National President's Notes

CHANGE TO NATIONAL EXECUTIVE

The South Australian Clay Target Association has notified us that Guy Yoannidis has resigned his position on the National Executive, and that he has been replaced by John Byrnes.

We thank Guy for his input and hard work whilst a member of the Executive, and we welcome John and look forward to working with him.

THE GUN LAWS!!

Once again we are unable to report any further on the current position re National Gun Laws, or the situation with members of the A.C.T.A.

It certainly makes you wonder how, when in a matter of days, a Government is able to prepare and present a vast change to the existing firearm laws, and then in a period of six months that follow, they are unable to present the most basic of decisions re these changes to the laws.

Negotiations are still continuing for A.C.T.A. members to retain their semi-automatic shotguns. South Australia is the only State to have enacted their legislation with

exemptions being granted to A. C. T. A. members. As the amnesty does not conclude in most States until September 1997, semi-auto shotguns, although they cannot be used at this moment, can be retained until this date.

SCHOOL STUDENT CLAY TARGET COMPETITIONS

Victoria has just completed another very successful year in school shooting, and due to the proposed laws banning the use of self-loading/pump-action shotguns, plus our success in Atlanta, this year's events attracted national television coverage.

When the programmes were aired, they included comments from the so-called experts against shooting and firearm ownership. These narrow-minded, self-important critics were not necessary; however, I believe the media coverage did us no harm at all, and the programmes came across in our favour.

If given the opportunity, I urge all Clubs and/or members to use the media to promote our sport. All I ask is that prior to making any comments to the media, make yourself conversant with the policies of the Association.

Mount Isa Gun Club Inc

The Annual Copper City Skeet Championships is the highlight of the year for the North West's dedicated Skeet shooters and last Sunday was no exception to the rule as the Mount Isa Gun Club hosted the 1996 Copper City Skeet Championships.

With three full squads of dedicated "Skeeties" raring to go the competition was always going to be fierce and so it was. Three shooters, Doug Stone, Phil Leddick and Jim Edmonds all carded handicap possibles and faced the shoot off which saw victory going to Doug with Phil and Jim having to settle for the minor placings.

With the Skeet handicap out of the way it was time to focus on the big one 'The Copper City Championship' and focus is just what Jim Edmonds did in shooting a fine 47/50 which earned him the title of Copper City Skeet Champion 1996 as well as the A grade trophy. Doug Stone finished just one point behind to win his last B grade Skeet title as his efforts earned him a promotion to A grade. Gordon Wilkie, a total newcomer to the sport of "Skeet", he in fact shot skeet for the first time on Sunday, proved he could be a force to be reckoned with in years to come by winning C grade with a well shot 43/50.

Many years ago one of the founders of the Mount Isa Gun Club and the man responsible for getting "Skeet Shooting" going in the North West was a gentleman named Gus Buerchler. Sadly Gus passed away quite a few years ago and in his honour every year the Mount Isa Gun Club presents the "Gus Buerchler Remembrance Trophy" to the shooter who top scores over both the major skeet rounds of the Carnival. Doug Stone was the proud recipient this year with a fine score of 94/100.

While many people would have had enough by this stage, clay target shooters a breed apart and they duly lined up for the Down the Line program which kicked off with a ten target "Eye Opener" event. The first major event of the afternoon was fifty targets of pointscore and Ron Power showed that using a brand new shotgun for the first time could be an advantage as he shot all fifty targets only incurring three penalty points for needing the second shot to finish with 147/150. This earned him the B grade and was the highest score shot in the event. Gary Brown and Rob Cusack both scored 144/150 and were sent out to fight out A grade with Rob Cusack emerging the victor with a final score of 159/165. Gordon Wilkie shot very well for a C grader (some say too well) and his 136/150 put his name on the C grade trophy.

Twenty five targets of Single Barrel shooting usually sorts out the men from the boys but not this time. Ted Matthews gave the "Vision Enhancing Devices" a quick polish and went out and shot the lot, as did Brian Palethorpe and Rob Cusack, but it was Ted who held them at bay and claimed A grade with a final score of 33/33. Sam Edmonds was determined to put his name on B grade and got off to a good start with 24/25, only to have Dean Cusack put in a zero to hero performance to equal score with him. Unfortunately for Dean his reversal to form didn't last as he missed the second target in the shoot off leaving Sam Edmonds to enjoy his second ever B grade badge.

The finale of the day's shooting was to be fifteen pair of Double Rise targets and Brian Palethorpe made sure A grade was his with 28/30. Michael Mc Phail, who travelled from Townsville to compete on the weekend, thought his luck had changed when he carded 24/30 only to discover that so had Sam Edmonds and Dean Cusack which made B grade a three way fight. The 'pep talk' that Dean gave himself after his dismal performance in the fifty target event must have worked as his return to form stayed with him as he won the B grade trophy with 35/42, and Glen Petersen, who had only

joined the club that morning, found his name on the C grade trophy which was earned as he shot 23/30.

The finale of the day was the drawing of the Mount Isa Gun Club Raffle, and it was with bated breath that everyone waited as Bruce Murphy conducted the draw and announced the winning numbers. Ticket number 0291 was the lucky one and an incredulous Gillian Holdsworth could hardly believe her ears when Club Secretary Ron Power rang to tell her that she had won prizes to the value of \$2,500.00. Michael McPhail, whose luck just hadn't been in all day, was equally stunned when his ticket, number 1723, was announced as the winner of the second prize of goods to the value of \$500.00.

The Mount Isa Gun Club wishes to thank all the people who supported the Club through the purchase of raffle tickets and also Michael Coleman who put in a sterling effort to make the raffle a success. Also our heartfelt thanks to Doris and Ted who did an excellent job of satisfying the need for food and refreshments. Thank you all!

Cowra Gold Cup



N.S.W. Level 1 Accreditation Seminar

Dubbo Gun Club — 14th & 15th September 1996

Since accepting the State Coaching Co-Ordinator's duties following the retirement of Fred Schmetzer, Chris Davis has gone about his tasks in a quiet but positive way.

To maintain the Coaching momentum in New South Wales, Chris planned a Level 1 Accreditation course to be held in Dubbo, thereby enabling accessibility for many prospective Club Coaches. So it was that ten coaching candidates and selected Level 2 and 3 Coaching presenters assembled on Saturday morning, 14th September.

The attendees: Lou Herne Goulburn; Paul Croker Goulburn; Neil Skelly Crockwell; Ken Fuller Dubbo; Rod Carr Dubbo; Robert Neaf Mendooran; David Coleman Wagga Wagga; Martin Croker Fullerton; Ian Piddington Narremine; Mike Height Swansea; Chris Davis Level 2 State Co-Ordinator; Robyn Faber Level 2; Fred Schmetzer Level 3; Murray Alexander Level 3 National Director of Coaching.

Beginning at 9.00am, Chris began with the introduced and explanation of Level 1 and so started what is traditionally a long day for the Coaching Candidates.

From this start we flowed into the Role of the Coach, presented by Fred Schmetzer. Fred took everybody into the everyday life of Coaching and the knowledge and situations that would be encountered. There was no area left untouched or question unanswered as the Coach's tasks were dissected and discussed.

With the lunch break over, Robyn Faber took over and presented the next session on Program Planning and Goal Setting. Robyn's presentation, like Fred before, had been well researched and was extremely easy to listen to and understand. This simple fact was not lost on the Coaches as they interacted easily with the programs being discussed.

A short break late afternoon led into the final segment for the day, that supposedly mysterious subject "Sports Psychology". Having been so involved with the previous subject, the coaches easily entered into the discussion as everybody explored the now not so mysterious subject of How and Why. This led into the training and abilities of competitors to manage the mind and have control over that which is controllable.

By the time this session was over the hour was late, so Chris called a halt and briefed everybody on the 9.00am start the next morning.

Sunday morning everybody was on deck on time and Chris began with Safety and Shooting Etiquette. This subject, although generally known by all Clay Target competitors, is now assuming a much more vital part of Coaching. As our new laws are pushed onto us, so must we adjust and become more aware of firearms, their safe handling and storage. Firearm Safety leads into Shooting Etiquette and again Coaches have a very defined responsibility to ensure the right techniques and knowledge of how the "on track" individuals responsibilities must be undertaken.

With the next subject being the "Characteristics of Shotguns", Chris carried straight on to clearly explain the many different and sometimes overlooked parts that make up a competition shotgun and how they interact with its owner.

The discussion on shotguns had led into the next subject of the "Basics of Shotgun Shooting". Fred unrolled his charts and, with practiced ease, walked everybody through the basics and into how they are and how they can be used. It seemed as though time would escape us, so after a short break for lunch, the final two sessions were presented.

Communication was the first, followed by the "I'll begin next week", Physical Conditioning. Each subject was discussed on how the individual can interact with others and how our lives away from the Sport need to be considered when making changes.

Finally the majority of the classroom work was over and the Coaches broke up into groups to undertake the practical session. This involved a coaching scenario with several of each group being coaches and the rest being observers. After 30 minutes of the set task, everyone retired back to the Club rooms to discuss the results and listen to how others viewed and heard the coaches at work.

Chris took over for the final segment, describing the following 12 months and the programming of supervising Coaches for the new candidates. Assignments from the Beginning Coaching work book were set and the weekend was wound up.

To me it had been extremely well-conducted Coaching Accreditation weekend, with high quality presenters assisting Chris extend the coaching numbers.

Thanks must be given to Dubbo Gun Club for use of their facilities, and especially to Chris Davis, the N.S.W.C.T.A. Coaching Co-Ordinator for a top effort.



Junior Development Work at Mount Gambier

South Australian State Coach, Phil Mules, has made two recent visits to Mount Gambier assisting local coaches with the development of junior shooters that have come through the Club's Annual Secondary Schools Gun Safety and Handling Programs.

Every year around September/October, the Mount Gambier Club plays host to as many as 80 students, Years 10, 11 & 12, giving instruction on gun safety issues and practical handling related exercises which ultimately culminates in a 10-target shoot at the end of the day.

Several follow-up sessions are provided for interested students and all participants are invited to the Club's Christmas Shoot for the Annual Schools Special Shoot. At this stage it is common that only 10-15 students will remain in the program.

The free program for students concludes with a day in March/April. From this point on they are charged a nominal fee to cover costs. Participant numbers are usually down to 0-5 by this stage and represent those with a real interest in clay target shooting.

Encouragement and special trophies are provided at all Club shoots for these junior shooters, whether A.C.T.A. registered or not. The program concludes in the middle part of the school year with a visit or two from State Coaching staff. At this year's final day, State Coach Phil Mules put in several hours with a class of six participants.

With the increased difficulty faced over the past couple of years in getting the program to students, the Club is taking a different tact in 1996, with a 90-minute presentation to each local school. The presentation will focus heavily on gun safety and related issues. Students may then elect to continue the program outside normal

The Club successfully retains on average one student each year to its membership list. Should you desire information on any aspect of this program, especially the difficulties faced, please call Club Secretary Phil Green on (087) 215 543.

Now 5 of our Olympians had qualified for the World Cup Finals being held for the first time away from Munich at Montecatini, Italy.


With the tremendous support of the Australian Sports Commission funding had been provided for all invited participants and myself as Team Coach/Manager.

Don't miss Moulamein

Moulamein - Clay target shooters in other states except Victoria, will say "Where the hell is Moulamein?" However, this tiny South West Riverina town, claimed to be the oldest in the Riverina, has been well known to Victorian fishermen and duck shooters over at least six decades.

Well, Moulamein Clay Target Club Inc, began life as a registered club in 1978, under the auspices of Norm Lipple and Robert Weaver, helped by enthusiasts such as Peter Redfearn, Ken Beet, John McCraith, Chris Gorey, L. Richards, Neil Slessor and one or two others. A weak Outers trap was first used but the club graduated to Snipe lever trap, known to (much) older shooters. The venue was changed three times, the last move being to the present ranges on the Moulamein Centenary Reserve, three kilometres from Moulamein on the Barham Road. The move to a proper traphouse and an early Ken Burton trap in late 1979 heralded a new era for the fledging club, believed to be the first permanent gun club in the district. This small organisation prospered and after several years, a second range was built and equipped with an upgraded Burton manual trap. Eventually, the club received a matching grant from the NSW Department of Sport, Recreation and Racing and purchased a Burton self loading trap (holds more than five) which proved to be a great asset.

Night shooting lights were provided at the No.1 range and a new phase of target shooting emerged, particularly in the hot months of January and February.

Over the years, Juniors have won State titles in both NSW and Victoria and senior shooters have made their mark in several states.

Faced with declining attendances, the club took the initiative to proved a majority of graded championships, with sashes and ribbons, together with reasonable trophies. This project was immeasurably assisted by the sterling work of our President of some years, Charles Peach, known in some circles as "Sir Charles". Blessed with more front than Myers, Charles has successfully bluffed, persuaded and coerced many local traders into each sponsoring a clay target competition each year. These firms have responded in a magnificent fashion, which, in turn has attracted top line competitors and dramatically increased attendances. Each sponsor has an attractive name plaque on display within the Clubhouse.

Whilst having donated funds to local charities in the past, perhaps the finest effort was a "Charity Shoot" held on 30 June, 1996. With an attendance of 43 shooters and many spectators, teams were formed by members of local sporting bodies competing for the honour of the highest score. The Visitors book was fully utilised and the supervision of safety was both close and constant. A barbecue lunch was provided and at the end of the day, a very happy crowd left the ground with the knowledge that a substantial donation would be available to a local organisation. Moulamein Clay Target Club Inc was pleased to present the local swimming pool committee with a cheque for \$400 - not bad for a town of perhaps 250 residents.

Recently, a second set of night shooting lights was commissioned on No.2 range and a day night shoot was held on Saturday September 28, 1996.

Some 44 competitors, from Castlemaine, Barham, Cohuna, Kerang, Deniliquin, Hay, Stony Crossing, Swan Hill, Tooleybuc, Patchewollock, Boundary Bend and Moulamein, took part in two graded Championships and a Sweepstake. What was probably only the third time in 18 years, rain set in from 12.30pm to 10pm, accompanied by a

strong breeze from 90 degrees left which further challenged shooters, In accordance with the strongest clay target shooting tradition, shooters, referees and scorers carried on with the program, office workers Doreen Weaver and Phyllis Epps doing sterling work with damp score sheets.

The first event, following practice, comprised a 60 target Medley of 20 targets Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Point Score, for a total of 100 points. This was sponsored by A & V. Upton, of Wakool Village, the Uptons are hay making contractors.

In AA grade Ray Peatling 97/100 took the honours, closely followed by Ronnie Glenn on 96/100. Ex Moulamein resident Kevin Geppert on 95/100 won A grade with J. Lowe 91/100 runner up. Rising B grade junior David Glenn from Deniliquin shot extremely well to win on 96/100. Second in B grade was Cohuna stalwart Bill Perry on a creditable 94/100. In C grade, M. Stuchbee was the winner on 92/100 followed by G. Passelque 90/100.

Following a barbecue tea, with fruit salad dessert, the night section of the competition commenced, still in rain with a strengthening wind. A five target Point score sweepstake saw 15/15 scored by David Mark, David Glenn and Neil Whelan to take the money. A 25 target graded Point Score Championship, sponsored by Paul and Helen Pearce of "06 Shooting Supplies" followed.

Cohuna's Ray Peatling 72/75 won AA grade, second was Craig Weaver of Moulamein with 70/75. Charles Peach took A grade with 81/89 with David Mark runner up on 80/89. Barham's Allan Street won B grade on 65/75 with Moulamein's Colin Hare second on 62/75. M. Stuchbee, 59/75 won C grade and runner up was Mick Domaille, Hay on 58/75, all shot in shocking conditions.

One feature of the day/night competition, in most adverse circumstances, was the excellent shooting and demeanour of Junior shooters David Glenn, Robert Kemp and small, courageous Nicholas Mark.

The Open High Gun award was won by Ray Peatling on 181/190 whilst the Ladies High Gun was won by Christine Geppert on 144/190. The well known Frank James of Kerang, a bulwark of clay target shooting, took out the Veterans award on 154/190. Frank had also helped with the preparation of the Moulamein ranges for the competition. Straight shooting David Glenn won the award for Junior High Gun on the good score of 171/190.

All in all, in spite of discouraging weather, a most successful meet was achieved. Following the presentation by President Charles Peach and Mrs Helen Pearce, various speakers thanked the canteen staff and all who had assisted with refereeing and scoring. The green grocery raffles were won by Mrs Richardson and Mrs Chris Street.

In a footnote, Moulamein is most grateful to Mrs Chris Geppert who has been successful in including Moulamein's shoot program in the V.C.T.A. Shoot book.




