

National President's Notes Glenn G. Woodhatch

GRAND AMERICAN/WORLD DTL

As it stands at the moment, the World DTL event is to be held in Wales at the end of July 1999. This is approximately one week after the British Home International and one week prior to the Grand American. If this turns out to be case, then it should present an excellent opportunity for trap shooters to partake in a once in a life trap shooting experience.

Time is running out to confirm and organise this planned trip, but it should be well worth the wait, despite the current value of the Australian dollar. Hopefully by the time of the trip it will have recovered somewhat. It is hoped full details can be printed in the next CTSN.

CLUB MEMBERSHIP ONLY

It has been the practice of some clubs to accept membership to their clubs without these "members" becoming "registered shooters" of the ACTA. I would ask the committees of these clubs to ask themselves who benefits from this practice. There can only be one answer — and that is the individual being granted this membership, certainly not the club, or the State or National bodies. It has certainly become more evident since the changes to our gun laws and the onus being placed on gun owners to supply a genuine reason for firearm ownership. If a licence holder is granted a licence for the purpose of clay target shooting, then he must show he is a genuine clay target shooter.

I would suggest that if he does not wish to take part in the registered competition, then he does not have the "genuine reason of clay target shooting". This being the case, the person MUST register with the ACTA.

I have no doubt that some people will argue that they are entitled to shoot birds only or to take part in practice only. If this is the case, then we must ask if the club would exist without it being "an approved club" by State Law. The answer is no . . . clubs are approved only on the proof of its members being registered with an approved shooting body such as the ACTA.

We are only able to negotiate our low insurance premiums on the number of registered members we have, therefore the more members of our Association, the more we can achieve for them.

I am not aware of any other sporting/shooting organisation allowing this practice to exist. There are many more reasons for clubs to discontinue this practice, and I have no doubt I will be "hauled over the coals" by some in regards to this, but please, we are here for our shooters and we can only achieve results if everyone stands up and is counted. I ask all members to point out the benefits of being a "registered shooter".

SHOOTERS AND SHOOTING

I am indebted to a close friend and keen shooter in Herb Prior of Canberra for the following. It seems that despite progress, little changes in the human nature.

It is an excerpt from a book, *Shooting* (Moore and Marsh) published in 1887. Lord Walsingham writes of his observations of sportsmen and offers this advice:

"Shooting affords much assistance to a study of human nature. The different characteristics of individual sportsmen are strongly marked by their demeanour under various circumstances. We find among them several types. The most distinct of these are the habitually fortunate men. There are those who, wherever they are placed, whether by lot or by selection, seem to others to get the best of the shooting --- so much so, that they are jokingly credited with some mysterious power of attracting game. There are those who on the contrary, are certain to complain that they have been most unlucky. They will call attention to the fact that others have had more shooting than themselves, and wonder how it so consistently happens that they never get the best of luck. A parallel line of contrast may be drawn between those that are satisfied and content wherever they are placed, and those who, if left to their own choice, would prefer to take any other place than their own . . . In shooting as in other occupations, the rule that good luck follows good management is almost invariable. The score does not depend solely upon the number of opportunities, but on what use has been made of them".

Still relevant after 111 years ... thanks Herb.

ACTA LOSES ICON

The clay world was saddened on the 14th August to learn of the death of our historian, George Biggs. George passed away after suffering a heart attack following an operation. George is going to be missed by all who came into contact with him in our sport. George's knowledge of shooting, teh history of the sport and of its governing body was immense. He commenced his association with clay target shooting in 1945 and remained involved until his passing.

In 1994 George published his book "Australian Clay Target Association . . . History and Records – 1936-1992". This publication is often referred to by shooters to settle all sorts of disputes over "who won what and where . . ." George also wrote the book Trap and Skeet Shooting.

George served an unprecedented 25 years on the National Executive. He is also one of the elite few to win National Titles in both Trap and Skeet. In later years he devoted his involvement to coaching and many can thank George for their better than average ability.

Elsewhere in this magazine there is an obituary to this unique man.



The team arrived in Desenzano late in the afternoon on the 10th. The Hotel Desenzano was situated 8km from the Lonato Shooting Range and was very comfortable and within walking distance of restaurants and supermarkets.

The next day was official practice for double trap and it was a very jet lagged bunch of shooters who arrived at the range that morning. The Lonato range consists of nine trap and skeet fields and a background of green grass and trees on a bank out at about 120m. The bank is covered with a green mesh to give an even background and to catch the lead shot.

Most of the shooters did not shoot practice very well due to tiredness but felt that with a good nights rest, things would improved the next day. That afternoon we attended the official opening ceremony followed by a very early night.



Barcelona World Championships 1998 17 - 29 July, 1998

The same team which contested the Lonato World Cup also competed in the World Championship. The 16th was spent travelling between Lonato and Barcelona, registering firearms and settling into our accommodation, which was the local university campus. The accommodation was very basic but reasonably comfortable, except for the fact that the temperatures were around 35-38 degrees during the day and the rooms had no air-conditioning or even fans. It was also very noisy and getting a good nights sleep was going to prove difficult.

17th July was Double Trap practice. The range was the '92 Olympic venue consisting of rifle, pistol and shotgun ranges, all of which would be in use for this full World Championship. The rifle and pistol teams had begun arriving before us and had already started their various practice and competition schedules. The range had 3 superimposed trap and skeet layouts with a green grass background out to around 120m then uphill to a brown grass backdrop. The targets looked near perfect and everyone put in good practice sessions. It was obvious that this would be a high scoring tournament and this certainly would prove true.

and just missed out but still managed to finish 7th overall with her best ever score of 107.

The crowd was full expecting the world record of 192 to be broken with Richard Faulds (GBR) on 145 and Russell on 142. Michael missed his first pair then one of the second pair. To his credit he showed why he is one of the best shooters in the world today to hold it together to finish with a 45 and equal the final world record. Meanwhile our current Olympic and World Double Trap Champion Russell was on fire in the final to post a great 48 to pass Faulds and take 2nd place. 1 & 2 at the Worlds, it doesn't get any better than that!

The 47th World Championships in Barcelona had come to an end with Australia again providing a World Champion in Michael Diamond, the second place in Russell Mark and the Gold Medal Team in Double Trap. 





Clay Busting Loses Longtime Contributor

The death of George Biggs on Friday 14th August 1998 came as a shock to all who knew him. Although aged 88 years, George seemed to be indestructible, and his passing leaves a big gap in clay target shooting's 'old guard'!

George's contribution to the sport will no doubt be chronicled elsewhere. However, it is his 'hidden' efforts on which I will focus.

My first contact with George was in the early sixties when I was working for ICIANZ and George was a manager with Hartley's Sports Store in Flinders Street, Melbourne. Our relationship strengthened over a period, and we became close friends during the planning and conduct of the 1973 World Shooting Championships at Melbourne Gun Club.

When my appointment as National Secretary of the ACTA was announced in September 1976, one of the first people to offer support was George Biggs. His extensive knowledge of the sport's history and rules proved invaluable, and he was always available for advice.

A little later, when a decision was made to establish a national coaching scheme and an old colleague of mine, Newton Thomas, was appointed National Director of Coaching, George was again conspicuous in his efforts to contribute, ultimately being appointed to the official coaching team as Victorian Director of Coaching.

Another project in which I was intimately involved was the schoolboy/schoolgirl training scheme and George was very prominent in its emergence, not only as a community safety program, but also providing a new personal challenge to students.

He continued to play a major role in the development and promotion of the sport of clay busting right to the end.

My personal loss is of a very loyal and close friend, one to whom I owe a great deal.

Maybe, just maybe, we will soon see an angels' shooting team appear on the scene!

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

1.In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. NOTE: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.

2.Squads of 6 to shoot 100 targets in rounds of 50, brackets of 25, two visits to the traps, 2nd 50t moving up one trap. cg 1-2, 2-3, 3-4 etc.

3.While shooters may request to be squadded in the same wave as other shooters, under no circumstances are shooters allowed to arrange their own squads. All squads will be determined by the Nationals Office, whose decision shall be final.

4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 Targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the change over for each 25 targets. Should two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF TARGET shall be incurred.

5.Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will forfeit their nomination. Upon the payment of a second nomination shooters will be re squadded towards the end of the event.

6.Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

7.Any competitor may be called upon to referee and or score throughout the period of competition. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.

8.Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET will be incurred in the event concerned.

9.Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility shall be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.

10.Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.

11.All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.

12.All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.

13.Optional purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location from the area accepting shooting event nominations.

14.Optional purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.

15. When team selection is involved, shooters shall be eligible for the open team as well as section teams irrespective of the section nominated for. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

16.Competitors must compete in a clear majority of programmed events to gain High Gun recognition. High Gun over 400 targets of the National Program.

17.Women and Junior shooters only are eligible for their section as well as the open event.

18.A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section including high gun before sashes, medals, trophies are awarded.

19.Nominations will close daily at 11.00 am.

20. The practice of card playing at the National Championships is prohibited in areas embracing the club rooms, bar, dining areas or such areas as may be determined from time to time.

21.Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

22.An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate.

23.I am in compliance with State licensing laws in my State of residence and in the State where this competition is being conducted.





with 106+20, Daniel Power from Crookwell won B grade 102/125 and Rocky Manno from SA won C grade with 88/125.






The gentlemen in the office kept the day running smoothly with squads backing up ready to shoot.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS - OCTOBER 1998

Last month's column on the workings of a Major Shoot in America has created a great deal of interest and generated a number of questions on such matters as professional refereeing, selective squadding, the National Major Shoot Calendar and how the money payouts are distributed. Over the next few months I will attempt to address each of these issues individually. This month I will start with selective squadding, not only because I consider it to be an extremely important issue, but also because I believe that we currently stand at the crossroads with it in Australia

Many years ago, when I first started shooting, I learnt that at grass roots level you can pretty much arrange your squad any way you please, which has all sorts of advantages and conveniences. However, when I began to attend State shoots and the Nationals, I found that this all changes. Suddenly squadding was under the total jurisdiction of the hierarchy and was definitely not done to conform with shooter convenience. Not knowing any better, I just presumed that this was the way that it was, and although disliking it, simply learned to live with it. However, on my first trip to the New Zealand Nationals, I found that a lady at the squadding window, taking five tickets in any order you want, is a much better plan. Almost all Australian shooters that attend the NZ Nationals shoot well and have a great time and I believe that their selective squadding policy is one of the main reasons for this.

Upon returning to Australia, I spent the next several years making a determined effort to get this procedure adopted here. All to no avail! Every time I got the idea off the ground, a small minority of people would sow the seed of doubt that some people might use this avenue to cheat, and down it would crash again. After losing the vote on these grounds at several consecutive AGMs. I became so frustrated and disappointed that I stopped attending the AGM altogether. Most New Zealanders who shoot in Australia have adjusted to our squadding system, but I know it is an issue with them, because it came up rather pointedly one year at their Nationals. A bunch of Aussies were sitting around taking the mickey out of the Kiwis, as they often tend to do. After several sheep jokes, which caused us great amusement and them to smile politely, one of the Kiwis asked us "what have you got, if you have five Aussies shooting together?" We had no idea, but when the answer was "obviously someone cheating", all the Kiwis roared laughing and we were left with egg on our faces and a serious dent in our National ego. Afterwards, I spoke seriously to several of them about the matter and asked their thoughts. The general consensus was that, in their opinion, it probably stemmed from a mind-set that reflected our convict origins. Now there is some food for thought!

Anyway, I went on to bigger and better things and tried to forget about it. But unfortunately, after shooting extensively in the U.S. and Canada and speaking with people from all over the world, I found that we are the only country with a hang up over selective squadding. The fact that it stems partly from a lack of faith in our shooters' basic honesty and integrity is not only a disappointment to me, but also a major embarrassment at times. After several difficult attempts to explain our national stand on squadding to overseas shooters, I learnt to avoid the issue at all costs. My frustration increased the longer I competed overseas as the multiple benefits of selective squadding continued to become apparent.

There are numerous advantages for the shooters, including many diverse areas of convenience and the ability to consistently shoot higher scores - which is the result of operating in a stable environment, rather than of cheating. There are numerous advantages for shoot organizers including simpler and earlier squadding and time savings both during squad change-overs and the total time taken for a squad to shoot. With selective squadding you never find four shooters standing around waiting to start with no idea who or where the fifth shooter might be and when five people shoot together regularly they soon develop a rhythm and take less time. There are numerous advantages for the sport itself in general, not the least of which is greater participation at individual shoots. If only one or two members of a regular squad want to go to a particular shoot, they will spend a lot of time trying to talk the rest of the squad into going as well. If that fails then they usually try to talk several other friends into going so they can make up a squad, before eventually going it alone as we all normally do at present in Australin.

I would like to see selective squadding introduced for all the above reasons and another two more pages full if space permitted me to ramble on forever, but I also have to admit that I have a vested interest in the concept. In my position of National Shoot Marshall it would make my life so much easier. A selected squad always has a spokesperson/organizer who can usually make decisions on behalf of the squad or at least arrange to get a voted decision very quickly. When this helps me the most is if I have a trap break down and need a squad to shoot on another trap to catch up. A quick chat with the spokesperson is usually all I need. Also, it helps at the end of each event when I often need to move a couple of squads around onto different traps to save time by getting all the squads to finish nearly together. If it is a random squad, I need to track down each and every shooter and advise them accordingly, which is very time consuming especially if I don't know a couple of them. However, if it is a selected squad, I simply find any one of them, tell him to advise the rest, and then I can get on with more important things.

Also, selected squads usually make all my referee and scorer problems just go away. Firstly, I never arrive at a field to find five shooters and no workers, because they have all just wandered off either deliberately or absent-mindedly forgetting to work out who is going to do it. That system works okay with strangers, but it's pretty hard to pull off with your mates. Secondly, even when the referening roster works great, and the shooters are also backing up well, i still get frustratingly long delays between squads while shooters walk to the far end of the car-park and back to lock their guns away, as now required by law. With a selected squad, when you finish shooting, you just hand your gun to one of your mates, pick up the button, and away you go. (He also brings you a drink back later, or even relieves you between rounds) Thirdly, the refereeing roster becomes unnecessary because they work it out internally to give you a better result than a roster ever could. After a selected squad, you hardly ever get an inexperienced referee and a veteran scoring, who should be sitting down resting. The capable members of the squad usually accept this responsibility gracefully as part of the selective squadding package.

Anyway let's bring ourselves up to date. So there I was in Wagga last year, working at the Trap Nationals. Imagine my surprise on Sunday morning when I was told that, at the AGM the previous evening, a motion was passed from the floor that shooters will be squadded in the order that they nominate. Now I don't claim to be Albert Einstein, but it only took me about two seconds to figure out that we now had selective squadding in Australia albeit via the back door. If five of you wish to shoot together in a particular order, you simply get together and line up at the squadding window in that order. What if there are already two shooters listed on the squad sheet when your first shooter gets to the window? What stops you standing aside and allowing three other people through? End of story. So what happened? For the rest of the week those people who wished to shoot together did so. Those people who wished to squad randomly did so. Everybody had a great time and I did not hear a single allegation of cheating or any other complaint for that matter.

In the eighteen months since then, we have had a Skeet Nationals, another Trap Nationals and many State shoots. I have competed in, or worked at, most of these and so far have not seen a single hith with the selective squadding system. As a matter of fact, I believe we are now on an unprecedented run of three consecutive Nationals without a single protest hearing and harmony between competitors and administrators seems to be at an all time high. Actually, at several recent shoots, I believe that queue-hopping theatrics have been deemed unnecessarily childish, and squadding has simply been done as required, which was the original intent. So where is that fabled cheating flag that flew so ignominiously over us for so long? It's in tatters in the trash where it always belonged and the people who had been flying it need to hang their heads in shame.

So if the problem is solved and selective squadding is now a fait accompli, why am I even raising the issue? Well, we've run into a hitch. The problem is that, due to achieving the objective in a de facto form via the back door, it's unforeseen and undesirable by-products are going to cause it to self-destruct. The round about rule that now allows selective squadding to be achieved at the top end of our sport is hampering the selective squadding that has always existed at grass roots level. Imagine the average gun club secretary, with no idea of ACTA politics, receiving a rule change advice stating that, in future all shooters must be squadded in the order that they nominate. Without knowing the background it appears absurd, intrusive, illogical and totally inappropriate.

But rules are rules and so next Saturday, when Billy Bloggs arrives at the gun club bright and early, with mum and the kids who are all set to shoot, he hits a brick wall. As usual, he hands one cheque and five nomination forms over the counter and says, "I'll be the second shooter in the second squad, mum will shoot third and Mary will shoot fourth beside her mum. Uncle Mick and Jimmy Jones will be here shortly to fill the first and fifth spots. Put little Billy in the third squad because he hates to shoot with his sister and put young Fred in squad four because he is going to use my gun". Imagine the look on his face when he is told that, due to the new rule change, they will have to be the first five shooters in the first squad. Instant disaster, lots of unhappy campers, the day's shooting ruined and several strongly worded letters of complaint to the National Office on Monday from the shooters as well as the administrators.

Let's examine some of the reasons that have been advanced against selective squadding. Cheating has always been the main argument put up by the opposition, but with a year and a half of hindsight it now seems to have had about as much substance as fairyfloss. Another time-honored favorite is: They don't do it in ISU. To this I say: They don't do it in tiddlywinks or sabre tossing either. And forgive me for daring to malign the sacred cow, but I defy anyone to read the ISU rulebook and then try to convince me that the guy who wrote it actually rulebook and then try to convince me that all while doing it. Another good one that was once used to shoot me down went something like: Little Johnny Smith, who is a brand new C grade shooter, goes along to his first Nationals and by the random method gets to shoot along side Billy Iles in the National Double Barrel. Imagine the thrill this would give him and who are we to deprive him of that chance.

What a crock of horse manure! If Billy lies is prepared to spend all year honing up his skills in an attempt to win another National Double Barrel title, who are we to deprive him of a stable neutral environment to show his true ability. Who are we to squad him with four total strangers who may tip his level playing field upside down? The first shooter may arrive ten minutes late and rock his mental preparation. The shooter on his left may decide to fidget just as Bill calls and the shooter on his right may decide to have an argument with the referee after about ten targets. Is this giving him a fair go and providing him with equity, or is this the infamous "tall poppy" system where instead of trying to rise to his level, we try to drag him down. And let's not forget little Johnny Smith. In reality, he was probably so distracted and intimidated by having to shoot beside the great man that he wasn't able to achieve his own potential. Wouldn't we be better to allow both of these competitors to compete in the most distraction free and unstressed environment possible.

So where does this leave us? Between a rock and a hard place. We obviously can't leave the rule unchanged, but if we water "will" down to "may", then the original intent is lost and we're headed for confrontation and ill-will again. What is the answer? Rescind the rule totally. Replace it with a rule that says "Shooters will be allowed to arrange their own squads and shoot management will make every effort to accommodate this, whenever possible". Remember, this is not a new and untried and radical concept. The rest of the world has had it since the year dot. I believe the hour is at hand to take the bull by the horns, shake of our "convict origin mind set", as our Tasman neighbors so appropriately put it, and get with the times.








Sunday dawned a beautiful warm sunny day with a few sore heads starting to shoot at 9am.




Left: Winner of Mafeesh Handicap, Brian Doyle with Ern Hawkins.

Level Accreditation Course Mt. Gambier, S.A. 31st July - 2nd August



After accepting an invitation from Mr Phil Mules, S.A.C.T.A. Coaching Director, to attend a Level 1 Accreditation Course in Mount Gambier plans were put in place.

Arriving in Adelaide Friday morning I was met by Phil and after picking up a vehicle we headed for Mount Gambier. To show me a little of his state Phil had me head to Mount Gambier via the Coorong. A pleasant drive for anyone having never seen this region, had us at our destination some 4 & 1/2 hours later.

By request and to fit in with shoot dates in the zone we had programmed the course to begin Friday evening and finish mid morning on Sunday. This then allowed those involved to travel to the South East Gun Club's shoot.

At 7.00pm with a great fire warming the Mt. Gambier club rooms, the program of Accreditation began.

In attendance were member from: Mt. Gambier Gun Club: Terry Gilcrist, Phil Green, Gavin Height, Max Medhurst, Rodney Gilcrist; Bordertown Gun Club: Robert Andrews, Bruce Carter, Ken Richards; Millicent Gun Club: Peter Winser, Steve Chambers; South East Gun Club: Alan Walters, Ken Burton.

First part of the program was the Course explanation which included the Level 1 kit and its contents. As past Level 1 Coaches know this kit contains manuals and books put together and funded by the ACTA Coaching Council to assist a new Coach begin.

Phil Mules then presented the many facets of the Role of a Coach, explaining that practical skills are one thing, being able to get message across, another. Sports Psychology followed with the main theme being how it effects and can be used by Club competitors in our sport. At 9.30pm the evening concluded with a short question period.

Sharp at 9.00am the next morning with the fire still warming

us we began with Physical Conditioning for the Clay Target Shooter being discussed. A collective sigh of relief when intense physical training and no McDonalds weren't the basis of the presentation. To change pace Safety and Shooter Etiquette was presented by Phil Green. After a short break, Characteristics of Shotguns was introduced and considerable time was spent explaining each area and the basis of Gun Fit. As with other programs, the Basics of Shotgun Shooting followed before the practical track work began.

Out onto the D.T.L. layout additional Basics of gun hold, both over and traditional, were discussed as well as stance and vision. Several club members had volunteered to

attend so that the new Coaches could see, discuss and evaluate different styles for faults and work on ways to assist in improving the shooter. From a new Junior to a very experienced shooter the Coaches looked, listened and under direction worked out solutions to different trouble areas. At 5.15pm the day ended with Skeet being programmed for Sunday morning.

It seemed the next morning was even colder when we took to the layouts again to discuss the basics. One area that a good deal of attention was hold outs with stance and the physical point that the individual clearly saw the target and was able to react in co-ordination with the target. A few surprised looks were witnessed with a simple test of reaction versus vision was tried.

At 10.30am a halt was called so that the course conclusion could be held as well as a question period. The bitterly cold conditions had nothing to do with the race to the fire. During this final session the assignments were reconfirmed as well as a supervising Coach being assigned. Then, following a question period, the drive back to Adelaide began.

To me the course had again unearthed a quantity of talented Coaches, some being top competitors, but all dedicated to helping others and aiding the sport to prosper. During the duration of the course it was also good to see Trevor Reschke (Level 2) and Guy Yoannides (Level 1 and ex ACTA Coaching Committee member) drop in to say hello and view the course.

No event can be conducted without preplanning and Phil Mules, SACTA Coaching Director did a first class job. To Max Medhurst, Phil Green and the ladies of the Mt. Gambier Gun Club, my appreciation for your support of this Coaching Accreditation program.



KENNETH SYDNEY BURTON ("NUGGET")

BORN 23-09-39, DIED 10-10-93, AGED 54

Ken (Nugget) was born in Boort (Vic.) and lived his entire life on the farming property he and his father shared - farmed then eventually bought when Nugget was 14 years old. Although playing football in his younger days, after being introduced to shooting in 1970 it became his love. "Why waste a good Saturday going to footy when you could go to a shoot somewhere?" he'd often say.

He was a true ambassador to the sport, encouraging all he met to take up the sport. He helped numerous juniors along the way and encouraged Clubs to support junior events, saying "The kids of today are our shooters of tomorrow". No distance was too far to travel, as long as there was a good programme on.

He chased Double Rise and Handicap events all over Australia. If you can remember "Nugget" coming to your Club, I'd say it was either to shool Double Rise or he'd fix your traps while he was there.

Rise or he'd fix your traps while he was there. His Kerang Ibis Traps machine became popular Australia-wide for their simplicity, affordability to all Clubs, and the knowledge that if you had a problem, "Nugget" would fix it, without question.

After his death the business was sold and, I'm pleased to say, the new owners David and Julie Pay are keeping up "Nugget's" service side of that business, as well as continuing to make good traps.


The Boort Clay Target Club decided to honour "Nugget" after his sudden death (a massive heart attack) and put on a Memorial Shoot in "Nugget's" name. The event to be 60 pair of Double Rise. To those of you who knew him you can imagine him saying "That's right, put on a bloody good Double Rise event when you know I can't be there to shoot it".

Nugget was also a great believer in that Memorial Shoots go on for too long, and eventually the shooters say "Who's he?" when a Memorial Shoot is mentioned. So it was decided that Nugget's Memorial Shoot would only run for five years. The fifth and final year is to be a Grand Final.

So shooters, this is your last chance to honour a great man, a man who never refused to help out any Club who asked for help. Who was a friend to all. A shooter of considerable ability. The man I loved and admired, my husband. So please come along and give "Nugget" his final send-off, and make this day a true memorial to him.
