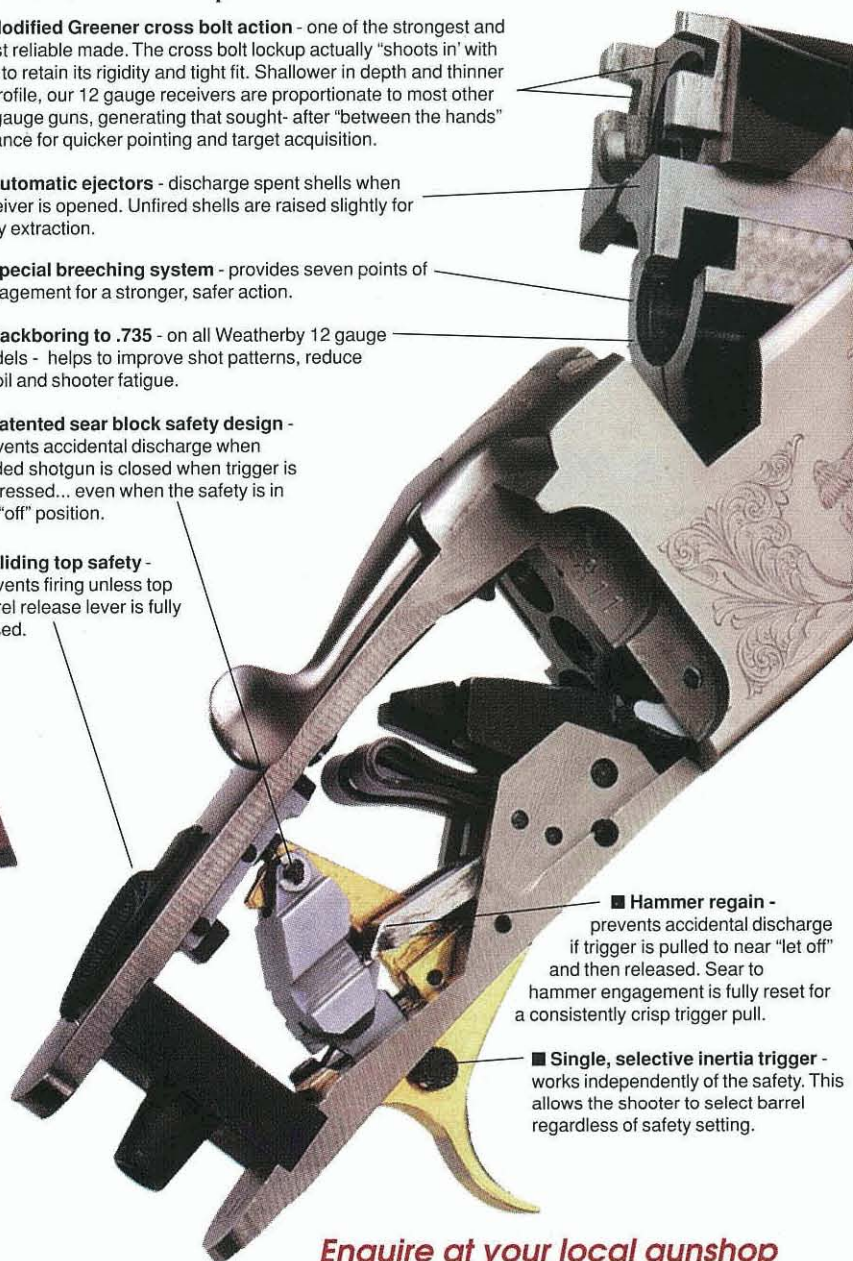

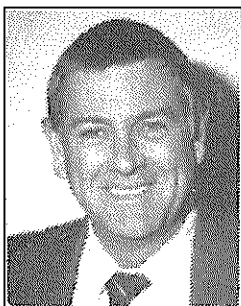

SHOOT OFFS DOUBLE BARREL...OPTION TO CHANGE TO POINTS

Under Rule 3.22(j) clubs now have the option to change to points to determine the winner in double barrel events after the shoot off has reached 100 targets. This was introduced after approaches from clubs and shooters, regarding the length of time involved in some shoot offs, not to mention the added cost to clubs. It is recommended that any club wishing to use this rule advise shooters by placing a notice on their office windows that this rule will be invoked, should a shoot off reach 100 targets.

VOLUNTARY WORKERS LIST

To meet the current requirements re Workers Compensation all clubs are required to keep an up to date list naming all their voluntary workers. It is now not necessary to forward a list to the ACTA office.

WORLD DTL

Everything is now in readiness for this event and it is hoped everyone will enjoy being part of it. One disappointment is that we were unable to obtain the services of sufficient referees to alleviate the need for prior squad members to be required to referee the following squad. The organising committee will address this issue to try and eliminate the need for any shooter to referee more than once for the Championship. With a full compliment of competitors, it is hoped all will go away well pleased to have been part of our truly first DTL International held in Australia.

FROM THE AUSTRALIAN CLAY PIGEON SHOOTING NEWS SEPTEMBER 1952

Advice to Referees.....

"The wads, particularly in some of the imported cartridges, can be very clearly seen and it is often difficult to tell the difference between a wad and a piece broken from the pigeon. In such cases give your decision as you see it - not as the spectators think. A referee's decision is final on such points and very few competitors will complain if a referee is conscientious and efficient.

Always remember that the referee who never made a mistake does not exist.

Do not wear dark glasses when refereeing; you may miss those fine pieces broken from the pigeon if you do."

TAMWORTH CLAY TARGET CLUB

On the weekend 15-16 February the Tamworth Clay Target Club conducted its annual two day skeet carnival with the Northern Zone Carnival run in conjunction.

The weather was an exact repeat of the trap carnival in September last year with heavy rain on the days leading up to the shoot with continuing rain on the Saturday and easing off on the Sunday.

Despite the wet weather some 49 shooters nominated on Saturday morning. Several of the travelling shooters had detoured around floods to get to the Loomberah grounds.

The first 50 target championship was won by Ray Porter from Brisbane with 104/104 from club mate Nick Aird on 103/104.

The 50 target handicap sponsored by Olimpyc Targets took some 155 targets to determine the placegetters. Nasseem Malouf from the Wakehurst Club was the winner with 155/155 with the four other placegetters shooting more than 100 targets.

The 50 target Northern Zone Championship was the first event on Sunday with a similar number of shooters nominating. Max Barton from Toowoomba was the overall winner of the event.

The final event on the four event/200 target program was a 50 target Championship sponsored by Sellier and Bellot cartridges. This event saw a good shoot off between Col Burt from Tamworth and Michael Faber from Narrabri. Michael was the winner with 102/102 while Col had to accept AA grade with 101/102 and Tom Falvo from Wakehurst won A grade with 99/100.

The Overall High Gun and Geoff Walters Memorial Trophy was won by the popular Neal Dimmick from Brisbane with the perfect score 200/200. This is Neal's second win of the Geoff Walters Trophy since its inception. Neal and Geoff were great skeet shooting mates and it seemed very appropriate for Neal to win it for the second time.

Dan Lagden was unlucky to drop a target somewhere over the weekend; he was the AA grade High Gun winner with 199/200. Christian Naudin - Wakehurst 196, Rod Taylor - Tamworth 195 and Neil Haynes - Taree/Wingham 177 were the other grade High Gun winners.

The Ladies High Gun was won by Carol Ogden from Melbourne 105/200, Jason Lagden from Wakehurst shot 196 to take the Junior High Gun and that evergreen shooter from Cecil Park in Reg Clarke was the Veterans winner with 194.

The Northern Zone Skeet Team was selected over the 100 targets on Sunday with Tamworth shooters filling the top seven places - Col Burt 99, Lach Cameron and Rod Taylor 98, John Chapman 97, Col Barton and Rod Prior 96, Kevin Weatherall and Jim Wilberforce 95 were the best eight scores for the zone.

The shoot was considered a success despite the weather, however, it may not have been that way but for the sponsorship of Olimpyc Targets and Sellier & Bellot cartridges. Prouds the Jewellers have always looked after the club with trophies and the club is most appreciative of their sponsorship and support.

The Ladies Committee led by Bev Taylor and Judy Barton provided fine meals and refreshments throughout the weekend and Graham and Rae Richardson had the grounds looking a picture following the good rainfall in previous weeks.

Australia Cup and Oceania Games Adelaide

28th January to 6th February 1997

Throughout these two major events, which were held at the State Shooting Park, saw some excellent competition between the competitors who had come from not only Australia, but New Zealand, Japan and South Africa. These shooters not only received a warm welcome to our fair city but we also turned on some very hot and humid weather, not quite the "norm", but in fact turning out to be one of our hottest summers in some 15 years.

The Australia Cup, the first of what will become an annual event, was used as the 3rd elimination for the Australian Training Squad where they gained points for their placings as well as cash trophies for those lucky enough to fill the winning places. Australia Cup - Open Trap placings went to Adam Vella, taking 1st place with 147/150 over Michael Diamond on 145/150 and Ben Kelly filling 3rd place on 143/150.

Australia Cup - Junior Trap saw some fierce competition with Nathan McDonnell finally taking out the event from Nathan Cassells after a shoot-off because they had both shot 139/150 in the event. Nathan McDonnell's final score was 139+2 to Nathan Cassells' 139+1, and even Nick Marinis had to shoot-off for 3rd placing with Glen Roberts of New Zealand. Nick shot a 137+1 to take out 3rd. Australia Cup - Ladies Trap was taken out by Deserie Wakefield with a score of 118/125.

In all 28 competitors, which included 7 from New Zealand, shot the Trap event.

Australia Cup - Open I.S.U. Skeet saw Craig Meuleman on 141/150 take out 1st place over Clark Pirie of New Zealand,

who had to shoot off with fellow countryman Geoff Jukes after they tied on 140/150. Clark finally taking 2nd place with 140+4 over Geoff's score of 140+3 who filled the minor placing.

Australia Cup - Junior I.S.U. Skeet shows some very promising young shooters coming through, with placings going to Kris Jones on 130/150 from George Barton on 127/150 and Michael Wenzel taking 3rd place with 117/150.

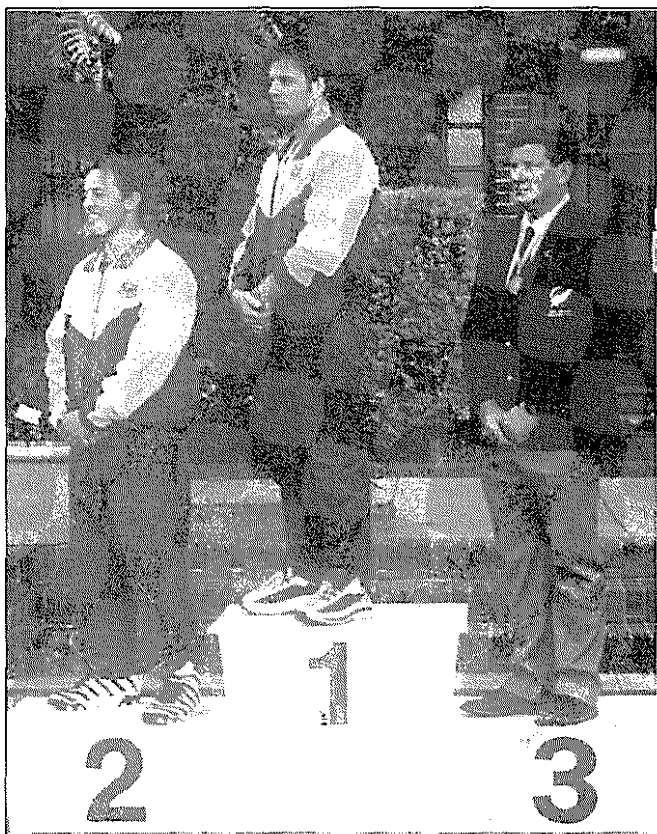
Competitor numbers showed 20 which included 7 from New Zealand shooting the I.S.U. Skeet.

Double Trap is being keenly contested in all divisions - Open, Juniors and Ladies with some 36 competitors vying for the Australia Cup Double Trap titles - this included 1 from Japan and 9 from New Zealand.

Australia Cup - Open Double Trap went to Russell Mark, a clear winner shooting 185/200 over Steve Haberman on 177/200 with Adam Vella taking 3rd place after he had to shoot-off with Craig Tilley as they tied on 176/200. Adam's final score being 176+5 to Craig's 176+4.

Australia Cup - Junior Double Trap went to Nathan Cassells on 168/200, with Marc Crimmins taking 2nd on a score of 166/200 and Craig Henwood filling 3rd place on 164/200, a relatively close competition with only 4 target separating them.

Australia Cup - Ladies Double Trap was won by Deserie Wakefield who shot 133/160 with Yoshiko Kira of Japan (out here receiving tuition from Russell Mark) taking 2nd place with 125/160 and Ann Maree Roberts filling 3rd place with a score of 122/160.

Competitors and officials throughout this time were being housed at the Australian Institute of Sports residence at Henley Beach "Del Monte" - a beautiful old building used originally I believe as a guest house and home to many famous athletes/sports people (the Australian Cycling Team and Cricket Academy - who knows any one of us may have slept in Shane Warne's bed?). Anyway, the residence is directly across the rose from the beach and a more relaxing and beautiful place to stay would be hard to find - one of South Australia's "best kept secrets" was the comment made by Russell Mark at supper one evening - with those residing able to make toast and Milo before retiring for the night. Goodness knows how many extra loaves of bread/raisin bread were used over the period of our stay, for the sea air made everyone ravenous.

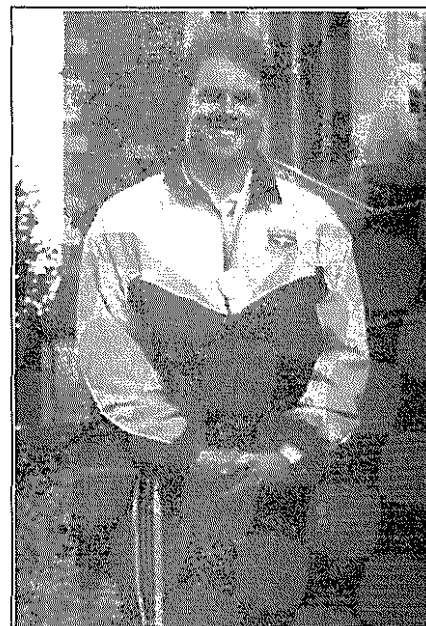
The Oceania Games officially "kicked off" on 1st February, and Day One's programmed events included the Team event in both Trap and I.S.U. Skeet.

The I.S.U. Skeet - Open saw Australia's "A" Team of C. Meuleman, C. Barton and D. Cunningham take 1st place with a score of 207/225 over New Zealand's "A" Team of G. Taylor, G. Jukes and M. Duff on 203/225, with Australia's "B" Team taking 3rd place with a score of 188/225, shooters being C. Bertini, R. Dower and B. Brighenti.

I.S.U. Skeet - Junior division saw New Zealand's "A" Team victorious by just one target, the team members V. Shaw, J. Mudford and J. Moore shot 176/225 over Australia's "A" Team of M. Wenzel, M. Crimmins and D. Work, who shot 175/225.

Australia made a clean sweep of the team events in the Trap. Trap - Open Team of A. Vella, B. Kelley and R. Mark made up Australia's "A" Team who shot 216/225 to take 1st place over Australia "B", comprising C. Bentley, D. Nielsen and J. Maxwell who shot 208/225, with New Zealand's "A" taking 3rd place after having shot a score of 199/225 - shooters here being D. Coe, B. Wistrand and W. Jones.

Trap - Ladies. Australia's "A" Team of D. Wakefield, L. Lloyd and D. Trindall shot a 189/225 to win out over New Zealand's "A", comprising of S. Thompson, P. France and T. Borrell who shot 160/225. Trap - Junior. Here again Australia's "A" Team were much too good and they gave their opposition a hammering - D. Bruce, N. Cassells and N. McDonnell shot a 200/225 to take out 1st place, Australia's "B" taking 2nd place with N. Marinis, C. Henwood and B. Byrnes shooting a 182/225 and New Zealand's "A" Team coming in a close 3rd with a score of 181/225 - their shooters being S. Wilson, G. Roberts and R. Munro.

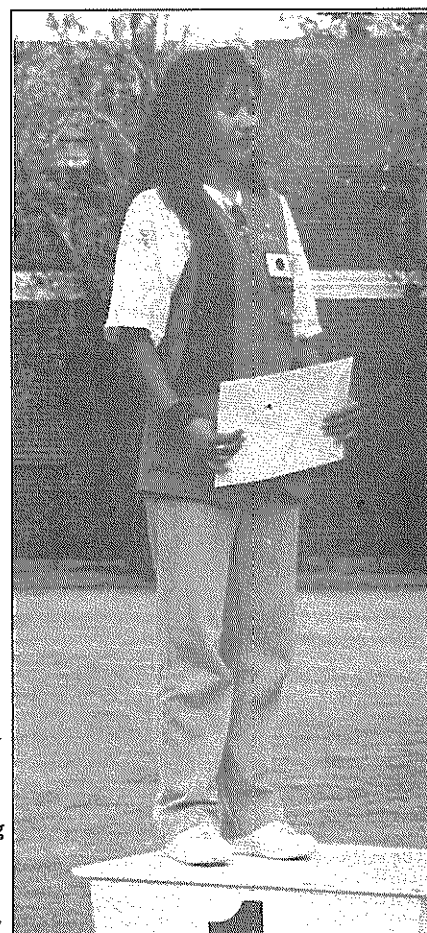

A happy Vere Storch took 1st place after having shot 194/200 with yet another shoot-off for 2nd and 3rd between Sue Thompson of New Zealand and Frances Scott who had both shot 187/200 in the competition. Many thanks to those who helped run these 2 major events, to those who gave their time to referee and score and then sat for their B Grade Judges course, to the Coaches Luca, Murray and Greg for their input, to Darren Roach the masseur with the magic hands who literally worked his fingers to the bone each day of competition and into the late hours of each night, to Dr. Sue Homolka who on her 2+ day visit with us won everyone over with her charm, to Vince Mollica who now knows what a Team Manager's role entails, and especially to Graham Michell for his untiring efforts in his role as Chairman of the Shooting Committee, who had worked his butt off to ensure this competition would go off without a hitch - only I would know!

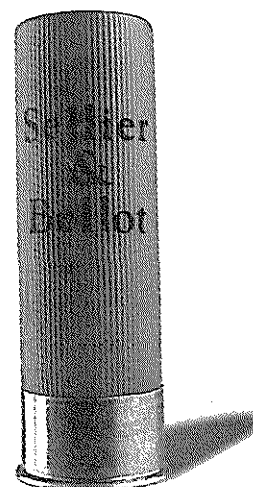

Due to the relocation and the Car Races planned for Bathurst this year, the club will not be shooting at all in October. A further reminder will be in a later issue.

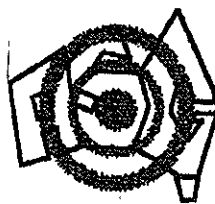

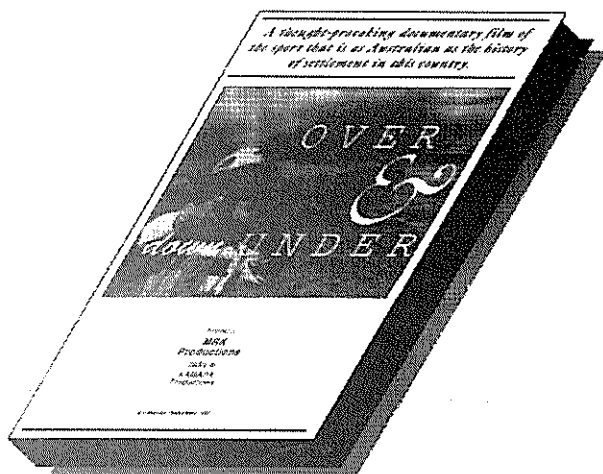

Saturday morning saw fine hot weather but this soon changed to very windy and wet conditions.

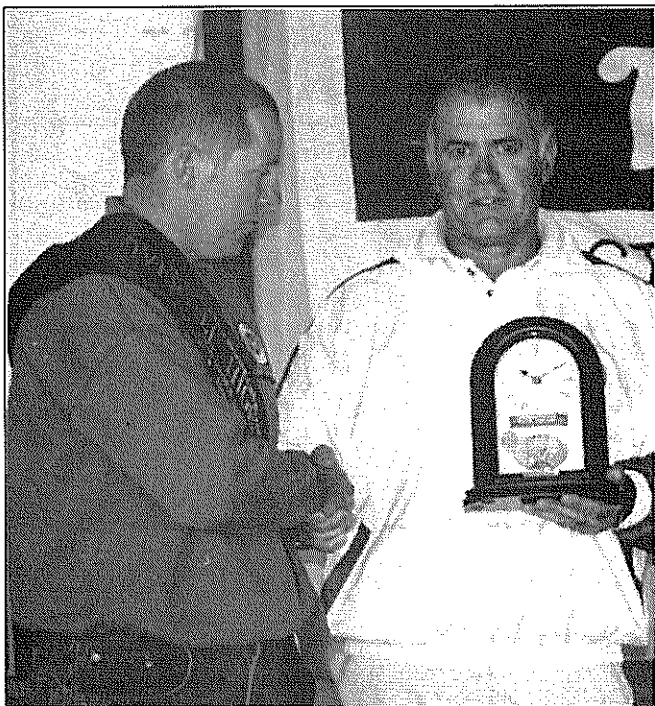

1996 President's Report to the Annual General Meeting

1996 certainly was a year where shooting reached its highest pinnacle, yet on the other hand, shooters were to be penalised by some of the harshest laws in the western world.

No doubt the performance of our Olympic team in Atlanta was the highlight of our year, not only did Michael, Russell and Deserie win medals, but everyone of our shooters finished in the top one third of their respective events. No other Australian team was able to match or better this outstanding achievement, nor for that matter any of the foreign teams. Because of the outstanding performance of our team, our future and funding in the short term is assured.

The success of our shooters can be attributed to their personal dedication and determination, their personal coaches and the backup teams within the ACTA. Well done.

By negotiation and a very well prepared submission the ACTA was able to successfully lobby for the retention of semi auto and pump action shotguns for its members. No other organisation in Australia was able to achieve this. There is no doubt that the ill prepared National Firearms Legislation was pushed through without the consideration or input of the vast number of law abiding shooters within the community. It seems that only when the law abiding citizen is deprived of all firearms, will the bureaucrats realise that tragedies, suicides, murders and firearm misuse will continue unabated despite there being no firearms. One wonders what is the real motive behind the disarmament of the population.

As is now the accepted first International shoot, a large number of our members crossed the Tasman for the New Zealand Nationals. Our most successful shooters were Michael Diamond, Russell Mark, Bill Iles, Roger Duthie, Phil Grainger, Terry Boucher and Jon Whittakers. We were again successful in the Glenn Cup with Jamie Elliott, Roger Duthie, Russell Mark, Michael Diamond and Arthur Turner all shooting well.

The Australasian and Pacific Grand Prix was again an outstanding success and the organising committee and the Brisbane Gun Club are to be congratulated on what is now a firmly established International event.

It was down to Tasmania for the Trap Nationals in April and some very cool weather. However, the competition was far from cool right from the State Open Shoulder to Shoulder competition which Victoria won for the first time in some seventeen years. It was great to see a full compliment of teams represented and it is hoped that this be the norm in the future. Our thanks for a successful carnival must go to the "Tassie Team" in the office, the generous support of all the sponsors and to all those that chipped in to make it work.

A sad note at the Nationals was that "Tup" Pedersen had passed away just prior to the shoot. Tup had contributed enormously to the ACTA, not only in the position of National President, but in attending almost every club in Australia.

In April we sent a team to the World Cup in Lima, Peru. We were successful with John Maxwell winning a silver medal as did our Trap team. We also won a bronze in the Ladies Double Trap team.

We were well represented at the World Cups in Italy and Germany. In Milan we again won silver in the Trap event and a bronze in the Mens Double Trap.

Michael Diamond was to complete an outstanding year by winning the silver medal at the World Cup in Montecatini.

Melbourne Gun Club was host of the third ACTA/SSAA Sporting Clay Nationals and despite lower numbers than the first two events, we were able to come out in the black for the

first time. Our thanks to the VCTA, Melbourne Gun Club and its Committee led by Bob Buchan. David Cunningham showed his well round versatility with the shotgun by taking out this title.

News that Adrian Cousens won the 1997 World 12g Skeet Championships in San Antonio, Texas was the highlight for October. Congratulations Adrian.

Adelaide played host to the 1996 Olympic Discipline Nationals and despite a hiccup with the weather some excellent scores were posted. The overall High Gun Trap went to Adam Vella with David Cunningham taking the Skeet High Gun. The junior Trap winner was Ben Kelley with Dot Trindall successful in the Ladies.

Cecil Park was the setting for the 1996 Skeet Nationals where some one hundred and sixty shooters took part. Our friends from across the Tasman were strong in their quest for prizes with Brian Thomson coming up top dog in the National Skeet Championships, however it was Queensland's Neil Dimmick who won the High Gun event.

The National Executive continues to address all aspects of the sport with professionalism and enthusiasm. The task they voluntarily take on can at times be very rewarding, but for the most it is extremely hard work. The criticism levelled by the few "experts" from time to time is always found to be of a personal belief, not the expectation of the majority. My personal thanks to all the Executive members for their input in 1996.

During 1996 we lost the services of Guy Yoannidis and we thank him for his contribution over the years. In his place we welcome John Byrnes and look forward to his time with us, hoping it to be long and fruitful.

Our National Director of Coaching has again contributed enormously to the successful running of the Coaching Program required by Canberra. Not only is his a thankless task, but it is very demanding of time. To Murray, and his team of the State Coaching Co-ordinators we are indebted.

Our sponsors are our life blood. To the Australian Sports Commission, Winchester Australia, Fuller Firearms, Olympic Targets, Express Shotshells and BRA Insurance. The outstanding support of these companies and individuals cannot be under emphasised.

1996 saw the continued improvement in presentation of the CTSN. To all involved with this very necessary part of our organisation, I thank you.

Membership in 1996 increased considerably, this no doubt due to the Gun Laws and the uncertain future of shooting. This trend is continuing and it is hoped that new members, old friends rejoining and our current members will be able to continue this sport for decades to come.

We will promote a National Clay Target Day in 1997 where it is hoped that we will gain considerably more members. I would suggest that all clubs approach their local Members of Parliament, both Federal and State and involve them on this day.

A fitting tribute to our sports people for 1996 was the awarding of the Order of Australia medal to Michael and Russell. I am sure every member of the ACTA felt proud on this announcement of the awards and we congratulate two fine sportsmen.

Finally my personal thanks, and those of all members, must be passed to our National Office, Graeme, Leanne, Gina and Manon a big Thank You.

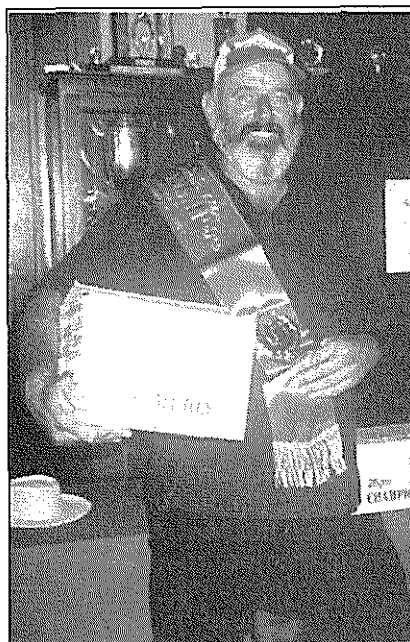

1997 National ZZ Championships

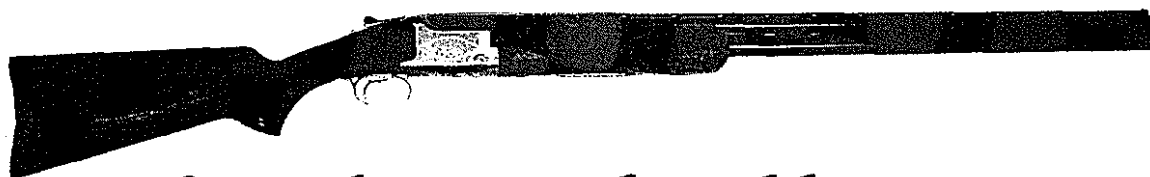

As a result of Lindsay's unceasing efforts, coupled with his ability to badger material out of anyone with the able assistance of such other great supporters as his mates Jim Wharton, Brian Herbert, Bob Schubert and Rick Hannah (just to name a few), the Gladstone Gun Club's facilities were constructed at very little cost which allowed the club's funds

to be applied to providing enjoyable, entertaining shoots which were recognised by shooters from all over the country.

At the time of moving to the new grounds with its marvellous facilities, Lindsay was not only performing the bulk of the building work but was also Club President while Elaine played an equally important role as Club Secretary/Treasurer.

Australian Shooting Games Brisbane, Queensland

June - July, 1997



The inaugural Australian Shooting Games encompassing all shooting events will be held at the multi-discipline Belmont Shooting complex at Brisbane, between the 26th June and 13th July, 1997.

Featuring competitions in pistol, archery, fullbore rifle, smallbore rifle, sporting shooter disciplines, field and game as well as Olympic Discipline clay target events, the competition is planned to become the premier shooting competition in Australia.

Plans are well underway to establish the competition and upgrade many of the facilities at the Belmont complex to bring them up to World Championship and Olympic Games standard.

With the support from the Queensland State Government, which has already seen the granting of assistance to the Brisbane Gun Club to install a

third Olympic Trap range and upgrade the two existing ranges to cater for Australia's first ever World Cup in June this year, the scene is now set for the inaugural Australian Shooting Games competitions in 1997, with plans in place to establish 1998 as a 'fully international multi-discipline' competition.

The clay target shooting competition to be held at the Brisbane Gun Club from 9th July, will be held in conjunction with the Queensland State ISU Carnival. In all, three events in Olympic Trap and three events in ISU Skeet will be conducted - making a total of 325 targets of each discipline over the five day competition.

As with all events forming part of the Australian Shooting Games competition, winners and place getters in all grades and sections will receive a specially struck Australian Games Shooting medal.

A competition entry fee of \$30 per shooter applies to all shooters entering the Australian Shooting Games events. This administration fee is similar to the fee applied to the World Masters Games, and is in addition to the normal nomination fees.

Over and Down Under

I have been Clay Target Shooting for four and a half years now and have never been competitive until I took up this sport. I love it, I like the people and the challenge of smoking targets and attempting perfect scores. I have set myself some goals which I may never achieve and it certainly won't be from lack of trying.

Even in the short period that I have been in the game, our sport has, for obvious reasons suffered bad publicity, largely a result of public ignorance and because we, shooters, have not made a concerted effort to publicise the sport, let alone counteract the negativity we often encounter.

Clay target shooters need to be recognised as sports people who compete at local, state, national and international level - no different from a golfer, swimmer or football player. Winning two gold medals and one bronze at the 1996 Olympics was the best publicity this sport has ever had. Thanks to Michael, Russell and Deserie. We need to see more coverage of the sport on video and television.

Positive publicity is what is badly needed to educate our friends, politicians and the public at large.

I am very proud to have instigated the production of a documentary film, now available on video, called 'Over and Down Under' to do just that. Anyone who has seen the video will clearly recognise that clay target shooters are human after all. They come from all walks of life, males and females, young and old. They love their sport and need to be recognised for that.

With the talent of Mr Voya Rajic (Executive produced), Mr Michael Karris (Cameraman) and Mr Keith Lynch (Editor) we set out to film without a budget. We thought we would give of our time freely and worry about the budget later as it was an impromptu decision made two days before the Nationals. This, in hindsight was not a very wise idea. For those who know little about producing documentaries and videos of TV broadcast quality, a budget of 200,000 to 300,000 dollars would be needed to adequately cover the cost of producing a one hour documentary. I think we are very fortunate to produce Over and Down Under for far, far less money.

Some sponsorship has been forthcoming but rarely covers the cost of editing alone. I personally thank those sponsors who have helped to date: ACTA, NSWCTA, Wakehurst

CTC, Dan Case, Bathurst Woodturning Co and Kevin Tunny of Olimpyc Targets.

We kindly seek further sponsorship from clubs, manufacturers of shotguns, ammo and traps and anyone remotely involved in the sport. I urge each clay target shooter from all disciplines to support our present production. If videos could be given out as prizes at competitions, added to club archives and bought by shooters for nostalgic or publicity reasons, then this would certainly help offset some of the cost. I would certainly like to see a different video produced each year covering actual competitions at a major event in one of the different disciplines. This would be great publicity for the sport and it can be done.

The documentary film Over and Down Under is about clay target shooting (not only skeet), the sport and the people who shoot - this is your story. I would like to take this opportunity to thank, on behalf of the team at Kamara Productions, all those who contributed to the production of this video and those who have helped spread the word. Your comments on the video and ways of improving future editions are most welcome.
