ATA TRAP

In my June notes I mentioned that there had been a change to rules for the conduct of 'The Grand American' and that we would clarify the position.

We have received word from the ATA that they will authorise the ACTA to conduct qualifying events on their behalf. What this means is the ACTA can authorise clubs to shoot events under the rules and conditions of the ATA.

This thereby enables anyone intending travelling to the 'Grand' in the future to compete and not shoot targets only as is now the case.

To qualify, shooters will have to shoot 1000 targets under ATA conditions in a twelve month period. It is envisaged that clubs who will conduct these qualifying matches will most probably shoot 200 targets in a day. The event must be shot by at least five shooters on the day.

Clubs wishing to conduct these events are asked to contact the office for full details re the running of these events and ATA membership.

GRAND AMERICAN TOUR 1999

It is still my intention to organise a tour to the 100th Grand American and will shortly include a form in the CTSN for anyone wishing information on the trip. The above paragraph will be of benefit to people wishing to attend.

1998 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"

360 Targets Double Trap - 325 Targets Olympic Trap - 325 Targets ISU Skeet.

After three years during which the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition has established itself as one of the most important olympic discipline clay target shooting competitions in the region, the organising committee have decided on a change of date and format for the "Grand Prix" in 1998.

In order to keep up with the recent good news that womens's trap and skeet events will be conducted at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney and in an effort to provide top quality competition for our international shooters early in the year prior to the commencement of the World Cup competitions, the 1998 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition will be held from

Saturday 14th February through to Saturday 21st February, 1998.

For the increasing number of double trap enthusiasts, the new format "Grand Prix" competition will see an extra double trap championship included in the program, increasing the number of double trap targets over the three days of the double trap competition to 360. Separate competitions will be conducted for men and women with new and upgraded perpetual trophies and prizes planned.

The good news for women, is that the 1998 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition will also cater for the new format women's events, with a total of five separate women's events programmed in 1998 in both the olympic trap and skeet disciplines. This alone will offer a terrific opportunity for our women shooters to gain some good competition amongst themselves in preparation for the long lead up to the Sydney Olympic Games, especially since Brisbane has now established itself as a recognised World Cup venue.

The preliminary program for the 1998 "Grand Prix" competition is:

Saturday 14th Feb - 60 Tgt Double Trap Badge Match - men and women.

Sunday 15th Feb - 150 Tgt Double Trap Championship - men; 120 Tgt Double Trap Championship - women.

Monday 16th Feb - 150 Tgt Double Trap Championship - men; 120 Tgt Double Trap Championship - women.

Tuesday 17th Feb - 75 Tgt Badge Match Olympic Trap - men and women; 75 Tgt Badge Match ISU Skeet - men and women.

Wed 18th/Thurs 19th Feb - 125 Tgt Olympic Trap Championship - men; 125 Tgt ISU Skeet Championship - men; 75 Tgt Olympic Trap Championship - women; 50 Tgt Olympic Trap Badge Match - women; 75 Tgt ISU Skeet Championship - women; 50 Tgt Olympic Trap Badge Match - women.

Fri 20th/Sat 21st Feb - 125 Tgt Olympic Trap Championship - men; 125 Tgt ISU Skeet Championship - men; 75 Tgt Olympic Trap Championship - women; 50 Tgt Olympic Trap Trophy event - women; 75 Tgt ISU Skeet Championship - women; 50 Tgt ISU Skeet Trophy event - women.

In addition to the new format and timing for the 1998 "Grand Prix", increased sponsorship is currently being negotiated to cater for the anticipated upgrading of trophies and prizes for the new events. As usual, pre-nomination for the 1998 competition will be required with entry forms being available shortly or at the OD Nationals. 





GOING FOR GOLD WITH BERETTA.


Over the years Beretta have become the most dedicated gunmaker in the world, committed to making fine guns for every application. Their acceptance and quality are second to none although price wise the Beretta guns are expensive - often the concession for a wide range of production and excellent quality! Beretta's 682 Gold Sporting sent for review was everything I expected, when it arrived. From its hard cover case and multitude of options and completely furnished with all required tools, at around \$3,400 it was certainly well presented - ready to shoot straight from its case!

Recently I have placed a greater emphasis on the performance of guns reviewed and from this perspective the 682 Gold performed beyond expectations - at the SSAA Keysborough range I shot a possible score at the "Birdbrain" with my first shots. This certainly gave me a very positive feeling about the gun, especially since I am usually more comfortable shooting a semi-automatic.




The Beretta Gold Sporting comes complete with all accessories, including gun socks, and its own combination locked hard case.

At a glance the gun looked great. The standard Beretta dark blue hard case supplied with the gun housed all accessories whilst the fawn gunsocks, for the separate stock and barrel set, provided a finishing touch. The Bruniton application to the barrels is by now a familiar feature of Beretta under and over shotguns. For those unfamiliar, this is a teflon-like coating applied to the barrels which has a high resilience to rusting. In fact the barrel need not be oiled in the manner "blued" barrels would need to be maintained. If the bruniton is scratched, a repair kit can be utilised to reinstate the bruniton whereas with a blued set of barrels the gun would need to be re-blued. Quite an expensive exercise. Beretta have introduced a new finish for the receiver of the 682 Gold - "Greystone". This is a grey/black finish




A tang mounted safety/barrel selector catch, split selective ejectors and a stylish design are typical of Beretta design.

that compliments the bruniton well. I have no information on its maintenance but feel this surface would need to be wiped clean with a lightly oiled patch to maintain its pristine condition. Gold inlaid scroll lettering is featured on both sides and beneath the receiver and compliments the gold plated trigger. Beretta have kept their embellishment of the receiver to a minimum, just enough to give the 682 Gold an air of elegance. The woodwork was perfectly matched with near faultless checkering - a hallmark of Beretta quality.


With an overall length of 47 1/4", (1200mm), and weighing 7lb 8 oz, (around 3.5 kg.), the barrels measured 29 1/2" and weighed in at 1.490 kg. Fitted with a 5mm, trap-style, parallel rib and a selection of three different front sights the Mobil, interchangeable, internal choke tube system was installed to

provide greater versatility for shooters. The provision of three different front sights was quite a pleasant addition for shooters have the choice of a large or medium red fluro sight or a medium white bead. These are easily installed by hand but care needs to be taken to align the thread. The addition of some Loctite 2000 will ensure a semi-permanent installation of a sight for this particular application has a "breakable" bond. Chambered for both 2 3/4" and 3" cartridges and proofed to 1200 Bar the forcing cones are as long as Italian proof laws allow, a recognised benefit for reduced perceived recoil.


Both barrels measured 0.722" which is quite tight for a 12 gauge gun, particularly since the trend with Japanese manufacturers is to overbore barrels. Beretta have obviously configured their barrels to what they consider to be optimal - the performance of their competition guns is certainly exemplary, so

they must be doing everything right! The mobil interchangeable choke tube system has also been with the 682 Berettas for many years. The bonus of these chokes is not only their greater versatility but their compatibility with steel shot loads. The five choke tubes supplied are labelled from cylinder through to full choke and, as shooters seem to favour an all-round gun, the compatibility of the 682 Gold with steel shot is certainly a bonus for waterfowl hunters.

The receiver with its "greystone" finish has been tastefully presented. Gone seem the days of over embellished, gaudy receivers. Beretta have adopted clean, stylish lines with a minimum of decoration for their competition guns. The replaceable shoulder and hinge pins are another long-standing feature of the 682 series. These facilitate re-jointing with the minimal amount of effort should it ever be required. The dual conical locking lugs wear-in as time passes. These are also available in over-size should their replacement ever be required. A non-reflective finish on the rearward section of the receiver provides an uninterrupted view over the barrels. A similar finish to the top lever also imparts a non-slip grip for positive operation. Upon closing the barrels to the action the 682 Gold locked-up smoothly and firmly, as would be expected of a new gun of Beretta's quality. A generously sized trigger guard and two off-




Overall, with its Bruniton finished barrels and silverstone receiver, the Beretta 682 Gold Sporting is a stylish gun any shooter would be proud to own.

set triggers, (one for a left handed shooter and the other for a right), were included as accessories. The trigger foot is removable and has three pre-set positions. Beretta have also generously provided a precision screw driver for this purpose. The safety and integral barrel selector were located on the tang beneath the top lever. A file-cut selector positively selected either barrel as desired - one red dot for the under barrel and two red dots for the upper barrel. Unlike a trap gun, a barrel selector is a necessity with a sporting clays gun particularly when facing driven targets, requiring the tightest choked barrel to be fired first. Beretta have acknowledged an earlier design problem and recessed the selector switch below the level of the safety catch. This is a pleasing modification.

The stock and woodwork were well matched with the schnabel forend providing a final, practical touch. Checkering, completed at 20 lines per inch, was well executed. Overruns were not evident and a double line border contained grips on the forend and pistol grip of the stock. A palm swell was installed on the right hand side of the pistol grip. This "hand-filling" feature

provides a fuller and firmer grip for increased control of the gun. The schnabel forend was sufficiently hand-filling and coupled with the hands-in-line alignment of the stock's pistol grip, afforded good, firm control whilst mounting and shooting. The stock of the Beretta 682 Gold Sporting was not as full nor "heavy" as other stocks reviewed on earlier models. This possibly placed the balance of the gun a little forward of the hinge pin - around 10mm. The gun felt beautifully balanced and as I was soon to realise, it fitted me perfectly. A convenient spanner was provided with the gun to remove the stock. This was simply achieved and enables the user to gain access to the boxlock mechanism for cleaning, or to quickly change to another stock for a different shooting situation. Both stock and forend were coated with a matte polyurethane-like finish. The stock had a solid, black rubber recoil pad fitted for comfort.

During field testing the Beretta 682 Gold Sporting performed exceptionally well. It obviously fitted perfectly for as mentioned earlier, I shot a possible 25/25 at "Birdbrain" when set on its highest level! Later, during a duck hunt, I managed to bag several birds with ease. During both outings the gun swung well, and of course, came to my shoulder as if made for me. A slight adjustment of the ejector timing was required and after this minor adjustment was completed the gold sporting functioned perfectly. A visit to Ballarat for a 50 target round of simulated field was a great test for the gun. Again my scores were more than respectable, after both rounds I had at some stage shot every target on the ground. A selection of 28 gram, 34 gram and 36 gram loads were fired through the Beretta without causing any undue discomfort from recoil. The chokes certainly performed their task well for targets were literally "turned inside out" - a very pleasing result for a gun straight out of its box.

For those who know our esteemed editor, Breil Jackson, his build is very different to mine yet the Beretta 682 Gold Sporting on test is his own gun - he also shoots well with the Beretta. It is always a pleasure to review and shoot a new Beretta model. Whether Beretta have come of age after surviving for over 400 years or they have matured with age, as with a good red wine, I can only say that coupled with a 5 year warranty the 682 Gold Sporting was a magnificent firearm to use, at whatever discipline. Although the Australian distributor's price is as good as any throughout the world the 682 models are not cheap. They are a well designed competition sporting arm that transforms many ordinary shooters into above average performers, and even world champions. Whilst I can highly recommend this gun for those who feel comfortable with its "feel" and balance there are others whom it might not suit. If you are a keen sporting clays shooter and you would like to aspire to the best, most could do no better than one of these Beretta 682 Gold Sporting superposed guns. They are destined for the winner's circle! Until next time, good luck and safe shooting!

A visit to one of the "Spanish Best": Armas Kemen

This article is continued from last month . . .

I watched in awe at the precision of Louis' work. He held the trigger assembly above the lamp's flame until the surfaces of the sides and top were blackened. He then fitted the group into the action. He opened and closed the action and pressed the trigger twice to set off each of the two inertia firing pins. He removed the trigger group and studied the tiny silvery surfaces where the black carbon had been worn away. "Aqui!" he said to me. "Here!" He pointed to a shiny line about the width of a hair.

Louis made a few short passes with a fine grit piece of emery cloth over the area where the carbon had worn away. Again he blackened the assembly and repeated the process. With unhurried focus, he worked the action, discharged the firing pins and removed the trigger group again. He repeated the operation, each time applying the emery cloth and removing the steel a thousandth of a millimetre at a time. He did not stop the blackening and filing until no carbon wore off when the action was operated several times. Only then did he accept that the trigger group fit perfectly.

I started to walk over to the man working on the actions, but John interrupted. Time to get back to the hotel, he said. Fine by me, I thought. I needed to work on organising my notes, do more reading and, if possible, take a short nap before dinner. We were scheduled to visit the factory the next morning, so I would have the opportunity to speak to the other workers. I patted Louis on the shoulder and thanked him for allowing me to observe his work.

The next morning brought more insights into the making of a "Spanish Best" escopeta. In the sun-dappled light, I stood next to Antonio Ballesteros, the craftsman entrusted with what Wieland described as one of the most demanding skills in gunmaking, action filing. The technique is "todo a mano" Antonio told me, his eyes glittering in exultation, "totally by hand". He asked me to touch the gleaming receiver and the sideplate. On the mirror-like surface I could see the reflection of my hand.

On a whim, I picked up a double barrel that was leaning against the wall near him, held it at the action end and let it hang down. With my free hand I snapped my fingernail against the middle section of one of the barrels. A clear bell-like tone resulted. I repeated this pinging up and down the length of the barrel. Each time the resulting tone was melodic and clean. No dead spots in the welding, I concluded.

I watched Antonio as he opened and closed the action repeatedly, firing the trigger, then placed the action in the vice. Alternating between files and emery cloth pressed against a file's blade for concentrated force and control, he made a few sharp strokes against the glistening steel. He removed the action from the vice, cocked it, set off the first firing pin, then gently tapped the action with his fist until the second spring was cocked. He performed this process ten repetitions. I counted. With his forefinger and a middle finger, Antonio then touched the steel surfaces that were rubbed by the moving parts of the action.

Trusting sensory neurons tuned by thousands of touches, he felt their cold smoothness, then placed the action back in the vice and applied four or five precise strokes with the file and additional strokes with the emery cloth. With a blast from an air compressor, he cleaned the dust-like metal filings from the action. He repeated the entire tedious sequence again and again until he was satisfied. ON the average, one action is completed each day. Aware of my interest, Antonio stopped for a moment and handed me an assembled shotgun that he had just completed. Its receiver had not yet been blued. I opened and cocked the action. It closed with a reassuring solid velvety "thunk".

The steel, I was told, came from Bilbao. Kemen uses steel that is graded higher than standard "bellota" steel. Under Kemen's direction, their steel is hardened with a special formula of chrome and nickel alloys to achieve the highest standards of strength and resilience. I remembered that the previous day Juan handed me a shotgun that had been used as a "demo" model. It had fired about seventy thousand rounds, he said. It opened as smoothly as the new ones hot off the rack. I saw no signs of wear.

I shook Antonio's hand and said goodbye. I crossed the work area, went to Pedro Arreitunandia and greeted him again. "Hello, Michelangelo!" He responded with a warm smile. We resumed our discussion from yesterday. The receiver he was working on featured birds in flight in realistic fine shallow engraving.

He strives to create something personal, he told me, seeking to transmute other styles into his unique interpretation. Pedro's home is by the water, about twenty kilometres from Eibar. In his living room overlooking the Gulf of Biscay, he sits, stares and dreams of engraving styles. He told me that his wife asks what he's thinking about. "Engraving", he answers. New styles, new patterns, how to improve. He is never satisfied.

"Siempre mejorando", he told me, allowing me a glimpse of his soul.

"Always improving." Pedro loves his craft. He studies constantly to get better. Each piece must be better than all previous ones, he told me. "Siempre mejorando", he repeated. "Always getting better."

Pedro raised his hands prayerfully. His work is a hobby, he confided. "Me gusta mucha", he reiterated throughout our conversation. "I like it very much." He articulated a sentiment about his profession that I cannot remember ever having heard expressed by anyone. "Estoy contento." "I am content", he said. He brought his hands together. "Tengo mucho suerte." A humble smile bloomed on his delicate face. "I am very lucky." I know few people that would make that statement, even though it would be justified.

I hugged Pedro, envying his serenity and skill. Perhaps some day, I told him, he will create a masterpiece for me. "I hope so", he told me. I bid him farewell. Our group left the Kemen factory and joined Arcadio for a lunch of grilled steak and peppery fried fish, potatoes smothered with cabbage and another bottle of Rioja.

Arcadio had offered to take us to San Sebastian for the afternoon to do some international trap and bunker shooting. I was looking forward to that opportunity. I had never tried those sports. Prior to the trip to Spain, John had sent me a gorgeous KM-4 twelve gauge to demo. I had tried the Kemen with several different reload recipes at the Cherry Creek Shooting Club's ten-stand sporting clays range. I was particularly impressed with the performance and low recoil of the one-ounce and the seven-eighth ounce "international" loads. I awaited the challenge of utilising similar loads and testing my modest skills on the faster European-style clays. It was not to be. The weather was hostile. A dense blanket of fog along with intermittent rain rolled in from the sea.

The afternoon passed quickly. For our last few hours together, John and I migrated to the smoky bar of the Hotel Arrate. We talked late into our last evening in Eibar. He share his philosophy on shotguns, his love of shooting and how he interweaves the sport with his charity work. He also offered his vision of Kemen's future. To survive, John opined, Kemen must maintain its fastidious pursuit of perfection. Kemen is increasing its product line. It has begun to produce over-and-under target guns in twenty gauge and twenty-eight gauge in addition to the classical English side-by-side in those gauges.

John's eyes glittered with intensity as he spoke. A shooter should not buy a Kemen, he emphasised, if the shotgun is seen as no more than a less expensive copy of an English or Italian "best" model. That would be unfair to all the manufacturers. The Kemen stands on its own unique merits and qualities, he added. I saw how the guns were made and thus, between sips of bitter Basque beer, I felt justified in nodding in agreement.

I disclosed that Juan Cruz had taken my measurements for a gun. Juan had kept poking me, pushing my head higher, "alta", or lower, "baja", exchanging gun after gun, until the sighting plane was exactly correct, the length of pull exact and the drop at the comb just right. Juan had scribbled the measurement numbers on a scrap of paper and then stuffed it into a dusty file box.

I shrugged. "Just in case", I told John. We are taught to save for a rainy day, I mused, but we're not given much guidance to know when that rainy day is soon to be upon us. It's all a crapshoot, I figured. Based on experiences in my line of work, there is one truism I have reluctantly come to accept which may prompt a little more indulgence on my part: Go first class or your executors will!

Many shooters will say that the Kemen and its ilk are extravagant. No doubt! Who among us has not seen talented shooters consistently run incredible scores with modestly-priced auto loaders? But one doesn't hang on El Greco or a Goya merely to cover a bare patch on the wall. The Kemen is an expression of the soaring human spirit's striving to create beauty and achieve excellence. The gun's proud owner possesses more than a shotgun; he or she has a small wavelength in the prism of noble Basque history.

It was almost midnight. John and I clinked our glasses and called it a night. We caught each other glancing at our watches. We flashed a knowing grin. Neither of us had reset our timepieces since leaving the States. I was subtracting eight hours and John, who lives in California, was subtracting nine. We each knew what the other was thinking about: family. My children were just getting home from school and preparing for soccer practice, soon they would be hurtling up and down the field, yelling and kicking, and I would be holding them in ninety-two hours, but who's counting!

For an instant, the thoughts of my children and those about my visit to the Kemen factory intersected. In this conflicted and difficult world, how does one raise a child to achieve wisdom and confidence as well as a passion for beauty and excellence? My visit to Eibar provided at least a partial answer. As in building a Kemen, you raise them with love and patience, with skill and with respect for tradition, a thousandth of a millimetre at a time.

1997 NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISU Skeet and rounds of 25 Pair for Open/Jnr Double Trap and 20 Pair for Womens Double Trap.
3. Nominations to be received by the time of 3pm of the day prior to the beginning of the Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director. All squads shall be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
5. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.
6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated as scorer/referee or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the services of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role SHALL INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed Jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
14. High gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for high gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective high gun.
15. Women and Juniors shooters only are eligible for their section as well as the open event.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Practice of card playing at the Nationals Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas, or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
18. The UIT Rules will be used to determine the OA placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.
19. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. I am in compliance with State licensing laws in my State of residence and in the State where this competition is being conducted.







Olympic Update (2) - Sydney 2000

Olympic Co-Ordination Authority

O.C.A., the Olympic Co-Ordination Authority charged with the responsibility of delivering the Sydney International Shooting Centre at Cecil Park, on time for S.O.C.O.G. to conduct an Olympic test event prior to the Games in September 2000, is well advanced with its planning.

A Draft Design Facility Brief has been put to tender with those on the short list given a comprehensive briefing on what is required by O.C.A.. Each of the short list tenderers has been invited to submit a design concept based upon the Draft Facility Brief, following which O.C.A. will contract the design for the Sydney International Shooting Centre.

The Shooting Centre will be equipped for the Olympics with electronic targets with 60 firing points on the 50m range, 10 groups of five targets on the 25m range, three Running Target ranges, three Olympic shotgun ranges, plus a 10-position Finals Hall for Pistol-Rifle and Running Target.

Present plans call for a preliminary concept design to be prepared by late August. The preliminary design will then be submitted to the U.I.T. Executive Committee for comment when they meet in September in Lugano, Switzerland, during the Rifle-Pistol & Running Target World Cup Finals. The final design is scheduled for completion by December 1997. Earth moving is planned to commence in January 1998, with the shooting centre planned for completion in mid-1999.

Pre-Olympic Test Event

S.O.C.O.G. will be conducting a test event at Cecil Park prior to the Games in September 2000. Preliminary discussions have already taken place with the U.I.T. in regard to the timing of the test event. A Decision in this regard will most likely be delayed until O.C.A. have completed their design for the shooting centre, an action on their part which will tie in closely with plans to have the shooting centre fully operational in mid-1999.

A Memorandum of Understanding between S.O.C.O.G. and the Australian Shooting Association for the conduct of the test event was signed by the President of the Australian Shooting Association, Mr. Alistair Macpherson, O.A.M., at a meeting of the A.S.A. Management Committee in Brisbane on 14th June.

Sydney International Shooting Centre

The Olympic Co-Ordination Authority is commissioning a report of the Sydney International Shooting Centre as part of a management feasibility study of the facility post Olympics. With shooting never before so well positioned in relation to obtaining a first class shooting facility for all of the Olympic disciplines, and then at a later date 300m Rifle, the future benefits offered to shooting are inestimable. Hopefully they will not be underestimated by those who are consulted during the preparation of the report to O.C.A.. U.I.T. Secretary General, Horst Schreiber, visited Australia in June attending the U.I.T. World Cup in Brisbane, which was well attended and well organised by the World Cup Organising Committee. Following his visit to Brisbane, Horst Schreiber visited Sydney for a series of meetings with S.O.C.O.G. and O.C.A., each of which were extremely productive.

O.C.A. conducted a site inspection at Cecil Park, which suitably impressed the U.I.T. Secretary General, confirming the opinion offered by those who have inspected the site to date. Meetings which followed also confirmed that U.I.T.'s belief that O.C.A. is extremely well positioned to deliver the shooting complex on time, particularly so when compared to Atlanta in a much later time frame.

U.I.T.

The U.I.T. plans to appoint its Technical Delegates at a meeting of the Executive Committee in Lugano in September. With O.C.A. advising Horst Schreiber that they require U.I.T. technical advice prior to September to ensure the completion of the preliminary design by the end of August, and final design by the end of

December Gary Anderson, U.I.T. Vice-President, Competition Manager at Atlanta, has been authorised by the U.I.T. to provide O.C.A. with interim technical advice pending the appointment of Technical Delegates.

Gary is well known to shotgun shooters, having served the U.I.T. as Technical Delegate to the World Shotgun Championships in Perth 1991. Gary, a dual Olympic gold medallist in 300m Rifle, will visit Sydney in early August to consult with O.C.A. and also to meet with S.O.C.O.G. on matters pertaining to S.O.C.O.G.'s preparations for shooting in 2000.

Olympic Shooting Events

Two new events, Womens Trap and Skeet, have been announced by the I.O.C. for Sydney. The addition of these two new events increases the number of medal events for 2000 from 15 to 17, which is an excellent result for shooting.

Olympic Shooting Quotas

Exact quota numbers for Sydney are yet to be confirmed by the I.O.C. It is clear, however, that the 405 quotas plus 25 I.O.C. Wild Cards that applied in Atlanta will be affected by the addition of the two new Womens events. With the I.O.C. confining the number of participating athletes for Sydney to 10,200, at the same time adding additional sports and events to the Olympic program, Atlanta's quotas (Men 280, Women 125 plus 25 I.O.C. Wild Cards) will not be added to for Sydney, with the probability being that reductions will occur to the number of shooting's quotas for 2000.

The number of quotas per event as shown for Atlanta will also be affected by the introduction of the two new Womens shotgun events.

Notwithstanding the decision to confine the number of athletes in 2000 to 10,200, shooters competing in Sydney will be eligible to contest additional events for which their country has either not exceeded their level of entries or does not have a quota place, providing that they have shot the Minimum Qualifying Score (M.Q.S.) for the additional event.

The first of Sydney's quotas are expected to be won in November of this year, when six quotas, Mens/Womens Trap, Skeet and Double Trap, will be determined at the World Shotgun Championships in Peru. Details of the I.O.C./U.I.T. quota system and M.Q.S. scores for 2000 will be provided as soon as confirmed details become available.

Shooting Updates

As it is my intention to continue to provide the Australian Shooting Association, and also the New Zealand Shooting Federation, with regular updates on shooting's Olympic progress for distribution to their affiliated bodies, my next report to shooters is scheduled to be forwarded to the A.S.A. and N.Z.S.F. on or around 1st October.

On a personal note, I will be relocating to Sydney on 4th August to fulfil my role as Competition Manager - Shooting for the Olympic Games in September 2000, and Paralympic Games in October 2000.

I look forward during this time to working on behalf of S.O.C.O.G., the Sydney Organising Committee for the Olympic Games and S.P.O.C., the Sydney Paralympic Organising Committee, for the overall success of the Olympic and Paralympic Games, with particular emphasis on shooting's participation.

Editor's Mailbox

Dear Sir

The following account relates to a re-loaded 12 gauge cartridge 'hanging fire' for several seconds, which I advise to alert other shooters that a mis-fire should be treated with extreme caution.

As with other shooters who witnessed the incident, I had read many years ago, that it could happen with a modern cartridge, but in a 'lifetime' of shooting had never seen it happen.

At a recent Field & Game Association simulated shoot, a competing member fired at the first target of a double, then swung onto his second target. He flinched slightly as other members of the squad heard the mechanism of his gun click, but the cartridge did not fire. Lowering the gun from his shoulder, he turned his head toward the referee and said: "I had a mis-fire". Before the referee could take the gun to examine it, the gun which was held with the shooters hand well clear of the trigger guard, discharged. The unexpected discharge caused the gun to be thrown from his hand onto the ground.

The shooter involved is an excellent shot of very wide experience and has assured me that his reloading components are stored with the utmost care.

What I recall reading all those years ago was never to open the

gun for at least ten seconds after a misfire, and then to throw the cartridge as far away as possible. It makes good sense.









Event one was a 25t cash divided and 18 shooters shared in the cash.





The Origins of Skeet Shooting

For close to 20,000 members of the National Skeet Shooting Association, shattering clay targets is a way of life ... exercise of the body, mind and the soul.

Through winter and summer they shoot at millions of targets - breaking most of them - meet new people and travel across the U.S.

It all started on the grounds of the Glen Rock Kennels in the town of Andover, Massachusetts in 1920. It was there and then that a small group of upland game hunters, including the late C.E. Davies, proprietor of the Glen Rock Kennels, his son Henry W., and the late William H. Foster, all of Andover, were shooting at clay targets as a means of obtaining wing-shooting practice with their favourite upland guns. Their shooting gradually developed into a regular program that gave each shooter the same series of shots so that the competition, which was inevitable, might be even.

Originally, the arrangement was a complete circle of twenty-five yards radius with the circumference marked off like the face of a clock. The trap was set at "12 o'clock" and was set to throw the targets over "6 o'clock". The competitive program consisted of shooting two shots from each of the twelve stations. The shell that was left over from a box was used, first as a stunt, to shoot at an incomer from the center of the circle. This later proved to be a shot offering real snap-shooting practice and has since developed into the plan of Station Eight shots of the regulation program.

"Shooting around the clock" as it was informally called, had most of the elements of modern skeet shooting. But, a commonplace incident then occurred that had a distinct bearing on the present day program. In "shooting around the clock", shots were fired to all points of the compass, until a neighbour started a chicken farm in a lot adjoining the kennels. That put a stop to shooting in that direction. Foster solved the problem by producing a second trap and placing it at "6 o'clock" so that it would throw its target over "twelve". This gave the shooter the same problems as were found in the original clock-face, but reduced the danger area by half.

Noting the appeal of this form of shooting, Foster became convinced that development of the idea could be made nationally acceptable. He therefore set about to complete a shooting program that would contain all the necessary elements of wing-shooting practice and a competitive sport. Among the additions were the four sets of doubles and the optional shot.

When the details of the sport had been worked out and tested, and a set of rules drawn up, the idea was introduced to the public in the February 1926 issue of both National Sportsman and Hunting and Fishing magazines. At the same time, a prize of \$100 was offered for the most appropriate name for the new sport. It was won by Mrs. Gertrude Hurlbutt of Dayton, Montana, who suggested "Skeet", an old Scandinavian form of the word "shoot". Some 10,000 entries were received in the contest.

The American shooter was apparently ready and waiting for a practical form of wing-shooting with the shotgun that would give

an opportunity to test their skill any month of the year on a series of shots similar to those encountered in hunting and, as evidenced by the popularity of skeet shooting today, it has far exceeded the expectations of its sponsors.

As the popularity of the sport grew, the forming of a National Skeet Shooting Association was inevitable. This came about and the first National Championship Shoot was held August 26-31,



1935, at Cleveland, Ohio. The 12 gauge (then called the all gauge) entry in that shoot totaled 113 participants. This tournament became an annual fixture, being rotated around the country - St. Louis, Detroit, Tulsa, San Francisco, Indianapolis and the last championship under the original association was held at Syracuse in 1942. Skeet became nonexistent during World War II insofar as civilian shooters were concerned. Equipment and ammunition were unavailable. Most of the participants had gone to war. Gun clubs ceased to operate and many disappeared completely. However, the government quickly recognized the value of the sport in gunnery training and all branches of the armed forces relied on skeet to teach servicemen the principle of leading moving targets. Many of the great civilian shooters rushed into the service and most of them were used as instructors.

With the end of the world conflict, a dedicated group of skeet enthusiasts officially brought the sport back to the public with organization and incorporation of the present National Skeet Shooting Association in December, 1946. This new association was financed in the beginning by a substantial, no-interest loan from the National Rifle Association. The National Championship Shoot was resumed at Indianapolis in 1946 and it has been held annually ever since.

Soon after the new organization was formed, the national headquarters was moved to Dallas, Texas from Washington, D.C. Dallas also was designated for a time as the permanent home of the association, including the annual national tournament. Due to a number of circumstances, the permanent home policy was abolished in 1952 and since that time the tournament, officially name "World Championships", has been staged at Reno, Nevada; Waterford, Michigan; Lynnhaven, Virginia; St. Janvier, Quebec; Rush, New York; Savannah, Georgia; Bucyrus, Kansas; and San Antonio, Texas. September 1, 1973 the association headquarters was moved to the site of the National Gun Club at San Antonio, Texas.

In addition to the regular skeet shooting program of 12, 20, and 28 gauge, .410 bore and doubles, there are the international style and the collegiate divisions, both with specifically designed regulations.

The international style features the previous low-gun position and variable-timing target release, required by NSSA rules up to 1952. Contrasted to the present checked gun position, this style is required by the International Shooting Union, a worldwide shooting organization, and the International Olympic Committee, producer of the Olympic Games, where skeet shooting was first included on the program in 1968.

His weekend starts at 2am Saturday. He has breakfast, organises himself and heads off on the two and a half hour drive to Perth airport to catch the morning plane. Our weekend starts at 8am Saturday. We have breakfast, organise ourselves and head off on the five minute drive to the club.

We go through the introductions and have a bit of a chat to get the "Hi, how's it going?" over with. What are we going to cover first? How about some DTL?

Using the time before each target to prepare yourself as a point that was mentioned often. The importance of physical fitness, psychological training and conditioning and mental preparation was emphasised. Tips on how to prepare for the weeks leading up to a major competition were discussed.

What are we shooting tomorrow?

The day finishes with the promise of greater things to come, using the skills shown today. We take our visitor home and ply him with a good feed of desert T-bone, some good conversation and wash it all down with a small amount of the fermented grape.

Sunday arrives with superb weather conditions. Everyone starts the day with the calendered competition, the usual eye opener and 50 pointscore club championship. The competition is fierce, the juniors are putting on the pressure, some outsiders are putting on the pressure, the skills are put into practice.

After lunch it's straight into Skeet training, the emphasis being on breaking the target where it is most vulnerable. Time is spent with each of the shooter's problem targets and these are tackled with simple and constructive control methods. In the afternoon we all switch to some sporting, using some battues, rockets, a quartering crosser and the skeet traps.

The training comes to an end as light is starting to fade. We take our visitor home to a cup of good Italian coffee and another good feed washed down with a swig of fruit juice, we all have to drive.

Our weekend finishes at 9pm when we put him on the evening plane to Perth and drive the ten minutes back home. His weekend finishes after the one and a half hour flight and the return two and a half hour drive to his home and his wife.
