GUN LAWS - THE CONTINUING SAGA

As I write these notes most States have confirmed that clay target shooters will be allowed to keep at least one semi automatic for competition. It is apparent that it will be some time before the changes become law in all states, and there is no doubt there will be differences between states.

On reading the proposed legislation it is very apparent the general aim is to eventually ban the private ownership of firearms

I have received a number of complaints that the ACTA did not spend a great deal of our legislation fund in this fight. It is my very strong belief that the money we spent achieved the only positive result by any shooting organisation, and that to spend the remaining balance of our fund would not have achieved any better result. I firmly believe the money will be needed in the very near future (possibly immediately following the Olympic Games in Sydney) to fight a major move to disarm the community.

To the armchair experts who are currently backstabbing the Executive members of the Association around the clubs and claiming we did nothing, let's have your positive ideas and we will act upon them. If you can offer no more than criticism, please look in the mirror before you speak, and I guess this applies to many issues.

WORLD DTL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Only limited places remain for this event. The response has been great as far as competitors go, but we are still looking for officials, trappers and scorers. The event now is less than six months away and the organisers are eager to have everything in place. If you are considering acting in any of the positions, please let us know.


His profile reads in part:







Adrian Cousens, Melbourne Gun Club Member, was the winner of the 12 gauge World Skeet Championships in San Antonio, Texas on October 9 1996.

Adrian had no intention of competing at the event and vying for the title. He was persuaded to attend to honour his American two-man team partner John Jensen, who was to be inducted into the National Skeet Shooters' Association Hall of Fame

The event was shot over two days in which 1,050 competitors participated.

You shoot five rounds consecutively each day. This takes approx 1hr 40m to shoot 125 targets per day. Nearly all countries that shoot American Skeet were represented at the event.

A total of 21 competitors shot the whole 250t, to go into the shoot off which included our Bairnsdale born and bred shooter.

The shoot off (at full fluoro orange targets) began at 8pm in the evening and was shot under lights on the one field. White targets were not used as they were too bright under the lights.

In the shoot off Adrian just kept breaking them until there was only he and the referee left.

"I couldn't believe I'd won it. For me, it overcame the one great disappointment of my career, after being runner-up three times in the 12g section and retiring, thinking this was it. To turn around and win was wonderful."

Apart from winning the 12 gauge event Adrian continued to have a very good carnival coming fourth overall in the champion of champions.

Adrian was the first person ever to originate outside the North American continent to win at the World Skeet Championships. This was in 1992.

In addition to the 12g he had previously been runner up In the doubles and 28g and a fourth in the 20g twice.

In 1992 Adrian won the very prestigious High overall ring with a score of 550/550. He was also only the fourth person to 650/650 to take the High All round and receive the very beautiful NSSA watch.

The 650t is made up as follows:

Doubles Championships - 100t

12g Championships - 250t

20g Championships- 100t

28g Championships- 100t

410 Championships - 100t

Adrian has also won two US Open National Championships, one Canadian

National Championship as well as four Australian National Skeet titles.

Adrian has not restricted his wins just to the 12g. In 1990 he won at the World Skeet Championships the high overall (399t) and won the 20g event.

Congratulations Adrian on your fantastic efforts.

Mildura has produced some top sports persons over the years, but it has been forty years since we were the recipients of any Olympic medals. A local lad, Keith Hogarth won a bronze medal in Boxing in the welter weight division at the 1956 Melbourne Olympics.

Whether it has been Deserie's Bronze Medal win or the publicity given the gun legislation, or both, Mildura Gun Club is running on a high at the moment, with increased membership and general shooting interest and activity on the up at the club.

A junior coaching and training program sponsored by North Star Motors Mildura (Gordon and Lorraine Colman Proprietors) saw fifteen junior shooters from the club enter the North West Zone State Schoolboy/girl eliminations at Boort Gun Club.

Michael Mammone and Theresa Dimasi made it into the senior finals with Ben Garraway being eliminated in the Junior section in a shoot off. Theresa was the only one successful and went on to win the Victorian Senior Girls State Title in the final held at Bendigo Gun Club.

As well as our Junior coaching program, some thirty pupils have been involved in a four week firearm education course being conducted by the club. This activity has proved very popular and is already being programmed with several local schools for 1997.

Not all will become shooters but at least they will grow up with an understanding of firearms and their use in our society. This may help eliminate some of the problems we are experiencing today, when it becomes their time to make responsible decisions, particularly in firearms legislation.

As this will be published in December CTSN, I take this opportunity on behalf of the Board of Mildura Gun Club to wish our members and those who have visited and supported us through 1996 all the best for the festive season and we look forward to your continued patronage for 1997.









The 'Cheating Campaign' which was co-launched by Federal Minister for Sport, Territories and Local Government Mr Warwick Smith, ASDA Boardmember Sharon Buchanan, Australian elite athletes Kieren Perkins, Susie O'Neill and Rebecca Joyce, has reinforced the message identified by the overwhelming majority of Australian elite athletes that the use of banned drugs in sport is cheating.

Olympic high jumper Tim Forsyth conducted numerous telephone interviews promoting awareness of the inadvertent doping problem within Australian sport.

* The distribution of more than 900 'Beat the Cheats' t-shirts, 1600 posters, 2900 stickers and 1100 badges promoting the cheating message to sporting organisations and individuals.

The success of the 'cheating campaign' would not have been possible without the overwhelming support that you have given to a number of national activities that were undertaken by ASDA in the lead up to the Atlanta Olympics.




A good year for the series winner, Morwell, left to right: B. Stokes, L. Lewis, B. Lewis, J. Attard, B. Webb.





Editor's Mailbox

Dear Sir

May we, members of the Kerang Clay Target Club Inc., take some space to congratulate Mr George Biggs on his article in the September issue of the CTSN on the number of meaningless Championships and the amount of Double Barrel shooting taking place.

We, as a small country club, are finding it increasingly difficult to operate in a society hostile to shooting sport and tightening finances.

We have always striven to give the shooter value for money rightly or wrongly, by running two Championships at most programs. We don't know why, bet the winner of the last one couldn't tell you what was written on the Sash. Probably because after being presented with the sash by the Club President, the recipient ripped it off as quick as he could, if indeed he put it on at all, and then jams the same into his pocket.

This coupled with grading presents a sizeable expense at trophy time: 4 Sashes, 4×1 st trophies and 4×2 nd trophies. If you don't give the above, and I guess there are other clubs with similar problems, it is only the bad news that spreads "only give ribbons", or "noms to high" or "lousy trophies", if not all three, at "such and such" club.

With other sports it is a season's work to be rewarded, not twice a day or possibly three or four times each weekend it the shooter is prepared to travel a bit.

Why don't shooters and those in high places look to introducing something new for club shoots?

Perhaps each club could run day, and if available night, categories of each double barrel, single barrel, pointscore, double rise and deauville doubles events (just an example), giving a total of ten Championships per club per year, and give another name or just plain old 'Common Mark' for club events.

With a formula similar to the above there is still a lot of Championship shooting available, and with a bit of common sense, perhaps we could do away with the 'saturation of Championships' of the present time and get back to what it is supposed to be anyway - SPORT.

Congratulations George for bringing this problem out in the open. Kerang Clay Target Club Incorporated agrees with you.

Australia's First Olympic Gold Medal Winner

by George Biggs, ACTA Historian

Yes he was a Shooter His name: Donald Mackintosh and the year was 1900 at the Paris Olympic Games.

Well before those of us who are shooting today were born, Donald Mackintosh was making a name for Australia on European Shooting Grounds and at the leading grounds and at the leading Gun Clubs of England in the 1890s.

Betty Cuthbert, Murray Rose, Marjorie Jackson, Dawn Fraser, Herb Elliot and other Olympic Winners of past years. But what about Donald Mackintosh?

In the year 1900 Australia sent three male competitors to the Paris Games. One of them was Donald Mackintosh, at that time classed as one of the best shots in the world. In Paris he won gold medals for game and live bird shooting but, because he was not recognised by the Australian Olympic Federation, Australia did not officially credit him with the honour.

Mackintosh's achievement, in fact, went unrecognised for 87 years, then Brisbane couple Professor Max and Dr Reet Howell, researching a book on Australian gold medal winners, came across his case.

They found an official 1936 A.O.F. history of Australia's participation in the Olympics did not included Mackintosh as a competitor in the 1900 Olympic Games. But other sources including Alexander Weyand's the Olympic Pageant and John Grombach's Olympic Cavalcade of Sport did included the shooter as a gold medal winner.

The Howell's decided to clear up the matter and set about obtaining Mackintosh's recognition by the International Olympic Committee.

Their efforts were rewarded when, on September 14, 1987, I.O.C. Secretary General Francoise Zweifel sent a letter to the authors confirming Mackintosh's medals.

The mystery of Donald Mackintosh's medals is one of the highlights of Howell's new book - Aussie Gold: The story of Australia at the Olympics.

Some of "Donald's" more conspicuous wins on the continent and in England and at home are as follows:

1890 First in Melbourne Gun Club \$2000 Handicap shooting 33 birds straight from 33 yards handicap.

Donald Mackintosh first visited England in 1896 where he spent a year returning again in 1900 to spend the next nine years "Donald" worthily represented Australia in European and British shooting circles, gaining much prominence as a successful competitor in the most important shooting events in the old world.

Donald Mackintosh's shooting feats at the 1900 Paris Games were only recently recognised by the International Shooting Committee.

The Melton Historical Society has commissioned Creswick Monumental Works to restore Mr Mackintosh's grave and hopes to unveil a commemorative plaque in honour of the great sportsman later this year.

The Society's Secretary, Ms Gail Chambers has written to the Australian Olympic Committee to ask if they can use the Olympic Rings on the Commemorative Plaque.

Donald Mackintosh was born September 22, 1866 and died September 8, 1951. He was inducted into the Australian Sports Hall of Fame in 1987.




Gladstone Clay Target Club Inc

The Birth of a Gun Club — Woods Point, Victoria

Recently I had a call from Don Woods, owner of the Woods Point Hotel and one of our founding members, to tell me about the loss of one of our members and an interesting tale of the birth of the Woods Point Gun Club.

"In the late 1960s in Woods Point no one used shotguns apart from the occasional foray into the countryside for duck opening. The ducks were pretty safe. Shooting a duck was rare as none of us knew much about the art of shotgunning.

"One night in the bar of the Woods Point Pub, Bob Legg a local miner and identity, Ron Wales from Warburton who was working in the area, and myself, were enjoying a beer and discussing our frustration at not being able to regularly get a bag of ducks, in fact even hitting them was generally greeted with great surprise. Ron suggested that we get a clay target hand thrower for some practice as duck opening was approaching, so the next day I rang Ron Martyn of Melbourne Firearms to see if he could help us.

"Ron landed at woods Point the next weekend with a crude looking trap bolted to an FJ Holden wheel, (not on the car at the time). Ron and I went to the old Slaughter Yards, which are just past the present location of the Gun Club, and set this contraption up. We went through a couple of packets of ammo each and managed to hit one or two targets and found the experience quite enjoyable. The following Monday, Bob Legg, Ron Wales and myself were having a few beers, (again), and discussing the merits of practicing with the clay target thrower. Because of our lack of shotgunning ability we decided that the idea of holding regular clay target shoots would improve our skills and gets us out of the pub occasionally. Ron Wales produced a \$10 note, slapped it onto the bar and said, 'I would like to be the first financial member of the club.

"That was back in 1970 and as you can see from that small beginning we built a successful clay target club that today still thrives even though it is one of the most remote gun clubs in the country. I am constantly amazed and pleased when I see the standard of shooters that have come from our club and always enjoy the friendliness and hospitality that our club is renowned for. Incidentally, until Ron Wales went to live in Warburton just after the Second World War, no one there bothered to go duck shooting.

Ron introduced the sport into this part of Victoria. Ron and I spent many enjoyable duck shooting trips together and I am pleased that he was the catalyst that got our great gun club off the ground."

On the 14th September, 1996, Ron Wales died in Warburton Hospital, a few days short of his 69th birthday. His service at Warbuton was one of the largest ever held in the area as he was a well known local identity and respected by all. Ron has the honour of being the first member of the Woods Point Gun Club, a distinction that no other shooter can ever hold. The following eulogy from his service sums up the way he lived his life.

"Ron, a man's man, a battler, a beaut bloke who loved his wife and family, boxing, shooting, bowls and footy.

He was proud to serve his country. His motto was 'United we stand, divided we fall'. A great mate who will be missed."

The committee and members of the Woods Point Gun Club mourn the loss of our founding member and offer our sincere condolences to his family.




