


Broken HillWest Darling Championship

Athlete Information Asthma Checklist



It is a fact in sport that many athletes require medications for the treatment of injuries or medical conditions, e.g. asthma.

Medications used to treat asthma are a complex issue as many contain substanaces which are either banned or subject to certain restrictions. Some international and national sporting organisa-

tions require notification that these medications are being taken. Some common brand names included in this category are Ventolin, Serevent and Bricanyl. The good news is that most asthmatic conditions can be treated by medications which are permitted under certain conditions.

To ensure you are taking a permitted medication and have notified the relevant authority, follow the checklist below

Make sure that:

- * your condition has been diagnosed by a physician;
- * the medication you are taking has been prescribed;
- * the medication which has been prescribed is permitted+;
- * you have notified the relevant medical authority within your sport or your national sporting organisation where required++.
- + Asthma medications which contain the Beta-2 agonists salbutamol, salmeterol or terbutaline or a corticosteroid are permitted if the medication is administered by inhalation only. However, special notification requirements may be need to be followed (as outlined below).
- ++ Notification is required where it is stipulated in your sports doping policy. This can be checked by contacting your National Sporting Organisation and may require a letter from your doctor. This applies primarily to those athletes who may be subject to drug testing.

The handicap event was won by 16 year old junior shooter, Jarrard Smith of Bundaberg with the only possible 25/25.







- (A) Subject to the payment of the prescribed registration fee as may be decided by the ACTA from time to time.
- (B) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club (respective) which is operating under the rules and regulations of the State Association and ACTA.

- (A) Acting in accordance with the rules and regulations of the club, State or

National Association whilst undertaking their voluntary duties.

NOTE: Paid personnel such as trappers, trap mechanics, bar staff or any other paid staff are subject to the provisions of the Workers Compensation Act and protection must be obtained for them from the appropriate authority within their State. This is to be organised by the Employer (Club etc).

5 CLUB VISITORS -

(Participants and Observers)

(A)Must be registered as such (club visitor) on the register to be maintained by each club for that specific purpose.

(B) Must at all times be under the control and supervision of registered ACTA shooters

(C) Must be participating in accordance with the rules and regulations of the respective club, State Association and ACTA

(D) Visitors, other than children who must be under the care of a responsible person, must at all times sign the visitors' book which must be provided by all clubs for that purpose.

(E) In the event of a visitors or visitors to the club negligently causing injury or damage to any person or property, any actions that may be taken would need to be directed towards the person or persons concerned.

NOTE: Any organised event for participating visitors, such as school children etc. who are not registered with the ACTA must have been officially ratified by your club at a constituted meeting and minuted accordingly. Should this requirement not be complied with then difficulties could and may possible arise in the event of a claim under the Public Liability Policy.

6(A)Clubs who have life members or similar, where no affiliation fee is paid to its the activity and the control of the control of

either the club or the ACTA by reason of their inactivity in the sport at Club and/or ACTA level are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to "registered shooters".

(B)Clubs who may have sponsors or the like attending their premises as "Honorary Members" on a more frequent basis than would be seen to be a visitor are fully protected under the same conditions as would apply to registered shoot-

7Clubs conducting events that are outside the rules pertaining to regular competition, which are broadly known as "Novelty Events" are fully protected under the terms and conditions of the ACTA Public Liability Policy providing that all other conditions relating to safety etc have been complied with.

This protection extends to shoots conducted between different shooting disciplines and on grounds other than the Clubs normal shooting ground (Subject to Federal and State Laws). These shoots MUST be sanctioned by the State Association and referred to the ACTA if in doubt.

8Clubs electing to become Incorporated bodies should be able to use the master ACTA policy to fulfil the requirements of Incorporation, therefore eliminating the need for any club to maintain a Public Liability Policy in addition to the ACTA master policy unless cover in excess of \$20,000,000 is required.

NOTE: Paid employees MUST at all times be protected under the Workers Compensation Act within the State of the Employee. This is to be arranged by the Employer (Club etc).

9Situations arising that may not be covered in this policy summary will be clarified upon request.

The existing policy therefore extends to all persons likely to be on the grounds for a Club, State or National event.

The need for individual Clubs or State Associations to undertake a policy of their own is climinated other than they may require cover for an amount in excess of the existing \$20,000,000.

(A) Visitors attending National, State, Zone, International Championships are

exempt from the requirement to sign a visitors register.

(B)Member to member whilst participating in any event.

(C)Erection, demolition, alterations, additions to buildings including club houses and trap houses for the portion of the work undertaken by voluntary workers. Cover does not extend to any works carried out or undertaken by contractors or sub-contractors.

(D)Registered shooters involved in coaching or instruction are indemnified.

11All shooting events must be sanctioned under the rules of the National body. 12 FOR INFORMATION: Further extensions included within the policy are member to member, food and drink, care custody and control, medical and welfare facilities, tenants' liability, hoists cranes and unregistered vehicles, car parking, cross liabilities.

13Clubs on leased premises are indemnified in respect to tenants liability.

Property owners providing leased premises are required to have an existing policy to be indemnified as a property owner.

Clubs hiring premises to a third party are indemnified under the policy. 14 NOTE:

THERE IS NO NEED FOR ANY AFFILIATED CLUB OR STATE ASSOCIATION TO TAKE OUT PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE UNLESS THEY WISH TO HAVE COVER IN EXCESS OF \$20 MILLION.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

A couple of weeks ago, I had a guy call me in response to my request for subjects to discuss in this column. He explained that he had started shooting clay targets back in the mid 80s, after he left school and started work. I think he said that his first exposure to shotguns may have been via a school program, which I firmly believe is where our sport needs promoting, if it is going to survive the current bureaucratic push to make shooting sports politically unpalatable. Anyway, he went on to explain that even though he enjoyed shooting, after a couple of years his available time and money needed to be spent on cars and girls and other such things, and clay target shooting had to go by the wayside, at least for the time being.

Now however, his life is back to being more stable and he has gotten back into shooting. Previously, he had not had the time or the space or the resources to get into reloading, even though nearly everyone else was doing it and the benefits were obvious. Now he was keen to reload, but most people seemed to be shooting factory shells. Previously, any empty hulls that hit the ground were fought over by reloaders, but now fired shells seemed to be a problem for the clubs to clean up and dispose of. His first question was why do less people reload these days and his second one was where could a novice get some good simple reloading advice. I promised to give the matter some thought and publish his answers in next month's column and here it is.

In relation to why fewer people reload these days, I know why, I just don't know how come. The reason why is pure economics. When I started reloading back in the late 70s, a case of shells cost nearly \$100, but you could reload a case for around \$35, or almost 1/3 of the cost. Thus, nearly everyone reloaded. I remember going to the Nationals each year and the rules said you had to use factory shells, so there was most of your hull supply for the next year.

These days you can still buy a case of shells for not much more than \$100, but the cost of reloading components has steadily risen over the years and now it costs more than twice as much to reload. The nett result is that instead of being able to reload 27 or 28 cases of shells for the same expenditure as 10 cases of factory loads, you can now load maybe 13 or 14. With this type of arithmetic on the costs, once you figure out how long it would take to recoup the cost of a reloader, which has also doubled along with the components, even if you don't allow any sort of labour cost content, the whole exercise loses it's appeal.

So there is the why, but how come reloading costs have more than doubled, while the cost of shells has barely risen, is totally beyond me. If anyone can explain that one to me I would be most interested.

Thus, shotshell reloading is now confined to a relative minority, most of who have probably had their reloading equipment

for a long time and therefore it is well and truly amortized. I think this whole situation is a great pity for a number of reasons. A lot of shooters that I know, myself included, never looked upon reloading as a chore, but as a separate and interesting hobby in it's own right.

Finding a new load, putting it together, and then going out to try it, was often as much fun as the shooting itself. Likewise, a win at the end of the day was always much more rewarding with ammo that you had assembled yourself. Furthermore, reloading has an appreciable psychiatric value – I do most of my best meditating while I'm reloading. Also, reloading gives shooters an insight into internal and external ballistics that they would otherwise probably never come to appreciate and I believe, in a round about sort of way, the more you understand about the sport, the better chance you have to excel at it.

Anyway, that's about the strength of it, and the only area where target reloading can be justified on a purely commercial basis these days, is in the small gauges for skeet shooting. Here nett reloading costs vary from similar to slightly less, but the much higher costs for factory shells restores the viability. However I still think reloading is a great idea, even if the savings have diminished and here is the benefit of my experience:

The old adage of "learn to walk before you try to run" is never truer than in reloading. I strongly recommend that all novice reloaders start out with a single stage, manually operated reloader. Use this device long enough to become thoroughly conversant and familiar with the entire reloading process, before attempting to load on progressive and/or power operated reloaders. These machines are very sophisticated and quite complicated and can initially be quite a handful, even for experienced reloaders.

Before using any reloader, read the instruction manual carefully and always heed the safety warnings. Some general safety advice to keep in mind includes: 1) Always wear safety glasses when reloading. 2) Never smoke or allow naked flames near the reloading area. 3) Store powder and primers in a cool, dry, secure area away from the reloading bench. Have only the minimum practical amount of these two components on the bench at any time. 4) Reloading requires continued and total concentration, so always reload in silence and solitude. If you have any type of interruption - stop reloading - attend to it then return to reloading. 5) Always work slowly and carefully. Reloading is all about accuracy and consistency - not speed. Adequate speed will come naturally with practice. 6) Buy a good set of scales and weigh your powder regularly. At least the first three with any new load and then at least one in every hundred and every time you start a fresh powder container.

Never experiment with reloading data. Until you become thoroughly familiar with reloading, a wise guideline is to try to duplicate a factory shell, using components manufactured by that hull maker. When you decide to use a particular hull, then common sense dictates that satisfactory performance should be attainable by using that manufacturer's primers, powder and wads in proportions recommended by that company to duplicate their factory load. If a hull manufacturer does not supply any or all of the various reloading components, then your next move should be to check a reputable reloading guide to see which after market or competitors components they suggest will duplicate a factory load. I seldom ever mismatch hulls and wads, but I often change primers and/or powder in order to obtain loading economy, lower pressures, better and/or cleaner metering and cleaner burning.

Never switch components within an established load, without checking the data for that component. Most people understand that all propellants are different and cannot be interchanged without obtaining fresh data for that powder. What is not so obvious, is that different primers vary considerably in ignition

strength and sometimes require substantial powder charge changes. Even less obvious, is that although most wads look similar and seem to be a pretty basic component unworthy of serious consideration, nothing could be further from the truth. Wad changes can cause substantial changes to interior ballistics, due to differences in design, plastic strength, occupied volume, compression rates and diameter. The latter is probably the most important variable and in extreme cases, a large diameter wad, designed for a parallel thin wall case, could jam in a tapered wall case before seating on the powder charge. This could create a variable air space, which may cause anything from inconsistent performance to radical and potentially dangerous pressure changes.

Some other items of good practical advice are: 1) Use the best and hardest shot available regardless of price. Any manufacturer that will not provide guaranteed antimony levels in writing upon request, should be considered suspect. 2) Use compression formed cases whenever possible. Not only will they last longer, but also their crimp will probably retain its structural integrity longer, providing more premium loads before performance begins to decrease with case wear. 3) Always resize your shells, either before or during reloading. Even if they chamber satisfactorily in your present gun, if you change your gun or have a tube rechambered, you could end up with a substantial quantity of shells that won't go in your gun. Note: Resizing a loaded shell is a very dangerous and illadvised practice. 4) Beware of wet or damp hulls. If you have been shooting in the rain, or have any other reason to suspect their dryness, or if their origin is unknown, dry them thoroughly before reloading.

I am a great believer in the old adage "Beware the man with one gun" and I believe in the same theory with ammunition. I use only one shell for all my clay target shooting, the Sellier & Bellot Super Trap Light # 7 1/2. When I reload I try to duplicate it's performance with the following recipe, courtesy of Mr Ken Melgaard, Technical Officer at ADI Mulwala:

Hull Plastic compression formed

(Winchester AA etc)

Primer Winchester W209

Powder ADI AS30N - 18.5 gr

Wad Winchester WAA12SL

Shot 1 oz Extra hard #71/2

Velocity 1250 fps Pressure 10,500psi

Between the Ears

How often have you experienced it yourself? The last training sessions were pretty OK: good enough to remind you that you can do it. With this confidence in your stomach and some strong one liners on your mind you head off for the next competition. But when you actually stand there in your squad waiting for your first competition target things are quite different.

The little man in between your ears is busy, but what he is whispering you now has not much to do with what he was about during the last days. In fact you can't really see in how far his contributions are going to help you here and now.

But that is not all!

Somehow your body seems to go its own way as well. It simply does not feel right. What seems to be working automatically in training is suddenly beyond your control. You never have to think much about what you are doing in training, nor do you ever spend a second on investigating your physical sensations. But one think is for sure, in this competition it is not the way it is at home, you realise after having just wounded the first garget. That is not you, is it? What follows then is a drama compared to how you handle things in training. The good thing about it, you conclude when stepping back into the club house, is the fact that fortunately no one can read your thoughts. You are absolutely determined not to share any details of your interior battle with the others. Looking at how the others behave, sitting there, being just their usual selves, making jokes, convinces you that you must be the only one who is suffering from difficulties. One more reason to shut! "What the h..., I better stop grinding my brain, otherwise I just become neurotic about it. Next competition will be better," you hastily conclude and go on with life.

Since two years I have been accompanying shooters in highly challenging situations in my work as the Mental Training Coach for the Australian Shooting Association.

Situations that include the full spectrum of emotions reaching from tears to complete happiness (which, by the way, does not exclude the possibility of tears), but also all levels of competitiveness from local comps to the Olympic Games. The insight I have gained over the years (as an international shooter myself, as a technical coach, and the Mental Training Coach of ASA) make it easier for me to understand what you are going through. The knowledge I gained in my psychology degree (Dipl. psych, Muenster/Germany) and through conversations with coaches and shooters helps me to support you and choose some methods that might be of benefit for you.

Although I originally come from a different shooting discipline (rifle) identification is not difficult. It is astonishing how similar are concerns and problems among the 17 different disciplines I am mainly focussing on in my work. Differences occur in the consequences of some typical symptoms.

If you identify yourself with the scenario as described above, I have got some good news for you! You are not the only one, who experiences difficulties in showing his full potential in a comp or feeling exactly the same as in training. Many of your troubles are secretly shared by others. Of course they would not tell you, as they think they are the only ones. I have even better news! There are some tips and tricks that may help you to overcome some of your problems.

Optimal performance happens in optimal conditions. Some of these conditions are external (eg weather, facilities, other competitors, etc) or internal (eg body feeling, arousal state, thoughts . . .), some of them are under your control, some of them are not. Performance determining factors that are under your control are the quality and fit of your equipment, your technical skills, your physical fitness and your mental state.

The order of the four elements should not imply the importance they have for your shooting. It is true that without a properly adjusted gun you should not expect too much. With your equipment you set the basic conditions, but all other ele-



ments supplement each other and should somehow all be incorporated in your training schedule. Depending on your experience in shooting their weight and importance changes. For a beginner the technical work on the range might still be predominant. With increasing skill level, quantity of training, and level of competition physical fitness and psychological aspects become more and more important. Well, as the level of the champions, where equipment, technical skill, and fitness are equal, the skill to control your body and mind counts most.

The term SKILL should be stressed in this context, as it means that it is something that can be learned. In other words all those you find on the top of the ranking were not necessarily born with this ability to cope with competition stress. They have learned to apply some strategies and mental techniques that proved to be most effective for them. Some of them acquired these skills over the course of several years by recording and processing their experiences, studying books on that topic or by talking to other competitors. Others will have made them a part of their training schedule and worked on it in a very conscious way. The latter of which seems to be more time efficient.

Central topics with regards to mental skills in clay target shooting are:

- Motivation
- · Arousal Control
- Imagery
- Attention and Thought Control
- Competition Preparation
- · Travel Skills

The term SKILL also means that you have to be prepared to put some time and effort into it. Sport psychology is not the sort of emergency button you press when it is almost too late and nothing else seems to have helped so far. Mental Training should become a part of your normal training routine, with the only difference that it does not take as much time as your technical training.

What sounds like work could soon help you to become more efficient, consistent, secure and better in the execution of your shot routine on a station provided you are willing to sacrifice some time for training (and you do not neglect the other three factors). You might be able to pick up some tricks of how to keep your mind on the game and how to keep your body (and mind) in a zone of proper functioning. "What else?" you ask. Well, you might become more independent. And there is the possibility for you to find out that some of the methods are even applicable in your everyday life.

It was decided to meet at this venue in NSW with the development of the National Ground in Wagga Wagga, Executive Members could go out to the grounds and inspect same as

The Executive Committee made a number of decisions and a summary of these are as follows:

1/Oceania Games - September 1999

The DTL teams to represent Australia at these games will be selected from the Nationals at Roma Qld. The team will comprise of the top 3 after completion of the Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points and Mackintosh.

There will be a three person Open, Ladies and Juniors team. Any one person will only be eligible to compete in one of the teams.

The American Skeet team will be selected at the 1998 Nationals in Perth WA should the 1999 Nationals be conducted after the Oceania Games.

An "A" and "B" team may well be entered in the games. 2/World DTL Championships - 1999

At the time of writing this report, the date and venue of this event has yet to be decided by the ICPSA. We believe it will be conducted in Ireland in Aug/Sep 1999.

The ACTA will be sending a full team to compete at these championships. They will comprise of 5 Open, 3 Ladies, 3 Veterans and 3 Juniors.

The team will comprise of the top 5 or 3 as applicable after completion of the Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points and Mackintosh events.

Any one person will only be eligible to compete in one of the teams.

3/Pre Nominations

Pre nominations for next years Roma Nationals were reviewed with some changes implemented.

There will be no "dollar" reduction for pre nominating. Instead, another incentive will be offered to all those who pre nominate. This will be advised at a later date.

When you pre nominate you will receive you receipt together with your squadding card. Once a shooter arrives at the grounds they can go straight to the squadding window, providing you have not changed grades since pre nomination. If you changed grades then it is the shooters responsibility to advise the office/handicapper of the change.

4/1999 National DTL Championships - Roma The National program for Roma will be as follows:

Wednesday 24 and Thursday 25 March - Pre Nationals

Friday 26 March - Grand Australian Handicap 50t Saturday 27 March - National Double Barrel Championship 100t

Nominations for the events are yet to be confirmed but reduced nominations will be applicable to second family members (second family member must be spouse or junior) 4/Handicap Cards



Today, President Ray Godkin, announced the Australian Commonwealth Games Association (ACGA) had appointed 23 shooters to the 1998 Australian Commonwealth Games Team which will compete in Malaysia from 11th-21st September.
