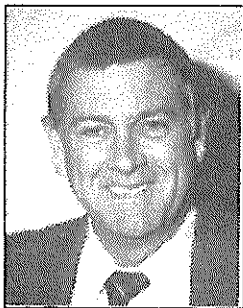

RULE INTERPRETATIONS

With the introduction of a new rule it seems inevitable that different persons place different interpretations on the rule.

One recent example is the introduction of the rule pertaining to the nomination procedure for squadding purposes, i.e., "shooters will be squadded in order of nomination".

We have been contacted and told that this rule makes it impossible for clubs to shoot more than one discipline on a day. This rule was introduced as a result of a proposal put to the AGM at Wagga Wagga earlier this year when members in attendance voted overwhelmingly for its introduction. My interpretation would be that the rule pertains to the running of a particular event, not a complete days shooting. To be able to conduct a full days shooting, including different disciplines, the club would squad shooters as to their availability to shoot each event or discipline. The rule was in no way introduced to prevent the smooth running of any competition.

My thanks to each member of the National Executive for their contribution during the past 12 months. Each member gives of their own time and particular expertise generously to improve all aspects of our Association and I am sure, despite the odd grizzle, everyone acknowledges their input.

To all our sponsors, an enormous thankyou. During 1997 the continued support of our sponsors has enabled us to present an extremely high image at all ACTA events, not the least of all being the World DTL Championships at Wagga Wagga. What a great event that was! It is hoped our positive liaison with our sponsors will continue, and that they will in turn benefit greatly from their relationship with us.

To Graeme, Leanne, Gina, Manon and Carol thankyou from all for your courteous and efficient assistance during the year. To all our support staff, whether they be a team manager, coach or secretary, we say thanks. To Murray, our National Director of Coaching, and to each of his State counterparts, thank you to each for your efforts.

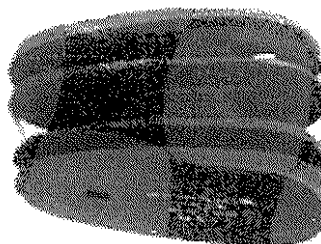

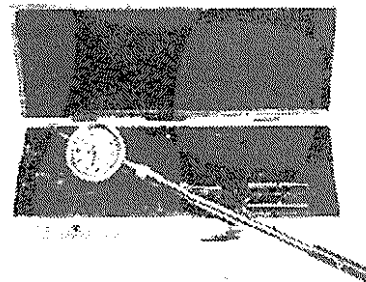

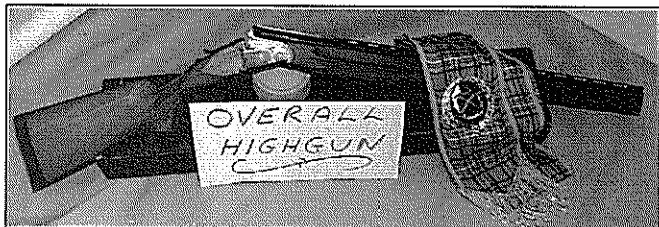

Some of the magnificent trophies on offer are displayed in these photographs.

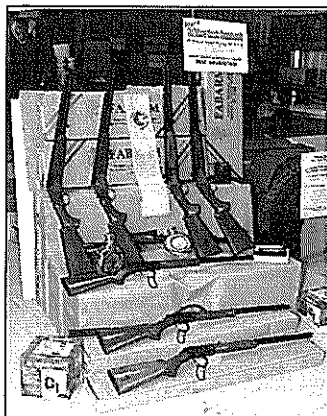

Travel

As previously organised all the participants to this trip arrived in Melbourne in the afternoon in time to get the Qantas flight to Italy. This itinerary has been chosen because, apart from the valuable cost, it was the only flight going straight to Rome-Italy without changing aircraft and with one stop over in Bangkok. This has permitted us to be quite confident about the fact that the guns and all the other equipment wouldn't get lost on the way once loaded in the aircraft. In fact we didn't lose any luggage and upon the arrival in Rome we went through the custom procedures very smoothly, even though it took a while to fill in all the forms needed by law (bureaucracy in Italy is quite complicated and very often the people in charge don't know what to do!).

We landed in Rome with one hour of delay due to a big weather storm in Bangkok. After disembarking the aircraft at 8.20am Tuesday the 16th of September, we collected all baggage, we cleared the custom and we left the airport around 11.15am after collecting a nine seater minibus Ducato from Avis, very good with good baggage storage room, and a station wagon from Budget. After three hours drive we arrived at Montecatini at 2.30pm and all the team had been accommodated following the previously arranged agreements.

Stay, Training

As soon as the team was securely accommodated in the Hotel Francia & Quirinale (more than acceptable), I went to the shooting range to see if everything was ready and to find out information about the competition and training.

At 7.30pm we had dinner and then, all of us very tired from the long trip, we went to bed.

During the 17th & 18th of September (19th as well for Olympic Trench and Skeet shooters) we had very good training with enough opportunities for everyone to exhaust their

shooting wishes. The only problem I could seriously notice were that being alone with such a big team (not in number but in disciplines) I wasn't really able to follow everyones training because they were shooting contemporary but in different ranges.

Technical Meeting

At 12.00pm on the 18th September we had the technical meeting conducted by Adriano Laiolo (Italy), Michael Tipa and Medhat Wahdan (U.I.T.). No news turned up at all and all the discussion, honestly quite confused, was about drawing of lots and competition schedule.

Opening Ceremony

During the afternoon of September the 18th at 5.00pm the Opening Ceremony was carried out. All members of the Australian Team wore their tracksuit and the National flag was carried by Deserie Wakefield due to the fact that she is a lady and, between she and Ann Maree Roberts, Deserie obtained major success in her carrier. The ceremony was officiated by the President of the U.I.T. Mr Olegario Vazquez Rana, the General Secretary of the U.I.T. Mr Horst Schreiber and the President of the Italian Shooting Federation Mr Luciano Rossi who after their speeches officially opened the 1997 World Cup Final. During the ceremony, Mr Luciano Rossi officially asked the U.I.T. to have the opportunity to organise the World Cup Final 1998 which was later decided from the U.I.T. that will be granted once again to Italy and will be organised in Montecatini during the 3rd week of September 1998.

Stay, Competition

19th of September was the day for Double Trap competitions, Men and Women. It has been quite hard for Deserie to compete in the right way because just during the day before



the competition I realised that she was always missing targets on the left hand side and so I thought it was valuable to shoot a glance to her gun fitting. I was quite surprised when I found out that the stock wasn't fitting to her properly at all and so I explained to her that to break the targets she had to shoot them on the right side (virtually behind) to break them. These sort of episodes let me think that we certainly need a gunsmith to be available in the next future in a training camp where we will get all the shooters together to let the gunsmith fix all the fitting problems we should find during a gun fitting check. Of course this gunsmith should be capable to do all works on every kind of gun and be equipped for the best finished of the wood once modified.

Anyway talking about the competition, the first thing I must say is that the targets were very difficult for everybody and this can be appreciated looking at the scores. The reason is



that the targets were released from FAB trap machines, air cocked, short arm and therefore very fast thrown targets, for the first 15 metres, only after that were they slowing down. It was really very difficult for everybody to find the right timing on the targets.

I would say that all the shooters have done their best to compete at the highest performance possible so that none of them have got nothing to recriminate.

Ann Maree Roberts made the final with the score of 95, the third best score, on tie with two other shooters. A score of 31/40 in the final wasn't enough to get a medal and so she ended 6th, 2 targets behind the silver medal and 18 targets behind the gold medal. The score of Gelisio can be compared as better than the mens competition winners score.

For the Mens event, a very bad first round of 33/50 for Michael Diamond has put him immediately out of competition. Adam Vella has been for the whole competition very close to the group of leader followers and unfortunately a bad last round (38/50) has left him out of the final by just one target. Russell Mark, despite a non perfect condition, has grown consistently within the competition, realising that all the other shooters had some troubles in shooting good scores, tapping into his wealth of experience. He made the final two targets behind the leader in Albano Pera, silver medallist in Atlanta and, during the final round, he shot 44/50 against 42/50 of Pera and he tied him up. The shame was that actually Russell had the chance to win when he was leading Albano by one and he missed the very last target in the final. After that they made the shoot off to break the tie for the first and second place and Russell was selected to shoot first. He broke his first and second pairs as Albano did and then he missed the second target of his third pair. Albano did the same giving back to Russell the opportunity to go ahead once again. Russell shot his fourth pair and he missed again his second target and this time Albano did not forgive him.

It really was a shame but this is the sport of shooting where sometimes you win and sometimes you lose.

In the meantime the Skeet and Olympic Trap shooters, missing Diamond and Vella, had their official training preparing their competition for the following day.

Neither competition had been of a very high technical standard with both leaders of Trap and Skeet after the first day with the score of 72, Pelliello - Trap, and Benelli, Falco and Al Rashidi - Skeet. Unfortunately our Skeet shooter Craig Meuleman started with a first round of 20. It was a shame because after that bad round he had shot pretty good in 23-23-24-25, and with an additional good round instead of the 20, he could have been in the leading group and for sure in the final, which he missed in the shoot off for the 6th & 7th place with the Russian Teoplij. Clive Barton shot average scores for the whole competition in 23-23-23-21-22, never being very close to the leaders, especially after the bad rounds of the second day of competition.

In Trap things were different. In fact after the first day Michael Diamond was one target behind the leader, despite a bad second round of 22, when he promptly recovered with a perfect shot 25 on the third round. Adam shot average scores 23-22-23-23-23 for the whole competition with Ben Kelley shooting a very bad first day of 22-20-19 and quite a good second day with 24-24, even if too late.

After the first round of the second competition day, with Pelliello shooting a score of 22, Michael Diamond was leading by one target in front of him and Scalzone. During the last round Michael missed one, Pelliello shot 25 and Scalzone missed three, so that Pelliello and Diamond got in the final with a tied score of 119.

Michael was very concentrated and in the final shot a perfect 25 on flash targets where Pelliello wasn't able to go any further than that of 23.

Very well done Michael, World Cup Final Winner 1997 in Olympic Trap, the only foreign shooter capable within the last two years to win a World Cup (last year 4 Italians, this year 3 Italians and 1 Australian).

Some Italian newspapers have said that they consider in a certain way, this World Cup won by Michael as to be half Italian given that the Australian coach is Italian. To me, the only thing I know, is that all the shooters have done a great job and Michael has performed a competition behaving himself in a professional way.

Medical

No problems at all were encountered on this matter during the whole trip.

Conclusion

As I previously said, the whole trip has been very good for everyone and no problems of any kind were encountered. I would like to thank the Uniserve Pty Ltd that has sponsored the Australian Team for this competition.

Peter Field (Dysart) was 1st in AA with 47/50, from Julian



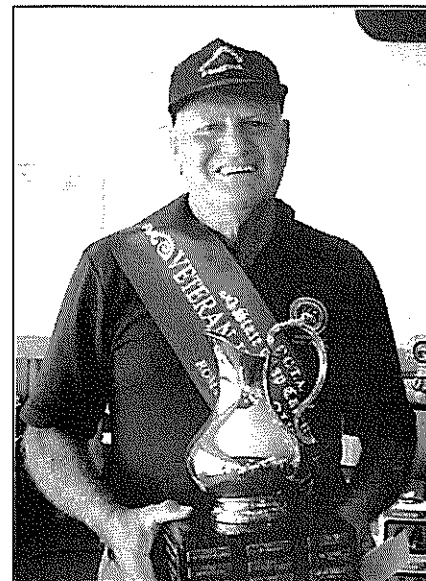

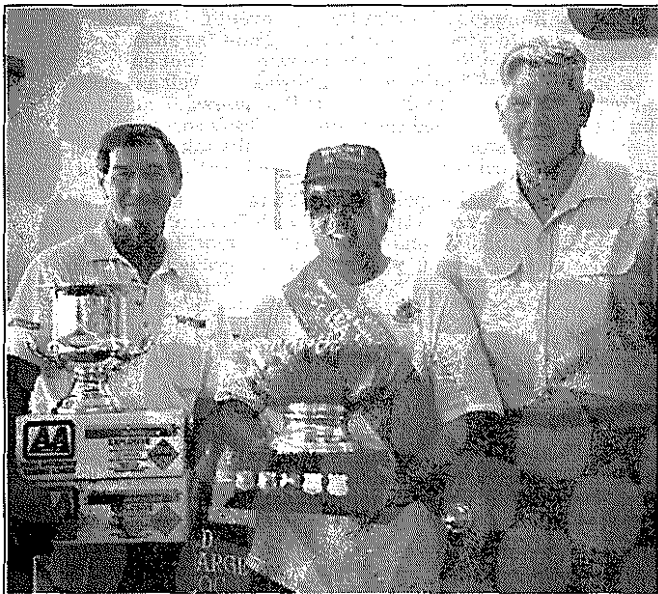


Left to right: Robert Nugent (QCTA State President), Dennis McIntosh (Whitsunday). State SB Championship.

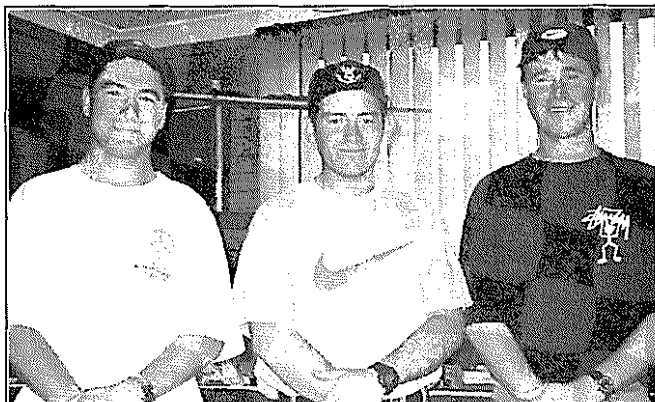


Olympic Trap Team: Leo Pezzano, Brad Webb, Glenn Kable, Michael Diamond

Jackson 47/50, Sub Juniors by Scott Wallis and Veterans by Merv Lyons with 43/50.

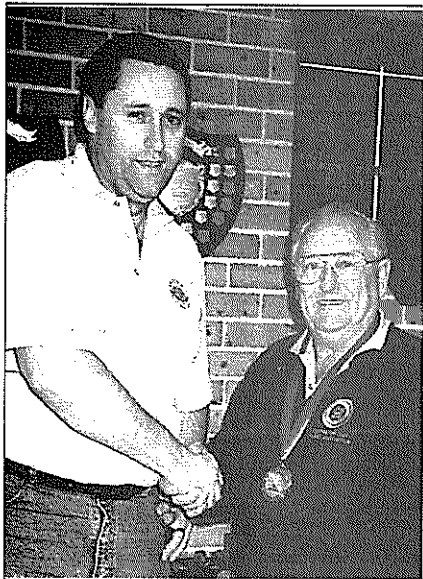

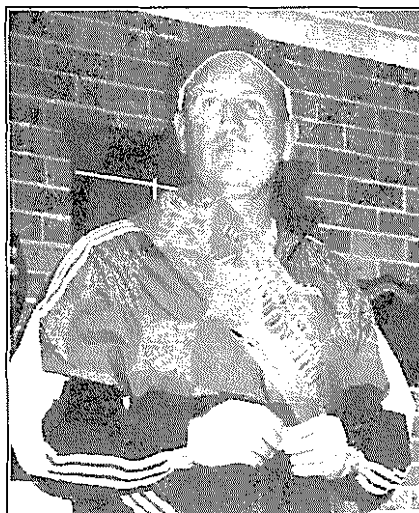

about the competitors of years gone by, about the memorable achievements of the Club, and of course, about where the Club stands today and its plans for the 21st century.

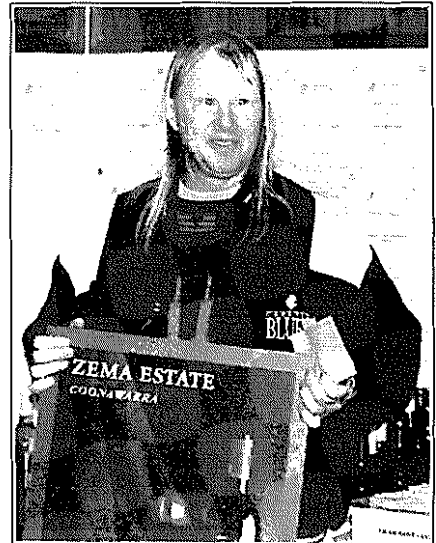

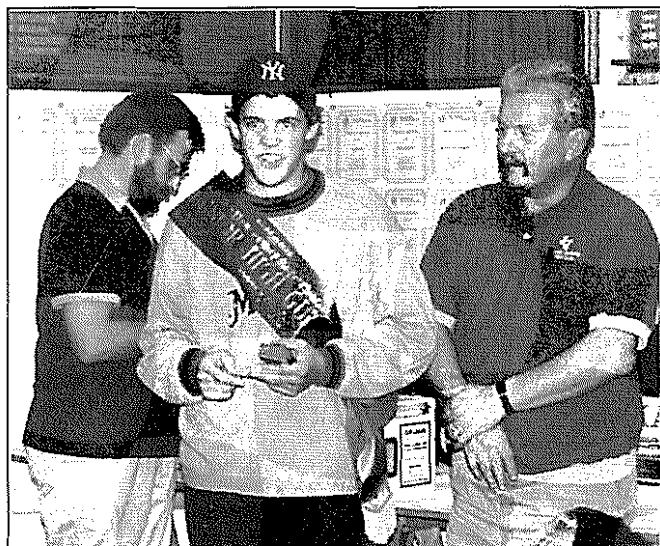

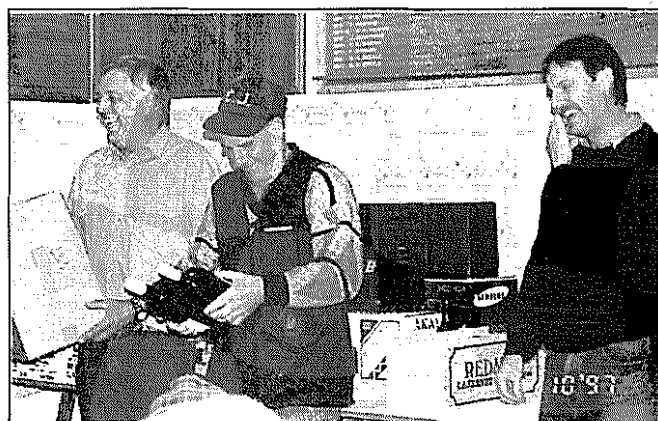

A list of your clubs 1997 financial members to date is enclosed, please use the shooter membership numbers when renewing your club members for next season.

Registration forms for 1998 are also enclosed, you will be pleased to note that the Association has been near to avoiding any increase membership fees, with the only change being a small increase in the full member fee from \$50.00 to \$55.00.

Score books will be similar to that of previous years and issued upon receipt of renewal. After this issue, renewal will be by way of a coloured sticker to be placed on the front of the book. Once a book is full or lost it may be replaced by applying to the ACTA for a new book to be issued. Note this application must be authorised by the members Club Secretary or Club Handicapper.

To preserve the score book I may remind you that plastic wallet like covers are available for purchase at .35c each. A good idea for the club to bulk purchase.

In order to process your club shooter registrations, the ACTA must first receive your 1998 Club Affiliation. This also has only increased marginally to that of \$125.00. An account for same will be forwarded shortly, please forward this amount promptly.

Remember that the \$125 Club Affiliation Fee covers your club for Public Liability Coverage through the ACTA Insurance Brokers. This public risk amount has been increased to \$20,000,000. Note that it is not necessary for your club to take out separate Public Liability Insurance, the policy covers your club provided your Affiliation fee is paid.

With many Clubs having change of Secretaries during the season, I take this opportunity to remind current Secretaries of the ACTA Interim Membership Card. Interim Membership (\$10) may be offered to new shooters only, as a 'try before you buy' type membership.

The Interim Membership entitles the shooter to compete at the issuing club only, during the interim membership of three months. It does not entitle the shooter to compete in zone, state or national championships conducted by the issuing club during the interim period.

If after the expiry date of the interim membership, the shooter elects to continue as an A.C.T.A registered shooter, the \$10 interim membership fee is deducted from the fee payable for twelve months registration.

Quantities of the interim membership cards are available from the ACTA Office.

Editor's Mailbox

Sir

The 28 gram (1oz) cartridge load has now gained general acceptance within our sport, however the benefits of this remarkable advance in cartridge technology have come at a price.

In double barrel shooting in particular, long shoot offs are becoming the norm, breaks in excess of 250 are now commonplace and over 500 far from rare.

These factors present Club managements with both increased irrecoverable costs and shoot administration problems.

The A.C.T.A has acknowledged the problems, but the decision to permit clubs to change to point scoring after 100 targets of double barrel shoot off is, at best, a weak compromise solution.

If double barrel shooting is to be retained in our schedule of events, then I believe that there is a strong argument for revision of Rules 4.05(a) and (b), which define legal targets both as to distance and spread of flight.

Common sense indicates that reversion to the previous legal flight distance of 50+/-5 metres - 4.05(a) - and elimination of the 'standard target' straightaway from Lane 1 and Lane 5 qualification - 4.05(b), would restore the 'degree of difficulty' which we accepted for many years, and should go a long way towards bringing double barrel shoot offs back to indicating levels of shooting skills rather than merely levels of physical and mental endurance, provided of course that the referees conducting events and shoot offs do not permit abuse of the refusal rule by repeated non-acceptance of legal 'swingers' by shooters.

Healthy and rational debate of this issue would be worthwhile.

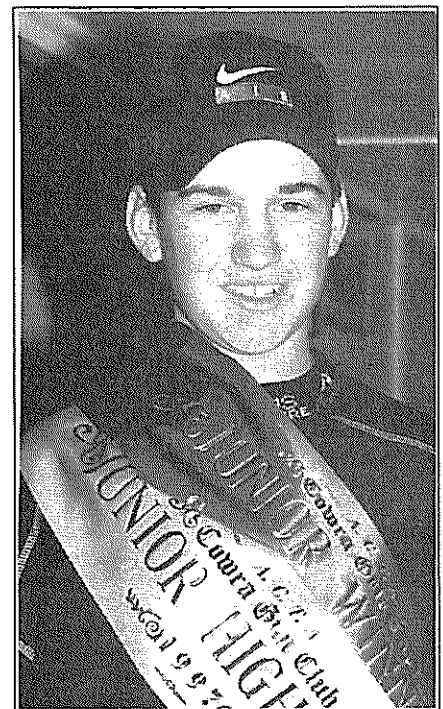

Thirteen competitors scored 99/100.



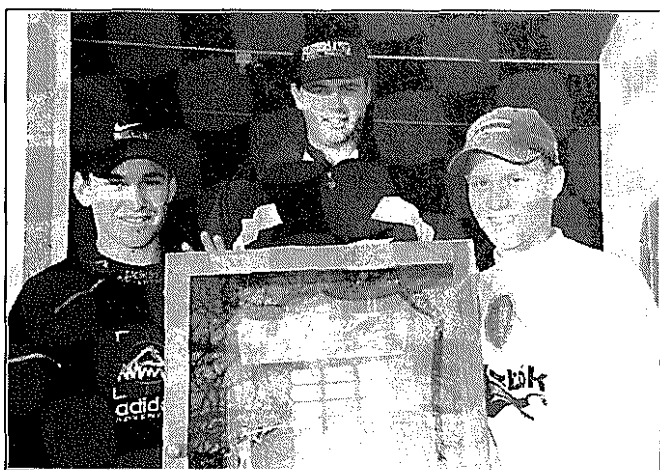

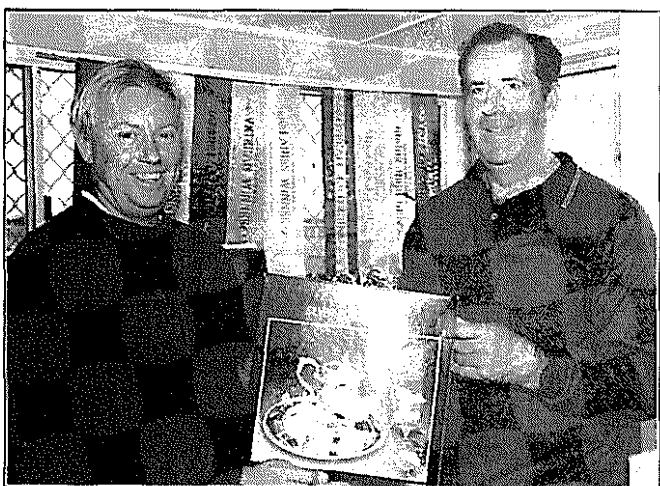

Reiffenhauser Cases

I remember when I bought my first packet of plastic shotgun cartridges way back in the late 1960s. The cartridges were green coloured ICIL ounce and a quarter [36 grams] number 4s.

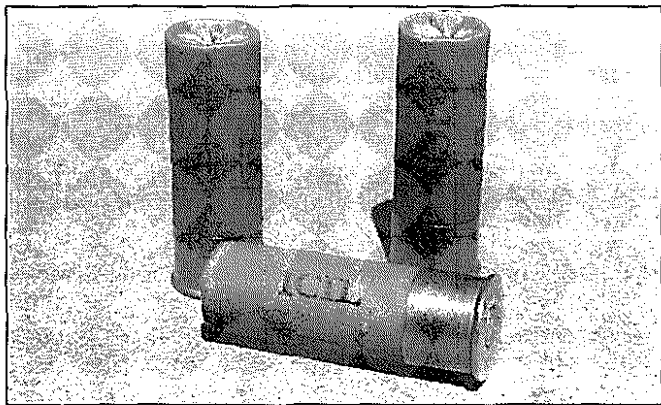
The interesting aspect of these cartridges was that the shot pellets and the felt wad could be clearly seen through the semi-transparent casing. At the time, ICI were marketing plastic cased ammunition of two types: some had felt and cardboard wads while others were loaded with the newly developed plastic wads.

These early plastic cartridge cases were of a type of construction that is still in use today. They were multi-piece affairs made from plastic tubing with a tightly wound paper base wad and a brass plated soft steel case head to hold it all together. This type of cartridge case is known as a "Reiffenhauser" case.

In contrast to the Reiffenhauser case is the one piece compression moulded case (like those made by Winchester) where the entire unit, except the brass case head, is made of plastic. Actually, the metal cladding around the case head is only there to prevent the extractor ripping through the soft plastic rim if the cartridge is fired in a self-loader. Otherwise, the case could be made entirely of plastic.

Unlike the straight sided Reiffenhauser case, the moulded type has case walls that are slightly tapered, being quite thick where they join the solid head. See photograph of sectioned cases.

Reiffenhauser cases are cheaper to manufacture than the one piece moulded type and are used extensively in cheaper varieties of ammunition. They are intended to be fired once and discarded. In fact, Reiffenhauser cases are discarded to such an extent that some shooters

refer to them as "throwaways", believing that they are non-reloadable.

Such an assumption is far from the truth. The majority of straight walled cases, regardless of their country of origin, use standard size primers and are just as reloadable as the compression formed types. In most instances, however, they are only good for one or two reloads before they split at the mouth. A compression moulded cartridge is often reusable for anything up to ten reloads, although many split long before then.

The Reiffenhauser design has improved a little over the years. Originally the base wad was a tightly wound paper bung which had a tendency to loosen after a few firings. The modern version of the case has a solid plastic base wad which does not give trouble in this regard.

The interesting aspect of the Reiffenhauser case is its parallel case walls due to the fact that it is made from plastic tubing. When compared to a compression formed case with its tapered case walls, there is a significant difference in the internal shape of the two cases.

To put it in simple terms: the Reiffenhauser case has a larger internal diameter and greater capacity. This has a substantial effect on the burning rate of the powder and the type of wad that should be used to load it.

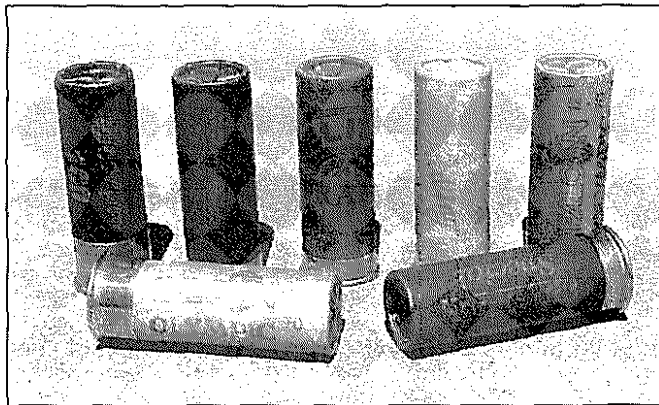
If one studies the ADI Hand Loading Guide, there are separate pages of loading data for compression formed cases and the straight walled Reiffenhauser type. The latter requires approximately two additional grains of powder to produce the same muzzle velocities as the former. That's probably another reason why most hand loaders prefer the

compression formed case - it's cheaper to reload!

Whilst some shooters consider it a disadvantage to reload Reiffenhauser cases because of the extra powder required, it's not all bad news if one looks beyond the velocity and powder weight figures.

The breech pressure differences are considerable and cartridges loaded with Reiffenhauser type cases operate at approximately 1500-2000 psi less pressure for a given velocity. This is brought about by the fact that the larger case capacity effectively reduces the burning rate of the propellant and it behaves in a manner similar to that of a slower burning powder.

According to ADI data for compression formed cases, a one ounce [28 gram] trap load at 1250 fps using 18.5 grains of AS-30 powder produces 9750 psi pressure. On the other hand, 20.0 grains of the same powder in a straight

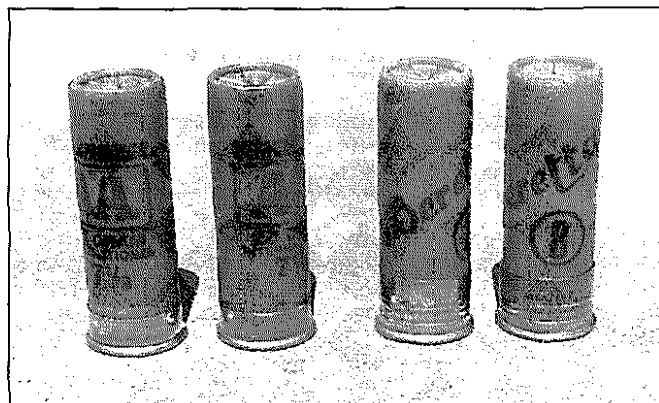


Some cartridges of the Reiffenhauser type. Shown are: Fiocchi, Falcon, Scorpio, Jialing and Champion. There are many others.

walled Reiffenhauser case gives the same velocity at a pressure of 8200 psi, a difference of 1550 psi. So that makes these so-called "throwaways" very reloadable indeed!

The figures quoted are from the second edition of ADI's Handloader's Guide. It is interesting to note that a similar comparison using the first edition for reference shows a 3000 psi difference? Regardless of why there is this discrepancy, it is obvious that Reiffenhauser type cartridges operate at considerably lower pressures.

Firing low pressure ammunition must be easier on the gun that fires it. It also gives the added bonus of a greatly increased safety margin and less perceived recoil.

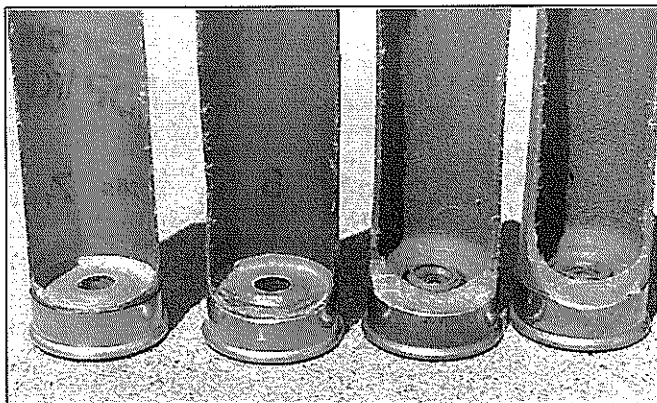


Winchester and Beretta cases are of the one piece compression moulded variety. These shells are more expensive to manufacture, but give many reloads before splitting at the mouth.

Another aspect of lower breech pressures is the fact that there is less deformation of the shot pellets as they are accelerated towards the muzzle. As deformed pellets are inclined to wander out of the main pattern area, the less they are deformed, the better the quality of the shot pattern.

All things considered, The Reiffenhauser case has a lot of favourable aspects.

Something should be said at this stage regarding the type of wads used in Reiffenhauser cases. As their internal shape is different, they require a wad which is compatible to that shape.

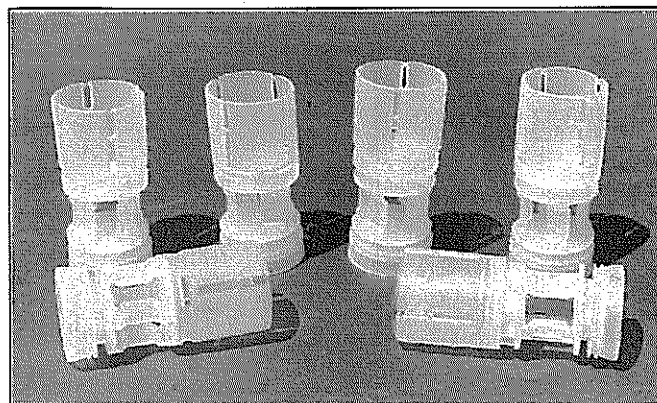

To explain further: the cup which covers the powder charge and seals the gas pressure upon firing should have the same out side diameter as the cup that holds the shot charge. Wads intended for use in taper walled compression formed cases have a smaller powder cup. It is, therefore, unwise to use these wads in straight walled cases with their larger internal dimensions as the wad may not seal properly when the charge ignites.

The opposite is also true. Do not put wads meant for Reiffenhauser cases into tapered cases as they may jam in the lower part of the case and not sit firmly on top of the powder charge.

Gualandi, Danarm and Borre are a few wad brand names which are often loaded into Reiffenhauser cases. Some of them are not readily available and one may have to shop around to obtain the right wad for a particular case, powder and shot combination. Remember also that not all Reiffenhauser cases are of the same internal depth and can vary by several millimetres depending on make. This internal length variation, plus the differences in volume between various powder types all add to the problem of selecting a wad of the correct length.

It is not considered good practise to use a longish wad and crush the life out of it with heaps of wad pressure so as to make it fit the internal depth of a particular case. It is far better to use a wad of the appropriate length for the case being loaded.

As the internal depth can vary depending on the make of case, it is wise to keep to a suitable case, wad and powder combination and forget about the others.

Fortunately there are a variety of wads of differing lengths and at least one of them should work in OK to give the right powder, wad and shot length so as to allow a good crimp. If a crimp has a bulging appearance at the

mouth it requires a shorter wad. If the crimp is turned in at the mouth, a longer wad may be needed.

In the early 1970s the two main cartridge manufactures in Australia were Eley and Winchester. Eley cases were of the Reiffenhauser type while the Winchesters were compression formed. Naturally the majority of hand loaders preferred to reload the Winchesters because of their superior reloading qualities.

However, most hand loaders in those days used Nobel shotgun powders and Nobel 60 was a popular choice for both trap and field loads. 23.5 grains was the recommended charge weight for a one and an eighth ounce [32 gram] load and although it wasn't said so at the time, that charge weight would have applied to loading Nobel 60 into the Eley straight walled Reiffenhauser case.

Loading data in those days wasn't as detailed as it is today and it's most unlikely that anything was ever mentioned about breech pressures or different types of cases and their internal dimensions and capacities.

Many hand loaders loaded 23.5 grains of Nobel 60 into Winchester cases, whereas, the charge should have been reduced by a grain or two. Nearly all trap shooters reloaded back then and, at a rough guess, I'd say that a good many of them were using overloaded ammunition.



Correct wad selection will prevent reloads from having either turned in or bulged crimps. While such cartridges will still work reasonably well, they do not inspire confidence and look unprofessional.

There will always be those who will overload due to either foolishness or ignorance. In the case of Nobel 60, it would appear as though many shooters overloaded due to inadequate information about the powder they were using. At that time there was a distinct lack of knowledge amongst hand loaders regarding the effects that the internal shape and capacity of a cartridge case has on breech pressures. Back then all cases were treated equally with the exception that one type was more reloadable than the other.

Today we know better. Different shaped casings create considerable variations in breech pressures and must be treated accordingly. Personally, I'll stay with the Reiffenhauser case and its low pressure characteristic.

As a gun club member I find there is no shortage of empties whether they be the straight walled variety or otherwise. After a shoot there are hundreds of fired once cases available for the taking. What some of my fellow shooters can't understand is - why I collect all the rotten "throwaway" ones?

So if you see someone picking up Reiffenhauser cases at a shoot one day, say hello, because there is every possibility that it's me.
