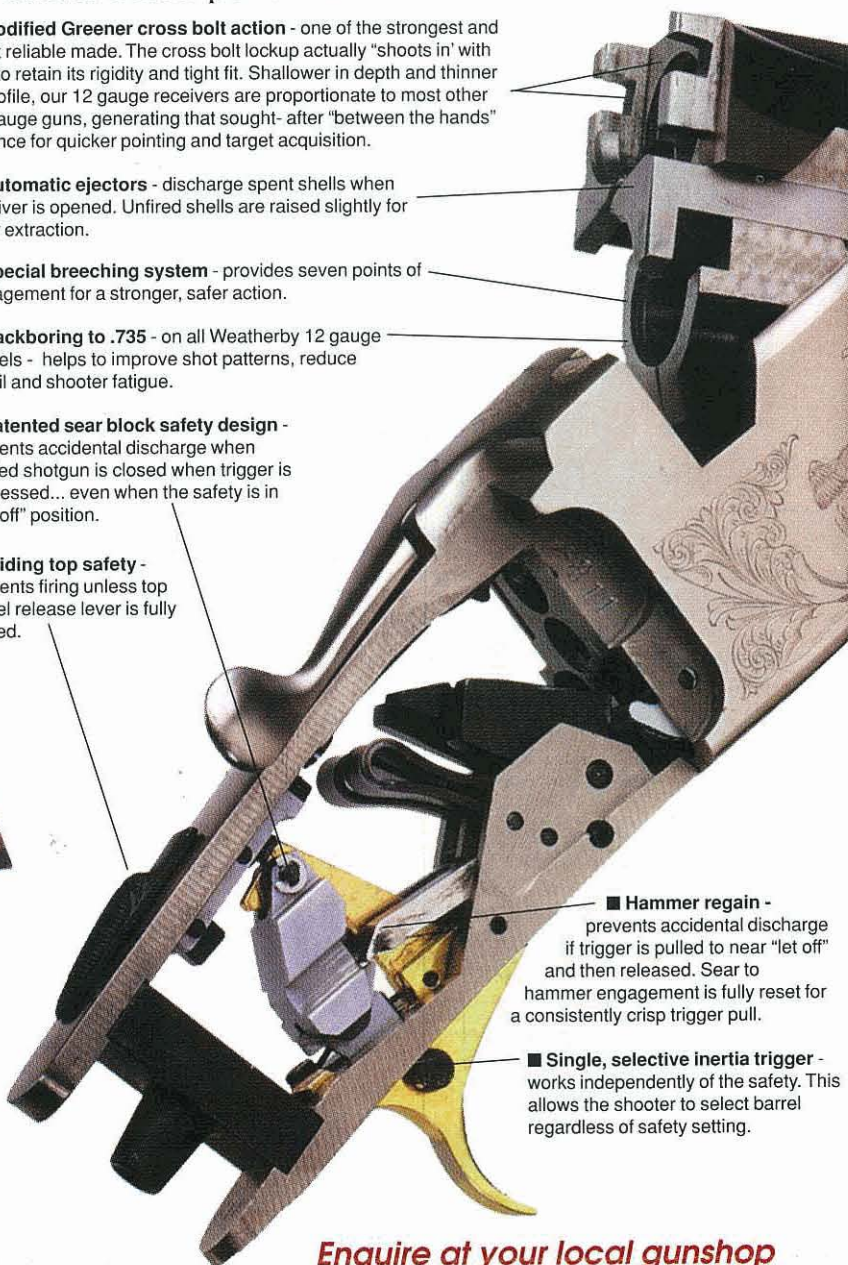

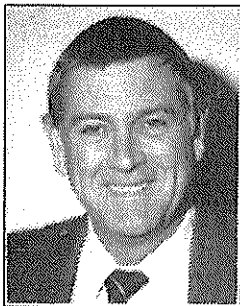

Russell Mark has recently been named Australia's Sportsperson of the Year. It is a tremendous accolade for Russell and shooting and we congratulate him. His win over Susie O'Neill (swimming), Mark Woodforde (tennis) and Nova Peris-Kneebone (hockey/athletics) is outstanding.

WORLD DTL CHAMPIONSHIP

The World DTL Championship at Wagga was an outstanding success with only a few minor hiccups. Everyone who attended I am sure enjoyed themselves and they also had the privilege of witnessing some outstanding shooting. Our shooters and teams excelled, and the organising committee can now give themselves a pat on the back for a job well done.

A meeting of Officials from each Country attending tentatively agreed that the next event will be held in the United Kingdom some time in 1999, followed by New Zealand in the year 2002.

I would like to think that Australia will send a full complement of teams to each of these venues, that being 5 Open and 3 each of Women, Juniors & Veterans.

ADAM VELLA...GOLD...WORLD CUP ITALY

In another tremendous performance by one of our shooters Adam Vella has won the Gold in Trap at the World Cup held recently in Italy.

One can only now look forward to Sydney 2000 with enthusiasm and perhaps the biggest question will be, who will our representatives be with so many world class competitors now competing for us?

Congratulations Adam.

NATIONAL GUN LAWS

One can only wonder when State that have not introduced the new laws as agreed to at the Police Ministers conference in 1996, will do

so, and when they do, will we have uniform laws Australia wide, or will there only be a few similarities between states.

We were grateful when we won the right for our members to keep and use their semi auto/pump action shotguns, but we can only wonder why farmers were granted their authorities as a matter of urgency in some states, yet in the same States our members were told nothing could be done until the new laws were introduced. If one was cynical they could say we were discriminated against.

It is hoped that when all States have passed their new legislation, all our members can get on with shooting and firearm ownership without being subjected to unnecessary encumbrances from bureaucracy.

My opinion is, and I stress it is only my opinion, that in the near future all shooters will be required to be a member of an approved shooting organisation and they will have to justify the possession of every individual firearm they have.

NEW RULE INTRODUCED "GRAND AMERICAN"

I have received a note from a friend in the USA where he has expressed his concern in relation to a new rule introduced by the ATA, and its effects on visiting International shooters.

It reads, "1. Elimination of penalty yardage at the 1997 Grand American World Trapshooting Tournament. Those shooters not meeting handicap target requirements by Friday, preceding the first regular day of the Grand American, will no longer be placed on penalty yardage. Instead, they will be required to shoot targets only and may not compete for monies or trophies in the handicap events. One exception is that of Senior Veterans who have for many years been permitted to shoot from their assigned yardage for trophies and monies even though they may not have handicap target requirements. This change should encourage more handicap participation at your clubs prior to the Grand."

We will contact David Bopp of the ATA and clarify the position for any one wishing to visit the Grand this year.

BRISBANE WORLD CUP

All is now in readiness for us to host the World Cup in Brisbane in June. The organising committee has left no stone unturned to ensure that the event will be a success and that the International Shooting Union will be looking to Australia to continue to host World Cups.

Entries are excellent and the Brisbane Gun Club has undergone major reconstruction works to make certain the ground and layouts are equal to the best.

If you take the time to attend during the event I am sure you will be suitably impressed.

1997 Cyprus World Cup and 1997 Italian World Cup

Our two Teams that represented Australia and the Clay Target Association at the Cyprus World Cup and the Italian World Cup did so with yet another accomplished performance following on from Craig Meuleman's win in India.

Individual performances achieved were: Cyprus - 3rd Trap Russell Mark; Italy - 1st Trap Adam Vella, 9th Trap Michael Diamond, 4th Double Trap Michael Diamond.

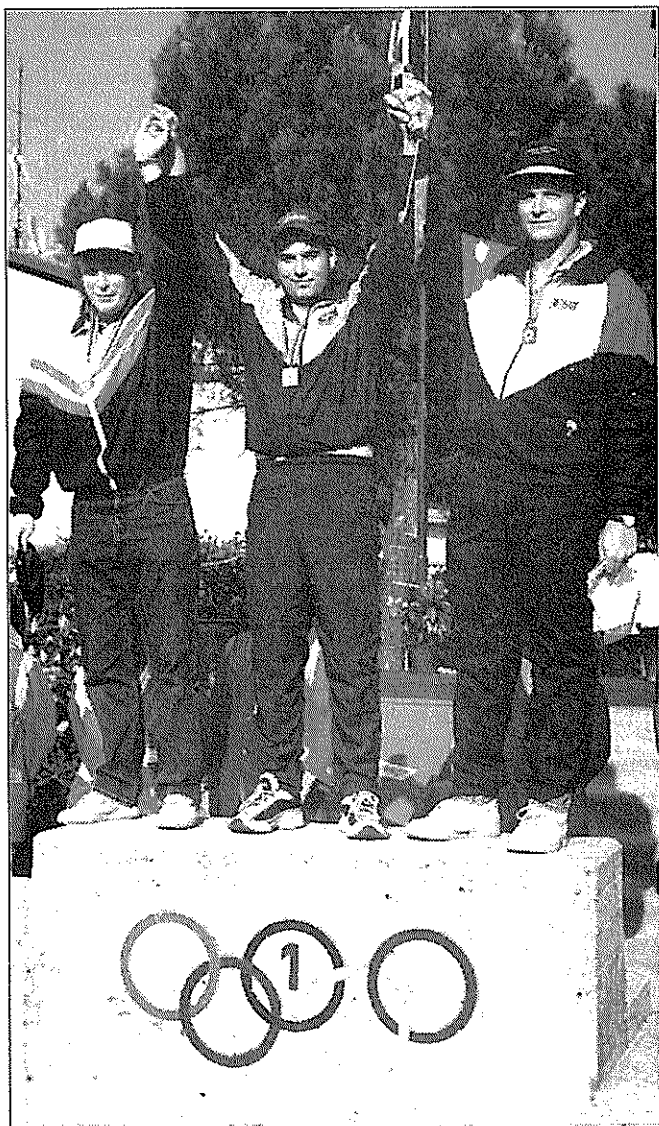
Cyprus World Cup: Due to a last minute change in flight plans, the team for Cyprus left Sydney for London via Bangkok. This change was caused by British Airways not having clearance to transit firearms through Singapore. As the flight from Sydney was full, I was left to travel via Singapore to meet up with the team in London for our journey down to Larnaca in Cyprus.

Upon arrival in Cyprus at Larnaca Airport the first of our

misfortunes began. Tom Turner's suitcase decided to stay at home and was missing for three days.

Having arrived a day early we took advantage of the time and went to Nicosia, via of course, the shooting facilities. Unlike 1995 when the weather was extremely hot, we found this time it was to be very cold with up to a 30 knot wind blowing most days.

Throughout the training days prior to the Double Trap we got a further taste of the weather and things to come as it got colder and the winds got stronger. The Opening Ceremony took place on Wednesday 19th by the President of Cyprus and

misfortunes began. Tom Turner's suitcase decided to stay at home and was missing for three days.

Having arrived a day early we took advantage of the time and went to Nicosia, via of course, the shooting facilities. Unlike 1995 when the weather was extremely hot, we found this time it was to be very cold with up to a 30 knot wind blowing most days.

Throughout the training days prior to the Double Trap we got a further taste of the weather and things to come as it got colder and the winds got stronger. The Opening Ceremony took place on Wednesday 19th by the President of Cyprus and the General Secretary of the UIT Mr Schreiber. However due to worsening conditions the Ceremony was cut short as sleet made conditions unbearable.

That evening Russell arrived with the beginning of a serious eye infection and already unable to see from his right eye. The next morning at 6.00am a doctor was called for Russell who now could stand no light in both eyes. Drops were procured but eventually the appointed World Cup doctor and an official UIT doctor prescribed more powerful ointments. With the help of the Finnish Team we were able to use their vehicle to deliver the ointments to Russell.

Double Trap got underway but not before our departure from our Hotel saw snow flakes falling. At the shooting facility which is set high in the hills, the chill factor made life extremely unpleasant and our team fought hard to register respectable scores. Unfortunately having only summerweight clothes we shivered through the event to score disappointing scores.

Craig Tilley 43.30.41 = 114/150. Craig Bentley 35.35.35 = 105/150. Phillip Melvin 37.33.37 = 107/150.

Friday the 11th, was the official training day and with Russell able to stand light and see a little, the team began training for Trap and Skeet. During the day the UIT doctor arranged for Russell to be checked by an Eye Specialist at Nicosia Hospital. The result showed no damage but only a small chance of being able to compete. With this knowledge a Medivac flight was checked for Russell but this unfortunately was unable to be arranged.

Saturday was cold and clear with little wind, the Trap and Skeet Teams, with Russell who now had approximately 70% vision, began their two days of competition.

Trap: Russell Mark 25.24.23.24.21+21+5 = 138/150. Craig Bentley 21.20.23.23.23 = 110/125. Tom Turner 24.19.19.21.21 = 104/125.

Skeet: Robert Dower 23.21.21.24.23 = 112/125. Clem Bertini 22.20.24.20.20 = 106/125.

Sunday afternoon saw Russell in the finals where he eventually shot his way to 3rd position, an unbelievable result given the circumstances.

During Sunday a contingent of Australian Police attached to the U.N. Peace keeping force joined us at the Gun Club and supported the shooters throughout the day. It was great to have a cheer squad proud to support other Australians. That evening they took us on a tour of the Nicosia Buffer Zone between the Turkish and Greek people ending up with a BBQ at their barracks on the abandoned international airport. It was a fabulous gesture from them, especially the way they supported the team throughout the

day and we all enjoyed their company.

Monday morning the team departed for Australia as myself, Tom Turner and Phil Melvin headed for Italy. On arrival in Milan we found to our dismay several of our bags missing due to incorrect ticketing out of Cyprus. With Phil Melvin's gun and case missing and Tom Turner's luggage missing again we had no alternative than to head for Lonato some two hours after arrival and hope British Airways would track down our cases.

With the team for the Italian World Cup having already arrived the day before our two groups joined back together and hoped for a better result than we had achieved in Cyprus.

Tuesday the 14th was training day for Double Trap and our team put in a solid effort. All except Phil (shooting for MQS) who now had to travel back to Milan to secure his baggage which included his gun. At 7am on Wednesday and a few minutes before our departure to the range, Tom Turner's long suffering luggage was delivered. The competition was shot in fair conditions with the results being: Michael Diamond 41.49.43+39 = 172/200 (4th). Steve Haberman 43.45.39 = 127/150 MQS. Steve Atkins 37.42.43 = 112/150 MQS. Phil Melvin 36.37.38 + 111/150.

With Thursday the 17th being official training for Trap and Skeet, conditions cool and clear, the remainder of the team began to familiarise themselves with the Linate traps and background.

On Friday competition began in Trap and Skeet and at the end of the qualifying we had Adam Vella in the final and Michael Diamond in the shoot off for 5th and 6th place for the final. Luck was not with Michael and he finished in 9th place.

Adam went on to score a brilliant win in his first ever International finals appearance and take out the Italian World Cup. It was a jubilant team that swamped Adam with congratulations and chaired him from the tracks. A mail note here: Adam achieved another first when he used a Kemen shotgun to win that Company's first ever World Cup.

Results: Trap: Adam Vella 24.24.25.25.24+24+1 = 122/125 1st. Michael Diamond 25.25.24.20.24 = 118/125 MQS. Filip Petriella 24.24.23.23.23 = 117/125 MQS. Tom Turner 23.23.16.21.21 = 104/125.

Skeet: Barty Brighenti 20.24.24.22.24 = 114/125 = MQS. Fred Guyatt 22.25.22.22.19 = 110/125. Michael Inguanti 22.23.24.20.21 = 110/125.

Finally the day arrived and we all packed for our departure by various routes back to Australia and for some a short break before the Korean World Cup. Both teams acquitted themselves extremely well given the unusual climatic conditions and ACTA and it's members can be proud of each member of the two World Cup teams.

It is my wish to thank the Executive of the ACTA for their continued support for myself as Team Manager/Coach for International competition. The problems encountered aside, I consider it an honour and a privilege to have been associated with the two teams in Cyprus and Italy.

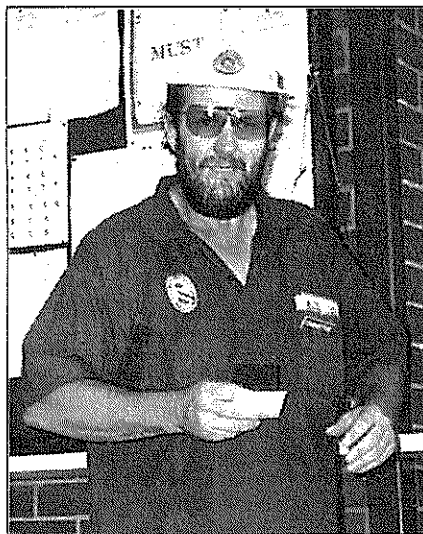


B. Brighenti accepting the Miroku from Craig Golding of Fuller Firearms, with club president Greg Pinner looking on

The following day dawned fine and fair, which is more than I can say for some of the previous night's parties, the grounds were immaculate and the shooters came from far and wide for our Festival of Sport shoot and Miroku challenge.

Michael opened the shoot and the first event, a five target Double Barrel Eye Opener, got underway - 60 shot the possible. The Festival of Sport 50 target Double Barrel was next and,

surprisingly enough, only three shot the possible - Michael Diamond, Ron Cugley (good to see you again "Cuddles") and Scott Henshall. In the shoot-off all three were going strong and it looked like a marathon would follow, but Ron dropped his 80th target to take A Grade, and it was left to Scott to tackle Michael alone, but he missed his 110th and Michael took the Overall and AA with 110/110. The other places were Brian North - second in A Grade with 66/67; first in B Grade R. Wojtowycz 49/50, and D. Glenn was 2nd with 66/68. C Grade was taken out by B. Brighenti with 49/50, and 2nd B. Brown 47/50. Best unplaced junior was Shane Dunn 49/50 (one of the distance travellers) and we hope to see him back again. The Veterans section was won by Arthur Krautz 65/67, and Nessa Jenkins won the Ladies with 43/50.

The 30 target Handicap "Miroku Challenge" was preceded by a 5 target Handicap Eye Opener for which there were 49 possibles, but not so for the 30 target event which saw only 4 possibles. In the shoot-off Ross Carter, our Secretary, was first to go with 36/37, then it wasn't long before 3rd place was finalised with G. Evans missing his 50th target. Ron Cugley was there again and this time he had Barty Brighenti doing a lot of walking from 12 to 19 until Cuddles missed his 109th target to leave Barty with the Miroku.

The Juniors were also involved in a shoot-off for a rifle and Scott Shields ran out the winner with 64/65. Wal Kennedy, the flower man, won the

Veterans section with 28/30 and Nessa Jenkins topped the Ladies with 28/30.

Event 5, a 25 target Pointscore, seemed a bit like an anti-climax, but a wonderful example of 1st barrel shooting saw Michael Diamond with AA win 96/96 from Brett Ford 95/96. Brad Wignall and Brian Beard shared A Grade with 80/81 and 74/75 respectively. B Grade was won by Tom Caldwell with 87/87 and Ross Liersch was 2nd with 86/87 - good to see some of the locals getting in the act. Gentleman Reg Phefley with 74/75 took out C Grade and I. Malovic was second with 71/75.

Following on from the Junior clinic the day before, our "novice" shooters contested keenly in the two 10 target Single Barrel events. The first event was won by Corey Worthington with 7/10 and Jonathan Leahy was second with 6/11, after shooting off with Jess Hoffman. The afternoon event was taken out by Jonathan Leahy with 7/10 and Clayton Anderson was second with 6/10. The "novice" events are conducted for those juniors who are not yet registered with the A.C.T.A. and most are only in the sub-junior age group. When these kids are shooting scores of 7/10 single barrel - at 12 years of age - it doesn't look too good for us "oldies" in the future.

The experienced junior section was won by David Glenn with 14/15 and Simon Carter on 13/15 ran second.

The High Gun for the day was won by Reece Ehlers with 162 out of a possible 165, well done "Top Gun",

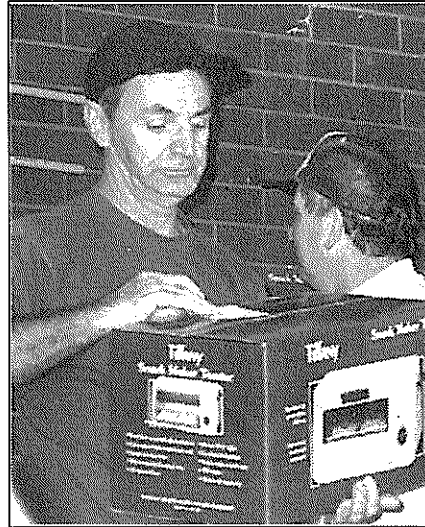
On behalf of Albury-Wodonga Clay Target Club I would like to thank

Dear Sir

After attending the 1997 DTL Nationals at Wagga I would like to make some suggestions as to their improvement and profitability.

1. There should be at least three practice traps running from 8.00am each day. I believe the takings would be in the region of \$25,000-\$30,000 instead of \$6000-\$7000. People will practice for hours on end if they don't have to wait in a queue of 30-40 shooters.

2. There should be a fully qualified and paid day care person/s and say an air castle or similar for parents to leave children during the day.

Parents would pay say \$5-\$10 per child per day to have them looked after. For quite a few people this is their

annual holiday and should be one of enjoyment and not hard work and frustration trying to keep children happy all day while mum or dad try and shoot.

3. There must be a check list of items to be obtained up to three months before a Nationals. Not having shooter squad cards available and having to be rush printed two days before the event, or not having a gunsmithing facility on site, instead of relying on the generosity of other shooters to help out is just not good enough.

I realise it is all too easy to sit back and criticise but this whole thing is a business and we should look at making as much money as possible as well as making the shooters as happy as we can. After all without the shooters we don't have a Nationals.

As for the World Championships, except for the brilliant display of shooting by the Australian shooters it made me ashamed to be an Australian. There have been two World events before this and with heaps of time to organise it you would think after seeing how it was run that we only knew one day before that we had to run the event.

Adrian Cousens is to be highly commended for a fantastic job under very trying conditions.

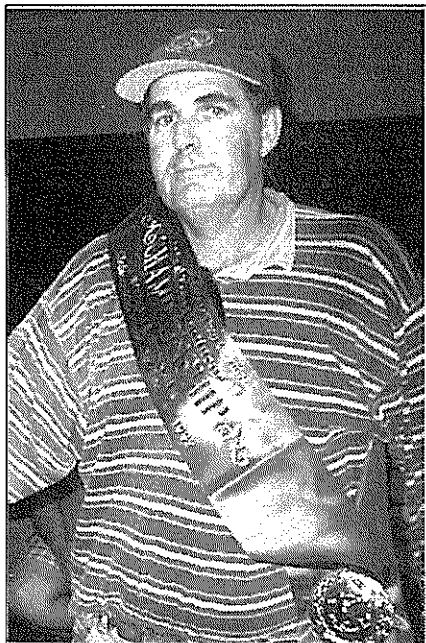
We just have to be more professional at these events. We can no longer say she'll be right mate because it won't.

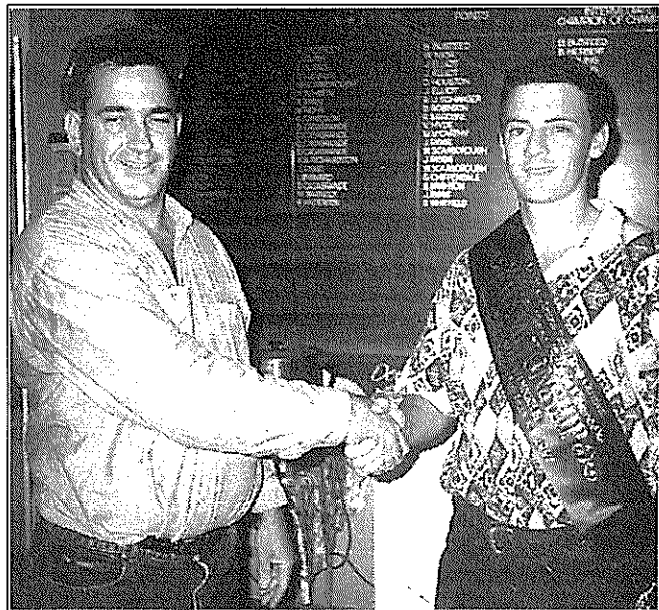

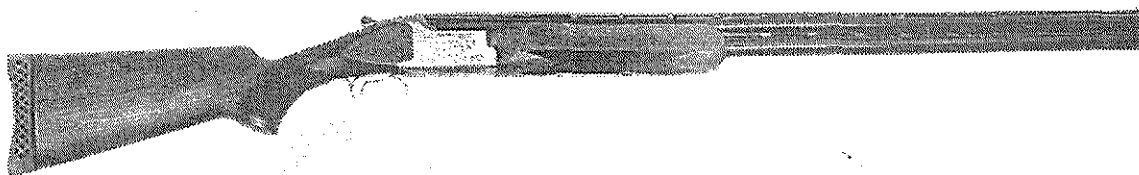

the local shooters were keen to sample the targets.

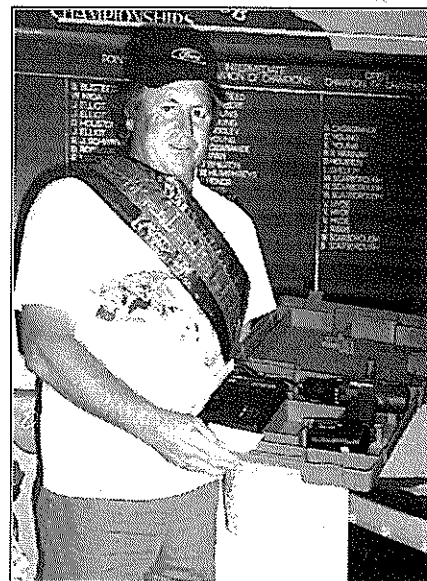

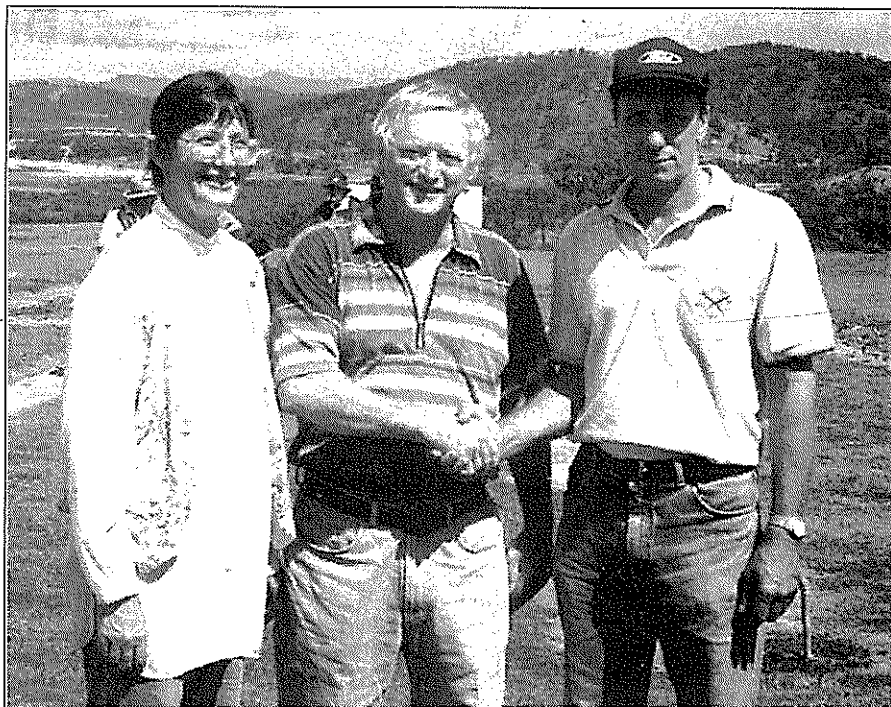

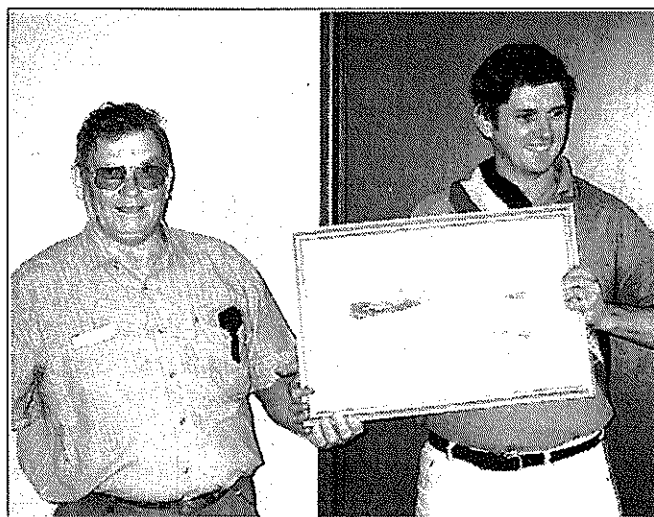

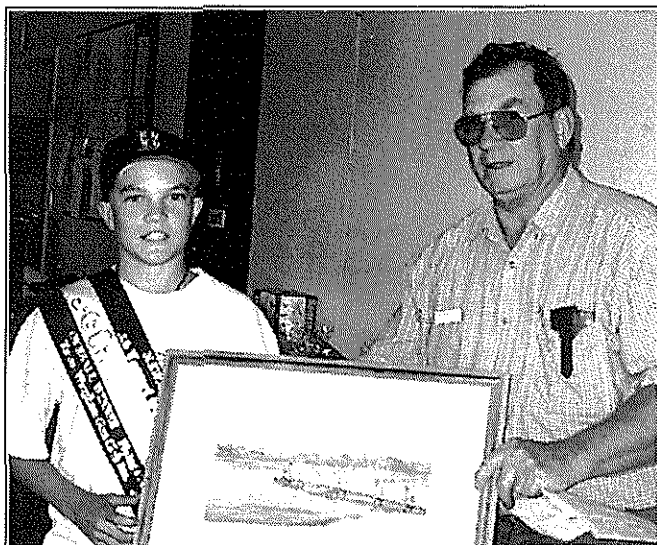

22nd Annual Faminco Royal Flying Doctor Charity Shoot

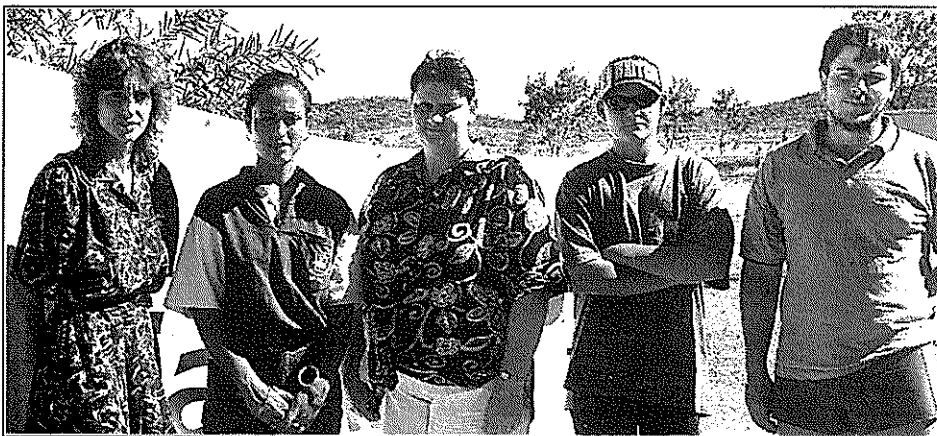

I've just recently received news of the passing of an old friend and fellow shooter in one Horry Donnelly.

I first met up with Horry at the old Melbourne Live Bird Club in early 1946 when he was not long out of the Army, having enlisted at the age of 16 and served in many theatres of war, including the Western Front.

It was during the 1950s-1960s that Horry became an outstanding performer with his double barrel side-by-side "William Powell" shotgun at the Australian Gun Club's grounds at East Burwood, Victoria. Horry twice won the National Champion of Champions Cup, firstly in 1941 and again in 1948 with scores of 52/60 and 49/50 from 20 yards.

For the last 15 years he has lived with his daughter at Caloundra in Queensland.

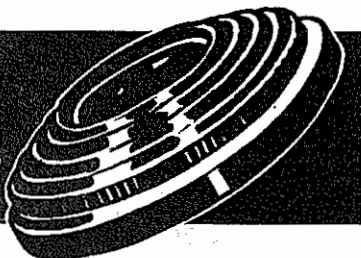

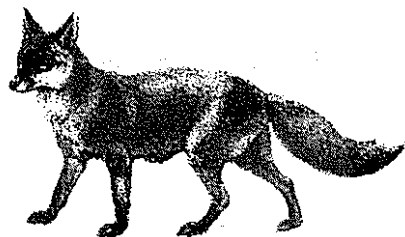

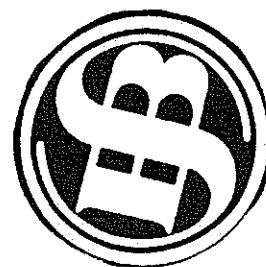
