# 'FREE CASE OF SHELLS"

### PRE NOMINATIONS

The Executive Committee of the Australian Clay Target Association has agreed that pre nominations shall be accepted for the DTL Nationals at Roma in March 1999.

If you pre nominate you could win a case of shells. All pre nominations received by 8 March 1999 will go into a draw for a "Case of Shells".

We encourage shooters to pre nominate as, apart from having the chance to take home a free case of shells, it will save you time when you arrive in Roma.

Conditions of pre nominating are as follows:

- 1. Must be received by the National Office by March 8 1999
- 2. A receipt will be sent to you advising of receipt of nomination together with your squadding card. YOU WILL NOT BE SQUADDED UNTIL YOU ARRIVE IN ROMA.
- 3. All squadding will be done upon you arrival in Roma.
- 4. At the Nationals, you will have to produce your squadding card and handicap card so that you can be squadded.
- 5. If you have changed your grade since pre nominating YOU MUST ADVISE THE OFFICE UPON YOUR ARRIVAL AT THE GROUNDS BEFORE YOU ARE SQUADDED.
- 6. You may nominate for one or all events.
- 7. Payment must be sent with the pre nominations. This maybe by cheque, money order or credit card.
- 8. If you cancel before the Nationals, monies will be refunded less a \$5 administration fee.

# 18TH AUSTRALASIAN POLICE TRAP & SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

ade ade 13-15th November 1998


This successful three day, annual, shoot was hosted by the South Australian Police Gun Club at the International Gun Club, Virginia.

A six event program attracted police and civilian competitors from around Australia. Neil Phipps (Victoria) took out several overall honors in the Police Competition; Bob Andrews (Bordertown) the civilian.

Unfortunately, there were no International Competitors this year.

Though the weather provided favorable shooting conditions over the three days, there was only one possible shot during the entire Championships - Ian Prior (ACT Police) - in Event 1: 50 Target Skeet.

Ian's perfect score helped other ACT team shooters, B Bock and T

Curtis take out the Skeet Team Championship with a score of 137/150.

The overall civilian winner in this same event went to L Charles (S.A.G.C) -48/50. There was no civilian team event.

Event 2: 50 Target Single Barrel, held on the Saturday. Overall was won by police member G Durre (QLD) - 49/50 and civilian competitor P Marcoionni (I.G.C) - 50/51.

Event 3: 50 Target Pointscore was awarded to N Phipps (Police) - 165/168 and B Andrews (Civilian) - 149/150.

50 Target Trench: Event 4, proved to be a challenge for many shooters not accustomed to this discipline of shooting. N Phipps once again took honors for Police - 24/25 and J Finnis (I.G.C) for civilians - 24/25.

On the third day of shooting, SA Police Gun Club member A Vilcins secured the overall 50 Target Double Barrel Championship with a score of 50/51. B Andrews, with a near perfect score of 59/60, secured the civilian overall in this event (5).

Upon completion of Event 5, Victoria had won back the Police Champion Trap Team trophy, which they lost last year, to this year's runner-up, South Australia. Members of the Victorian team were N Phipps, T Bannan, C Penno - 139/150 + 13/15.

The SA International Gun Club team members, P Marcoionni, R Dower and J Finnis, came to the fore and won the Civilian Champion Trap Team event with a score of 144/150.

The final event of the program was the 60 Target Champion of Champions - shot from 18 meters. Retired Victorian Police Officer Neil Phipps with a score of 92/100 was the overall Police Champion and R Dower, International Gun Club member, with a score of 94/100, won the Civilian Champion title.

Other major prize winners include:

N Phipps and B Andrews - Trap High Gun over Events 2,3,5,6 with scores of 330 and 339 out of a possible 350 respectively.

C Anderson and D Hamann - Intermediate High Gun over the same events - with 316 and 303 respectively.


S Byrnes, from the Lower North Gun Club, won the Ladies High Gun with a score of 303.

The Veterans title went to C Abela (S.A.G.C) with 283.

It is proposed that we will be sending the following teams to compete in the World DTL Championships in Wales in July/August 1999:

Open Team - 5

Ladies Team - 3

Note Veteran and Junior teams will be selected after confirmation of age from the CPSA.

Teams will be selected from the total number of targets of the following events:

Double Barrel (100t), Single Barrel (50t), Points (50t) and Mackintosh.

All selections will be subject to approval by the Justification Committee.

# 2000 PARALYMPIC GAMES VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

The staging of the Sydney 2000 Paralympic Games will require the skills, knowledge and support of many Australians. Volunteers will be the public face of the Games and part of the team to make the Games happen for Australia.

One Area which will require volunteers is the Paralympic Family. The Paralympic Family includes the International Paralympic Committee (IPC), National Paralympic Committee (NPC), International Sports Organization for the Disabled, International Paralympic Sports Federations, VIP guests and Sponsors.

The IPC Relations and Protocol program within the Sydney Paralympic Organizing Committee (SPOC) coordinates the organization of all official visits to Sydney at games-time by VIPs as well as their accommodation, operation of VIP Lounges, meet and greet at airports and transportation needs.

Volunteers are being sought for the following games-time positions:

- Paralympic Family Assistant ( to work with VIP's and special guests),
- Attendant Paralympic Family Venues (competition and non-competition venues),
- National Paralympic Committee Assistants (Paralympic Village).

A Commitment of three weeks is required (11 October to 1 November 2000) by all volunteers wishing to work with the Paralympic Family.

What is the role of a Paralympic Family Assistant?

Paralympic Family Assistants work directly with members of the Paralympic Family. This could include administrative assistance, airport "Meet and greet" services and hospitality. In addition, assistants may be required to accompany the Paralympic Family to competition venues and social functions.

What is the role of an attendant at Paralympic Family venues? Competition venues: control access to VIP areas and provide assistance to VIP's using the hospitality lounge and seating areas.

Non-competition venues: 'Meet and greet' at airports, provide VIP Liaison in the Paralympic Village and Paralympic Family Headquarters, as well as support for the Paralympic Family Secretaria, IPC Secretariat and the Protocol Program.

What is the role of a NPC Assistant?

As a NPC Assistant, you will be assigned to work directly with a specific National Paralympic Committee in the Paralympic Village. You will be required to gain a sound working knowledge of the functions of the Village and SPOC operations through the training provided. With this knowledge, you will be the first point of contact between the NPC and SPOC and will be involved in problem resolution during the Paralympic Games.

Who is eligible?

The desired requirements for selection are:

- fluency in a second language preferred, but not essential,
- dedication, commitment, resourcefulness and reliability,
- demonstrated ability to work in a multicultural environment
- high level of stamina and flexibility
- customer service experience and flexibility
- drivers license and knowledge of Sydney
- availability for training during the next two years.

Please note: experience working with people with a disability is not required and volunteers will not be required to work as "carers" for athletes.

# GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES AUSTRALIAN SPORTS MEDAL

The Prime Minister John Howard has announced that the Government is creating an Australian Sports Medal in the Australian system of honors and awards. The Medal will be a commemorative medal awarded during the year 2000.

The year 2000 has been selected because Sydney is hosting the Olympics and Paralympic Games but the award of the Medal will not be restricted to athletes and others connected with the Games. The Medal is intended to recognize a cross-section of those whose efforts have made Australia a Nation of sporting excellence. These include current and former competitors and those who provide the support base of sport: coaches, sports scientists, office holders, facilities Managers, those who maintain playing fields, provide transport and so on. The Government hope that a high proportion of the Medals will go to the unsung heroes and heroines of sport whose efforts at the grass roots have enabled Australia to become a great sporting Nation.

Apart from the Medal announced on 11 November 1998 to honor surviving veterans of the Great War, this will be the first distinctively Australian commemorative medal, previously Australia has shared in commemorative medals created as part of the British Honors System at times of coronations and jubilees. Nominations for the Australian Sports Medal will be submitted through the Commonwealth government to the governorgeneral. A certificate will accompany each Medal.

About one third of Medals will be nominated by the Commonwealth government and the state and territory sports ministers. In a departure from tradition, the government plans that the majority of Medals will be awarded to persons nominated by the Sports Community itself. Peak sports bodies recognized or funded by the Australian Sports Commission will be offered Quotas according to a formula based on the number of their registered competitors. Ministers will be able to nominate persons from any sport, not just those which are recognized by the Australian Sports Commission.

This will enable other sports and those persons whose contribution is wider than to one sport to be recognized by the Medal.

The Medals will be distributed progressively through out the Year 2000 and opportunities will be provided to enable sports bodies, if they wish, to host their own presentation ceremonies.

Peak bodies will be invited later this year to take part in the scheme.

Peak sporting bodies that agree to participate will be expected to establish an internal consultation process to chooses nominees so as to ensure that the names submitted to the Commonwealth government enjoy the greatest degree of support from within the sport and have regard to geography, gender (for relevant sports) with a balance between players and the support base and between veterans and the up-and-coming. Particular weighting is to be accorded to those who have put something back into the sport, for example, players who have given years of free-coaching to disadvantaged children and for those otherwise unrecognized by the Australian honors system.

Each peak sporting body will determine its own arrangements for selecting nominees such as establishing a central committee to oversight the nomination process for their sport. Nominations will be formally submitted through the principal Public Officer of the sport to the Commonwealth Government.

Whilst some sports icons who already have Australian honors may receive the Australian Sports Medal, the government anticipates that a high proportion of nominations will be for those who have not already been recognized by the Australian Honor.

Sports people are familiar with the many sporting awards available and some have received Australian Honors, however, the receipt of this unique award should have a special meaning: it is a formal Australian honor able to be worn on the left breast with other official honors and it will have come from within their sport.

The Medal provides a wonderful opportunity for the Nation to honor those Australians which the sports community itself regards have having made a great contribution to Australian sport as players or in a support role.

Conditions of Competition - Entry

Entry into the 1999 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 1999 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association.

Australian competitors must produce their 1999 registered shooter record book before nominating, to the 1999 Nationals Office Handicapper.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate Championship Titles for Open (with a Veterans division), Ladies and Juniors, excepting the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Ladies, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.

Note: A junior female must decide which section she is to enter, either Ladies or Juniors, she is not eligible for both.

A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before sashes/medals/cash/trophies are awarded.

When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as selection teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors over the age of 65 years on March 26, 1999.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on March 26, 1999 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors - are those who, on March 26, 1999 will be under the age of 15 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event.

Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure or equivalent shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be Olimpyc Black. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers.

All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified - and indication can be obtained for the daily scoreboard. This

applies to trap grades, Open, Ladies, Juniors and Veterans divisions. Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

# SHOOTING FOR THE HOMES

The 1st Annual Freemasons' Homes Clay Target day was held on Saturday 31st October 1998 at Kilmore, organized by Wor Bro Ian Gould and Wor Bro Brian Weybury. It was supported by members of the Greenvale branch of Field and Game Australia, the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia and the Australian Clay Target Association.

The event was a 50 target novelty "Simulated Field" Event. "Simulated Field" is similar to "Sporting Clays" and is a bit like golf with a gun. Shooters are grouped in squads of 4 - 6. They have a comfortable stroll in lightly timbered farmland between stations, where clay targets are thrown to simulate game (including the "rabbit" which is a clay target rolled along the ground). It is a very social and challenging game.

Perhaps because shotgun disciplines in general and "simulated Field" in particular gives greater opportunities to meet and chat with competitors, it is one of the fast growing shooting sports. There are dozens of Clubs with tens of thousands of Members.

Branches host monthly events which are visited by shooters from all over the State.

The Inaugural Clay Target Day was not widely advertised and did not have any sponsors, but attracted a lot of interest and 50 Brethren and Friends who raised \$240 for the Homes. At least 2 of the Brethren were former members of lodges that had returned their charter. At the end of the day they had a number of invitations to other lodges.

Everyone shot 2 rounds (50 targets). Because Greenvale is an approved shooting ground, a shooters license is not required provided a licensed shooter supervises you. A couple of novices took this opportunity to try clay target shooting for the first time. After all guns were put away, everyone met in the Greenvale Clubhouse to enjoy a cup of tea, coffee, or a beer. Trophies were awarded to the best juniors ( there may be a Lewis among them), Ladies, and grades A,B and C.

Shooting is a fraternity (unfortunately it does not attract many women, although they are most welcome) with a number of similarities to Freemasonry.

The 3 main shooting clubs, the Victorian Sporting Shooters Association of Australia (SSAA), Victorian Field and Game Association (VFGA) and the Victorian Clay Target Association (VCTA) are predominately male organizations. Together they have a membership in excess of 30,000 in dozens of branches.

Every weekend there are many competitions all over the State, with many shooters visiting from other branches. Aside from the competition, there is a great social atmosphere. Like Lodges, most people wear name-tags (I have been reprimanded for forgetting mine on occasions) and after shooting has finished for the day, most shooters enjoy the hospitality of the host club with a cup of tea or a glass of beer.

To be made a licensed shooter you must be mature of age, and well and worthily recommended. You must be a "fit and proper" person. The "fellowcraft" studies the "hidden mysteries of science and nature", including internal and external ballistics, velocities and angles, how much lead to give a target, etc.

To become a "master" a shooter, he must study himself. Physical skills are not enough. Mental stamina, confidence and attitude make the champion.

There are over 30,000 men of good character (this being a prerequisite for a license and membership) who are members of the VFGA, SSAA and VCTA in Victoria. I hope the Homes Clay Target Day will help promote Freemasonry to them.

This was a great day, which will be held again next year. Probate dates are either the 5th Saturday in July or October. Greenvale VFGA at Kilmore is limited to a maximum of 100 shooters, so next year there may be concurrent shoots at other venues, possibly the Mornington Peninsula and Wodonga.



# PREPARING FOR A COACHING SESSION

The following article has been submitted to assist Coaches obtain the maximum benefit from a One on One training session. I recommend that all Coaches take a few minutes and read it thoroughly.

Coaching another person to become a better shooter is an honor and a very important responsibility. That person wants you as a coach because they want to improve, and they have chosen someone to help them do that. While this is a great honor, a coach has the responsibility of making the practice and training as helpful, interesting and beneficial as possible. One of the best ways to do this is for a coach to be organized and prepared.

The most important thing in preparing for a coaching session is to know the components of a practice session and ways to make those components work well. The average coaching session generally consists of four parts - an introduction, skill instruction, competition and conclusion.

The introduction to a practice session prepares the shooter so that they are physically warmed up and their mind is on the job. In a typical one-hour session, the introduction should take about 5-10 mins. This time is well spent, as, if it is done properly, the shooter should be mentally and physically warmedup. In this way, the coach and the shooter can make the most of the training session (every one's mind is on the job), and the physical warm up should minimize any soreness from the training session.

The first part of the warm-up should physically prepare the shooter for the training session. This is a perfect time to gauge what's on the shooter's mind, and get their mind on the job at hand - what is being learned and practiced in today's session. The coach could begin with asking the shooter about how they feel they are progressing with their shooting. For example, the coach may ask how they shot on the weekend, have they been doing dry practice at home, or the coach may focus the shooter on an up-coming competition. The coach should then continue with a discussion on their goals of the session and where today's session fits in with the overall training program - the bigger picture.

The next part of the warm-up should physically prepare the shooter for the training session. A warm-up does not mean sending the shooter on a 10 minute run. Instead, it is essential that the coach and the shooter go through at least a 5 minute stretching routine before shooting starts. Shoulder, arm, lower back and leg stretching will minimize soreness and injury from shooting.

The second part of the training session is revision, refinement and skill development, and should take about 45 minutes out of a typical one-hour session. The aim of this part of the training session is to improve the shooters skills and encourage their enjoyment of shooting.

Skill development should begin immediately after the warmup, and should consist of a series of exercises and drills that revise and refine old skills, and introduce the shooter to new skills. It is essential that the coach plans the order of the drills and exercises before the training session, and that the drills and exercises chosen are part of a well planned and logical learning program. For example, novice shooters should always begin with shooting from lane 3 from 11 meters with "straightaway's", and then progress to the other lanes with "straightaways". Once they have "got the idea", then oscillating targets,

shooting from different lanes, and increasing distance can be gradually introduced.

However, the coach must also be flexible enough to change if necessary. For example, the shooter may progress more quickly than the coach thought they might. Therefore, the coach may change what they had planned for the session. Finally, it is often a good idea to finish with some competition (such as a round of 10 or 20 targets) or some game in which the shooter gets a chance to test their old and new skills.

The conclusion to a practice session should consist of a warm-down and evaluation of the training session. In a typical one-hour session, the conclusion should take about 5-10 minutes. The conclusion would generally start with the coach and the shooter going through the same stretching routine from the beginning of the session. During this time the coach and shooter can discuss how the training sessions went, and discuss arrangements for the next session. This discussion is likely to continue during any clean up and putting away of equipment.

In preparing for a coaching session, a coach must make many decisions with respect to each of the parts of a practice session. For example, the coach must decide what skills should be taught during a given training session. Further, the coach must decide what drills are the best for learning new and revising old skills. These and other decisions will have a major impact on the success or otherwise the coaching session. The keys to preparing for any coaching session are for the coach to make these decisions before arriving at the shooting range, and to ensure that these decisions are part of a well-planned and logical learning program.

#### Welcome to Update No.5 of the SOCOG Shooting Program

Since the last update, SOCOG's shooting staff have continued to progress plans for the Sydney 2000 Olympic and Paralympic Games, with the following projects in progress;

- -Compilation of detailed operating plans
- -Staff and volunteer recruitment
- -Milestone plans and records management
- -Venue layout plans and overlay requirements for competitions.
- -Identification of Olympic & Paralympic sport equipment requirements
- -Furniture, fittings and technology requirements.
- -ISSF World Cup/Test Event planning and operations.
- -Provision of data and information to other SOCOG functional areas regarding athletics, team officials, technical officials, ISSF Technical Committees, transport, accommodation, training, Field of Play operations etc.

#### SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL SHOOTING CENTRE

From the commencement of the main building contract on 11 July 1998, construction is approximately 45% completed with the project expected to be finished according to schedule in mid 1999. When completed the SISC will provide shooters with the most modern complex in the world. ISSF Technical Delegates, Gary Anderson (USA) and Jesus Elizondo (Mexico) are scheduled to visit Sydney in February 1999 to conduct the first of their two technical inspections of the range. ISCD Paralympic Technical Delegate Dave Baskin (USA), is also scheduled to visit Sydney for his inspection at the corresponding time.

VOLUNTEER - Update

Approximately 200 shooting specific people have expressed their interest in volunteering for the Games. This number will be increased when details of the General Volunteer Recruitment Program are released. If you have not expressed your interest in being a shooting specific volunteer and would like to do so, please contact Shooting Administration Manager Gina Di Lullo on (02) 92973765 and Gina will arrange for you to receive an Expression of Interest form which would need to be completed and returned as soon as possible.

In the new year we will be commencing our identification of persons for positions for the Test Event in March-April 2000. The Test Event otherwise known as the ISSF World Cup, is where we will obtain our Olympic and Paralympic National Technical Officials and shooting specific volunteers. The test Event is expected to be the largest International Shooting competition ever conducted in Australia with athlete numbers expected to be in the vicinity of 800 plus officials. It will also provide an introduction of the experience of being an Olympic and Paralympic Shooting Volunteer in 2000.

TO GET YOUR TICKETS

The ticketing policy and the prices for tickets has now been approved by the International Olympic Committee and released to the General Public in September.

General Admission tickets for all Shooting sessions are priced at \$50 with competition commencing on September 16 concluding on September 23.

The SISC will operate at a capacity of 6,500 - 7000 spectators for 8 days, with Shooting commencing on Day 1 of the Games. Key Facts

- -Seventy per cent of tickets will cost \$A60 or less.
- -Eight per cent will cost less than \$A100.
- -Five million tickets will be made through the Australian public ticket offer.
- -Three quarters of these tickets will give more Australians the opportunity to see the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games, per head of population, than any other Olympic Games host nation population. -Application will be by mail order, which means there is no first in, first served, and will allow well informed decisions to be made at home prior to applying for tickets.

-People will have 45 days to complete and return their order form for their choices in 635 sessions of sport and ceremonies across 16 days.

-Australians will be able to order Olympic tickets in mid 1999 when an information and mail order booklet will be distributed through News Ltd newspapers around the Country.

-To give all Australians a fair chance to buy tickets, people are limited to purchasing four tickets per person for the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, and six tickets to all other sessions.

-Where more people want tickets to a session than there are available seats, the tickets will be allocated on the basis of random computer selection.

-SOCOG will set aside 1.5 million tickets priced between \$A10 and \$A19 especially to help schools and disadvantaged. These will be called "Olympic Opportunity" tickets.

TICKETS 'n' TRANSPORT

-The Olympic transport system will operate 24 hours a day for the general public during the 16 days of the Olympic Games.

-Olympic spectators will have free travel on the Olympic transport system for the entire day of their Olympic event and until 4am the following day.

-This free travel will be available on the City Rail network and the special Olympic bus routes, but will also include unlimited travel for other purposes over the relevant period.

-The free travel will cover more than 300 stations forming the City Rail Suburban and Inter City Network - extending to Newcastle, Dungog and Scone in the Hunter Valley; Port Kembla and Bomaderry (Nowra) to the South; Goulburn to the South West; and through the Blue Mountains to Lithgow.

Buses covered by the scheme include the Sydney Olympic Park regional bus routes - buses to Sydney Olympic Park on routes designed to compliment the rail system; shuttle buses between venues and car parking; and between Olympic competition venues; and shuttle buses operating between railway stations and venues.

-Access to the shooting venue will be by shuttle bus from Eastern Creek "Park & Ride" station (approximately 15km, 9mins) and Liverpool and Blacktown railway stations.

#### TÖRCH RELAY EXCITEMENT

The Sydney 2000 Olympic Torch Relay will offer a unique opportunity for Australians to "Share The Spirit" of the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

The torch will be lit on 12 May 2000 from a flame kindled by the suns rays at a special ceremony in Olympia, Greece, home of the original Olympic Games.

>From this flame the Olympic Torch and two miner's safety lamps are lit, then carried by Torchbearers to Athens and from there by as many means of transport as possible to the host city of the Games, Sydney. Any Torch which goes out anywhere on the journey is reignited by the Olympic Flame from one of the miners lamps.

On it way to Australia the Torch Relay will visit the nearby Olympic nations in Oceania - Guam, the Federated States of Micronesia, Nauru, Solomon Islands, Papau New Guinea, Vanuatu, Samoa, American Samoa, Cook Islands, Tonja, Fiji and New Zealand.

The Torch Relay provides SOCOG with the opportunity to plan a unique journey which showcases Australia and Oceania's history, people, culture and diverse geography to the rest of the world. The torch will be carried around Oceania for approximately 20 days prior to its arrival in Australia on 8 June, 2000.

The Torch will visit all States and Territories and will journey within one hour's drive of 85% of Australia's population.

The Sydney 2000 Olympic Torch Relay will have 10,000 Torchbearers throughout Australia with each Torchbearer carrying the Torch by foot for up to a kilometer, with the average slot length 500 meters. Included in the 10,000 will be Olympians, community representatives and a wide cross section of people from all walks of life. In 1999 a National campaign will be launched for anyone who

wishes to apply to be a torchbearer. The Torchbearer Selection Process will be open for several months following which all applicants will be assessed with those persons selected to be announced early in 2000.

Running alongside the Torchbearers will be 2,500 escort runners during the 100 day Relay - the longest and most comprehensive of

any Relay since it began in 1936.

The torch will also travel by various forms of transport which is likely to include a train, bicycle, stock horse, tram, road train, rowing boat, canoe, dragon boat, ferry, solar vehicle, wave piercer and even by the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

Together with the many community celebrations, the Sydney 2000 Olympic Torch Relay will allow millions of people a chance to be directly involved with the Games.

HOW MANY PEOPLE WILL WATCH THE GAMES WITH YOU? The Olympic Games is the largest single broadcast event in the world - larger than the World Cup or any other event. Approximately 160 countries broadcast the 1998 Nagano Winter Games, and more than 220 countries will broadcast the Sydney Olympic

### CUZZO'S RAMBLINGS **MARCH 1999**

Equitable refereeing is one of the largest unsolved problems that we currently face in Clay Target Shooting in Australia. I guess while ever there needs to be a human element in refereeing, the problem will never be totally solved, but I believe that at present we are a lot further from the optimum point than we need to be. The main reason for this is because in Clay Target Shooting the referee takes on an additional dimension, where he is able to influence the equity of the competition in a primary and material way, that referees in most other sports are unable to do.

In most sports the referee has only three basic functions. Firstly he has to interpret and apply the rules. Secondly he has to record the scores in order to eventually establish who has won or lost. And thirdly he has the responsibility of making final and indisputable decisions on points of fact (which may be at variance with the opinions of the competitors) - such as whether the clay target was hit or missed, whether the tennis ball landed inside or outside the line, whether the football was marked or dropped, whether the cricket ball would have struck the stumps if it had not struck the batsman's pads etc. etc.

Unless the referee is either totally incompetent or maliciously biased, none of these areas are usually of any great concern in Clay Target shooting, or any other sport for that matter. Incorrect rules decisions can usually be sorted out to everyone's satisfaction at the time, or failing that, by the jury at some later time. Mistakes in scoring are very rare and the necessity of checking and signing your score-sheet before you leave the field generally allows such errors to be rectified while they are still fresh in everyone's mind. Any differences of opinion as to whether or not you dislodged a visible piece from the target should logically go the referee's way because, not only is he in a better position to see than you are, but also his perception is not clouded by an intense vested interest. Such situations, when they occur, are generally a good indication that you need either more choke or more practice or maybe both. Wayne Mayes always said "if you don't like the referee's call on a target, hit the next one harder.

How Clay Target refereeing differs from all other forms of sports adjudicating is where the umpire actually participates in the game. In cricket he does not bowl the ball at you, in football he does not kick the ball to you and in golf he does not set the height of your tee before you drive. But in Clay Target Shooting he does launch (pull) the target for you, and the degree of his ability to do this in a timely and consistent manner materially affects the degree of ability required by the shooter to consistently break the target.

Competency in pulling is acquired in much the same way as competency in shooting. They both start out "fairly ordinary" and then improve with the amount of practice you have had at it, the amount of concentration you apply to it on any given day, and the amount of natural ability you have for these types of activities. All shooters and all pullers generally start out as "C" class participants. Some shooters very quickly progress from "C" to "AA" and then almost always put in a solid performance, whereas others struggle for years to reach "B" or "A" and never become consistent. Similarly, some pullers become very proficient in a very short space of time, whereas others are best avoided even after they have been in the game a long time. Although the learning process is parallel in both activities and skill levels are often similar, this is not necessarily always the case. I have struck "AA" shooters who couldn't pull a good round if their life depended on it and I have had "C" class shooters do a brilliant

The problem we have in Australia is that with no professional refereeing system, we are left with a rotational roster scheme that will occasionally provide you with a "less than adequate" puller at the worst possible time. At club level and small to medium feature shoots, the shoot marshal will probably know nearly all the participants personally and can hand pick and allocate suitable pullers almost all the time. However, at large feature shoots, State Shoots and the Nationals this type of intimate personal intervention is impossible and you are left to draw your puller via the "lucky dip"

selection method from the previous squad. (shooters one and two for the first round and three and four for the second)

Some time ago the rules were changed to require the pull to be instantaneous, and the shooters to be the judge of this, and have the option of refusing any pull they did not think conformed. This was certainly a substantial step in the right direction and decreased the problem significantly. But it did not eliminate it! Now I'm not saying you can't shoot good scores with a bad or marginal puller. What I'm saying is that it is a lot easier to break a hundred when the puller is crisp and consistent, than it is when he is slow and/or inconsistent. In the first instance you are able to put him out of your mind and apply yourself fully to the task of shooting. Whereas in the second instance your rhythm is broken from time to time by having to refuse a target, and the doubt is constantly at the forefront of your awareness decreasing your primary focus. And this is where the inequity lies!

So what is the solution? Well lets look at some similar applications. In the United States the refereeing tasks are not broken up amongst two people as they are in Australia. Over there, when you arrive at your field you find one paid professional referee waiting for you who performs all four functions of pulling, scoring, ruling and adjudicating. So why do we break the job up amongst two people in this country? Because without professional refereeing you are left with the necessity of using the other competitors on a rotational roster system and some of these will not have the necessary capabilities or experience to do the job properly. But with two to choose from, you stand a better chance of getting at least one who will be adequate. And don't forget, it is not their scoring, ruling or adjudicating prowess that we need to be concerned about. As explained in the third paragraph, these things are of secondary importance because they can be satisfactorily sorted out afterwards. It is their pulling ability that is absolutely paramount, because you only get one chance at that, and if it's wrong, it can't be fixed later.

My opinion? I think we break the job up incorrectly. Instead of breaking it up into a referee (who pulls, rules and adjudicates) and a scorer, I think we should break it up into a referee (who scores, rules and adjudicates) and a puller. This way you still get a potentially unbiased referee, because he is drawn at random from the previous squad, but you isolate the pulling, which allows you to address that problem separately, and thus be in a better position to explore other more viable options.

My lack of interest in the Olympic Disciplines of shooting is well known. The reasons for this are less widely known and stem mainly from the fact that the rules are written in such a way as to provide an ultra-competitive competition at the expense of fun, convenience, compassion and a lot of the social aspects for the shooters. These side effects are probably unavoidable due to the basic requirements of the sport. But for my weekends I would rather enjoy a casual leisure activity than participate in something that is more like regimented unpaid work. However, credit where it is due. The same draconian rulebook that keeps me out of the sport has done a perfect job of eliminating the puller from the equation in both of the disciplines. In ISU Skeet the random timed pulling is done via an electronic scrambler box and in the Trap variants it is done instantaneously by phono-pulls.

I don't think random timing has any application in Trap or Skeet, but I firmly believe that phono-pulls are one of our best options and should be used whenever possible. When they are unavailable, I believe that there are a couple of other viable options which are well worth utilising, and which are both better than the "lucky dip" system. Firstly you could allow the competitors to pull their own targets. This is not viable in Trap but works great in Skeet. Secondly you could allow the competitors to supply their own puller. Now before you howl down either of these options, just because they are new, untried and appear somewhat radical, think about them carefully and remember two things.

With the break-up of the refereeing tasks into a referee (who scores, rules and adjudicates) and a puller, the puller has no say in the refereeing, which is done by a disassociated person provided by short management. In effect the puller simply substitutes for electronic equipment and becomes a human surrogate phono-pull. Therefore no matter how biased he may be towards you, he cannot provide you with any type of covert advantage. Also remember that there is no such thing as a puller who is better than good. Pullers only come in two shapes: good and less than good. Those who are "anyway less than good" can certainly put you at a disadvantage, but if you have

one that is good, there is no way that anyone else can come up with one who is better than good and thus give themselves an unfair advantage over you.

By offering either of these alternatives when phono-pulls are unavailable, rather than the "lucky dip" puller selection method, everyone has the option of providing themselves with a puller who is as good as everyone else's. In this way a situation of greater equity is attained and thus our original objective is achieved: to provide the most equitable refereeing possible. The problems with pulling are a lot like the problems with selective squadding. At club level and at small feature shoots, where it wouldn't hurt you so much, they generally don't occur. But when you go to a major shoot or a State shoot or the Nationals, and it really does matter, that's when you can sometimes get really screwed, and trust me, it will take the fun out of your day.

I have seen numerous examples of relatively new shooters, who have just started to shoot great around their local area, head off to their first Nationals with great expectations, only to be devastated by unforeseen and unexpected problems. Such as being squadded with strange and/or distractive people, or trying to shoot under extreme pressure with their first experience of a sub-standard puller. As your experience broadens, you learn to handle these things better, but you shouldn't have to, because they are examples of avoidable inequity. Any time I am trying to beat Billy or Russell or Michael, I don't need that already mammoth task further compounded by my puller. Alternatively, any victories I might have over them would be hollow ones if I thought they had succumbed to bad pulling rather than my skills and endurance.

Thus I believe that we should work towards attaining a system where the refereeing responsibilities are redistributed and phonopulls are used wherever possible. When unavailable, the pulling should be done, in order of preference, by the shooters themselves, by a supplied puller, and then finally by the roster system only if none of the participants elect to utilise one of the other options. In this way we can move closer to a situation where luck and chance play a smaller part in our sport, where application and hard work have a better chance of succeeding, and where unnecessary disappointment and frustration are minimised.

A further improvement in the standard of our refereeing can be achieved simply by equipping all fields with proper refereeing stands, which are standard equipment in the U.S. They resemble a scaled up school desk, sufficiently elevated to allow a seated referee to see over the heads of the shooters, and fitted with a large umbrella to ward off the elements. The main problem with refereeing is that, after standing out in sun for half an hour to shoot at 50 targets, the last thing you look forward to is standing out there for another half an hour officiating. By eliminating "standing" and "out in the sun", refereeing becomes a much less arduous task, and consequently you are much better able to apply yourself to it.

The first correct answer drawn and thus the winner of a free entry to this year's National Double Barrel was John Farrell from Coffs Harbour. As John won the STQ competition a couple of months ago, he thus becomes the first multiple winner, which just goes to prove the old adage "you gotta be in it to win it'.
