U.I.T. World Cup, Brisbane

Following many months of hard work by the Organising Committee. Australia's first ever World Cup in Olympic Discipline Clay Target Shooting got under way on time recently at the Brisbane Gun Club.

With proceedings due to start on Friday 6th June with the official practice for trap and the official Opening Ceremony, many overseas competitors took advantage of the opportunity to acclimatise and recover from the northern hemisphere winter and

the effects of jet lag by arriving early for the competition.

First to arrive were the members of the strong Italian team regarded by many as the current yard stick in the world of shotgun shooting. After a day or so of relaxing with a bit of fishing thrown in, they became regular visitors to Brisbane Gun Club in the lead up to official proceedings.

By the start of official practice, all competitors for the trap event had arrived and were taking advantage of the perfect Queensland winter weather to prepare follow. Brisbane Gun Club had rushed to complete major upgrading for the World Cup and with

for the proceedings to a few days to spare

With practice out of the way, the official opening was planned for 4.00pm on the Brisbane Gun Club grounds and without exception all present were impressed by the proceedings and preparation that had taken place for the big day.

Official guests at the Opening Ceremony included the Hon. Mick Veivers. Queensland Minister for Sport; Mr Horst Schreiber, UIT Secretary General; Mr Hiroshi Matsuo, UIT Technical Delegate; Graeme Hudson, President Oceania Shooting Federation; Alastair Macpherson, President Australian Shooting Association; Glenn Woodhatch. President Australian Clay Target Association; Robert Nugent, Organising Committee Chairman; Tom Meadows, President, Queensland Clay

Target Association; Tibor Gonczol, UIT Delegate; Jury Members David Menck, Jim Kelly. Peter Strike, Ewen Pirie (NZ), Michele de Rosa (Italy), and many other government, sporting and Olympic organisation representatives.

During the official opening Mr Schreiber made special mention of

the exemplary preparation completed by the Organising Committee and reiterated the need for Australia to be further involved in events such as the World Cup in the lead up to the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney.

Prior to the large crowd in attendance being entertained by an Australian Aboriginal dance group, the Minister for Sport Mick Veivers, officially handed over the new facilities funded by his Department of Sport and Recreation, and then officially declared the World Cup Shotgun competition open.

Following a social gathering at the Brisbane Gun Club, all was now well in hand for the competition to commence at 10.00am on Saturday morning, 7th June.

All the hard work and preparation was now due to be put to the test and with great



could now boast three brand new fully automatic Olympic Trap ranges and upgraded skeet facilities for the competition. Under the close eye of Mr


Hiroshi Matsuo the UIT's Technical Delegate from Japan, an enormous amount of work was completed in a very short time and great credit needs to be paid to those members of the Brisbane Gun Club who made it all happen in such a short time.

Official practice for the trap event went well with all competitors allocated one round of practice on each of the three olympic trap ranges throughout the day. With a little spare time after practice was completed, there was always someone at the competition office window still keen to have another round or two. It didn't take the girls in the office long to learn to converse in half a dozen or so different languages.

The need to arrange accommodation, transportation, police permits, customs papers, tents, caps, shirts, signs, programs, meals, drinks, office paperwork, ceremonies, medals, trophies etc. etc., was in itself a mammoth task, but with assistance of fellow committee member David Menck, Chairman Robert Nugent and Tom Meadows (looking after the facilities) everything just 'fell' into place eventually.

Olympic Trap

Shooters from nine countries were to contest the Olympic Trap event, the first of the three disciplines on the program, and many saw Australia as being the country most likely to come out on top following recent successes by many of our shooters overseas.

In all events, shooters had been nominated in either the World Cup competition or for the opportunity to record a minimum qualifying score (MQS), which enables a shooter to be eligible to compete at the next Olympic Games. Quite often organisers are puzzled why certain competitors are nominated for an MQS only, and are then not eligible to win a placing in the competition. No doubt the selectors would get a few things wrong during this competition also, and would have to re-think their selection procedures after the smoke has cleared. As usual, three competitors are permitted to be entered by each country for the World Cup competition, and a further two to record an MQS. Quite a few of the participating nations including America, New Zealand, Japan, China and Australia had taken advantage of this opportunity, which was good for the competition in general.

Michael Diamond, Russell Mark and Adam Vella were all in good form following recent overseas successes and keen to make the most of a hometown advantage, while the Italians were also keen and ready to go. For Australia, Ben Kelley, who won the recent World Cup in Korea and John Maxwell, who had also been in



Women's Double Trap winners — Ann Maree Roberts (Aust), E Gao (Chn) and Deserie Wakefield (Aust)


recent good form, were slotted into the MQS ranks this time

At the completion of the first day's 75 targets, Michael Diamond had a narrow one target lead over the field with Russell Mark and Des Coe (New Zealand), right on Michael's heels. Italians Roberto Scalzone, Marco Conti and Adriano Lamera were all well placed one target further back on 72/75, along with James Clawson (USA). Four more shooters were still there on 71/75 for the day.

In the Australian Classic competition which was being held in conjunction to cater for team events and ladies and juniors competitions, Deserie Wakefield had opened up a good break over the rest of the lady competitors by recording 70/75 for the day, 5 targets ahead of Dot Trindall with Veronica Jurica another five targets further behind Dot.

Derek Bruce and Craig Henwood shared the lead in the junior section with 71/75, with Nathan McDonnell poised to make his move on 70/75.


As day 2 progressed, the Italians Roberto Scalzone and Marco Conti made their move by shooting 50/50 for the day to go into the

final tied with Michael Diamond and Russell Mark, all on 122/125. Des Coe (NZL) and Hongtao Xu (CHN), made up the six for the final after shooting-out James Clawson (USA) who finished equal with them on 120/125.

Deserie Wakefield continued on her good form to take the ladies event and Nathan McDonnell the juniors.

The World Cup Trap final provided the excitement that all present had come to see. With four shooters all going into the final tied on 122/125 and the other two tied on 121/125, something had to give before long.

Russell Mark and Roberto Scalzone shot perfect 25s in the final to still be tied on 147/150, and would have to continue sudden death single barrel. Diamond and Conti both missed one in the final and they would have to continue to fight out for the bronze medal, while Coe and Xu were also still tied after both shooting perfect

So, 150 targets gone and still no sign of a winner. Scalzone and Mark then proceeded to continue the battle with the first break coming after 14 single barrel targets when Scalzone missed. Mark only had to break his target to take the gold medal, but he too missed to let Scalzone back in. 3 targets further on and Scalzone fired, 'dusting' the target, which resulted in the referees and assistants not being able to make a decision. The target was restored by the referee and Scalzone made no mistake by recording a clean hit. Russell Mark was unable to hit his target, giving the gold medal to Scalzone of Italy with Mark taking the silver.

The shoot off for the bronze medal also kept the crowd riveted to their seats with Marco Conti finally proving too good for Michael Diamond on the day, to take the third placing after only 7 targets.

The Italians also showed their depth by taking the teams competition with a narrow one target win over Australia with New Zealand in third position.

With the Olympic Trap competition decided the focus now turned to the doubles event with titles up for grabs in both the Men's and Women's Double Trap. Again the Australian trio of Russell Mark, Adam Vella and Michael Diamond appeared to be the favourites following recent successes, but the Italian team of Loca Marini, Mirco Cenci and Ercole Buffoli probably weren't taking too much notice of the hometown talk.

In the Women's event, the Chinese shooters E. Gao, Yafei Zhang and Xiaoguang Jiang were probably going to be the ones to watch, with the Australian hopes pinned on Olympians Deserie Wakefield and Ann Marce Roberts and Adelaide youngster Lisa Smith.

A full day of practice was first in order, as many of the

competitors in the doubles competition were specialists, and had not been in the trap competitions. In particular this was evident from the Chinese and Italians contingents who have really set the scene of having specialist shooters in all disciplines.

Tuesday 10th June, and after the completion of the first round of men's competition, Luca Marini of Italy had certainly indicated his intentions with a perfect 50/50 to lead the rest of the field by two targets. Americans Steve Puls and Charles Redding both started well with 48 and 46 respectively, along with Michael Diamond, Mirco Cenci and Binyuan Hu (China) all on 46. Russell Mark had a disastrous start shooting 37/50 in his first round and was never going to be in the competition from there on.

The MQS section as usual was also creating some problems for the selectors. Steve Haberman missed one target in his initial visit for a 49/50, and in the women's event Brisbane shooter Dot Trindall carded the highest women's score in the first round notching up 37/40, one target ahead of the early competition leader, Cindy Gentry of America. Mei Zhu of China also recorded 36/40 in the MQS section to again leave the selectors thinking.

At the completion of the three rounds, Luca Marini of Italy had maintained his two target lead to be the first qualifier ahead of American Charles Redding, with Michael Diamond two targets further back on 138/150. Mirco Cenci (Italy), Bo Li (China) and Des Coe (New Zealand) were to make up the 'final' six.

In the MQS section, Steve Haberman finished as the high scorer on 140/150, equal second best score of the entire competition. A similar result was recorded in the women's event, where Mei Zhu of China shot three 36s to finish on 108/120, three targets ahead of Australian Ann Maree Roberts who had performed extremely well to be first qualifier in the Women's final ahead of Gao (China), Deserie Wakefield (Australia), Yafei Zhang (China), Xiaogung Jiang (China), Lisa Smith (Australia).

With the Double Trap finalists now decided, we were to have two Italians, one American, one Australian, one Chinese and one Kiwi in the Men's final, and three Australians and three Chinese in the Women's final. A great mixture of very good shooters.

As is usual in Double Trap shooting, the medals were still up for grabs - anything can happen in a round of doubles, but in these particular instances, it didn't and the top qualifiers both shot extremely good final rounds to take their respective gold medals.

Luca Marini added a very professional 48/50 to his qualifying score to end up on 190/200, only one target less than the world record, beating Charles Redding and Michael Diamond who took silver and bronze respectively, while Ann Maree Roberts became Australia's first ever Women's Double Trap World Cup winner, by carding a near perfect 37/40, to increase her winning margin to three targets over Gao of China with Deserie Wakefield taking the bronze.

In the teams competitions, the strong Italian team of Marini, Cenci and Buffoli were far too strong in the men's competition to take the gold from Australia with China in third place, while the Chinese relegated Australia to second again in the women's event with New Zealand taking third.

The Junior section of the Double Trap event also saw some great competition, with Nathan Cassells taking the overall honours from Derek Bruce with Craig Henwood in third position. Nick Marinis and Marc Crimmins who also competed in the event also performed well and will no doubt be better for the experience of a World Cup competition, as will Dot Trindall, Gleniss Lawrence, Diane Reeves and Cherie Reeves who all took part in the womens

Following this, most of the trap shooters were calling it a day, and as happens so often now new faces were starting to appear around the club for the skeet competition. A few of the contingents including the Americans, Saudi Arabians, Chinese and Japanese stayed on to offer moral support for the rest of the team, which was no doubt great for the skeeties who otherwise were likely to be a bit lonely.

With renewed interest following the announcement that Women's Trap and Skeet would be introduced to the competition for the Sydney Olympics, practice got under way on Wednesday morning with all concerned eager to get in as much practice as possible. Again, each shooter was allocated three rounds of practice for the day, and time permitting an extra round or two might be available.

The Polish, American, Saudi Arabian, and Japanese shooters were all very keen to have a go after sitting around for a week sneaking in the odd round of practice when possible between trap events, and the new comers were also taking advantage of the great Queensland weather to fine tune their skills.

Day one of the skeet, and without doubt this event was as open as any in recent times. The local critics saw the Polish shooters along with the Chinese, Australians and individuals from Pakistan, and the U.S. as possible medallists, but really, it was anyone's guess as to the final outcome.

After the first round when a few 25s and a few more 24s had been carded, no one was any wiser, but as the day progressed the front runners started to emerge. MQS shooter Xiguang Gao (China) had the best score for the day with 74/75, but in the competition proper, Clive Barton (Australia) and Ahmad Sultan (Pakistan) were the joint leaders on 73/75, one target ahead of David Cunningham (Australia) who was sharing third place with Brian Thomson of New Zealand on 72/75. The Polish and Chinese shooters were still hanging in one or two targets back in the field

but from here it was going to be very difficult for anyone else to peg back the front runners

The final day of the World Cup competition, and with two rounds of skeet to go all was in place for a good finish. 24s and 23s seemed to be the order of the day with only Clive Barton, Brian Thomson and Saeed Al Mutairy (KSA) being able to notch up perfect 25s. Young Pakistani shooter Ahmad Sultan, finished with a rough round of 20 to be out of contention, but will no doubt figure in quite a few skeet competitions in the not too distant future as his level of experience improves.

The 'final' six were now decided, with Australian's Clive Barton (121/125) and David Cunningham 120/125 going in first and second, ahead of Kiwi Brian Thomson with the Poles, Mirslaw Rzepkowski and Grzegorz Chrzanowski also in, one target ahead of Weiguang Zhang (China), who had to survive a three way shoot off to take the sixth place in the final.

After over a week of glorious sunny weather, the clouds let go as final preparations were taking place for the skeet 'final', but again the Organising Committee had got it right and the sky cleared again, just long enough to get the competition completed.

Watched by a good crowd, the skeet 'final' got under way with a great chance for a one-two victory for Australia, which is exactly how it finished. Missing only his high eight target, Clive Barton became Australia's newest World Cup winner (145/150), one target ahead of David Cunningham who also shot 24/25 in the 'final' to maintain a healthy three shot advantage over Brian Thomson of New Zealand. Thomson and the two Polish competitors Rzepkowski and Chrzanowski all finished on 141/150 and so proceeded to a miss and out shoot-off shooting doubles on stations 3, 4 & 5 until a winner was determined. Thomson emerged victor leaving the Poles to continue to fight it out for 4th and 5th sports. Rzepkowski finally winning, leaving the Chinese shooter Zhang in 6th position.

After holding down the first two placing's, the Australian trio of Barton, Cunningham and Craig Meuleman, who had not had the best of competitions, took the gold medal in the teams competition ahead of Poland and China third.

The Australian Classic competition for Juniors saw another win, with George Barton, Clive's younger brother, taking the gold medal ahead of Michael Wenzel, Kris Jones, David Work and Marc Crimmins.







Since the new firearms laws were introduced last year, Australians around the country have handed-in over 400,000 guns and received compensation amounting to more than \$200 million.

If you still have a prohibited firearm – such as a self-loading rifle or self-loading or pump action shotgun – you have until the 30th September 1997 to hand it in. If you hand it in before this date, you will be paid fair, tax-free compensation and will not be prosecuted under the new laws.



It is with sincere regret that the members of the Burdekin Gun Club advise the passing of Alan Kelly, a long serving member of the club.








The author was shooting at a neighbouring station, when a rousing cheer was heard at the "Overhead". The story was relayed later that evening. An out-of-town shooter had

A visit to one of the "Spanish Best": Armas Kemen

The silence was physical. It was not just the absence of human sound. I could feel the silence, as if a partial vacuum was pulling at my skin. Unmoving and bathed in mid-morning Basque sunlight that cascaded around green security bars fortifying bench-to-ceiling windows, I stood inside the small L-shaped manufacturing facility of Armas Kemen.

Respectfully quiet and bug-eyed, I inhaled slowly and deeply so as not to disrupt the concentration of the master gunmaker to my left who was fitting trigger assembly into the white steel bascula, the action, of a shotgun under construction. My nostrils tingled. A mixture of scents floated through the still air: the sweet aftershave lotion of my host, Arcadio Sarriugarte, solvents and the delicious earthy fragrance of shaved walnut stock blanks.


The silence was broken only by the highpitched "chirp chirp chirp" of files striking steel, plus an almost inaudible groan as the stockmaker's rasp carved walnut to the custom dimensions of its fortuitous owner. No electric machines whined or screamed.

Arcadio gestured gracefully with his hand, inviting me to look around and ask questions. "Mi casa es su casa", he said with a broad smile. I understood. "My house is your house." I nodded appreciatively and responded in my best Spanish - "My house is your house also, along with the mortgage!" He laughed. Perhaps he understood my quip; probably not. Arcadio turned and went back to his office.

With a yellow legal pad in one hand and my camera in the other, I joined John Aguinaga and walked to the workbench that traversed most of the wall opposite the entrance to the work area. Nine gun craftsmen were steeped in deep concentration, their tools meticulously arranged as if they were in a surgical operating room. I studied their faces. They were intense yet tranquil, with a softness that comes from not being required to rush to meet quotas or deadlines. When a worker did catch the eye of another, there were smiles, not scowls. I was impressed.

I stepped from work station to work station, each devoted to a specific task. A cordial smile acknowledged my presence and then the artisan would resume his task. In choppy Spanish I spoke with each of the workers and gained a depth of insight into the souls of the Basque guns and of the gunmakers.

I was in Elgoibar, a small industrial town in the Basque region of Northern Spain. I had recently made the acquaintance of John Aguinaga, a man of Basque descent and an owner of U.S.A. Sporting Clays Incorporated, the exclusive North American importer of Kemen shotguns. John and Ken Bogdan, the other principal in the company, and Derek Partridge, a consultant to Armas Kemen, were travelling to the factory to confer with Arcadio and Juan Cruz Sarriugarte, owners of Armas Kemen. John invited me to join him, observe the




Fitting barrels to action

manufacturing process and write a few words about the Kemen company.

For several reasons, I was delighted to accept the invitation. A trip to Spain would be, of course, a respite from my law practice. But, far more thrilling would be the opportunity to see first hand how the "old world" masters in the Basque region worked their alchemy. I would peer into their almost secretive world in which heavy blanks of fine Valencian or Turkish walnut and bars of nickel-chromium steel are transformed into the highest exemplars of the gunmaker's art on the planet.

Since reading Terry Wieland's sumptuous book "Spanish Best, The Fine Shotguns of Spain", I have harboured an increasing desire to become more hand-made how educated about shotguns are crafted. One of the rewards of writing is having a purpose to meet people. Preparing an article gives me something to talk about. Now I could look into the eyes of the people who shaped the wood, who fitted and engraved the steel and who strategised for the success of an exclusive shotgun manufacturer. This was a dream come true. As an additional gracenote, it had been thirteen years since I last visited Spain, when I travelled through the

southern Andalusian region on my honeymoon. I relished the opportunity to again experience Spain's charm, hospitality and fine cuisine.

I watched the gunmakers with the awe reserved for a skilled artist bringing a blank canvas to life with colour and form. Then I chuckled. The contrast between the quality arms produced inside and Kemen's modest, indeed humble, facilities at Calle Ermuarenbide 14, is paradoxical. Kemen's home is on the second floor of a weary two-storey building. The exterior is a pinkish-cream colour, marred by cracked plaster and peeling paint, and no longer able to disguise its losing battle against the elements. The glass block windows on the lower level defy light to penetrate their layers of dirt and grime.

A modest sign with a once-upon-a-time white background simply states "Kemen" in yellow letters and "Sarriugarte" in smaller black letters. There is no graphic of a gun or any reference to gunmaking. An uninformed traveller passing by would be justifiably disinclined to believe that up the deteriorating cement stairway resided a company solidly placed within the constellation of elite Basque manufacturers of the Spanish "best" sporting arms.

The inauspicious entrance to Armas Kemen caused me to think of the austere modest shops that existed in Cremona four hundred years ago that housed Italy's finest violin makers, Stradivarius and Guarnarius, among others. Only a few instruments were produced each year, but they were the most extraordinary in the world. Things are not what they appear to be, I mused. The previous day I was coincidentally reminded of that notion when I passed by one of the computer stores in Eibar and saw a large poster for Disney's video "Aladdin"

Indeed, walking the narrow streets of Eibar and Elgoibar, nestled in the Vascongadas Valley in the province of Vizcaya, there is nothing to suggest that these two small industrial towns are among the greatest arms manufacturing centres on the continent. No flashy signs or garish chambers of commerce proclaim the world stature of the arms trade or its prominence as a revenue source for the region. Vizcaya, along with Alava and Guipuzcoa, are the three provinces of the larger geographic unit, which boasts a rich industrial greatness but also a painful political, military and economic history.

I was ready to view the making of one of the Spanish Best. I reloaded my camera. checked the ASA setting, then ambled over to the two engravers seated at the far end of the workbench. Of the several work segments, I was drawn to the engravers as if by a magnet. I aimed my camera and began photographing their exquisite artistry. From my memory's depths I recalled a comment about the Kemen guns made by Frank Kodl in a gun review written by Don Zutz. Kodl wrote "The real satisfying thing about the Kemen is its overall "Perazzi" look and related dynamics. Straight out of the box, it's like shooting with an old friend." Well, I never had such old friends! I thought it time to make some new ones. I introduced myself to the first engraver. "Hello!"

Pedro Arreitunandia turned to me with a warm open smile. Correct verb forms fell like rubble down a mountain in our tortured conversation. I learned that Pedro had begun his apprenticeship in the several engraving disciplines thirty-five years ago, at the age of fourteen. He had worked in Eibar, in Elgoibar and, for about one year, had the equivalent of an internship in Italy. He began his career as a jeweller, familiarising himself with the styles of the world's greats engravers. He then began working en armas, in guns, and had been doing so for ten years before joining Kemen.

His small work area held a veritable library on the engraver's art. Volumes were piled high behind his vice. In a large drawer were more books plus photographs and sketches of engravings from all over the world. There were also letters and cards from customers requesting that Pedro duplicate in gold and steel the sketches and photographs that were attached. Even more photographs and sketches lay on a raised stand like the sheet music of a concert violinist, set to guide the transformation of the customer's dream into reality.

On the Kemen Extra Luxe and other custom models, Pedro did the intricate and elegant gold engraving and inlay work know as Damasquina. He showed me a photograph of the golden crest of King Juan Carlos that he engraved for the king. "Mi passion es esto!" Pedro told me. "This is my passion!". His eyes sparkled with intensity and love.


I thought of Michelangelo's words, that

the genius of the sculptor is to unlock the angel in the marble. I now saw the same process blossom in a different medium. Under Pedro's steady hand that would make a brain surgeon envious, the piece of white steel came to life as the metal shone and shimmered in the changing light. I savoured the moment.

Pedro gave me a brief education on engraving. He pointed to a brilliantly engraved receiver featuring several birds in different stages of flight. The light absorption and reflection properties of the steel enhanced the elegance of the work. Pedro described this form as the "Estilo Italiano", or Italian style, noted for its deep relief and realistic scenes. "Es muy hermosa," he tells me. "It's very beautiful", but not the most difficult style, he said.

The receiver with the bevy of birds required about eighty hours. I raised my eyebrows. That's a chunk of time in my business! Pedro reached for an instrument called a burril, the knife-like tool used for the Italian Style and for some of the less demanding bulino engraving. Then he picked up an instrument called the martilio, or hammer, from about half dozen different sized hammers on his table. The engraver cuts the steel by hitting the burril with the hammer. Thus the technique is often referred to as "con burril y martilio" or, in English translation, the "scuder and small hammer" technique.

The "Estilo Bulino", the Bulino style engraving, Pedro told me, is much more demanding; much more time consuming. He handed me a small, lethal-looking tool called the bulino, which had a simple steel point. He pointed to the workbench. About two dozen bulinos of different sizes lay in neat rows. The bulino is much finer that a burril. With evident pride, Pedro showed me a sideplate which took over 200 hours.

"Estilo bulino", he told me, his face glowing.

In the pure bulino style, the engraver carves and sculpts the steel almost exclusively by the controlled pressure and strength of the hands. Pedro picked up a magnifying glass, a lupa, and slowly moved it over the sideplate that was secured between lead-covered vice jaws. The most demanding execution of the bulino style requires the lupa, he enthusiastically explained, to permit the minute engraving of the details and shadings.

Perhaps I could peek into Pedro's mind. Lets say, I asked him, you've worked for a week or more on a masterpiece, an intricate Purdy scrollwork such as the one he was then working on, and suddenly, Ooops!! A mistake! What happens? How do you feel? Pedro shrugged sheepishly, as if he has suffered that experience at least once. "Es muy malo", he said tersely. "It's very bad." I should think so, I silently concurred. The steel can't be covered up like acrylic on a canvas.

Pedro Otaola, handsome man with an

easy smile and clear brown eyes, was to Pedro's right. This Pedro did the less demanding engraving. At the moment he was cutting the "Kemen" name into barrels, los tubos, and then filling the cut with gold. Gold wire in about a dozen different diameters, from about that of a human hair to perhaps two millimetres, lay in coils by his vice. "Oro puro", he said. "Pure gold." All the gold was twenty-four carat, I was told.

With burril and martilio, he worked with the speed and precision of a laser beam as he cut the "Kemen" name. Then he took a strand of fine gold and placed it over a section of a letter, starting with the "K", and gently hammered it into place. Strand by strand, he filled the five chiselled letters, then lifted the barrel and rubbed his hand over the surface. After smoothing the barrel with several short strong passes with emery cloth fitted against his finger, he turned to me and gestured for me to feel the gold.

I gingerly touched the barrel. Seemed OK to me! Pedro smiled, again placed the emery cloth over this finger and repeated the process several additional times, touching the gold after every few strokes. Then he stopped. The smooth gleaming gold contrasted beautifully against the silvery steel. "Perfecto!" He grinned and carefully removed the barrel from the vice, placed it in a numbered slot and retrieved an uncut barrel.

Arcadio and Derek approached us and showed the two engravers sketches of a customer's specialised request for a hunting scene. They huddled as a surgeon might prepare a staff for an operation. Photographs of engraving examples were retrieved and studied to capture the spirit and mystique desired by their fortunate customer. A minor language problem arose. Ken's lovely fiance Melanie, who is fluent in Spanish, joined the conference and assisted in clarifying parts of the English-written letter. I looked at the sketches for the proposed engraving. Gorgeous! Then Arcadio said, in perfect English, "lunch!".

Our group entered the restaurant. Arcadio promised me an authentic Basque culinary experience. From my readings, I was familiar with the region's food: hearty mixes of peppers, lamb, fish, asparagus, beans and onions. I was looking forward to a memorable meal. I was also hoping to be brought current on Armas Kemen since the publication of Wieland's marvellously detailed work. In neither category was I disappointed.


The Basque ritual of the midday meal, which commences at about two in the afternoon, effortlessly extends two hours or more. Our group sat down at a heavy wooden table without linen but which had several baskets of warm chewy bread and three one-litre bottles of drinking water. In preparation for my trip, I had read selectively from Hubrecht Kuijker's lush book "The Wine Atlas of Spain". Since I would be visiting the Rioja region after leaving Eibar, I urged the group to select a bottle of Rioja or two. No one objected.

I love the Rioja wines, a mixture of the robust tempranillo and the earthy garnacha grapes. We chose two bottles: an elegant Apilanez 1989 En Crianza, which meant that it had been aged in wood a minimum of three years, and a 1994 Faustino V , which was a well-balanced and surprisingly smooth for such a young wine. I inhaled the aroma of the deep ruby liquid; a banquet for the eyes and olfactory system.

The lunch, selected by Arcadio, featured fresh pan-fried fish with roasted garlic and hot pepper sauce. It was delicious. At Arcadio's insistence, I joined him after the meal in a glass of Patxaran, a red sweet after-dinner Basque liqueur.

When he wasn't looking, with a quick burning gulp I swallowed a table of my required medication. If you've got to take medicine, I recommend this method.

Arcadio then invited me to partake in the ritual of dipping the unlit end of a cigar, in this instance, a rather harsh stogie from the Canary Islands, into the Patxaran liqueur and then inhaling the smoke fully. The melange of tastes was quite delicious. We ended the meal with a dense coffee of head-snapping bitterness that was so thick a spoon could almost stand in the liquid.

Derek began to speak about the history of Armas Kemen. Promptly, Arcadio began to make interjections. To fully understand the philosophy and soul of the Basque arms industry and the Kemen shotguns, I sensed that a person must first have insight into Basque history. I began to grasp that historical perspective as I listened to Arcadio and reviewed Wieland's book during my sleepless nights. Arcadio and his brother, Juan Cruz had, like roots from the grape vines, dug deep into the nutrient-rich soil of their Basque culture to create shotguns with their unique philosophy and style.

No truer expression of fierce Basque pride can be stated than Arcadio's prescient comment: "We are not Spanish gunmakers. We are not Latin. We are Basque!" He placed his glass of Patxaran on the table and rolled his hand into a fist to emphasise his point. The link to his roots is evident in the selection of the company's name: Kemen is Basque or Euskadi for "strength".

The Basques had populated the region for thousands of years, dating back to the Stone Age. Through modern times they were willing to suffer mightly for demonstrating their identity. During Franco's regime, for example, merely speaking their Basque language, Euskera, was made illegal, punishable by death.

The discovery of iron by the Romans in Bilbao, a city about forty kilometres west of Eibar, transformed the Bilbao-Eibar region into a major industrial centre. Eibar became Spain's traditional villa armera. By the mid-fifteenth century, groups of armaments manufacturers, collectively known as artilleria, were well established. Spanish steel for swords enjoyed a reputation, in Wieland's words, as the best in Europe, if not the world. From the early 1900's, almost half of the Spanish merchant fleet was constructed in the Basque provinces.

Spurred by the demand from European gunmakers, the transition from swords to barrelmaking was smooth, and gunmaking became the mainstay of the Basque Valley over the past four hundred years. The Spanish word for shotgun, escopeta, describing an unrifled sporting arm, emerged in the mid-17th century and is used to this day.

The seminal event that influenced Basque gunmaking toward the English style was the decisive Peninsula War battle in 1813, fought in Vitoria, the present capital of the Basque region, in which the Duke of Wellington defeated Napoleon's brother, Joseph Bonaparte. With London only six hundred miles from Bilbao across the Bay of Biscay, and the Basques tending to eschew relations with the Castilians in Madrid, commercial, banking and cultural ties with England flourished.


The English influence on Basque gunmaking was undiluted. The aristocracy of Basque gunmakers, building their weapons for the Spanish elite and their driven bird shooting on the Castilian plains, modelled their "Spanish Best" after those of the great English "best" game guns: side-by-side barrels, sidelocks, straight grip, splinter fore-end, double triggers and elegant scroll engraving. Spanish guns not sold domestically were exported almost exclusively to Britain.

Although it is the most industrialised region of Spain, renowned for its steel mills and large banks, the unique Basque cultural characteristics have contoured the structure of the arms trade into insular small shops and cottage industries. The soul and essence of Basque gunmaking is succinctly captured in Wieland's astute phrase "prideful independence".

True to their Basque independent nature, the Sarriugartes, Arcadio, his brother, Juan Cruz, and their father, Francisco, founded Armas Kemen. They sensed that a niche could be established in the market for top quality over-and-under Spanish target guns. Desiring to create a new market for different kinds of clients and different shooting sports, Kemen thus departed from the Basque gunmaking genius of high quality side-by-side double shotguns of the English style.

"Fine guns are great art, and great art

will always have a market", Arcadio said, with the help of Melanie's translation. In the Basque spirit of doing what others had done, but doing it

better, and for less money, the Sarriugartes, like a healthy organism, continued the process of regeneration and renewal.

Inspired by the spirited Italian doubles, with their clean, uncluttered and sophisticated lines and low barrel profile, Kemen sought to distinguish itself in the market between Perazzi and Fabbri or, in Derek's words, between the "elite" and the "super elite". The philosophy of Kemen was to adopt and then build upon Perazzi's well-deserved reputation for innovation. Versatility is the hallmark concept that guides Kemen. Their guns offer the shooter interchangeable barrels, stocks and removable trigger groups along with an array of custom features, such as elongated forcing cones, backbored barrels, choke tubes and exquisite engraving on their deluxe models that, in Derek's words, rival all but the most extraordinary expressions of Italian

Not without some dismay for not having sampled more of the Basque cuisine, we left the restaurant and returned to the factory. This time, when I walked through Arcadio's unassuming office, I made some notes. It was plain. The atmosphere was all business, a working man's environment, not there to impress visitors but to get things done. I felt comfortable. The small gun case behind the well-worn wooden conference table contained a collection of about half-adozen Sarriugarte shotguns produced under the direction of Arcadio's father prior to the founding of Armas Kemen. There was one jewel, a prototype of Kemen's newest addition to their product line, a twelve-gauge side-by-side whose wood and engraving were beyond elegant.

Arcadio accompanied me into the work

area again. I passed through a small antechamber cluttered with metal racks of bookkeeping files and a gun rack. Walnut wood blanks for stocks were stacked like grand slabs of stone on a rickety metal table. Awaiting the sculptor, each stock blank bore an identifying number. Some had outlines of the stock and forearm drawn in black magic marker. As if in perpetual motion, his light complected face framed with straight brown hair, Arcadio strode into the work area and then out again, his hands clutching work orders and photographs.

Juan Cruz materialised from the office and rumbled past me like a cuddly black bear. He has brown penetrating eyes, an untamed beard and dark hair that showed little acquaintance with a brush or comb. Papers waved from his left hand like flags in a breeze and a telephone seemed to grow from his right ear like an ominous fungus.

I stepped into the workroom again. Rows of white steel barrels were aligned in wooden racks on the bright blue benches against the wall. The barrels gleamed as the natural light diminished and the overhead lights became fluorescent more pronounced. I walked over to the stockmaker just as he placed his rasp on the table. He picked up a template of a stock pattern and a slim ruler, then held them against different sections of the unfinished stock. He made his calculations, pencilled in some marks on the stock and resumed shaping the wood.

The scent of walnut was delicious. As the wood was sculpted, dark curled shavings piled on the floor like a snowfall of mocha chocolate. The walnut, I learned, was primarily from the Valencia region of Spain. The finest walnut, used in the higher grade shotguns, come from Turkey. The final stock finishing was contracted out to a professional furniture company, where the incredible checkering, or picarando, of thirty-two lines per inch was done. There the wood is hand rubbed with oils and hardeners in dozens of applications in a process that requires about ten days to complete.

I turned to my left. One of the barrel fitters was whistling softly in concert with a tune coming from a portable radio on his bench. The Spanish song ended and suddenly the Beach Boys were singing about East Coast girls, I was beginning to feel at home!

I sniffed the air. The odour of a burning oil lamp was evident. Louis Tejero was working on fitting a trigger group just behind the stockmaker. Now my education about the inner workings of the Kemen was about to begin. A large selection of files, their wooden handles worn smooth from thousands of hours of use, was arrayed on his work area. Nearby were dozens of slivers of different grits of emery cloth coiled up like pieces of spaghetti.

Gun Fit and Alteration

'The following article is taken from a paper delivered by Mr Angelo Zappala of Queensland during Year 1 of his Level 3 Accreditation. The information contained in this article is very worthwhile and worthy reading. Once read check the data against your own shotguns fit.'

Murray Alexander, National Director of Coaching.

From time to time, coaches are asked by shooters, does my gun fit me? Because of the many variables associated with gun fit, some coaches who are not converse on the subject fully, pass the matter onto a suitable person such as a stockmaker or gunsmith, he feels suitable to answer and correct the problem.

However, the first step the coach should do is to have the shooter mount his or her gun and view the gun mount. I believe that a high percentage of shooters have never learnt to gun mount their gun correctly. If the shooters does not gun mount correctly, the coach should show the shooter by demonstrating the correct procedure. That is place the rear end of the gun butt under the armpit, close the gun in a horizontal position, then lift the gun muzzle to eye level, then lift the stock butt forward and up to the face so that the comb of the stock contacts the flesh part of the cheek under the cheek bone as padding and then the butt of the stock is pressed back into the shoulder pocket, formed by lifting the elbow off the master hand which grips the stock grip.

If the stock is too long, then the gun butt will be found to be mounted out on the shoulder point, also the shooters head will be canted to enable the shooters eye to get in line with the centre of the rib, which positions the bone of the cheek to bear on the top of the comb and on firing, the upwards camming action will give the shooter a sore face, which eventually leads to flinching.

Basically the gun fit and alterations of a factory made stock comes down to four corrections:

- 1) Correct Stock Pitch
- 2) Correct Length of Pull
- 3) Correct Drop at the Comb
- 4) Correct Eye Alignment to the Centre of the Rib

If a new recoil pad is to be fitted with these corrections, I recommend the use of the straight type of recoil pad over the use of the full type curve pad, as the straight type recoil pad is more forgiving in gun mounting.

To find the correct stock pitch for the shooter in question, have the shooter mount the gun as described before by bringing the stock comb up to the cheek and back into the shoulder pocket, if the toe of the recoil pad bears most of the contact on th shooters shoulder and the heel of the pad has little to no contact support, then the angle of the pad must be changed so that the full area of the pad comes into full contact into the shoulder pocket, so as the recoil of the gun can be distributed evenly over the whole area of pad contact.

To find this correct angle or pitch, loosen the two recoil pad retainer screws and pad out the top of the recoil pad from the heel of the stock with cardboard pieces and tighten the retainer screw lightly and re-check the gun to the shooter shoulder pocket until the pad feels comfortable and evenly supported over the shoulder pocket.

Now we have the correct pitch for our shooter, the next step to obtain the correct length of pull. This measurement is taken from the centre face of the trigger to the middle back section of the recoil pad or butt plate. This measurement is governed by the distance from the shooters thumb of the master hand which grips the stock grip to the shooters nose, the distance form the thumb which passes over the top of the stock grip to the shooters nose when in the mounted position should be from 1/2" to 3/4" would be a good fit.

In helping you to acquire the overall length of pull over many years of gun fitting stock to shooters I have used this table of measurement as a reference to come up with the right length of pull.

Measurement of Person	Length of Pull
5' to 5'4"	13" to 13 1/2" pull
5'4" to 5'8"	14" pull
5'8" to 6'	14 1/2" pull
6' to 6'4"	14 3/4" pull
6' to 6'8"	15" pull

Having worked out which length of pull would suit the shooter, subtract from this measurement the thickness of the recoil pad we are to fit and then add 1/16" to the measurement, this 1/16" will be used to clean up any squired marks left from the sawing of the stock by sanding back to the measurement we require.

Place masking tape around the stock butt in the area to be cut, measure from the centre face of the trigger back to the middle of the butt and mark the cut off length on the masking tape.

Place a straight edge on this mark and angle the straight edge to run parallel to the angle of the padded out recoil pad which fits the shooters shoulder. Now mark the cut off line on the masking tape and saw the stock off along this line, keeping this cut square to the end of the butt, now with

a sand block, sand back the butt base to the required measurement. Now centre the new recoil pad to the butt, drill and screw the recoil pad to the butt, sand down the excess rubber of the pad to blend in with the contour of the stock surface.

We now have the stock with the correct pitch and correct length of pull, our next step is to correct the drop at the comb and correct eye alignment to the centre of the rib.

The height of the comb should be such, that with the cheek resting firmly, not hard on the top of it, the whole of the rib should be seen. A simple and more definite method is to see by how much the line of sight, in this case from the pupil of the eye to the front sight, passes above the rear end of the rib or breech of the gun. For normal all-round shooting this line of sight should be between 1/4" to 3/8" above the rib at the rear, and dead centre along it.

If the stock comb is higher than the above measurement, then it is a simple task to reduce the comb height down to it. If the stock is too low, then the comb height can be corrected by either cutting off I." or so off the old comb depth and gluing on a matching piece of timber which is shaped to the new height and thickness for eye alignment to the centre of the rib. The more modern approach these days is to the installing of the adjustable comb to the stock which makes it easier to fit the stock to the shooter.

Stock bending is another way which is used by the gunsmith to bring the shooters eye in line with the centre of the rib. It can be also used to bend the stock upwards or downwards to obtain correct drop at the comb, if the correcting measurement is of a small nature. The secret in bending stocks is to leave the bent stock in the jig for at least two weeks before taking it out of the jig so as the wood fibres can harden in their new position.

Now we have the stock with the correct pitch, length of pull, correct height at the comb and correct eye line to the centre of the rib, when the gun is mounted you will find the gun very comfortable to mount and shoot.





Orange(#45) Dull cloudy days. Blocks blue light and enhances the orange of the target.



Sunset Orange(#49) Bright, hazy conditions. Slightly darker than orange to absorb scattered or stray blue light.



Ranger Bronze(#50) Very bright, hazy sunlight. Stray blue light absorbing qualities which enhance target outline.



<u>Light Purple(#47)</u> Combines grey and vermilion. It dampens the green and enhances the orange target against tall trees.



Pale Yellow(#48) The light colour tint allows this lens to be used indoors, outdoors, flat light, or at night.



Vermilion(#46) Highlights conditions where there is poor background such as trees. Enhances the target against the background.



Yellow(#43) For hazy, foggy days or late afternoon. This will block out much of the blue light.



Brown(#44) A blue blocking lens for bright open background and bright glarey days.



Clear(#42) For shooting indoors when no contrast between target and background is desired. Also, excellent for safety lens while hand loading.



Grey(#41) Transmits all colours at the same level. For use on bright days. Does not enhance target, just brings light down. Use in direct sun conditions.
