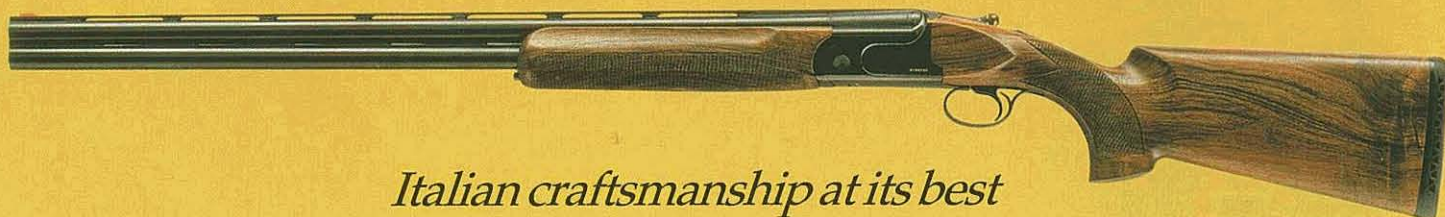

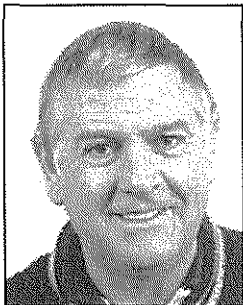

1999 WORLD DTL-GAME FAIR-GRAND AMERICAN:

I have been assured that no one is about closing down any range.

Year 3 (final) level 3 accreditation, October 9-11, 1998 — For the four remaining Coaches, the third and final year of their Level 3 Accreditation Course was programmed for the second weekend of October.

The attendees were Mrs Robyn Faber (NSW), Mr Jim Shepherd (Vic), Mr Peter Strike (WA) and Mr Chris Davis (NSW).

Day 1.

After the four participants have arrived and been checked in, the Course Administration component was attended to. This was followed by the review of the Compulsory Texts that had been required reading. This occupied several hours with the final segment of the day being an assessment clarification for the next days video assignments.

Day 2.

At 9 am the Level 3 Course participants assembled for the presentation of their compulsory video assignments. We were joined by Ms Claudia Kulla (ASA Mental Trainer) who, having been involved in the program, had requested permission to attend as an observer. The order of presentation had been decided by ballot the previous evening with Mr Jim Shepherd first. He was to be followed by Mr Chris Davis, Mr Peter Strike and then Ms Robyn Faber. For the next four hours the Coaches used their allocated one hour to present their designated topic. These topics (assignments) ranged from a Coach's introduction to Double Trap to a Coach's view of a Training Program.

As each presentation concluded it was then assessed by the other Coaches and myself as National Director of Coaching and Course Conveyor. The presentations were all first class and showed the ability each of the participants have and their skills knowledge in Coaching.

Once the assessments were completed, the marks obtained were calculated with all previous assignment marks for final rating.

1. Mr Jim Shepherd (Victoria)
2. Mr Peter Strike (WA)
3. Mr Chris Davis (NSW)
4. Mrs Robyn Faber (NSW)

These marks verified their successful gaining of Level 3 Coaching Accreditation.

To finalise the program a review of the three year program was undertaken. This session gave valuable feedback into the strengths and weaknesses of the course.

Suggestions were tabled, discussed and then set aside for possible inclusion in the rewrite of the ACC/ACTA Level 3 Accreditation Course in 1999. With the course conclusion completed, the four (4)

remaining Coaches (from 8 starters) were presented with a frame certificate. This certificate was to be a sign of their dedication and achievement within the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

In conclusion, it must be said that these four new Level 3 Coaches have a tremendous amount of skills and ability and it's my hope that their States will take advantage of this skill and knowledge. I further hope ACTA will promote them to the ASA as Coaches able to support already designated Team Coaches with National and ASA squads. Only through this will their skills knowledge be used and expanded.

Further benefits were gained for ACTA during the three years duration of the course.

Kuala Lumpur 1998

Our Australian Clay Target Team travelled to Malaysia with their sights set firmly on achieving the best result ever for Australia in Commonwealth Games Shooting.

The venue for the shooting was to be the island of Langkawi, some 40 minutes by air from Kuala Lumpur, the host city for the 16th Games.

The shooting complex at Lisram was constructed and a rumoured cost of \$A60million and must be ranked as one of the World's best shooting facilities. All shooters and officials could not have been made more welcome and our hosts went out of their way to assist and to ensure our visit would be problem free.

It did not take our team, Clive Barton & David Cunningham (Skeet) and Michael Diamond & Ben Kelley (Trap) long to settle in and quickly adapt to the warm, humid weather. A quick check of the armoury saw that all our ammunition and firearms had arrived. We were then able to go about practice and competition confidently.

Our first competition was the badge matches and it was here that Michael firmed as favourite after finishing in first place. Ben also shot well being well up with the best.

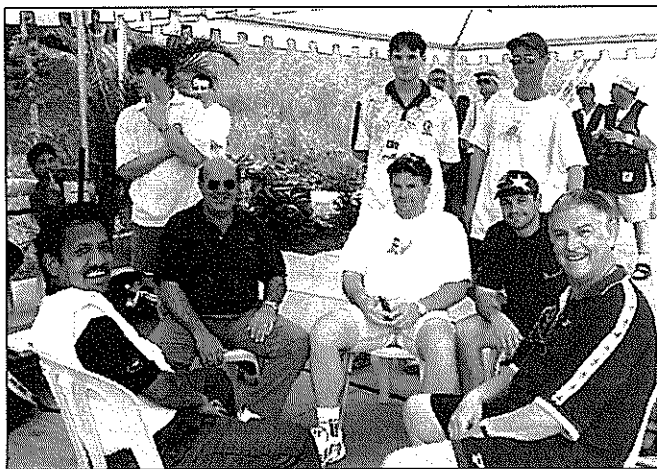
In the skeet, Clive commenced his bid for a medal in the Games with excellent shooting which saw him finish in fifth place. David was also finding form and was confidently focusing his sights on a medal in the following week.

After flying to Kuala Lumpur to take part in the Opening Ceremony all shooters returned to Langkawi prepared to make their presence felt.

The trap pairs event was the first official Commonwealth Games competition and Michael and Ben had to be content with a silver behind the Indian pair. Michael's 98 was again the top score, a great effort by Ben and Michael saw our first medal.

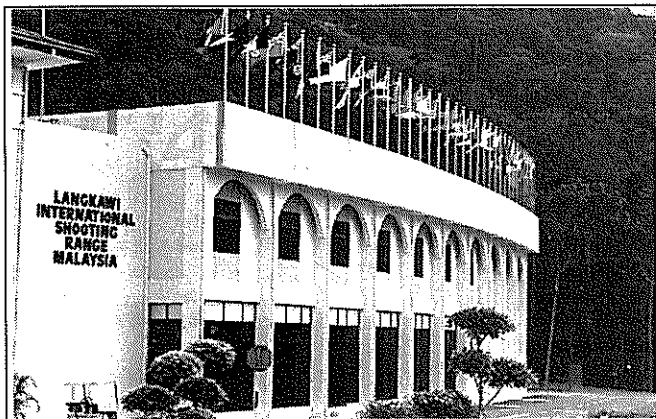


Glenn Woodhatch with Ben Kelley and Michael Diamond at presentation of silver medal for teams.

A break of a day and the skeet pairs. Cyprus proved too strong for the field and took the gold medal. David and Clive shot particularly well to finish in fourth place. It is indicative of the competition that four targets separated gold from fourth.

With a couple of days off, it was down to practice for the individual events and also afforded us the time to drop in and support our fellow Australians in their disciplines.

After day one of the individual trap, three shooters in Michael, Ian Peel and Bob Borsley (both England) had opened up a sizeable gap on the rest of the field, each shooting 73/75.

Ian Peels 49/50 on the second day put a little pressure on the others. Michael went into the final on 120, two down on Peel. Ben shot exceptionally well to record 49/50 and grab a place in the final.

Talk about tension in a shoot off; at the completion of the 25 targets Peel had dropped three, Michael only one, thereby making it all square and necessitating a sudden death single barrel shoot off. Peel succumbed and Michael had picked up a Commonwealth Games Gold Medal to the elation of all the Australians that had gathered for the shoot off. Seasoned shooter and friend from New Zealand, Des Coe, won the bronze.

To have both Ben and Michael in the final was in itself a great achievement.

It did not take long for our final event, the skeet individual to come around.

Day one completed saw David on 72/75 and Clive close by on 71/75. David's 72/75 put him in equal first position with four others. On to the final day of competition and after the 50 targets had been completed, both David and Clive were in the final, a great effort.

Des Davies (Wales) went into the final with three targets up his sleeve, an outstanding effort. At the conclusion of the 25 target final, bronze was Davids, Clive finished in fifth placing.

For all four shooters to reach the Final was outstanding.

Our overall result was that we had in the bag the best ever result for trap and skeet in a Commonwealth Games.

At the conclusion, it was pack up all the gear, thank our hosts in Langkawi and head back to K.L. for the Closing Ceremony.

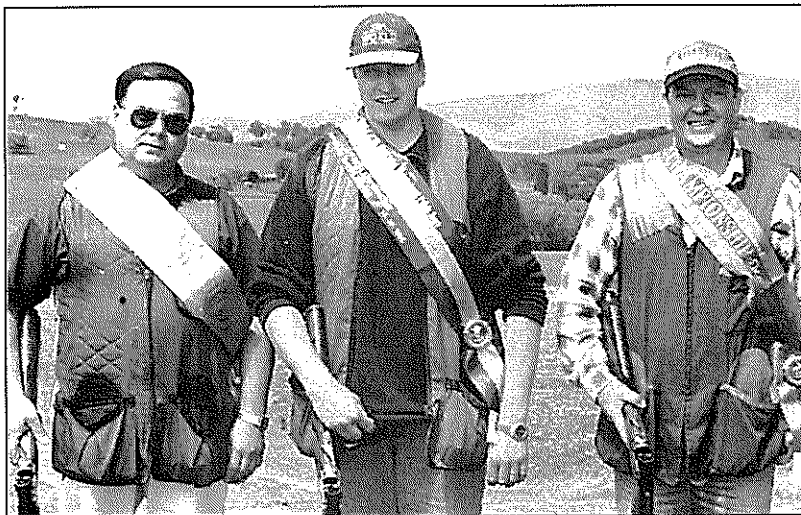
The next event was 25t Scandinavian Logging Single Barrel Championship. This was won after a shoot off by Paul Lyons (Majura Park) 54/54.

Large International Field for 1999 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix"

Following extensive promotion throughout the shooting world over the past few months, the 1999 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix", to be held in Brisbane in February, is set to attract one of the strongest fields ever to contest a clay target shooting competition in Australia.

Entries for the 5th Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" have already been received from throughout Asia, Europe, America and Great Britain, and if early entries are any indication, the 1999 event will provide even more competition than that which provided record-breaking scores in 1998.

In the lead-up to the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, the Brisbane "Grand Prix" competition is now being viewed by many international competitors as a good opportunity to experience the Australian competition and gain some "local" knowledge.

Many "high profile" national team members from overseas have indicated that they will be at the February competition in Brisbane and are keen to experience the competition on Australian soil.

Not only will an influx of international visitors be good for our national team members to gain early season competition, but it will also be a golden opportunity for all interested Olympic Discipline clay target shooters to compete alongside some of the world's best shooters in Double Trap, Olympic Trap and I.S.S.F. Skeet - an opportunity which rarely becomes available.

New format competition

In order to offer more opportunities and rewards, the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" Organising Committee have made changes to the programme for 1999 by including a 200-target *Australasian Open* competition in Olympic Trap and Skeet, and have added a new format optional "skins" event, which from all reports has never been conducted anywhere else in the world.

The 200-target *Australasian Open* competitions in trap and skeet will be conducted over two days, 100 targets each day, with a "final" at the end of the competition.

The Australian Clay Target "Skins", events are designed to be conducted along the same lines as a "skins" competition in golf, where the winner of a hole (or round in the case of trap, skeet or double trap) takes the prizemoney allocated to that hole. In the case of the Australian Clay Target "Skins", competition, the winner (or winners) will have the chance to win prizemoney from each round of the 100 target competition.

As in golf, if the round is "halved" (shared) by a number of competitors, then the money allocated to that round will "jackpot" to the next round and so on, until the competition is finally brought to an end after four rounds (100 targets) - three rounds (150 targets) for double trap.

To cater for all shooters, the "skins" competition will be conducted in two sections (Open for AA and A Grade, and Intermediate for B and C Grade competitors). Shooters will also have the opportunity to shoot for "1/2 skins", which will be half the nomination fee and only attract half the prizemoney if that shooter should win. More information on the makeup of the Australian Clay Target "Skins", competitions will be available soon.

With a changed format, more targets and two new styles of events, the 1999 Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition will again further establish itself as Australia's premier international clay target shooting competition.

Shooters are reminded that entries to the "Grand Prix" competition close on 29th January, and that starting positions will be limited.

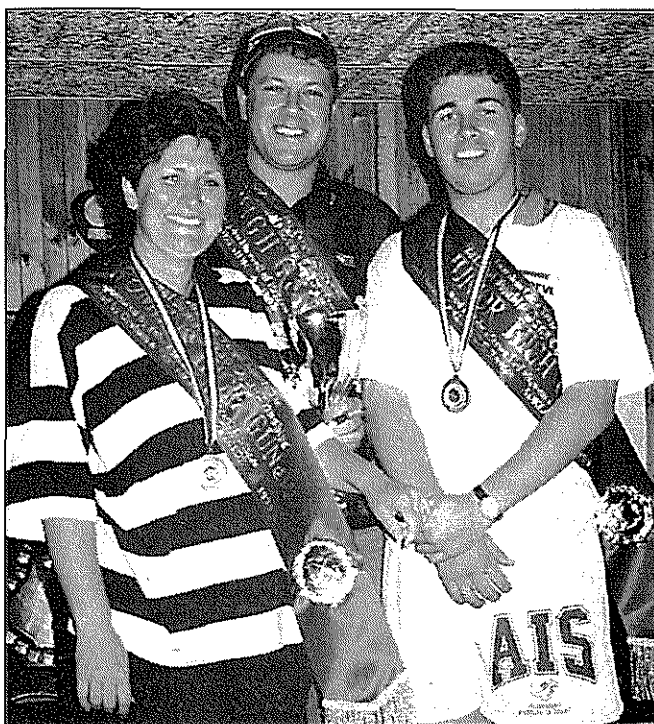

Clive Barton a new Australian Record for ISU Skeet with a score of 148/150.

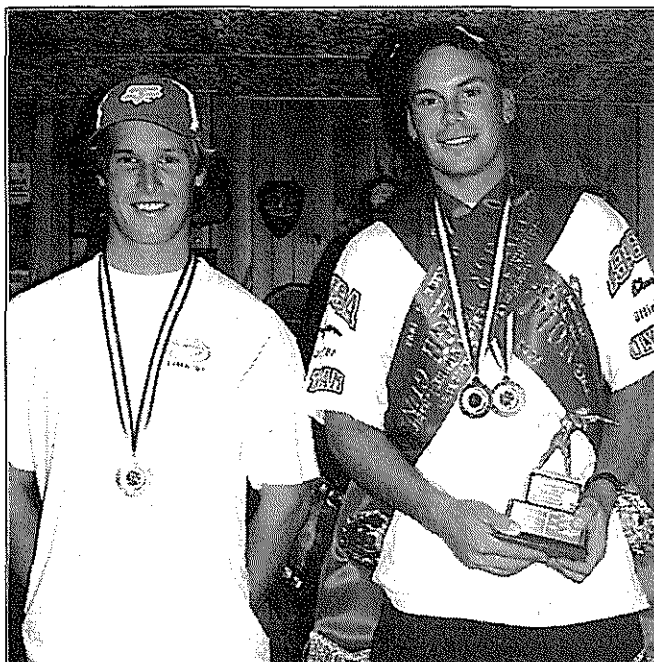
Nathan Cassells equalled the Australian Junior Trap Record of 147/150. Well done!

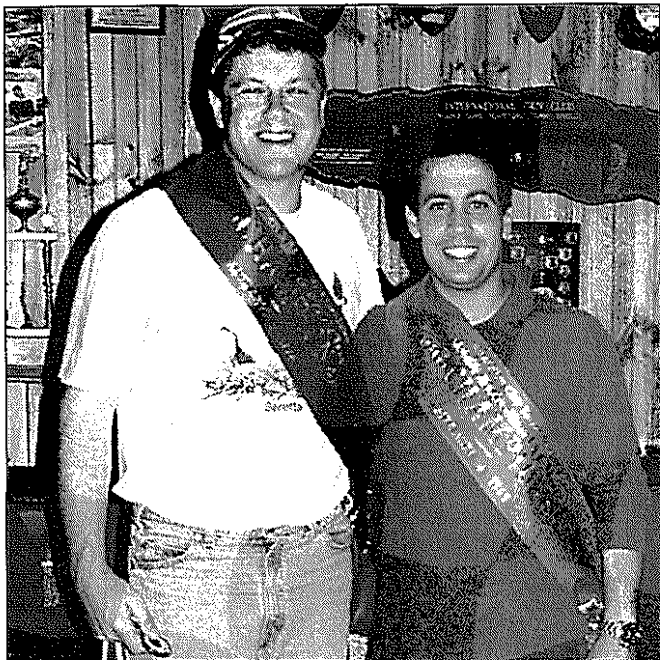
Competitor numbers throughout the competition had been exceptional with Trap 119; ISU Skeet 39; Double Trap 59.

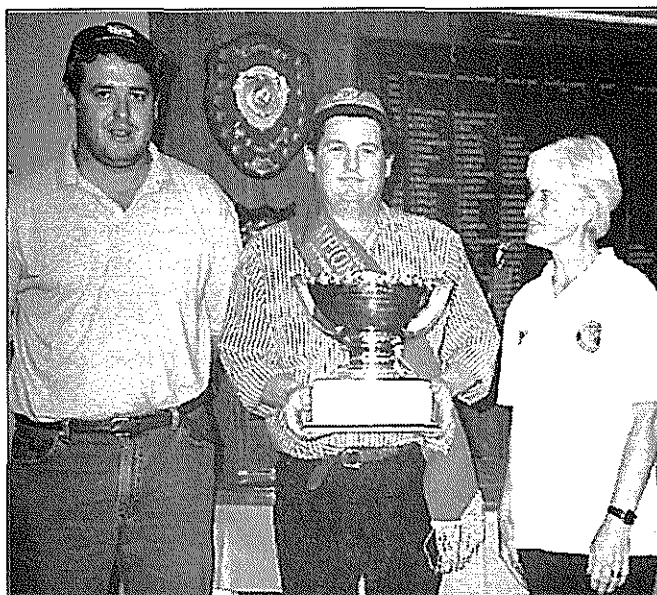


Geoff Lancaster, winner State Single Barrel Championship, 1998.

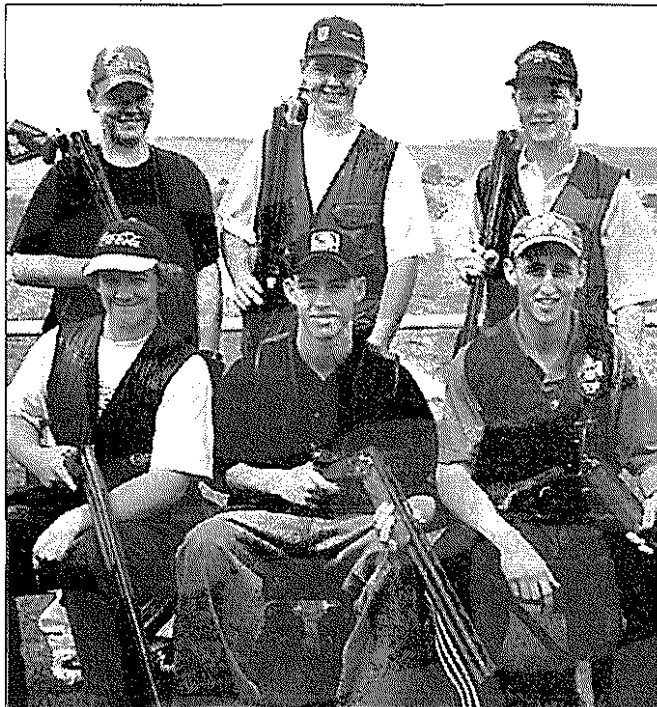

Rule 1.04 (d) Squadding (Trap)—Alter last sentence to read:
"Shooters may be squadded in order of nomination".

Rule 1.05 (d) Squadding (Skeet)—Alter last sentence to read:
"Shooters may be squadded in order of nomination".

Rule 2.01 (i)—Add to first sentence after . . . down graded:
"He can only be downgraded one grade at a time"

Rule 2.02 (b) (i)—Delete in full and replace with:
"For every 200 targets shot, a 1 metre backward movement will apply if the percentage is 95% or above. If an overall win is recorded, (regardless of score), the Handicap card will be ruled off immediately. The 200 targets will then restart."

Rule 2.02 (c)—Delete in full and replace with:
"(c) (i) 1 metre backward movement to apply to any overall handicap winner regardless of score.

(ii) A shooter recording 95% or above, from 15 metres (with a handicap of 15 metres or less), will automatically be re-handicapped to 16 metres."

Rule 2.03 (a)—Delete in full and replace with:
"A 1 metre inward movement will apply if a shooter's

recorded percentage is less than 80 per cent, over 200 targets."

Note: Any win will take precedence over a movement by percentage.

Rule 4.05 (a)—Alteration to first sentence:
Replace "3 metres" with "4.5 metres" and "10 metres" with "18 metres".

Rule 3.32 A.C.T.A. SPORTING CLAYS—Add:
"To be read in conjunction with A.C.T.A. Trap and Skeet Rules."

Rule 3.32 (iv)—Add after . . . as a caged area "(1 square metre)".

Rule 3.32 (b)—Insert at end:
"Hand throwers will be prohibited."

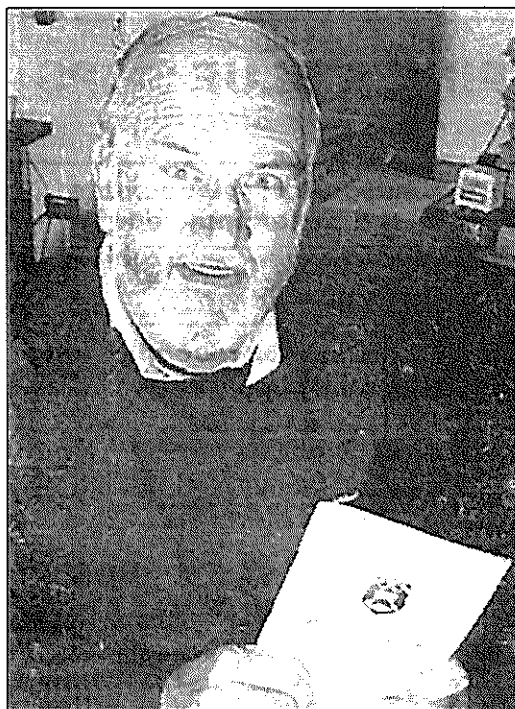
Rule 3.32 (d)—Delete first sentence and replace with:
"The target sequence will be shown to all shooters prior to commencement of competition only and with any subsequent changes to the target sequence."

Rule 3.32—Add:
"(n) A shooter can refuse targets as per A.C.T.A. rules GRST 17 & 1.08 (c)."

"(o) Malfunctions, as per A.C.T.A. Rule 1.10 (f)."

"(p) Pairs to be scored 1-1 when broken by 1 shot."

"(q) Baulk rule will apply as per A.C.T.A. Rules 1.11 (a)."

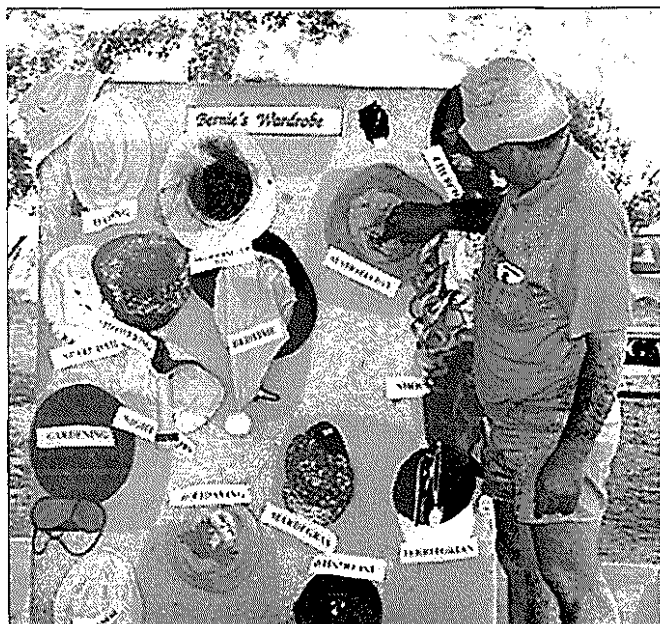

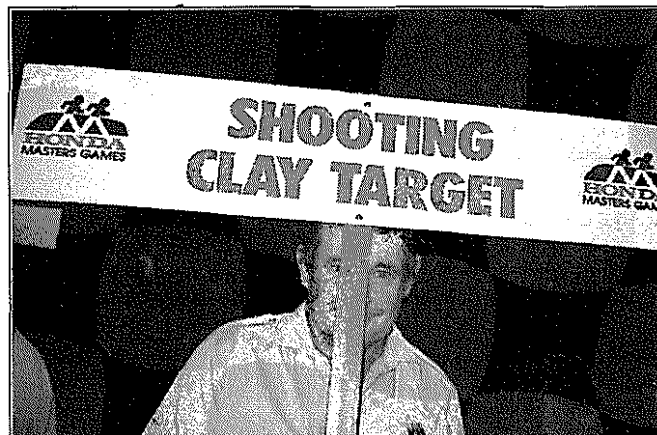

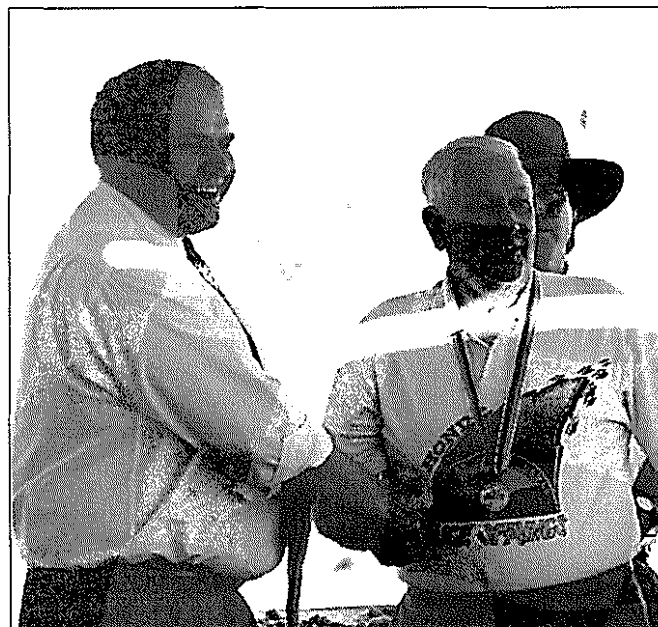
Ken Perrett had a successful Tambo two day at the end of September taking out the B grade High Gun as well as a few other trophies.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS DECEMBER 1998

Western Australia! What a great place for a Skeet Shoot. What a wonderful place for a holiday. What a beautiful place for a honeymoon. During the last couple of weeks I've been in WA doing all of those things instead of being at home researching and writing an "in depth" article for December.

So for those of you who read this column each month for my "deep and meaningful" thoughts on Clay Target Shooting in general and Skeet Shooting in particular, please turn the page and I'll see you next month.

But for those of you who have some spare time, and also read my writings for their entertainment value, c'mon along and I'll show you how this column got it's name.

First, let's examine some recent history. On the last Saturday before the Skeet Nationals, I broke two targets with the one shot. I not only married one of the nicest ladies that you would ever want to meet (and that's saying something, because I have met some pretty damn nice ones over the years), but I also married a Skeet Shooter.

Friends, family, ex-family and shooters, traveled from near and far for the big occasion. John Woolley even flew over from New Zealand to drive one of the wedding cars. And what a party we had! Anyway, after spending Sunday sobering up and packing, Karen and I flew to Perth on Monday, along with a heap of friends, to start shooting the Pre-Nationals on Tuesday.

And what a treat was in store for us! WA turned on a week of great weather for the Shoot, and then backed it up with another great week for our honeymoon. Obviously the West is far too big to see all of it in just one week, so we chose a very small area down in the far south-west, known as the Cape Region. Operating out of a base in Bunbury, thanks to Shane and Lynne Williams, we toured this area extensively, and I would recommend it unreservedly to anyone looking for a holiday destination.

The place is most famous for it's beaches and forests, it's many wineries and it's magnificent limestone caves, which have to be seen to be believed. We also sampled at cheese factories, climbed lighthouses, rode the Busselton jetty train two kilometers out into the sea, and purchased numerous nic-nacs from the multitude of arts and crafts shops that are to be found all around the region.

Anyway, back to the Shoot. For those of you who have not seen the WA Gun Club, it is a sight to behold. I have seen some pretty flash Gun Clubs all around the world, but WAGC is right up there with the best of them, and Christine Alexander and her tireless band of workers had the place right up to scratch, as usual.

The Pre-nationals ran smoothly, with attendance building steadily and different winners on each day. 100s were posted on both days and in the shoot-offs for placings on Wednesday night, several shooters recorded personal bests, some reaching almost 200.

On Thursday morning the shooting started in earnest and the shoulder to shoulder teams match provided a great start. For the first time that I can remember, the match ended in a two-way tie. A quick check of the rulebook did not produce a mandatory procedure for breaking such a tie, and the suggestion of some type of count-back system was not well received by either team.

Thus, we conducted a shoot-off by station, as per the system used at the World Championships and a short but entertaining spectacle was provided. I won't tell you who won, but I can tell you that Queensland did not repeat last years win and that the previous night's wager, put up by their captain, now rests comfortably in my pocket. I personally agree with the rejection of a count-back for several reasons. Firstly, to have any sort of relevance, a count-back should always be a count-forward.

Secondly, they only ever produce hollow victories. And thirdly, I have never seen any count-back situation that did not produce controversy and discontent. I firmly believe that count-backs should either be abolished or retained only as a last resort when no other method is available. Shoot-offs are what shooting is all about!

For the next four days, the Shoot went like clockwork, which was a fitting reward for the effort put in by WACTA, WAGC and the Tournament Director, Mr Murray Alexander. Not having worked with Murray before, I was unprepared for his dynamic enthusiasm. He seemed to be in all places, at all times, doing all things, including helping me or offering to help me at every turn.

About half way through the shoot I had to remind him that I was supposed to be working for him, not vice versa. Thanks again Murray. About the only drama we ran into all week was a partial machine/target problem, but with the vast facilities available at WAGC, it really was a non-event. When one field decided to play up, we simply shut it down and went to another one.

The atmosphere all week was friendly and relaxed. I don't remember ever seeing anyone, at any time, who didn't seem to be happy and having fun. I believe this was substantially assisted by the squadding being done as per the "intent" of Bill Iles' original motion at the 1997 AGM, i.e. that the shooters be treated like paying customers and given what they want. I spoke at great length with Elaine Forward (who was the host State President as well as the head of the Rules Committee) about this matter prior to the shoot. She agreed that, as the last three Nationals have run well

under this system, there seemed to be no reason to change a good thing.

However, I was very disappointed to read the rule changes to squadding in the last CTSN, where the word "will" has been changed to "may" in 1.04(d) and 1.05(h).

This effectively negates the original intent, because shooters "may" have been squadded in order of nomination for the last twenty years, but they "weren't". After extensive lobbying by a significant number of the shooters present, Elaine has agreed to consider having the rule changed back to "will", but adding some wording like "whenever possible/practical" after it (and possibly doing this prior to January 1, 1999).

This compromise would seem to preserve the original intent, whilst eliminating the undesirable grass roots side effects, and thus was well received by those concerned. I still live in hope that one day soon we can overcome the aura that surrounds the words "selective squadding" and be able to call a spade a spade, rather than having to achieve our objective via a "portable, manually-operated excavating implement".

In the months leading up to the shoot, a number of people, myself included, were concerned that the attendance may not have been as good as was hoped. The state of the economy, the gun law debacle and the large travelling distances involved, were all major concerns. I am very pleased to confirm that these fears were totally unfounded, as this years numbers were as good as last year. I would like to thank all those people who made the effort to go, and I know that none of you were disappointed.

This column is not meant to be a shoot report and I am trying not to upstage that article any more than I can avoid, but a number of the statistics from the shoot are very interesting and somewhat thought provoking. Like, for instance, the winner and runner-up in both Individual National Titles were all shooting release triggers, as was the Overall High-Gun winner.

Each of the three National Title winners was over 50 years of age, and each one was a first time recipient of their respective Australia badges. Although, one of the Silver Australia Badge winners already has a Gold Australia, which he won by sending me back to the parking lot, in a shoot-off for it, a couple of years ago, so I certainly consider him to be a very worthy winner. As a cryptic clue to the identity of the other individual winner, all I will say is that exactly one week prior, he was the best man at my wedding. Thus, he has now clearly established the fact that he is a wonderful shot, as well as being an all-round good guy.

The Overall High-Gun! Well, I am going to make an exception here and spill the beans, because the name may not mean all that much to many Australian shooters, and that is a great pity. The gentleman's name is Ray Everett and he originates from the Christchurch Gun Club in the South Island of New Zealand. I first met him on my inaugural visit to the New Zealand Nationals back in the early 80s, and I got to know him well because we shot together in a team event that year, but that is another story, for another day. The man is very quietly spoken and extremely polite, and thus tends to be somewhat inconspicuous, but I very quickly learned to be in awe of him. Apart from being the dictionary's definition of a gentleman, and my definition of a true sportsman - humble in victory and gracious in defeat - he is one of the most talented and disciplined shooters that I have ever met. I believe that he has represented his country in all four clay target disciplines (Trap, Skeet, Trench & ISU Skeet) and I strongly suspect that he may have won National Titles in all of them as well. On top of that, his win last week made him only the second person in history to have won National High Guns in both Trap and Skeet in Australasia. Interestingly enough, as on the previous occasion, he did it in the same calendar year. I consider him to be one of New Zealand's National Treasures, I regard it a privilege and an honour to call him a friend, and I applaud him on this occasion, as well as for all of his magnificent achievements.

During the Nationals I discussed Small Gauge Shooting with a considerable number of people, but a definitive answer as to what we should do about it, in this country, still eludes me. Several people suggested that a database of all the relevant people would be a good start, and I tend to agree. So if you have a small gauge gun, or even an interest in using one, please send me your name, address and phone numbers, along with any other details or ideas that you have, and we'll put you on the mailing list.

Introducing Mr Falco

He is the sort of person you simply have to believe. Eyes like that and this smile reaching from one ear to the other. Simply impertinently likeable!

It is not just the vehemence of his gestures and the extent to which he is going into detail when explaining his approach to shooting but certainly also the naked facts that give him credibility. Next to me sits what they call a living legend, Ennio Falco, one of the world's best Skeet shooters (although it might be disputable whether this chap fulfills the minimum size criteria of a legend). Ennio was invited to come over to Australia in order to participate in the National Championships in Adelaide (Sept/Oct 98) with the financial support of ASA and ACTA. Certainly a valuable contribution and an even better challenge to our skeeties.

It is Sunday the 27th of Sept., only four days after he had arrived from Italy. Having already completed his first program he does not look too happy about his score of 121. Does he still feel jet-lagged, I ask him. This seems to be the sort of question he was just waiting for. The answer comes without any hesitation. Yes, of course. He usually applies the formula of needing one day to overcome a time difference of one hour time. I start calculating. If I take Italian time as a basis, this would mean that Ennio should feel perfect in another four days time. It is the classic formula many countries apply when planning for overseas trips. But he goes a bit beyond my calculation. If he had to come for an important international competition to Australia, he would prefer to arrive here approx. 10 days before the competition in order to get enough time for adaptation. When he prepared for the Olympic Games in Atlanta, it was not different. By the time he started his competition he had already spent two weeks in the country, only three days of which on the Olympic range. Allowing enough time to adapt to time zone differences is very important to him.

Ennio Falco took up shooting skeet at the age of 14. The first year of his training he describes more as a period of pure enjoyment. The performance aspect was not important at all. Training was not structured. He just went out to shoot round after round, when he felt like it. After one year it was clear to him that there was more than just the leisure aspect behind. He wanted to take it up more seriously and started focussing on technical work. This meant changing from shooting round by round to work on the different stations. It was in that time that he lost his father who had been his coach before and he started to work with a group of dedicated young shooters. I start calculating again and come to the silent conclusion that he must have been shooting for 16 years now.

I am curious to find out more about how he trains now and whether his training plan follows the general principles of periodisation. The Italian Skeet season, he tells me, lasts from February to the end of September. If he has got an important competition in March, he starts to prepare for this in February. From October to February he does not do any skeet training at all, but goes out for hunting instead. It is only the physical exercise he sticks to throughout the whole year: jogging, stretching, and weight work in the gym. This big break allows him to recover from the last competitive season, find some distraction from the sport and be fresh and keen once the season starts again.

The intensive preparation for a competition he starts approx. 15 days before. For the first seven days he works on quantity and shoots up to 300 targets a day, whereas the last half of preparation is reserved for the fine work on stations. In this period he only shoots 50-75 targets depending on how good his technique is and how he feels on the different stations. And there is usually a tiny problem somewhere, so always something to work on.

Psychology is very important to him. One year before Atlanta he got into contact with a psychologist who is now working with the Italian Clay Target team. He thinks, that it is particularly important to talk to this person after failures, when he is looking for help to cope with missed targets. Not just in order to deal with a competition retrospectively, but also to help him find back to his usual competitive attitude.

In fact the most important areas he has worked on with regards to psychology are coping with failure (= missed targets) and refocussing, as he has to learn to process these experiences, but at the same time to leave them out and go on with the rest of the round as if nothing annoying had happened. It is very important to him to make sure that missed targets or bad shots do not influence the remainder of the round in a negative way, which can easily happen if one sticks to the wrong thoughts.

He incorporates psychology in the preparation of each round. Before he goes

out onto the layout he has imagined the whole round already. He imagines himself shooting and how it feels to hit all targets before he is actually doing it. In addition to that he checks trajectories, wind conditions and the necessity to change glasses.

Work with imagery is not only confined to the time between rounds. He actually watches the targets of the person in front of him in the squad, watches the trajectory, and imagines his barrel moving and his body absorbing the recoil when he shoots it.

Coping with misses is not always easy for him as he regards himself as a very self-critical person and therefore very much aware of errors. It depends in how far he is able to explain the missed targets. But sometimes he would need to imagine the perfect shot routine once he has finished the station, adjust his self-talk and simply go on with the preparation for the next station.

Once he has finished on a station he usually steps back and isolates from the rest of the squad for some minutes until it is his turn again and he begins his usual preparation by watching the person in front of him. Between the stations he does not think about anything technical, he is aware of what is happening in his surrounding but he does not process it consciously. He gives his mind a break before he starts his concentration phase.

Coming back to the preparation for a round or the preparation for shooting in general, he explains it like a routine or almost a ceremony he runs through each time. He is not really thinking about it anymore, as it is always the same. As a matter of fact his preparation has become part of his lifestyle. He does not need to think about what to eat and drink for breakfast, when to get out to the range, or what to do before he can shoot his first round. It is more or less always the same. His preparation is as methodical and as monotonous as Skeet itself (!) Sometimes of course when he learned that there was something that might have helped him to reach a better score, something that he links with a good performance, he would probably tend to keep it as a part of a routine.

Sometimes this goes almost as far as superstition, when he tries to stand in a certain spot of the layout after having passed a station. He always works on these little anchors of what to do between the stations. They certainly don't have a direct impact on his performance. Others might accuse him of superstitious thoughts, but it is not that he believes putting his feet into a certain place when waiting for the next station would make him shoot better, it is more the belief that if he keeps himself busy and tries to follow these little things, he has no time to think about other silly things that could be potentially more detrimental to his shooting performance.

Ennio regards himself as a very calm shooter. Hardly ever competitive situations succeed in increasing his heart rate. As a matter of fact his heart rate is very stable in the low 50s throughout the whole competition. Even the final of the Olympic Games did not change that. In case he feels too tired and too slow he drinks some coke and goes for a little jog to become more awake. At the moment he is learning to lower his arousal level by applying abdominal breathing. He reckons it is a very important technique to stop him from getting into this negative spiral once he missed a target. These are the only moments when arousal is shooting up and he has to fight it by adjusting self-talk and arousal level.

With regards to self-confidence Ennio cannot remember a point in time from when onwards he felt assertive or strong enough to win against successful international shooters. It just happened, he did not think about it before. But looking at it from today's point of view he comes to the conclusion that he could have won many more competitions much earlier in his career if he had not respected other opponents too much. His perception of their strength made him weaker and this is what might have cost him medals in the past. Nowadays he is able to ignore what his opponents do. He never follows any of their scores, but just focuses on himself.

He does not think that he has done anything special when he wins, but it seems like a tragedy when he shoots not so well. He is very critical and sceptical towards his own performance and sometimes penalises and punishes himself very much if he is not as perfect as he can be or wants to be.

Some of this highly ambitious point of view is somewhat reflected in his goal setting. When he is preparing for a World Cup, somewhere in the back of his mind is the wish to win, of course. But this is not the predominant goal. For him it is much more important to see his training investment paid out by a decent score and a decent technique.

His attitude towards goals and his training and input in skeet changed dramatically after the Olympics in Barcelona, where he was put into the position of a reserve. Scribani Rossi, Benelli and Rossetti in the team, and Falco just out. This would not happen again, he swore to himself. From that time onwards he wanted to invest more time into training in order to make sure that he would be in the team for the next Olympics. He knew that this would need a lot of work, and this has been his principle ever since: Success is based on a lot of work. It is not just the quantity that is important but certainly the degree of technical perfection. In competitions he is striving for perfection that comes close to what he is capable of doing in training. To achieve this he needs a lot of training, but every now and then he faces the negative consequences of over-training. So whether he wants it or not, occasionally he has to step on the brakes in order to avoid burnout.

How does he cope with potentially exciting situations in the course of a competition, I wanted to know. I knew that he was not suffering from extreme arousal symptoms but this does not come naturally, it seems most probable that it is based on him tightly holding a special mind set in critical moments.

He replies that the scenario of 100 targets straight and now entering the 5th round, certainly somehow triggers the thought that he could shoot the record and that he wants to shoot it. But once he is out on the layout he needs to shoot it target by target, station by station, trying to stick to his usual routine no matter what. Depending on how well he manages to be absorbed by his routine he certainly never thinks about a possible outcome of a good round. Focus on the immediate and not the future is his recipe! The next step is decisive and nothing else.

When you shoot 100 straight everything seems so easy, that you don't have much reason to doubt yourself in that moment, he adds after a bit of reflection.

Shoot-offs are certainly special situations of a competition. He tries to get used to them by training doubles on a regular basis with his training partners. In general they don't worry him any more, which is impressively proven by the fact that he managed to shoot 33 doubles in a shoot off in Suh/ Germany in 1996 (but even that was not good enough to win it).

My impression of Ennio Falco is that of a very honest and ambitious young man, who, although extremely successful, is still fighting with difficulties that are known to all of us. The fact that he is admitting to this and explaining his attempts to cope with it makes him even more likeable as it dissolves the distance created by glory and success. For me it was a kind of reconfirmation for my work and the ideas I try to get into people's minds. I would like to thank Ennio Falco for this very informative conversation, Luca Scribani Rossi for his assistance in translating and Natasha Lonsdale, George Barton and Neil Rundle, who helped me to prepare the guideline for this interview.

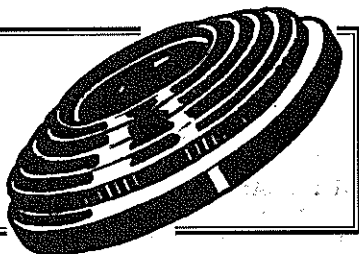

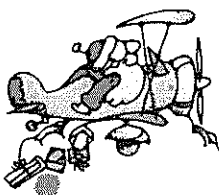

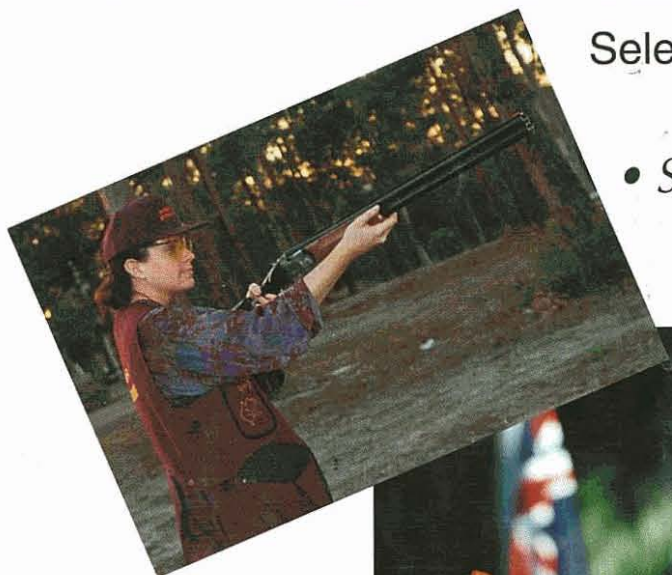
