the Chairman of the International Jury before action is taken.

Rule Changes being Enacted

1. For finals, all equal scores will be shot off for the six positions. Count back no longer applies. i.e. 2×124 's ballot for 1st and 2nd; 3×123 's shoot off for the last 4 positions. A ballot is held then to decide the order of the squad.

2. Trap - Single Barrel shoot off resulting from Finals will be shot squad system. Defined as shooter 1 on pad 1, shooter 2 on pad 2, shooter 3 on pad 3, etc, etc.

3. Doubles - All individuals in shoot off following Finals will line up behind pad 1. Number 1 shooter is shown a pair, then calls and shoots. Number 1 shooter then unloads and moves to pad 2. Number 2 shooter moves to pad 1, calls and shoots. This carries on until all have completed pad 1, then shooter 1 who has seen a pair form pad 2 calls and shoots. The system is repeated until required results are finalised. Score form each pad still decides those that carry on.

4. Doubles Competition - At the beginning of each squad No 1 shooter will be shown a pair.

5. Skeet - For shoot off following finals only stations 3 4 & 5 will be used. Doubles to be shot from each station. Total targets from each station to decide those that continue to next station.

*For information, it has been confirmed that a new event will be introduced into the U.I.T. This event will be Skeet Doubles and open for both Men and Women. It is possible that the new discipline will be demonstrated at the World Cup Finals in September at Monticatini, Italy. The Doubles described is not similar to targets thrown in American/Standard Skeet.

The A.C.T.A. Executive had approved a 'Code of Conduct' to be implemented for all Australian Clay Target Teams - ISU or DTL. This Code of Conduct has been drawn up after consultation with the Australian Institute of Sport, the Manager of the Australian Track and Field Team and the High Performance Manager of the Australian Shooting Association.

If we expect continued support from the Australian Government, we must expect strict discipline of our Training Squads. This Code of Conduct document will be signed, in conjunction with the National Training Squad Criteria, as a contract with all participating members of the National Training Squad.

"Code of Conduct"

1. All athletes will be totally accountable for their actions at all times and will be held responsible for any breach of the following.

2. Designated responsible personnel to accompany juniors on all internal and external trips where possible.

3. Senior athletes must act as role models to the juniors.

4. All athletes will assemble at appointed meeting times, i.e. travel arrivals, departures, lectures/discussions etc. Disciplinary action will occur if designated times and places are not adhered to.

5. All camp participants, coaches, managers, athletes, will eat and sleep at the designated venue unless given permission to do otherwise, which will only be given in exceptional circumstances.

6. Rooms will be allocated by manager/coach - there will be no swapping.

7. Rooms may be inspected at any time by team or squad officials.

8. Male and female athletes will not enter each others rooms after 11.00pm.

9. Sexual relationships amongst team members will not be

tolerated excepting married couples or long term de facto relationships.

10. Designated clothing or uniforms to be worn at all times and inspected by manager/coach.

11. Absence from or going out from the camp area is not permitted unless the express permission of the manager/coach is given and all instructions for travel both to and from are adhered to.

12. No alcohol to be consumed at any Training Camp. The consumption of alcohol on overseas trips is to be at the official functions only and at the discretion of the manager/coach and only then in a responsible manner. Manager/coaches in breach of this will be dealt with more harshly than an athlete.

13. An 11pm curfew on all camps, trips away, etc.

14. Misconduct taking place at camps or competitions, which is not otherwise covered under this Code of Conduct (for example, drug abuse or damage to/theft of property) will be regarded as a breach of this code.

15. Breaches of this Code of Conduct may be met with suspension, immediate dismissal and/or fines.

16. This Code of Conduct applies to all ACTA selected teams whether overseas or at Training camps/Elimination competitions.

DOUBLE TRAP

After National Titles and eliminations, the top 1-3 shooters will apply for World Cups; 4-6 will apply second; and 7-9 will apply third.

Shooters not able to fill their positions will be replaced by the next highest scorer. After 4 World Cups have been held, shooters with the highest points will be selected for the World Championships etc.

NOTE: Shooters will only be allowed to attend one World Cup.

TIED SCORES

Any tied scores will be broken by a count-back system.

FUNDING

The funding for all World Cups and Championships will be on a self-funded basis. The A.C.T.A. will endeavour, through the Australian Sports Commission, to apply for support to encourage shooters to maintain high standards.

SHOOTER RESPONSIBILITY

All shooters must abide by U.I.T. eligibility rules and antidoping regulations.

In the year of the Olympics the order of selection for World Cups will be the highest qualifier other than the Olympic team.

The Olympic Team members will have first priority on World Cups as part of their training for that year.


SHOOTING COMMITTEE




Coffs Harbour 7th Annual Golden Snapper Event



Olympic Shooting

Shooting has been an Olympic event since the first modern Games in 1896 and Australia's recent medal record has been very good. It must seem perverse to most Australians that some guns used in the Olympic shooting events will no longer be available in Australia.

Not many know that it was Sir Alexander Fleming's (1881-19655) expertise as a rifle marksman that led to his acceptance as a postgraduate researcher by the head of the bacteriological laboratory, where he discovered penicillin.

Professor Sir Almroth Wright (1861-1947) head of Fleming's London University laboratory and Baron Pierre de Coubertin (1863-1937), founder of the modern Olympics, were both excellent shots.


In the low crime, neutral nation of Switzerland, the law requires that virtually all sane, able-bodied males between 20 and 42 years have ready access to self loading rifles at all times. There are relatively few murders in Switzerland involving military weapons. The penalties for abuse are severe.

At the outbreak of the Second World War, many new recruits in our military trained with axe handles and broomsticks, owing to the shortage of rifles. If invaded, our formal Defence Force would probably last only a few hours until its imported missiles were spent. Politicians have no natural right to disarm our citizenry.

Australians used to operate on the principle that one was innocent until proven guilty. Nevertheless, the new gun laws will make criminals of most owners of self loading rifles because of the behaviour of a few psychopaths. Meanwhile, the executives of tobacco companies are paid large salaries to kill thousands of Australians each year.

History shows that unarmed prophets do not survive. Prime Minister John Howard claims to trust the intelligence and judgement of the Australian population. The results of a carefully worded National Referendum should at least clarify the current uncertainty and confusion.

It's Time for Change

Not much has changed over 40 years

Recently while browsing through some old 1950's ACTA magazines it becomes obvious that a few things have changed for the better. Noticeably the standard of shooter performance and gun club equipment & ground layout etc, with some small clubs joining up with larger clubs and becoming more efficient.

'Famous Clubs Amalgamate (about 1948)

The Blackburn Club held its eighth Annual Meeting at Scott's Hotel, Melbourne on Tuesday August 24. The meeting was well attended and several important matters were finalised. Chief among these was the approval of amalgamation with the Nobel Clay Target Club. The later club, the mother of all clay pigeon shooting clubs in Australia, has been in recess since the early months of the recent war period.

Its former ground was taken over for housing and efforts to secure another venue proved abortive. The committees of the two clubs, through appointed delegates, then entered into negotiations with the view to joining forces.

The committees of both clubs approached the subject in true sporting spirit, hence any minor details or slight differences of opinion, ironed out with the minimum of delay.

The culmination of negotiations was arrived at during the annual meeting when (Nobel members had already approved) the Blackburn members unanimously agreed to the proposition.

The new name of the club caused a fair amount of discussion. The ultimate decision was to name the new organisation "The Australian Clay Target Club" (incorporating Blackburn and Nobel Clay Target Clubs).

The club will continue to shoot as one entity on the East Burwood three trap shooting ground. Dave Watson did such a good job in his first year as President of the Blackburn club that the combined members would not hear of his retirement from the chair in the new club's first season. He was deeply appreciative of the confidence shown in him.'

However we are, in my view, lacking promotion of our sport - in fact we have never been very good in this department.

My suggestions are the following: How about we switch to point scoring in double barrel shooting, it would lessen the cost of shooting and give us a decision sconer at much lest cost. I could never see the wisdom in for instance, shooting a 25 or 50 target championship, going on to 300/400 targets in the shoot off to get a decision whilst the rest of the members sit around bored stiff. While we are on the subject of changing things, let's alter the skeet rule of gun on shoulder. Why not go back to the early days of skeet when the gun was held off the shoulder until after the target is released, as is the rule in International Skeet. Let us present the trap and skeet shooter with a greater challenge. It is a great sport and would add greater interest by shooting more handicap events. This in turn adds more experience and better scores. Some thought needs to be given to the many meaningless so called championships competed for every week throughout the country.

During April of next year (1997) the ACTA will conduct the World Down the Line Championship on the grounds of the Wagga Gun Club in New South Wales. April 9, 10 & 11 are the three days the Championship will run over shooting 300 targets Double Barrel Point Scoring.

This 300 target event will surely give Australian shooters a first hand experience of how much more efficient point scoring can be. I would personally like to see single barrel shooting eventually, it is what we do at skeet anyway.

Letters to the Editor 1955

The following is a copy of a letter sent to the ACTA Secretary Bill McCullough for magazine publishing by Mr CJ Colledge, then Secretary of the Coburg Gun Club which is now the Metropolitan Gun Club operating at Epping.

'Meaningless Championships (1955)

If clay bird shooting is to mean anything in the field of sport, it is incumbent on the Association to exercise careful consideration of the ever increasing number of championships allotted each year.

The situation now appears to have got completely out of hand. Perhaps we have become too complacent in the past, but sooner or later the brake will have to be applied with a degree of force.

In addition to the annual championships conducted by the Association, the amazing total of over 300 "championships"; were allotted throughout the Commonwealth in 1955.

When the list was published, it was further pointed out that "any minor championship not allotted or shown in the list may be applied for to the Association secretary during 1955".

Add to this the innumerable club championships and you will see that the title of "Champion" these days loses a great deal of its prestige,, and in some cases leads to not a little embarrassment to the conscientious shooter.

Where is it going to end?

No other sport would tolerate such an encumbrance.

I would suggest that the most important title event in clay bird shooting is the Champion of Champions Cup. If it is not, then it should be made so.

As now, it should be conducted solely by the Association and should be made difficult to win. When won, the Champion should be acclaimed far and wide, not merely until the tumult and the shouting dies as pertains today.

It reflects little credit on the sport when it is realised that very few people outside shooters could tell who was the Champion of Champions for 1954, and even some shooters themselves may be a little hazy on that score.

The Champion of Champions Cup should be a single barrel event, the true test of a shooter's ability, and should be in the nature of an elimination test. When the test has been decided, the winner then has earned the right to challenge the present title holder, and the two should meet at the invitation and as guests of the Association.

The definitions of the words "champion" and "challenge" put the case in a nutshell. A "champion" is "one who fights to defend", while challenge means "a call to a contest".

To my mind no Champion of Champions has ever been specifically invited to defend his title the following year against all comers. Surely that is his right by common courtesy, and he should be invited to "fight to defend" "a call to a contest".

If he cannot accept the challenge, then the title should revert to the challenger.

Other sports lionise their top men, and what is more, insist that they lose their titles only in competition or by default.

A more modified procedure could well be adopted by clubs entrusted with the conduct of Commonwealth and State championships.

The foregoing title events will always attract strong fields, but from that very point the interest progressively lags, until some district championship draw fields, the numerical strength of which reflects very little credit on so fine a sport.

Night championships and clay sparrow championships could be deleted without loss of face. At best they are no more than novelty events and their promotion would be just as enjoyable to shooters without the appellation of the precious word "championship".

Possibly intermediate and/or tyro championships could be arranged, but that is as far as the Association should go. It should then direct that the word "championship" not be used for any other events, with the exception of club championships. This would go a long way in preserving the dignity of the titles.

Club championships are reasonable, but here again they should be subject to strict supervision. Domestic rules lay down that only financial members shall compete in club championships, but there is nothing to prevent a shooter joining a club on the day of the shoot and then taking his place in the field, perhaps never again being seen at that particular club. A member to be eligible should have been financial for at least three months.

The district championship set-up would be laughable if it were not so serious. Some have high sounding titles which mean nothing. They don't even mean that the event is restricted to shooters in the particular district to which the name applies. What possible glory or standing could be attached to the title of, say, "Walk-up Champion of the Distinct of Bandywallop"?

New clubs are being formed and will seek registration with the Association. They, too, in time will doubtless conduct club championships, and it is reasonable to assume that more official championships will be inaugurated to suit their particular districts.

If drastic action is not taken in the near future, every day will be a championship day. Even now some clubs are shooting two championships on the one program in order to get through their commitments.

Let the real championships be the only ones to count. Let the title mean something to the winner. Applaud his victory and let him be honoured for what he is - a champion.'

The following article is presented by Mr Peter McBride, Level 2 Coach, West Australian Gun Club.

STANCE AND GUN HOLD POSITIONS

Our stance, or the positioning of our feet, enables us to swing our guns cleanly and comfortably along the target path while maintaining our balance.

Previously, the rule of thumb was that on each track, the front foot, left or right, as required, pointed generally in the direction of the fifty metre peg, the feet being near to forty-five degrees from each other, the front knee flexed slightly and sixty percent of the weight on the front foot.

The shoulders being forward nearly to that foot and the feet no wider apart than shoulder width.

This stance enables the shooter to swing easily after the hardest target from each track, to absorb recoil without being driven backwards, and at all times maintain balance.

Then, on instructions from the ACTA, and moving more in line with the American ideas, the target angles were narrowed in, and the distance thrown became forty-eight metres.

Consequently, it is no longer so critical to cover the extreme angles and the targets are not moving as fast.

The new idea also takes into consideration the fact that a right hand shooter can usually swing easier to the left than right due to his left arm being extended to the forend and a left hand shooter similarly finds it easier to swing to the right.

Now we stand, assuming we are right handed, not pointing at the fifty metre peg but nearer to the left hand side of the trap house from track one.

From track two, our stance faces nearly to the centre of the trap house, from track three we point to the right hand corner, four we point some eight metres right of the trap house, and from five, some ten to fifteen metres to the right. These positions all favour the right hand target slightly, and are those positions used by most of our top shooters. (Reverse for a left hand shooter).

i.e. A simple way to achieve this is to use the clock method on each track:

Right hand shooters - Feet face: Track 1: 12 o'clock to 1.30 o'clock; Tracks 2-5: 1 o'clock to 2.30 o'clock.

Left hand shooters - Feet face: Tracks 1-4: 11 o'clock to 9.30 o'clock; Track 5: 12 o'clock to 10.30 o'clock.



Not so much weight is used on the front foot, as not so much body swing is needed as before.

People who have previously shot rifles, tend to adopt a fore and aft stance with the gun mounted out towards the shoulder joint, or with the feet wide apart. Both of these prevent smooth swinging from the hips, the shoulder rolls downwards, and the shot string ends up way behind the target.

HOLD POSITION

The next question: "Where do I hold the gun when looking for the target?"



- A. Normal hold for a two eyed shooter holding "high". Height depends on wind speed and direction.
- B. Normal hold for a one eyed shooter.
- C. Alternate points for "o" high pointing "o" Low pointing.

These are only guides. Each shooter must determine which gives the best view of the emerging target, according to the conditions and personal reflexes.

For beginners the old idea of left front corner, half way to the centre, centre, half way to the right front corner, and right hand front corner and just low enough on the top of the trap house to let your eyes see out over the rib and over the front edge of the trap house is still quite good.

The eyes must not look at the foresight on the barrel or the edge of the trap house, but just over both and projected some distance out with an open field.

With experience and with two eyes it is possible to hold high, ie to have the gun raised above the trap house so that when the target appears above the barrel you do not have the large amount of gun movement needed to catch it. The danger here is, if the barrel is too high, extreme angle targets can fly out beneath your vision. With a strong headwind, where targets are rising quickly, there is an advantage; with following winds keeping the target low, the advantage is not so good. A one-eyed shooters does better with a lower hold position, having a naturally narrower field of view.

Only the shooter himself can work out which method works best for him/her.
