

SYDNEY 2000 OLYMPICS

I recently travelled to Sydney and met with officials of the Olympic Co-ordination Authority and visited the construction site at Homebush Bay and then the Cecil Park Clay Target Club where the proposed venue for shooting was fully detailed to us, including details of the trap and skeet layouts.

There is no doubt that many people will be required to act as officials in the shooting competition and as soon as details of requirements become available, we will print them in the CTSN so that anyone wishing to act in any capacity will be able to take steps to nominate. A great aspect of the proposed site will be the construction of a public viewing area for anyone wishing to see any of the finals.

NATIONAL GUN LAWS

By now everyone should be well aware that "National Gun Laws" will not exist, but a few similarities will from State to State. It appears that the Gun Buy Back was not all that successful in most States, or, if it was, then the number of firearms owned in Australia was grossly over estimated.

It is still hoped that one positive to come from the new laws around Australia will be that competitive shooters will be able to travel from State to State to compete in the future without the necessity to obtain temporary licences or permits.

This was promised by Police Ministers in the beginning, but it seems that some States have ignored this and will still require temporary permits, either for firearms, or for shooters. Another aspect that is of concern is the constant rumours that there seems to be a distinct push in some States to stop persons under the age of 18 from shooting.

It is hoped that this is only as stated, rumour. Wonder what the reaction would be if all persons under the age of 18 were not allowed to ride bicycles due to the potential risk of serious accident.

Cohuna Clay Target Club

Cohuna Clay Target Club was the host club for the 1997 North West Zone School Persons Shoot. This event, which is held with the assistance of Winchester Australia and the VCTA, is one of the main ways that the junior shooters of the state can gain recognition and then proceed to higher levels of competition. All this type of competition needs encouragement. Thank you Winchester.

The event was held on 14th August with 152 students from 22 schools joining in the competition. Thank you to the schools who travelled long distances to help make the day such a success. The numbers were slightly down on last year but this seemed mainly due to the junior license problems. With the encouragement of the schools and clubs this shouldn't be a problem next year.

The North West Zone officials were assisted on the day by Rod Laidlaw from Winchester and President of the ACTA Glenn Woodhatch who presented the sash and medallions at the end of the days events.

The Overall winner on the day was Jarrod Fletcher from Cohuna Secondary College who shot 19/20. Good shooting Jarrod.

Casey Fletcher, Jarrod Fletcher, Margaret Peatling and Ian Trevena (Cohuna Secondary College) made up the winning team shooting 63/80. Following closely behind was the Kaniva team.

The Senior boys was won by Luke Cassells 17/20 (Maryborough), followed by T. Greenwood 20/25 (Maryborough) and then J. Madden 19/25 (Kaniva).

Senior girl Margaret Peatling 14/20 (Cohuna) was the winner in a close competition from T. Dimasi 13/20 (Mildura) and K. Deckett 11/20 (Kaniva).

Junior boys was decided with a shoot off in front of the crowd of spectators and students. Melissa Puiatti 16/25 (Kerang) was the eventual winner. Second L. Dimasi 15/25 (Mildura) and third A. Papst 13/25 (Warracknabeal).

Congratulations to all the students who participated. Your behaviour, gun handling and safety was a credit to all the schools you represented. Thank you to all who assisted on the day, the teachers, the parents, the scorers and referees, the Cohuna Club members and the North West Zone for co-ordinating the day, as these types of events don't just happen. After receiving an invitation from His Royal Highness, Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah at the World Cup held in Brisbane, we were extremely privileged to hold a Junior Training Camp in conjunction with the Asian Clay Shooting Championships.

The team consisted of Nathan Cassells, Derek Bruce and Craig Henwood (Trap & Double Trap); Lisa Smith, Susan Milroy and Nessa Jenkins (Women's Double Trap); George Barton, Kris Jones and Michael Wenzel (Skeet), Murray Alexander (Coach) and Graham Michell (Team Manager).

We were exceptionally lucky to be able to train on the most luxurious, modern and best planned shooting facility in the world. The facilities were beyond comparison and the hospitality and friendship shown to us by His Royal Highness and the people of Brunei (especially Heather and Ian Hale) made our trip one that we will never, ever forget.

Given that the grounds, targets and equipment were virtually perfect as was the administration and ground staff with electronic scoreboards, it is entirely up to the best prepared team of shooters who will come out top at any competition held here.


There is to be a World Cup held here next year and the valuable lessons that Murray and I have picked up whilst on this Training Camp should be of a great benefit to our Team who will be going there to participate.

Our accommodation at the Centre Point Hotel was extremely comfortable and was close to all shopping that was required and with tennis and squash courts and swimming pools available.

The food was very plentiful and very rich with sumptuous desserts and it would be very easy to put on weight if you were not careful.

The cost of living in Brunei is very high with most things being dearer than they are in Australia.

There were also so many activities available, soccer matches and polo matches to watch, jungle walks to go on and of course the theme park, Jerudong Park Playground all of which are free of charge (except the jungle walks) and are readily accessible with the first class ground transport organised for the teams.

Most of the Asian countries who participated graciously accepted our being there but I felt a few were a bit apprehensive when they heard that the Australian shooters were coming to participate at the Championships, but when they realised it was only our Juniors and not our Senior Team and that they were only there to gain overseas competition experience, we were then accepted and made to feel welcome in the competition.

Many valuable lessons were learned by the whole Team from the Manager and Coach down to the competitors. The climatic conditions were extremely strength sapping with the temperatures around 32 to 35 degrees, but with a humidity reading in the high 80's to low 90's, and shooting into a background of differing coloured jungle greens and light conditions all took getting used to.

The grounds were equipped with the most modern Mattarelli traps, phonopull systems on the skeet were also used which takes out the human error on instantaneous targets, and this caught many a shooter out with 21.5 being the average score on the skeet grounds. All targets were virtually perfect and were thrown to the proper distance and height and the trap targets going the full 80 metres. A lot of countries and clubs in Australia will still not throw

Brunei is a very rich and exciting place, a very religious Muslim country with extremely strict laws of behaviour with many glittering domes mosques and beautiful rain forest scenery.

Our trip started on Thursday 7th August, we all assembled at Brisbane's International Airport where we were to board the Royal Brunei Airline 767 for our flight to Brunei via Darwin. The airline is extremely popular and fully booked at all times. The Manager of Royal Brunei Airlines met me at the airport to make sure that all of our arrangements were ok, and the Customs were extremely helpful with the

world. It is a very beautiful and luxurious venue and it is open 7 days a week. In the heat and excitement it was pretty hard trying to keep up with all the young team members with them going on most of the rides available. The majority of the rides being far too hair raising for me to even contemplate going on and when we left there at 11pm we had many excited but very tired team members who


wanted to go back at a later date for another go on the rides. We did let them loose here again but only at the end of the competition.

Sunday 10th August was official trap training and Team Managers meeting, the meeting was held in one of the wings of the Shooting Complex clubhouse, very luxurious and equal to any government meeting room in the world with coffee, tea and refreshments and finger food being served during the meeting, this was supplied to all competitors, officials and workers throughout the competition (breakfast, lunch and afternoon tea) courtesy of His Royal Highness.

Sunday evening we were welcomed to a dinner hosted by His Royal Highness at the Polo Club at Jerudon Park; this we all got dressed up for and it is occasions such as this I wish every Team member had a full dress

uniform i.e., blazers etc. When we entered the hall we were split up and placed at different tables, 2 or 3 of us scattered about at different tables as were all of the other competing teams.

I don't believe there could be a more lavish or luxurious dining hall anywhere in the world for the silk carpets, silver cutlery, crystal glassware, the chandeliers and the gold leaf painted ceilings etc., plus every type of food and desserts that you could wish for. We were entertained by local women singers and an Egyptian male vocalist, the Prince being very fond of Egyptian music. We were also entertained by the Team Manager and members of the

minimum of delay when checking the guns.

On arrival in Brunei (11pm) we were met by the organising officials and Ian Hale, once again Customs were most obliging and with all paperwork in order once again we had a speedy transit through Immigration and Customs. The only drawback we encountered was three suitcases missing - Murray Alexander, Lisa Smith and Kris Jones being the owners. Murrays bag was returned within 24 hours; his bag being left in Brisbane because he only had 1 hour and 20 minutes from his flight in from Perth to catch the flight to Brunei and this I believe was the cause for his 'lost' bag. Much more time is needed between flights for baggage transfers. Lisa and Kris's bags were left on the plane at Brunei and ended up in Heathrow Airport, London, but were returned within two and a half days after being found in London, proving that the airlines are very helpful at chasing down 'lost' baggage. Lisa was relieved at her case being found but it also proved a valuable lesson that all overseas travellers should take at least one set of clothes in their hand luggage for emergencies.

Friday 8th August saw the whole Team having a rest and checking out the hotel and surrounding area and then in the evening going to watch a soccer match between his Royal Highness' team and a team made up of television and radio celebrities - this was a fun game and it is not very often you would see a member of Royalty playing a full game of soccer. Soccer is the most loved sport in Brunei with Ian Hale being in one of the Prince's teams.

Saturday 9th August we all went to have our first glimpse of the shooting range and some unofficial practice for the trap shooters.

Saturday evening saw Murray, Lisa and Kris head off to the airport to retrieve their bags and I took the rest of the team to the Jerudong Park Playground which is unmistakably and undoubtedly one of the main attractions in Brunei, a gift from His Majesty the Sultan, to the people of Brunei Darussalam, offering amusement, entertainment and rides for all ages, rivalling the theme parks of the United States and here they are free of charge! The theme park covers some 40 acres of land and has every ride known all over the





Kuwait Team with impromptu dancing and clapping to the music, this was a very enjoyable evening.

Monday 11th August we were out at the Shooting Range

very early in anticipation of the Opening Ceremony and the first targets of the Trap competition. As soon as we arrived at the grounds in the bus we all went in to breakfast in the huge fully air conditioned tent that was used as a canteen for the duration of the competition and once again the variety of the food was spectacular. I have never seen prawns cooked in so many different ways.

The Opening Ceremony was shot and to the point with a march past by all participating countries, a few speeches and a spectacular unveiling of the Asian Shooting Championships logo with multi coloured smoke flares and

numerous balloons, very colourful in this opulent setting with hundred of thousands of potted plants adorning the grounds.

Our three Trap shooters shooting very well in the conditions, their scores in the low 20's.

Tuesday 12th August, this saw the last 50 targets of the Trap competition and the best Australian was Derek who shot a 110/125 while Nathan shot a 108/125 and Craig shot a 106/125. These scores would give Derek equal 21st in the overall competition, Nathan equal 26th placing and Craig equal 31st. Un-official Double Trap and Skeet practice was held after the presentation ceremony with everyone returning to the hotel very tired.

Wednesday 13th August was official Double Trap training day and the evening was spent relaxing in anticipation of the coming day's competition.

Thursday 14th August and the hard conditions were starting to show on all competitors with most of the scores being down in the Women's Double Trap except for the top six places. Lisa ended up shooting 96/120 which would have given her ninth place overall, Susan shot an 83/120 which would give her 20th position and Nessa shot a 77/120 giving her 21st place overall.

Nathan came in the best of the boys with a 124/150 while Craig shot a 122/150 and Derek only managed a 98/150. Overall their placings would have been Nathan equal 15th, Craig equal 18th and Derek 32nd. China winning the Double Trap for Men with a 187/200 and the Women with a 143/160.

After the presentation of the Double Trap medals, the Skeet boys had a round of un-official practice and then we all went out to the Polo Club again for the Farewell Dinner hosted by the Prince again. Once again we were treated to a lavish

occasion and this time having Malaysian female singers and the same Egyptian singer from the Welcoming Dinner.

Murray and I had two of the Malaysian singers seated at our table as was the Manager of the Kuwait Team (who seems to be the life of every party) and he soon had our three Aussie girls and Yoshiko Kira of Japan (known by many Australians as having spent time here earlier in the year receiving coaching in Double Trap from Russell) and a couple of the Malaysian singers all up doing some Egyptian type dancing. It was not long before a couple of the UIT representatives and Murray and I were 'dragged up' to join in the dancing. The Kuwait Manager and a few of his Team members then joining the Egyptian singer on the stage singing along with him. The Prince seemed to be really enjoying himself and I was told later that he reluctantly left around 11pm. By this time our boys had caught the eyes of some of the young ladies who carried the medals and flowers at presentation times and I could have done with a good sheep dog to try to round them up and get them on the bus so we could return to the hotel ourselves. Another great day for all our Team members.

Friday 15th August, Official practice day for Skeet with the Double Trap shooters stopping back at the hotel and with the girls going on a walk through the jungle at ground and tree top level with Heather Hale plus a ride on the river taxis, a most enjoyable day was had by all of the girls.

Saturday 16th August saw the first 75 targets being shot in the Skeet competition. Our shooters performing reasonably

well with Kris shooting his very first 25/25 making him a very happy person. At the day's end, George was leading on a 69/75 from Kris with 67/75 and Michael on 66/75. Scores in the Skeet were pretty low overall as the electronic phonopulls, the heat and the light all made for tough conditions. An early night for the Skeet shooters.

Sunday 17th August was the final day of competition and the Closing Ceremony. At the completion of the Skeet, Michael came out triumphant shooting a 112/125 (the last round posting a 24/25) with George also on 112/125 (but posting a 20/25 in the last round) while Kris came in with a 106/125. Overall their places among the competition would have been Michael 12th, George 14th and Kris in 26th place. 115-117/125 made the Final 6 and the Skeet competition was won by Korea.

The Closing Ceremony was again a short but spectacular affair preceded by the Skeet presentations and

presentations and gifts to referees and officials, then a march past by the participating nations and the final handing over of the Asian Shooting Championships to Kuwait who will be hosting the titles next year in March. It finished with a spectacular unveiling of a Bon Voyage and Welcome to Kuwait sign, once again with colourful smoke flares, thus ending a great Championships shoot hosted by this wonderful country.

Sunday evening saw this Australian Team, Ian and Heather Hale and three of our minders being entertained at a barbecue at the Australian Embassy hosted by Australian Ambassador Neil Davis and much to the surprise of the boys, there was an esky of Fosters canned beer, a couple of bottles of spirits and a couple of bottles of Brown Brothers red and white wine (much to Murray's delight as each time Murray reported home to wife Chris, she would just say she was just opening a nice cool bottle of Chardonnay, knowing full well that we were in an alcohol free environment). Neil and his wife were delightful hosts and we all had a good time, as did one of our minders who surprised George with his ability to sink a few cans of Fosters beer.

Home to bed by 11pm.

Monday 18th August and Murray was leaving us today on a direct flight back to Perth while the rest of us were going out at 1.30pm to the Shooting Range where the range was open for all the practice that the Double Trap and Trap boys and girls wanted, shooting in the company of the Prince and a few other invited guests. We left the range at 5pm to return to the hotel so the Team could have their final night out at the Jerudong Park Playground.

Tuesday 19th August we had a 10am start out at the Shooting Range with training in all disciplines and we practiced until 3pm with the shooters practicing all their weakest stations.

Back to the hotel for last minute shopping, swimming, tennis or just relaxing.

Wednesday 20th August saw everyone having a sleep in as we were only due to go out to the Shooting Range at 1.30pm and to get ready to leave the hotel at 9pm for an 11pm departure back home.

When we arrived at the Shooting Park it started to rain and rain and rain.....at least an inch or more in a matter of 45 minutes, but this did not seem to deter the Prince or any of our shooters for as soon as the rain eased off, they all went out to shoot. Prior to this we had formed three teams of our Australian shooters to compete in a 'triathlon' shoot where every one had to shoot 25 ISU Skeet, 25 Trap and 25pr Double Trap, each team having one Trap shooter, one Skeet shooter and one Double Trap lady shooter. This contest created some momentous results with the final result getting down to virtually the last shot by George in Double Trap where the Team he was in ran out the winners, but definitely not with the help of an unknown person who created an Australian and possibly a World Record in ISU Skeet!!!

By this time it was 5pm and the Prince was dressed and ready to go off to a soccer match, playing against the team that Ian Hale plays for and as stated before they just love their soccer. To shoot all afternoon in the rain and then go and play soccer for another two hours in the mud and rain just shows that he really loves his sport.

What a great and wonderful host he had been to all of the Australians especially supplying all the targets and ammunition for free (as much as we had wanted over the last three days since the competition had ended) and supplying us free use of the mini bus since Sunday.

After a sad farewell to the Prince and everyone else who helped us in any way we sadly went back to our hotel to pack for our departure.

Incidentally, the tallest boy was seen wearing one of the doorman's traditional hats, a bit of swapping must have taken place at some time, it certainly suits you Derek.

Ian and Heather Hale came to see us off at the airport and once again we had no problems at the airport except for 160 kilograms of excess baggage, but that problem was quietly overcome and we made our farewells to all and boarded our aircraft, arriving back in Brisbane at 9.30am on Thursday morning.

Back through Customs in Brisbane where once again we had no problems except for George who could not find his licence but being in an Australian tracksuits and having all the right paperwork, the Customs let us all through with no hassles. Proving that if all the paperwork is in order there are no hassles getting in or out of Australia, but you must have all the original documents and not photocopies, current firearms licences must be carried at all times.

We all then went off to our respective home states and this concluded a very successful training camp where many valuable lessons have been learnt and I would like to take this opportunity of thanking all the Team members for their exemplary behaviour and willingness to listen and learn from their Coach Murray and they were exceptional ambassadors for Australia. RULE AMMENDMENTS

EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1997

That Rule 1.04 (d) and 1.05 (h) be altered by removing "All squads will be determined by the office, whose decision shall be final." and inserting "Shooters will be squadded in order of nomination."

That we add to Rule 4.14 — re self loading and pump action firearms "a maximum of two rounds can be loaded at any time".

That the following be added to Rule 2.01 (q) — Newly registered A.C.T.A. shooters with experience and grade classification in other shotgun codes (eg. Field and Game) shall for the first 200 targets shoot at the highest grade attained in that code.

Rule interpretation

Guideline 5 (a)

"One target not-to-count shall be given to a shooter, for his first target of the day"

Clubs running events described as an Eyeopener are still required as per this rule to throw one target, not to count before the event.





CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2. Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in rounds of 50, brackets of 25, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap, eg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4 etc.

3. While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF TARGET shall be incurred.

5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re squadded towards the end of the event.

6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

7. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and or score throughout the period of competition. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.

9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14. Optional sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16. Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition. High Gun over 400 targets of the National Program.

17. Women and Junior shooters only are eligible for their section as well as the open event.

18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded.

19. Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.

20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.

21. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

22. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

23. I am in compliance with State licensing laws in my State of residence and in the State where this competition is being conducted.



THE LANBER 97 EST SPORTER.


Spanish gunmaker, Lanber, have been making guns for many years and models brought into Australia over 20 years ago are still going strong - probably the greatest virtue of these guns, their longevity. Admittedly those guns that are still working well have not undergone heavy use, but for casual hunting and shooting they are as good as one could expect for their price. Backed by a 5 year guarantee from the Australian distributors, the Lanber range of shotguns is certainly worth consideration. In the UK they are the number one volume gun, representing very good quality for an affordable price.




The action and monobloc of the Lanber 97 are strong enough to handle heavy loads with ease. The gun is provided with a 5 year warranty.

AT A GLANCE.

Having reviewed the first Lanber models distributed by Olin in Australia I was more than interested to be sent a recent Lanber 97 EST Sporter/Field gun for review. The gun arrived in typical cardboard packaging and was supplied with its certificate of proof, a guarantee card and 5 interchangeable Lanber chokes. Earlier models of this gun landed in Australia had 28" barrels. The new model has 30" barrels, very well figured walnut stockwork and an engraved, silver matte receiver. One of the striking qualities of the Lanber sporter was the quality of the walnut and the execution of the checkering. On lower priced guns it is not common to see such quality with the provision of a schnabel forend, a competition rib and interchangeable chokes - there is no other new gun in the marketplace that comes close with such value for money!




Designed primarily for the sporting clay shooter the Lanber 97 EST is also very suitable for use in the field - a dual purpose gun for the hunter and clay target shooter.



Split ejectors, a tang mounted safety and barrel selector provide the Lanber with all the features of guns costing thousands of dollars more.

THE BARRELS

Weighing just on 7 lb. 6 oz. with 1.524 kg. barrels the Lanber 97 EST certainly looked good. The blued finish was generally even with a few spots at the bottom of rib posts that had not been cleaned properly after soldering. As a consequence there were a couple of bare patches where the blueing had not taken. Side ventilated ribs topped with a tapered, competition style ventilated top rib complimented the finesse of the gun. The rib was fitted with a single, white trap-style front sight and provided the gun with features required for successful sporting clay or field shooting. The 29 1/2" barrels, (Lanber term them 30"), are a necessity for sporting clays/field shooting for the longer barrels swing more evenly when shooting at distant targets. The provision of an interchangeable choke tube system also enables a greater range of shooting situations to be undertaken, including skeet and quail shooting where usual half and full fixed chokes place shooters at a disadvantage.




The stock and forend were well constructed. Wood quality was above average for a gun in its price range and the colour matched very well.

The bore of the Lanber 97 EST was measured at 0.728", the nominal diameter for standard 12 gauge shotguns. The chokes were very close to designated with cylinder, (no choke), being 0.004" underbore size and improved modified, (3/4 choke), being 0.003" tighter than nominal, measuring 0.033 points of constriction. Modified and full choke were measured at 20 points and 40 points, respectively. The choke tubes

were 45 mm. long and supplied with a vinyl choke pouch and spanner. At the other end, the gun was chambered for 2 3/4" shells and proofed to 1,200 bar.

THE ACTION.

Lanber utilise a a boxlock action with the model 97 EST Sporter. The barrels are jointed using bifurcated lugs, providing the gun with a lower than normal profile - very much along the lines of Beretta guns, from which they are modelled. The blued cocking rods operating the hammers were quite obvious in the bottom of the silver receiver. These usually pass along the side walls of the receiver but Lanber have taken the shortest route - straight up the middle! The satin finish on the receiver is quite in line with a field gun whilst the shallow engraving covering both sides and the receiver floor was tastefully completed. It provided a sufficient distraction from what would otherwise be a flat, uninteresting surface. The rake of the gilded trigger was comfortable and the trigger guard generous enough for the largest of fingers. A combined barrel selector/safety catch was located on the tang and was comfortably placed for most shooters. The file cut surfaces provided positive thumb operation of both the safety and barrel selector. Generally, the receiver was functionally designed whilst all metal to metal and wood to metal surfaces were closely fitted.



The provision of interchangeable choke tubes means the Lanber 97 EST is suited to a variety of shooting and hunting situations, making it a great all-rounder.


THE STOCK AND FOREND.

The woodwork on the Lanber EST 97 Sporter was well matched and displayed good character in the grain. The oiled finish was a pleasant addition as was the schnabel styled forend and solid rubber recoil pad fitted to the butt. The checkering on the pistol grip and forend was well executed at 18 lines/inch. It provided a positive grip for practical use. The forend was a little bulkier than I have found with similar guns but this fullness of the forend serves to completely fill the shooter's hand and provide a reassuring grip. The stock design was standard whilst the Lanber dimensions were very similar to many other sporters I have reviewed - manufacturers appear to have standardised these measurements for best, all round results. Top English shooter, Barry Simpson, had a great deal of input into the stock and overall design of the latest Lanber models, his influence is quite obvious. The balance of the gun was slightly forward of the hinge pin and enabled the 97 EST to come quickly to the shoulder. It was a very pleasant gun to handle and mount whilst "dry" pointing and swinging.

IN THE FIELD.

The Lanber 97 EST performed well at a recent sporting clays shoot. Whilst firing a variety of loads, from 28 gram to 36 gram Super X loads, the gun handled the recoil well and

broke targets evenly - when pointed in the right direction. A good selection of targets were offered on the day with some targets out as far as 50 yards and others only 15 yards away. With a selection of choke tubes at my disposal I was able to select the respective chokes at each station and annihilate targets whilst others in my squad simply broke off bits and pieces. Since watching Digweed and Bloxham at the world championships I have firmed my beliefs on the advantages of interchangeable chokes and take every amount of consideration to enhance my performance. Apart from not being totally familiar with the Lanber I managed to post a respectable tally with my lost targets attributed to my performance - certainly not the gun's!



The monobloc and split ejectors are well finished and compliment the overall appearance of the gun.

In conclusion, I found the Lanber 97 EST to be a well made and very pleasant gun to shoot. Unfortunately during field testing I was not fast enough to bag the only two rabbits I saw and not cunning enough for two hares. A domestic goose gone "feral" was as close as I came to bagging game, otherwise the gun performed well and was pleasant to carry in the field. For the occasional shooter I would have no hesitation in recommending the Lanber 97 EST for use in the field or at a sporting clays ground. The 5 year warranty and \$1,000 price tag are certainly two good incentives to own one of these well presented Lanber shotguns. With nothing else on available within their price range and for what they offer, if you are thinking of buying a new gun, you just couldn't go wrong!

Olin Australia New Leadership



Judging by the interest shown, the ZZ's was indeed the right choice, quickly bringing back many memories of just how live birds behaved and providing an ideal stimulus for the many stories and yarns told throughout the afternoon. Many invitations were sent and good local media coverage given.

51 shooters entered into the match and relived the 'good old days' with plastic ZZ pigeons. At all times throughout the day long competition, large numbers of spectators watched as shooters in single file contested each group of 3 ZZ's, by the time the last round of 3 ZZ's was being shot, the crowd had grown to in excess of 150.

Unlike days bygone when visitors were charged an entrance fee, the club was pleased to welcome such a number of visitors and provide afternoon tea free of charge.

The day saw a number of items of great interest emerge, including live bird traps, trophies of all descriptions, old cartridges, some very nice doubles (side by sides) and of course photos and newspaper articles.

During the course of the day over 200 people attended the club during its open house celebration, many being former shooters and others direct decadents. Everyone had in common one thing,

that being to make sure that their family was being remembered during the 125th birthday celebration, with many bringing along old family trophies.

These trophies included a number of very nice silver pieces and gold medals as well as team cups and shields. One Mount Gambier family brought along a trophy that certainly impressed all the ladies present, that being a beautiful gold and pearl bracelet. The bracelet was won in an 1890 pigeon match, trophy being one pearl for each pigeon shot. The bracelet contains 13 large pearls, having been won by Albert Grosser from 31 yards.

Nobes, GC Doughty, WM Burton. The conditions were eight birds each; 1 1/4oz shot; 20 yard rise; 80 yard fall. Mr Elliot acted as referee and Mr Beswick as trapper of the birds. The shooting was fair considering that all the three gentlemen were out of practice some of them not having shot at a pigeon for a quarter of a century. Several of the birds dropped out of the bounds and of course were not counted. The results were as follows: - Mr Nobes, 1 1 1 0 1 1 1 (7); Mr Doughty, 1 1 0 1 1 0 1 1 (6); Mr Burton, 0 1 1 1 0 1 1 0 (5).

This shoot is believed to be the precursor to the later establishment of the club in 1872.

By 1883 the club had moved to Frew Park which is now part of the city centre, a location that was the home of the Mount Gambier club for many long years. Shoots were held on days of major town events, like the show and races and attracted large fields of shooters and huge spectator crowds. It was interesting to note at the foot of the 1883 Mount Gambier Show Shoot report the following caption - It is a noticeable fact that the four winners all fired

Sifting through the information that came forth was an enlightening experience and much has been learned of the clubs 125 year history. The clubs venture into rabbit shooting matches was highlighted with handicaps up to 35 yards, the club thought that it had a real winner, not so, the matter flopped because the rabbits wouldn't run.

A special tribute was paid to Nancy Pearson who had for some time been researching into the club's history. We now have hundreds of photos and newspaper articles, courtesy of Nancy and those who were able to attend the day. It is impossible to promote all, however we have selected a number of articles we found interesting.

Pigeon Shooting (May 1868)- On Tuesday last a match came off at Mr Beswick's farm between Messrs GM

guns from the well known factory of Scott and Sons, three with breech loaders and one with a muzzle loader.

By 1890 the club had progressed well, with the advert (see opposite) appearing in the local press.

One hundred pounds in 1890 was certainly a large purse in any mans language. Conditions read "An unlimited number of birds, guns limited to 12 gauge, 1 1/4oz shot, two nominations allowed, miss and out." Nominations were two pounds and had to be in the hands of the secretary a week prior accompanied with club handicap card, no handicap card - penalty maximum distance. Handicaps 32 to 21 yards.

Shoot report of the match reads in part "The number of nominations was very satisfactory...the day was favourable for good shooting. Four hundred strong birds were obtained from Adelaide, and the sportsmen declared themselves well satisfied with them, the trapping and the management of the match...the winners were all Mount Gambier residents and it will be interesting to sportsmen to note that the successful shots used Scotts, Belmont Interchangables and Keep Bros, of course, all were breech-loaders.

By 1893 shooting at Mount Gambier had diversified to include rabbit matches with handicaps out to 35 yards. The matches proved a failure due course because of the difficulty experienced in getting the rabbits to run!!!

By the turn of the century it is obvious from the newsclippings to hand that many successful pigeon, parrot, starling and sparrow matches were held, including double rise matches. Almost all matches were shot from handicap marks, including the double rise matches.

Shooting was not cheap, as the below dodger of 1912 shows. A sixty pound open handicap match, nominations two pounds ten shillings each, which must have taken the sport into the top income bracket in those days. In addition to nomination fees was the cost of cartridges and the birds, costing ten shillings each. (See advertisement Page 23).

The first 'clay pigeon' trial took place at the club in 1915, clay pigeons having taken on quite widely with gun clubs in Victoria at this time. A newspaper article of June 1915 reads "Clay Pigeons on Trial - At the last meeting of the Mount Gambier Gun Club it was resolved to make an experiment with the shooting of clay pigeons and to that end it was agreed to have a special match with these substitutes on June 2nd. The novelty of the match induced some 30 members of the club to enter, while the absence of the destruction of bird life in the experiment drew a large number of ladies and gentlemen who had no connection with the club to the grounds as spectators." The article went on to describe clay pigeons and the shooting technique required, summing up "That clay pigeons leave the trap at all angles and it requires a keen eye and a quick aim to achieve a fair number of kills. For the majority of shooters the clay pigeons were too smart."

During this early period of the 20th century there were 15 gun clubs in the lower South East of South Australia, all based on live bird shooting.

Despite the 1915 trial, it was almost 25 years later before clay birds were officially inaugurated at the Mount Gambier Gun Club. A newspaper article of 4 April 1939 reads in part "Keenly contested Teams Match - Judging by the interest of shooters and the interest evinced in the opening shoot at clay birds at the Mount Gambier club's grounds on Saturday it would seem that the committee has made no mistake in introducing this innovation. For the uninitiated it may be explained that a clay bird consists of a 4 inch clay disc, catapulted from a trap with a steel spring arm, and released in the usual way by pulling a string at the call of the shooter. A clean break or a chip, however small, is recorded a hit. Although somewhat mechanised the flight may be directed in any direction by adjustment by the trapper, making the diversity of shots to resemble as near to live bird shooting as possible. In Victoria many clay bird clubs have been formed, and this sport is

Smuggler and Right Barrel. Not too many shoots were won by visitors, although JW. Sutherland shooting under the name 'Calrossie' was an exception on a number of occasions in the period 1900-1930.

Two shooters who will always be remembered throughout Australia as Mount Gambiers best pigeon shooters are Albert Grosser and Les Sims.

Albert Grosser was a member of the Mount Gambier Gun Club during the late 1800's and early 1900's, and was without dispute one of Australia's leading gunmen over a period of 15-20 years. Grosser had countless local successes and in 1888 he won the largest pigeon contest held to that time in Australia, being 500 pounds cash plus trophy, an event that was held in Melbourne. 500 pounds in 1888 was one hell of a lot of money, enough in those days to purchase a very substantial farming enterprise and still have plenty of change left over.

Amongst Grossers' other interstate victories was 275 pounds won at Stawell, 350 pounds won at Ballarat and in 1904/05, he won the Gun Championship of Australia in Melbourne with a first prize of 250 pounds. Grosser died in 1909 aged 57 years.

Les Sims, regarded as one of the fastest pigeon shots, often killed his bird before it had time to be more than just a few yards from the trap. Sims days came towards the end of Mount Gambier's pigeon shooting times. He won numerous live bird matches all over the region and often travelled considerable distances to win Championship trophies.

Les Sims won the last ever live bird shoot in the British Commonwealth, when in 1959 the Wangaratta Gun Club conducted the Victorian Galah Championship. Sims and Webb (Leeton NSW) tied at 20/21 in the first application of birds. On shooting off for the title, Sims won on the 27th bird. Sims competed on the International circuit with great success and is equally well known abroad and he is at home in Australia. Sims remains an active clay target shooter today, although failing eyesight has put his wins further apart.

Reunion with 'old shooters and their families' was only part of the purpose of August 30, hard earned hits was also in order with those vying for the South Australian ZZ Title. Choice targets and a good side wind made targets really challenging for event the best of shooters.

ZZ shooting was underway shortly after 10am, with the match ground having been superimposed over the clubs number two layout directly in front of the clubrooms. Committee members had put a great deal of effort into layout presentation and the grounds certainly looked a picture.

At the completion of the 3 ZZ eye opener, 18 shooters showed great potential in readiness for the State match, all having hit all three ZZ's.

51 nominations were taken for the State match, consisting of 15 ZZ's, 27 yards, shot size restricted to No.7 with a maximum 1&1/4oz load. Several non competing nominations were also taken in the match.

As the match progressed, the crowd built in size as did their interest in how shooters were performing. 11 shooters reached six hits without a miss, five going on to make it 9 hits straight. The three shots, 10, 11 & 12 were a very telling time, and by their end only two shooters remained unbeaten at 12 hits no misses, nine shooters had 11 hits, 1 miss.

As the last three shots were taken, tension built further, many shooters missing and others reliant on second barrels. With a crowd that had now grown to in excess of 150, all eyes were on local Mount Gambier shooter Chris Wright, who when stepping onto the shooting mark was the only shooter who could win the event outright, but needed all three ZZ's demolished to do so.

A miss by Wright would see him tie with four shooters on 14/15. Wright took his 13th ZZ on the first shot as it came from the far left trap crossing low and rapidly to the right side fence. Taking aim for

the 14th ZZ, it released from the extreme right trap and flew high and fast, again one shot and hit was the ZZ.

Last ZZ, and only the three centre traps loaded, it was an ideal split for the young Wright. The crowd in absolute silence, Wright called and from the very centre trap emerged a quick flighted ZZ, moving at a quartering angle. Wright swiftly moved in on the ZZ and again it was a one shot hit, bringing a standing ovation from the crowd and competitors and taking with him the South Australian ZZ Championship match, 15 straight hits.

Shooters to finish on 14/15 were Bruce England (Bordertown), Ian Fratantaro (Melbourne) and Mount Gambiers Brian Smith and Danile Ashby. A further eight shooters tied for the minor places at 13/15.

The win by the local Wright concluded a magnificent day at the Mount Gambier Gun Club, we couldn't have asked for better remarked Club President Mr Frank Kentish, as he made the winners trophy presentation to Chris Wright and thanked the 200+ visitors who came to the club to honour and celebrate the vision of our fore-bearers some 125 years ago.

The usual Mount Gambier BBQ tea and refreshments followed trophy presentation, with the evening finally drawing to a close well after dark and not before many an old tale was told.

Whilst trophies may not be 100 pounds cash or a motor car, well in excess of \$5000 will be contested during the day and nominations are set at \$60, BBQ tea included.







Dear Editor

With all the controversy surrounding the possession and use of firearms in Australia during the last few years and currently, perhaps the time has come to consider logically the existence and function of established shooting clubs. As far as this district is concerned, I refer particularly to the Forest Clay Target Club Inc., situated at Nolans Road, Lakesland.

This club had its beginnings at Sutton Forest, near Moss Vale, in the nineteen fifties, and was then known as the Sutton Forest Gun Club. The late Maurie Quirk and Cec Tickle from Tahmoor, were foundation members. However, in the late seventies, the property housing the range changed hands, and the club ceased to exist.

In 1982 action began to reform the club in the Picton district and eventually a site was made available on his farm, by the late Harry Nolan at Lakesland, and construction of the trap houses, lanes, and club premises began. The following twelve months saw the basic construction completed and 99 shooters attended the opening shoot on 4th December, 1983, which for the original Committee of Dino Anton, Fred & Jenny Twarloh, Bob Lipscombe, Robby Byrne, Bob Dunk, Dianne Lipscombe, Eric Schutte, Jack Kelland, Fay Quirk, Rob Jones, Laurie Moon and George Bowes, was a most satisfying day.

Today the club has just under 100 members affiliated with the Australian Clay Target Association and conducts shooting programs twice monthly. Members are strictly vetted and discipline while on the range is strict. There has never been even a minor accident and we go to some lengths to maintain that record.

The club holds three shoots each year for charity. In May of each year we hold the Lakesland Bush Fire Brigade Charity Shoot. This is a two day event, the first of which was held in 1984. To date, the sum of \$31,354.67 has been raised for the Brigade.

A new charity shoot has been included in our program this year. The Cec Tickle Memorial Handicap Championship was shot on the 24th August 1997, and will be included in future programs. A suitable donation will be forwarded to the Royal Blind Society in due course.

In December of each year, the Harry Nolan Anniversary Shoot is held. The Jennifer Eggins Cancer Foundation is the beneficiary of this shoot, and since its inception in 1994, the sum of \$3,700.00 has been donated to this Charity.

I think it can be fairly said that we not only enjoy our sport, but we also make a considerable contribution to the community.

Olympic Athletes elected to new Athletes' Commission

The Executive Board of the Australian Olympic Committee (AOC) at its meeting August 1, 1997, elected members to the AOC Athletes' Commission, which will serve for the next four years, through the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

The Athletes' Commission plays an important role with the AOC, providing advice to the Executive on all matters relating to the Olympic Movement, the International Olympic Committee, the International Federations, the National Olympic Committees, the Olympic Museum, Olympic Solidarity, doping, eligibility, Olympic Village facilities, Olympic Ceremonies, sport and politics and other issues referred to it from the AOC Executive Board.

The ten members of the Commission were elected from forty-one nominations received from both National Federations and, for the first time, the athletes themselves.

Announcing the new Commission, AOC President, John Coates said "I am very pleased to announce the Olympians who will serve on the Athletes' Commission for the next four years. We had an overwhelming response from some of Australia's most respected Olympians who want an active role in the development of the Olympic Movement in this country and particularly with the preparations for the Australian Team for the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

"The AOC is focused on the needs of our athletes and this group of people know first hand what is required to compete at Olympic competition. With representatives from various sports, both summer and winter, and representation of males and females, the Commission is well placed to provide a balanced view on all Olympic matters," he said.

The AOC Athletes' Commission members are: Damien Brown - Weightlifting 1992,1996; Jeni Danks - Sailing 1992,1996; Michael McKay - Rowing 1988, 1992 (Gold), 1996 (Gold); Robyn Maher - Basketball 1984, 1988, 1996 (Bronze); Russell Mark - Shooting 1988, 1992, 1996 (Gold); Kirstie Marshall 1994; Steve Moneghetti - Athletics 1988, 1992, 1996; Nicole Stevenson - Swimming 1988, 1992 (Bronze), 1996 (Silver, Bronze); Liane Tooth - Hockey 1984, 1988(Gold), 1992, 1996(Gold); Chris Wybrow - Water Polo 1984, 1988, 1992.

The Commission will hold its first meeting in September and at that time they will elect a Chair, who takes a place as a voting member of the Executive Board of the AOC, and a Deputy Chair, one to be a male and one female.

Recognising the importance of the Commission, the AOC Executive today decided to recommend to the next Annual General Meeting of its members that both the Chair and Deputy Chair of the Athletes' Commission serve as voting members on the AOC Executive.

"Being a voting member on the Board gives the Commission a strong voice in the decisions taken with regards to the Olympic Movement and especially Australia's Olympic Teams," Mr Coates said. "By increasing the size of the Executive to include the Deputy Chair of our Athletes' Commission will give our athletes a greater say and encourage their involvement in Olympic Administration.

Australia is one of just three National Olympic Committees which has athletes as voting members of their Executive Board - the other two nations being the United States and Germany, both very successfully operating Olympic Committees.

Under the AOC's Constitution, athletes are eligible for election to the Commission if they have been competitors in the Australian Team at either or both of the previous two Olympic Games or Olympic Winter Games. The Commission is comprised of ten athletes, including not less than four males and four females, and not more than one male and female of any one sport on the Olympic program.


