

Shooters came from all States of Australia, together with a representative from New Zealand. No one present could remember a bigger turn-out for the State Trap Carnival.

Kemen's sponsorship of the Australian Open competitions will also be extended to include the presentation of especially prepared silver cups to the overall winner of each 'Kemen' Australian Open event. Rio cartridges will be presented to each grade and section winner in these events compliments of Rio Oceania Pty Ltd.

A further feature of the 1999 Double Trap program will be a 'CHARITY TEAM EVENT", with two member teams representing Perazzi, Kemen and Beretta competing. As has been the requirement in past years, pre nomination for the Australasian-Pacific "Grand Prix" competition is necessary. Again, all shooters will be catered for at the "Grand Prix". All events will have sections for open, lady, junior and veteran shooters and all events will be graded AA,A,B & C grades. 5. If you have changed your grade since pre nominating YOU

MUST ADVISE THE OFFICE UPON ARRIVAL AT THE GROUNDS BEFORE YOU ARE SQUADDED.

6. You may nominate for one or all events.

7. Payment must be sent with the pre nomination. This may be by cheque, money order or credit card.

8. If you cancel before the Nationals, monies will be refunded less a \$5.00 administration fee.



The Yarram Secondary College has an active shooting Club, with a


large number (200), yes two hundred, having obtained their Jnr Shooting Permit. A very commendable policy.









RISK MANAGEMENT IN SPORT

INTRODUCTION

This Sports Update examines what risk management is and how it can be applied to your organisation and activities.

Risk management is a procedure to reduce potential liability. It is a pro-active system which attempts to address potential problem areas before they actually lead to reactively defending legal proceedings. The aim is a safer environment and "legally safer" operational procedures. Education of all people involved, their acceptance of the importance of risk, and open communication of ideas is vital to a risk management plan's success.

The following are only general guidelines, and in all cases a risk management plan must be specific to the particular sport, facility or program.

COACHES

Coaches are in a position of expertise and knowledge, and have duties to properly instruct, supervise and to warn. Coaches should:

Properly supervise activities (additional care may be necessary where a participant is young, inexperienced, or known to be awkward, aggressive or easily fatigued);

Properly instruct (including demonstration) on techniques of the sport;

Evenly match opponents;

Teach the rules of the sport especially those necessary for safety;

Give appropriate warnings on the risk of particular activities. (This is important for the young or inexperienced);

Teach any activity which requires an increase in skill levels, strength, or conditioning progressively;

Never encourage an injured athlete to continue playing;

Ensure injured athletes get medical treatment as soon as possible;

Discourage violent actions (inform participants that actions onfield can lead to civil action off field);

Ensure that counselling and information is available on the dangers of drug use;

Keep themselves up to date with current practice in their sport; Keep records of their instruction and training techniques. REFEREES

A new area of potential legal liability relates to referees' performance of their functions. In implementing risk management, umpires should:

Uphold the rules of the game;

"Send Off" violent players;

Ensure that if the rules require safety equipment such as mouth guards or head gear that they are used;

Enforce rules designed to stop dangerous play and infectious diseases.

FACILITIES AND GROUNDS CONTROL

A person or entity with control of premises or grounds is responsible for ensuring that such venues are safe. Some measures that can be taken are:

If involved in the design of sports facilities, ensure safety is considered;

Building, facility and equipment inspection plans (eg: checking sports areas are safe by means of padding, correct surfaces, and proper lighting);

Roofing should be repaired to prevent leaks which could cause someone to slip;

CONGRATULATIONS!

Seating must be checked to ensure safe - eg: no sharp edges;

If an organisation owns or leases a facility or premises and some other organisation wants to use that facility, ensure a facility use agreement imposing safety and insurance obligations on the user is in place:

If in control of dangerous facilities (eg: swimming pool), ensure there is adequate security preventing entry when there is no supervision;

Ensure security plans are in place particularly in sports where the crowd may have a tendency for unruly or violent behaviour;

Consider the safety of spectators through the use of protective barriers (eg: car racing) and screens;

Warnings must be visible and specific. (Consider signs in languages other than English).

EQUIPMENT

Equipment must be properly assembled and maintained;

Implement a regular system for inspection of sports equipment. Records should be kept when inspected and by whom;

Make sure equipment warranties are satisfied;

Ensure major repairs are carried out by the relevant experts; Consider the layout of equipment carefully;

Users should be instructed on the correct way to use equipment.

PLAYING SURFACES

Ensure that the playing surfaces are of the correct type for the relevant sport, and such surfaces are properly installed;

Playing surfaces should be regularly checked for potential hazards that could cause injury (eg: broken glass, sprinkler heads) and remove the hazard before play is permitted. This obligation to remove dangers also applies to other areas.

MISCELLANEOUS

A sport's rules should be designed with safety in mind, particularly to safety equipment;

General supervision plans should be effected and tested;

Medical staff be on hand at events or be available if required. In sports facilities numbers for ambulance, hospital and nearby available doctors should be detailed near telephones for easy reference;

Transport plans supervised and safe transport may be required where sports teams are involved;

Infectious diseases policies (eg "blood bin") should be developed. First aid kits should always contain surgical gloves for use when handling bleeding people;

A doping (or drugs) policy should be implemented. An insurance policy may exclude a claim relating to the use of non-medically prescribed drugs. If a coach or organisation is sued for providing steroids to an athlete they will have to pay any damages awarded themselves;

React promptly to the cause of an accident. Accident reports should be made, including details of the people involved, witnesses and what action was taken afterwards to correct the situation (if possible). Whenever an accident occurs inform your insurance company or broker (this may be required by your policy);

Educate and train staff to perform their roles effectively and safely (may include resuscitation and general first aid courses). Also keep up to date with industry advances by attending seminars and training programs;

Develop checklists for maintenance routines (equipment, grounds and facility). It is not enough however just to set up a checklist it must be implemented.

RISK MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATORS

Committee members and administrators of sporting organisations owe certain legal duties to the organisation and its members. These duties are similar to those owed by company directors. Those duties require them to act competently, honestly, in good faith and in what they consider to be the best interests of the organisation. If they fail any of those duties, they may be liable to compensate members of the organisation or third parties who suffer loss as a result of that failure. In terms of their management of an organisation administrators should ensure that:

Their organisation is incorporated under the relevant Associations Incorporated Act if an association, or the Corporations Law if a company;

Compliance with all legislative requirements (eg: reporting, lodging and accounting requirements);

The constitution is clearly drafted with clear purposes. If safety is a purpose of the organisation it should be expressly stated in the rules;

The constitution is regularly reviewed and if necessary amended to ensure the constitution evolves with the activities of the organisation or external developments which may affect the organisation;

The Committee is fully and regularly informed, by written report if necessary, of the activities of the organisation (and so can make formal decisions);

The working environment for employees is safe (OH&S requirements are met);

They recognise and respond to concerns about the impact of the organisation's activities on participants, members, the organisation itself, the public and the sport, for example, discrimination, infectious diseases, pregnancy, smoking or doping policies; Insurance is appropriate to the organisation's activities and current and that the insurer's requirements regarding notification of potential claims are met.

This list is not exhaustive and is intended only to provide examples for administrators.

CONCLUSION

While the law now affects the conduct of sports greater than ever before, don't see this as a negative, but as a positive reason to take the initiative to implement safe practises and risk management programs. There can be a great sense of achievement in knowing that you are satisfying your legal, moral and ethical duties by providing good, safe and effective sporting services. It really is all about good business.

The aims of the Foundation is to provide support generally for cancer sufferers in the district.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY—NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
- 2. Squads of 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. For 100 target events they shall be shot in brackets of 25 targets, two visits to the traps.
- 3. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- 4. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 5. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.
- Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nom inations paid.
- 7. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
- 8. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET IN THE NEXT EVENT. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred in the event concerned.
- 9. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first rounds of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
- 10. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
- 11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
- 12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 13. Optional sweep/purse nominations shall be noted on a separate form from shooting nominations. Entries for sweep/purse will only be accepted at the designated area, which shall be at a different location of the area accepting shooting event nominations.
- 14. Options sweep/purse prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Junior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize. Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter, (junior or ladies), she is not eligible for both.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies/and or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Nominations will close daily at 11.00am or at discretion of the Tournament Director.
- 19. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors—Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to the second family members only. They being wives/husbands and juniors. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.

CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS FEBRUARY 1999

Midway through last year I wrote an article on Shooting Stance and Gun Mount. Around the same time I did a couple of Coaching Weekends for the NSWCTA for their State Trap and State Skeet Teams. The article and it's content seemed to be of considerable interest to most of the shooters who attended those seminars and on both occasions led to questions regarding my views on foot positions for the various lanes and stations. As with all the other individual facets of Clay Target Shooting I have considered that problem, researched it, analyzed it, and formed my own theory as to the best method of addressing it. This month I am going to expound on that theory and it's conception.

When I first started to get serious about Clay Target Shooting in general, and Skeet Shooting in particular, it soon became apparent to me that setting up the angle of the body, in relation to where the shot was fired, was one of the several basic foundations of consistent good shooting. The establishment of this angle is controlled by foot placement, so I began an in-depth study into this area and quickly found it to be a veritable Pandora's Box. Inconsistency and contradiction appeared to be the order of the day.


At that time formal coaching was almost unheard-of in this country and the top shooters seemed to consider their skills to be some sort of black art which was shrouded in a veil of secrecy. Worse still was the existence of a type of macho image which dictated that real men just know how to shoot and so apart from total novices, anyone asking for advice would be admitting weakness and actually taking a shooting lesson would be cause for major embarrassment. The only real avenues of assistance available at that time were a number of books, mostly originating from the United States written by various professional shooters in the employ of firearms and ammunition companies.

Two that spring to mind immediately are Fred Missildine and D Lee Braun. In hindsight I now realize that Missildine was a swingthru shooter. This fact, combined with my extremely limited natural ability and my total lack of a basic grasp of that concept, is why I found his book somewhat confusing and have only been able to appreciate it fully in later years as my ignorance slowly diminished. Lee Braun however was a sustained lead exponent and thus his writings were immediately of enormous assistance to me and I consider his book to be a timeless classic, well worth reading even today.

Anyway in the process of my research I encountered numerous different methods of specifying correct foot position. The three most popular of these methods were:

- 1) Little black feet diagrams for each station.
- 2) Toe line diagrams for each station.
- 3) Belly button pointed at the low house.

After trying and evaluating each of these methods, I decided that



none of them ontained all of the desirable features that such a method shoul@rovide. The belly button method always appealed to me, mainly@cause of it's simplicity, additionally because of it's adaptability t left-handers (who could simply point their belly button at theigh house), but also, strangely enough, because of it's non-deperency upon the positioning of the feet. This meant that people wh radical foot/body relationships could not unknowingly be misil by it, and that people who intentionally used a radical stanc could use it without any adaptation. However, although this ethod has numerous virtues, it fails in it's primary objective becise it just won't work all the time. On most targets it feels OK, others it seems somewhat awkward, and on some it just won't we at all.

The next morapplicable method seemed to be toe-lines. Although obviously mh more complicated, due to a multitude of lines and angles whicheeded memorizing, and clearly lacking some of the belly buttomethod's virtues, it at least seemed as though theoretically it ald work on all stations. Practical experience soon showed thathis method had several shortcomings. The worst of these was itability to misalign people who used any stance other than the onused by the line drawer. This left me with the little black feet dgrams, and although this method totally eliminated the potenti misalignment associated with toe lines, it is undoubted the most complicated of all the methods, comprising numerous lrd-to-remember diagrams. It also shares with toe lines the laiof easy adaptation for left handers and the necessity for blind fai in the fact that the diagram drawer actually knew what he wadoing, due to a lack of any supporting theory or logic.

Clearly wh was needed was a generalized method which incorporated allhe virtues of the existing methods but lacked any of their shortmings. Rather than continue to evaluate, criticize and modifyreviously suggested methods, I decided to compile a list of desible features and then either devise a new method or amalgama several existing methods in an effort to attain the optimum rthod. The mandatory features included:

- 1) To be siple and easy to remember and implement.
- 2) To be adicable on all stations at all times.
- 3) To inspi confidence by virtue of supporting logic.
- 4) To be imune to incorrect foot/body relationships.
- 5) To be eily adaptable to left handers.

After muctrial and error I devised a method which utilizes one black footiagram, incorporates one toe line angle, and borrows from the gic of the belly button method, thus encompassing several of's other virtues.

The first id most important thing to understand about foot position is th the exact placement of the feet is not the primary purpose the exercise. That purpose is to position the body at a particulaangle to the shooting area, and specifying the placement ancelative positioning of the feet is the most convenient way to aleve that end. Therefore to consistently attain the correct by angle, the first thing we need to do is provide a fixed relationsp between the body axis line and a suitable foot placement why will provide adequate comfort, balance and stability. Practical xperience has shown that spacing the feet apart at about shilder width, side by side and with both feet angling out at any cifortable angle provided they are equally angled will provide ts situation. Thus we now have our one and only black foot diagm. A practical advantage of this simple foot placement is that are drawn across the toes is parallel to the body axis line (the linearmed by extending both arms out horizontally to each side of tlbody).

All that mains now is to establish the optimum angle between the bodyxis line and the shooting area (target break point), and we will lve our one and only toe line angle. I derived this angle by two derent methods, which fortunately provided almost identical rests. From the theoretical aspect I measured how far the averageerson can swing a gun both left and right, and then found thenter of these two extremities. Logically this mid-point should be the angle of maximum comfort and zero tension in the arc of the swing. Aligning this angle with the target break point should provide the best chance for a smooth unchecked swing from the hold point, through the target break point and into the follow through zone.

From the practical aspect I simply studied most of the top shooters in action and observed the angle between their body axis line and their target break point, regardless of how or where their feet were positioned. Although this provided some interesting anomalies between the various shooters, and in some cases between stations for individual shooters, the median point still usually came out very similar to the theoretical value calculated above. That angle turns out to be 60 degrees from the direction the body faces and correspondingly 30 degrees offset from the toe line of the black foot diagram and/or the body axis line.

Thus we now have a foot placement method which fulfills the five desirable criteria listed above:

1) Decide on the point where you intend to break the target (median point if it is variable).

2) Adopt the foot placement as per the black foot diagram and place your toes on an imaginary line extending from yourself to the target break point.

3) Offset your toe line 30 degrees from the line to the target break point by moving your front foot back about six inches. (righthanders stand to the left of the line and move their left foot back and conversely, left-handers stand to the right of the line and move their right foot back)

The by-products of the simplicity and generality of this method are that it is flexible, adaptable and has several other additional and incidental advantages and applications. Some of these are:

1) If you find that either a more square or a more angular stance seems more comfortable to you, then you can simply increase or decrease the angle provided you use a constant angle for all shots. 2) If you wish to use a foot placement other than the one stipulated in the black foot diagram, then simply alter the angle by whatever angle this foot placement causes your toe line to vary from parallel to your body axis line.

3) If you wish to use a radical foot placement, or a variable foot placement, or even choose to ignore your foot placement, then simply offset your body axis line from the direction of your anticipated target break point.

4) As your ability level changes and your target break points move back earlier on the flight line, your foot position and body angle adjusts automatically to compensate for these changes.

5) As this method is not materially tied to a skeet field in any way, it can be taken with you to a trap-shooting field, a sporting-clays range, or even used in a hunting application. (For trap shooting the median target break point is always a point about halfway between the traphouse and the central distance marker)

Now, to change the subject. Several months ago I wrote an article on the merits of fixed dates for major shooting events. Therefore I am pleased to advise that the ACTA have tentatively returned the Skeet Nationals to November #3 (the third weekend in November) for this year and hopefully for good. NSW have returned their State skeet shoot permanently to August #2 after last years unfortunate reshuffle and have decided to expand their official program to three days. QLD are adamant that their skeet shoot will never move from September #3 and that their program will remain at three days. SA were very happy with their move to May #3 last year, which put their skeet shoot on a long weekend and allowed them to run a three-day carnival and I believe this is now a permanent fixture. TAS are moving their skeet to June #2 this year in order to be able to run a three-day shoot and envisage both changes being permanent.

Although VIC have reconfirmed May #1 for this year's State Skeet shoot, unfortunately there is talk that last year's much bereaved program reduction from three days to two days may carry over. As the once undisputed Skeet stronghold in Australia and the original innovators of the three-day Skeet Carnival it saddens me to see us slip back even further. Hopefully a re-evaluation of this situation may occur before the program is advertised. I know that State AGMs need to be held at the State Trapshoot, but I wish the VCTA would follow the example of both NSW and QLD and have the State President and Secretary convene an informal meeting with the shooters at the State Skeet Carnival each year to gain some insight into what the shooters really like and/or want.

On a brighter note it seems that the adoption of our National Shooting Ground has been brought forward six months. 1999 was supposed to be the last year of the Rotational Venue System but apparently this year's Skeet Nationals have been reallocated to Wagga. Also I'm told that the NSWCTA have recently made Wagga their permanent State Shooting Ground. All these things can only make our National Shooting Ground bigger and better sooner and I congratulate all those involved in the making of these decisions.




