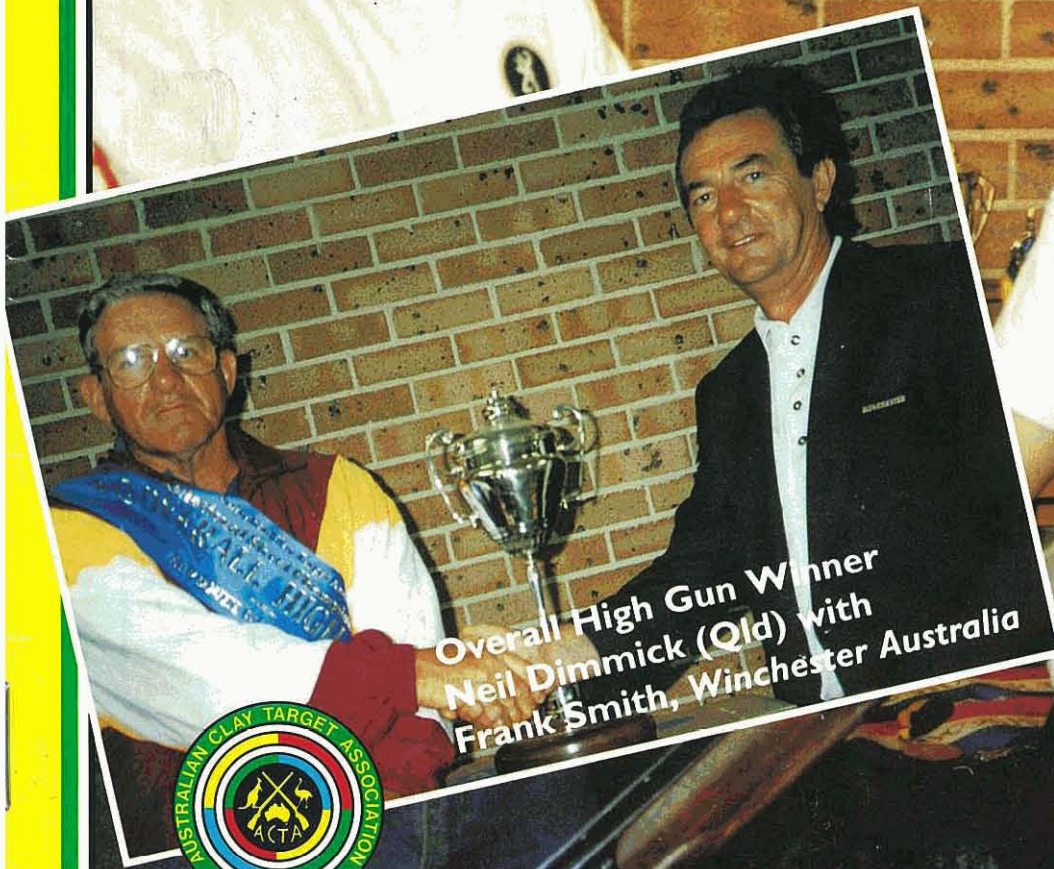

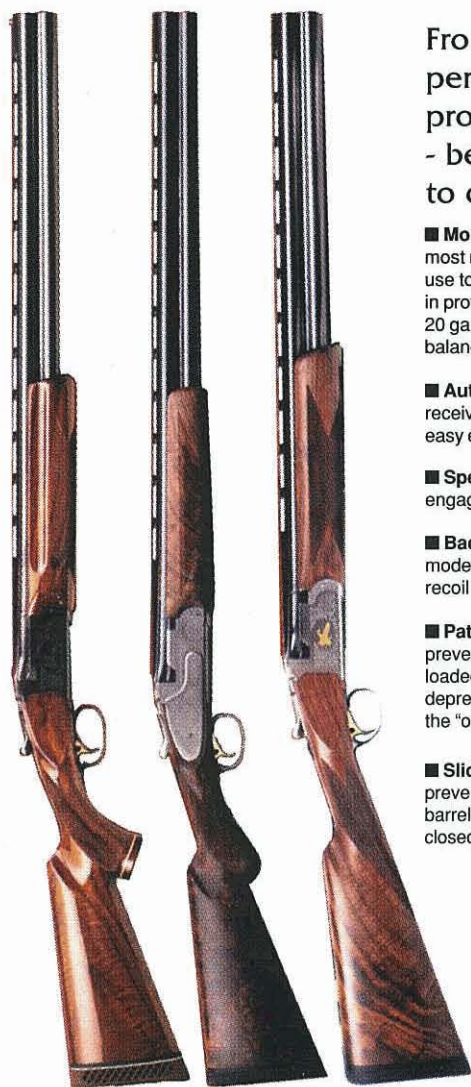

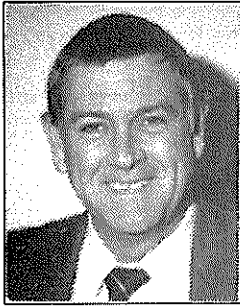

Elsewhere printed in this edition is a copy of a letter I have received from Canberra advising that as clay target shooters, we will be allowed to own and use semi auto/pump action shotguns.

We are the only shooting organisation to be afforded this privilege, and I do not envisage any other bodies will be approved in the future, and it is due in part to the manner in which your Executive approached the situation and the submission it made. Another factor would have to be the achievements of our shooters in International competition.

The Executive judiciously used funds in this fight for our shooters' right to be allowed to retain their firearms for clay target shooting and achieved the best result possible in the current political climate.

I hope the results we achieved meet the approval of those who believed we had done very little for their right to own and use these firearms.

WORLD D.T.L. CHAMPIONSHIP

We are still looking for referees and scorers for this event. There seems to be a misunderstanding as to the payment for this duty. We are paying \$250 per layout per day, in other words \$750 for the 3 days. So if your Club is prepared to adopt a trap, please let us know.

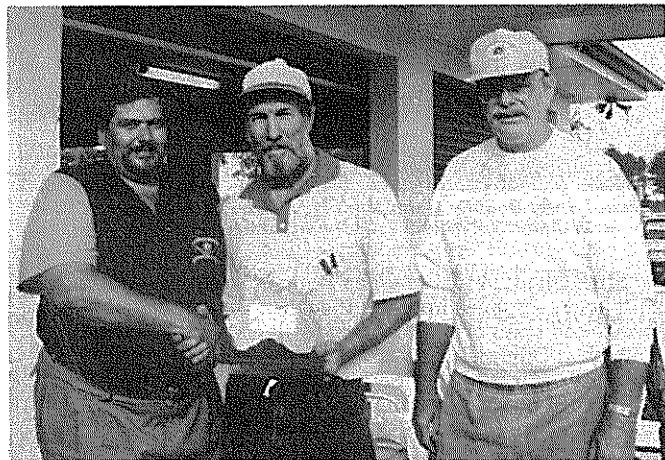

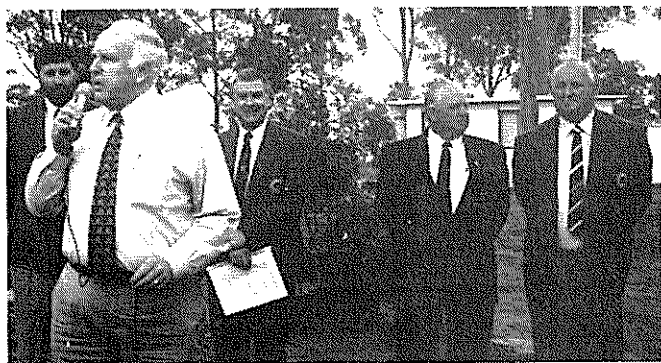

1996 National Skeet Championships

The picturesque semi rural setting of the Cecil Park Clay Target Club in outer western Sydney was the venue for this years National Championships and the weather remained kind for the duration of the pre-nationals and the Nationals. The club has 368 registered ACTA members at the last count and still growing.

Club President, Rev. David McLeod and his team of dedicated workers can feel very proud of this relatively new facility - a lot of thought has gone into the trap houses, parking facilities are excellent and with the Club house on a raised area, it is not difficult to see the entire length of the grounds in either direction at any time.

The best presented team was awarded to Queensland.

The National Skeet Doubles Championship was the first event and 133 shooters vied for the Paul Johnston Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge. With the 100 target completed, 2 shooters had returned 98/100 - Guy Bedington (Qld) and junior shooter John 'BJ' Withers (Qld). The overall winner was Guy Bedington 104/106, 2nd overall BJ Withers 103/106 and 3rd overall Adrian Cousens 109/112.

AA grade went to Neal Dimmick (Qld) 107/111, 2nd Dave Dundon (Qld) 98/102, 3rd Scott Wright (NSW) 104/108. Cecil Park member Michael Banicek was the winner in the A grade, 2nd Tib Gedson (NZ) 101/106, 3rd Pieter Muntz (WA) 95/100. The B grade award went to Andrew Chuck (NSW) 119/130, 2nd Frances Scott (Vic) 118/130, 3rd Robyn Faber (NSW) 97/108. 150 shooters nominated for the All States Skeet Championship, and only two shooters returned the 100/100. The overall first place went to Dave Dundon 101/101 from Mike Swale (Qld) 100/101, 3rd in AA grade went to Ray Everett (NZ) 161/162. In the AA grade section 1st was taken out by Robert Dower (SA) 160/162, from Nick Aird (Qld) 143/145 and 3rd Mal Briggs (Vic) 135/137. Kel Madsen (Qld) was the winner in A grade with 102/104 from Tib Gedson (NZ) 99/102 and Mike O'Neil (NZ) 126/129 3rd. Dennis Krieg from Cecil Park returned 97/100 to win B grade, from Frances Scott (Vic) 110/114 and 3rd placing went to Sam Forsythe (WA) 109/114. In C grade 1st went to Charlie Battisti (Vic) 91/100 from Elio Zadro (NSW) 97/109, 3rd going to Dennis

Harwood (Qld) 96/109. Margaret Denton scored a fine 97/100 to win the Womens Section with shoot offs required to determine the other section wins with Robbie Marino 102/106 Junior winner and Reg Clarke 100/104 Veterans winner.

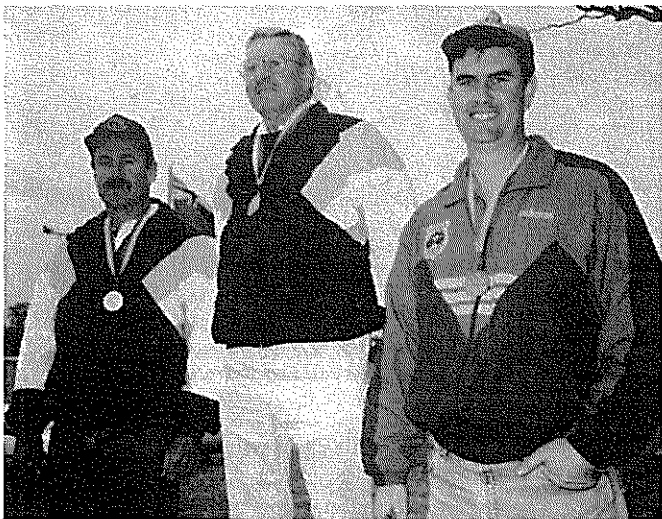

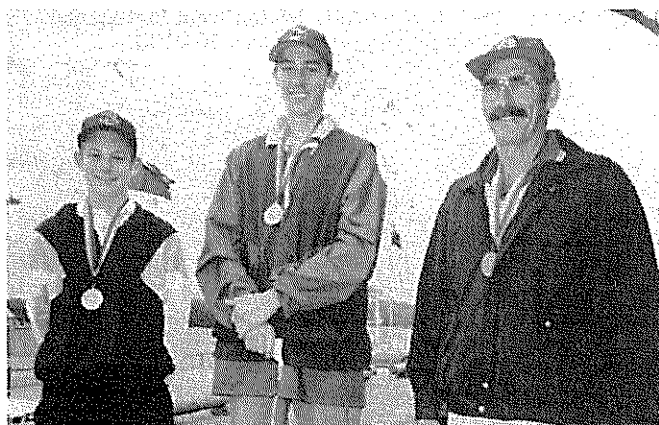
Michael Faber both posted 50/50, Robbie taking the prize with 85/85.

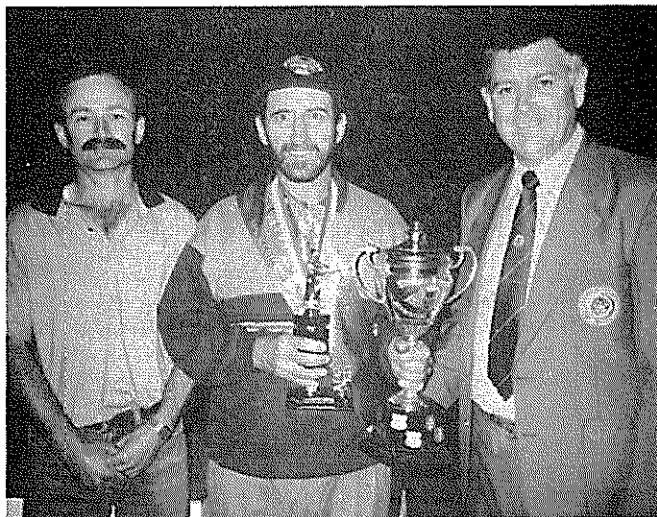

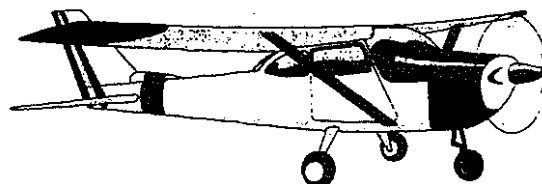

Dear Graeme

I thought I would write to the ACTA and explain the Kingaroy Gun Club's involvement in junior shooting at school level over the past ten years.

Just maybe this is the year we need to put our clubs involvement in junior shooting to the press, with the gun law debate, and the recent success of our trap shooters in Atlanta.

Since 1986 we have trained and coached the Kingaroy State High School Trap Shooting Team, and all young people interested for some six to eight weeks, starting September of each year.

Most years we have some 20-25 shooters who participate, and from these we shoot for the Kingaroy High School Trap Shooting Champion sponsored by Winchester Australia (The Winchester Medallion) and a Perpetual Shield donated by our club.

This award is presented at the Annual School's Sports Presentation Night. Bob Dupuy from Winchester has been a great supporter of our program. From these students we select a team of six to shoot the Queensland State High School Championship for a Perpetual Trophy sponsored by Winchester Australia.

The event is a 20 target single barrel off 15 metres, postal competition.

We have been fortunate over a number of years to win this trophy, and will be defending strongly again this year.

The students pay \$10 for this at our club. They shoot 25 targets per week, we have a number of club guns, jackets, safety glasses, ear muffs etc for them to use. They learn to trap, score and referee for the squads. Basically when they leave they look like shooters and are most safety conscious on the tracks.

We have two Coaches of Level 1 at our club, plus a number of interested members who assist.

We are fortunate to have a high school that believes in this program, I can recommend the idea to all clubs. You need to give a little of your time, but you will be well rewarded at club

To the National President

National Firearms Controls - Access to Category C Firearms for Clay Target Shooters.

I write to you on behalf of the Australasian Police Minister's Council (APMC). The APMC met in Brisbane on 15 November 1996.

Among the issues discussed at that meeting, was National Firearms Controls - Access to Category C Firearms for Clay Target Shooters. As some of the outcomes in relation to this item, directly relate to the Australian Clay Target Association, I wish to inform of the APMC decision.

The APMC, recognising that the international rules of clay target shooting allow the use of semi-automatic and pump action shotguns loaded with no more than two shots in competition, resolved:

a) to add a restricted class of shooters to those permitted to access certain Category C firearms under the following conditions;

(i) the applicant for the licence must, at this date, possess a semi-automatic or pump action shotgun for use in clay target competition and be an existing member of a club affiliated with the Australian Clay Target Association; or

(ii) in the case of a new applicant, the application must be supported, in writing, by an officer of an ACTA affiliated club, sufficient to satisfy the licensing authority that the applicant has a physical need (for reasons of lack of strength or dexterity) such as to require a semi-automatic or pump-action shotgun in order to participate in clay target events;

(iii) the applicant must take part in a minimum of four

club competitions per year with cancellation of membership for failing to comply;

(iv) the licence will only authorise use of the firearm on an authorised shooting range, in accordance with approved competition and associated training programs (including the loading of no more than two shots at a time) with misuse being subject to criminal penalties.

(v) the firearm, when not in use, be stored in a locked, steel safe of a thickness to ensure it is not easily penetrable, bolted to the structure of a building; and

(vi) these conditions must be explicitly stated in legislation/regulation and, in addition, ACTA rules must stipulate these minimum requirements and must require ACTA to notify licensing authorities of membership cancellation.

b) to note that the Commonwealth will amend the Customs (Prohibited Import) Regulations to allow the importation by international competitors, for a limited period and subject to exportation on expiry of that period, of certain semi-automatic and pump-action shotguns for clay target competitions; and

c) that international competitors in Australian be subject to the same requirements as Australian competitors in relation to use (paragraph (a)(iv) and storage (paragraph (a)(v).

I request that you consider the APMC's decision, and undertake to implement it as soon as possible.

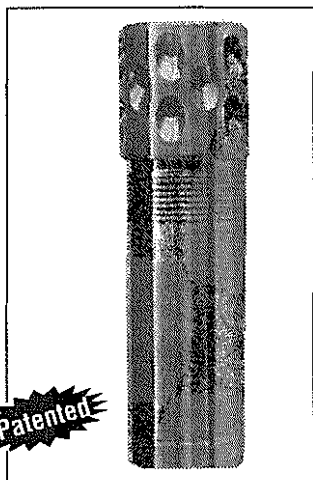

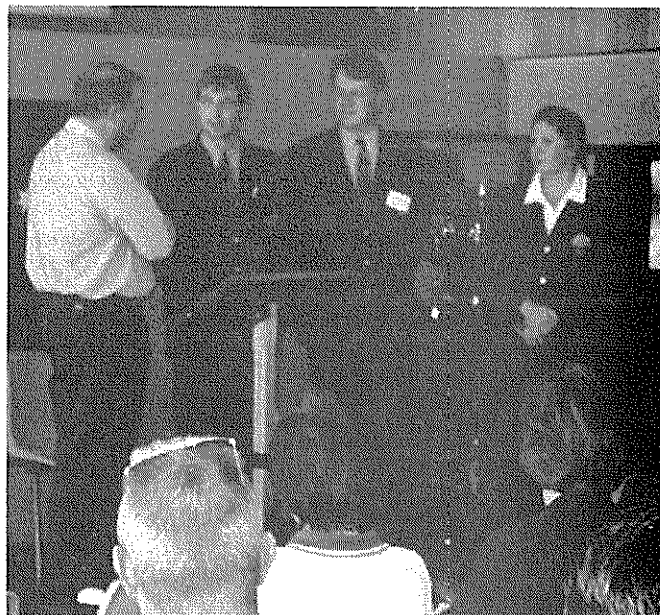

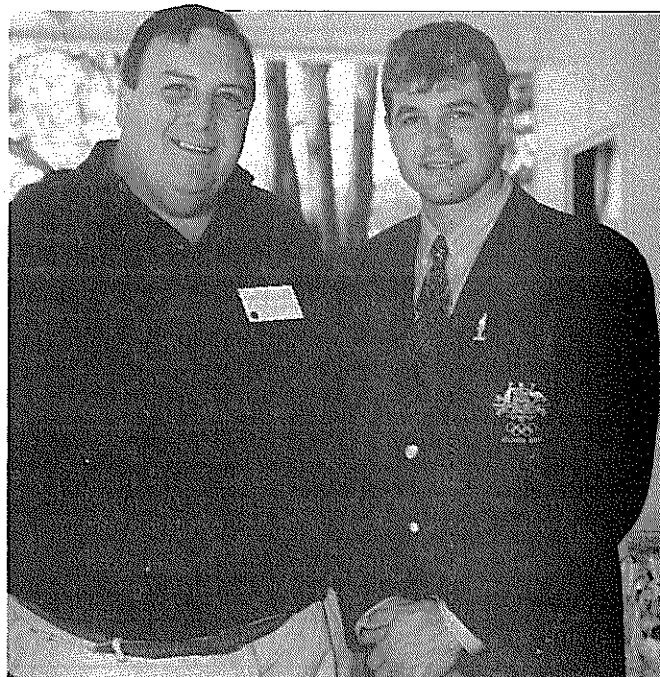

Media Release

Parliamentary Committee to inquire into the Funding of Community Sporting and Recreational Facilities

The Minister for Sport, Territories and Local Government, Mr Warwick Smith, MP, has tasked the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Environment, Recreation and the Arts with a new inquiry, Mr Warren Truss, the Committee's Chairman, announced.

The Committee has been asked to consider four matters relating to the funding of sporting and recreational facilities:

*should the Commonwealth Government establish a program to fund local community sporting and recreational facilities?

*what are the present and future requirements for national, regional and local community sporting and recreational facilities?

*could existing community and educational facilities be better used to meet community needs for sporting and recreational pursuits?

*what alternatives are there to the current methods of funding national, regional and local community sporting and recreational facilities?

The Minister has requested that the Committee report to the Parliament by 1 October 1997 with recommendations on these matters.

Mr Truss said that the Committee will be contacting sporting organisations, State and Commonwealth departments and agencies, local government, and private sector sporting interests about the inquiry. The Committee will invite them to make submissions to the inquiry and will also welcome submissions from other interested persons and organisations. The Association is finishing up a most successful 1996 membership season, with an increase in members in all categories.

A list of your clubs 1996 financial members is enclosed, please use the shooter membership numbers when renewing your club members for next season.

Registration forms for 1997 are also enclosed, you will be pleased to note that the Association has avoided increasing membership fees and maintained the same registration prices as last year.

In order to process your club shooter registrations, the ACTA must first receive your 1997 Club Affiliation of \$100. An account for same is enclosed, please forward this amount promptly.

Remember that the \$100 Club Affiliation Fee covers your club to the \$5 million mark for Public Liability Coverage through the ACTA Insurance Brokers. It is not necessary for your club to take out separate Public Liability Insurance unless you wish to be covered for more than this amount.

A summary of the Policy is attached for your information.

Firearms Legislation

In the January '97 edition of the CTSN you will see a letter with regard to the proposed Firearms Legislation. You will note that for members to use semi automatic or pump action shotguns they must be a financial member of the Australian Clay Target Association. No other shooting organisation will have this exemption.

As part of this legislation those shooters with a Category "C" licence must attend at least four competitions per year. This will vary from State to State eg South Australia Six competitions.

A record of their attendance must be kept in their handicap record card. If a shooter does not comply with this they will lose their licence. The ACTA will also advise the relevant authorities upon cancellation of membership.

As more details come to hand on this legislation we will advise all clubs accordingly. A summary will be forwarded once the legislation has been finalised.

Your Executive has been lobbying the various State Governments along the lines of the proposed legislation. The lobbying has been restricted to our field of interest which is shotguns. There has been some criticism of the Executive for not utilising the Legislation fund to a greater extent. We believe we have gained a maximum outcome for little expense.

Handicap Cards

With the proposed legislation that a shooter with a Category "C" licence must attend at least four shoots per year, would all clubs please ensure that the books are completed correctly.

Club Names

In this time when "Gun" appears to be a dirty word, I ask that all clubs consider adopting the words "Clay Target Club" eg Essex Gun Club would change to "Essex Clay Target Club". Please contact this office if you would like further advice on this matter.

Promotional Pamphlets

The Australian Clay Target Association has printed a promotional pamphlet for Clay Target shooting (sample enclosed). We would like to thank Winchester Australia for their support in producing this pamphlet and West Australian Clay Target Association for allowing us to adapt their brochure to the ACTA requirements.

A supply will be sent to all Clubs in the near future, but if you require some as soon as possible please contact the National Office.

The Case Of The Missing Jacket

The Australian Institute of Sport — Wednesday 27th November — Academics, sports scientist and specialist coaches from all over the world with elite athletes from all the major sports present and what was the talk of campus, the big mystery? Who's taken Murray's Jacket?

The gathering of state coaches attending the start of their Level 3 accreditation course were inadvertently to become involved in one of life's great mysteries, "The case of the missing jacket".

The cast of principal characters — Robyn Faber (NSW), Chris Davis (NSW), John Mitchell (Qld), Angelo Zappala (Qld), Jim Shepherd (Vic), Vince Marney (WA), Peter Strike (WA) and the inimitable victim or was it villain of the piece, Murray Alexander.

Open scene — Day 2, NSP room. After an early breakfast and opening remarks from Murray, the welcome and introduction to the course having been taken care of the previous night as soon as all participants had checked in, Murray at this time wearing the jacket which was later to become the focal point of the day, introduced Jim Papas, an affable, fast talking, American-born NBL coach to present the first paper — An insight into the workings of elite level coaches "The role of the advanced coach", this covered the requirements and pressures applied to and the relationships developed between coaches and athletes.

A short coffee break at the completion of the Papas presentation was following by the introduction of sports Psychologist Claudie Kulla who spoke on goal setting and demonstrated with, among others, sets of children's blocks to illustrate the importance of correct and clear instructions both visual and verbal during interaction between coach and athlete. This was to outline some shortcomings in those partaking of the demonstration and in particular that Peter Strike is color blind or deaf or may be a combination of both.

Another break followed by the presentation of course participants set assignments — to make a 15/20 minute presentation on a subject chosen by Murray, assignments ranged through rules, both standard disciplines and ISU, legal responsibilities of the coach, goal setting, physical fitness, gun specifications and fitting and patterning of guns. The day concluded with a short discussion on the events of the day and finally to bed at 11.30 pm.

Day 3 — A briefing on drugs in sport by David Packwood from the Australian Sports Drug Agency covering the specifics of the drug testing procedures and the rights of both athlete and coach. David's video based presentation was followed by Liz Broad — Nutritionalist in residence at the institute with a discussion on the correct dietary habits for athletes and much to the surprise of all present, not recommending drastic changes for those not partaking of a correct diet, but rather a gradual alteration with the focus on the reduction of the fat/s sugar intakes. The diet discussion was followed by Liz speaking on the effects of dehydration and the steps to follow to avoid it. In all both subjects were presented in a far more sensible and acceptable manner than is the norm with nutritionalist/dietitians. Lunch with Liz Broad proved to be an interesting experience, it was surprising to note the immediate change to the food selection and amount by course participants.

After lunch the afternoon was started with the presentation of "evaluation and assessment" by Ellery Reid, a tri-athlete on the staff at the AIS and then out to a local restaurant for a well earned night of relaxation, coupled with the fortune of having picked one of Canberra's better eating houses completely by accident.

Day 4 — Early wake up, a brisk walk around the campus,

breakfast and then, at it again — a 2 hour presentation from Murray on the organisation and administration of seminars, courses and touring squads and then another period with sports psychologist Claudia Kulla. Finally a break for lunch and in the afternoon a trip to the Canberra International Gun Club to inspect the facility, unload clays and ammunition in preparation for the Junior Development Camp, which was to follow the completion of the Level 3 course. Practical coaching followed to complete the afternoon. The building of the complex at the CIGC is progressing well with the clubhouse not far from completion, it would have probably already been finished had not the local vandals paid a visit and smashed all the glass panel doors and windows. The setback aside, there was been a huge amount of work done by the usual small group of people, as found in most club unfortunately.

The return to the institute, then dinner followed by a discussion on the interpretation and application of the UIT Rules completed the activities for the day.

Day 5 — The final presentations of this course, a UIT referees course and the summation of all subjects covered, coupled with suggestions for inclusion of next year's course concluded what was a very intensive, demanding schedule for all concerned.

And what of the mystery of Murray's jacket?

Sometime between the sports psychology session and the resumption after lunch on day 2, Murray's jacket, which had by this time been left hanging over the back of a chair in the NSP room, disappeared — well, what a to do, Murray's favourite jacket, the top half of a track suit, gone, all manner of people had access to the room, where do we start to look?

Discussion over who was about at the time and who was seen to go past when we were in the dining hall. No clues, just the usual feeling of disbelief that we all seem to experience when something is taken.

Suddenly Murray jumped up and hurried away, that fierce, bulldog like look of determination fixed on his face, as we were to later learn, in hot pursuit of two members of the cleaning staff. A few minutes later Murray reappeared jacket in hand a tale to tell of his pursuit of the buggy mounted cleaners through the grounds, over garden beds, through hedges and ponds, students and lecturers alike scattering in all directions to avoid the pursued and the by now, puffing, red faced pursuer. Finally success, cornered in the swimming pool, darstedly cads, how dare they cross our director of coaching, a stern talking to, a report to the office and the mystery was solved.

All taken into consideration a highly successful camp, state coaches all gathered in the same place at the same time in the pursuit of furthering their knowledge, for the betterment of clay target shooting Australia-wide, and all put together, as usual, with military like precision by Murray Alexander. The course participants would like to acknowledge Murray's input and register our expression of thanks.

It was probably the only down side of an otherwise very productive week, that some states did not send senior level coaches and one state, which had two coaches attend, did not support either this endeavour or its participants, who had to meet their own considerable expenses after being refused funding assistance by their state executive.

If coaching is to achieve its rightful, recognised place in the further development of clay target shooting, then maybe it is high time that some of the monies obtained on the pretence of development is spent to this end.
