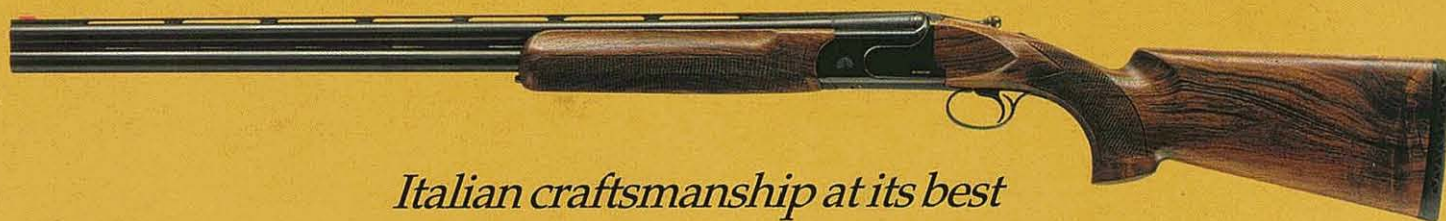

National President's Notes

GRAND AMERICAN

It is still proposed to organise a trip to the Grand American next year — 100th year — but right at the moment the Australian dollar is such that the cost of the trip will be increased quite significantly. As soon as we have a figure available, I will let you know. If you are still thinking of going, now is a real good time to start saving.

SCORE CARDS

A timely reminder to all who make entries on the score card to record each event individually. Some officials are still writing down a total of all targets shot on the day. This may be a time saving factor, but it does not help in assessing a shooter's ability. Should it be found that a substitute score may be needed to assess a shooter and remembering only a similar score can be substituted, this may be difficult if a score of 68/75 is recorded when a shooter may have shot 24/25, 24/25 and 20/25. It is also timely to ask each shooter to ensure that his card is kept totalled.

MEMBERSHIP

Our membership continues to grow with the figure at the end of May being 12, 072. This is 1,712 up on the same time as last year. However there is still a large number of members from last year that have not rejoined. If you know of anyone in this category, please encourage them to continue with their membership.

DRESS CODE

It is interesting to note that the CPSA (UK) have officially introduced a dress code to avoid damage to the public image and perception of the sport by requiring participants to present at all times a wholesome and dignified appearance whilst taking part. Specific examples of personal appearance or garments that are considered unacceptable are:

1. Nakedness of the trunk or limbs other than the lower arms or legs.
2. Wearing of shooters vests over naked flesh.
3. Sleeveless shirts or tops (other than shooting vests).
4. Cut off jeans or trousers or any type of shorts other than tailored shorts.
5. Torn, slashed or shredded shirts, jeans or trousers.
6. Military or camouflaged wear.
7. Any excessively worn, dirty or derelict clothing or footwear.
8. Any other garments or personal appearances that go against the spirit of the code or that seek to exploit any possible loophole within it.

We are certainly in the public spotlight and the creation of an image certainly has an impact on the general public's perception of shooters. Do you have thoughts on this? Please let us know what you think.

Event 2 Kangaroo Paw Challenge sponsored by Kambo's Retravision: OA: P. Mezzatesta 23/25; A: P. Melvin 25/29, 2nd R. Bailey 23/29; B grade was again won by M. Kosovich 22/25 from S. Forsyth 21/25; C grade M. Kelly 20/26, 2nd P. Chen 19/26.

Event 3 Banksia Classic sponsored by Roy Alexander (Himself) & Sons was won by P. Melvin 47/50. M. Westlake took A grade 45/51 from R. Bailey 44/51; B grade was won by R. Bessen 42/50 with M. Kosovich 2nd 41/50. Gary Quan Sing had a victory in C grade with 41/50 defeating M. Hatch 40/50.

Shim 76/100. M. Kelly was the Junior Champ with 67/100.

Overall High Gun sponsored by Roy Alexander (Himself) & Sons went to Phil Melvin 231/250, Junior High Gun was won by M. Kelly 191/250.

It was good to see two juniors attend and put the seniors to the test. Records tumble at SA State Skeet Carnival

Saturday 16th May, early morning revealed superbly presented grounds by the host SA Gun Club, the God of Skeet had smiled kindly with perfect weather, which was to last for the Carnival duration, the campers had settled in and were enjoying breakfast with locally picked mushrooms, and State administrators were nervously waiting to see if the rescheduled, revamped and extended program was to attract a good field of Skeet shooters.

They need not have worried, as 58 "Skeeties" tried their luck over the program, a large increase from 1997.

Thanks to all shooters from near and far for contributing to what was to prove an enormously successful Carnival, with some exceptional shooting. Great to welcome interstate shooters; Kevin Williams, Carmel Carlon, Rod Williams, Adrian Cousens, Karen Ellis, Mal Briggs, Craig Gray, Carol Ogden, Judith Kent, and Bob Thorne from Victoria, and Laurie Sceresini, Reg Clarke and Peter Vella from New South Wales.

Surprisingly, the first event generated only four possibles, and certainly did not reflect the great scoring to follow. Adrian Cousens with the sole 25 was successful in "AA" from Reg Clarke 30/31; Robin Freebairn 37/37 outlasted Ray Kimber 36/37 in "A"; Phil Casey 24/25 saved shells to take out "B" from Peter Caddy 23/25; and Becky Simmons 22/25 won "C" from Ray Leake 19/25.

As expected the State Handicap saw 14 shooters commence the shoot-off and after a further 44 targets (shorter than expected) the dust settled with Mal Briggs successful 93/93 from Adam Goodall 91/94 and Wayne Channing 84/89. Mal, Adam and Adrian managed 50/50 off-gun in this event.

The presentations, concluded reasonably early allowing competitors plenty of time to socialise, revisit the "Think Tank" etc.

Day 2, more superb weather, and shooters slipped into Event 3, the Festival City Skeet Championship. Only 2 possibles were recorded (suggesting perhaps that socialising was the wrong call), and following the shoot offs Overall and "AA" winner was Adrian Cousens 64/64 from Peter Vella 63/64; "A" Adam Goodall 51/52, Colin Jacobs 50/52; "B" Peter Hendy 56/58, Tim O'Connor 55/58; "C" Vito Cocca 47/56, Kevin Polst 46/56. Lady winner was Carol Ogden 47/50 and Veteran winner Reg Clarke 48/50.

Having cleansed the systems of "rust" and other socialising matter(s), the "Skeeties" again presented for the premier event of the Carnival, the South Australian State Skeet Championship, generously sponsored by Wayne Channing. Scoring in this event certainly lifted a notch or two, at the completion of the 50 targets seven shooters (4x"AA", 2x"A", 1x"B", a delighted Karen Ellis) had managed possibles and commenced the shoot-off to determine overall and grade winners. And what a shoot off it was! Karen left High 1 to breed, Mal unexpectedly dropped L2, Reg let L6 slip by leaving Adam, Adrian, Kym Holmes and Bobby Dower clean after the first round. Kym dropped (another) L2, leaving Adam, Adrian and Bob clean, this status being intact after a further 50 targets, the last 25 of which were shot in less than ideal light. The many spectators present were of the opinion that all three were shooting so well that no light at all would not have been a problem.

The shoot-off recommenced on the same layout the following morning, and as so often seems to happen, never really got going with Bob dropping H4 and Adam watching L6 go by, leaving Adrian as Overall and "AA" winner 166/166, from Bob Dower 160/161; "A" Adam Goodall 168/169, Kym Holmes 80/81; "B" Karen Ellis 50/50, Peter Hendy 49/50; "C" Vito Cocca 42/50, Robby Peek 41/50. Lady winner Karen Ellis 50/50, Veteran Reg Clarke 50/50.

A delighted Adam Goodall had secured his 200 break badge (and "AA", Adrian Cousens was sitting on 230 straight (unfinished) and the Club record of 270 odd held by Robby Thompson since 1991 was looking tenuous.

The Adelaide Skeet Championship saw three possibles, all "AA" and following the shoot-offs, Overall and "AA" Adrian Cousens 62/62, Ray Kimber 61/62; "A" Colin Jacobs 48/50, Rod Williams 59/64; "B" Judith Kent 51/54, Carmel

Carlton 50/54; "C" Brenton Deacon 34/50, Kevin Polst 39/56 (Grandson/Grandfather). Lady winner was Carol Ogden 48/50 and Veteran winner Benny Murphy 46/50.

With 292 unfinished Adrian had broken the Club record, a great achievement.

The final event, the Carnival Skeet Championship commenced and it was obvious that some of the shooters who had been involved in shoot-offs were starting to slow down a little.

Two possibles were recorded, Bobby Thorne in "AA" and Colin Jacobs in "A", and after the shoot offs, Overall and "AA" winner Bob Thorne 60/60, Reg Clarke 77/79; "A" Colin Jacobs 59/60, Robin Freebairn 48/50; "B" Peter Hendy 61/64, Tim O'Connor 60/64; "C" Kevin Polst 46/50, Brenton Deacon 44/50. Lady winner was Carol Ogden 47/50 and Veteran winner Reg Clarke 48/50.

Adrian extended the club record to 303, Brilliant.

High Gun winners were: Open - Adrian Cousens 271/275, Lady - Carol Ogden 253/275 and Veteran - Reg Clarke 262/275.

South Australian Champion Skeet Shooter; Adam Goodall 268/275.

The top five South Australian Shoulder to Shoulder Team qualifiers to represent the State at the Perth National Championships in October are Colin Jacobs, Robert Dower, Adam Goodall, Fred Guyatt and Peter Hendy.

So concluded a most successful and enjoyable Skeet carnival, with much fine shooting, the efforts of Adrian Cousens and Adam Goodall being exceptional.

Scuttlebuck around the car parks was that shooters generally had a most enjoyable time and will be back next year, "interstaters" suggesting they will encourage more of their colleagues to come along.

Please do, we thoroughly enjoyed your company and shooting expertise and we believe that with some minor "tinkering" the program can be further improved next year.

Sincere thanks to all shooters, the South Australian Gun Club and all officials and workers for a job very well done.

Following the State Council decision to move the State Trap Carnival back to the May Labour Day weekend, our shooters contested 2 Trap Carnivals in seven months.

The allocation was made to the Central Zone Club of Gemfields (Emerald). The Club was aware of the need to improve certain areas and generally raise the standard of their facilities. The result being a new toilet and shower block, trap houses and lanes renovated and new traps to name a few. Add to this the recent rain and the grounds looked great, tent city quickly appeared and catering staff got into full production and all was ready.

The three days of good weather, a little shower that passed

The Overall winner was Dennis McIntosh with a score of 129/129; taking into consideration that he had major open heart surgery only eight weeks prior to this event, a terrific effort! Runner up and taking 1st in

The Burdekin club 'shared' grade with Lawrence Falco 1st 72/75, from David O'Donnell 91/96. Ilfracombe shooter, Bevan Doyle was successful in C

grade on 73/75, and the handicapper was taking notice! Runner up in C grade was Dan Sykes with 71/75. The Womens section went to Kaye Rehbein 71/75, Adam Healy won the Juniors with 85/87 and Lyle Vidler from Kingaroy recorded 72/75 in the Veteran section.

The 50 target State Double Barrel had 156 shooters and 30 possibles were recorded, 24 in AA grade and 6 in A grade. The defending champion was Ian Merrick (Cobar). The last three shooters looked settled in for a long haul - Ray Collinson from Burdekin was first to go 213/214 - 2nd in AA grade, leaving Angus Anderson (Roma) and Ray Maroske (Terranora Lakes). Angus missed his 228th target, but Ray did exactly the same. So they settled down again, Ray missed at 290/292 giving him 1st in AA grade and Angus was the Overall winner 291/292 receiving the O.W. Smith Perpetual Cup, Winchester Perpetual Cup, State Sash, Silver Qld Badge and Cash Award.

Danny Casagrande was 1st in A grade with 59/59, from Lil Jarvis also from Rockhampton 58/59. In B grade John Cormack (Roma) was the winner 50/51, from Rob Anderson of Normanton 49/51. Cloncurry shooter Darryl Grant won C grade with 52/55 from Malcolm Stokes of Gemfields 51/55. The Womens Double Barrel was won by Lil Jarvis 50/50

from Liane Robertson of Silkwood 47/50. The Robertson name popped up again in the Junior section with Steven recording 65/65 to win from Josh Walsh (Clermont) 64/65. The Veteran winner was another Kingaroy member in Karel Srb on 47/50 from Barry Nasser (Clermont) 48/52.

Our deepest sympathies to Nancy and the family.

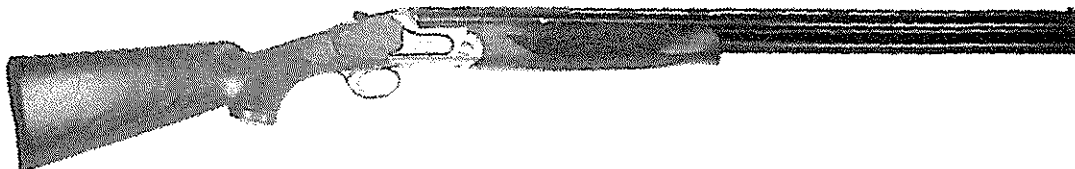

The A grade winner was Bill Hine of the home club 99/100, from Trevor Jones of Wangaratta and Simon Hewitt of FAGC.

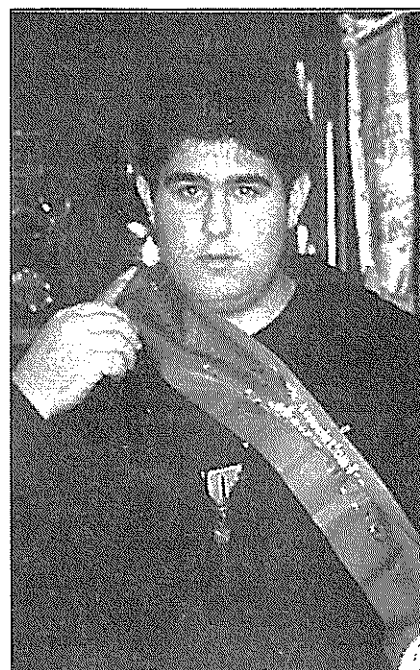

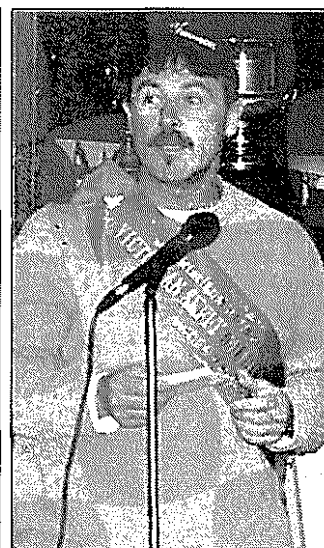

This World Cup was the first World Cup to be held in 1998, and one of two World Cups where women can gain quota spots for their country in Trap and Skeet.

Thanks to the Australian Sports Commission we were able to assemble a full team for this event.

The results that the team achieved at this World Cup were admirable and very pleasing for all given the terrible conditions that were encountered.

Double Trap: Michael Diamond winning Gold, Brett Hall finishing in 6th position in the final, and Adam Vella taking 10th placing and the Team winning Gold for Australia over China and Italy.

Women's Double Trap: Deserie Wakefield-Baynes took 6th place in the Final, Ann Maree Roberts came in 10th, and Gleniss Lawrence took 20th placing. Their Team taking 4th place.

Trap: Ben Kelley came in 5th place in the Final, Russell Mark came in 19th place, and Tom Turner came 20th and their Team also took 4th place.

Women's Trap: Deserie Wakefield-Baynes winning Bronze, Lisa Smith taking 7th place, and Dianne Reeves 20th. As a Team they were equal first placing, but on a count-back took Silver behind Russia who took the Gold medal.

Skeet: George Barton took 21st place, Clive Barton 24th and Barty Brighenti came in 67th - their Team placing being 10th.

Women's Skeet: Janine Kettles came 12th, Wendy Huehn 17th and Natasha Lonsdale came 19th.

The Team started to assemble in Sydney on Monday 16th March with Graham, Deserie, Dianne and Gleniss having to stop while the rest came in early Tuesday morning meeting at the International Airport between 7 and 7.30 am for a 9.30 am departure.

We used Singapore Airlines and the plane we had was an air-bus which

We went directly to the Shooting Complex, to put the guns/ammunition in the armoury, and then on to our hotel which was about 500 metres away - the hotel being the Forte Grande, which was a 5* hotel. A quick book in, we unpacked our bags and then went down to breakfast around 4.30 am, and then off to bed for a bit of sleep.

I was up at 11 am (not having any sleep on the plane trip) and went down for lunch where I met up with some of the Team members who had already been over to the pyramids which were only about a kilometre away from the hotel. They had a good time and had gone inside the pyramids to the burial chambers etc. and I was told that Dianne had felt a bit queasy being confined in the small spaces.

We had a team meeting that afternoon, and worked out our plans for the coming days of un-official practice and the rest of the day was spent tidying up loose ends with dinner at 7 pm.

The food at the hotel was quite good, with breakfast and dinner included in the price of our accommodation - it was 'smorgasbord' type meals. Bottled water, coffee, drinks etc were all very expensive with coffee at \$5 Australian per cup, small bottled water around \$2-\$3 Australian and the Team soon learnt that at breakfast time it paid to take extra sliced meat, rolls, boiled eggs, fruit etc. in their bags for their lunch, as the food on the offer at the gun club was not very appetising.

proved very comfortable, especially when it was only three-quarters full and the Team could have 2 seats each. The departure from Sydney went extremely well, with the airline doing everything they possibly could for us with our guns/ammunition etc. The flight to Singapore was of 8 hours duration, with a 4 hour stop-over in Singapore, where we stayed in the airport and met up with Brett Hall who had flown direct from Darwin. The flight from Singapore to Cairo was again in an airbus, this time the plane only being half full, and on talking nicely to the seat allocation staff, managed to get up to 4 seats each for the Team members, so they could get a good night's sleep - this leg of our journey taking 11 hours. Both flights were very smooth, with plenty to eat and drink, and each seat was equipped with personal videos, enabling each person to pick what shows they wanted to watch, and there were numerous games that could be played. Each seat had it's own telephone, and a couple of Team members soon found out how to call someone sitting in another seat.

We arrived at the Cairo airport at 1.00 am, being met by officials from the Egyptian Shooting Federation, who helped us through Customs, Police checks etc. After about an hour, we had our baggage/guns/cartridges, but this could have been done a lot quicker if only the Police/Customs/

Immigration people would work together a bit, but Luca said it was the quickest he had ever been through the officials in Cairo - this being his 5th visit to Egypt.

We were then told we were to be taken to our hotel, about an hours drive away, by 'limousine'! I thought that this was good service but when we saw the 3 black Mercedes that pulled in to pick us up we quickly came back to earth. In Australia 'they' would have been on their way to the scrap yard. By the time the 11 of us got into 3 cars, there was not much room left for our cases/guns etc. It was lucky that one of the cars had a roof rack where 8 suit cases ended up, being tied down with a piece of rope, while 8 very worried owners looked on. Talk about an Egyptian caravan - piled with people, bags, guns, ammunition, and with a Police escort to the entrance of the airport and then we were on our own.

As this was very early in the morning, there was only a moderate amount of traffic on the road, but we could see why the Mercedes looked so battered, and why there were so few vehicles in Cairo that had no dents - there appears to be no traffic rules, the pedestrians are 'open game' and the roads are in poor condition, cars appeared to be driven without their lights on, only using their 'parkers' and then throw in the smell, pollution and the fact that it was bitterly cold, this then was our welcome to Cairo.

A lesson we soon learnt at the hotel was not to send faxes or make telephone calls - faxes costing 30 Egyptian pounds (\$15 Aust) per page and telephone calls costing anything up to 180 Egyptian pounds (\$90 Aust) for a 3 minute call, so I utilised Luca's lap top computer for faxes of results etc on a daily basis, and the rest of the Team had family members ring Cairo instead of them ringing back home to Australia.

The following morning the Team had breakfast together and then went to the Gun Club for un-official practice - as there was no 'official' buses running as yet, we walked over to the shooting complex and as I have said previously 'no road rules' and that 'pedestrians are open game', I am glad that we only had to walk this distance once and that we got there safely.

The Egyptian Shooting Federation grounds cater for all disciplines of shooting, small bore, rifle, pistol, big bore and of course clay target. The complex is quite large and is run by the Egyptian army. It is very old and is in a run-down condition - fitting in with most of Cairo. After collecting our guns and ammunition we caught a bus out to the shotgun range, inside the complex, and for most of us it was our first look at the ranges.

I must say that I have heard much about the ranges here in Cairo, but I was still quite surprised when I saw them, as was most of the Team. There were 3 grounds with the Skeet superimposed over the Trap layouts, they were on split levels, and the lot looked like it had been sighted in an old disused sand pit with the sand being a very bright golden colour. The construction of the trap houses were not as we are used to in Australia, in fact the ground was level with the bottom of the trap house as in Australian DTL shooting; the shooting positions remaining at the height of the roof (in Cairo), this I believe giving a false impression of the height and angle of the targets. The equipment used was Spith, using black targets which were very, very hard to break. After each day of shooting, all the broken pieces of clays had to be rolled into the sand to make visibility better, and this was done with a truck dragging a chain and men pulling round concrete pipes along. At the end of the day's shooting it was very hard to see the targets amongst the broken ones laying on the background of sand. Un-official practice saw one trap used for Double Trap and two for Trap.

Two of the trap layouts were set up terribly with most targets going 100+ metres and at atrocious angles. The weather for most of the competition varied from 12 degrees C to 27 degrees C, with gusty winds and sand storms. The wind was bitterly cold. We finished shooting about 1.30 pm, with all shooters having had enough of the targets, the harsh conditions, and the visibility.

The Club House at the shooting range was quite good providing you got there early and staked your claim for position on the lounges. The toilets were very clean, in fact some of the cleanest I have seen, and there were always cleaning attendants on hand at all times. The biggest battle was to buy cartridges and practice tickets, as the people handling these did not speak English very well. The only shells available for Trap were Victory 7, and there were Fiochi and Miochi available for Skeet in 9. Michael's cartridges did not arrive and I spent about a half a day chasing around Cairo, by telephone, only to be told that the government regulates all shops in the brands of shells/guns that can be sold, so Victory only were available. (We think our gun laws are harsh!).

This evening the Team was invited to go to the Australia Club at the Australian Embassy to meet the new lady ambassador and her staff. I hired a mini bus to take us down town, about an hour and a quarter drive in peak hour traffic, and when we eventually found the Embassy rooms we were all disappointed as the Ambassador was not even there. Drinks had to be bought with coupons. After waiting for about an hour, the Ambassador finally arrived, she was very friendly, was introduced to all Team members, and spent some time chatting with Russell and Deserie, and she introduced us to all other Australians present at the Club. We returned to the hotel for dinner and an early night.

Up early Thursday morning for another un-official practice day, where everyone had 2 rounds. We finished practice at 1 pm and went back to the hotel where Luca, Deserie, Gleniss, Ann Maree, Lisa and I hired an old 6 seater taxi, for we wanted to go down town to have a look at the famous bazaar, where there are thousands of little shops off cobbled streets in old Cairo - seemed almost like a rabbit warren. Luca was after some special spices and the rest of us just wanted to have a look and do the 'touristy thing'. Our taxi driver was a happy-go-lucky young bloke who wanted to take us everywhere, except for where we wanted to go. After many arguments we finally got to the bazaar, and spent a couple of hours looking around, plenty of arguments over prices and quality, and we ended up leaving there not buying anything.

We did however have plenty of offers, of up to 200 camels, for Ann Maree and Lisa, they like blonde girls, but what on earth were we going to do with 200 camels!! On our way home we went to a papyrus shop to see how they make papyrus paper and paint it. Deserie and I ended up buying 3 each, probably paid too much for them, but we like them. We arrived back in time for dinner and had an early night.

Friday saw everyone up early again and going off for practice at the gun club. I am glad that we had come early and had plenty of practice, as everyone seemed to be coming to grips with the conditions, ie. weather, background etc., and were feeling much happier with their shooting. Luca was doing a splendid job giving everyone small tips on different things, and all of the Team were using and asking for Luca's help - what an asset to Australian Shooting this man is! By this time all Teams

from the participating countries had arrived and the ranges were full of people. My time seemed to be spent buying extra practice tickets, cartridges, trying to sort out entry fees, paying bills and the biggest problem of all seemed to be trying to change American Express travellers cheques into American \$. All you can get is Egyptian pounds from the banks, but the Egyptian Shooting Federation only wanted American \$, not even travellers cheques. Everytime I went to the bank I was told 'come back later, we don't have enough American \$ here right now', this went on for days and it was very frustrating.

After practice was completed and all other business had been taken care of at the shooting range, Ann Maree, Lisa and I hired another taxi and went to the local bazaar and spent a couple of quiet hours doing the shopping we had missed out on the day before. Back to the hotel for dinner and an early night.

Saturday was the last day of un-official practice with everyone again having a couple of rounds and making their final preparations for the start of the World Cup.

As Australia was first up for practice, Official practice starting on Sunday, we had our usual Team meeting and then for something different on Saturday night some of the Australian Team and United States Team went to the English version of a laser light show at the pyramids. This show went for about an hour, with laser lights and a full story of how and why the pyramids were built. It was all very moving, sitting in the dark at the base of the pyramids and sphinx, and when we left the show we all felt very humble and emotional at the building of these wonders. A thoroughly enjoyable experience.

Sunday and up at 5 am to get ready to start shooting at our practice time of 7 am. The weather was not too bad. All shot well at official practice, but Dianne was still having trouble with her call, and the microphones and wearing too many layers of clothing. As the Opening Ceremony was being held at 3 pm we all went back to the hotel to change into our official uniforms and we gave Ann Maree the honour of carrying the Australian flag.

Australia was the first country to be presented to the assembled crowd, and the UIT President and his wife. Our Team marched off when it was our turn, and we went into the main building and up to the first floor - this we did with all the other teams following. When we got there and asked what they wanted us to do next, none could understand English or knew what we were supposed to do, so we all ended up going back down stairs to watch the rest of the Opening Ceremony which included Egyptian dancing horses. Poor old Ann Maree - she was so embarrassed with all the ribbing that we and the American Team gave her that she vowed never to touch the flag every again (I had been alongside her when she was told to go upstairs following the march past, but I think somewhere the organisation had been a bit confused), so it was not her fault that she had led us on a wild goose chase, and in fact she had made a very good 'flag bearer'.

The squadding lists were out by now and we had a Team meeting. Ben was in squad 3 in the first wave at 7 am, the worst possible trap you could get for such an early start. The only trees around the shooting ground were on the right hand side of trap 3, and with black targets swinging right into the tree line along with the smog and haze, the targets were nigh on impossible to see. Early to bed.

Monday - the start of the World Cup. Weather conditions cool and hazy in the morning with a temperature expected to get around 24 degrees C.

Ben being in the first wave was out shooting at 7 am and posted a score of 23/25. Lisa was the second Australian to shoot and her score was 22/25. Dianne Shot in the same wave as Lisa and she managed 21/25. Deserie was up next, on trap 3 with the grounds still being very hazy but getting better, and she shot a credible 24/25. Russell came up next on trap 1, and he shot a score of 21/25. Tom was the last to shoot the first round and he shot a 24/25.

The weather for the day wasn't too bad and at the end of the day we had mixed results, with Ben finishing in equal 3rd position on 71/75 (with 3 others), behind 2 shooters on 73/75. Tom finished with a 69/75, and Russell on 65/75.

We had hopes of having two of our Team in the Women's Final for Deserie was already filling 3rd place and Lisa was to shoot off for the 6th position, against a girl from Spain. Deserie was placed 3rd on a score of 67/75 behind an Italian shooter and a Spanish shooter who had just set a new World Record by shooting a score of 69/75. Lisa however dropped her first target of the shoot off for the 6th position, so allowing the girl from Spain into the Final on a score of 65/75. Dianne finished on 59/75 in 20th position.

By the time they got around to setting up the trap for the Women's Final, a cold wind had sprung up. Now we had high hopes for Deserie,

as she was shooting really well. We then had our first sight of the black flash targets, and they were no different to any other flash targets seen around the world. With numerous broken targets and them being so hard that they were difficult to break, the Final was very exciting with the lead changing quite a bit. In the end it was the Italian who finished with a score of 20/25, giving her an 89/100, and a new World Record and Gold medal. Deserie having shot a 19/25, and the Spanish girl a 17/25, giving them a tied score, had to shoot off for the Silver and Bronze medals. Deserie missed her 2nd target and had to settle for another Bronze medal, but given the cold wind that she had to tolerate and the amount of broken targets that had been thrown, this was a really good effort, and everyone was very proud of her.

Our Team (Women's) ended up equal first with Russia, but they were beaten on a countback, and had to settle for the Team Silver medal. Presentation was held in front of the main Club House just on dusk and a good crowd attended. It was a very proud moment for Australia - trophies received by the shooters were lovely. At the completion of the presentation Deserie and I headed for the Drug Testing Unit, and the rest of the Team headed back for dinner and an early night.

Adam and Michael were arriving tonight, and I was to go out to meet them, but the Shooting Federation officials refused to take me out with them as they said they were able to handle all incoming competitors.

Tuesday - Another 7 pm start, with two of our shooters, namely Ben and Tom, very nervous, and Russell just extremely disappointed at his shooting the day before. Russell shot first posting a 25 and only pulled 2 second barrels and really looked the true champion that he is. (The organisers were only using two of the layouts with the third being set up for Double Trap practice). Ben shot a score of 24 and was looking really good and Tom shot a 21 and was very angry with himself. Russell's second round was a 22, finishing on 112/125, Tom shot a 22 to give him a score of 112/125, and Ben shot another 24, giving him a score of 119/125, and going into the Final in 3rd place. While all of this was happening, Michael, Adam, Brett and the girls all had un-official Double Trap practice, and all had shot reasonably well.

Time for the Open Final - An Italian and a Czech both on 120/125 were in front of Ben on his 119/125, and again by the time everything was in readiness for the Final, the wind had again sprung up, and the temperature was dropping. Once again the targets were, to say the least, terrible, with many broken targets being thrown and the lead seeing-sawing throughout the Final. Venturini of Italy on 144/150 won Gold over Kiernan of the United States who took Silver with 142/150. Both had shot a 24/15 in the Final, and then Ben had to shoot off with two others when following the Final they all were on 141/150. This was for the Bronze medal. Ben missed his first target which was an extremely nasty little target giving him the placing of fifth in the Final. Bronze went to another Italian. Ben was very disappointed, but we all thought he had put up a valiant effort on Australia's behalf and we were still proud of him.

We all returned to the hotel feeling sad for Ben and as the Trap Team of Tom, Russell, Ben, Dianne and Lisa were leaving tonight at 9.30 pm, they all did their last minute packing while the rest of us went to an official presentation show and dinner at the Pharaonic Village which is on a little island in the middle of the Nile, in the centre of Cairo. This had a make believe tomb of Tutankhamen, showing his burial chamber etc. and then there was an open air show followed by a dinner, where all participants were presented with a souvenir medal. The open air show was spoken in the Egyptian language and the weather was bitterly cold and a lot of people present began to leave. The hall where the dinner was held was packed with twice as many people that it should have held, and when we received our entree, an inedible deep-fried concoction, we also decided to leave and caught a boat back across the river where we hired 2 taxis and returned to our hotel. We all went to bed without having eaten a proper meal. Once again I was refused permission to accompany our Trap Team to the airport, and to await the arrival of our Skeet Team who were coming in on the same plane. This situation was very disappointing to me - the only way I could have overcome this would have been to hire a taxi and to take myself to and from the airport for the cost of around 220 Egyptian pounds, and even then I would not have been allowed into the airport to meet the incoming Team, because of the security etc. So I met the Team when they arrived at the hotel, to make sure everything was ok, and that they had got through Customs etc. without any hassles. Official Double Trap practice tomorrow.

Wednesday - Up at 5 am and out to the range for our 7 am start - Australia being first up each day. Practice started off well until Gleniss broke a firing pin on her 6th and 7th pair which forced her to retire so we could replace it. After a repair such as this you soon find out who your friends are when you try to fit into a squad to resume your practice. In the end we had to fit her in between two squads and she had to shoot a round by herself in order to catch up with the rest. This is not

easy when there are nearly 100 competitors all wanting a practice. We finished our practice of 3 rounds each early in the afternoon and returned to the hotel to relax and to do any last minute shopping, as the Double Trap Team were to leave the following night after the full day of competition.

We held an informal Team meeting over dinner and all went to bed looking forward to a successful Double Trap competition.

Thursday - Double Trap competition started at 7 am with the weather forecast giving a day of strong winds with a temperature of around 23 degrees C - not very pleasing! Some of the locals went as far as to say we could end up having a sand storm during the afternoon - this proved correct and a terrible day it was weather wise.

The targets were so unpredictable, all shooters had problems and yet considering the conditions that were encountered, some really good scores were posted - Michael shooting a 135/150, Brett a 131/150 (this included one round of 38) and Adam shooting a 129/150 (this too including a round of 39). Deserie shot a 98/120, Ann Maree a 94/120 (feeling out of sorts with stomach cramps and a sore face) and Gleniss an 87/120 (suffering from a stomach upset) shooting a last round of just 27, dropping 4 of her last 6 targets.

As the last squads were being put through with the weather getting worse by the hour, and the horizon being blackened by an oncoming sand storm, blown by an icy cold wind, all eyes were on the score board for both men and women.

Michael came in second position, with a score of 135/150 having shot (44,45,46) behind Bo Li of China on 136/150 with two shooters on 134/150 and five shooters having to shoot off for the 5th and 6th positions in the Final. - Brett being one of this five. After just 2 pair, Brett came into position 5 for the Final.

Deserie proved again what a champion she is by coming in the 6th position for the Final with her 98/120, while the other girls places were Ann Maree 10th and Gleniss 20th and as a Team they came in 4th place.

The Women's Final was shot first and what a Final it was with very low scores being shot where everyone had a chance to win. Kimberly Rhode of the USA came out the winner with an 138/160 over Hengping Ding of China on 135/160 and An Focan of Belgium on 132/160. Deserie finished in 6th place after having shot a 26/40 in the Final. Given the terrible conditions all the finalists for both the Men and Women deserve nothing but praise.

Then came the Open Final, and the weather conditions had deteriorated even further. The pairs were getting that bad and inconsistent

that the Italian shooter started refusing pairs and this he did once too often, for the Judge then called them 'lost' birds. Michael missed a couple of targets early and then all eyes were on Bo Li, but as the Final progressed it was only Michael who seemed to handle the bad targets the best, shooting a 41/50, Bo Li a 36/50, and Brett not handling the conditions well at all, shot a 29/50, leaving him in 6th placing.

Congratulations - Michael won Gold, Bing Zhang of China took the Silver, and Sergio Pinero of Spain, the Bronze. Adam came in 10th place with his 129/150. Australia won the Team Gold medal from China and Italy. What a day for Australia - Michael proving that he is the best all round shooter that the world has in it today.

Presentations were held in some of the bleakest weather you could possibly imagine, but this did not deter the enthusiasm shown by the Australian Team.

After all the presentations, drug testing etc. was over, it was back to the hotel to finalise packing, showers etc, for the Double Trap Team and I were leaving at 9.30 pm. The airport was closed for a short while due to the sand storm, but was open for our plane to take off at 1 am, leaving Luca and the Skeet Team to finish off Australia's attendance at the World Cup in Cairo and the following is the report that Luca has made of the Skeet competition.

Cairo World Cup, 19-29th March 1998

Skeet Competition Report

The Skeet Team comprising Barty Brighenti, Clive and George Barton, Neil Rundle (MQS position) and Wendy Heuhn, Janine Kettles and Natasha Lonsdale arrived in Cairo on the 25th March so they had a couple of days to recover from the long trip, before becoming involved in the official training and competition. The atmosphere within the Team has been really good with everyone always available to support his/her team mates. The official training has immediately shown, as happened with the other disciplines, just how hard the competition was going to be, due to the more than 100 participants (meaning early morning starts at 7 am) and the weather conditions with sand storms and poor visibility. The three layouts were set very differently one from the other, making the official training very difficult for everyone, including those shooters from the strongest countries. However the preparation was good, and a great excitement could be felt within the Australian Team members.

On the 28th March, the competition started at the usual time of 7 am. The Australian Team started off really well with an amazing 96/100 (Barty and George having shot 25's and Clive and Neil shot 23's). The start was not so good for the girls, as they probably felt a little too much responsibility at being the first female Skeet team to represent Australia overseas. They still need a lot more experience, having been shooting Skeet for such a relatively short time. Janine Kettles was the only one from the Australian women's team to be able to shoot consistently over the score of 20/25, finishing with a 63/75 in 12th position. The Women's competition was won by Shan Zhan from China, an old acquaintance of mine in the skeet world, having been a winner at the Olympic Games in Barcelona in 1992, in front of all the male participants, myself included!

The second round for the boys was still very good with Barty (24), average for Clive (23), a bit of a problem for George (21) and consistent for Neil (22) at his very first international experience, and after one year of having practiced skeet shooting. In his third round Barty definitely couldn't handle the pressure of being in a leading position in a World Cup, and shot a terrible 19 through inexperience. This will be of great importance for his baggage of experience. Clive shot his third 23 for the day, as did George, and Neil finished off with a 21.

The following day George shot (23+25) and Clive (25+23) finishing on 117/125, while Barty shot (23+18), probably still disappointed for his bad round of the day before, and could only manage to shoot a score of 109/125. Neil Rundle (22+23) finished with a total of 111/125 that, in the way it had been shot, shows the consistency of this boy, and his strong basic preparation.

In the afternoon everybody watched an exciting Final where Benelli (Italy) and Graves (USA) with 123/125, Heinrich (Germany) and Bechynsky (Czech) on 122/125 and Eklund (Finland) and Falco (Italy) on 121/125 disputed the victory. The assured spectacle of having seen six top shooters performing all together under pressure has been, at the same time, a very useful and practical demonstration for the Australian Skeet Team members. In the end Benelli won with a perfect score of 25/25 in the Final.

In conclusion, as I have previously said, the whole trip has been very good for everybody, and no problems of any kind have been encountered. I personally think the Australian Skeet Team has done a good job, and the proof of this has come through the many signs of sympathy

from members of foreign teams that came to congratulate us, particularly for the terrific effort made in participating with new female shooters.

Thank you team mates, it has been a great experience for everybody, and I am sure it will be remembered and used for your future reference.

As you can see by reading this report, the conditions that our competitors shoot in and some of the countries they have to go to are far from perfect and are not the easiest of places in the World to compete.

I have heard many times around the gun clubs just "how good these overseas trips are" and that "our international shooters have everything given to them".

I would like to take this opportunity to let the shooters of Australia know a few things that our international shooters put into their sport.

Not only is the cost of training their own responsibility but they have to actually go to the Nationals (which could be anywhere in Australia) to get into the training squad, then they have to attend a series of eliminations (all at their own expense) and once selected for the teams they have to pay between \$1000 and \$1500 per trip towards airfares, buy their own cartridges, pay for any un-official practice (this is usually US\$7 per round of 25t), pay for all their inoculations which can cost up to \$200 per trip depending on where they go and how long since they have had their last shots, pay for their own meals (lunch and dinner), plus phones, faxes etc to keep in touch with those at home and lastly put up with the conditions that most shooters in Australia would not even tolerate.

All of these shooters are to be commended and are willing to help anyone further their shooting ambitions so next time you see one of them, introduce yourself and take time for a chat, I am sure you won't be disappointed.

In conclusion I would like to thank all of the team members for making this trip a most pleasant experience. There was not one cross word spoken for the whole trip and everyone gave support to each other. We even had a lesson in didgeridoo playing from Brett Hall at the gun club where many of the competitors were amazed that Brett could get such a fine tune out of a piece of brass pipe.

I would like to thank Luca on behalf of the team for his help and friendship given to us all. Australia is very lucky to have Luca as our Coach as there are many other countries trying to entice him away from us.

Thanks to the whole team for what has undoubtedly been, a most memorable trip.

BRUNEI DARUSSALAM WORLD CUP & GRAND PRIX

MAY 1ST-7TH, 1998

Thursday 30th April saw the majority of the team, to participate at the World Cup and Grand Prix in Brunei, assemble at the Brisbane International Airport to board the Royal Brunei Airlines flight to Brunei Darussalam. The team consisted of Trap: John Maxwell, Adam Vella, John Gilopidis and Nino Pedulla (MQS), Diane Reeves, Iona McJames and Suzie Balogh; Skeet: David Cunningham, John Summers, Barty Brighenti and Neil Rundle (MQS); and Double Trap: Geoff Lancaster, Steve Atkins, Nathan Cassells and Gleniss Lawrence (Double Trap shooters only flying in on the 2nd May) and Coach, Greg Chan and Team Manager, Graham Michell.

Royal Brunei Airlines went out of their way to make everything as easy as possible, with all of the preliminaries, before leaving Brisbane, and they gave us preferential seating on the 767 for the flight which was to be of 7+ hours duration (via Darwin where we were to pick up Greg Chan). We left Brisbane at 11 am with an excited team of shooters but none more so than Suzie Balogh, this was her first trip overseas and she was really keen to do well. Our time for arrival in Brunei was 5.30 pm (which is only 2 hour behind EST).

We were met at the airport by the Organising Committee personnel who gave us first class attention through Immigration and Customs and then introduced us to our liaison officer who took us to our accommodation at the Centrepoint Hotel - a very nice hotel with comfortable rooms and all facilities close at hand. After an evening meal and a team meeting where plans were made for the coming week we all went off to our respective rooms for a good night's sleep.

The Brunei Darussalam Gun Club is undoubtedly the best gun club in

the world with excellent facilities. The grounds consisted of 7 layouts, 4 having Skeet and 4 having Trap with the centre layout directly in front of the Club House (not your usual Club House) being superimposed. All the throwing equipment was Mattarelli which threw Mattarelli fluoro targets and Piattelli flash targets for the Finals. All of the targets that were thrown were as close to being perfect as you could get, all the grounds were under lawn and there were many thousands of pot plants covering the mounds separating the layouts. The majority of the background was jungle green rainforest - all in all making this one of the most beautiful settings for a gun club, in the world.

Most of the layouts had electronic score boards and were fully manned by competent Referees, Jurors and local workers. Australia was very ably represented by Peter Strike, Jim Kelly and David Menck (Jury), Peter Quire (Chief Referee) and Glen Woodhatch and Vince Mollica (Referees). All these people were later commended for a job well done, especially Peter Quire who at the request of the Prince was asked to present the bouquets of flowers to the winning Trap teams, an honoured role to be bestowed on Peter. Well done to all.

The temperature for the whole carnival was around 35 degrees Celsius with the humidity in the upper 80-90 percent, making conditions very hard for people who were not used to this - Diane Reeves however reveling in the heat: - no need for 3 layers of clothing here!

There was a huge food tent, fully airconditioned, which was nearly as big as a good sized circus tent and there were also 2 'shooters amenities' tents which housed 8-ball tables etc. in them, a big administration

tent and a large armoury bunker, all of which were airconditioned. Breakfast, lunch, afternoon tea and all iced drinks on the ranges were provided 'free of charge' and the food supplied catered for everyone's taste and was presented as though we were at a 5* hotel.

On picking up our guns/ammunition daily we were then transported to the shooting range on the very best golf buggies manned by army personnel - what a service. The ammunition available was Eley, Remington, Fiochi and Winchester in both Trap and Skeet sizes, all for \$7 (US) per packet. After talking to Michael (who was in charge of all the shooting equipment) I was able to obtain lockers for all of our shooters, in the main Club House and these were equipped with polished

What a barbeque that was! Everything you could possibly eat and as is the case with everything in Brunei, 5* treatment, and it would be the first barbeque that I have ever been to, or seen, where at the end of the night there were still trays of barbequed 'lobster tails' left uneaten! We all left having eaten too much but made many new friends and renewed old friendships - a wonderful night had by all.

Saturday, 2nd May - Official practice day. Out to the range by 8 am to make sure we were able to reserve a table for our shooters under the airconditioned verandah - this seemed to be our number 1 priority each day because if you could position yourself under the airconditioners and fans it made life much more comfortable. All of the team coming

to grips a little more with the humidity and generally feeling happier after their rounds of practice. In these conditions head bands, wrist bands and hand towels are a 'must', as was keeping up their fluid intake, and being able to shower between rounds was a big help. With both Skeet and Trap shooting going on at the same time on all the ranges, Greg and I were kept flat out keeping up with the shooters at practice. Practice was completed at 3.40 pm as the grounds were being put into readiness for the Opening Ceremony which was to be held at 7.30 pm.

Back to the hotel to rest and prepare for the evening and as this was to be a formal dress occasion we all dressed up in our uniforms. As our 4 Double Trap shooters were scheduled to arrive at 5.20 pm, I went out to the airport to meet them and to see if they could be rushed through Customs etc., and then get them back to the hotel to change and still make it to the Opening Ceremony in time. This was going to be a 'touch and go' situation at the best of times, so upon meeting the boys from the armoury and telling them of my predicament, they promised to do everything they could to rush my shooters through. What a time for the plane to be 15 minutes behind schedule! Panic stations! Luckily the guns and cases were the first to come out and within a quarter of an hour everything was finalised and we were on our way to the hotel. Hurried showers and dressing saw us out at the shooting grounds at 7.15 pm only to find that the Ceremony was being held up for some dignitaries who had not yet arrived and giving us time then to sit in one of the airconditioned wings of the Club House and catch our breath.

All Teams assembled for the march pass, and following the Opening speeches the Prince walked around, shaking hands and talking to the various teams and we were treated to a spectacular laser light show incorporating music and coloured smoke. Following the Opening Ceremony we had Team photographs taken and for the next 2 or 3 days I was a very proud Team Manager for I received many congratulations by different countries for the dress and manner in which our Team had presented themselves in the trying conditions.

Our team was the largest team present with 18 competitors and 2 officials, next was Japan who had the same overall number but only 14 competitors with 6 officials. Once again showing how dedicated our shooters are, before leaving Australia and being asked if they could bring their formal wear, a number of them had to go out and buy their

marble showers which proved invaluable, for towels were provided and you could have a shower in between rounds.

Friday, 1st May - A 7.30 am departure from our hotel for a 30 minute drive to the shooting range and the first glimpse for most of our team of this very special ground. We collected all our coupons for ammunition, practice rounds and guns and went up to the range for unofficial practice where all disciplines were shooting at once. While our shooters were having their practice under Greg's watchful eye, I was busy

Most of our shooters got a good taste of the conditions and were pleased to be able to go back to the hotel in the afternoon for a rest, showers and a change of clothes, for it was back to the range at 7 pm for a barbeque 'Welcome' dinner.

Back to the hotel and o bed at around 10 pm.

Sunday, 3rd May - 7 am saw us depart from the hotel to the shooting grounds at Jerudong Park. The conditions were great as usual. Both Trap and Skeet were to be shot at the same time over the 7 layouts keeping everyone on their toes. 120 Open Trap shooters, 12 Women Trap shooters, 83 Open Skeet shooters and 4 Women Skeet shooters was a lot to get through, and the Women's Finals in both events were to be shot that afternoon. It is to be noted that the Women's events were classified as Grand Priz and had not been entered as World Cup events.

At the end of the competition on Day One, we had John Maxwell on 69/75, Adam Vella 70/75, John Gilopidis 67/75 and Nino Pedulla on 72/75.

Womens Trap saw 3 of our Women making the Final, Diana Reeves on 69/75, Suzie Balogh with 66/75 and Iona McJames on a 62/75. Diane ended up taking Silver, finishing with a 90/100 after shooting a 21/25 in the Final. Suzie came in 4th place with 85/100, and Iona taking 6th place in the Final on 79/100.

At the completion of Open Skeet's first round we had John Summers on 71/75, Barty Brighenti on 67/75, David Cunningham on 66/75 and Neil Rundle on 65/75.

The Final in Women's Skeet saw Natasha Lonsdale winning Gold with her score of 84/100 over Wendy Huehn-Adams on 78/100 with Janine Kettles taking 4th place shooting a 76/100. Australia taking Gold and Silver - what a great way to finish a day's shooting and to see these Australian ladies with grins 'from ear to ear' accepting their magnificent trophies given by the Brunei Darussalam Shooting Federation, was a day I believe none will ever forget, let alone me at seeing the emotional tears brimming in Natasha's eyes, she looked as though she would burst with pride.

These results I hoped would give our Open Skeet a boost for they had all felt the fierce pressure of the day's competition.

Monday, 4th May - The competition for Day Two was just as fierce as it had been the day before and the best placed Australian in Trap was John Maxwell on =22nd placing having shot 116/125 followed by Adam Vella =29th place with a 115/125, and John Gilopidis on =42nd place with a 112/125. Nino Pedulla leading the MQS shooters with a

120/125. The Final result was D.Grazioli (USA) taking Gold with a 146/150, M. Tittarelli (Ita) taking Silver with a 145/150, and F. Peeters (Bel) taking the Bronze with a score of 144/150.

Open Skeet results showed John Summers, the best placed Australian, with a score of 117/125 taking = 17th place, Barty Brighenti came =28th shooting a 114/125 and David Cunningham coming in =33rd place having shot a 113/125. Neil Rundle was placed in 3rd position for those shooting MQS positions and his score was a 108/125. The winner of this event, after a mammoth shoot off was El Falco (Ita), 147/150 + 12, from B. Bechynsky (Cze) 147/150 + 11, and A. Ineshin (Est) on 146/150 + 6. These three gentlemen certainly deserved their Gold, Silver and Bronze medals - the magnificent scores and Finals were befitting of such a beautiful setting.

Although Australia did not feature in any of the results of today's shooting, it did however complete 2 very memorable days of competition in both Trap and Skeet.

Back to the hotel and then the Trap and Skeet Teams, accompanied by Greg Chan, went out to Jerudong Fun Park to try out all of the rides, all free of charge, with golf buggies to transport them all around the grounds. I later heard 'on the grapevine' that a few of the shooters had wished they had not tried some of the rides, with one of them looking a very 'pale green' in colour.

Tuesday, 5th May - This was Official Double Trap Practice day and the Trap and Skeet shooters had the day off to either sightsee or shop, but most of them came out to the shooting grounds to give support to the Double Trappers. On completion of the practice, a couple of the shooters were a little disappointed with their performances but were still confident that they would do better in the competition and were looking forward to it.

With the practice over, we saw some shooters heading back to the hotel and others were still out sightseeing, so I was pleasantly surprised when Ian Hale came and told us that Prince Sufri Bolkiah had invited us (the Australian Team) to come to his home and have a look at his collection of cars, his private shooting range and had asked us to make up a 'soccer team' to play against his own personal team - soccer is another of his 'loves'. As the bulk of our shooters had finished their competition, we eagerly accepted his invitation and along the way collected two Italian television crewmen who were quite good soccer players, and Brant Woodward of New Zealand who looked the part with his bald head. A few quick phone calls to 'round up the troops' and we were off to the Prince's house.

We took this opportunity to present a Certificate of Appreciation that I had printed up prior to leaving Australia (in Gothic print on parchment paper) and framed in Brunei, which had on it all the names of the Australian Team, and a wooden kangaroo and emu, mounted on a map of Australia, that had been carved out of a mallee root by Gordon Wakefield. Both were really nice gifts to be given to the Prince.

Well, what a lot of cars - cars that most people would only dream about. What a great gesture on the part of the Prince to not only let us see them but to sit in them as well. His personal favourite is a Ferrari and this one also took the eye of both John Summers and Nino Pedulla.

We were also privileged to see his personal shooting range and for that we were equally grateful, but then it was off to the soccer range. The Prince's Team came out in their proper yellow team colours - we had red, with a few Brunei players thrown in to help us. David Cunningham and Nino Pedulla and the two Italian television crewmen were the only ones who ended up with proper soccer uniforms, and they certainly looked the part, excepting for Nino (who had to have a 'cigarette' while playing) and David (his shorts looked 'more Aussie Rules' and were a shade too tight). Well the game got underway with a lot of enthusiastic players and we got a couple of quick goals on the board. As the game progressed however, our players began to feel the heat and this was when Gleniss (our Coach) came to the fore and started to

change the players, using those 'on the bench' when those on the field collapsed with exhaustion. Natasha really looked the piece in John Gilopidis' shorts! What really took the other team by surprise was when some of our players got 'Aussie Rules' mixed up with 'Soccer Rules' and this was where things started to go wrong, with penalties going against us. I would have liked to have gone on as our 'goalie', as I could have blocked off their goal attempts, but they wouldn't use me, and the 'goalie' they allocated to us I believe was actually playing for the Prince's team, as there were far too many missed balls on his part for him to have been playing for us! The final results was 15 goals to them and 3 goals to Australia. Best on ground for Australia was John Summers and I believe he lost over a gallon of perspiration. The next time we go to Brunei, we have challenged the Prince and his team to a game of 'Aussie Rules', and let's see them win that one!

The day ended with a lovely light tea with the Prince on the verandah of the Club House at the Soccer grounds. Team photos are available on request and I bet this would be the first international soccer team that the A.C.T.A. has ever produced.

Wednesday, 6th May - All up bright and early to leave at 7 am for the shooting range. The Double Trappers all seeming eager to start. The weather was good but the humidity was a little higher due to the rain that we had over night, making things just that little bit more muggy. Entries for the Double Trap were 76 in the Open section and 22 Women, and the women were allocated one layout just for themselves to shoot on although both Open and Women's Finals would then be shot over layout 3 as usual. Steve Atkins was the first of the Aussies to shoot, then Gleniss, Geoff and Nathan. Geoff Lancaster came off the tracks after his first 2 rounds, and was very disappointed at shooting a 44/50, (as did Steve Atkins) with Nathan Cassells not coming to grips at all with the conditions and only shooting a 39/50 and a 38/50.

Gleniss is her competition manged 2 rounds of 29/40, 29/40. Steve went out and shot a last round of 42/50, which really upset him, and Nathan improved slightly shooting a 42/50 as well. Then it was Geoff's turn and I am not sure that I have ever seen such a look of determination on any ones face before. Geoff went out like a 'man on a mission' and shot a great score of 49/50, giving him 9th place overall, with his score of 137/150. Steve finished in 23rd place on 130/150, Nathan was placed 50th on 119/150, and Gleniss hoping to do better in the last round shot a 30/40, finishing with an 88/120 in 15th place.

After two really well fought out Finals, Daniele Dispigno (Ita) took Gold, shooting 189/200, Silver to Waldemar Schanz (Ger) who shot a 186/200 +6, and Bronze went to Dominic Grazioli (USA) with a 186/200 +5. The Women's Final saw Hye Kyong Son (Kor) taking Gold, shooting 141/160, Titin Indawati (Ina) taking Silver with a 134/160 +2, and Ann Focan (Bel) taking the Bronze with a 134/160 +1.

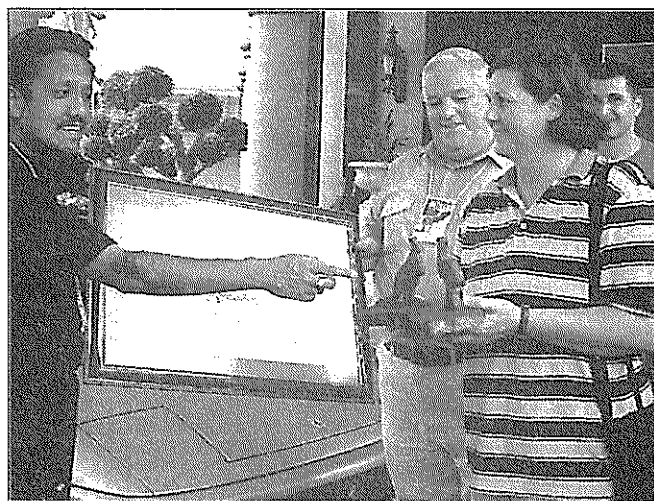
The targets for these events were as perfect as they possibly could be with all unbroken targets falling within a metre of each other.

The only sad part of this evening was that the Princes' had been unable to attend, as they had to fly out of the country on business. At the conclusion of the entertainment we made our many 'good byes' to both old friends and new ones we had made and headed back to our hotel.

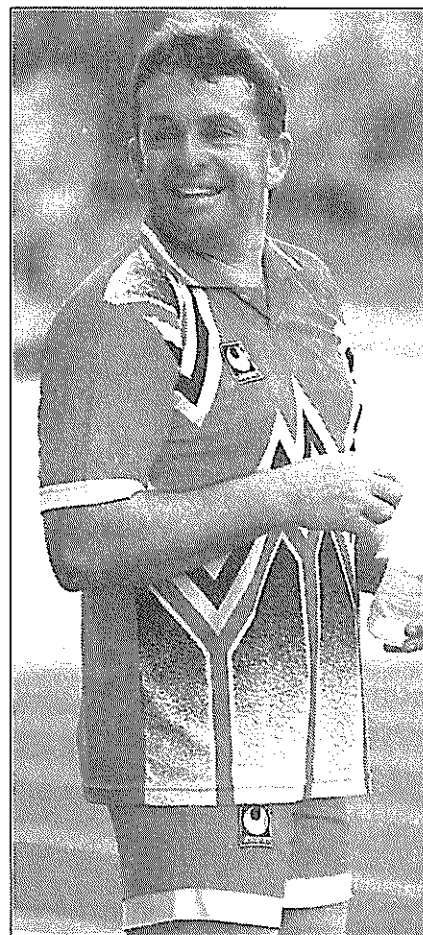

BRUNEI WORLD CUP 1998 COACHING REPORT

From the moment we stepped outside of the Brunei Airport I knew that the heat and humidity was going to be a significant factor in performances during this World Cup. Temperatures were not extremely high at around 33-34, but the humidity was in the vicinity of 80-85%.

The Brunei shooting complex is the most modern in the world, with a Club House befitting a royal family, and shooting facilities second to none. A huge dining tent and two shooters lounges were made available (air-conditioned, naturally), and the armoury took care of guns and ammo.

The complex consists of four Trap and four Skeet layouts, with the centre layouts superimposed for finals. All machinery is Matterelli, and all, bar the new Trap and Skeet range have electronic scoreboards. The background is manicured turf out to about 120 metres, then a backdrop of trees. The fluoro orange targets are very visible over the green background. Each night a sweeping machine picks up all of the wads and broken targets to give a perfect backdrop each day.

With Trap and Skeet being shot at the same time, it was difficult to get around to working with each individual every round, as we had full teams of men and women competing (12 in all). By practice day it was obvious that some were being affected by the heat more than others, but after some tips on dehydration, and trying to stay as cool as possible, most were reasonably happy with their practice.

Trap and Skeet competition was somewhat overcast with the light fading and inconsistent. This caused a few problems, particularly with the Skeet on a couple of the layouts, as the targets appeared to 'flash' in and out of visibility across the trees.

The highlight of the trap and skeet was the performance of some of the ladies. Although the competitors were very disappointing in numbers in the ladies Grand Prix, Natasha's win in the Skeet, and Wendy's second, were excellent results. Diane's second in the trap was also well

done. The best performance from the men came from Nino Pedula, who shooting as an MQS competitor turned in a 120 (5X24's).

The Double Trap targets thrown were almost perfect. They were consistent and landing within a 2 metre area, and with the great background, high scores were always needed. The best performance by the Australians came from Geoff Lancaster, who turned in a 137, including a fantastic 49 in the last round. Geoff finished in 9th place, only two targets outside the final.

The heat definitely affected some shooters and perhaps if major tournaments, such as world cups, world cup finals, or world championships, are held in Brunei in the future, some form of heat training and acclimatisation could be held in Darwin en route.

Some of the team were disappointed with their scores and most of the less experienced team members were affected by nerves and had difficulty coming to grips with the occasion. Don't waste this tournament, take this experience and learn from it, so that the next time you compete at this level you will be better equipped to handle the situation. All team members should benefit greatly from the experience of having competed at this world cup.

I would like to thank all the team for their general behaviour and positive response from a coaching point of view.

We had 21 shooters take part in the 50 target Point Score event. For A grade Neil Sinclair and Mick McGill both shot 144/150, and had to go in the shoot off to determine the winner. Mick McGill emerged the victor with 174/180, B grade went to Michael Coleman with 132/150 and C grade to Anne Coleman with 108/150.

The next event was the 50 targets Double Barrel. A grade was won by Bruce Murphy with 50/50, B grade was won by Michael Coleman with 47/50 and C grade went to Anne Coleman with 37/50. The best lady for this event was Myrtle Anderson with 43/50.

The last event of the day was the 25 target Continental. In A grade for this event, we had Neil Sinclair, Rob Cusack, Rod Cusack and Joe Sebastiani all shoot a perfect score of 25/25 and then have to head out again for the shoot off to determine who was going to be the winner. It was eventually won by Rob Cusack with 38/38. B grade was won by Michael Coleman with 24/25 and C grade had to be determined by a shoot off as well because Graham Hoyer and Anne Coleman both shot 18/25. Graham Hoyer was the eventual winner with 20/27 after Anne lost her second target. Young Joe Sebastiani junior's name was drawn out of the hat for the opportunity to shoot for the jackpot, better luck next time Joey. This marked the end of the days proceedings and now we all are getting in lots of practice for our Annual two day shoot which is on the 6th & 7th of June. The club is giving the novice shooters another opportunity to have a go at clay target shooting again by holding another novice shoot on the day we hand over the proceeds from the 23rd Annual Royal Flying Doctor Service Charity Shoot to the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

Cuzzo's Ramblings - July 1998

One of the problems that I continually run into in the course of conducting shooting schools and lessons is incorrect stance and gun mount. The correct stance for shooting clay targets is best attained by standing in a perfectly straight and upright position and adopting a foot position where neither foot is in front of the other and both feet are angled slightly outwards and your feet are spaced as wide as your shoulders. Then lean slightly towards your leading foot (left foot for right handers and vice versa) in such a way that you transfer 2/3 of your body weight to your front foot and thus assume a stance similar to that of a boxer or wrestler in the ready position. This body position will give you good balance and stability, allowing you to readily pivot about the front foot while swinging the gun, and to comfortably absorb the recoil of the gun without upsetting your balance. Your front knee should be slightly cracked while your back knee should be kept straight without being locked.

Although some prominent shooters, who shoot very well, do so from a crouched or squatting position, their good performances are probably in spite of their technically incorrect stance, rather than because of it. While watching good shooters who utilise radical stances, I often wonder how much better they might be able to shoot if they changed to a more conventional stance. I especially wonder how many of these stances will pass the test of time, when their body's natural deterioration through aging causes these unnatural stances to become less comfortable and much more prone to earlier tiring and increased fatigue.

Thus I do not advocate any crouching or squatting at all, and no more leaning than is required to obtain a 2:1 weight ratio between the leading and anchor feet. The head should be kept upright and erect at all times with the eyes as close to level as possible. The swing of the gun should originate from the lower body and be generated by the legs and waist. Provision of swing by the upper body is generally referred to as 'arm shooting' and should be avoided as far as possible. The upper body should be effectively locked, in so far as horizontal movement is concerned, and the arms should only be used to provide vertical movement to adjust for the rise and fall of the target.

Laying over or dropping a shoulder during the swing, such as many novice shooters are prone to do on shots like High Five, is equally undesirable. One of the best ways to cure or avoid this problem is to imagine that your body is supported and located by a vertical stake which rises up out of the ground between your feet and passes through your torso, neck and head and exits through a hole in the top of your cap. Now develop a smooth horizontally pivoting swing, which such an imaginary locating device would allow.

The end product of a correctly mounted gun is to have the butt positioned snugly and comfortably within the shoulder pocket, with the top of the butt approximately level with the top of the shoulder. The inside edge of the butt should be in beside the neck and any tendency to mount the gun out towards the shoulder, arm or biceps should be avoided. With the butt stock shouldered in this way, if the gun fit is correct, the side of the comb should be comfortably resting against your cheek and the top of the comb should be gently but firmly pressed up under your cheek bone. If any lowering or deviation of the head away from the upright and erect position is required to cheek the gun in this way, or to obtain the correct eye to sighting plane relationship, then your gun fit is incorrect and needs altering.

The three separate areas of stance, gun mount and gun fit are unavoidably locked together like the pieces of a jigsaw puzzle and thus inter-dependent upon one another. If one of them is wrong then one or both of the others will need to be made wrong in order to provide a compensating error so that a provisionally workable package can be obtained. Such compensating errors provide an undesirable set up, which is contrary to the basic principle of minimum adaptation. This principle encompasses the fact that the more you have to wrap yourself around your gun in order to make it fit, the more you will be able to unintentionally unwrap yourself at a critical time and thus cause an unnecessary miss. The point to be taken is that nil adaptation is a very desirable goal.

Inexperienced shooters usually start with a gun of unknown fit, mount it incorrectly, and then adapt their stance and body positioning

in order to try to make it fit. This method almost always includes a lot of head twisting and lowering as an integral feature. The correct approach is to start with the correct stance, mount the gun correctly and then alter the gun fit to provide correct alignment in this position. A reliable indicator of a correct stance/mount/fit package is to view the finished product from the front and observe a correct alignment of the master eye with the sighting plane with the head erect and the eyes level.

While still viewing from the front a correct package should have the leading arm angled down at about 45 degrees from the horizontal while the master arm should only be angled down about half this amount. A side view should show the first joint of the index finger controlling the trigger and the thumb wrapped around the grip providing between one and two inches of clearance between the thumb and the nose. The leading hand should cradle the forearm firmly but comfortably (about halfway between balancing it and white knuckling it) about half to two thirds of the way along its surface. As a general rule, gun manufacturers have a pretty fair grasp of where to position a forearm on a shotgun, and thus any attempt to grip the end of the forearm or the barrels will result in a tendency to over muscle the gun and decrease the smoothness of the swing. Conversely any tendency to grasp the rear of the forearm or the receiver will adversely decrease your ability to adequately control the gun. Upon questioning people who short grip their forearm in this way, the usual answer is that they do it in order to promote follow through. I can assure you that there is a much better way of obtaining adequate follow through than by achieving it as a by product of surrendering partial control of the gun, but that is another story for another day.

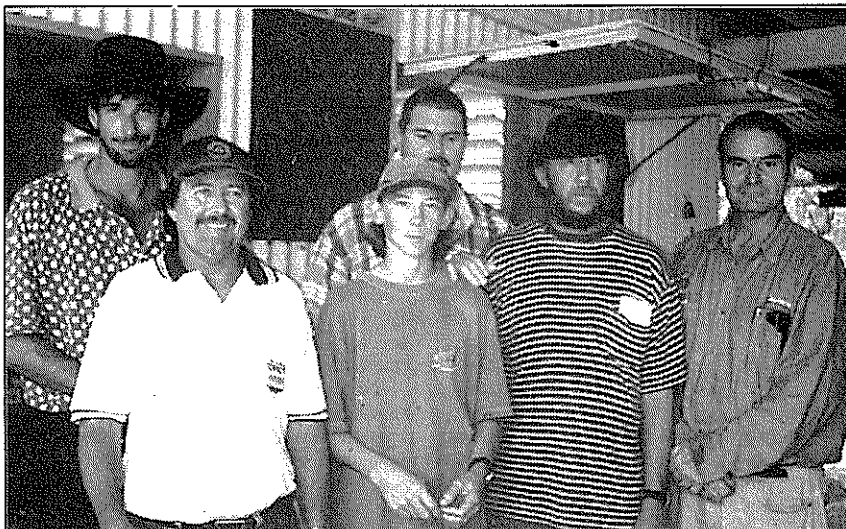

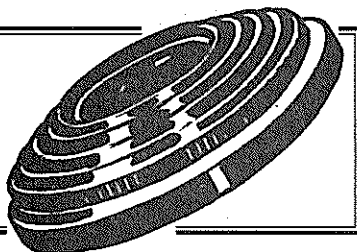

Where are they Now?

I have kept the score from the back of, it is called CTSN now, but I think then it was something like Australian Clay Target Journal, of course only where I featured with good results, did I keep.

I was lucky to win a points event with 45/45 on my first shoot of 15 targets competition. This first shoot was on 5-3-67, Shooters of the day to win were N. Shand, M. Champney, M. Jones and B. Muller. Dated 7-5-67 the winners were L. Ivans, T. Hauritz, S. Horn, E. Fayle, G. Lewis (Snr).

So as all shooters have been told, get to a big shoot, you will clean up, so I was invited to be the fourth shooter and off to Maryborough on May 1, 1967, we were from Murgon and shot at Kingaroy, so this was very new to me.

At the back of the lanes was a box in which you placed five cartridges if you wished to shoot the jackpot, placing your name in a book and the shooter with the best break for the day took all the shells, on that day it was S. Horn.

Since this shoot I have been to a lot of shoots, but have never seen a shoot start with double rise, it must have been to get you going. That program was 5pr DR, 20t SB C'ship, 20t DB, 20t Cash and a Winchester Western Trophy Handicap of 15t Points donated by F.W. Green & Co. Winners on the day being (of course some shooters took more than one trophy, but it is the shooter at the shoot that I am making my story on) D. Hamilton, O. Bloxsome, D. O'Dempsey, J. Bradbury, L. Vidler, G. Darlington, L. Greensill, D. Gull, S. Horn, R. Watts, E. Bishop, R. Kamradt, W. Maule, S. Jackson, R. Thompson, M. Champney. On the day I was squadded with as the photo shows left to right



Bob Thompson, George Lewis, myself, Ossie Bloxsome and Pam Isaacs, note the bullet belts and automatics, common place in those days. No reloading as ammo was only \$1.50 per box, mostly Winchester Red & Gold AA, when ammunition went up over \$2.50 reloading showed up with the result of no empties to rake up after the shoot. Also note the dress of the day, George & Ossie both wearing ties.

The story at the end of the results read "President Les Greensill was responsible for a wonderful feed of kippered fish which was enjoyed by the shooters at days end and is a recognised highlight of the club (L.V. Cairns, Sec)."

Next it was off to Central Burnett and at the dinner on the Saturday night in the hotel, again something I had never seen. Each shooter being sold off to the highest bidder, I couldn't afford to buy myself and was bought by Ossie Bloxsome, and at the end of the shoot Ossie gave me \$5.00 for shooting the possible. Shooters to win at that shoot were J. Gray, G. Darlington, J. Bradbury, S. Kentish, V. Bloxsome, B. Smith, E. Jensen, D. Smit, L. Ivans, R. Bloxsome, L. Cairns, O. Bloxsome, P. Hayman and in the company of G. Graft from New Zealand who had just shot at the Southport Nationals. In these days there was no A.B.C., only Handicap and years were given on amount of prize money, inward movement (1968) is calculated only on the full programmed events of four successive shoots, but in 1971 - no shooter can come forward more than one yard in any six month period.

The next shoot being Mundubbera on 18.6.67 and then a two day shoot 2nd & 3rd September 1967 at Toogoolawah was on the menu, and the winning circle consisted of R. Close, W. Hull, W. Stevens, M. Jones, W. Hughes, G. Ferguson, R. Hogarth, A. Kemp, R. Kamradt, T. Bamberry, W. Devonshire, B. Mackey, R. Britton, G. Nixon and G. Rawlins (Sec).

On 16&17 September 1967 Dalby held their 2 day shoot with 66 shooters, the winners L. Vidler, F. McEwan, G. Wenham, A. Jarrick, R. Northdurft, K. Braithwaite, C. Condon, C. Kassulke, A. James, K. Isaacs, J. Brodie, J. Ferguson, T. Hauritz, N. Shands, H. Brose, E. McEwan, J. Jenkins, M. McEwan, N. Seis, W. Shand, P. Kilner, M. Shelley, M. Jones, J. Burling, R. Britton, B. Frost, C. Condon (Hon Sec).

It was interesting reading back that 40% of shooters at each shoot showed up at most shoots, it was these shooters who made the shoots possible and injected life into clay targets. Of course there was always children playing around the carparks and one I can remember as his dad was at most shoots, was George Hogarth who now shoots and has a son of his own who shoots.

Just a few names from the past, I know some are still shooting, but the rest, Where are they now?

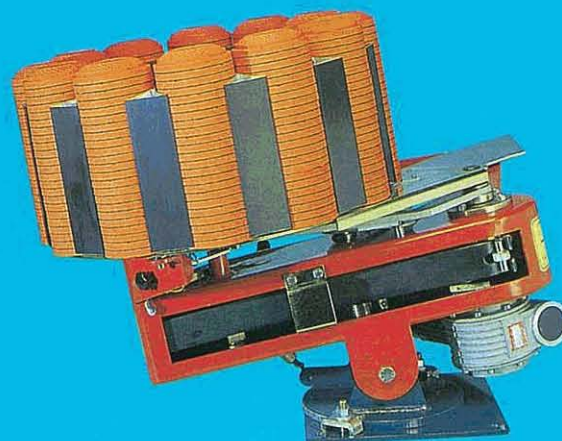


Forty six shooters attended the National ZZ Championship Title contest held at the Melbourne Gun Club in February 1998.

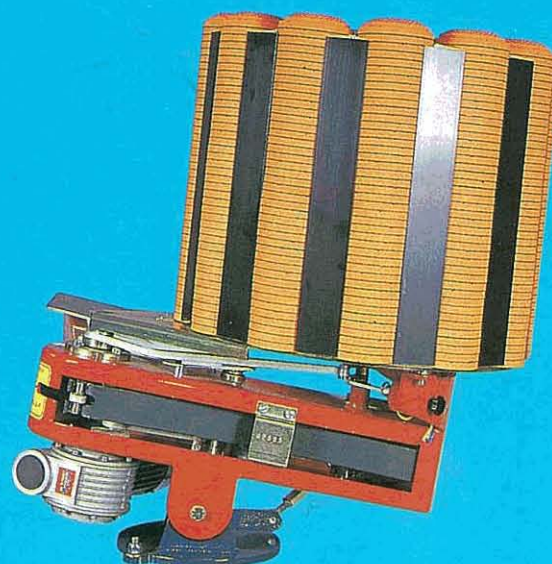
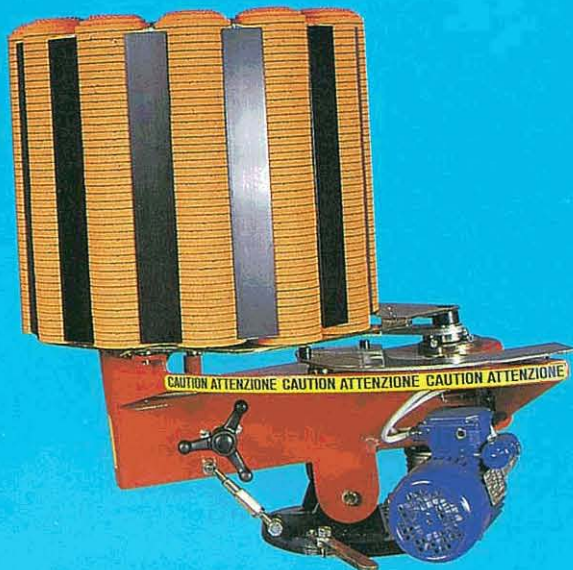
