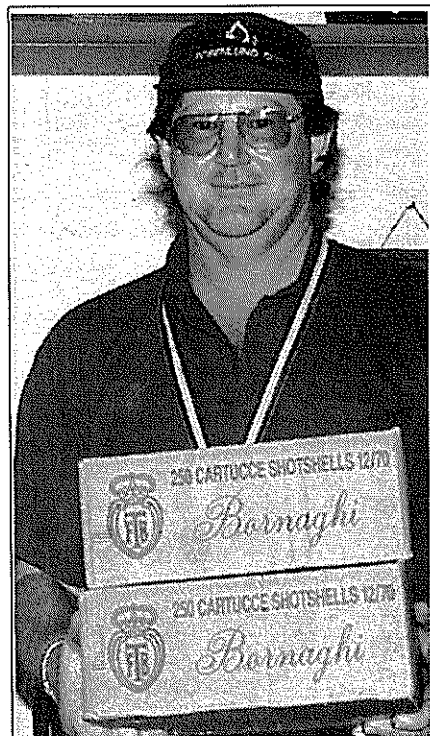

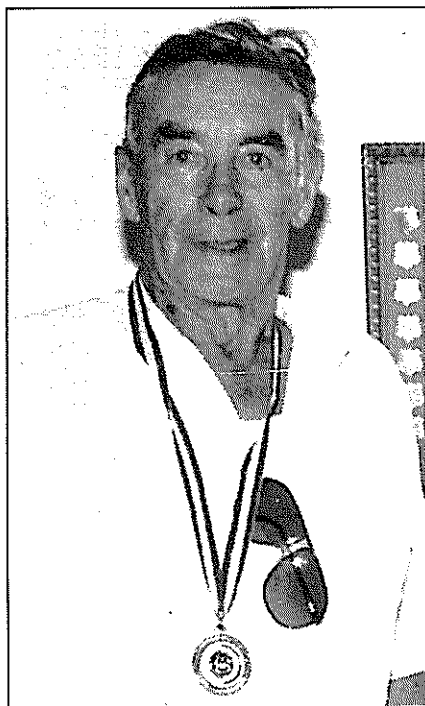

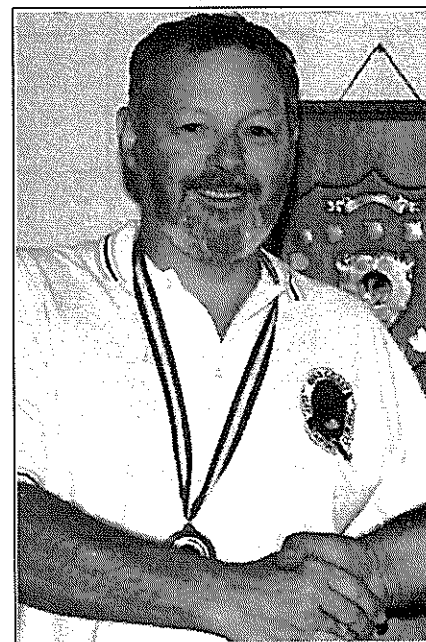

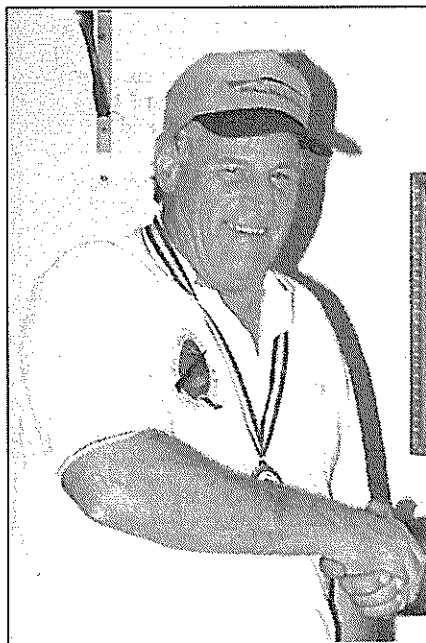

A Feast of Skeet *By Laurie Sceresini*

Should I or shouldn't I? Go to the World Skeet Championship at San Antonio, that is. If you start thinking about reasons not to go, the major one is \$Cost. Find something priced in \$U.S. and divide by .6 to convert to \$A dollars and ...Ouch!

Oh for the days of dollar parity. My friend George Petrou finally decided for me. George was already going and needed company. He twisted my arm about one centimetre up my back and I reluctantly agreed to go.

Firstly the administrative paperwork has to be in order. Getting your gun out of the country is no problem, but for a hassle free re-entry you need three things:

- * a B709A form from your Firearms Registry,
- * an export permit from the Australian Customs Service, and
- * a current Firearms Licence.

There's no place on the U.S. immigration documentation to declare that you have a firearm in possession. But don't assume that they don't want to know, of course they do! They record the serial number of your gun and make sure you have the paperwork to get the gun back to the country of origin.

First stop Los Angeles, California and the 16 year old customs girl looking like day one on the job, competently did all of the above and completely dumbfounded me by asking "Where's it's magazine?". I lost the facility of speech at this point, and began stuttering around for an answer when my wife, who only knows slightly more than this girl, rescued me and explained that this isn't the same as what Arnold Schwarzeneger uses and that under-over shotguns do not have magazines.

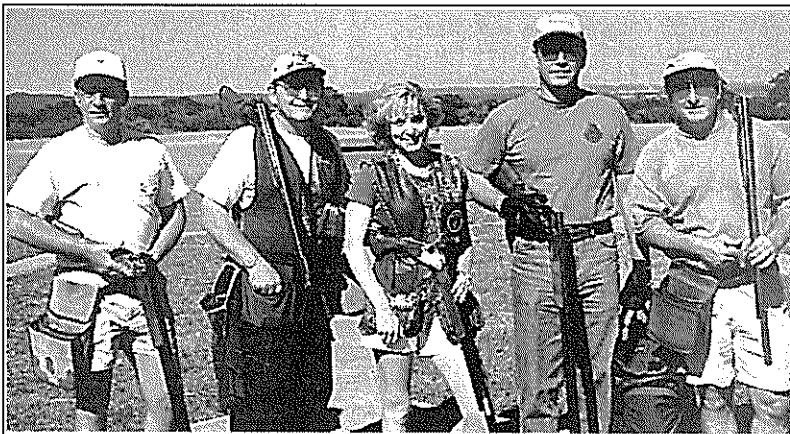
No visit to L.A. would be complete without a visit to the Pachmayr International Shooting Park in Rosemead. Only about 30 minutes from downtown L.A. and a treat with a dozen skeet fields, as many trap fields and Sporting Clays and Olympic Trap and Olympic Skeet. They have hire guns and even if you are just holidaying in L.A., take some time from the usual well publicised tourist stuff for a half a day of fun at this very fine facility. I did notice here, that the targets seemed a bit quicker than our Aussie skeet targets.

Onwards to Boston, Massachusetts to visit some family and find some more targets to shoot. At the airline check-in counter in the U.S.A. you must sign a declaration that your firearm is unloaded and place this declaration inside your gun case. If you don't do this, you are breaking a U.S. Federal law.

Found a cute little one layout club called Southboro Rod and Gun Club with the most difficult background. October in the New England states of northeast U.S.A. is called 'the foliage season'. At this time the deciduous trees turn from green to gold, brown, tan and red and all shades in between. Try shooting fluoro targets zipping across such a background. It ain't easy. Didn't shoot well, but made some friends; it seems clay target shooters are the same friendly, generous and practical types of people everywhere. It was also nice shooting skeet in Massachusetts because it was here that the game was invented. But that is another story.

By total contrast, Minuteman Sportsmans Club, in Burlington was like the Cadillac of clay target fields and also home of the famous Minuteman Classic skeet meet held each July. I got some good practice in here, but confirmed my suspicions that these

American skeet targets are decidedly quicker than what we shoot in Oz. Sort of half way between International Skeet speed and what we regularly shoot at home. I also found out that there are some onerous responsibilities in some states especially transporting firearms and ammunition on public roads. It seems there are no uniform national gun laws in the U.S.A. either. So it pays to check.

Finally to San Antonio, meet up with George and get down to some serious skeet shooting. The national shooting complex is a great credit to all the people involved in its creation. It has evolved over the years into a truly great shooting centre. It is the headquarters of the National Skeet Shooters Association and has 38 skeet fields in use. Each day for ten days straight, they cater for about 1200 shooters to shoot their 100 targets plus shoot offs. It is a huge undertaking in logistics and organisation, and to see the system work smoothly day after day was truly awe inspiring.

At registration you get a computer print out which indicates which field you have to be on each day and at what time. You get to your field half an hour or so before that time and get a good look at the targets. There is always a referee/scorer waiting for your squad. The trap houses are always filled, the targets are invariably excellent and importantly there is a cooler of bottled water with disposable paper cups at every field, a life saver in South Texas where conditions can be like the hottest Australian summer day. They shoot in squads of five and it typically takes about an hour and fifteen minutes to finish the 100 targets.

If you shoot the possible you prepare for the shoot off. If not, the day is your own. Visit Vendors Row and drool over the goodies for sale, buy a couple of items you need and a suitcase full of stuff you want. Feeling peckish? There is all day BBQ, with a menu to tame your gastronomic desires. My wife adds that this is not for vegetarians.

Have some on the sport gunsmithing or stock adjustment attended to by one of the mobile workshops. And at the end of the day go to the shoot-off stadium and watch the Greats of World Skeet turn targets into ink blots in the sky.

Our own world Champion, Adrian Cousens is fondly remembered here, conversations tend to go like this: "Oh, you're an Australian? You know Cuz? Is Cuz here? Where's Cuz? How's Cuz doin'?"

Adrian, will you please send these people a newsletter!

Seeing that I missed a lot of shoot offs, I didn't get bored in San Antonio. We visited the famous shrine of the Alamo, walked the Riverwalk with all its restaurants, arts and craft shops, the restored Spanish Governor's residence dating from the fifteenth century, Fort Sam Houston and more, much more. And then there is the famous Tex-Mex cuisine, with a range of chilli sauce that varies from mildly piquant to incendiary! A word of warning, if it tastes hot at the entrance, it's also hot at the exit. You know what I mean!

It was easy driving around San Antonio, there are freeways everywhere that will take you to shopping, sightseeing, eating out or ...visiting other skeet ranges, like the very neat San Antonio Gun

Club. George and I shot a few practice rounds here and met even more nice people who like to talk about shooting, life, the universe and everything. We met people who actually live at the home of the World Championships and are not competing?!? And they were actually astonished that some people would travel twenty thousand kilometres just to shoot skeet, such is life.

The Lackland Airforce Base also had a nice little two layout field and welcomed visitors. Those two layouts ran hot for ten days, nearby, on another part of the base, there is a great static display of military airplanes, old and new.

The highlight of the shoot for me was when the lady shooter in our squad shot her first hundred in competition and then went on to win her class in the shoot-off. She had been shooting well and it was great to see her put it all together. Remember the name, Stacy Lee Johnson. This is the first of many hundreds. I think she will become one of the greats. As a general observation I noticed there are a greater percentage of female shooters than at home. I think the nature of the competition in shooting the smaller gauges means that persons of smaller stature can learn to shoot in comfort, and not be knocked around by the big 12 gauge shells. A lot of people use the smaller gauges even to shoot in the 12 gauge competition and record perfect scores, perhaps if small gauge ammunition was available and reasonably priced, we might end up with more shooters in Australia.

Sadly, after the 410 bore competition is over, it's all over. Time to pack up, head back to Oz, work, household bills and all that. We had a wonderful time. George and I didn't shoot as well as we could, but that wasn't of paramount importance to us. We were there for the experience and realistically we are not in the same league as the Greats of the World Skeet, especially when we are fully savouring the local non-shooting attractions. I think it is important to have goals in life and, if possible, all dedicated skeeties, at least once in their life, should make the pilgrimage to the World Shoot. I can assure you that with preparation and a relaxed attitude, it will be a memorable lifetime experience. Highly recommended.

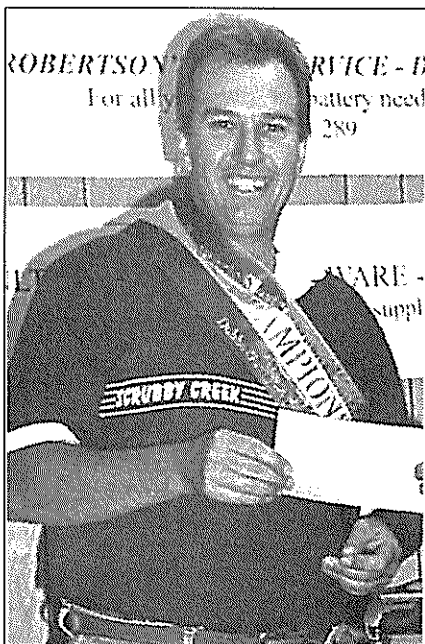
Macquarie Masters Championships

The first event was a twenty-five target double barrel eye opener cash divide and thirteen successful competitors including newly elected NSW State President Mark McInnes shot the possible.

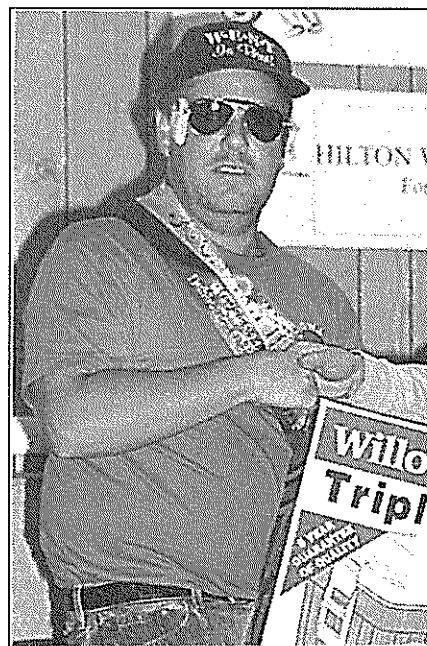

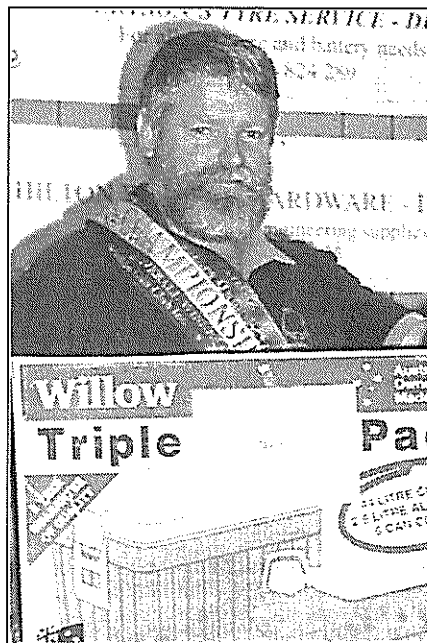

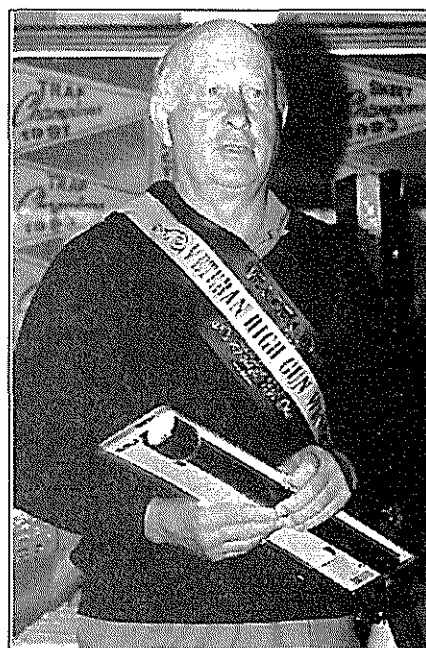

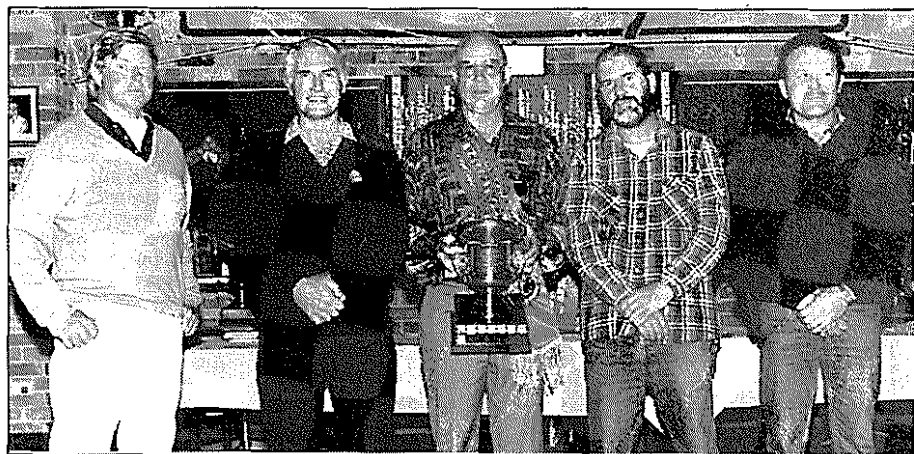

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS

JANUARY 1999

During the course of my duties as National Shoot Marshall, I am asked many questions. Most of these are current operational queries, such as "what field will the shoot-off be held on?" or "what time do we start tomorrow morning?" but occasionally inquiries of a more abstract nature are posed. The most recurring of these is "how did you ever get this job?" As the answer to that one is rather long and complicated and I always seem to be busy doing something or other, I have learnt to laugh it off with a one-liner like "just unlucky" or some other equally facetious parting shot. But it's a very good question, and if for no other reason than the frequency of it's occurrence, it deserves an adequate answer. However, as it is an integral piece in my overall philosophy on the betterment of clay target shooting in Australia, I am going to dedicate this month's column to it, in the hope that, along with many of the others, it's concept may someday come to pass.

First, let's look at some history. I began attending the Nationals back in the late 70s and after I had attended several, I began to wonder why some operational problems and mistakes seemed to reoccur on a regular basis. Later, after my attendances increased and my understanding of the situation expanded, it became obvious to me that this was one of the inherent problems of a Rotational Venue System coupled to a ?host-state? administration concept. Each state got to hold the Nationals about once every six years and used their own people to run it. Thus, on some occasions, a fresh set of people, with no prior experience in running the Nationals, were given the task of making it happen. So, although most of these people were intelligent, capable and enthusiastic, most would also agree that they were a lot wiser at the end of the week, than they were at the start. Unfortunately, this wisdom was not able to be capitalized upon, because by the time the tournament returned to their state, the bulk of them had moved on, and a mostly new set of people had to start again from square one.

Over a period of time, in order to minimize this problem as much as possible, the ACTA have developed operational procedures guides for the assistance of the organizers and this certainly is a big help. But the basic problem, enhanced by the once unassailable concept of "closed shop" in-state administration recruitment, due to State pride, did not seem to have an attainable solution. My trips to the New Zealand Nationals only served to highlight our problem even further, because due to their rotational venue system only having a two year cycle (from island to island) and their preparedness to dabble in external assistance, their problems in this area were pretty much non existent. So along with their squadding system, their administration achievements gave me much food for thought as to what we might be able to do to improve and advance the running of our major tournaments in Australia.

During the mid 80s, I was fortunate enough to be able to visit the United States several times and get a first hand look at the operational procedures of both the ATA at the Grand American Trapshoot and the NSSA at the World Skeet Championships. The ATA's problem had long ago solved itself by virtue of the fact that the size of the shoot had grown to such proportions that there was only one facility left in the world large enough to hold it - the home ground of the ATA at Dayton Ohio, with over 100 fields, stretched out in a continuous line over a mile long. (They actually run several farm tractors, towing passenger trailers, continuously up and back along the line, to carry the shooters to and from their fields) The NSSA was almost in the same boat. Years ago they had rotated their shoot all around the country (even to another country on one occasion). But as time went on and the size of the shoot increased, the number of adequate venues dwindled. By the time I arrived on the scene, only Savannah Georgia and NSSA's home ground in San Antonio Texas remained.

However, even though they still rotated the shoot between these two venues, they had long since come to appreciate the virtues of on-going management, so on the away years, they simply packed up their staff and equipment and shipped them off to Georgia. Although some of the administrators changed occasionally, one person never changed and that was the Chief Referee, whose job description is basically the same as our Shoot Marshall. My inquiries in this area revealed NSSA's policy that, as the Chief Referee is the most visibly exposed management entity and the interfacing medium between competitors and officials, as well as the controller of all the operational procedures and thus the provider of stability and consistency to the Shoot, that position was a permanent appointment. Furthermore, whenever the Chief Referee was approaching retirement, he would be replaced by someone who had acted as his assistant and understudied him for several years.

I immediately saw this concept as the most viable solution to our problem, and returned to Australia wondering how it could be integrated into our own system. After carefully considering the situation, and the fact that the world is full of people with good ideas that someone else should do, and that the best way to lead is from the front, I tentatively applied for the job of Shoot Marshall at the next Skeet Nationals. It came as no surprise to

anyone when both the ACTA and the VCTA were somewhat skeptical of this "bright idea", particularly in light of my reputation as an outspoken, rebellious trouble-maker. Furthermore, I don't think there was any precedent for giving the job to either a non-executive person, or a "cutting edge" participating shooter.

But as I was very persistent and had a lot of shooter support and the Shoot was at least being held in my home state, I did actually get the job, although I am sure it was with a great deal of trepidation on the part of the officialdom. Anyway, to cut a long story short, it went pretty well, so the following year I took the next step and applied for the job out-of-state. To the surprise of a lot of people, but to the credit of the NSWCTA, with whom I have subsequently developed a very close working relationship, and found to be a very progressive and imaginative organization, I got the job again. Unfortunately, soon after that second occasion, and just when I had the ball rolling, a combination of the pursuit of my own shooting career overseas, and our lack of fixed dates for major tournaments, caused me to pretty much lose contact with shooting in Australia for several years.

However, the basic idea never left the back of my mind, and when I returned to Australia to live in 1994, it was with a very different set of shooting priorities. So I immediately approached the authorities with the idea of not only taking up where I had left off with the Skeet Nationals, but also to run the Trap Nationals as well, and to perform both functions, on a permanent basis, for a minimum period of ten years. Although a number of the National Executive could see merit in the theory, after I explained it to them, the decision was out of their hands, because Nationals staffing was still a State responsibility. Thus, even though I had some degree of semi-official sanctioning, I was left to approach various State Associations a couple of times per year, with my hat in my hand, to beg for the job.

With some runs on the board as a skeet organizer, that half of the job wasn't too hard to reacquire and I have worked at every Skeet Nationals that I have been able to attend since that time. But breaking into the Trap Nationals proved to be somewhat more difficult and I got the impression that turning their cherished Trap Nationals over to a mere skeet shooter was not something that the officialdom was keen to rush into. However, patience and perseverance are a couple of my strong points and after several years I finally got a tiny little foot in the door when I was offered the job of office "gopher" for the Trap Nationals at Wagga in 1997. Subsequent events then worked in my favour and during the week I was promoted several times through Assistant Shoot Marshall and Acting Shoot Marshall to the job I wanted and the rest is history. By the end of that Shoot, I was negotiating with WACTA for the following year and had been approached by the QCTA for two years hence.

During the last couple of years I have also been approached by some of the State Associations, and even some individual clubs, to run shoots for them and I always oblige whenever time and money permits my attendance. By money I do not necessarily mean payment, but I do usually require at least my expenses to be covered. I have also recently developed a very close liaison with the QCTA, having run three of their last four State Shoots and I am currently working very closely with both them and the Roma Gun Club, to ensure that the next Trap Nationals is one of the best ever.

A separate but associated problem with shoot management, which can be alleviated by on-going administration, and the careful selection thereof, is the fact that some potential candidates lack basic "people skills" and/or have the wrong attitude. Unfortunately, I sometimes encounter people on shoot management teams who, even though they may be very accomplished competitors themselves, do not understand that the shooters are either your customers or your employers, depending on which way you look at it. Worse still, they sometimes get it totally upside down and think that they are "policemen" whose function is to keep shooters under surveillance and in line because without proper supervision they will misbehave and/or cheat. Some others do not handle authority well and feel a constant need to display it. These types of attitude shortcomings are not only bad, but are often counter-productive and self-generating, because people usually respond in line with the way that they are treated. One of the most important lessons that I learnt from working with several NSSA Chief Referees was that the most respected servant is the one who serves best. So although I sometimes have an overpowering urge to choke some of the competitors, I try very hard to restrain it, be polite, provide help and offer friendly advice.

With the adoption of Wagga as our National Headquarters and the accompanying establishment of a National Shooting Ground in that wonderfully receptive city, I believe the time is right to reassess our National Shoot Management criteria, with the thought of establishing some or all of the positions as on-going appointments. Obviously I believe that at least the Shoot Marshall's position should be made permanent and needless to say I would like to be one of the people considered for it. If you have any thoughts on this matter, either way, take the time to convey them to your National Executive member and let's see what can become of it.

Vale: I've had a lot of trouble writing this month's column as tears kept smudging the draft copies. The passing of John Withers has torn a gap in our lives that may never be filled. Karen and I have lost a squad member, a travelling companion, a card playing partner, a best man and a close friend and the children have lost their favourite adopted uncle. The shooting fra-

ternity has lost a National Champion and a super guy. Sometimes life just ain't fair.

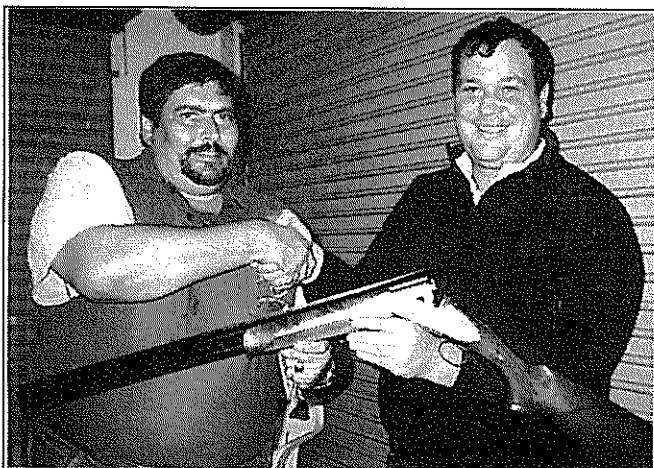

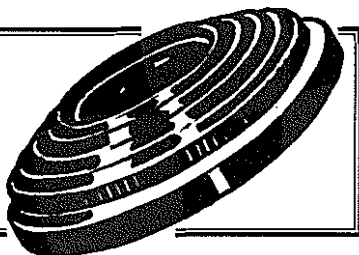

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY—NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. For 100 target events they shall be shot in brackets of 25 targets, two visits to the traps.
3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
6. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.
14. Options sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter, (junior or ladies), she is not eligible for both.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies/and or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at discretion of the Tournament Director.
19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors—Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to the second family members only. They being wives/husbands and juniors. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
eg (1) Father and 2 children father pays full noms whilst the 2 juniors pays 60% noms each.
eg (12) Husband, wife and two children nominate. The Husband pays full noms with the other three paying 60% noms each.
23. *All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.*
