When one of our top shooters wins a major event in Australia we tend to take it for granted, and such was the case when Bill won the World DTL Championship in Wagga. It is only when you get the time to reflect on the event, do you realise the significance of his score and just what he achieved.

His score of 899/900 is the new record for the event, and even though it is only the third time this World Championship has been conducted, I believe it will be a long time before his score is bettered, or for that matter equalled. Add to this the fact he was runner up in Wales in 1994 it certainly supports the opinion of many, that Bill is the World's best when it comes to DTL.



Trap Final: 1st Ben Kelley (Aus) 23.24.24.24.23 = 118 + 25 = 143+2





I was accompanied and well assisted by Tricia Van Nus (Rifle Coach), Vladimir Galiabovitch (Pistol Coach) and our own Murray Alexander and we met up with Claudia Kulla (Mental Training Coach) in Germany.

The Clay Target Team consisted of Nathan Cassells, Nathan McDonnell, Craig Henwood and Derek Bruce (Trap and Double Trap), George Barton and Kris Jones (Skeet) and Lisa Smith, Susan Milroy and Natasha Lonsdale (Ladies Double Trap).

We all met up at the Sydney Airport from our various States and boarded without any problems Thai Airways at 3.20pm, who were flying us to Frankfurt via Bangkok.

The first part of our flight to Bangkok (8 1/2 hours) was filled mostly by watching movies as hardly any of us could sleep through the excitement of the forthcoming training camp and competition and for many of them it was their first long trip by air. We were all seated together as a group and it was a comfortable journey.

We then had a two hour stop over in a very uncomfortable transit lounge at the Bangkok Airport followed by another 11 hour flight, this time not so comfortable as the plane was full, getting us to Frankfurt at 7.20am Thursday morning, most of the team having managed a few hours sleep.

Thursday 1st May

We were met at the gate by Claudia who was of great assistance with the language, getting us through Customs with our luggage and guns and then collecting our two minibuses which were to be our means of transport for the next 13 days (VW diesel, not much power), and this all took about two

hours.

The weather here was much cooler and our little convoy, led by Claudia in her rented car, headed to Suhl via the autobarn. Suhl was approximately 300k away and driving on the wrong side of the road, with everyone doing 130k per hour, was a bit of an experience.

The countryside was all very impressive compared to our flat wide open spaces. We saw dozens of deer-hides in the pastures that were cropped and everything was nice and green.

Suhl is a very spread out old town, situated on the southwest edge of the Thuringian Forest at the foot of the Domberg mountain with its more than one hundred year old Bismark Tower. With 56,000 inhabitants, Suhl is the centre of South Thuringia. From ancient times the history of the town and the traditions of its people have been closely related with the trade of gunmaking.

We finally arrived at the Shooting Sport Complex at Suhl which caters for all disciplines in shooting. It was opened to hold

the 1971 European Championships and the 1986 World Championships. It has a reputation as a first class competition site and training ground and we had arrived to try it out.

We were met by the Manager of the complex and we were then served lunch, a very large meal of a fricassee of meat and mashed potatoes. Everybody was more tired than hungry and after lunch we were allocated our rooms, each flat/apartment had two bedrooms, a lounge area and a shower, toilet, etc. with a TV, table & chairs, clean and comfortable. Now we were able to unpack, shower and most of us




had a few hours of sleep before dinner.

Dinner gave us our first taste of a `German' sandwich. A cold meat pattie as the filling between the bread, a cool drink and a muesli bar - something different!

We also held a Team Meeting to plan the coming days of training and to draw lots for daily Captains of the morning exercise program.

Friday 2nd May

Everyone up early for the 7am jog and physical training of stretches etc., under the guidance of Derek Bruce. Breakfast at 8am consisted of boiled eggs (reminiscent of my trip to India

earlier this year), cereal, assorted cold sliced meats of salami, metwurst etc., and rye bread.

We then all went off up to the shooting ranges organise cartridges, traps and to get used to the shooting grounds, they were totally enclosed by large pine trees which produces really loud echoes when shots are fired. It was the first time many of shooters would have a green tree background to shoot into, we were pleased to be having our camp prior to the Junior Competition which was still some six days awav.

Near the clay target range there was an office, a

restaurant and numerous cabins for shooting teams to stay, all very picturesque and well set out amongst the pine trees.

The only down side of the whole experience was that we had to use Laporte clays which are as hard in Europe as they are in Australia. It was most frustrating to see them hit, move about, but not break, even when hitting the ground and we also found that some of the cartridges that we had ordered had not yet arrived.

The machines used at the clay target range are fully automatic Laporte machines which throw a very nice target and they are operated by a token which alleviates any extra use in clays, a good idea when clubs are trying to keep an eye on costs.

We only had a small training program after sorting everything out and then went as a group down into Suhl for some shopping and sightseeing.

Lunch again, a hot meal - turkey in gravy with rice etc., and the evening meal - sandwiches. We decided it would be better to swap the meals - sandwiches at lunch and a hot dinner at night.

Team meeting held to explain the training planned for Saturday, some boredom already evident so extra activities have been planned as night only falls around 9pm.

Saturday 3rd May

7am start with a walk and jog and stretching for 30 minutes.

George Barton - Team leader for the day. Spirits seemed `up' today. Lisa Smith suffering from a head cold, 1st customer to our famous First Aid Kit. Breakfast at 8am and then off to the shooting range, about 500m from our accommodation.

Trained all day until 4pm, with everyone trying to come to terms with the noise (echoes from the pines) and just getting the feel of the surroundings. Everyone was very tired at the end of practice but we had to have an early dinner (a large group were coming in for a party) so we decided to go down to Suhl for the evening.

There we found an indoor go-kart track to give the team a special treat. We (Murray, Claudia and I) left them to have some fun and set off to find the winter sports game not far away up in the mountains, that has an Olympic bob-sled run, ski jumps, etc. We found it and much to our surprise th bob-sled was open. The run was made of concrete and was 1 1/2 kilometres in length, with four people per sled. What a thrill for the team to

have a go in this, the only way to check it out to make sure it was safe was for Murray and I to have a turn in it first!

I challenged Murray to have a 'go' with me, it took quite a lot of

talking but we 'donned' crash helmets, got into the sled with a 'professional' who was to steer for us and 60 seconds later we were at the bottom of the run. What a ride that was, 75kph. They said that the professionals do the ride in about 41 seconds, now that would be hair-raising. We decided there and then to take the Team up on Monday afternoon to let them all have a turn on the bob-sled ride. We also found the ski-jumps, but they were too high, just looking over the edge to take photographs was awesome enough.

Back to the team at the go-kart track where Murray had a race against them, of course they all tried to spin him out, then back to the camp to bed. Team morale is good.

Sunday 4th May

Following the daily routine of exercises and breakfast we set off to see a 'castle' about 80k from Suhl. Shooting is not allowed on Sunday mornings so it had been pre-arranged for us to take the castle tour.

Two hours later we were at the bottom of the hill/mountain where we had to leave our mini-buses. Four deutschmark per person later saw us catching other mini-buses up the side of the hill and then drop everyone about 1/2k from the base of a cliff on top of which sits the castle. Then everyone had to walk up the rest of the way on a 40 degree incline, the last 200m at 45 degree incline. Murray, Claudia and the Team left me about half way up (old cartilage problem in my left knee forcing me to. take my time), but I did make it to the top. A further 11 deutschmark each to take the tour inside the castle (all in German), and seeing that the group had already gone in I walked around the outside, took some photographs (fabulous scenery), and started back down the steps. Around halfway saw a lady playing a flute and a fellow on cello (should have been a poet instead), they were playing classical music to people having a rest either on the way up or down, it was a lovely setting and people stopped and gave them coins.

Finally the rest of the gang finished their tour (not really impressed) and it was back down to the mini-buses.

It was here that Claudia and I had to head back to Frankfurt with one mini-bus and the car to pick up the other juniors from Pistol, Rifle and Running Target who were flying in on Monday morning. Murray in the meantime taking our team back to Suhl for a light training session in the afternoon.

On the way back to Frankfurt I saw my first traffic jam, there on the autobarn, 2 and 3 lanes of traffic at a standstill and it was 20k long, thank goodness it was on the other side of the road. 4pm when we got back to Frankfurt. We found a little place to stay about 3k from the airport and had our evening meal in a little pub on the banks of a river where cargo boats were going to and fro, the type you see in photographs with little gardens and cars on top of them.

If the rest of the team were as tired as I was from all that climbing up and down the steps back at the castle they probably fell into bed as I did, it was a 5.30am start the next morning for us though as we had to pick up the incoming Team from the airport. I think that the exercise done by everyone on the castle tour would have been equal to all the morning routines we did daily for our entire stay. It had been a gruelling day.

Monday 5th May

Away at 5.30am to the airport where we picked up the Rifle and Pistol juniors and it was 9.30am when we finally finished getting them through Customs etc. We now had another 14 in our group and with the 12 already in Suhl, our group now became a party of 26.

Cold, raining miserable weather and it took 4 1/2 hours to get back to Suhl, pouring with rain all the way.

Once back at Suhl I settled the new Juniors into the accommodation and then showed them around and at dinner time explained what was expected of them and the rules that we had. Everyone had to stand up and introduce themselves to the rest of the group and tell a little of what discipline they were with, where they lived etc., and this was helpful to everyone.

Tuesday 6th May

Weather, raining and cold. Claudia and I had meetings to attend in the morning and later (after all disciplines had a light training session) we went into Suhl to 'McDonalds' for lunch and then to the Merkel Gun Factory and we had an interesting tour where we saw guns and rifles being made. Then it was off to the bob-sled run where we had already arranged rides for all of the juniors but when we got up there it was raining and considered too dangerous and slippery, so it was back to camp for everybody.

Wednesday 7th May

Woke up to 'snow' this morning, not heavy but lovely. The entire Team had snow fights while doing their morning exercises. Official training from '9am until 12.30pm as the German Minister for Sport is flying in by helicopter to inspect the Shooting Complex so I have arranged for the entire team to don their tracksuits and welcome him.

The weather is bitterly cold, all practice is going well, have checked out all the different ranges and everything is OK. We had team photographs taken whilst all in their tracksuits while we were waiting for the Sports Minister to arrive. His arrival was quite exciting for he was flown in by a very large Police helicopter. Some of the team actually got a look inside the helicopter and the girls 'sat' in the Minister's seat, they thought it was great.

Competition gets under way tomorrow for some of the Juniors so an early night is planned.

Thursday 8th May

Competition for Double Trap (Junior Men and Women) and Running Target (Rifle) beginning at 9am and programmed until 2pm with training for the others not competing.

Disappointing to now learn that there are no other Junior Women Double Trap Shooters, just our 3, so at the conclusion of their competition it was 1st to Susan Milroy shooting 95/120, 2nd to Lisa Smith with 88/120 and 3rd placing to Natasha Lonsdale on 80/120. Both Susan and Lisa shooting an MQS.

The Junior Men however had a good competition. Germany taking 1st placing, 2nd to Nathan Cassells on 166/200, just 1 target behind the German lad, and 3rd placing to Craig Henwood who shot a 164/200. Derek Bruce again just one target behind Craig to take 4th with a score of 163/200.

The two running target juniors did not shoot up to their best coming in 21st & 24th placings, but as it is their first competition I thought they did well under the circumstances.

Training still going well for those not competing.

A glaring error as I see it, the weather is freezing and all of our shooters are 'under dressed' and by putting all of those extra layers of clothing on, they are only 'binding themselves up' and they are unable to move freely. Thermal underwear?? A short Coaches meeting and off to bed.

Friday 9th May

Competition for all disciplines today with Trap and Skeet programmed from 9am until 5pm, while the other disciplines are scattered throughout the day.

Another bitterly cold day, with rain and again a light snow fall in the clay target range.

Nathan Cassells, Derek Bruce and Nathan McDonnell are competing in the Junior Men's Trap and Craig Henwood is competing in the Open section for a Senior Cup. At the end of the day Nathan Cassells is a clear leader on 73/75 with Derek Bruce 8 points behind him with Nathan McDonnell having an extremely bad day shooting 57/75. Craig Henwood has also shot well in the Open section.

The Skeet boys, George and Kris are having a really hard time with all of their heavy clothing, being unable to swing

freely George has shot a 65/75 and Kris a 59/75.

The other disciplines placings for the day are as follows: Running Target Mixed: Brenton Pollard 33rd, Andrew Bingham 35th; Air Rifle Jnr Men: Sam Wieland equal 26th; Standard Rifle Jnr Women: Susan McCready 39th; Free Pistol Jnr Men: Adrian Berthelsen 13th, Dean Walters 15th, Chris Shentall 26th; Air Pistol Jnr Women: Annmarie Forder 2nd, Kelly Rodgers 19th, Sally Taylor 25th.

It was very pleasing to see Annmarie Forder taking the Silver medal for the Air Pistol competition. Germany taking Gold with a score of 476.7, Annmarie taking Silver with her score of 476.2 and Poland taking Bronze with a 474.5. A great effort.

At presentation time when Annmarie received her medal the combined Australian team let everyone know that we were present with the "Aussie, Aussie, Aussie, Oi, Oi, Oi" chant. Up to that time the competitors had only clapped when shooters had received their medals but after the Aussies chant all of the other countries let forth with their cheers as well and this added some humour to the occasion.

With most of the shooters having finals the following day everyone went to bed early.

Saturday 10th May

Everyone up early, eager to get to their competition and finals, the weather again being extremely cold with rain.

At the end of the Clay Target competition we had Nathan Cassells and Derek Bruce in the Final of the Trap, Nathan a clear leader by 7 points over Derek and 8 points over a German lad, not a bad lead to go into the final with. Nathan then shot a 24 in the Final to give him 144/150, Derek shot a 22 giving him a 135/150 taking second place, the German lad shot a 20 giving him a 132/150. The Czech Republic took 4th, 5th and 6th placings in the Final.

It was pleasing that all available Pistol & Rifle Aussie Juniors

came up to watch the Trap Final and to give our shooters their support, with Nathan gaining for himself a couple of female admirers.

The Skeet boys did not fare as well with George coming in 9th place on a 108/125 and Kris being placed 19th after shooting a score of 98/125. The winning Czech shooter posting a score of 140/150

The other discipline finals for the day were: Air Pistol Jnr Men: Adrian Berthelsen 13th, Dean Walters equal 15th, Chris Shentall equal 25th; Free Rifle Jnr Men: Sam Wieland 11th; Sport Pistol Jnr Women: Sally Taylor 8th (in the Final), Kelly Rodgers 18th; Air Rifle Jnr Men: Susan McCready 39th, Shallan Valentine equal 40th; Free Rifle Jnr Men: Brett

Stephenson equal 25th.

Prior to the presentation time the German Black Powder Club again gave us a demonstration with their black powder pistols and cannon. Plenty of noise and plenty of smoke.

As had happened the previous day when Annmarie had received her medal, when Nathan and Derek were presented with their Gold and Silver medals for Trap the Aussie team again let out their chant and this really got the crowd going with all the countries waiting for their turn, trying to outdo each other, this was really great.

A disco and evening meal was organised at the Holiday Inn in

Suhl for all competitors and officials starting time 7pm. As this was the Clay Target Teams last night, with two of the Pistol shooters coming home with us, and we were to have a very early start, I had to impose an 11pm curfew.

To allow the Team to have a good time at the disco, the Coaches, Claudia and I decided that we would have a quiet dinner by ourselves and come back at 11pm to pick up the Team.

We dined at a 400 year old Inn that Murray had been to on a previous trip and the hospitality and food was great. We got back to the disco to find the team having a great time, there was plenty of food and plenty of noise and it was a pity to drag them away but we were looking at only getting 4-5 hours of sleep before starting on our long journey home.

Sunday 11th May

Up at 5am and 5.45am saw us bidding farewell to Tricia and Claudia and with the two buses filled to bursting point we headed for Frankfurt arriving there at 9.30am to meet up with Bill Murray arriving with the Senior Team of Pistol arriving with the Senior Team of Pistol arriving with them setting off for Suhl around 10am. We then waited for the Thai Airways booking office to open around midday.

By the time that we booked and had all of our guns etc., passed through Customs we still had a couple of hours to spare to buy things in the duty free shops and everyone was glad finally to be seated on the plane for an 11 hour flight back to Bangkok. Once again the plane was not full and our seating arrangements were good and any empty seats were quickly taken up. After dinner everyone settled down to a good nights sleep.

Monday 12th May

Arrived in Bangkok around 7.30am. We booked into the hotel that Thai Airways had arranged for us at the airport. I then

As the taxis were only hired for three hours this only allowed us about an hour of shopping time but this turned out well as everyone got most of the things that they were after during that limited time.

We then headed back to the hotel, paid a toll to get onto the freeway and we were back in only half the time. Once back we had a light snack, showers and some sleep before our 7pm departure. The weather here was opposite to what we had experienced in Germany, quite warm and we were all glad to get into our air-conditioned rooms after the stench back at the market place.

Once again the flight out of Bangkok to Sydney was not full and we were all able to get empty seats enabling us to stretch out. After more food and drinks we settled down to watch some movies and then tried to snatch a couple of hours sleep but again everyone was excited as they were all looking forward to getting home.

With all the bookwork, permits etc., in order and everyone dressed in their Aussie tracksuits it certainly makes going through Customs much easier. It was then farewell time to the group as we headed for our respective domestic airline departure lounges. Our trip was over.

I believe everyone had an exciting trip, we all learnt a great deal and everyone will benefit greatly from their experience and it was particularly pleasing to hear the comments from the two Pistol shooters who accompanied us back home. They said that the time spent with the Clay Target shooters on this trip was the best time that they have ever had compared to any previous trips they have made (in or out of Australia). This made me feel good.

In my opinion all of the Juniors from all of the disciplines on this trip were great ambassadors for Australia as were the Coaches and the future of Australian shooting is in great shape.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Olympic Athlete Program Committee, the Australian Shooting Association, and the Australian Clay Target Association of the honour of being chosen as Team Manager for this trip.

It was rewarding to see our successes and the eagerness with which the competitors are perusing their chosen sport and if we continue to get the great support from the Australian Sports Commission and the respective disciplines and their Coaches, Australians will be held in high esteem for their shooting abilities

I wish all the Junior the successes that they deserve.

HANDED IN YOUR ILLEGAL FIREAR?

YOU ONLY HAVE UNTIL THE 30TH SEPTEMBER

Since the new firearms laws were introduced last year, Australians around the country have handed-in over 400,000 guns and received compensation amounting to more than \$200 million.

If you still have a prohibited firearm – such as a self-loading rifle or self-loading or pump action shotgun – you have until the 30th September 1997 to hand it in. If you hand it in before this date, you will be paid fair, tax-free compensation and will not be prosecuted under the new laws.




Trap Nationals/World DTL Statistics

For those of you who may be interested in a little light hearted 'Trivia' we have put together some extra information and statistics for your entertainment as follows:

- * With almost 400,000 targets being used, at a weight of 105gms/target, the total weight of targets used was 42 tonne. This of course means that 42 tonne were manhandled into the traphouses by the workers!!!
- * Approximately 520,000 shotshells were used with 28gms of lead in each one means 14.56 tonne of lead was used.
- * 520,000 shotshells equals 1040 cases at an average of \$120 per case would have cost the Shooters \$125,000.
- * If all these cartridges were laid end to end they would reach for 208kms.
- * In the National Double Barrel Championship, 4281 targets per hour were shot or 71 per minute or 1.19 per second.
- * We drank 2,400 cans of Coke, 1,000 Diet Coke 1700 bottles of water as well as other mixed drinks.
- * We also consumed 294 litres milk, 6,000 packets of sugar, 2,500 tea bags and 10 kilograms of coffee.

We set new Nationals Records for number of competitors for the Champion of Champions, Pointscore Championship, Double Rise Championship and Deauville Doubles event.







With the presence of our International competitors, this




event was conducted with keen competition. With the criteria being a minimum of three International competing countries, I cannot recall the last time this competition was shot.

competitors, and shoot offs were required to decide nearly all of the winners and placegetters.



I need Eccles because I am now almost totally blind. I have an inherited disorder known as retinitis pigmentosa, commonly known as tunnel vision.

Would your readers share in my vision of Australia hosting the best ever Paralympic Games by giving an early donation to my fundraising ride from Melbourne to Sydney?

The route we're taking is 1,455 kilometres long. Just two cents a kilometre would be a tax-deductible gift of \$29.10. If you could manage twenty cents, it would raise \$291.00.





Alios Ambs shot 659/750 to be the C grade winner.






















Overall High Gun winner Arthur Turner losing one point over the program to score 224/225, with president Robert Naef

Shooting Update Sydney 2000

During the period between now and September 2000 the Australian Shooting Association will be provided with regular quarterly updates on SOCOG's progress in relation to a successful shooting program for the Sydney Olympic Games.

These updates will ensure that shooters and shooting throughout Australia is kept informed of what progress is being made on as many aspects of planning and preparations as possible for what will be with out doubt the greatest shooting competition ever held in Australia.

Quarterly Update

This being the first of my planned quarterly updates is for the quarter ending 30 March. The next update will be forwarded to the Australian Shooting Association for distribution to affiliates on or around 30 June of this year.

Sport Technical Advisory Committee

Each of the Olympic sports will be forming a Sport Technical Advisory Committee, to advise the respective Competition Manager's on technical matters relevant to their respective sport. A seven member Shooting Technical Advisory Committee has been formed to proved advice on matters related to shooting's involvement with the Olympic Games in 2000.

The Australian Shooting Association has appointed Tibor Gonczol as its Technical Representative to the advisory committee. Tibor has a wealth of experience in shooting having attended five Olympics either as a competitor or official, ten World Championships, and numerous UIT World Cups and Continental Championships.

Three other persons well qualified and well known in their respective disciplines have been invited to join the committee,

Aado Maranik - Smallbore and Running Target Technical Representative

Robert Smith - Shotgun Technical Representative

Russell Mark - Athletes Representative

Each has accepted the invitation to join the advisory committee, with Tibor Gonczol in addition to his appointment as ASA Technical Representative, also acting as Pistol Representative.

Two other persons will be added to the committee at a later date. One to be appointed by the controlling body in NSW for the Olympic shooting disciplines, as soon as advice is received from the Australian Shooting Association as to which of the two claimant bodies they recognise, NSW Shooting Association or NSW Shooting

Sports Council. The other will be invited by myself as Competition Manager to join the committee as SOCOG's representative.

The advisory committee met for the first occasion in Melbourne on February 24th, addressing a number of matters placed before them in a manner which left no doubt as to their capacity to fulfil their respective roles, and their willingness to play a major part in shootings planning and overall preparation for what will be an exciting time in September 2000.

Olympic Shooting Venue

At the time of writing no announcement had been made as to the location of the Olympic shooting facility. Holsworthy the original site, has been identified as a possible second airport servicing Sydney, so there is some doubt over the venue.

OCA, the Olympic Co-ordination Authority responsible for procuring a site and building the shooting facility, had identified a possible alternate site at Cecil Park, home of the Cecil Park Clay Target Club, approximately 30 minutes from the Olympic Village at Homebush.

The advisory committee has viewed preliminary drawings and also visited the site in company with OCA consultants. All were more than please with the undoubted potential of the Cecil Park site and also the preliminary drawings. Tests currently underway to ascertain the suitability of the site will more than likely determine its acceptability for the Olympic Shooting Complex.

While an announcement by the Minister of a confirmed location for the shooting facility is imminent, no actual decision can be taken until such time as the UIT and IOC approve a change from Holsworthy, the sit contained in the original Olympic bid.

SOCOG Competition Managers have met as a body on four occasions. These meetings have been extremely informative, with each clearly demonstrating the overall advanced state of SOCOG's preparedness at what could mistakenly be construed to be an early stage of planning.

Having witnessed first hand the commitment of the SOCOG staff to the success of the Games, there is no doubt in my mind that the Games in 2000 will be an outstanding success.

Notwithstanding there is a lot of work to do before this eventuates with shooting having the opportunity to play its part to its greatest capacity.




Mike Thornton from Fuller Firearms presenting Robert Rosenberger with his new Miroku shotgun




Margaret Denton congratulating Justin Barton, event 4-25 pair "Retreat" doubles




