Tasmania 70/75 to finish in second place and Queensland 68/75 was successful in third place.





A total 238 competitors entered this event with only one shooter scoring a



Sunday morning, bright and early, red eyes and headaches but it saw all of us again on time.


Neville Owen from Albert took the Double Barrel event with a great 135/135 from Peter McDonald.

Well done, Daryl.



Point Score Overall Col Burt







Sunday morning, fine weather and blue skies greeted the competitors on Day 2 with 37 shooters to contest the 3 Championships for the day.



Cuzzo's Ramblings

From 1988 until 1993 I lived the greater part of my life in the U.S. and travelled on the Skeet Shooting "Circuit" making my living as a professional shooter. One of the questions that always comes up in conversation when recounting these times is, "If you shoot on the week-ends, then what do you do to fill in your time for the rest of the week?" To answer that question I usually run through one week in the life of a profession shooter and here it is.

The week starts on Wednesday morning, when you rise at 6.30am to catch a cab at 7.15am, which drops you off at the bus terminal in time to catch the 7.30 bus to the airport. Although I lived in Stamford, Connecticut, the nearest airport to me was LaGuardia Airport in New York City. The bus drops you off at about 8.40am, depending on the traffic, in time to catch the 9.30 flight to Chicago. All airlines in the U.S. use the 'hub' system, where you travel from point A to point B by flying from point A to a hub and then catch a connecting flight to your actual destination. I always flew with United, who I found to be an excellent airline and their major hubs are Denver and Chicago. Thus all your travel around the East Coast, the Mid West and the South, which was most of it, would be via Chicago, and any travel to the West Coast would be via Denver. This put you into Chicago around noon, depending on the weather, and thus your connecting flight would leave between 1.00 and 2.00,

By the time you collect your baggage, hire your rental car and get out of the airport it would be 5.00pm and by the time you get to your hotel, check in, move in and settle in, it is around 6.00pm and time for dinner. After dinner you usually socialise with the other shooters for a while, as they generally all stay at the same hotels, and then off to bed.

On Thursday morning you rise around 7.30am to arrived at the gun club around 9.30am, to check in, pay your entry fees and options (unless your deposit which you sent months ago to reserve your position) and shoot some practice to get used to the local conditions. You may also do some hourly rate shooting lessons with some of the local shooters, who would have arranged this in advance. All this need to be done by 1.00pm when the Doubles event starts. At 1.00pm you normally head off to the local mall, or some similar place, to have lunch and maybe do a little shopping. You return to the club around 4.00pm to shoot on the last flight at 5.00pm. The later Doubles flights are the most desirable, so provided you are well up the pecking order, you shoot on either the 4 or 5pm flight. The shoot off starts at 6.15pm and provided you shot well enough earlier, you go out and try to finish the last five to open your cashier's account. The shoot off is usually over by 7.00pm, whereupon you go off to dinner with whichever party you choose.

On Friday morning, you again rise around 7.30am to arrive at the club around 9.30am as, on the shooting rotation you have selected, you shoot two guns today, the 12 and the 20, at 10.00am and 4.30pm respectively. You finish shooting the 12 at 11.25am and are now free until around 4.15pm, you never have to referee or score as these two jobs are done by one and the same person, the referee or 'puller' as they are commonly known, who are paid employees of the gun club who take their job as seriously as you take yours. Now you go and have some lunch, either at the gun club, or some local haunt frequented by the shooters, and then fill in the rest of the afternoon playing cards or talking with the other shooters or buying nic-nacs from the trade vendors etc. You finish shooting the 20 around 6.00pm and then go and get ready for the 12 gauge shoot off, where hopefully you again add to your cashier's account. Tonight you probably go to a different restaurant with a different group of people and won't worry about getting home too early.

On Saturday morning you probably sleep in until about 9.00 and then go sight seeing around the local area as you only shoot one gun today, the 28, and you don't shoot that until about 3.00pm. You arrive at the club around 2.30 and finish the 28 by 4.20pm whereupon you hurry aback to the clubhouse to take over the place in a card game of someone who shoots at 4.30pm. Around 5.45 pm the card game winds up and you go and check the scoreboard to see how many 100s there are in the 20 and 28 as both these guns will be shot off and won tonight. You go out in the 20 gauge shoot off with 47 other people and proceed to hack away at the first six or seven pairs, wondering what is wrong with your timing and then miss both targets on 4 coming back.

This causes you to leave the field amid a fair amount of friendly ribbing, smiling on the outside, but cussing on the inside, about all of yesterday afternoon's hard work being to no avail and how the option money will barely cover your entry fees. After changing your tubes, you go back and watch someone else win the shoot off and then congratulate the winner and runner up. You then go out and finish second in the 28, but it doesn't matter too much because when it got down to the two of you, you agreed to split the money, and 'All American' ranking points for second are better than none. Following that, you and your partner are called to split a four way tie for two man team, which you win and the cash register ticks over again. Due to finalising two guns, the shoot offs don't finish until 9.15pm under lights, but it doesn't matter as no one is going anywhere

anyway, because the shoot committee is providing free dinner at the club for all comers. Around 2.00am the gun club manager throws the last of you out and you wander off home glad that you're not on the rotation that shoots on the first flight tomorrow.

Sunday morning you wake at 9.45am and wander down to the pancake parlour with the rest of your squad (who you shoot with every weekend) and have some brunch and then get to the club by 12.30pm to shoot at 1.00pm. You are 300 straight at this stage and hoping to break your 400x400 for the year, but you shoot a 98 which puts you out of the money in the 410 but puts you in a three way shoot off for 3rd, 4th & 6th in the High Over All (there were two 399s) which you win and add another \$675 to your account. Within twenty minutes of the last shoot of finishing, the cahier announces that pay outs are ready and you can go and collect your winnings, say your good-byes and return to the hotel, where you have a quiet dinner with your two man team partner and his fiance and get an early night.

Monday morning you rise at 7.00am, check out of the hotel at 8.00am, arrive at the airport at 8.45am, de hire your rental car and catch the shuttle bus to the domestic terminal. You arrive there at 9.15am to check in your luggage and catch the 10.00am flight to Chicago and retrace your steps home. You eventually get there at 10.15pm after several delays on the way caused by bad weather in Chicago, traffic back up keeping you in a holding pattern over La Guardia and a wreck on the Interstate #95 throwing the bus schedules out of whack.

So what does that leave? Tuesday! Good old Tuesday! The busiest day of the week. You rise at 7.00am to unpack your suitcase, do your laundry and repack it again. Then you go to the post office, collect your mail and return home and go through it. After replying to your mail and paying your bills you go via the Post Office on your way to the grocery store, the barber, the dentist, the travel agent and the bank. After all your errands are done you hurry home to make a number of phone calls, during business hours, to order some more shells, order a new chamber for the bottom tube of your 20 gauge tube set and a tighter choke for the top barrel of your 410, and query an entry on your credit card account. After dinner you make several more calls to locate a late payment from a shoot last month, organise another shooter to fill a spot on your squad next week and contact a shoot organiser to change a rotation time at a shoot next month. After that you write several shoot reports for your sponsors and then try to get to bed early as you have to be up at 6.30am.

So there it is! As Wayne Mayes once said to me: "It's a hell of a job Cuzzo, but someone's got to do it."

Notwithstanding the very hard work expended by members of the Condobolin Gun Club committee in preparation for the clubs program of events listed as a contribution to the Jubilee Charity appeal the attendance of shooters, particularly the locals, was lamentably small.





Dennis James Byrne 1934 - 1997

It is with great sadness that we inform our readers of the sudden accidental passing of Dennis Byrne of Michelago, NSW. Dennis was born at Queanbeyan on 14th August 1934. His parents were well known as local farmers who pioneered the Michelago region. Dennis was raised and spent all his life on the land. His interest in the outdoors like so many, developed from his early bush experiences. He was practically raised with a gun in the hand and it was not surprising to later see him develop into a crack marksman. His introduction to clay target shooting came under unusual circumstances. In 1962 fellow townsman, Les Coffey, qualified for the world championships in Cairo in the discipline of pistol shooting. A benefit shoot was organised by Merv Edlington at his property in Tuggeranong. Many came to witness that event and tested their skills for the first time.

Dennis did not travel extensively, but liked to shoot at his home club in Queanbeyan and the Cowra Gun Club. He was a continuous member of the ACTA since 1962. He won in excess of fifty championships but more than likely held a lot more than this figure suggests. He ever only contested one State Carnival, at Cowra but had tremendous success in the few Nationals that extended. He first qualified as a member of the Mackintosh International Team in 1964 in Adelaide; 1965 in Melbourne and 1972 in Griffith becoming one of the few local club members to have made the national team on three or more occasions.

At the World qualifying championships in Hobart in 1970, Dennis high gunned both days of competition to qualify with fellow clubman Merv Lyons. They both represented Australia in Phoenix, Arizona with Dennis doing particularly well coming 16th overall. This was the first time Australia had ever been represented in the discipline of Trench shooting at the World Championships. At the club level, Dennis was a fierce competitor and a true club champion. If one were to meet him in a shoot off then one knew that they had a huge battle ahead of them. On three consecutive club programs, he shot 250 breaks indicating the calibre of shooter he truly was.

In Griffith in 1972, Dennis became one of only a handful of shooters to qualify into the Mackintosh Team with a perfect 250/250. In the same year he was placed second to Alf James in the National Single Barrel with 120/121 and second to Jim Ellis in the ANZ Point Score Championship.



With a life time interest in firearms and shooting Fred

took up clay target shooting in 1979 and has been a member of the SAGC and ACTA continuously since that time.

The enthusiasm and dedication Fred demonstrated in his military service and civilian employment has also been very evident in his association with the SAGC, ACTA and clay target shooting.

Notwithstanding his obvious physical impairment Fred has never let this impediment impinge on his capacity to compete in the sport. Still a regular and keen supporter he attends nearly every Club shoot and regularly competes at other regional Clubs and continues to give a good account of himself.


There is also little doubt that Fred has become a great source of inspiration to many shooters who are amazed at his ability to wield a shotgun with one arm when many of them have trouble emulating

that skill with two. Not only encouraging by example, Fred has also over many years made himself available to coach and encourage numerous beginners in the art and skill of breaking the clay target.

If a major physical impairment has done little to diminish Fred's enjoyment of his shooting then neither has it affected his capacity to work for the SAGC, its members and all other shooters who use the facilities of the Club. By any standard Fred's service to the Club must rate as absolutely outstanding and very possibly be unequalled by any other Club member elsewhere.

A member of the Committee of Management over many years he has not only functioned in that capacity but functioned to an extent beyond what one would ever expect of an individual.

It would be true to say that for many years the Club's highly successful Wednesday practice shoots would have been difficult had it not been for Fred's unstinting volunteering of his time and labour. Similarly, he will

"General Background

Mr Atkinson, Fred to his friends and fellow shooters was born in South Australia in 1915. Raised in a small business family he grew up in the hard years of the great depression and like so many of his generation became embroiled in World War 2.

Having volunteered for military service, Fred spent several months participating in the siege of Tobruk as a mortar sergeant. Returning to the South Pacific he saw action fighting the Imperial Japanese forces on the Kakoda Trail in New Guinea. The Military career, though exhibiting bravery and devotion to duty was cut short by a bullet wound that was to cost Fred his left arm from just below the shoulder.

On returning to civilian life Fred entered the Public Service of South Australia and worked as a courier until his retirement. The same kind of dedication to duty that he exhibited in his military service was also to manifest in his civilian occupation and resulted in invariably be in attendance at Saturday practice sessions to assist in the opening of the facility, operation and loading of the traps as well as "pushing the button" whilst maintaining the scores and offering advice to shooters on how to improve their scores.

On competition days Fred is always first to arrive at the SAGC grounds to open all facilities and prepare for the days activities. During the shoot he is, despite his age, by far one of the most active members of the Club, generally single handedly conducting practice trap, replenishing trap hoppers with targets, removing rubbish and refereeing or scoring every down the line wave. Frequently one of the last to leave he will assist with the clean up and closing of the facility.

Until ill health recently forced Fred to limit his work for the Club his services even extended to coming in the day after a shoot to mop and sanitise the club-house, canteen, and all toilet facilities, mow lawns, cut all edges, rake up and dispose of all used cartridges and perform other housekeeping functions. (He still comes in the day after shoots and at least one other full day each week providing all but mopping and mowing services.)

Even more amazingly, it has been revealed that for several years he also performed similar voluntary cleaning functions for the International Gun Club when it was located at the Angle Vale site.

Such commitments would be physically demanding of anyone much younger than Fred and without his disability, so seen in this context his service is even more remarkable. It is also worth noting that these essential housekeeping activities now have to be performed for the SAGC on a professional basis and at considerable cost.

The foregoing outline of Fred's remarkable service to the SAGC is we believe a record that few have ever equalled in terms of scope for tasks performed, the time span involved and when consideration is given to physical impairment.

This service continues to be rendered notwithstanding the fact that Fred's age and a long standing chronic major illness are now beginning to impinge on his capacity to work although there is no diminution of the spirit and dedication.

In the sport of clay target shooting as in other spheres of endeavour there are those who achieve prominence via competition success while others make a name for themselves as administrators and the like. The Fred Atkinsons' of the sport though they may be less conspicuous, are however, no less important and indeed, if it were not for the efforts of individuals like him the opportunities for the champions to flourish and even the continuance of the sport would be impossible.

Fred's unassuming manner and willingness to work over such a long period would be remarkable by any measure but when all the circumstances are considered then that effort is all the more exemplary.

Fred's efforts for the SAGC were recognised in 1988 when he was accorded the Clubs most prestigious

award, Honorary Life Membership, but given his ongoing remarkable contribution it is an achievement that is an inspiration to all clay target shooters and is surely worthy of the highest commendation. The SAGC Committee of Management (and indeed most clay target shooters of South Australia and a large number of visiting shooters from interstate and overseas) can think of no more worthy a person than Fred Atkinson to receive the Presidential Medal.




