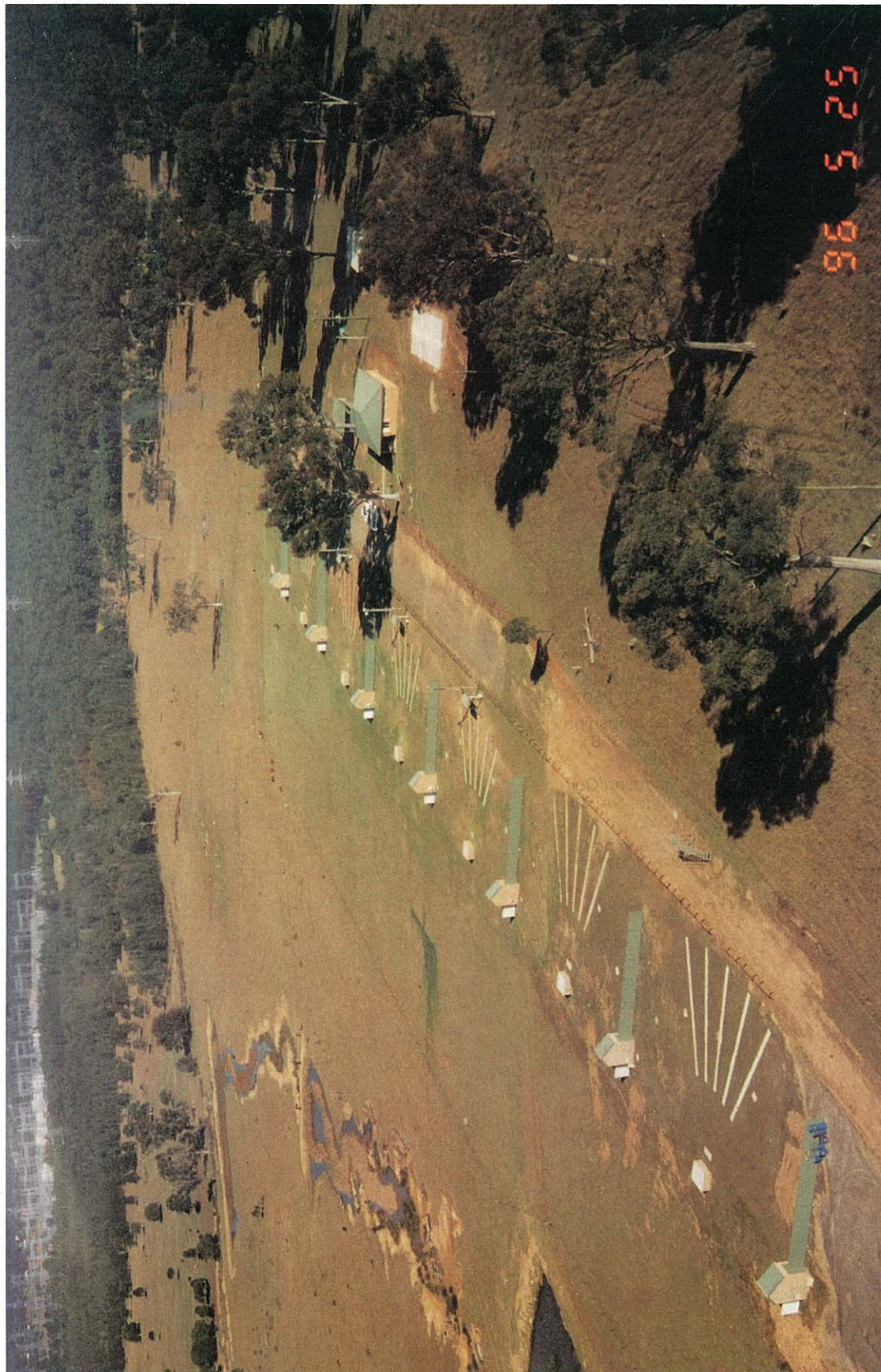

National President's Notes

FEDERAL GUN LAWS

Despite the earlier statements from Canberra that Australia would have uniform gun laws, it seems that each State will introduce laws as they see fit.

South Australia has been the first State to introduce their laws, and part of it allows members of the South Australian Clay Target Association/Australian Clay Target Association to make application for a category C licence to keep and use semi auto/pump action shotguns for clay target shooting.

It is hoped ALL other States follow South Australia in this matter.

NEW RULE BOOK

The Rules Committee are at present preparing a new rule book print. They are going through the rules and generally tidying it all up and it is hoped to have it printed by the end of the year. I must emphasise that they are not in the process of introducing new rules, but are incorporating all amendments that have been introduced since the last reprint and are removing any ambiguities that are present.

NATIONAL A.C.T.A. SPORTING CLAYS

The 3rd A.C.T.A./S.S.A.A. Sporting Clays Nationals are to be held at the Melbourne Gun Club on the 30th November-1st December. The Melbourne Gun Club/V.C.T.A. will be conducting an event on the 29th. Details are printed elsewhere in this edition.

The event will consist of 150 targets, 75 shot each day over 3 A.C.T.A. Sporting layouts. All shooters are invited to participate and enjoy the event.

GRAND AMERICAN

Approximately 20 Australian shooters attended this year's "Grand American". To most it was their first visit to the U.S.A. and all thoroughly enjoyed the experience. Each have stated their intention to return as soon as they possibly can. The magnitude of the event, plus the trade displays, drew the most comments.

Special thanks must go to Peter Streuber of Dayton, Ohio, who virtually adopted the Australian group and ensured their visit was something to remember. Thanks Pete.

WORLD D.T.L. CHAMPIONSHIP

We are looking to Clubs who are prepared to adopt a trap at the World D.T.L. Championship and aid as referees and scorers over the three days. Should your Club wish to participate, please contact Libby Bunting or the A.C.T.A. office. Enclosed in this magazine are entry forms for the championships. Please note conditions of entry. The amount of \$250 will be paid for the three days your Club officiates. By doing this, the workload can be shared by a number and the Clubs benefit financially.

VICTORIAN SCHOOLPERSONS CHAMPIONSHIP

The 1996 Victorian Winchester/V.C.T.A. School Championships qualifying rounds have been concluded, with the final being decided at Bendigo Clay Target Club on the 16th September. The turn out at each Zone qualification was outstanding. 215 attended at Shepparton, 183 at Boort, 103 at Frankston and 233 at Noorat. At each venue the enthusiasm was infectious and the conduct of all students exemplary.

To have 734 students participate augers well for the future of our sport and all concerned are to be congratulated. If the view of the Federal Government is for uniform gun laws, would it not be great to have the school programme Australia-wide.

Tamworth Clay Target Club

On Saturday morning 31st August, the Tamworth Clay Target Club members were certain that the Annual Two-Day Trap Carnival would be a wash-out. With some 50mm of steady rain over 36 hours, nobody thought that there would be many shooters who would attend the Carnival.

By 9.30am 106 shooters had nominated for the eight-event, 225 target program, a number that was only hoped for given fine weather conditions.

Despite the steady rain all day on Saturday, there were some excellent scores posted. The overall result of the 30 target Country Capital Double Barrel event was not finalised until Sunday morning, when John Sleightholme from Premer outlasted Tom Turner Junior from Cessnock. John's score was 290/290, a great score in very wet conditions.

The 30 target Champion of Champions event was won by Arthur Turner from Warren with 174/175 from AA Grade winner Ian Merrick from Cobar with 172/175.

The 25 target Continental was won by Tom Turner Junior with 85/85 from Robert Thompson from Cobar with 84/85.

The first event on Sunday with better weather conditions - at least the rain had stopped - saw the start of another day-long shoot-off between Bill Iles and Garry Rootes from Cecil Park

to decide Overall and AA Grade for the Miroku Challenge 30 target Double Barrel Classic.

Fuller Firearms sponsored this event and the Overall High Gun. The trophy for the event was a case of cartridges plus \$100 to Overall and Grade winners using a Miroku shotgun. A Miroku under and over shotgun was the overall trophy for the program. This shoot-off was eventually decided under lights with Bill Iles the overall winner with 365/365.

Bill Iles continued in fine shooting form to win the next event, the 30 target Pointscore Classic, with a score of 252/252 from Arthur Turner with 251/252.

C Grade shooter Tony Verrier from Toronto was the winner of the Handicap event, while Mark Crevatin from Melbourne won the 15 pair Double Rise event with the only clean round of 30/30, while great Tamworth Club supporter Gary Carlyon from Gunnedah won AA Grade with 37/50.

Mark Crevatin was the Overall High Gun winner and was presented with the Miroku shotgun by Fullers representative Craig Golding.

Ian Merrick was the AA Grade High Gun winner, Bernie Mackson from Scone won the A Grade High Gun, Glen Harvey and Scott Moody from Coonamble were the B Grade and C Grade High Gun winners respectively.

1996 Atlanta Olympic Games

Following a pre-arranged departure schedule, 15th July saw the Australian Clay Target Olympic Team join together at Los Angeles Airport. Apart from the 2 Skeeties, scheduled to arrive on the 18th, we were joined by several Pistol and Rifle shooters.

Under the guidance of the team Manager, Mr. Ray Andrews, we all boarded a Delta Boeing 757 and headed on the last leg to Atlanta.

Arriving in the Olympic City on 7.30pm, we were introduced to the hustle and bustle that was to be Atlanta for the next 3 weeks. At 2.30 the next morning, 5 hours after landing, we were through a very thorough Olympic Accreditation and taken to the Olympic Village. Here we were finally able to shower and get some sleep. Well, nearly all, as several did manage to find one of the 24-hour McDonalds spread around the village.

Later that day, after orientating ourselves with the massive expanse of the Village (which encompassed Georgia State University), everyone headed for the Wolf Creek Shooting Complex. As the 16th and 17th were unofficial training days, everyone used these to acclimatise and adjust to the 90-degree heat and humidity.

With the Official Opening to be in the evening of the 19th, the training on the 18th and 19th were to be limited to 3 hours

per day for ISU Trap only. As the Trap started on the 20th, it was agreed that Michael, Russell, John and myself would not attend the Opening Ceremony. (Earlier Craig and David had arrived, completing our group). Those that went to the Ceremony endured very oppressive conditions but were treated to a fabulous spectacular opening that will have many great memories for the future. The decision by the Trap competitors not to attend was to prove a good decision as most finally managed to get back to the Village by 2.30am.

Trap competition began at 10.00am with Michael, Russell and John very focused and fully prepared for the event to begin. The world's best were squared and began the competition with the first being introduced to the assembled spectators and then an explanation of what the event was.

At the end of the day John was equal first on 75/75 with Michael on 74/75 and Russell 72/75. Expectations were high and as competition began for the last 2 rounds, everyone was pumped up with excitement. As the results trickled in, the Australian camp found we had 2 positions in the finals, Michael on 124/125 and John on 123/125.

The stage was set for a tremendous final and at 2.30, following much media presentation and orchestrated parading, the final 6 settled down to do their best. On the Coach's bench with me sat Russell (2 competitors, 2 officials allowed) and, as Michael and John demolished each target, the stress felt by us was awesome. Michael had Joshua Lakatos, U.S.A., on his left and the American crowd cheered and screamed each time he fired. Totally focused, Michael maintained his timing and co-ordination to blast through the distraction. John was experiencing similar noises and looked in a great position to take second with 9 targets to go.

Michael's final shot and using a new Perazzi of only 2 months "Ink Blotted" his target for a 25 and, in front of 5,000 spectators, had won the Olympic Gold Medal. Pandemonium broke out with the Australian camp swamping Michael and eventually shouldering him around for all to see. John had dropped 2 low right-handers of 4 in the final brackets and slipped back to a highly creditable 4th position.

The emotions flowed amongst the Clay Target competitors for, with Michael winning Australia's first every Gold Medal in Shooting since 1900, he himself had obtained his goal set four years earlier in Barcelona. "Gold".

Following the medal presentation the compulsory drug testing took place, followed by the greatest media attention given to a shooter. Justly deserved was the catch-cry, and it was also Australia's first Gold at the Olympics after 2 days, and to say that way for another 3.

- 1st Michael Diamond Australia 124/125+25=149
- 2nd Josh Lakatos U.S.A. 123/125+24=147
- 3rd Lane Bade U.S.A. 123/125+24=147
- 4th John Maxwell Australia 123/125+23=146
- 13th Russell Mark Australia 120/125

Reality settled in the next morning and, while Michael did the media rounds, the Double Trap Women and Men began official training. Deserie and Ann Maree settled in well as did Russell and Steve, although Steve decided to stay with his faithful Beretta 682 instead of a newly acquired gun.

Competition got underway at 9.00am, and again the media presentation and explanation took place for the spectators. Conditions were like the Trap days, extremely hot and humid and, as the scores were posted after each round, our two women tried to remain cool and just put their best efforts in. As the 3rd round was completed, we found that Deserie and Ann Maree, plus 2 others, had tied for the 6th position in the finals on 103/120. Again the emotions started to rise, but the Clay Target Shooters, as was to be with each discipline being shot, rallied and kept Deserie and Ann Maree focused.

The tie-breaker began with Deserie first, followed by Italy, then Ann Maree and China. On Station 3 only our ladies remained and on Station 4 Ann Maree missed her second target to take 7th position and put Deserie into the finals. It had been obvious throughout the day that the slight change of technique she had perfected had been beneficial to Deserie and the mental work she and David Cunningham had worked on had completed the skills necessary to be in this situation.

Final tension mounted as the media introduced the ladies to the TV and a capacity house of 5,000 spectators. Deserie began and showed just how tough and experienced she is as she broke pair after pair. The crowd cheered every time Kim Rhode of the U.S.A. shot, but the big mover was Deserie. Sitting on the Coach's bench, I had to turn my "pace maker" up as I counted out the other competitors. The twenty pairs finished, and the unbelievable had happened - Deserie had climbed her way up to be equal second after starting several targets behind.

The tie-breaker (Deserie's 2nd for the day) began within 5

minutes, with Deserie first up. Luck was not with her and she missed her second target to have the Bronze Medal for her own. As with Michael, pandemonium broke loose. Deserie and Australia had a Bronze and shooting its second medal. What a picture - after years of shooting a discipline she didn't really like, a little justice had come her way. Again the drug testing then into the media scrum, as we had found out several days ago with Michael, was the norm.

There was no time to sit back as at 9.00am the next morning (24th) the Mens Double Trap began. Amidst the usual media presentation the tension was being felt as the field assembled to do battle. Round after round passed and Steve and Russell, a current World Champion and the immediate past World Champion put every bit of their skills to work. As the heat of the day increased, so did the tension as shooters vied for a finals berth. For Russell, success as he completed his 3rd round, finishing equal 1st with Chien Huang of Taipei. Steve had a stumble in his 2nd round and, even with a final effort of 45/50 came in at 17th position.

At 2.30 the finalists for Double Trap were called, and once again I found myself on the Coach's bench trying to look cool, calm and collected.

As with Deserie, Russell maintained his timing and crushed each pair as they appeared. This time there were not Americans in the final, so the 5,000 strong crowd got behind Russell as though he was their own. What a feeling as Russell punched through the 21st pair clean to only have to shoot one more pair to clinch the gold. History shows it took two pair before it was his, but with a 6 target lead, no one cared.

After Russell shot his last pair he turned and threw his empty Winchester shells into the crowd just before he was swamped then hoisted onto shoulders before a screaming and cheering crowd. Russell had Gold and Australia was No. 1 in the Clay Target field.

The media went wild for here was "One-Country Australia" basically dominating Clay Target Shooting and willing to talk to them (change of situation considering they never wanted to interview shooters before).

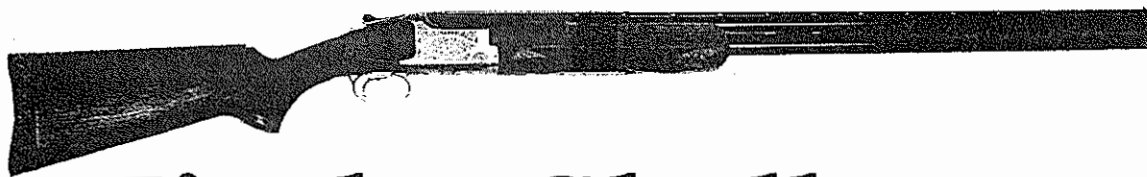

Friday the 26th and our two Skeet competitors faced the layouts for their long-awaited opportunity to strut their stuff. Conditions had begun to change and, although the temperature was still hot, the humidity had climbed and clouds had moved in. Both David and Craig started out well, but slipped up slightly in round one as they fought hard to put good scores on the board. At the end of Day 1 there were 2 75/75's in, 2 74/75 and 7 73/75's posted. David had run a great 50 to finish on 73/75, which Craig had compiled a 69/75.

The final day for shooting was not good as we were welcomed from drizzling rain to heavy downpours. Both David and Craig faced their rounds knowing the conditions would not be allowed to play a part in their next 2 rounds. As each shooter finished, the finals position became clear, with Ennio Falco of Italy shooting a 125/125. David had not been able to run his last two rounds as he had the previous day and finished with

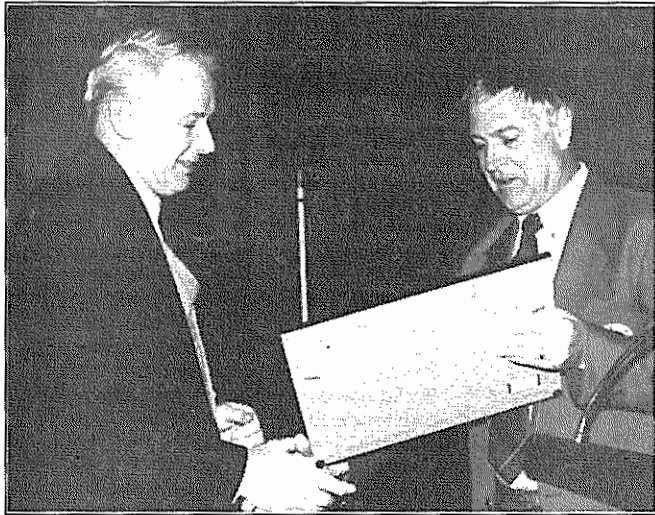

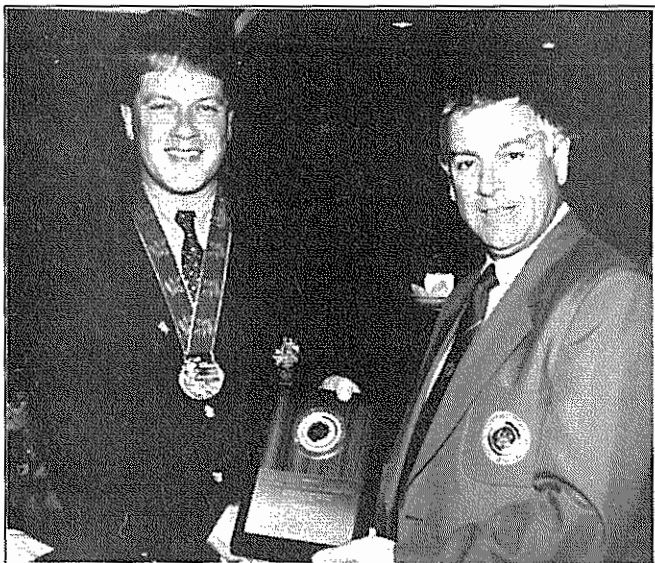

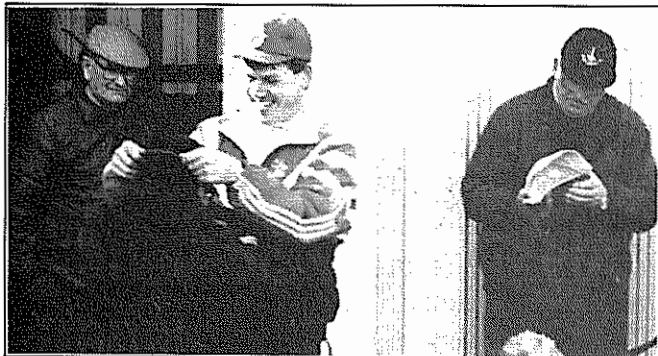

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in rounds of 50, brackets of 25, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4 etc.

3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF TARGET shall be incurred.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re squadded towards the end of the event.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and or score throughout the period of competition. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition. High Gun over 400 targets of the National Program.

17. Women and Junior shooters only are eligible for their section as well as the open event.

18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded.

19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.

20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.

21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

22. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

23. I am in compliance with State licensing laws in my State of residence and in the State where this competition is being conducted.

I.S.U. Postal Teams Match

The National office has received a number of queries regarding the ISU Postal Teams Match conditions.

In accordance with the ACTA Rule Book, Rule 3.25 the following guide is:

3.25 (a) Olympic Trap and ISU Skeet - The qualifying event shall be conducted over 50 targets. Teams are to consist of 6 shooters with the top 4 scores to count - the course of the teams event is to be 50 targets.

ISU Womens and Junior Teams to consist of 4 members with the 3 best score to count - 25 targets per team member.

(b) Double Trap - The qualifying event shall be conducted over 25 pairs (50 targets) for the Mens Team and 20 pairs (40 targets) for the Womens and Junior Teams. Teams are to consist of 6 shooters, with top 4 scores to count for Men, and 4 shooters in both the Womens and Junior Teams with the top 3 scores to count.

The course of the event shall be 25 pairs for Men and 20 pairs for Women and Juniors.

(c) All Team Event targets shot shall count and competition be completed as soon as possible, commencing from where the competition was suspended. (Refer rule 4.24).

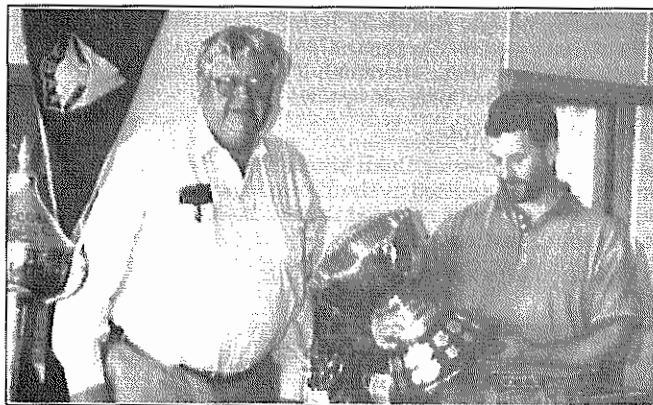

It is with deep sadness that I have to report the passing of an old long time friend and shooting pal in Frank Johnson. Frank was in his 89th year.

I first remember meeting Frank in 1948 at the newly formed Australian Gun Club at East Burwood, Victoria. The Noble Club and Blackburn Club merged to become the Australian Gun Club.

Like myself Frank used a Browning Auto Gun to shoot trap targets due mainly because the under and overs were not then on the market, and in any case we were not cashed up enough to afford anything better in those days. A Browning Auto Model 5 with vent rib could be purchased for \$20 with a spare vent rib barrel.

The picture shows Frank at the 1954 Nationals, Australian Gun Club grounds where he won the International Team High Gun with a score of 99/100. Here he used is Browning Auto.



Frank later took up skeet and became one of a small group in the development and promotion of the sport. He later served a term as Club President.

Frank was the official photographer for all National Championships staged at the Australian Gun Club over the next ten years, which was until the club closed down.

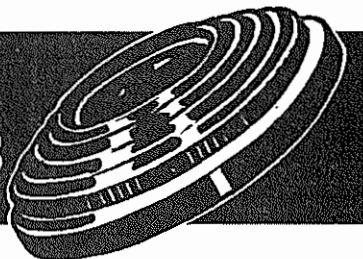

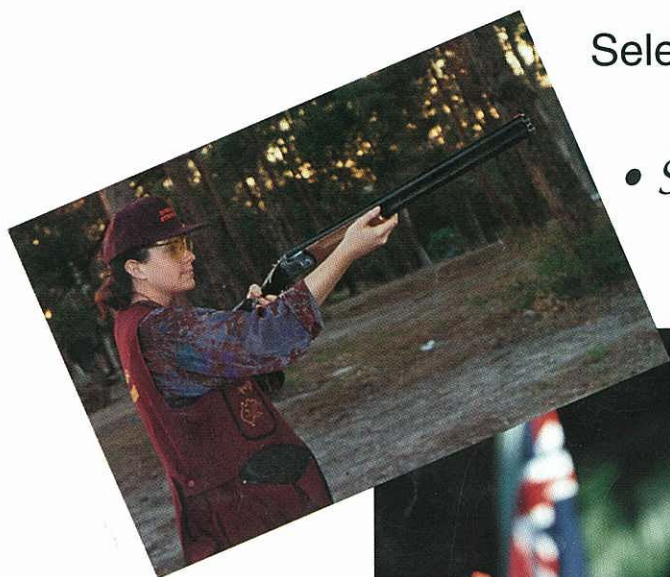
