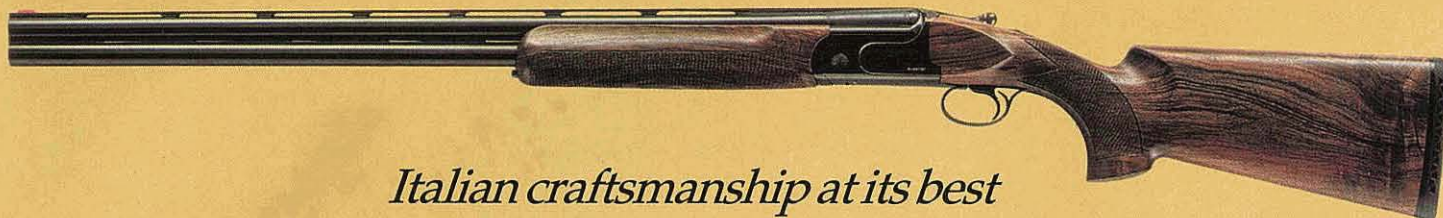

Michael was to win the Trap Individual Gold and teaming with Ben, won the Pairs Silver. David and Clive were unlucky to miss out on a medal in the skeet pairs finishing in 4th position with only 1 target separating all positions. David went on to win the individual skeet bronze with Clive finishing in 5th place.

A truly outstanding effort by all giving us our most successful Games team ever.

A full report on the Commonwealth Games will be included next month.

1999 WORLD DTL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1999 World DTL Championships are to take place at the Mid Wales Shooting School at Trefeglwys outside Newtown in Wales. This was the host club for the Championships in 1994 and is operated by Arthur WILLIAMS who is well known to many Australians for his hospitality and his visit to Wagga last year. The dates have been set as the 6th, 7th and 8th of August.

The weekend prior being the 30th, 31st July and 1st August sees the largest Game Fair of the UK being held at Harewood House in Yorkshire. This Fair features game fishing, shooting, gundogs, falconry and cooking.

It is still planned to send a full team to these Championships and to also organise a tour for members who wish to make the trip. Full details will be included in the December CTSN, after we receive confirmation of Grand American dates.

RECORDS TUMBLE

A very successful Olympic Discipline Nationals was held in Adelaide during September. A very large number of shooters turned out for all events and no less than 47 records were broken.

These were:

Clive BARTON (Skeet) 148/150 new Australian record
Nathan CASSELLS (Junior Trap) 147/150 equal Australian record

Russell MARK (Double Trap) 192/200 new Australian record

Deserie WAKEFIELD-BAYNES (Women's Double Trap) 149/160 new Australian record

Congratulations to these shooters and all those qualifying for our team.

Shooting for the Disabled

At present the only events available internationally for disabled shooters are rifle and pistol. The World Championships were held in these events in Spain during June this year and Australian shooters did very well. Currently, Ashley Adams, a cattle farmer from central Queensland is World Champion in the .22 rifle English Match, while our Sport Pistol team also won gold. Ashley's disability is a spinal cord injury which has left him in a wheelchair, but in the team there were also amputees, people with polio, spina bifida, degenerative diseases and cerebral palsy. Interestingly, Ashley also has points on the Olympic Athlete ranking.

There are, however, some shotgun shooters around the world who also have a disability and the purpose of this article is to find out how many in Australia may be interested in pursuing the possibility of international competition for shotgun some time in the future. This would not happen before 2000 as the program for the Paralympic Games has already been set and cannot be changed.

What we are proposing is a demonstration to be held in Victoria perhaps at the same time as the National Championships in Shooting for the Disabled to be held in Melbourne over the easter weekend. The time is negotiable. At that time, a video would be made to show to the International Shooting Committee for the Disabled and all the nationals who would be present at the Open European Championships in Denmark in mid 1999.

A great effort and very good shooting from Margaret Denton and Daniel Makim to gain selection in the Open Team as well as their respective sectional teams.

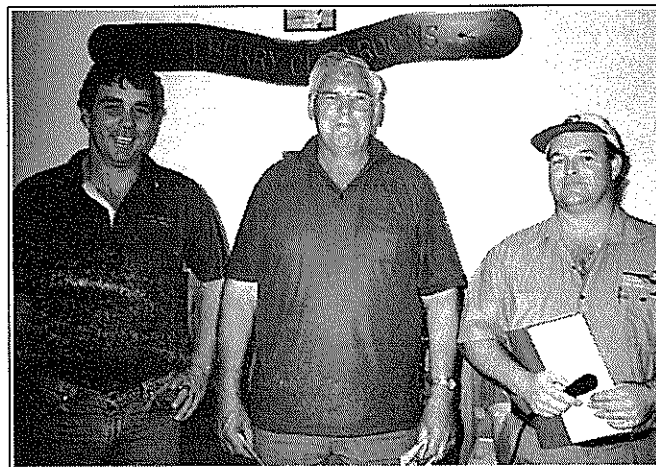

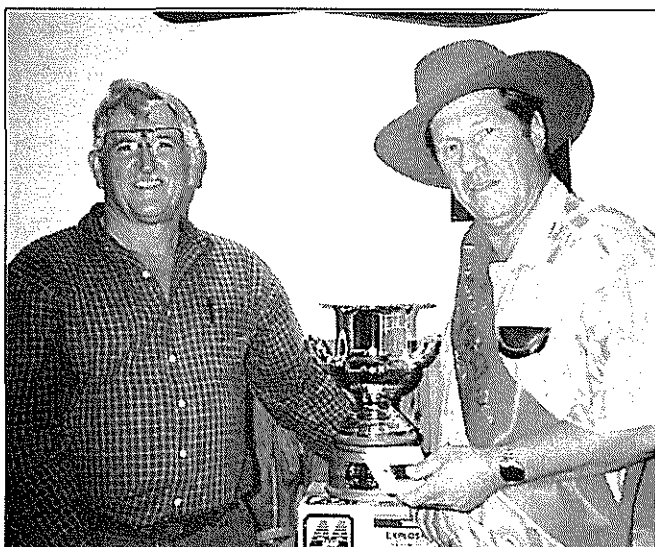
Qld State Skeet Carnival Overall winner — Pacific Coast Skeet Championship Mick Watson (WA) with Bill Allan and Robert Nugent.

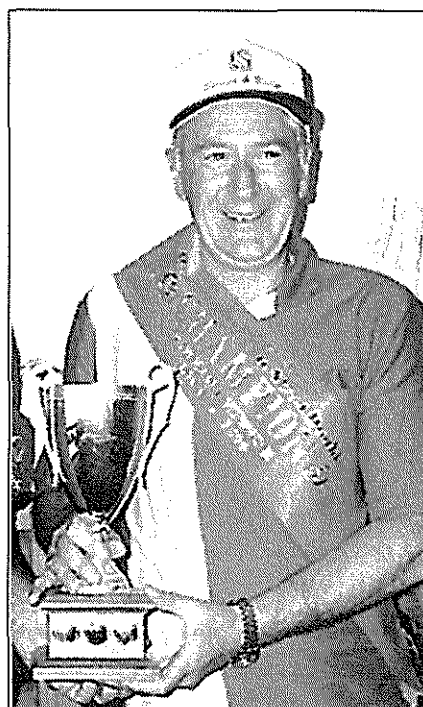

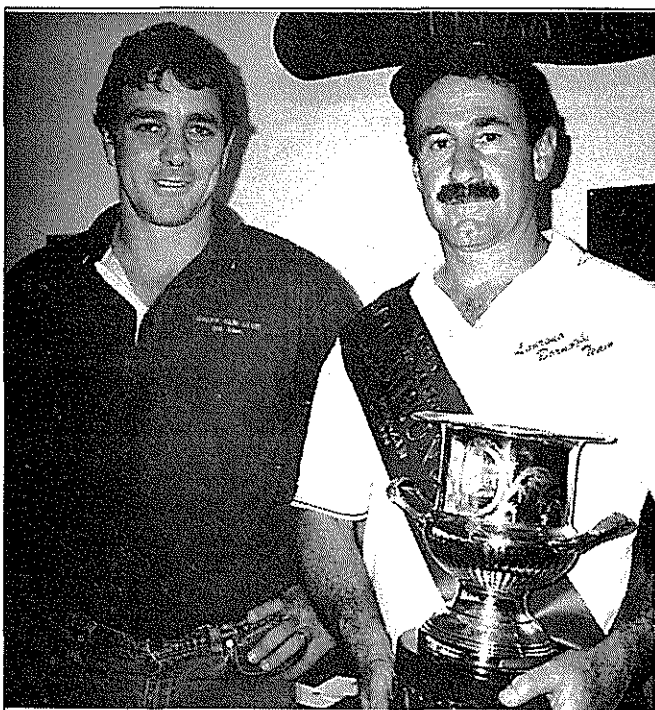
The Junior Encouragement award for this year was awarded to Owen Nugent.

Rule changes as of January 1, 1999

Rule 1.02 (d) Procedure—Add to front of rule:

"Once reaching his shooting mark . . ."

Rule 4.32 (a) Break Recognition—Add to last sentence after Also for: "all ISU events . . ."

Rule 1.04 (d) Squadding (Trap)—Alter last sentence to read:

"Shooters may be squadded in order of nomination".

Rule 1.05 (d) Squadding (Skeet)—Alter last sentence to read:

"Shooters may be squadded in order of nomination".

Rule 2.01 (i)—Add to first sentence after . . . down graded:

"He can only be downgraded one grade at a time"

Rule 2.02 (b) (i)—Delete in full and replace with:

"For every 200 targets shot, a 1 metre backward movement will apply if the percentage is 95% or above. If an overall win is recorded, (regardless of score), the Handicap card will be ruled off immediately. The 200 targets will then restart."

Rule 2.02 (c)—Delete in full and replace with:

"(c) (i) 1 metre backward movement to apply to any overall handicap winner regardless of score.

(ii) A shooter recording 95% or above, from 15 metres (with a handicap of 15 metres or less), will automatically be re-handicapped to 16 metres."

Rule 2.03 (a)—Delete in full and replace with:

"A 1 metre inward movement will apply if a shooter's recorded percentage is less than 80 per cent, over 200 targets."

Note: Any win will take precedence over a movement by percentage.

Rule 4.05 (a)—Alteration to first sentence:

Replace "3 metres" with "4.5 metres" and "10 metres" with "18 metres".

Rule 3.32 A.C.T.A. SPORTING CLAYS—Add:

"To be read in conjunction with A.C.T.A. Trap and Skeet Rules."

Rule 3.32 (iv)—Add after . . . as a caged area "(1 square metre)".

Rule 3.32 (b)—Insert at end:

"Hand throwers will be prohibited."

Rule 3.32 (d)—Delete first sentence and replace with:

"The target sequence will be shown to all shooters prior to commencement of competition only and with any subsequent changes to the target sequence."

Rule 3.32—Add:

"(n) A shooter can refuse targets as per A.C.T.A. rules GRST 17 & 1.08 (c)."

"(o) Malfunctions, as per A.C.T.A. Rule 1.10 (f)."

"(p) Pairs to be scored 1-1 when broken by 1 shot."

"(q) Baulk rule will apply as per A.C.T.A. Rules 1.11 (a)."

Day two started crisp and cool with shooters arriving to finish off the shoot-off from the previ-



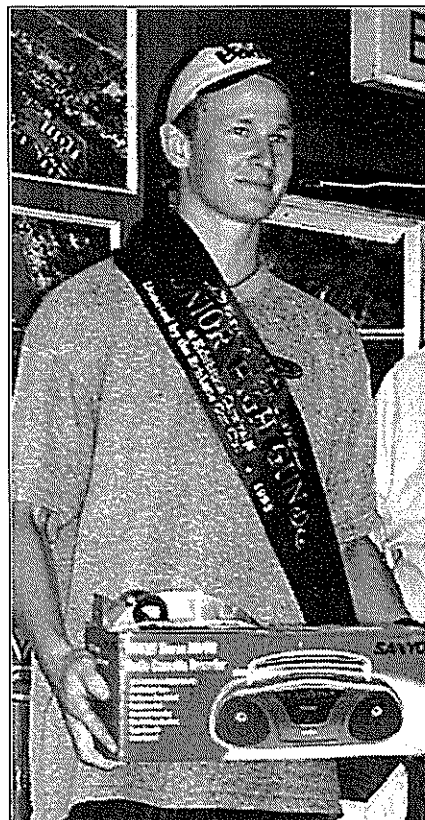

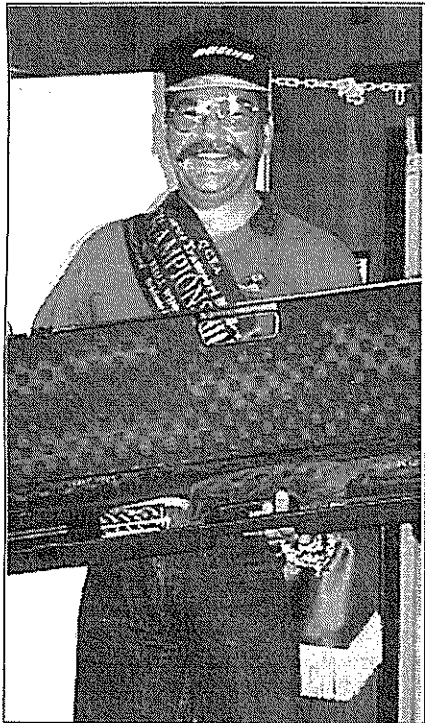

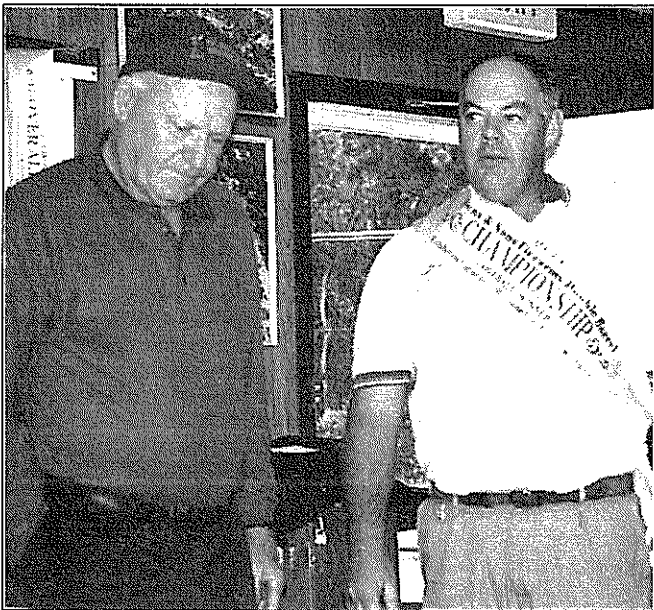

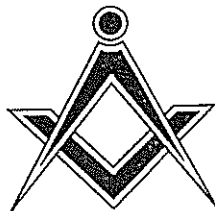

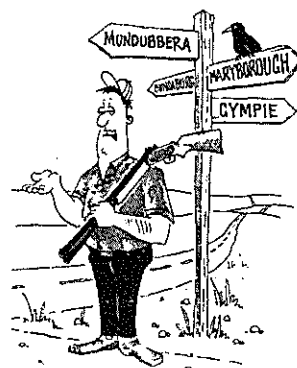
I didn't quite think this story held water and I got a lucky break while sitting at the doctors reading an old magazine and it seems there is another theory.

What makes shooters tick II

by Claudia Kulla, Mental Training Coach, ASA



In the September issue I started my column by writing about, what I believe is the most fundamental topic when dealing with shooting from a psychological point of view. It is motivation that lays the foundation for almost anything we do, whether it is at work, at home or out at the gun club. This key topic was introduced by explaining the goal setting technique with its time and contents related goals as well as some principles you should consider when applying goal setting. There are certainly some good reasons to think about using goal setting:

Goal Setting

- *Improves performance (quality and consistency)
- *Improves practice quality (as you always know what you are striving for)
- *Provides a plan for training and competition
- *Keeps you motivated for a longer time
- *Reduces boredom
- *Increases the intrinsic motivation (I will explain this term shortly)

So why not go back to the September issue and refresh your memory to be ready to start your own goal setting program?

CAUSES FOR MOTIVATION

I already touched the main reasons for us to join shooting or probably any other sport. But having an even closer look reveals that there are two main categories of causes that make a shooter tick.

Extrinsic rewards

Shooter X enjoys recognition and applause by the fellows out at the gun club when he shoots a good round. Nothing is more rewarding than being the centre of attention (even if it is just for a very short time). He likes the admiring looks, how they congratulate him and maybe even ask him for advice. His day is done when his coach pats his shoulder. Additional statements like "Hey Matey! That was great!" lead to a visible increase of chest volume and a sudden straightening of the spine. Moreover good rankings or good performance is not just rewarded by comments of other people, it very often finds its materialisation in prizes like cups, cheques or even guns. And honestly, who would reject anything like that.

To sum it up: Shooter X is driven by external rewards, praise or prizes coming from outside. Or in other words he is extrinsically motivated.

Intrinsic rewards

Shooter Y goes out to the range for the enjoyment of the activity, fun and the feeling of mastery. He is striving for perfection in his shooting routine. He goes out and works on his shooting even when there is nothing to win, just because he wants to become better. He likes every single aspect of the shooting activity; the way he prepares, the way his butt melts into his cheek, the way he swings, the way he can feel the recoil, how it looks when the target is smoked. Every improvement leaves a smile on his face and adds to his self esteem as he knows he is continuously gaining in expertise and gets one step closer to mastery.

Shooter Y is intrinsically motivated, his drive to put more effort into shooting, to become better and to stick to shooting mainly comes from inside.

Both examples are extreme and hardly ever exist in that pure form. If we put shooter X on one side of a scale and shooter Y on the other, most of us would probably see ourselves somewhere in between. Your motives for training might be even changing from the pure enjoyment of shooting activity for the High Gun.

It is not possible to say that one of the two styles is always preferable (although more intrinsically motivated people are supposed to show commitment for a longer time as a lack of rewards is not as frustrating as it is for extrinsically motivated people). They are also somewhat interrelated as external rewards can also increase intrinsic motivation. I don't want to go into details any further, but just give you some food for thought as where you see your major motives, more on the extrinsic or more on the intrinsic side? Both sides are important and should find consideration in what you do in order to keep shooting interesting for you.

SOME GENERAL IDEAS FOR INCREASING TRAINING MOTIVATION

Periodisation

Work with periodisation. It is a basic technique of training programming and belongs to exercise science. We cannot go into details here, but let us just have a look at its link to psychological aspects of shooting. You probably don't need much fantasy to work out that sustaining a strict training regime for a very long time can be tiring. As a matter of fact if you don't plan your training according to cycles, considering competitions and training intensities, you risk to burn out. Instead of achieving improvement, your performance might be even decreasing. Reasons for this are of physical and psychological nature. Just looking at the latter: you feel tired and lose training motivation. There is not more fun in what you do, it just feels like a duty. Very often it is only the fact that there is someone waiting for you at the gun club that you can actually be bothered to throw your gear into the boot of your car and go to the training venue. Enthusiasm is not detectable in that stage. Can you remember having gone through a phase like that? It certainly depends on your training quantity and your competition calendar, but some of you might have experienced such a motivational low.

In the beginning of a year take a year planner and fill in those competitions you know you would like to participate in. Mark highlights and decide according to your experience and available time, when to start your intensive training phase before the competition, increasing your quantity and the quality beyond your usual standard of training.

Avoid burn out by rewarding yourself with little breaks (4 days or 1 week) after you have participated in a competition that was important for you.

Your year planner should be set up in a way that it allows you to have at least one longer break of 4-6 weeks in which you hardly shoot at all, but which you use for doing some

fitness training, dealing with organisational things, or looking after your equipment. Ideally this break should be before the competitive year starts for you. From then onwards you can work with goal setting and gradually increase.

Breaks are very important for motivation as they provide distance to an activity that has almost become too monotonous. The time should be used to find some distraction from shooting in order to be fresh and keen again to start a new season.

Rewards

As already mentioned in the context of goal setting it is advisable to treat yourself with a little reward for goals that you have achieved. No matter whether you set yourself a more mental goal like achieving a perfect mental focus for 75% of the targets you call for, or whether you just stick to you plan to train over a quantity of 15 rounds a week, your reward can reach from positive self talk and self praise to buying yourself something nice, but make sure that the value of the reward is in relation to the importance of the achievement.

If you work as a coach applying a reward system it is very important to keep your training group running. Never forget to give a positive feedback, when you see your athletes putting in a lot of effort and persistence. It is not just the hit target you should reward but also the general work. You can apply verbal praise or material prizes. A judo club even installed a token system, rewarding technical work, ambitions and discipline with little coins that could be collected by the young athletes. Dependent on the number of tokens the kids could exchange them after a while for something really valuable like a training suit.

A reward is nothing else but a positive reinforcement for behaviour. By rewarding you increase the probability that your athlete will show that behaviour again, one of the basic principles of conditioning. Unfortunately, it is not that easy, there are some aspects you should keep in mind, when working with rewards as a coach:

*Reward immediately and not some days later.

*Newcomers should be rewarded more frequently than athletes with more experience and a higher skill level. Extrinsic rewards lose their effect after a while, that is why you should be pointing at more intrinsic values of shooting. Bring your athletes closer to the concept that winning is not all, but that the feeling of being satisfied with the way you shoot is much more important than achieving a high rank or medal. This makes it easier for them to become more independent from outside sources of positive feedback and they will be less frustrated in phases of stagnating performance.

*Reward only if it is deserved, we all have a value system and can easily judge whether this positive reinforcement was appropriate or not.

*Mind that extrinsic rewards can sometimes also be detrimental for the intrinsic motivation of your athletes. This can happen if your athletes think that you only want to control their behaviour, you don't give it in connection with shooting at all or when they are so highly intrinsically motivated that they don't need your feedback.

Self-talk

Your self-talk will be supporting your motivation to train or to compete if it is positive, confident and reflecting the fact that you see the upcoming event as a challenge.

Use expressions like "I want to...", "I choose to..." rather than "I must...", "I have to...", "I should...". The best way to become aware of what you are telling yourself is by writing

it down after shooting. You will be surprised how you address yourself sometimes. Some of us show most impatience when talking to ourselves. It is a good idea to have a look at the written statements in front of you. Mark every negative part of a sentence red and every positive part green. Neutral contents leave uncoloured. Now step back and have a look at your paper. Which colour is predominant?

Take now every red statement and formulate it in such a way that it becomes a positive statement. Don't forget, always replace 'can't' with 'can'!

Training Environment

Invite more people to your training, so that you every now and then have the chance to shoot in a squad, which makes your training effort much more realistic. If your friends are not of the same performance standard as you, that does not matter. In order to make your control competitions more challenging introduce a factor system that equals performance or simply allow your fellows to shoot more targets if they are below your level.

When you are not directly in a competition preparation phase you might want to introduce some games that make training a bit more interesting. Just fight out little things with your training partners. Have shoot offs for example and winner gets five cartridges from each competitor.

Or shoot Skeet in reverse order, which will give you something to think about as you are not shooting according to your normal routine (Attention: reasonable standard required!) Another challenge could be to shoot not just one pair per station, but maybe five or ten pairs, in a Double Trap round. The same is possible in Trap or Skeet. Try to shoot a round with 75 targets (triple the amount per station) with the objective to get them all. It is a bigger challenge and if you succeed it will inevitably improve the confidence in your own ability.

Performance monitoring

Your motivation to go on training can be increased by a guided performance analysis. Each time you shoot a competition analyse it carefully in order to work out which technical and mental aspects were good or which were still improvable. Work out this way what is under your control in shooting and what you should be striving for in future. That gives your training plan new input.

In addition to this it might be an idea to use a performance graph for illustrating score development. It gives you a better overview and keeps you motivated to get the curve going uphill.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS NOVEMBER 1998

While sitting around gun clubs between events, there are several questions that I am often asked. One of these always is "do you miss shooting on the US pro circuit?" The answer to this one is lengthy and complicated and involves a certain amount of yes and no. Another one usually goes something like "do you ever wonder where you would be, if you were still there now?" The answer to that one is always totally clear cut. I simply look at my watch, check the date and give an answer like: Today is Saturday the 10th of June, which makes this the second week-end in June, so I would be shooting at the North-South Open at the National Capital Gun Club in Washington DC. The reason my answer is so precise, is because American Skeet shooters long ago came to appreciate the virtues of a National Major Shoot Calendar, where the dates for all the Major Events are fixed from year to year. Changes to this calendar are almost never made, and when they are, it is always with great trepidation, as the repercussions are always hurtful to somebody. The three main advantages of a fixed calendar are:

- 1) Shooters can plan shooting trips and holidays well in advance.
- 2) Major Events of the same or similar discipline never clash with one another.
- 3) Anyone wishing to schedule a Major Event can work out a suitable date with confidence.

Unfortunately we have not applied this logic yet in Australia. Worse still, we are in a transitional stage between a fixed calendar and random programming, which means we have a "Claytons" calendar that sometimes causes more mayhem than no calendar at all. What happens is, just when we seem to be getting our dates sorted out, someone changes one, which starts a ripple effect that stuffs up the whole system, ruins a lot of other arrangements, and often catches people out. This almost happened to me recently, and illustrates point 1) above. I had all my arrangements in place to attend the NSW Skeet Carnival, which has been held on the second weekend in August for as long as I can remember, and thus I considered it to be one of the "rock solids." Luckily I was discussing my travel plans with another intending competitor, who wasn't a regular attendee and thus had gotten the dates from the latest shoot add. When he suggested that I was a week out, I told him that he must be confused, but I still rang Libbie Douglass just to check.

When she confirmed his belief, I was astounded. Understanding this, Libbie went on to explain that it was not the fault of either herself or the NSWCTA, but was a result of the ripple effect started by a change in the annual date of the ISU Nationals. Fortunately I was able to change my arrangements, even at this late time, with only minor inconvenience, but it brought home to me once again the problems caused by Major Shoot date changes, and the ensuing ripple effect. The ripple effect is when one change necessitates another change, which causes another change, which leads to another change etc etc. The flip side of the "shooting trip planning" point is not the drama of a change in a fixed date, but the problems caused by not having one to start with. Our National president, Mr Glenn Woodhatch, will agree with this, I am sure, because from reading his column each month, I can see that the lack of a fixed or set date for the World DTL Championships has been causing him to tear his hair out.

The recent Victorian Skeet Carnival drama is a graphic example of point 2) above. This event has been floating around without a permanent date for quite some time, and eventually, the problems and inconvenience this generated for the competitors, caused them to ask the VCTA for a fixed date. To their credit, the VCTA put in considerable time and effort rearranging their state calendar to incorporate a permanent timeslot for this event. However, there are no dedicated skeet shooters on the VCTA executive, and thus with no first hand knowledge, and no National reference available, they saw no problem allocating the first weekend in May. Unfortunately, this just happens to be the permanent date of

the South Australian Skeet Carnival. Thus, a lot of skeet shooters from at least three states (Vic NSW and SA) were unimpressed.

This resulted in me receiving a lot of phone calls and personal approaches, asking what I was going to do about it. (Sometimes I wonder how I ever got the job of spokesman and problem solver for half the skeet shooters in Australia, but then I remember that big mouth of mine, and the answer becomes a lot clearer) After a couple of phone calls to the VCTA, it became obvious they were loath to change the date due to the effort they had put into determining it, and the complexity of altering it. Undeterred, I remembered the one about "if Mohammed will not go to the mountain...." So, on behalf of the Skeet shooters, I approached the SACTA with my hat in my hand, explained the problem and asked if there was anything they could do to help us from their end. Within a few weeks they came back with an offer of the third weekend in May, which we gratefully accepted. But, remember that ripple business. So my next call had to be to the Wagga Gun Club, whose Annual Two-Day Skeet Shoot has long been held on the third weekend in May. Hopefully, their subsequent move to the third weekend in April hasn't created any other problems, of which I am unaware.

Point 3) is probably where the most heartbreak is caused. What happens is, some gun club decides to stage a major two-day shoot, which if successful may become an annual fixture. Using the limited scheduling references available to them, and with considerable soulsearching, they choose what they believe will be a suitable date. Then they put in a great deal of effort arranging sponsorship and organising the event. Finally, when it is too late to change it, they find that, unbeknown to one another, someone else has programmed a conflicting event at the same time, or shifted a major event to their date. What should have been a great shoot becomes a disappointment, and the organisers are left frustrated and disillusioned.

So where does all this leave us? It leaves me totally convinced that, the sooner we can establish a National Major Shoot Calendar in this country, the better. And how do we achieve that? Well, the ACTA will have to start the ball rolling by locking down the dates of the three National Championship Carnivals (Trap, Skeet and ISU) and they need to do this being mindful of the existing Major Shoot structure so that the process creates the least possible trauma. The Trap Nationals have been comfortable around the beginning of April for a long time, so I think they just need anchoring somewhere around the first weekend of that month. The ISU Nationals? I have never been to them and I have no interest in them, so I believe that even expressing an opinion as to the best time for them would be inappropriate. I think that the people concerned should suggest a suitable date, again being mindful of the existing Major Shoot structure.

The Skeet Nationals? When they were first conceived, a lot of practical input and careful consideration arrived at the third weekend in November. It was a very good date and seemed to suit everyone concerned. It provided a fitting and timely finale to the State Skeet Circuit, which runs from early May to late September, leaving enough time for state jackets and team arrangements to be made. It also neatly avoided the World Skeet Championships in October, and provided lots of light for shoot-offs, being well into daylight saving time. Just when all the Skeet shooters got in sync with that time, the Rotational Venue System started providing all sorts of local reasons to justify shifting that date around, and we have had no consistency since. Please give us back the third weekend in November! Next the State Associations would need to permanently lock down the various State Carnivals, which would involve very little change in the status quo if the ACTA set the Nationals wisely. Then the Major Club Carnivals could be cemented in place around these fixtures, and most of our problems would be over.

How would it work in practice? Well first you would draw up a "pattern" format, where the year was divided up into 48 nominal week-ends representing the four week-ends of each calendar month, and labelled January #1, January #2 etc. Then the Major

Events would be transposed onto this format such as April #1 - Trap Nationals, August #2 - NSW Skeet Carnival, November #3 - Skeet Nationals etc. Obviously there are more Major Shoots than there are weekends, but the Tasmanian Skeet Carnival clashing with a major Trap Shoot in WA or Qld would surely not be a problem. Fifth weekends would be best left vacant as they drift from month to month each year. However, they could be used for one-off or special events, such as the recent World DTL Championships, if another suitable regular weekend was difficult to find. Any time the first of a month fell on a Sunday, it would not be counted as a first weekend, but would be combined with the preceding Saturday to become part of a fifth week-end of the previous month.

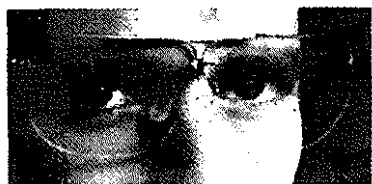
The ACTA office (or some other nominated controller) would apply this pattern format to the actual calendar well before the start of each year, thereby producing a standard format for that year, that would be made available, via mail, fax or e-mail, to any interested parties. Then, if you wished to organise a new annual or one-off event, you could choose a weekend with confidence, and register that date on the standard and/or pattern format. Your fixture would then be apparent to the next party, who requested the calendar for a similar purpose, and thus they would hopefully avoid you. The continually updated standard format could then be published in the CTSN each month in place of the current Shoot Calendar.

Several months ago, I advertised in this column for some CTSNs that I was missing, and I would like to thank the many people who mailed or offered magazines, filling all my gaps. Which leads me to this month's Shooting Trivia Question: How many people have appeared on two successive covers of the CTSN in the last year? Mail your answer to Shooting Trivia, P.O. Box 265, Bairnsdale 3875, to arrive by 25-11-98. A winner will be drawn from the correct answers, whose name will be published in the January CTSN, and who will receive a free nomination to the National C of C in Roma next March. This competition is not run by the ACTA, but by the author whose decision shall be final and no correspondence will be entered into.

P.S. I have received a number of inquiries recently regarding the possibility of getting Small Gauge Skeet Shooting going in Australia. At the Skeet Nationals in Perth I hope to call an informal meeting one evening to discuss this matter. Also I am led to believe that, at the Wagga Gun Clubs two-day Skeet Shoot on the fourth weekend in November, they intend to hold a 150 target Small Gauge shoot on the Friday. I am told that both guns and shells will be available for interested people. See November's CTSN for full details.

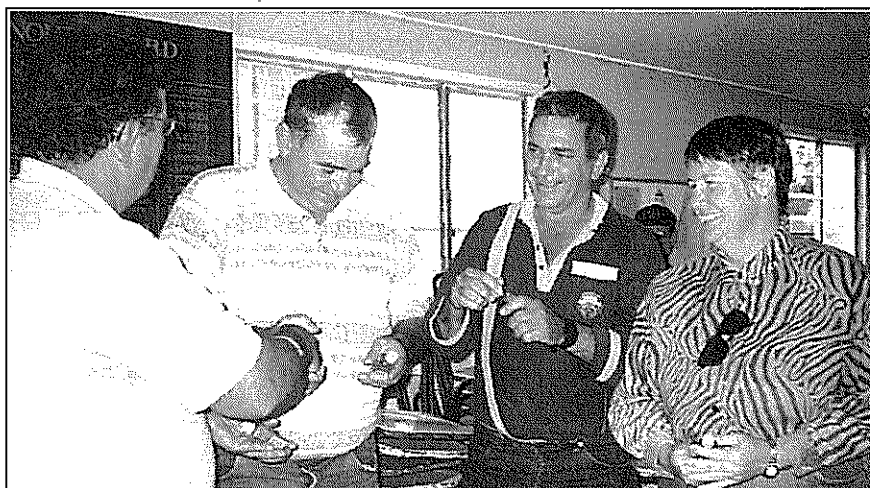
