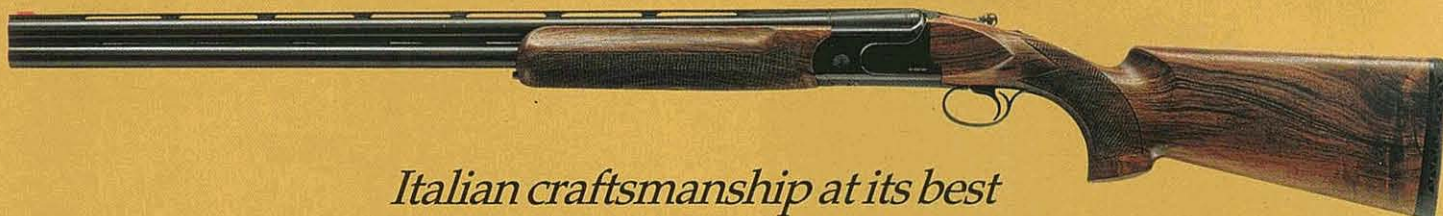

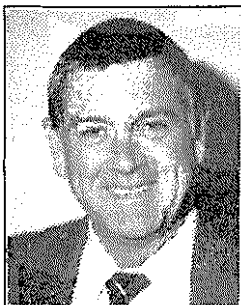

MEMBERSHIP CONTINUES TO GROW

Our membership has grown to a record 13,111 as of the end of July, and hopefully as you read these notes it will have increased considerably from that number. This is an increase of some 1699 members as of the same time last year.

When we break our figures up further, we find there are some 2217 new members. If we subtract the increase in membership from that of our new members, we are left with some 518 members from 1997 that have not renewed their membership in 1998. If you know of any of our old members that have not renewed, please encourage them to do so. Every member is vital to us, therefore we would like to know why they have elected not to rejoin so that we can rectify the problem.

OUR STARS CONTINUE TO SHINE

Our international shooters continue to bring glory to Australia. At the Lonato, Italy World Cup in July Lisa SMITH won silver in the women's trap and our team also won the silver. Michael DIAMOND captured the gold in the Men's Trap and Craig HENWOOD took the bronze in the Junior Men's Trap. A great effort by these top competitors.

From Lonato our team travelled to Barcelona, Spain where in an outstanding triumph for our shooters, Michael won the Double Trap with a new World Record 191/200. One target behind for silver was Russell MARK. We believe this quinella is a first for any Country. Michael and Russell teamed with Adam VELLA to claim the team gold medal, a truly outstanding achievement.

GRAND AMERICAN - WORLD DTL UPDATE

It appears being able to obtain a date for the 1999 World DTL Championship is harder than winning Tattsлото. Despite many calls and appeals to the CPSA we are yet to be given the dates. There is no doubt that shooters intending to attend will be becoming concerned as to our ability of being able to book accommodation etc. At the time of writing this, we believe it will be somewhere between the 17th and 30th July.

Our travel agent, Tourplanners (Aust) is working on a number of options for persons wishing to attend both the World DTL and Grand American, and for those wishing to attend either one only. It is hoped that in the next issue of the CTSN we will be able to supply the prices of the packages, plus the dates.

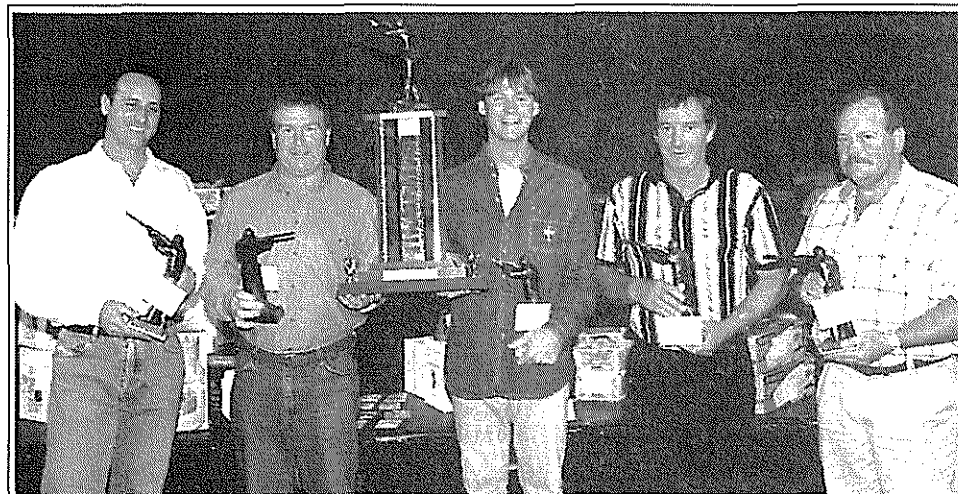

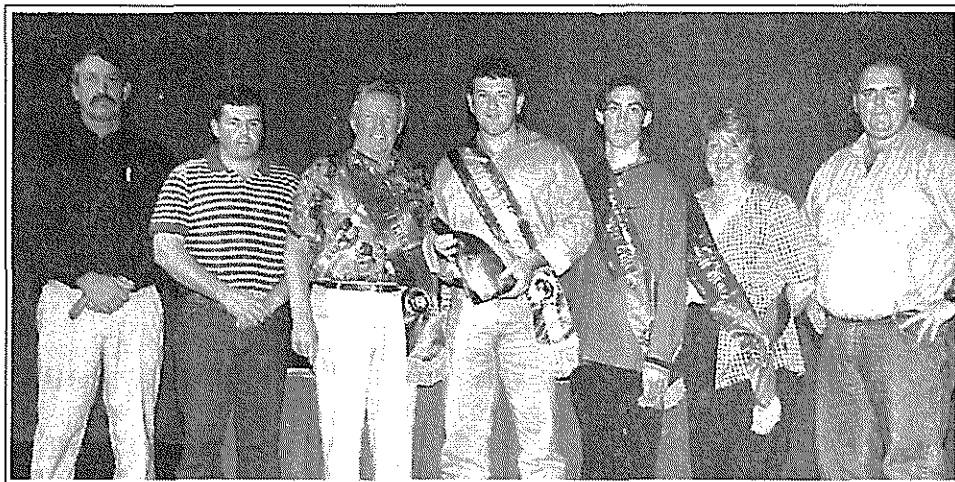

This event saw the top six shooters in the Open division of Trap, Double Trap and ISU Skeet accompanied by Suzy Balogh, Ann Maree Roberts, Luca Scribani Rossi (Coach) and Claudia Kulla (Mental Training Coach) with myself as Team Manager to contest the Australian Cup Final at Whiteman Park and there to select the Senior Team to represent Australia at the Final World Cup at Lonato, Italy and then go on to the World Championships in Barcelona, Spain.

The 2 Trap shooters and 2 Skeet shooters were also to be selected to represent Australia at the Commonwealth Games in Langkawi.

The shooters contesting these last positions were:

Trap - Russell Mark, Michael Diamond, Ben Kelley, Tom Turner, Geoff Mark and Adam Vella.

Double Trap - Michael Diamond, Russell Mark, Adam Vella, Steve Haberman, Geoff Lancaster and Brett Hall

ISU Skeet - David Cunningham, John Summers, Clive Barton, George Barton, Craig Meuleman and Barty Brighenti.

Prominent Western Australian shooters came to make up the squads.

The grounds at Whiteman Park and the equipment used were superbly presented for our use by the President of the W.A. Gun Club, Christine Alexander. The professional manner in which the shoot was run, the good targets, the helpers who had been organised by the Australian Coaching Director, Murray Alexander and the band of extremely willing B grade Judges under the supervision of Peter Strike all made for a well run and enjoyable competition. A hearty thank you to all concerned.

At the completion of the competition we saw Michael Diamond running out the overall winner of the Double Trap equalling the World Record (prior to the Final), Michael also taking out the overall placing in the Trap competition and Clive Barton winning the ISU Skeet competition (both with world class scores).

The selection of the teams then to represent Australia at the Lonato World Cup and the World Championships in Barcelona are as follows:

Trap - Michael Diamond, Russell Mark and Ben Kelley

Double Trap - Michael Diamond, Russell Mark and Adam Vella

ISU Skeet - Clive Barton, George Barton and David Cunningham.

David however was unable to go to the World Championships due to the sudden illness and hospitalisation of his employer and his place was taken by John Summers.

Trap team for Commonwealth Games - Michael Diamond and Ben Kelley as Russell Mark is unavailable due to personal commitments.

ISU Skeet team for Commonwealth Games - David Cunningham and Clive Barton. Clive had to shoot off with

younger brother George for this position and I believe this would be some sort of record where two brothers have had to shoot off for a position such as this.

We of the Shooting Committee and the ACTA Executive, and I am sure all shooters of Australia, wish them well in their coming competitions.

1998 NATIONAL OLYMPIC DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25, squads of 6 Olympic Trap, squads of 6 ISU Skeet and rounds of 25 Pair for Open/Jnr Double Trap and 20 Pair for Womens Double Trap.
3. Nominations to be received by the time of 3pm of the day prior to the beginning of the Event or such time as determined by the Tournament Director. All squads shall be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
5. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw.
6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the LOSS OF THREE TARGETS.
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated as scorer/referee or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the services of a suitable replacement who must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the

event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role SHALL INCUR A PENALTY AS PRESCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES.

10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed Jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
14. High gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for high gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective high gun.
15. Women and Juniors shooters only are eligible for their section as well as the open event.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Practice of card playing at the Nationals Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas, or such areas as may be determined from time to time.
18. The UIT Rules will be used to determine the OA placing, 1st, 2nd, 3rd in all events.
19. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.
23. I am in compliance with State licensing laws in my State of residence and in the State where this competition is being conducted.

The Glenn Trophy Team to compete against New Zealand at the Skeet Nationals will be selected from the top 5 scores over the 300 targets of the All States Skeet Championship 100t, Commonwealth Skeet Championship 100t and the National Skeet Championship 100t.

The event will be conducted on the morning of Sunday 25 October 1998 prior to the National Doubles competition.

OCEANIC GAMES

The teams to represent Australia at these Games in NSW next year will be selected the same as the Glenn Trophy Team except there will be six competitors (Three in "A" team and three in "B" team) funding arrangements to be advised. This will alter should the 1999 Skeet Nationals be held prior to the Oceania Games at which the team will then be selected.

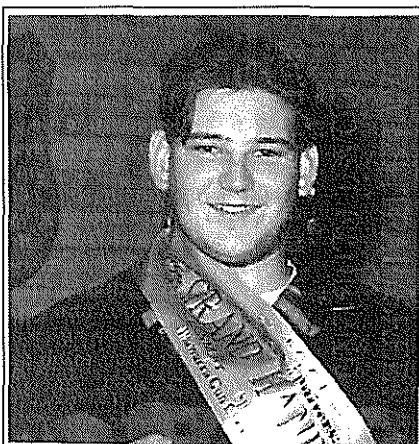

Tasmanian Gun Club 75th Anniversary

1923 - 1998

1998 is a milestone in the history of the Tasmanian Gun Club which was founded in September 1923. To mark the occasion, a 75th Anniversary Dinner is planned followed by an Anniversary shoot. The following is a history of the club compiled by Club Historian and Life Member, David Perry.

At a meeting convened by Mr G. Russell held at 8 pm at the Newstead Hotel, Launceston on September 5th, 1923, Mr G. Lidgerwood was elected to the chair. It was resolved that Mr. Midson act as Secretary. The name of the club was called the Northern Gun Club. The President for 1923 was Mr C.M. Gunn. In 1924-25 it was Mr M.L. Sidebotham.

The Club shot for about two years shooting pigeons, starlings and sparrows in a paddock next to the Newstead Hotel until the shooting of live birds was banned by an act of Parliament. The club then went into recess for over ten years until 6th January, 1936 when a shoot was organised in Fawcner's Paddock, Kings Meadows, Launceston, shooting at clay targets. The Secretary was instructed to spend eight shillings on advertising the shoot. The President then was Mr H. Quigley. The best performance of the day was W. Rainbird Jnr with H. Quigley shooting 14 straight each.

Later that year the club moved from Fawcner's Paddock to Machens Paddock some 400 yards away where the club had a 12 month lease. At this time the membership was 80. The club purchased a new automatic angle trap for 36 pounds which proved a great success.

The club joined the Victorian Association on the 14th October 1937, and the club name was changed from the Northern Gun Club to the Tasmanian Gun Club with an operating profit of 61 pounds, 15 shillings and threepence. In 1938 Mr W. Rainbird was elected President.

In 1939 the Commonwealth Double Barrel was shot in Tasmania for the first time. This was won by Mr J. Bryant from Victoria shooting 23/25. Forty four shooters took part from three States.

The Club operated on these grounds until the early 1940s but only shot occasionally during the second world war. It started again in January 1950 and moved to W. Rainbird's farm at St. Leonards shooting there until 1963. In September 1955 Sperry Marshall established a Tasmanian record of 177 straight in a double barrel event.

The club moved once again from St. Leonards to Breadalbane after a recess of three years due to vandals. The first shoot there was held on 17th December 1963 with 39 shooters attending. Shoots were held at Breadalbane until 1968 when the property was sold.

A decision had to be made whether the club kept moving or purchase their own property. Approximately 2 & 1/2 acres was purchased from D. Von Steiglitz at Nile Road, Evandale in 1967.

From 1968 the club had a very enthusiastic committee and many hours of work went into developing the new ground

which was opened in 1968 with three trap layouts and one skeet layout. A further five acres were purchased in 1974.

In 1972 W. Rainbird O.B.E. who had been President of the club since 1938 and a Life Member, died. He had been the backbone of the club and also an A.C.T.A. delegate for many years. It was his life's ambition to have a Nationals in Tasmania and it was a shame he did not see this happen. It was very fitting that Mrs Rainbird presented the Rainbird Cup to Sperry Marshall, winner of the National Single Barrel Championship for 1975.

Mr David Perry took over as President of the club from 1973-1976. In 1975 the first Nationals including Skeet were held in Tasmania at the club. The layout was increased to seven DTL traps and two Skeet layouts. These Nationals were a great success with a profit of \$6,000 being made.

These Nationals laid the foundation for the Tasmanian Gun Club's future both financially and providing excellent facilities. It was also the first time that shooting changed from yards to metres. This made a big difference in shooting breaks for a short period.

From 1977-1978 Mr L. Toyne was President. In 1979 a Trench complex was installed at a cost of \$20,000. Mr D. Perry was again elected President in 1979. Mr T. Smith was President in 1980, Mr N. Curbishley in 1981-2, Mr W. Richardson in 1983-4, Mr J. Sturzaker from 1985-90, Mr D. Perry again in 1991-94, Mr D. Galloway from 1995-97 and Mr J. Sturzaker in 1998.

In 1990 and again in 1996 National Trap Championships were conducted on this ground.

The club has seven life members in A. Poxon, W. Rainbird, D. Perry, P. Thurley, J. Boer, J. Blake and G. Clarke, who, along with many others, have contributed greatly towards the progress of the club.

B grade once again saw an outright win to Bob Arnold on 23/25 and in C grade Rob Dean showed his form by winning with a well shot 25/25.

Single Barrel can usually be relied upon to humble a few people but not Bruce Hall and Rob Cusack who shot the lot and shot off for A grade with Rob coming out on top with 38/38 ahead of Bruce whose 37/38 was still a fine effort. B grade once again went to that man Bob Arnold, this time with a 21/25, while in C grade Ian Harris and John Whatmore both carded 22/25 to force a shoot off which went to John Whatmore after just one target. The final score, John 23/26, Ian 22/26.

The final of the day was 25 targets off handicap and the day belonged to the front markers with Peter Bosel, Adrian Pope and Paul Pozzoli all recording possibles and calling for a shoot off to determine the placings which were Paul Pozzoli 44/44, Adrian Pope 43/44, and Peter Bosel 28/29.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

SEPTEMBER 1998

Since writing my column in June on a week in the life of a Professional Shooter, I have received a number of inquiries to explain terms such as "flight times" and "shooting rotations" and other general inquiries as to how a Major Shoot is conducted in the United States. As this subject seems to be of considerable interest, I have decided to explain how a major shoot is set up and run on the Professional Skeet Shooting Circuit.

Let's start from scratch. Imagine you want to put on a shoot, which you hope will become an established "circuit" shoot. First you would need to find a suitable gun club. This would entail having about ten skeet fields and adequate facilities to cater for about 200 shooters. It would also need to be located in an area that had adequate infrastructure to conveniently receive and accommodate an influx of about 300 extra people over a long week-end. This would require an airport and adequate accommodation and restaurants within a reasonable distance from the gun club. Then you would need to get a copy of the National Major Shoot Calendar in order to pick a date that does not clash with another Major Shoot somewhere else in the country that weekend. After that you would need to retain the services of an adequately qualified and experienced shoot organizer, who could be located anywhere in the country. Then you would contact the Chief Referee of whichever state the gun club was located in, to retain his services and confirm that he was able to supply 15 suitable referees on the selected week-end.

Now that you have all three of the indispensable things arranged - the club, the date and the workers - the next thing you need to do is get with your shoot organizer and guess at how many entries you will get, and thus decide whether to hold a two day or a three day shoot. As this is the first year of something that you hope will become an annual fixture, you decide to program a two-day shoot this year. That way you will probably fill it up and have a waiting list and then, if you run a great shoot, the word will get around and next year you will be confident that you can fill a three-day shoot. Having decided on two days, you now do your arithmetic and set your flight times and shooting rotations. These calculations are based on the fact that a squad of five shooters takes almost an hour and a half to shoot 100 targets. Thus you can schedule six flight times per day.

Occasionally these may start at 8.30am (as they do at the World Shoot, except on the two 12ga days when they start at 8.00 - which is a good reason not to shoot on rotations 6 or 1), but usually 9.00am is the preferred time. These flight times will then be 9.00 till 10.30, 10.30 till 12.00, 12.00 till 1.30, 1.30 till 3.00, 3.00 till 4.30 and 4.30 till 6.00. Almost all major shoots involve shooting 400 targets - 100 in each of the four different size guns - 12ga, 20ga, 28ga and 410 (the World Shoot is one of the few exceptions, where the 12ga is conducted over 250 targets, which takes two days, and therefore the HOA is over 550 targets instead of 400). Thus with twelve flight times over the two days and four events to run, you can use three flight times per gun. Now you can calculate the number of people that you can accommodate: 10 fields x 5 shooters per squad x 3 flights per gun = 150 entrants.

Establishing your shooting rotations is next and with three flight times you obviously have three rotations and these are normally designated A, B and C. On the first day, rotation A shoots at 9.00 and 1.30, rotation B shoots at 10.30 and 3.00 and rotation C shoots at 12.00 and 4.30. Normally the rotations shoot one flight later each day, so on the second day, rotation A shoots at 10.30 and 3.00, rotation B shoots at 12.00 and 4.30 and rotation C reverts to 9.00 and 1.30.

As the serious shooters usually consider it an advantage to go directly to the shoot-offs after qualifying, and nobody in their right mind would get up early and go and shoot on the 9.00am flight by choice, the most sought after rotation is rotation B. It is one of the two rotations with a 4.30 timeslot, but it is the only rotation with no 9.00am flight time. Thus rotation B always fills first, followed by rotation A. But rotation C is not hard to fill, because the less serious shooters favour it, as it allows them to finish shooting early on Sunday afternoon and head off travelling home. Obviously the more serious shooters are figuring on being called out onto the shoot-off field at 6.15 on Sunday evening to win the 28, 410 and HOA shoot-offs.

Your next step is to arrange about \$6000 in sponsorship money (generally referred to as Added Money), usually from one sponsor, who then attaches their name to the shoot. This may be from your own company, if that is your reason for organizing the shoot, or it may be from some local or industry business house, if you are organizing the shoot for some other reason. You need this amount because the Champion and Runner-up purses in the five individual events and the HOA are always paid out of sponsorship money.

Now it's time to work out your entry fees. The gun club has quoted you \$12 per 100 to throw the targets, the referees will cost you \$6 per 100 and you know that the usual amount to pay back to class is \$10 per 100. The wages and expenses incurred for your shoot organizer and various other workers, plus all other general administration costs will pan out to about \$5 per 100. Then you contact the local caterer who quotes you \$10 per head for the free dinner that you will provide on Saturday night, and after you allow for the referees and other workers this equates to about \$3 per 100. Your daily fees are \$3 per 100 (\$2 to NSSA and \$1 to the State Assn), and this brings you to \$39 so you decide to charge \$40 per 100. This will either allow you to generate a small profit or cover incidental expenses, probably the latter.

Next you write and submit an adv to the Skeet Review for the shoot, which details the events, the costs, the payouts and options, and the rotation set-up. It also includes an accommodation list, featuring any hotels with which you have negotiated a special shooters rate, directions to find the club, Saturday night's dinner details, the deposit amount (usually \$50 per shooter) and the after hours phone number of your shoot organizer. He will then draw up a squadding board and wait for the phone to start ringing.

His job is easier than you might imagine, especially at the beginning, because due to the universal acceptance of selective squadding, each short phone call will generally fill five spaces on his board. A typical call would go something like: Hi, this is Robert Paxton, can I reserve a squad at your shoot..... great, can we have rotation B.....thanks, I'll put a check for \$250 in the mail today..... bye. You don't even ask who the other shooters are, because you pretty much know who they'll be and if any of his regular squad can't come, he will arrange someone else to fill the spot.

By the time you've also heard from Wayne Mayes, George Desatoff, Dave Starrett, Larry Woo, Billy Williams, Tom Fiori and Howie Altman, the board is more than quarter filled already. As the deposits come in, you send out receipts and confirmations, and you hope that the board will be filled and a waiting list started by at least a month prior to the shoot. Some of the long established circuit shoots are so popular that they are effectively full, long before the squadding board is ever drawn up, because preference is always given to previous entrants. For instance, imagine that you rang Al Magyar now, and asked to reserve a full squad on rotation B for the Motor State shoot in Detroit on the second week-end in July next year. After he finished laughing, he would explain that you won't get on rotation 2 in the next twenty years, you won't get a full squad in the next ten years and if you want to pay a deposit on a single entry he could waitlist you for 2001.

Doubles are usually never part of the fixed events or the regular rotation, but a doubles event is always programmed on

the afternoon before the shoot starts. It is scheduled on a separate board, initially at 3.00, 4.00 and 5.00pm Friday, using six fields. If that fills up, you simply open a 2.00pm flight as well. Doubles were originally not on the regular rotation at the World Shoot and thus with six flight times for five days of shooting (remember the 12ga is shot over two days) rotation 2 did not have an 8.30 timeslot and thus filled well before any other rotation. Nowadays, doubles have been added to the regular rotations, so rotation 2 shoots them at 8.30. But it is still the most sought after rotation because an 8.30 flight time not only means you have to get up early, but you also look into the sun when shooting High One and Low Eight. In doubles you only shoot six High Ones instead of eight (or maybe up to twelve if things don't go well) and you never shoot on station Eight.

All your arrangements are now pretty much in place, so you bide your time until the Thursday before the shoot. That day your shoot organizer flies in and you set up the office and finalize the entries of a few of the early arrivals. As you process and classify each competitor, they pay the balance of their entry fees and team fees. At this time they also select and pay for whatever purses, options and jackpots they want. These are all gambling games of various sorts, but if you shoot well, they can add substantially to your winnings at the end of the week-end. Most of the entrants will check in on Friday, with the balance trickling in on Saturday morning.

Each day you qualify from 9.00am until 6.00pm, start the shoot-offs at 6.15 and usually have these completed by about 8.00pm. Even though the shooting season runs through the summer, it is important that the gun club has at least one well-lighted field in case the shoot-offs run late. If your shoot organizer is on the ball, he will have Saturday's payouts ready first thing on Sunday morning, and the final payouts ready fifteen minutes after the last shoot-off finishes on Sunday night. Any money not collected at this time is mailed out the following week.

Stop Press: I have just received word from WACTA that they have approved my application for the position of Shoot Marshall at the National Skeet Championships to be held this year in Perth from the 22nd to the 25th of October. I am looking forward to going and I hope to see as many of you there as possible. Everyone who attended the Trap Nationals there in April had a great time and, win lose or draw, they came home saying they were glad they made the effort to travel over there because it was one of the happiest and most enjoyable Nationals ever. I have spoken to the president of WACTA, Mrs Elaine Forward, and to several of her state executive members, and they have all assured me that they are intending to leave no stone unturned in their efforts to ensure that each and every skeet shooter who attends is made most welcome and has a great time during their visit to the West. Please do not cause all their efforts to go unrewarded by virtue of a poor attendance. Between the Ears

What makes shooters tick

Let us go back in time a little bit. Can you remember how you first got into contact with competitive clay target shooting?

Sit back, take a moment to revive old memories.

Go further and further through the years of your experience in clay target shooting.

Have you ever thought about the reasons that make you stick to it? What do you like about your sport?

Which are the decisive factors for your adherence, the foundations of your faith?

Take your time and try to answer these questions for yourself. Try and give a name to what ruled and directed investment and effort over all that time.

Answers to these questions will all be very individual and thereby very different. Whenever we talk about the direction, intensity and persistence of effort we touch the subject of motivation. A very complex concept offering innumerable facets, which are very likely influenced by age, gender, personality, social and cultural background etc.

While getting in touch with a sort often is just a coincidence (instigated by friends, relatives and maybe ever media) persistence of interest and investment cannot be explained by accidents anymore. Your motivation is based on satisfaction, or simpler the fulfilment of needs that are very important to you. I don't know you nor your personal reasons to be a competitive shooter, but I am pretty sure that I will find them either in the excitement that you feel when trying to beat another challenge, the socialisation with people who share your interests and/or the self affirmation, the positive kick for your ego, that is linked to success.

Do you agree or am I right?

Striving for personal growth is one of the main reasons to become and stay involved in competitive sports. You want to test yourself, learn more about yourself and your limits in demanding situations.

Each success puts a little credit into your account, that psychologists call 'self-concept', another word for what you think you are. And it is certainly by extreme activities like bungee jumping, climbing 8000m mountains, crossing deserts or sailing the seven seas that one can get this kick (this is just to calm down your guilty conscience). But let us terminate philosophising on this level and come back to basics before we all turn into little motivational theorists.

May well be that you are now more aware of the enjoyment you find in your sport. But this is not enough! Wouldn't it be great to get to know some of the methods

that would allow you to keep up that feeling of joy and excitement?

One basic principle for avoiding pleasure and fun turning into frustration is goal setting.

Goal Setting

It is a term well known in business and made its way into sport research in the 80s. Instead of using a really sophisticated definition, let us just apply a picture that gives you an idea of how it works. Goal setting is like climbing up steps of a staircase. Each step representing a goal that you can accomplish in a shorter time span (1 training session (= 1 micro goal), 1 to several weeks (= short term goal). When you reach the plateau between floors, you have accomplished intermediate goals (several months). Reaching the next floor is equal to achieving a long term goal (1 year or longer). Well, until you make it to the penthouse, which represents your dream.

Contents

Goals are not just characterised by the time span you set yourself in order to accomplish them, but also by their contents. Now this needs a bit of explanation:

Whenever you tell yourself: "This time I am going to win!" or "Today I want to be better than shooter XY" or "This year I am going to win the High Gun!", you apply outcome goals. These are goals that evaluate your performance against the performance of others, as winning prizes is undoubtedly related to the performance of others. (Do you agree?) These goals deal the consequences of your shooting and not with the process itself. (Am I still right?) Looking at this category of goals a bit closer, it appears that achieving them is only partly under your control. The only thing that you can control (if you are very good) is your performance, but you will never be able to control weather conditions that day or how the other competitors are going to shoot. Why then do you spend valuable mental energy on things that you can't even control! (you want to argue now?)

OK, OK, You are right. Outcome goals and their achievement can be very fulfilling. As a matter of fact, you should be able to picture yourself on the top of the podium, if you want to be there one day. Among others it is external rewards that feed our internal satisfaction and keep the fire burning.

But what seems to be appropriate for the long term planning and for looking at success in a retrospective sense, will make competitive life a bit more difficult on a short term basis.

So when going into a competition, never think about the outcome, but focus on your shot routine instead. Station for station or shot for shot you focus on the execution of perfection.

Your shooting technique and your mental approach are

the only things you can't control once you are in a competition. What the person shoots next to you is none of your business and beyond your control anyway, so let us save that energy.

The second category of goals is called performance goals. They focus on improvement relative to one's own past performance. So whenever you say: "Tomorrow I want to shoot five more targets than in last weekend's competition" or "In the next competition I want to shoot 121/125 in Trap!", you set yourself a performance goal, although even then the weather has its own effect.

Again performance goals are very appropriate in the long term and on an intermediate level, as they focus on the development of your scores, and scores are providing valuable feedback on your performance curve.

Let us think a bit further! What happens if a shooter takes a performance goal with him into a competition? He will calculate how many targets he has to shoot in each round. If he misses too many, he will become very frustrated and willing to give up much too early. Imagine now the opposite, he is going quite well. He has to shoot a 23 (ISU Skeet) to meet his criterion. He has already missed a high 2 and the low on the double on 7. What are his chances to stay clear on 8? You think high and low on 8 are impossible to miss. This view might usually be shared by our shooter, but now he is standing there aware of the fact that he should not miss. His inner monologue causes arousal. All of a sudden he wants to do consciously what he usually does automatically, and ...of course there is the higher probability of missing. Be honest with yourself and ask yourself whenever has the awareness of your score actually helped you in a competition?

My advice: Once you are in a competition, stay away from scores and score boards. You cannot avoid picking up bits and pieces in conversations, but let them go into one ear and leave your head through the other ear. Figures mean nothing while they are created, but lots once the competition has finished. You got it? Somehow scores are another form of outcome goals. They focus on a secondary step, namely the product of your shooting and not the shooting itself.

We herewith approach the category of goal that is most appropriate for going into a competition with: task related goals. They focus on technical, tactical, physical or mental aspects of your shooting routine. A typical task-related goal could be: "I want to make sure that my shoulder contact is right!" or "I want to apply a refocussing strategy for at least 75% of all shots (Trap)" or "I want to apply stomach breathing when waiting for my turn!" In contrast to the other goals mentioned before, they focus on your shooting process, on something that is under your control or becomes under your control by your accomplishing your task-related goals. Moreover they are ideal as goals for the next training unit or on a short term basis over the next week or so.

Some rules to consider

Now you know that goal setting is based on different time spans and on goals of different contents. To make your goal setting more successful in order to keep up your motivation in training and competition try to follow these rules:

*Set goals that focus on the shooting process.

*Include technical, physical, mental and tactical elements in your goals.

*Set challenging goals. You will have to put in some effort to achieve them.

*Set realistic goals. You cannot expect to improve your PB each time you go out and shoot!

*Set specific goals. Set clear, precise tasks to fulfil; example: "I want to get 95% of my first targets in DT!" instead of something vague like: "I want to become better!"

*Work with short term goals. They are very important for your training motivation. They are like steps leading you up to the next floor.

*Negotiate your goals with your coach. (If you have one). His judgement concerning the contents of goals is very important. As a matter of fact, usually goal setting should be based on a discussion between coach and athlete and be supervised by coaches, but if you don't have a coach you have to do it yourself.

*Write your goals down and maybe even show them to someone else. That increases your commitment!

*Evaluate your goals regularly. In how far did you achieve them? Do they need adjustment? If you have a coach, he should give you a regular feedback on achievement of goals or tell you when you should think about changing some of your goals because they are maybe too easy or too difficult.

Sydney 2000

NATIONAL TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Earlier this year expressions of interest were called from persons wishing to be involved with the Olympic and Paralympic Games as shooting volunteers. This notice calling for expressions of interest stated that travel and accommodation would be the responsibility for the respective individual. While this is correct for volunteers, it is not quite the case for persons identified and offered positions as National Technical Officials.

National Technical Officials officiating at the Olympic Games, will be provided with transport to and from their home, accommodation and meals at the officials village, as well as a Games time uniform.

If you are interested in officiating as a National Technical Official and have not previously advised of your interest, please do so at your earliest opportunity by completing the form which has been in a previous issue of your sports official publication, or by telephoning SOCOG Shooting on 02 9297 2460, requesting a form to be posted to you. Persons who have advised of their interest will shortly receive confirmation of receipt of their advice.

Please refer to the section headed SHOOTING VOLUNTEERS.

ARE OUR SHOOTING OFFICIALS UP TO IT—YES

While it is SOCOG's intention to ensure that all of the Olympic events are conducted efficiently by competent officials, the one certain way in which the success of the Olympic Games shooting program will be judged is by the manner in which the shooting events are conducted on the field-of-play.

It is essential, therefore, that those persons who are eventually selected as national technical officials are the best available, well trained and appropriately experienced. While there are concerns in some sports that the current pool of national technical officials is neither large enough nor sufficiently well trained for the task ahead, this is generally not the case in the sport of shooting.

Each of the four disciplines involved on the Olympic Games program has a depth of qualified A and B Grade Judges who are well experienced, with many of these having experience at World Cup, Commonwealth Games and Olympic Games level.

While the majority may not have had experience at this level, they will be able to gain further and considerable experience at the 1999 Oceania Shooting Championships and the ISSF World Cup in March 2000. At the conclusion of these two major events in Australia, they will have sufficient experience to cope well with what will be expected of them if they are selected as National Technical Officials for Sydney 2000.

SHOOTING VOLUNTEERS

The Official Volunteers 2000 Program is to be launched in October. It is expected that some 200 volunteers will be required to assist in the conduct of the Shooting Competition for the Olympic Games with a similar but lesser number required for the Paralympic Games.

Volunteers will be provided with the official volunteer uniform, meals while working, and access to free travel on public transport for the period of the Games.

The Official Volunteer 2000 National launch is scheduled to occur in early October, and will include all details on how to apply to become a volunteer. Further information about volunteering will be available at briefings to be held in all States in October.

A comprehensive supplement about Volunteers 2000 is to be included in the NSW Sun-Herald for residents of NSW. The Vol-

unteer 2000 application will be available in the NSW Sun-Herald a week later.

Persons interested in becoming involved with the Olympic and Paralympic Games will need to complete a Volunteer 2000 Application when they become available in October.

This requirement will also apply for those persons who have previously advised of their interest.

After the October launch Volunteer 2000 Applications will also be available upon request by ringing the Games Information Line on 136 363 for the cost of a local call.

Particular care must be taken when completing the volunteer application form to indicate SHOOTING as the Name of Sport AND the Shooting Centre, Cecil Park as the preferred venue.

Volunteers Applications received by SOCOG indicating SHOOTING, will be forwarded to the Shooting Competition Manager to ensure that prospective shooting volunteers receive first consideration for their chosen sport.

Volunteer applications will only be accepted on the official SOCOG Volunteers 2000 Application. All applications will be subject to a SOCOG security check.

Did you know . . . According to the official competition schedule which has recently been released, 21 sports will be played on September 16, the first day of competition for the 2000 Olympic Games. Shooting, Women's Air Rifle, will proudly and in keeping with tradition, provide the first medal for the Sydney Games.

17 events are on the Olympic shooting program, 10 men and 7 women. Clay Target, will have six events, 3 men, 2 women. Pistol, five events, 3 men and 2 women. Rifle, five events, 3 men, 2 women. Running Target, one event, men.

SHOOTING PICTOGRAM

Pictograms for the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games were endorsed by the International Olympic Committee and the Association of Summer Olympic International Federations (ASOIF) at meetings recently held in Sydney. The Pictograms were presented to each international federation following months of consultation with SOCOG Sports Competition Managers, the Sport commission, IOC Executive Board and international sporting federations.

The Olympic Games Pictograms which as well as being sport specific, are designed to overcome language barriers and provide an identifiable symbol unique to each sport. Combining Australian design with practicality, the Pictograms which are easily identified for each sport, have been described by many of the international federations as being the best design yet produced for an Olympic Games.

OLYMPIC VILLAGE

Athletes will be accommodated at the Olympic Village at Homebush. Situated on approximately 100 hectares, construction on the Olympic Village which will be home for 10,200 athletes and 1500 officials has already commenced.

SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING CENTRE—SISC

Work on the SISC is well under way and proceeding to schedule. Access roads have been created as has all of the early earth moving works. The site has been fully prepared to allow for the pouring of foundations for the main building which will house the 10-25-50m and finals range. Visitors to SISC have been very impressed with what has already occurred, and also with the fact that Sydney is well ahead of previous Olympics with planning and construction of the shooting facility which will be a showcase to the world, and a shooting centre which Australia's shooting athletes will enjoy and benefit from for many years to come.

UIY/ISSF

Delegates at a meeting of the UIY General Assembly held in Barcelona in July approved a recommendation from the UIY Executive Committee to change from International Shooting Union (UIT) to International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF). The decision taken by delegates is in keeping with the majority of international sporting bodies known as Federations.

ISSF WORLD CUP—MARCH 2000

The ISSF Executive Committee have approved an application from the Australian Shooting Association for a World Cup in each of the Olympic disciplines to be held in Sydney in March 2000.

Technical Delegates, Anderson USA, ISSF Vice President/Competition Manager Atlanta 1996, and Jesus Elizondo Mexico, Technical Delegate, Atlanta 1996, have been appointed for both the World Cup and Olympic Games.

Both Delegates are scheduled to visit Australia in February 1999 to carry out inspections of the new SISC shooting facility at Cecil Park.

The Australian Shooting Association with approval from the ISSF has vested SOCOG with full and total responsibility for the planning and conduct of the ISSF World Cup.

The World Cup which will also serve as the SOCOG Olympic Test Event will follow the exact program as that for the September 2000 Olympic Games.

Approximately 700 athletes plus officials are expected to take part in the World Cup which will be preceded for the first time in Australia by a General Assembly of ISSF Delegates.

PARALYMPICS

The Paralympic Games will take place between the 18th and 29th October, with the village open between October 11 and November 1. Shooting will figure prominently at the Games with twelve events over six days of competition. 150 athletes from the 40 countries affiliated with the International Shooting Committee for the Disabled, will participate in the Games with entry restricted to no more than three athletes per country for any one event.

We wish all disabled athletes whose vision is to, participate in the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games, set new standards in excellence, and achieve their best performance, success in their personal endeavours to achieve these goals.

While it is hard to imagine shooting going the way of basketball or beach volleyball, SOCOG's Sports Division, and each individual sport, is now in the process of assessing the potential to enhance the Olympic competitions with suitable presentation elements.

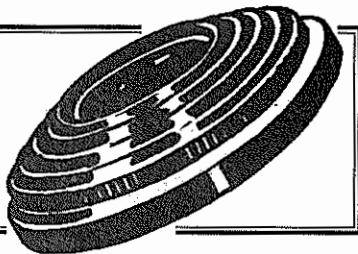

Before State Associations were formed, the year 1955, from the Editors notebook. 'Definition of Rules and Regulations' of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association. In future same will be published each calendar year. This direction was one of the decisions reached at the 19th Annual Meeting of affiliated clubs delegates held March 13th.

State Associations

It was decided to rescind the motion, passed at the 1954 Annual Meeting in regard to the formation of State Associations.

Handicapping Board

Messrs E.G. Biggs, L. Doyle with Secretary co-opted were appointed as a handicapping panel for the Association. In this connection it was also agreed upon that the following new rule be included in the existing rules, that club handicaps be not less than Association handicaps, by this rule it is meant that where a shooters club handicap is less than the published associated mark, the shooter must shoot from the Association mark. This rule comes into effect immediately.

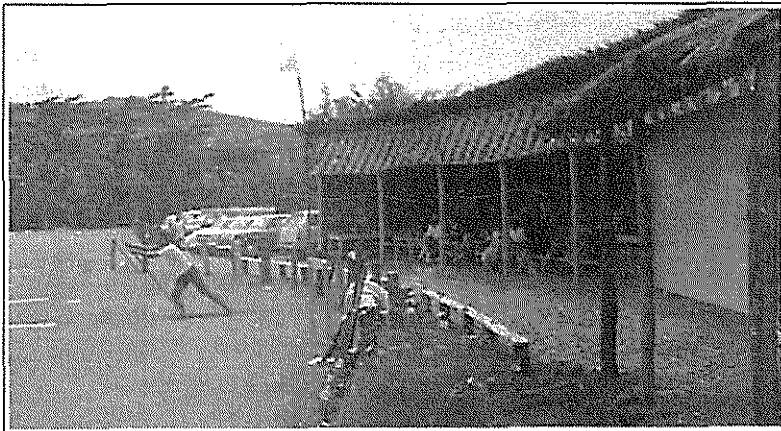
Papua New Guinea

There was a period of time not long after the 1956 Melbourne Olympic Games when Papua New Guinea gun clubs were affiliated with our Australian Clay Target Association.

For a number of years Australian shooters visited Papua New Guinea and they in turn attended our important events.

The Australian Clay Target Association were happy to have the New Guinea clubs with us during the years they were members.

As of September 1975 the respective clay target clubs in Papua New Guinea would cease to be a part of any shooting body outside their own country. As from that date PNG became an independent state.



1957 New President elected

21st Annual Meeting of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association was held at Southport, Queensland on Wednesday June 19, many items of importance were dealt with.

Chief among the business was the election of a new President of the Association, in the person Mr John Houston of Hay, N.S.W. Mr Houston succeeded Mr J.M. Wilson of Melbourne, who retired after serving in the position since 1941.

Mr Houston's appointment was well received and his elevation to the chair was warmly applauded.

Association Name Change

The meeting decided to approve of the recommendation to change the name of the Association by deleting the word 'pigeon' and including the word 'target' in its place. This change will operate from January 1, 1958.

The Hartly Break Badge

It was decided that break badges may now be carried on over more than one day (any number of days) providing the shooter does not engage in practice in between shoots or does not take part in double-rise, walk-up, deauville doubles or any other novelty contest, and shall compile the break under single or double barrel conditions, only in competition. The breaks may now be compiled from any mark including Championships.
